RUSSIAN MONARCHISTS BLAMED FOR SPREAD OF ANTI-SEMITISM IN SOVIET 'Pravda' Declares Anti-Semitism is Worst Enemy of Soviet

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Moscow, May 3.—The propaganda of the secret branches of the Russian monarchist organizations abroad was blamed for the spread of anti-Semitism in the Soviet Union by the "Prayda,"

official Soviet organ. In an article published by the news-paper on April 30 against the anti-Semitic tendencies the paper declares: "These (the monarchist organizations), our enemies, use the anti-Semitic propaganda to provoke distrust in our authority, circulating it whenever there is unemployment, discontent or economic difficulties. They penetrate the ranks of the politically immature workers and unemployment affords them a basis for employees.

The "Pravda" urges the eradication of anti-Semitism as the worst enemy of the Soviets and the workers.

'BOSTON POST' ASKS OFFICIAL RECOGNITION BY CONGRESS OF CHARLES LEVINE'S FLIGHT Calls Upon Congress to Award Distinguished Flying Cross (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Boston, May 3.—The "Boston Morning Post," the largest morning news-paper circulated in New England, in an editorial entitled "How About Levine?" comments on the failure of the United States Congress to recognize Chas. Levine the first passenger to fly across the Atlantic. The newspaper in its editorial declares that Levine receives nothing from his flight, but an official cold shoulder. "Congress should wake up, concludes the editorial, "to the valid claims of American citizens for the honors due heroes."

"Both Houses of Congress performed a graceful act in voting authority to the President to bestow the Distinguished Flying Cross on the three gallant members of the crew of the Bremen. The award was not alone deserved, but Congress was commendably prompt in recognizing the wonderful flight," the paper

"It is pertinent to inquire, however, if Congress has ever heard of Charles A. Levine? Or of Brock and Schlee of Detroit, who not alone hopped across the Atlantic, but continued on to Tokio, Japan, in a record-breaking series of flights? "Levine, Brock and Schlee are, without the least disparagement of the flight of the Bremen, as much entitled to recognition by Congress as the German and Irish fliers. POLICE BAR ROUMANIAN STUDENTS FROM NATIONAL CELEBRATION IN KISHINEFF

Bucharest, May 3. - Two hundred Roumanian students who were preparing to leave Jassy for Kishineff to participate in the Roumanian celebrations of Bessarabia's incorporation into the Kingdom of Roumania were prevented by the police from carrying out their plan.

The measure was taken because of the fear of excesses. The Roumanian press reports that 100,000 visitors from all over Roumania came to Kishineff to participate in the celebrations. Vigorous measures were taken by the police and the military to prevent disorders. No disturbances occurred.

LOS ANGELES KEHILLAH ADOPTS CONSTITUTION (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Los Angeles, Cal., May 3. - With thirty-one organizations represented the Kehillah of Los Angeles adopted its constitution.

Sixty-two delegates, two from each of the various organizations, met as a board of governors with Dr. George J. Saylin, president of the Kehillah, presiding, and discussed the various articles, adopting the constitution almost as reported by the committee, by unanimous vote.

The constitution was prepared by the officers elected at a general meeting, including J. A. Rosenkranz, Aaron Shapiro, Mrs. Albert Mellinkoif, Moses Tannenbaum, Dr. J. L. Reynols, vice president, and A. Fisch, treasurer.

The California Jewish Voice, Yiddish paper published in Los Angeles, has suspended daily publication. The paper will appear as a weekly.

LEAGUE OF BRITISH JEWS SAYS IT WILL CONTINUE TO ADVOCATE ITS PRINCIPLES Llewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, May 3. - Doubts as to whether "the continued existence of the League of British Jews is necessary" are answered in the tenth anmual report of the organization, a non-Zionist body, issued in connection with the forthcoming annual meeting on May 9.

The question was raised in the report which declares that "during 1927 the League was not needed to take any action requiring public notice." With the decline of the attacks on the political status of British Jews and the League's aims have been realized. settlement of the Palestinian question "in approximation with the principles of the League of British Jews," it is urged, the report states, that the

In reply to these doubts the report declares: "This plea has force but it would be shortsighted to ignore the fact that even in this country signs exist of some opposition to the principles on which the Tews obtained complete civil and political emancipation. Moreover, the continued existence of the League is a standing protest and barrier against anyone seeking to foist on the Jews an additional bond of nationality above the religious which for 2,000 years has sufficed to unite them in spiritual brotherhood." child, president of the United Synagogue who is also president of the League. The League is described as an association of British subjects professing the Jewish religion.

SILVERMAN RESIGNATION ACCEPTED BY HADASSAH

Board of Hadassah, it was announced yesterday. "Let us hope that you will in time

come, if not to agree with us, at least to recognize that our actions are directed not by 'a spirit of rancor and hatred,' as you declare, but only by our deep concern as Zionists.

"Please believe that while necessarily accepting your resignation we are not unmindful of the excellent service you have long rendered Hadassah in unstinted measure," the National Board declared in their letter regretfully accepting the resignation.

WORKERS CONFERENCE FLAYS SOVIET FOR SUPPRESSION OF CHALUTZIM ORGANIZATION (Jewish Daily Rulletin)

Detroit, May 3.-The Jewish National Workers Alliance at the closing session of its eleventh annual convention at the Hotel Statler here, reelected Meyer Brown, President: Louis Segall, Secretary and Nathan Zwirin, Vice-President, An executive committee of eleven was elected. A treasurer is to be chosen by a referendum vote of the entire membership, Dr. A. Grossman and R. Plottrott being the candidates.

NEW JEWISH GOLF CLUB FORMED BY OUSTED MEMBERS (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Milwaukee, Wis., May 3.-Following on the attempt of the Michiwaukee golf club to eliminate Jews from its membership comes the announcement of the progress that the Brynwood country club, the new Jewish organization of golf enthusiasts, is making.

Morris Stern is president of the Brynwood club. It was he who sent his resignation voluntarily to the Michiwaukee club as soon as he heard of the Michiwaukee's action Mr. Stern. who is a circuit court commissioner and former member of the Milwaukee school board, announced that nine fairways and greens will be ready for play by the middle of July and that the entire 18 holes will be ready a year from now.

Dr. L. Koppel is secretary of the club. It has a membership now of eighty-six and is limiting its members to 300.

TWO NEW YORK JEWS ELECTED MIZRACHI BANK DIRECTORS (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, May 3 .- Joseph Dauber and Max Stavissky, both of New York. were elected directors of the Mizrachi Bank at the annual meeting held here. The report and proposals of the directorate, including a decision to pay a four per cent dividend this year and reduce the discount by one-half of one percent, were approved. IN OPEN LETTER TO JUDGE MACK

Expresses Surprise That Judge Mack Should Have Presided at Opposition Conference in Washington; Answers Attacks in Resolution

Mack was made public yesterday by furnished by men known to you to Isidore D. Morrison, New York attorney and chairman of the finance committees of the Zionist Organization of America and the United Palestine Appeal.

Other than to acknowledge receipt of the letter, no reply from Judge

Mack was made public.

In his letter, in which he replies to some of the charges against the present Zionist Administration contained in the resolution adopted by the opposition conference Mr. Morrison expresses his surprise that a judge had consented to preside over the proceedings in Washington.

"For the past four years," Mr. Mor-

rison continues, "I have devoted my-

self assiduously to the work of the Zionist Organization and its subsidiaries. My work has not been sporadic but continuous and was frequently done at the sacrifice of my health. You have done me the honor of stating that you believe in my integrity and sincerity of purpose and that you know that I had no axe to grind. Associated with me in this work are many men of prominence in the Jewish community of New York, such as Mr. Abraham L. Liebowitz, who occupies first rank among our Jewish merchants, Mr. Philip Wattenberg who is a prominent builder and who has contributed \$100,000 to the Hebrew University, Dr. David J. Kaliski, a prominent physician with whom you have been long associated in Palestine health work, Mr. Morris Rothenberg, an attorney of prominence and of ability, in whom, I know, you have confidence, and many other men of equal standing. If rumors of mismanagement or diversion of funds were brought to you, the fair thing, the judicial thing to have done would have been to send for me or for any of the other gentlemen prominent in the administration and say to them, 'Gentlemen, such and such allegations have been brought to me, such and such accusations have been made. What are the facts?' You would have gotten them. You could have gone further and said. 'Gentlemen, my many years

((3) This states that the reason remittances have not been made regularly to Palestine is because the present administration has lost the confidence of the public. That, of course, is a conclusion based upon no facts at your disposal and a statement that the reason for the falling off in our collections was due to south winds would have been entitled to equal weight. As a matter of fact, however, our collections have not fallen down and by the end of the year we shall have remitted in full, notwithstanding the fact that all our field directors report that the campaigns have suffered tremendously by reasons of the mud slinging indulged in by some of the leaders of Hadassah and some of the persons who attended your conference.

"(4) The statement is made that by reason of its inexperience, incompetence, etc., the American organization exercised no influence on the World Zionist Organization or the Palestine Zionist Executive. The facts are to the contrary. The American delegation at the last Zionist Congress dominated the proceedings of that gathering and carried through the program decided upon at the last Zionist Convention. The reforms instituted in the administration in Palestine are directly due to the influence of the Zionist Organization of America.

"(5) The Zionist organization is accused of having failed to utilize the available resources for the economic upbuilding in Palestine. How it failed to do this does not appear. No one can point to a serious proposition for the upbuilding of Palestine that ever came to the Zionist organization that was not properly considered.

"(6) The accusation was made at the conference that the Zionist Organization of America has lost in membership. To that accusation we must plead guilty. But, my dear Judge Mack, if you were sitting in our committees, as you had a right to if you chose to do so, and heard read the almost daily cables from Palestine reciting hunger, starvation, unpaid wages and general distress and you were confronted with the problem of either devoting the personnel of the organization for increased membership or gathering of funds for Palestine, which course would you have pursued?
