## SHOLOM SCHWARTZBAR IS REFUSED PERMISSION TO ENTER PALESTINE

Palestine Government and Colonial Office Give no Reason for Refusing Visa

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, March 6 — Sholom Schwartzbard, avenger of the anti-Jewish pogroms in the Ukraine, who was acquitted by the French court of the slaying of Semion Petura, was refused permission to enter Palestine, it was learned today.

Schwartzbard, a citizen of France, who remained in Paris following his acquittal, applied to the Palestine authorities for a visa, it being understood that he intended to settle there with his family. Although his sensational trial and acquittal placed Schwartzbard in the center of interest, the Paris watchmaker has shunned the limelight. It was stated that he intended to settle in Palestine to lead a peaceful, unhampered life.

His application to the Palestine Government for a visa was denied. The Colonial Office in London approved the Palestine Government's decision.

No statement was issued here by the authorities as to the reasons for refusing the visa.

## TRANSJORDANIAN RULER PERSUADES TRIBESMEN NOT TO AVENGE RAIDS

Jerusalem, Mar. 6 — A serious situation has developed on the border of Transjordan, threatening to involve the western part of Palestine in warfare with the Wahabis.

The recent raids of the Wahabi tribes on Transjordanian villages and towns has called forth great indignation among the Transjordanian tribesmen who are clamoring for revenge. Expeditions of reprisal were said to be in full swing when Emir Abdullah, ruler of the territory, intervened urging the tribe leaders to refrain from their intention.

## PETER GRAIN, NOTED JEWISH JURIST, KNIGHTED IN CHINA

Shanghai, Mar. 6 — Judge Peter Grain, eminent Jewish jurist, judge of the British Supreme Court of China, was knighted by King George in recognition for his outstanding service.

## NEW POLISH PARLIAMENT HAS 14 JEWISH DEPUTIES, FINAL RETURNS INDICATE

National Minorities Bloc Elects 36 Deputies; Results Generally Seen as Victory for Pilsudski Regime

Warsaw, Mar. 6 — Fourteen Jewish deputies were elected to the third Polish Sejm in the national elections which took place on Sunday, March 4, final returns received here show.

The preponderant majority of the new Jewish representation in the Sejm is Zionist. The Jewish labor parties Bund and Left Poale Zion, as well as the Volkist party headed by Noah Frylucky, failed to elect any deputies. The Agudath Israel will have two deputies, but they were not elected on the ticket of the party which combined with the Volkists in a national bloc, but on the pro-government list, Wacław Wisliccki and Kaufman were elected on the pro-government list.

The election which was just concluded has reduced the number of Jewish deputies to 41 percent of their former strength. The club of Jewish deputies in the second Polish Sejm numbered 34.

In addition to Isaac Gruenbaum, who was re-elected in Warsaw; H. Farbstein, re-elected in Bialystock; Dr. Osias Thon, re-elected in Cracow; Dr. Leon Reich and another Jewish deputy, who were elected in Lemberg; Dr. Jerzy Rosenblatt who was re-elected in Lodz; there were elected Dr. Jacob Wygodski in Vilna; Rabbi J. Brodt of Tomaszow-Mazowiecki, Mizrahi leader, was elected in Wloclawek; M. Rass-

## PRUSSIA LEGALIZES JEWISH COMMUNITY OF FRANKFURT

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Mar. 6 — The Orthodox Jewish community of Frankfurt, known as the Torah True Kehillah, was legalized by the Prussian Diet after many years of negotiation.

The difficulty with regard to recognizing the statutes of the Kehillah lay in the fact that one of its articles contained the phrase, "the religious law is the supreme command," the opponents arguing that by implication it meant that the Torah True Kehillah puts the law of the Torah above the law of the state.

## HUNGARIAN STATESMEN SPEAK ON GOVERNMENT'S RACIAL, RELIGIOUS POLICY

Regent Horthy Gives Motives for Numerus Clausus; Bethlen Says Religious Prejudice is Absent

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Budapest, Mar. 6 — The views of Admiral Horthy, Regent of Hungary, on the background of the numerus clausus, and of Prime Minister Bethlen on the question of religious prejudice were aired at two public functions at which the Hungarian Government leaders spoke.

Admiral Horthy, in an address he delivered before the Peasants' Congress, now in session here, disclosed what might be termed the motive of the numerus clausus policy, although he mentioned neither the numerus clausus nor the Jewish question in Hungary.

Horthy laid great emphasis on the alleged over crowding in the free professions in the country. There is, he stated, an overproduction of intellectuals, leading to a situation where there are many doctors and few patients, many lawyers and a dearth of clients.

Simultaneously, however, the Regent

Among the accused are bankers, merchants, and the officials of the Moscow Mutual Credit Association, including Messrs. Gurewitz, Kissin, Rattner, Efraimsohn, Asarach, Alper, Kantorowitz and Wischniak. A number of the persons being tried are Jews.

## SMALL POX EPIDEMIC KILLS

231 IN YEMEN; PROCLAIM FAST

Jerusalem, Mar. 6 — Two hundred and thirty one persons died during last week in the vicinity of Aden, one of the two important seaports of Yemen, in the small pox epidemic which is raging there.

Four Jews were among the victims of the epidemic. The rabbinate of Aden proclaimed two days of fast and prayer.

**'GERMAN DREYFUS AFFAIR'  
INSTIGATORS TO BE PUT ON  
TRIAL DURING THIS MONTH**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Mar. 6.—Investigating Judge Koelling and Landgerichts-direktor Hoffmann, who instigated false charges of murder against Rudolf Haas, Jewish manufacturer of Magdeburg, will be tried this month by a disciplinary court.

Hoffman and Koelling, it is charged, persuaded Schroeder, who later confessed that he murdered Haas's bookkeeper, Felling, in the summer of 1926, to accuse Haas of having committed the murder.

Haas was arrested and held in prison for some time, being subjected to many investigations, while the murderer enjoyed his freedom under the favor of Hoffmann and Koelling.

The case attracted wide attention in Germany, being termed at the time the "German Dreyfus affair." The Liberals believed that the Jewish manufacturer of Magdeburg was innocent of the charge, while the nationalist and reactionary elements insisted that the Jew was guilty. The collapse of the "frame up" came about when Schroeder, who paraded as the accuser, finally confessed. Haas was released from prison in August, 1926. Announcement was then made that disciplinary

**JESSNER, GERMAN JEWISH  
PRODUCER, IS HONORED BY  
STATESMEN AND ARTISTS**

Berlin, Mar. 6.—Leopold Jessner, well known German Jewish theatre manager and superintendent of the State theatre, against whom the main committee of the Prussian Diet last week voted a resolution of lack of confidence, was honored last night by Germany's most prominent statesmen, writers and artists on the occasion of his fiftieth birthday.

In honor of the occasion a gala performance of Hauptmann's play, "Die Weber" was given at the State theatre. Herr Loebe, president of the Reichstag, was among the prominent statesmen present. The speakers, who included writers and theatrical producers, paid tribute to Jessner's genius. A message of felicitation was read from the Prussian Prime Minister Brauns. A banquet in honor of Herr Jessner was given at the Stage club.

The resolution expressing lack of confidence in Jessner was adopted on February 29 by the main committee of the Diet following charges that his views on the theatre "endanger the moral standard." The move of the Diet committee was the climax of agitation carried on for many years by reactionary and nationalist elements against Jessner.

**PYTHIANS TO ESTABLISH  
HEBREW UNIVERSITY FUND**

Establishment of an endowment for the Hebrew University in Jerusalem has been undertaken by the Knights of Pythias of the 47th District, Brooklyn. A campaign is now being conducted among the 2,500 members of the district in the interest of the United Palestine Appeal. An entertainment will be given at the Brooklyn Academy of Music on Sunday evening, March 25th.

The affair at the Academy of Music is being sponsored by the Past Chancellors Association of the 47th District under the chairmanship of its president, Deputy Grand Chancellor Daniel Gutman. The seven lodges of the district and their Chancellor Commanders cooperating in the campaign are Warren G. Harding Lodge, Julius R. **MAKE MORE COMPLAINTS  
OF ANTI-JEWISH DISCRIMINATION IN MASONIC CLUB**

The discrimination shown by the Metropolitan Masons' Country Club of Briarcliff was not against all Jews stated Daniel N. Mosessohn, editor of the "Jewish Tribune," which revealed the discrimination in the club. Moses Altman, a lieutenant commander of the Scottish Rite bodies in New York, who is high in Masonic circles, was offered a membership, said Mr. Mosessohn, as were Arthur Kuhn and William Klingenstein. "But they refused flatly to join," he said, "when they were told that other Jews were being excluded."

Mr. Mosessohn stated he possesses affidavits made out by Jewish Masons who say they were barred from the club because of their faith.

Mr. Mosessohn said that Sol P. Fink and Herbert L. Solomon, two of the Jews who signed affidavits alleging discrimination, had made specific applications for membership in the Metropolitan Masons' Club. They were told, they said, that the roster of the club was full, and were notified that they had been made members of the Briarcliff Lodge Sports Club instead.

Jerome J. Brandt, a Mason of Centennial Lodge 763, declared before a notary public on Oct. 31 that his application to join was refused "because I am a Hebrew."

**OTTINGER SEEKS REPUBLICAN  
NOMINATION FOR GOVERNOR**

A campaign to nominate Attorney General Albert Ottinger on the Republican ticket will be started soon, it was stated in party circles.

A. T. Fancher of Salamanca, Cattaraugus County, will head Mr. Ottinger's campaign committee, it was said. The Ottinger campaign is expected to start as soon as Mr. Fancher, now in Cuba, returns.

Mr. Ottinger is believed by many to be the best candidate that the Republicans could name to hold down the Democratic vote in New York City, particularly if Governor Smith should be the Democratic nominee for President.

FOR 4000 BOSTON NEWSBOYS**

Youngstown Jewish Community Dedicates New Temple

(By our Youngstown correspondent)

Youngstown, O., Mar. 6.—Dedication of the new Temple Anshe Emeth, Conservative Congregation, will take place during this month.

Several years ago a wing of the Children of Israel Congregation withdrew and founded the Congregation Anshe Emeth Temple. Progress on the new building has been slow, the section composed of the auditorium and class rooms having been completed five years ago. When additional funds became available last summer work was resumed and now the entire structure has been completed. Prominent in this undertaking have been the Frankle brothers.

The spiritual leader of the congregation is Rabbi Eugene Kohn, who succeeded Rabbi B. H. Birnbaum upon the latter's resignation in 1926. Rabbi Kohn is taking an active interest in local Zionist activities and directing the work of the young Judaea clubs recently organized in the city.

There is an active Zionist organization here. The successful drives of the United Palestine Appeal have been directed by Oscar Altshuler, president of the district, D. I. Fish, Samuel Drabkin and A. Kamenetsky.

Among the other functioning Jewish organizations here are the Council of Jewish Women, the B'nai B'rith and the Hadassah.

Recently under the leadership of Rabbi Miller, Temple Emanuel undertook to establish a Jewish Community House. A large building was acquired for this purpose but when the venture proved too large for the congregation to handle alone it was taken over by the entire Jewish Community.

A membership drive was held in 1927 in which the membership was increased with 1300 new members. Harry Levinson was chosen to head the new organization with Max Brunswick, Nathan Grosshandler, Louis Regenstein, president of Temple Emanuel and Clarence J. Strouss assisting him.

The Jewish community of Youngstown numbers about 8,000.

The first Jewish settlers came from Germany, arriving here in the early thirties of the nineteenth century. The descendants of the early immigrants are the most influential Jewish group in the community. They are prominent in the social and business life of the city and include Herman Ritter, I. ## S.A. JEWISH BOARD WARNS AGAINST IMMIGRANTS WHO CAN'T PASS LITERACY TEST

Issues Statement Explaining South  
African Immigration Regulations  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Johannesburg, S. A., Mar. 6.—Several cases of Jewish immigrants who arrived from Eastern Europe and were unable to pass a test in the reading and writing of Yiddish have attracted attention here. The immigration regulations for South Africa require the passing of a literacy test for admittance and recognize Yiddish as one of the languages for the test.

The South African Jewish Board of Deputies issued the following statement in connection with these cases.

"Quite a number of Jewish immigrants have of late been prohibited from landing on arrival in Cape Town because of their inability to pass the education test in Yiddish, in accordance with the requirements of the Immigrants Regulation Act, which stipulates that immigrants to the Union must be able to read and write a European language, and includes Yiddish in that category. In view thereof, my board desires that it should be made known as widely as possible, both among relatives and friends of would-be immigrants as well as among the latter themselves, that in their own interests they must not on any account come to South Africa unless they are able to read and write Yiddish or any other European language."

Former Municipal Court Justice William Blau denied reports that he was to speak at a meeting of protest against the delegation which is coming to the United States from Hungary for the unveiling of a statue of Louis Kossuth. Mr. Blau said that he was not only in favor of a welcome for the delegates, but he also was a member of the committee making plans to unveil the statue.

appealed to the peasant delegates to bring the gospel of education to the village. The peasants, he stated, should not limit the education of their sons and daughters merely to the elementary schools, but rather see to it that the gifted sons of the village obtain a university education. "We need the unadulterated, reliable patriotism of the peasants," he declared.

In an after dinner speech delivered at a banquet held at Debrecen, Prime Minister Count Bethlen told his audience that "religious antagonism does not grow on Hungarian soil."

After the revolution and the war, great anti-Semitic disturbances occurred, it is true. These, however, were merely a reaction to the war and revolution. The Prime Minister related an anecdote which characterizes the "search for the Jew" that dominated those days.

A sergeant in the army grouped the new recruits according to their religion. There were a few of the recruits who declared they belonged to no religion, being "Konfessionslose."

"Choose a religion for yourselves or otherwise I will put you in the Jewish group," the sergeant commanded.

Then, Count Bethlen continued, the Communists and the revolutionary elements, as "Konfessionslose," were put among the Jews and were beaten without distinction.

This state of mind is disappearing. "I do recognize the Jewish question as a social and economic one and will not permit it being made a religious issue," the Prime Minister declared.

Bishop Babariz, who was the next speaker, remarked that he was not inclined to accept anti-Semitism either in its social or economic form.

## FALL RIVER JEWS TO REPLACE TEMPLE DESTROYED IN FIRE

Fall River, Mar. 6.—A new site has been purchased to replace the Beth El Temple destroyed here on February 2 when a fire swept the city, wiping out the entire business section. Communes have already been appointed to plan the building of a new temple. A campaign is already in progress to raise the necessary funds.

## SAN FRANCISCO WELFARE FUND ADDS TO U.P.A. SHARE

San Francisco, Mar. 6.—The amount of money to be allotted to Palestine by the Jewish National Welfare Fund of San Francisco is expected to be increased, as a result of the visit to that city of Louis Lipsky, president of the Zionist Organization.

ner, representative of the Jewish artisans, was also elected.

Doubt seems still to prevail as to whether the candidate of the Left Poale Zion, which united with the Ukrainian workers in Wolyn, was elected.

A Harglass, Zionist, former deputy of Siedlce was elected on the pro-government list.

The National Minorities bloc elected altogether 36 deputies, of whom 6 are Zionists and 1 representative of the Jewish artisans. The Zionists will have ten representatives in the Sejm. In Warsaw the number of votes cast for the National Minorities list amounted to 42,886, while at the previous election the National Minorities polled 50,538.

The election generally is viewed here as a great victory for the Pilsudski regime and it is very likely that his cabinet will have a majority in the new Sejm.
