## MOND IS THREATENED BY ANTI-ZIONIST MOB WHEN HE ARRIVES IN BAGDAD

Police Combat Rioters in Iraq Capital, 40 Arrested, Several Injured

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bagdad, Iraq, Feb. 11.—An anti-Zionist demonstration, arranged by Arab political propagandists, created a serious problem for the police authorities in the capital of Iraq on the arrival here of Sir Alfred Mond, British industrialist, former Minister of Public Works and Zionist leader. Mounted police were compelled to charge through the mob before the demonstrators were dispersed. Forty were arrested and several were injured in the riot.

Sir Alfred, who left Jerusalem for Bagdad accompanied by his wife and daughter, was compelled to enter the city by a circuitous route in order to avoid the threatening mob of ten thousand. Six miles from the city the party was informed of the threatening attitude of the demonstrators. The party was transferred from the trans-desert car into four smaller automobiles and proceeded undetected to the British Residency in Bagdad.

The demonstration began when a procession of Arab students, shouting "Down with Zionism," marched through the streets to the western entrance of the city where they expected the arrival of the Mond party. Several cars which were suspected of carrying the Mond party were stopped by the demonstrators and the passengers, who proved to be local residents, were severely beaten and robbed before they could prove that they had no connection with the Mond party. Mounted police were called to restore order.

It was stated that the demonstrations were provoked by Arab agitators who spread the rumor that the object of Sir Alfred Mond's visit to Iraq was to introduce into the kingdom of Feisal the Zionist principles similar to those of the Palestine regime. The Mond party entered the city after the mob was dispersed.

## YESHIVA STUDENTS WILL TAKE UP AGRICULTURE

Jerusalem, Feb. 11.—Forty students of Chief Rabbi Kook's Yeshiva in Jerusalem, the Hebron Yeshiva and other Yeshivas in the country have formed an association to establish a small-holders' settlement under the guidance of the "Hapoel Hamizrachi," Chief Rabbi Kook has promised his support to the enterprise.

## JEWISH MERCHANTS SELL 25% CHEAPER, POLISH GOVERNMENT MEMBER SAYS

Government Investigation Disproves Charge Jews Are Profiteers

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Feb. 11.—The charge of the Polish anti-Semitic organizations and newspapers that Jewish merchants are profiteers was disproved through an official investigation of the Polish Government. In the jargon of the Polish anti-Semitic campaigners, the word "Zyd" (Jew) and "Paskarz" (profiteer) are synonymous.

The results of the investigation of the Government were submitted by the Minister of Commerce Kwiatkowski to a press conference called at the Ministry to discuss the economic problems of the Republic.

To make purchases at Jewish stores is more advantageous, the Minister told the astounded representatives of the Polish newspapers. In order to compare prices, the Minister stated, he had ordered agents of the Ministry of Commerce to go out to various parts of the capital and purchase various articles in various stores. A comparison of the prices, between those bought in the Nalewki region, the Jewish shopping center, and on Marszalkowska Street, the Fifth Avenue of Warsaw, showed that the Jewish merchants sold their merchandise twenty-five percent cheaper than the non-Jews, the Minister declared.

## DEMOCRATIC MINORITIES BLOC IN LATVIA COLLAPSES

Riga, Feb. 11.—The democratic bloc of minority nationalities which was formed in Latvia a year ago has collapsed. The bloc included the democratic Jewish, Polish and Russian deputies. It succeeded in bringing about the formation of a democratic Government, which enacted several measures of benefit to the Jews of Latvia. Not long ago the Russian deputies made a number of demands to which the Government could not agree. The Russian deputies thereupon went over to the opposition of the Right. The Polish deputies followed them into the opposition and in consequence the Government fell.

The new Government under the Premiership of M. Juroshevski, a notorious anti-Semite, who was responsible, among other things, for the recent carrying out of the referendum on

## HUNGARIAN STUDENTS DEMONSTRATE, PARLIAMENT DISCUSSES NUMERUS CLAUSUS

Jewish Deputies Attack Government's Policy on Question

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Budapest, Feb. 11.—While parliament debated the government bill which purports to modify the numerus clausus law, a demonstration of students took place at the Technical Institute, protesting against the change which would in truth bring about no increase in the number of admissible Jewish students.

The students uttered threats that the lectures at the colleges and universities will be boycotted if the bill is promulgated.

A very small number of deputies were present in the house when the discussion on the bill took place. Before the discussion started, a conference was held between Count Klebelsberg, Minister of Education, and Paul Sandor, Jewish deputy. When interviewed by the representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, Count Klebelsberg stated that the purpose of the bill is merely to calm the spirits without actually raising the number of Jewish students in the colleges and universities.

During the debate in which Jewish deputies attacked the government and the hypocritical proposal, the question of whether the Jews constitute a race or religion came up again. Deputy Baracs, a Jewish deputy, stated that the main question to be decided is whether the Jews are a religious sect or a race. Since the Hungarian constitution recognizes only religions, the proposed bill is unconstitutional. The purpose of the numerus clausus is to defend Christian students of Latin against the rivalry of Jewish students, he argued.

Count Klebelsberg retorted that it was this proposal that upholds the constitution and emphasizes that the Jews are a religious sect.

The Socialist deputy, Varnai, a Jew, attacked the bill, declaring that the numerus clausus was the offspring of ugly hatred and is a wholesale indictment of Jewry.

## RUSSIAN EMBASSY DENIES RUMORS ABOUT POGROMS

### FORMER MERCHANT SUICIDE WHEN HE FAILS TO LOCATE HIS BROTHER IN AMERICA

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Feb. 11.—Failure to locate his brother, said to be a well to do merchant in the United States and who might have brought him aid in his plight, drove Simcha Sdankow, once a wealthy merchant, to commit suicide on the street here. He was sixty-eight years old.

Sdankow's act of despair was the climax of a deeply stirring tragedy in the throes of which are many Russian Jewish families as a result of the upheaval in Russia.

Sdankow, who before the war was a rich lumber merchant, having wide commercial relations in western Europe, lost all of his property by a confiscation decree of the Bolshevik authorities. His only daughter was shot on the charge that she was a friend of an officer in the Czarist army. Sdankow's wife died of heart failure on receipt of the news of her daughter's death.

Reduced to extreme poverty, Sdankow made his way to Poland, where he had to resort to begging, continuing to live in the hope that from Poland he might succeed in learning the whereabouts of his brother, said to be a well to do merchant in the United States.

When all efforts failed and when his many letters brought no reply, the merchant-beggar ended his life last night on a side street in Poland's capital.

### TALK OF PALESTINE CRISIS EXAGGERATED, WASSERMANN STATES AT BERLIN MEETING German Notables' Body Reaffirms Faith in Palestine Reconstruction

Berlin, Feb. 11.—Words of encouragement as to the future possibilities in the reconstruction of Palestine as the Jewish National Home were heard at the annual meeting of the Pro-Palestine Committee in Germany held here last night.

Sixty German notables, including diplomats, members of parliament, professors at the universities, and leading industrialists attended the meeting which was presided over by Count von Bernstorff. In his report on the past year's activities of the committee, Count von Bernstorff stated that the Committee's membership has grown from sixty to one hundred and twenty-four. The committee bases its work on the principle expressed in the Balfour declaration that the reconstruction of the Jewish National Home is not to prejudice the status of Jews in the countries of their birth and citizenship. The Pro-Palestine Committee is supporting the reconstruction of Palestine politically and economically, he stated.

In a lengthy report submitted to the committee by Oscar Wassermann, director of the Deutsche Reichsbank and member of the Non-Partisan Survey Commission of the Jewish Agency, the well known German financier who recently returned from Palestine took exception to what he termed exaggerated reports of the Palestine crisis. The spirit of the people in Palestine is hopeful, the human material is ideal and constitutes a guarantee for the success of the work. The construction of the Haifa harbor and the carrying out of the electrification project will open new perspectives, he stated.

Herr Wassermann, however, was less optimistic with regard to the possibilities of exploiting the salts of the Dead Sea.

### FEUCHTWANGER'S 'POWER' TO BE FILMED IN ENGLAND

London, Feb. 11.—Lion Feuchtwanger's novel, "Jew Suss," published in America under the title "Power," will be produced as a motion picture. The film rights of the book were recently purchased by Louis Blattner for about \$8,000. It is to be screened by Rex Ingram, it was announced here.

The film will be produced in England at a cost of £100,000. By an agreement with Joseph M. Schenck, the picture will be released all over the world through United Artists.

A. T. Strahorn, who was the last of the experts of the Jewish Agency Non-Partisan Survey Commission to stay in Palestine left Washington on January 14 on his return to New York.

Mr. Strahorn is on the staff of the Bureau of Soils in the United States Department of Agriculture.

### JEWISH COMMUNITY OF WATERBURY DECLINES TO ACT AS UNIT IN FIRE CASE

Community Stirred Over Catastrophe  
 Resulting in 3 Deaths

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Waterbury, Conn., Feb. 11.—Local Jewish leaders, including Alderman Charles Schmitman, who had considered calling a mass meeting of the Jewish people of the city for the purpose of denouncing all those responsible for the fire which destroyed a group of buildings on Baldwin street, of expressing sympathy to the Moynihan family which lost two boys in the fire, and possibly for raising funds for those who suffered by it, have abandoned their plan.

After consultation, it was decided not to take any concerted action nor to ask the Jewish community to record itself as a unit. The punishment of those responsible is in the hands of the authorities and it was concluded that any action in the nature of denunciation of culprits might be misinterpreted. If any individual wishes to express an opinion or contribute to the relief of those who suffered from the fire there is nothing to prevent his doing so as an individual.

This action was contemplated in connection with charges brought against Louis N. Leopold, president of the Waterbury Furniture Company, that he had hired two men, Jacob Weiss and Maurice Shalnitz, Jews, to set fire to his furniture store, the burning of which last Sunday morning, resulted in the death of two children, John and Joseph Moynihan.

The body of Jacob Weiss was found among the ruins. Shalnitz, who was found unconscious, is now in a critical condition in the New Haven Hospital. Incriminating evidence against Louis N. Leopold is said to be in the hands of the authorities.

### TWO POLISH JEWISH PARTIES ARE EVICTED FROM OFFICES

Warsaw, Feb. 11.—Two Polish Jewish parties, which are taking an active part in the present campaign for the forthcoming parliamentary elections, face liquidation because of their inability to pay rent for their headquarters.

Having failed to meet the rent for the past several months, the owner of the house, at Tomackie 13, dispossessed the headquarters of the Polish branch of the Mizrahi, Orthodox wing of the Zionist movement, and of the Volkspartei, headed by former deputy N. Prylucki.

With the present shortage of housing facilities now obtaining in Warsaw the eviction equals liquidation.

Rabbi Simon G. Kramer, formerly of Congregation Knesseth Israel, Hammond Ind., was installed as rabbi of Temple Beth-El, Gary, Ind. Rabbis Saul Silber, president of the Hebrew Theological College of Chicago, was among the speakers.

**\$1,000,000 SPENT BY J.D.C. FOR ORPHAN CARE IN PALESTINE**  
**Work is Reviewed as Palestine Committee is Liquidated**

Over 4,000 war orphans in Palestine have been cared for and placed in a position to support themselves, and the work in connection with their maintenance, education, and trade training was liquidated last month, according to a report from Jerusalem submitted by Miss Sophia Berger who served as executive director of the Palestine Orphan Committee since its inception eight and a half years ago, according to a statement issued from the headquarters of the Joint Distribution Committee.

The task involved the expenditure of over \$2,250,000 of which the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Felix M. Warburg, chairman, contributed more than \$2,000,000. The Hadassah Medical Organization, co-operating with the orphan committee, made possible careful attention to the children's health. The records show that in a group of 2,000 Jerusalem children, there were six deaths over a period of five years. The committee also did pioneer work in its care of tuberculosis suspects, in dental care, in supplying lunches to kindergartens and school children, and in vocational guidance work.

The policy of the Palestine Orphan Committee was to place the children in private homes, with their widowed mothers or with relatives, wherever possible, or in carefully selected foster homes. As a result of this method of child care, its eleven orphanages were closed one by one. Especial attention was given to trade training of girls and boys. They were apprenticed to skilled artisans or were otherwise prepared for entrance into all fields of work—domestic service, skilled labor, farming, office work, and professions. The boys entered fifty-five trades, while the girls took up fourteen occupations, including teaching.

In order to prepare children for life on the land, the Palestine Orphan Committee organized two Children's Villages, Meier Shfeyah, with a predominance of girls, maintained by the Junior Hadassah of America, and Givat Hamoreh, a village with a predominance of boys, maintained by the Jewish community of South Africa.

There are still about two hundred children to be cared for until they can be self-supporting. Miss Berger will direct the work until its completion.

The Palestine Orphan Committee which dissolved itself on the completion of its work consisted of Norman Bentwich, chairman; Miss Sophia Berger, Dr. J. L. Magnes, dean of the Hebrew University, and Emanuel N. Mohl.

**Michigan Attorney General Rules Against Use of Bible in Public Schools**

*(By Our Special Correspondent)*

Lansing, Feb. 9.—Use of the Bible in public schools was prohibited today by Attorney-General W. W. Potter in an opinion which necessitates discontinuance of religious courses in the various normal schools and at Michigan State College.

The opinion had been requested by Dr. W. K. Wilson, a member of the Lansing school board, who said he desired a ruling to guide him in his future work on the board.

Potter explained that the constitution clearly prevents use of any religious textbooks. Although the State college and the normals are not "public schools" under the law, authorities explained the constitutional provision affecting the lower institutions would have little effect upon them.

The University of Michigan is not concerned with the ruling. Religious training there is conducted in a separate building not maintained by the State. The normals and the State college conduct courses designed to "fix the students' thoughts on the teachings of Jesus."

Webster H. Pearce, superintendent of public instruction, admitted that the Bible is read in both grade and high schools in many sections. E. T. Cameron, executive secretary of the Michigan Educational association, said that outlines for Bible study have been sold extensively by the association for use in high schools throughout the State. He added that in many schools the classes are conducted in nearby churches rather than in the public building.

The fact that Bible study is optional does not evade the provisions of the constitution. Potter ruled. In brief, his findings are as follows:

Sectarian books may not be used in the public schools.

School boards have no authority to establish or continue courses in religious subjects.

Public school buildings may not be used for religious instruction.

Any text book stressing the doctrines of the Protestant or any other religion cannot be used in the public schools.

Public funds cannot be used for purchasing religious text books or to pay salaries of religious teachers.

Discussing the proposal that because religious courses or Bible reading periods are not unconstitutional as they are optional to the student, the attorney general quoted an opinion by the Iowa supreme court saying this fact is of

**PUBLIC FORUMS ON ASPECTS OF JEWISH LIFE IN AMERICA**

**Views of Orthodox, Conservative and Reform to be Presented**

A series of public lectures aiming to bring about better understanding between the groups in American Jewry will be started at Temple Beth-El, New York, on February 19, under the auspices of the Hebrew Union College School for Teachers. These Sunday evening lectures, grouped under the general subject of "Aspects of Jewish Life and Thought in America," will constitute the 1928 program of the Jewish educational forums conducted every year by the Hebrew Union College School for Teachers.

In the course of five lectures, leaders of all the religious groups of American Judaism, Orthodox, Conservative, and Reform, will speak. Each lecture will be followed by an open forum.

Rabbi Leo Jung, of the Jewish Center, will speak on "What is Orthodox Judaism?" Rabbi Jacob Kohn, of Temple Anshe Chesed will speak on "What is Conservative Judaism?" and Rabbi Samuel Schulman, of Congregation Emanu-El, will deliver an address on "What is Reform Judaism?" In addition there will be two lectures on subjects of general interest, among them one on "The Zionism of Achad Ha'am," by Rabbi Mordecai M. Kaplan of the Society for the Advancement of Judaism, and another on "Problems of Leadership in American Judaism" by Louis Marshall.

The first lecture of the series will be given on Sunday night, February 19, when Rabbi Leo Jung will speak on "What is Orthodox Judaism?" These lectures are open to the public.

no consequence.

"The rule applied by the supreme court of Iowa in this case applies to the teaching of any religion, whether Protestant, Jewish, Mohammedanism, Buddhism or any other sect or denomination," Potter said.

"This principle of unfettered individual liberty of conscience necessarily implies, what is too often forgotten, that such liberty must be so exercised by him to whom it is given so as not to infringe upon the equally sacred right of his neighbor to differ with him. To that end it is fundamental that the law itself shall be free from all taint of discrimination, and that the State shall be watchful to forbid the use or abuse of any of its powers or privileges in the interests of any church or sect. Nowhere is such an abuse more likely to manifest itself than in our system of public schools.

"If there is any one thing which is well settled in the policies and purposes of the American people as a whole, it is the fixed and unalterable

### EGYPTIAN CURRENCY WILL CEASE AS LEGAL TENDER IN PALESTINE, IS DECISION (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Feb. 11.—It is the intention of Government to demoteise Egyptian gold, notes, silver and nickel coins, at present legal tender, at the end of February, it is officially stated here.

A proclamation under the Palestine Currency Order, 1927, will be published in the Official Gazette and the press as soon as the date of demoteisation is definitely decided. From that date Egyptian currency will cease to be legal tender and will not be accepted or exchanged by the Government. The public has been advised to exchange any Egyptian currency in their possession at an early date.

The new citizenship law passed by the democratic Government which conferred citizenship on thousands of Latvian Jews, is supported by the reactionary and anti-Semitic parties in the Sejm.

There is much resentment in certain Jewish circles because the Agudist deputies in the Sejm voted for the new Government in spite of its anti-Semitic tendencies.

determination that there shall be an absolute separation of the Church and State, and that our public school system shall not be used directly or indirectly for religious instruction."

Continuing, Potter explained that Bible reading before classes by teachers is as much an infringement of the right to religious freedom as is instruction.

"If parents or other persons charged with the education of children desire to have them educated in matters of religion, the children can be sent to private sectarian or parochial schools," the opinion concluded, "so long as the standard of education in such institutions is substantially equivalent to that prescribed by the State for public schools."

A shipment of seven cases of linens, hospital supplies and garments valued at \$1,200 was sent to the Hadassah Medical Organization in Palestine on February 2 by the Hadassah Palestine Supplies Bureau. These garments and supplies are gathered from 750 sewing groups in Hadassah Chapters, Sisterhoods and other Jewish women's organizations throughout the United States.

The shipment made February 2 on the S. S. Providence also carried three cases of garments, linens and supplies valued at \$500 for Meier Shifayah, the children's village maintained by Junior Hadassah.

### YOUNG PEOPLE'S LEAGUE HOLDS CONVENTION IN N. Y.

The convention of the Young People's League of the United Synagogue of America was opened in New York on Friday. Sessions were concluded on Monday.

A symposium was held at the Society for the Advancement of Judaism on "The Reciprocal Relations between Youth and the Developing Synagogue." Dr. Jacob Kohn, Rabbi of Anshe Chesed Congregation, led the discussion.

The convention was in session on Sunday at the Hotel Pennsylvania. Rabbi Abraham Burnstein, S. Herbert Golden, president of the United Synagogue, Mrs. Samuel Spiegel, president of the Women's League and Herbert J. Roeder, president of the Young People's League, addressed the assembly.

In Williamson, West Virginia, a town of ten thousand inhabitants and with a Jewish congregation recruited from about twenty-five families, the construction of a synagogue is now under way.

It will cost in the neighborhood of \$20,000 and funds have been contributed by the non-Jewish members of the community, as well as the Jewish population.

The synagogue will be completed by the early part of May.

Announcement has been made by the National Committee on Religious Schools of the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods, of the annual award of prizes to contributors to "Young Israel." The contest for 1926-27 which has just ended has resulted in the following awards: For the best short story to Joseph Gaer of New York City, for his story "The Uncles from Far Away." For the best poem, to Mrs. Edith Mirick of Washington, D. C., entitled "Spring Chorus;" for the best article, to Max Robin of New York City for his "Grandfather's Tale," and for the best illustrations, to Mrs. Harry Sternberg of New York City.

The judges were Burton Rascoe, Babette Deutsch, and Samuel Ornitz, "Young Israel" is a magazine published for Jewish children and sponsored by the Union of American Hebrew Congregations.

Joseph Friedman, a student of Hebrew Union College is officiating there bi-weekly at present.
