JULIUS ROSENWALD SUBSCRIBES \$5,000,000 FOR EXTENDING JEW-ISH COLONIZATION IN RUSSIA

\$10,000,000 Fund to be Raised by New Body, James N. Rosenberg Announces; Russian Government Gives Satisfactory Assurances of Continued Assistance; No Public Campaign, Substantial Subscriptions Expected to Follow Rosenwald's; Plan Has No Bearing on Siberia Colonization Discussion

Julius Rosenwald, famous American Jewish philanthropist, has agreed to subscribe \$5,000,000 for the continuance and further development of the Jewish colonization work in Russia.

A fund of \$10,000,000 to secure a long time continuance of the colonization work in the Crimea and the Ukraine will be raised outside and in addition to the sums allotted for Jewish colonization from the \$25,000,000 United Jewish Campaign of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee.

A new society for settling Jews on the land in Russia is now being organized to sponsor the new work.

These facts which outline a new chapter in the rescue work of American Jews in behalf of the Jews in Russia were disclosed by James N. Rosenberg, well known New York attorney, vice-chairman of the Joint Distribution Committee and chairman of the American Jewish Joint Agricultural Corporation in reply to an inquiry of the Jewish Daily Bulletih yesterday.

HUNGARIAN GOVERNMENT ACCUSED OF WEAKNESS IN NUMERUS CLAUSUS ISSUE (Javish Telegraphic Agenes)

Budapest, Mar. 22. — The Bethlen Government was under fire yesterday at a session of a parliamentary committee when the question of the numerus clausus was again discussed.

The committee took up the resolution introduced some time ago by Deptuty Gyoerky, nationalist leader, charging the Bethlen Government with weakness in its attitude on the numerus classus.

The modification bill was the result of foreign pressure, the resolution charged. In the committee yesterday Deputy Byoerky demanded that the Government submit to the League Council a copy of its memorandum on the numerus clausus and a detailed report of the examination of the Hungarian Government representative and of Count Bethlen's declaration in which he had declared that Hungary will either have to modify the numerus clausus law or leave the League.

"The Russian Government, which has cooperated effectively throughout the work of the American Jewish Joint Agricultural Corporation, through the aid of which 100,000 Jews have settled on upwards of one million acres of land within the past four years, thus becoming self-supporting farmers, has given satisfactory assurances of continued and increased assistance," Mr. Rosenberg stated.

The work which will be undertaken with the new \$10,000,000 fund is to follow upon the completion in Russia of the present program of the Joint Distribution Committee and of the American Jewish Joint Agricultural Corporation. "The plan now under

GREEK GOVERNMENT WILL PROHIBIT PUBLICATION OF INFAMOUS PROTOCOLS (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Salonica, Mar. 22-While two leading Greek papers are concluding the publication of the Protocols of the Elders of Zion in a Greek version, the Greek Government is considering the issuance of a decree prohibiting further publication of the forgeries.

A report was current today that instructions were issued by the Ministry of Justice urging the editors of the "Phos" and "Macedonia" not to continue publishing the protocols. "Phos," Royalist paper, has alr Royalist paper, has already finished the entire series, while the "Macedonia," the organ of the followers of Venizelos, Republicans, will shortly complete the publication.

Leaders of the Jewish community here were given the assurance that the order will not prevent them from presenting the Jewish point of view on the protocols in the newspapers. In reply to the interpellation of the

Jewish deputy, Bessantchi, concerning the memorandum of the Prefect of the Evrou District asking for the expulsion of Jews from the frontier region, Minister of the Interior, Maris, declared that the Jewish population has no cause for anxiety. The Government does not consider acting upon the prefect's suggestion to expel the Jews. No Jew will be persecuted because he is a Jew.

AMERICAN COMMITTEE VOTES \$138,000 TOWARD HEBREW UNI-VERSITY BUDGET FOR 1927-28 Felix M. Warburg Presides Over Session of Advisory Body

The amount of \$138,000 was voted by the American Advisory Committee of the Hebrew University in Palestine as its contribution to the budget of the University for the year 1927-28. This decision was taken at a meeting of the committee Wednesday afternoon at the office of Felix M. Warburg, chairman, on the motion of Maurice Wertheim, treasurer.

A cable has been sent to Dr. Judah L. Magnes, Chancellor of the University, informing him that this sum would be forthcoming in monthly installments. Mr. Warburg in summing up a re-

port of the University's activities for the last six months just received from Jerusalem, said: "Despite the earthquake disaster the work of the university has progressed in a very satisfactory manner. The number of regular students attending the University had almost doubled since the last term. The students are enrolled in the departments of the Institute of Jewish Studies, The School of Oriental Studies, the Institute of Mathematics and the Institute of Chemistry."

LABORITES, RILED, DISPERSE KEHILLAH COUNCIL MEMBERS WHEN SESSION IS DELAYED Warsaw Leaders Were in Conference

in Search of Unity (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Mar. 22-A delay of sever-

al hours in the opening of the plenary session of the Warsaw Kehillah Council resulted last night in a near riot.

Following the internal crisis in the Warsaw Kehillah because of the failure of the various parties represented in that body to agree on the budgetary allotments for the school needs of the Jewish population in the capital, an effort was made last night to bring about a modus operandi by an agreement between the Zionists and the Agudists.

Before the scheduled plenary session. which was called by the Kehiliah praesidium, a caucus of the Zionist and Agudist members was arranged. The laborite members of the council, representing the Bund and the Poale Zion. in protest against the delay in the opening of the session, left the hall.

When the session was opened later. in the absence of the labor delegates, laborites assembled in the gallery turned off the lights and raised a tumult which resulted in a near riot. They would not permit the session to take place without the presence of the labor delegates, they declared. They then proceeded to drive the members of the council from the hall. In the skirmish the furniture in the hall was destroyed. The police was called to restore order. The plenary session did not take place.

MATZOTH FACTORY MUST BE CLOSED, COMMUNISTS URGE (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Charkoff, Mar. 22. - A factory to supply the Jewish colonists in some Ukraine districts with matzoth for the forthcoming Passover was started by the Ozet, the society for settling Jews on the land, in Neshin.

The operation of this factory called forth the criticism of the Yiddish communist daily, "Stern," which urges the Ozet to close the factory immediately, even if it involves a loss.

NEW YORK FEDERATION WILL SEEK \$500,000 OVER BUDGET OF LAST YEAR

The amount of \$5,300,000 will be sought this year by the New York Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies. This sum is more than \$500,000 in excess of Federation's 1927 total, it was announced at a dianer of the Businessmen's Council of the Federation held at the Roosevelt Hotel Wednesday night.

Arthur S. Meyer of the Executive Committee of the council declared that a comparison of philanthropic gifts with income tax returns showed that while 2 per cent of the people paid 85 per cent of the income taxes, the 3 per cent of the public representing the heaviest contributors to charity gave only 57 per cent of the total contributed. This, he asserttd, indicated that persons with large incomes were allowing those with small incomes to bear more than their share.

Justice Joseph M. Proskauer said that society was barbarous so long as it did not provide opportunity for every one to earn an honest living, and that it was therefore the duty of the Federation and similar organizations to assist those in distress.

Felix M. Warburg, Chairman of the Federation Board, who presided, announced new officers of the council. They were Frederick Brown, Arthur Lehman and Percy S. Straus, Honorary Chairmen; Eli H. Bernheim, William Goldman, Bernard K. Marcus and Henry Samstag, Vice Chairmen; Colonel H. A. Guinzburg, Treasurer; Walter E. Beer, Associate Treasurer, and Albert J. Erdmann, Secretary.

New Reform Jewish Prayer Book Issued in Germany

(By our Berlin Correspondent) Berlin, Mar. 2 .- A new Jewish prayer

book has just been issued by the Jewish Reform Community of Berlin. Book has been prepared by a commission presided over by Herr Hans Lachmann-Mosse. Its purpose is indicated in a statement made by Dr. Joseph Lehmann, who says: "The bond which binds us with the past, with the nearest and the most distant Jewish spirit, has not been loosened, but strengthened by raising into relief the essential points of our worship. The effect of the Kedusha, the Kaddish, the reading of the Torah, is no longer weakened by long-drawn out prayers before and after. We have cut down to a minimum the recital of long prayers which were mostly verbatim translations of the Hebrew prayers of the old Siddur. We express the basic ideas of the chief of the old prayers in clear and concise form: Praise of the Creator, the Teaching, Israel's mission, the importance of the individual soul, the sin of isolated life, the idea of humanity and the goal of humanity in God's Kingdom of peace and justice.

Liberalezeitung," The "Juedische which circulates a copy of the prayer book in its current issue, speaks of it in connection with the Liberal prayer book which has been prepared by Rabbi Caesar Seligmann and is now in the press and will appear in about two months' time.

"At one time," it comments, "Liberal Judaism in Germany thought that it had to draw a dividing line between Liberal Judaism and Reform Judaism. Only ten BE CLOSED ON SABBATH years ago the official report on Liberal Judaism in the collected volume on 'German Jewry, Its Parties and Organizations', reproached Reform. Judaism for having put the present-day view in place of the eternal truth.

"Since that time," the paper proceeds, "conditions have happily changed. Today there is general recognition in the authoritative circles of Liberal Judaism that Reform Judaism is the Left Wing of Liberal Judaism, constituting a group inside Liberal Judaism. Ideologically and his-torically they belong together. The conviction as to the essence of Judaism, especially the value placed on prophetic Judaism, the recognition of the right of the individual in the religion, the application of the principle of development to the religious sphere also and the conception of the universal character of our community, all these things unite us. Reform Ju-daism is only one trend in Liberal Judaism, and there are some in the Liberal ranks who differ in a great many things from Reform Judaism. This, however, i tell your friends to subservice.

OVER \$75,000 IS RAISED FOR UNITED PALESTINE APPEAL AT 2 DINNERS IN NEW YORK

More than \$75,000 was added to the campaign treasury of the United Palestine Appeal at two dinners this week. Dr. Stephen S. Wise, national honorary chairman, was the guest of honor at the Borough Park dinner held at Union Temple, Brooklyn, and the Washington Heights dinner at the Hotel Astor on Tuesday night.

More than 400 attended the \$100-aplate dinner of the Borough Park Division, the affair marking the seventh annual dinner in the campaign for Palestine funds. Addresses were delivered by Dr. Wise and Rev. Hirsch Masliansky with Isaac Ipp, campaign chairman, acting as toastmaster.

Leading contributions in the \$45,000 raised in Borough Park include Young Israel, \$2,000; Max Jonas, \$2,000; Joseph Dauber, \$1,500.

Characterizing the rebuilding of the Jewish National Homeland as the "miracle of miracles," Dr. Wise said at the Washington Heights dinner, "It isn't often the Jews have a chance to invest in an immortal enterprise. We are not asked to give our lives. All we are asked is to give what we can. We Iews are said to be capable of adventure. The 4,000 years of Jewish history is matchless. In 1858 our fathers were dispossesed from the land to which they had given deep significance. During the years that followed. while they were never hopeless, they were helpless. Within our time the great opportunity has come to us."

In 1919 they had increased to 30 out of every hundred; in 1920 the number was 29 per cent., in 1921 33 per cent., in 1922 40 per cent., in 1923 37 per cent., in 1924 48 per cent., and in 1925 46 per cent.

ICA ARGENTINE COLONIES' WORK DEPICTED IN FILM

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Paris, Mar. 11.—A film depicting the work of the Jewish Colonization Association in the Argentine, was shown here last night to representatives of various organizations and of the press, in connection with the meeting of the Council

Among those present at the showing of the film were the Military Attache of the Argentine Legation in Paris, M. Franz Philippson, President of the Council of the Ica; Herr James Simon, President of the Hilfsverein der Deutschen Juden; Dr. Oscar Kohn; Dr. Alfred Klee; Leo Motzkin; Louis Oungre; M. Edouard Oungre; Rabbi Weil, Rabbi Liber and Rabbi Eisenstadt; Dr. M. Krainin, President of the Emigdirekt; Dr. Latzki Bertholdi: M. Bigar. Secretary-General of the Alliance Israelite. and M. Berl, Editor of "Paix et Droit." the organ of the Alliance Israelite Universelle.

Professor Solomon Reinach delivered an address on the activities of the Ica, tracing its origin from the time when Baron de Hirsch first entered into negotiations with the Russian Government for the purpose of obtaining an alleviation of the position of the Jews of the Russian Empire.
