> AMERICAN ATTORNEY WILL PROCEED TO LONDON FOR OSCAR SLATER'S RE-TRIAL Clewich Tolographie Agency)

London, Jan. 28.-The new trial for Oscar Slater, who spent eighteen years in Peterhead prison on the charge of having murdered an aged Glasgow vroman, will begin here in a few weeks. MOVE MADE IN WARSAW CITY COUNCIL TO ENACT LEGIS-LATION AGAINST SCHECHITA Measure Viewed as Election Stunt of Anti-Semites

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Warsaw, Jan. 28-The move of Pol-

ish nationalist elements in the Warsaw City Council to bring about the prohibition of Schechita, the Jewish me-thod of slaughtering animals, is considered here an election measure calculated only to have a political effect, it being extremely doubtful whether sufficient support would be found to out the measure through

The move was made at a meeting of the budget commission of the Council when it considered the estimates concerning the administration of the city slaughter houses. The pro-posal was introduced by Dr. Zawadzki, a Warsaw physician of Jewish extraction affiliated with the national Democratic Party. The resolution urged that the schechita be prohibited and instead electric stunning of animals be made obligatory. The Jewish members of the commission protested against the introduction of the resolution, arguing that the system of slaughtering has nothing to do with the budget question. The proposal, however, was car-

ried by a majority vote.
When the resolution was adopted, the Jewish members representing the middle classes left the session as a sign of protest. The councillors representing the Jewish labor groups Bund and Poale Zion remained. The resolution would have to pass the plenum of the city council and be ratified by the Ministry of the Interior. It was stated on good authority that the measure has no chance of being passed.

SEEK TO CREATE UNITED JEWISH BLOC IN ROUMANIA (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Jan. 28-Negotiations are in progress for the establishment of a united Tewish bloc including all the Jewish parties and organizations throughout Roumania to contest the next Parliamentary elections which are to take place shortly.

The leaders of the Jewish parties in

Old Roumania and the Provinces of Bessarabia and Bukovina are discussing the organization of the bloc. The Jewish parties of Bukovina have already formed the Bukovinian Section of the bloc which will as a whole join he larger bloc comprising the Jews of the entire country.

ity Chest Campaign

(By our San Francisco correspondent)

San Francisco, Jan. 23.-In the plans for the San Francisco Community Chest's annual financial campaign next month, Jews of this city again are taking a position of leadership in keeping with the important part they have played for years in local social service and philanthropic

Jewish men and women are members of the various committees handling important details incident to the drive which the Chest will make for support of the 104 charitable and welfare organizations of all creecs which it supports.

Back of this fact lies one of far more significance-a fact often pointed to with pride by local Jewish leaders. It is that Jewish charities of San Francisco, fully two decades ago, actually set the example for a Community Chest by combining under the banner of the San Francisco Federation of Jewish Charities.

In the Federation are seven constituent welfare and philanthropic bodies, each performing a widely different function, but operating under a consolidated administrative organization manned by the federation. These are the Eureka Benevolent Society, now the central charity and social service institution, Mount Zion Hospital and Nurses Training School. Pacific Hebrew Orphan Asylum and Home Society, Emanu-El Sisterhood, the Hebrew Home for the Aged Disabled nd the Free Loan Society (Chevra Gemilus Chasodim). Combining these organizations into the

Federation of Jewish Charities set an example for economical and efficient organization and administration which was cited with much emphasis when the plan for merging all of the city's institutions into the Chest was first broached.

With the institution of the chest six years ago, Federation became a part of it and its leaders participate actively in the financial drives of the chest organization. The Chest allocates between \$250,-000 and \$300,000 yearly to the Federation of Jewish Charities. Of this amount \$90,000 goes to the operation of the Eureka Benevolent Society.

The background being as it is, it is only fitting that Jewish leaders should play an important part in the chest campaigns which are headed by men and women leading in every field of the city's endeavor.

Judge M. C. Sloss, formerly associate justice of the California State Supreme

Court, has been one of the leading figures in Chest affairs and now is playing one of the foremost parts in the lineup of organization work for the coming San Francisco Jews Lead in Commun- campaign.

Mrs. Sloss is one of the principal women in chest organization, heading a committee which aims at scientific exploitation of the purposes and needs of the Community Chest.

Dr. Samuel C. Kohs, social service director of the Eureka Benevolent Society, likewise is active in Chest affairs, as is Supervisor Jesse C. Colman and Mrs. Leo Clayburgh, who heads a publicity committee of the entire organization.

EIGHT JEWISH PARTIES TO CONTEST IN POLISH PARLIAMENT ELECTIONS

Lack of Unity Endangers Strength of Representation in Sejm

Warsaw, Jan. 28 — Eight Jewish parties will solicit the political support of the Jewish population in the Republic of Poland in the forthcoming elections to the third Polish Sejm, which take place on February 22. Thirty four Polish parties have filed their lists with the election registration board. Eight Jewish lists were presented.

The Jewish lists that will split the Jewish vote are the following: 1. The Jewish national bloc within the bloc of national minorities, headed by Isaac Gruenbaum; 2. The list of the Right wing of the Jewish labor party, Poale Zion, 3 The list of the Left wing of the Poale Zion; 4. The list of the Orthodox Agudath Israel combined with the Volkist party headed by Noah Prilutzki, under the name Jewish National Bloc; 5. The list of the Jewish labor party, Bund; 6. The list of the Zionists in Galicia, headed by Dr. Leon Reich and Dr. Osias Thon; 7. The list of the Zionist democratic workers and 8. The list of the Hitachduth, Zionist labor group.

In addition, several Polish parties are presenting lewish candidates on their lists, particularly in Galicia. JOHNSON BILL WOULD MAKE ALIEN DEPORTABLE FOR VIO-LATION OF PROHIBITION LAW (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Washington, D.C., Jan. 28.—Drastic clauses are contained in the Johnson Deportation Bill which was introduced into the House on January 26 with the approval of the House Immigration Committee.

The bill provides for the deportation of aliens who violate the prohibition, narcotic, or white slave laws and repeals the present law requiring the deportation of aliens convicted of "moral turpitude," but does not affect the law barring aliens from entry where the last named offense is concerned.

Deportation also of convicts as soon as they serve their sentences is provided and an alien serving a sentence of one year or more is subject to deportation.

The section of the deportation bill outlining the classes of aliens subject to deportation includes: An alien who at the time of entry was a member of one or more of the classes excluded by law from admission to the United States—at any time within five years after entry.

An alien who entered the United States at any time or place other than as designated by immigration officials, or who elucked examination or inspection, or who obtained entry by a false or misleading representation—at any time after entry, unless the entry was before July 1, 1924, in which case at any time within five years after entry.

An alien who remains in the United States for a longer time than authorized by law or regulations made under authorized the state for a longer time after entry, unless the entry was before July 1, 1924, in which case at any time within five years after entry. An alien seaman not admitted to the United States for permanent residence shall be considered as having remained in the United States for a longer time than authorized by law if he is found engaged in any occupation in the United States other than that of a seaman on a yessel arriving from or bound to a foreign port or place.

An alien who at any time within five years after entry is a public charge from causes not affirmatively shown to have arisen subsequent to entry—at any time after entry.

An alien who at any time within five years after entry, from causes not affirmatively shown to have arisen subsequent to entry, is an idiot, imbecile, feebleminded persons, epileptic, insane nerson, person of constitutional psychopathic inferiority, or person with chronic alcoholism—at any time after entry.

An alien who is convicted of any offense (committed after the enactment of the Deportation Act of 1928 and within 10 years after entry) for which he is sentenced to imprisonment for a term of one year or more—at any time after entry, but not after the expiration of three

London, Jan. 28 .- A new company, the Anglo-Binyan Hayishuv of Palestine, Ltd. has just been organized here. The company which will seek to develop urban and rural settlement in Palestine by the acquisition of land which it will develop and sell to private individuals and small groups on easy terms, has an initial capital of £3,000. The first directors are J. Rivlin, M. Levene, M. Chaikin, H. Aaronsohn and I. Rivlin.

The company will also undertake the plantation of orange and banana groves, and the management of small farms, giving an opportunity to Jews who are at present unable to settle in Palestine, the means for preparing themselvs to do so

An alien who is convicted of any offense (committed after the enactment of the Deportation Act of 1928 and at any time after entry) for which he is sentenced to imprisonment for a term of one year or more, and who is thereafter convicted of the same or any other offense (committed after the enactment of the Deportation Act of 1928 and at any time after entry) for which he is sentenced to imprisonment for a term of one year or more-at any time after entry, but not after the expiration of three years after the termination of the imprisonment

An alien who is convicted of any offense (committed after the enactment of the Deportation Act of 1928 and within 10 years after entry) for which he is sentenced to imprisonment for a term which when added to the terms to which sentenced under two or more previous convictions of the same or any other offense (committed after the enactment of the Deportation Act of 1928) amounts to two years or more-at any time after entry, but not after the expiration of three years after the termination of the imprisonment.
