U. S. TAKES MEASURES FOR BETTERMENT OF JEWISH SITUATION IN ROUMANIA

Minister Acts in Behalf of State Department

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, April 27.—Weighty action with a view of bettering the situation of Jews in Roumania was undertaken by the American Minister to Bucharest, William S. Culbertson, in behalf of the U. S. State Department, states a report in the Bucharest newspaper "Cvintul" today.

The endeavors, which are being made within the limits of international diplomatic propriety, aim to bring about a change in the treatment of the Jewish population in this country.

THIRTEEN SARCOPHAGI OF SECOND TEMPLE PERIOD FOUND NEAR JERUSALEM

Jerusalem, April 27.—Thirteen sarcophagi containing bones belonging to the period of the Second Temple were discovered in a cave near Jerusalem.

The sarcophagi bear Hebrew and Greek inscriptions. Rabbi A. J. Cook, Chief Rabbi of Palestine, asked permission of the Palestine authorities to inter the bones in accordance with the requirements of the Jewish religious law.

The museums of Cyprus and Athens have donated to the Hebrew University the duplications in their antiquities collections.

FIRE SWEEPING GALATZ RAZES TWELVE HOUSES

Bucharest, April 27.—A fire sweeping in from the burning meadows destroyed twelve Jewish houses and stores in Galatz.

Much damage was caused to the synagogue where Holy Scrolls and religious objects were destroyed. Stores in Braila and Plantelor streets were burned. The damage is estimated at fifty million lei.

JOSEPH LANIADO ELECTED TO ASSEMBLY IN SYRIA

Damascus, April 27.—Joseph Laniado, will be the only Jewish representative in the constitutional assembly of Syria.

Mr. Laniado was elected by the Jewish population of Damascus.

JEWISH VICTIMS OF QUAKE IN BULGARIA APPEAL FOR AID; THOUSANDS ROOFLESS

I.O.B.E. Executive Committee Takes Immediate Action

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Cincinnati, O., April 27.—An appeal for urgent aid to bring relief to the Jewish victims who suffered in the earthquake in the Bulgarian cities, Philippopolis, Tchirpan, Haskovo, was received today by Alfred M. Cohen, international president of the Independent Order B'nai Brith.

A cable received from Constantino from Mr. Niego, the president of the B'nai Brith district in Turkey, urges the American headquarters of the order to despatch immediate aid for the thousands of Jews who remain roofless as a result of the earthquake in which their houses were destroyed.

Mr. Cohen stated today that the Independent Order B'nai Brith has taken immediate action to forward aid as requested.

REFERENCES IN TALMUD SUPPORT THEORY THAT ETRUSCANS WERE SEMITES

London, April 27.—The question of the origin of the Etruscan language and Professor Savini's claim to have traced its affinities with Hebrew is raised by Rabbi Isaac Herzog in a letter to the "London Times."

Pointing out that in the Talmud and in the Midrash, Rome is frequently identified with Edom, Dr. Herzog writes: On reviewing the mass of Talmud and Midrash material connected with the subject, one does gain the cumulative impression that in the view of the ancient Jewish Homilists, the equation of Rome with Edom rested upon more than a merely figurative basis, or, that there was a popular belief afloat that at a certain point of time in hoary antiquity a branch of the Edomite race had actually migrated to Italy and participated in the founding of Rome.

HIGHER POST FOR JESSNER, TARGET OF ANTI-SEMITES

Berlin, April 27.—Leopold Jessner, director of the Prussian State Theatre, against whom an extensive campaign was recently conducted by a group of anti-Semites, was elevated to a higher post by Minister of Education Becker.

Herr Jessner was appointed general superintendent of the Prussian State Theatre.

ALFRED LOEWENSTEIN, BELGIAN MILLIONAIRE, DENIES HE IS A JEW

States He is Roman Catholic, in Reply to Question

Alfred Loewenstein, the Belgian millionaire who arrived in New York with a retinue of fifteen persons and five guests, believed by many to be a Jew, is not of the Jewish faith.

When a representative of the Jewish Daily Bulletin attempted to obtain an interview with the financier, one of his private secretaries stated that Mr. Loewenstein was a Roman Catholic.

Unable to reach Mr. Loewenstein, the Jewish Daily Bulletin despatched the following telegram to him: "One of your private secretaries stated to the Jewish Daily Bulletin representative that you were a Roman Catholic. The Jewish press here always believed you are of the Mosaic faith. Before publishing your secretary's statement, we would like to have it verified."

In reply Mr. Loewenstein telegraphed: "Replying to your telegram, I am a Roman Catholic."

The "Jewish Morning Journal" before the publication of this denial, acting under the widespread impression that Mr. Loewenstein was a Jew, commented editorially upon his arrival in (Continued on page 4)

 FELLOWSHIP WINDOW**

Portland, Ore., Apr. 27.—A fellow-ship window, gift of the Christian community of Portland, was presented by Dr. W. Youngson, pastor of the Rose City Episcopal Church, at the dedication of Beth Israel Synagogue today. The new building, which was erected at a cost of \$500,000, replaces the old building which burned down in 1923.

D. Sofia Cohen and Dr. William Elferer who were present at the dedication of the earlier synagogue in 1888 were present at the dedication exercises today.

Henry J. Orenheimer, chairman of the Board of Trustees, accepted the formal presentation of the synagogue by Julius I. Meier, chairman of the building committee.

**JEWES OF BUKOVINA DECIDE
 TO ESTABLISH NATIONAL
 COMMUNITIES FEDERATION**
 Congress Voices Demand for Autonomy of Jewish Kehillahs
 (Jewish Telegraph Agency)
 Czernowitz, April 27.—The formation of a Jewish National Federation for the province of Bukovina, with a view to the creation of a general federation of all the Jews throughout Rumania, was decided upon at the first Jewish conference for Bukovina held here. Over 200 delegates from all parts of Bukovina were present.

The conference calls upon the Jewish representatives in the other Rumanian provinces to form similar federations which will then be linked together in one federation.

Resolutions of protest against the continuing anti-Semitic agitation and against the anti-Jewish excesses in Oradea and Cluj and against the restrictions imposed upon the right of education of the Jewish youth at the Rumanian universities in consequence of the toleration of anti-Semitic manifestations against Jewish students were adopted.

The conference voiced the demand for complete autonomy for the Jewish communities. Another resolution demanded the amendment of the Citizenship Law by which thousands of Jews have been rendered "Szatzenlose," men without a country.

Former Deputy Dr. Mayer Ebner, who with former Senator Karl Klinger convened the conference, was elected president of the federation. Mr. Klinger, Dr. Marcus Kraemer, Fleming and Scerzlieb were chosen vice-presidents.

A consultation between Dr. William Filberman, president of the Union of Rumanian Jews, has taken place on the question of establishing Jewish federations in Transylvania and Old Rumania.

**EDMOND DE ROTHSCHILD'S
 WORK IN PALESTINE IS
 DESCRIBED IN NEW BOOK**
 Nathan Straus Lauds Baron Edmond's
 Munificence

The Palestine work of Baron Edmond Rothschild, who alone invested \$50,000,000 in the Palestine colonies during the past fifty years, is described in a book entitled "Baron Edmond Rothschild, the Story of a Practical Idealist," by David Druck, which is just off the press.

The volume contains a preface by Nathan Straus, leading American contributor for Palestine causes. The publication of the book was sponsored by a committee which included Herman Bernstein, chairman, Dr. Joshua Bloch, Ruben Brainin, Prof. Israel Davidson, Dr. H. G. Enelow, Jacob Fishman, Dr. Samuel Margoshes, Prof. Alexander Marx and William Z. Spiegelman.

The thirty-two chapters constitute the first story of Baron Edmond's work, of which there was no previous connected record. The various trials and tribulations of the colonists, successes and failures, the obstacles and triumphs are described. The English translation of the book is by Leo M. Glassman.

In his introduction Mr. Straus states: "In Palestine the record of Edmond de Rothschild's achievements is perpetuated everywhere—in the colonies he established so many years ago, in the far-sighted building by this practical vision-ary."

"He commenced to translate the dream of Zion into reality twenty years before the immortal Theodor Herzl came into Jewish life as the leader of modern Zionism. The generosity of Edmond de Rothschild had poured millions into Palestine long before its restoration had developed it into an organized national program. He became a determining factor in the life of the Jewish people because in his philanthropy there was so much idealism, so much love and so much vision. And the Jews of the world, particularly the Jews of Palestine, feel a sense of surpassing admiration and genuine love for the man who has rightly been styled one of Israel's greatest Cholim in the new old Zion."

"If not for the colonies established by Baron Rothschild so many years ago, if not for his foresight and his unceasing aid to these colonies, the task of reclaiming Palestine would have been much more difficult than it has been. There was a time when Baron de Rothschild was criticized by other wealthy Jews who regarded these colonization activities as a foolish and useless fancy. But he paid no heed to such criticism, but continued and increased his efforts with unparalleled enthusiasm, with boundless love and unqualified generosity."

CENSUS OF PALESTINE INDUSTRIES IS TO BE TAKEN BY GOVERNMENT

Jerusalem, April 27.—The Government intends to take a census of industries in Palestine on or about May 1, with the object of obtaining data of commercial and industrial conditions in the country, it is officially stated here.

A questionnaire is being prepared and officers of the Department of Customs, Excise and Trade, together with District Officers, will be charged with duties in collecting and collating the information submitted in response to the questionnaire which will be given for completion to all industrial establishments. All information supplied in response to the questionnaire will be treated as confidential and the result of the census will be published in a manner which will not disclose the particulars of individual businesses. The Government has asked that owners and managers of factories, workshops and other industrial establishments will co-operate with the Government in this matter, by answering the questionnaire completely and fully.

JEW'S COLLEGE TO BE PART OF LONDON UNIVERSITY

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, April 27.—Jews' College may become a school of the University of London as a result of a request presented to the University by the College. While maintaining its position as a Jewish Theological Seminary, Jews' College will, should permission be granted, become an institution of university status. The authorities have already decided that the college complies in all respects with the requirements which govern such admittance.

The work of Jews' College, both administratively and educationally, has proceeded satisfactorily during the year 1926-1927, the annual report just issued here declares. There has been growing recognition both within and without the community of the importance of this institution in the religious and educational development of British Jewry, states the report.

At the annual session of the Conference Committee of National Jewish Women's Organizations, which will convene at the Hotel Stevens, Chicago, on Tuesday afternoon, May 1st, the National Council of Jewish Women will be represented by Mrs. Ignace J. Reiss of Chicago, one of its National Directors, and Mrs. Etelle M. Sternberger, its Executive Secretary who is also Secretary-Treasurer of the Conference Committee of the National Jewish Women's Organizations.

The National Council of Jewish Women will also participate in the annual convention of the American Academy of Political and Social Science, the National Conference of Social Work, the annual convention of the Dramatic League of America and will also send a representative to the convention of the Young Women's Christian Association convention in Sacramento, Cal. in response to an invitation.

Jews on Pacific Coast Excel in Sports,

Oakland, Calif., April 22.—Jews have made an outstanding contribution to athletics on the Pacific Coast. Many of the most brilliant stars in the athletic firmament of the West are of Jewish descent.

Five of the leading players on the varsity football team of the University of California are Jewish and there are many others. These five are Irving Harry Marcus, halfback; "Benny" back and Harold Kaufman, guard, Eisan quarterback; Sterling Newman, half-back, Harold Kaufman, guard, Eisan and Newman are half Jewish. Four of them hail from San Francisco, the other, Newman, from Twin Falls, Idaho. Lom has been a "triple threat" man, who could pass, kick or run. Much of the team's attack has been built around him.

At Stanford have been Samuel Joseph, fullback, from Los Angeles, and Herbert Fleishhacker, fullback, son of a San Francisco banker, one of California's leading financiers. Fleishhacker was the brilliant star of the last game with University of California. Rushed in at nearly the last moment, he plunged through the line for big gains, executed a clever forward pass and made possible a brilliant surprise touchdown. In his "prep" days he was national interscholastic shot-put champion.

Two of the University of California men also have shone in other lines of athletic endeavor. Lom is a basketball star, the university's best broad jumper and member of a fraternity baseball team, the Kappa Nu. Marcus has excelled as a boxer and won his Stanford bout this year.

The University of Southern California at Los Angeles has Moses ("Four-Yard") Edelson, flashy half-back, one of the eleven's outstanding stars and rated by most observers as the greatest player on the team except for the famous Drury. He it was, in fact, who made possible most of Drury's sensational runs, providing such interference as the West seldom has seen.

Ed ("Mutts") Todresic was a star on the varsity football and basketball teams of the Stockton High School last winter.

Last year Sam Gold, brother of "Jimmy Duffy," famous professional Pacific Coast boxer, was captain of the University of California boxing team and rated as one of the best amateur boxers on the coast. He won

the following manner:

"We are not ashamed to take pride in a prominent Jew when he attracts the world's attention. However, the faintest order of bluff reveals us and we therefore forgive the metropolitan press wholeheartedly, in fact we even feel a sense of gratitude, for its failure to point out that the first, second or third richest man in the world, Mr. Alfred Loewenstein of Belgium, who is now a pompous guest of New York, is a car 'coreligionist'.

"Wealth is as much of a convenience for Jews as it is for others. We have a sufficient number of poor people, so that several or perhaps several scores of Jewish multimillionaires do not create a balance. We leave it to others, however, to grow enthusiastic about one who derives his distinction from money alone. It seems that this magazine about whom very little was known until several years ago, is a specialist in advertising himself. He carries with him a publicity bureau of his own, obviously for the purpose of attracting wide attention wherever he goes," the paper states.

The first Canadian Conference on Social Work which concluded its sessions in Montreal on Friday, was participated in by Jewish social service workers.

Miss Helen E. By the will of the Hebrew Ladies' Home for the Aged of Boston and the Beth Israel Hospital of Boston will receive 25 per cent of the income. The Hebrew University will receive 4 per cent of the income. Among the other institutions to benefit by the will besides a scholarship at the Boston University, are the Federal Jewish Charities and the Hebrew Free Loan Society of Boston. The balance of the income of the fund is to be applied to other worthy charities.

A biographical contest supplementing the previously announced oratorical contest is being sponsored by the National Young Yujins.

The biographical contest provides for prizes for the best biographies of outstanding Jewish personalities. Six sets of suitable Jewish historical figures have been selected as subjects including David Greisk, Julius Maccabee, Ben Eliaz, Semion Bakel, Haim Mandelstam, and among others. For Semion, Oscar Sussan and Israel Gorenfeld.

The prizes offered are as follows: First prize, \$10 in cash or a Tel Aviv bond, a gold medal and a three month trip to the National Young Yujins Conference; second prize, \$5 in cash or a Tel Aviv bond, and a silver medal; third prize, \$2 in cash or a Tel Aviv bond; and a silver medal.

He gained his boxing knowledge principally at the Olympic club in San Francisco. He has been fighting only about two years but has engaged in between 25 and 30 battles. He is no less proficient mentally and recently passed the examination to the bar of California.

Three years ago Sam Ladar was captain of the University of California basketball team and prior to that was on the Olympic Club team.

Sam Baher, guard of the University of California at Los Angeles basketball team, is one of the fastest running guards in the game.

David Luby is one of Oregon's clever backfield football men.

Dr. Albert Boles Rosenthal is line coach for the University of California varsity football eleven.

William H. Hollander, Oakland attorney, formerly was a professional baseball player, playing with the Oakland club of the Pacific Coast League, and is now scout for the St. Louis Cardinals. He officiates at the San Francisco-California basketball games, having also been a basketball star, and for a time was president of the organization of officials in basketball for Northern California.

Solomon Minkin, playing a smashing game at first base on the regular staff of the San Francisco baseball club this year, formerly was a baseball and football star for Occidental College in Los Angeles.

Sidney Cohen, brother of Andy Cohen, who is making a sensational record as successor to Rogers Hornsby at second base for the New York Giants, is pitching for the San Francisco baseball club.

"Red" Levin is first substitute guard on the Olympic Club basketball team, which won the championship this winter for northern and Central California in the Pacific Athletic Association.

\$50,000 RAISED BY DETROIT U.P.A. FIRST WEEK OF DRIVE

Detroit, Mich., April 27.—The first week of the campaign for the United Palestine Appeal resulted in the raising of \$50,000 toward Detroit's \$110,000 quota, it was reported at a luncheon of workers at noon Friday.

A communication was read from Mayor John C. Lodge, endorsing the campaign. The Detroit mayor wrote:

"It gives me much pleasure to commend the United Palestine Appeal for the upbuilding of the Jewish Homeland in Palestine.

"It is a worthy movement, for certainly no race in the world's history has suffered more from bigoted persecution than the Jewish, and it is only right that at this time leaders of that race should endeavor to re-establish a Jewish Homeland and Government.

"I recommend the movement to all tolerant citizens of Detroit."
