ASKS PALESTINE GOVERNMENT TO INCREASE PROTECTION FOR WOMEN IN JERUSALEM

Cases of Criminal Assault Grow in Alarming Degree; Crime Sweeps Holy City

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, June 14.—The Palestine Government was officially asked today to increase police protection especially in the evening, for the safety of women and girls in Jerusalem and other cities. A memorandum embodying this request was submitted today to Lord Plumer, the High Commissioner, by the Executive Committee of the Vaad Leumi, National Council of Palestine Jews.

This action has become necessary due to the increase of crime in Jerusalem, particularly assaults on girls and women. The majority of attacks were directed against Jewish girls and women by Arabs. Last night three attempts of assault upon Jewish women occurred in Jerusalem.

Warsaw, May 28.—Representations on behalf of the United States Government to the Government of Palestine, asking greater protection for the families of Americans resident in the country, were made by Oscar Hauser, American Consul General in Jerusalem, according to a report of the Palestine correspondent of the Warsaw "Hajnt."

The action was the result of a criminal attack made by three Arabs upon

RABBI SCHNEURSOHN, TALMUDIC SCHOLAR, DEAD

Warsaw, June 14.—Rabbi Schneur Salman Schneursohn of Ciechanowice, noted Talmudic scholar, died in that city yesterday. He was 72 years old.

Rabbi Schneursohn, who was a member of the famous Chassidic rabbinical family by that name, was widely known as a Talmudic authority.

FIND VALUABLE DEPOSITS IN KALININDORF REGION

Moscow, June 14.—Valuable deposits were discovered by a commission of the Ort in the Kalinindorf region.

The deposits are marl and dolomite, used in the manufacture of cement. The construction of a million dollar cement works employing 400 is planned. The cement manufactured will be sufficient to supply all of the Ukraine.

JEWISH POLITICAL ATTITUDE TOWARD PILSUDSKI PROGRAM UNDERGOES RADICAL CHANGE

Gruenbaum Elected Club Leader; Deputies Force Anti Budget Majority

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, June 14.—A radical turn in the course of Jewish political attitude toward the Pilsudski government was registered at today's plenary session of the Club of Jewish Deputies, which embraces those Jewish deputies who were elected on the tickets of the bloc of national minorities and Zionist groups.

Deputy Isaac Gruenbaum, advocate of the radical attitude, who was out of the office of president of the club for the past four years, under the influence of the deputies from Galicia, was elected president of the club.

The new situation was created when a majority of the club members rejected the motion of the Galician deputies that the members refrain from voting in parliament on the acceptance or the rejection of the government budget. The majority instead, adopted a resolution instructing

JEWISH SENATOR CHARGES COUNT TELEKI WITH INCITING ANTI-JEWISH EXCESSES

Court Trial to Dispute Charges of Editor of Pester Lloyd

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Budapest, June 14. — An interesting trial which promises to reveal the motives and origins of the recent anti-Jewish excesses in the Hungarian universities will take place soon, as the result of a decision by the court of the Hungarian Senate.

The court decided to lift the immunity guaranteed to members of the Upper Chamber, and permit Count Teleki to start proceedings against Senator Josef Veszi, editor-in-chief of the "Pester Lloyd." Mr. Veszi, who recently celebrated his seventieth birthday and the fiftieth anniversary of his widely known paper, was appointed member of the Upper House for life by an order of Admiral Horthy, Regent of Hungary. This honor was conferred upon him by the Regent on the occasion of his seventieth birthday.

The suit is the result of an article published in the "Pester Lloyd" accusing Count Teleki of instigating the anti-Semitic excesses in the universities. The Senate court urged the Senate to lift the immunity.

AGENCY COMMISSIONERS MEET ZIONIST EXECUTIVE IN EXTRAORDINARY SESSION

Discuss Economic Question; Expect Commission to Conclude Work Early Next Week

London, June 14.—The Commissioners of the Non-Partisan Palestine Survey Commission attended an extraordinary meeting of the Zionist Executive held here this afternoon.

The meeting was devoted to economic questions. Dr. Arthur Ruppin and Harry Sacher, member of the Jerusalem Executive, who arrived in London last night, were present at the meeting.

It was stated that the Agency Commission will conclude its work by Monday or Tuesday of next week.

MINNEAPOLIS ADOPTS PEACE AND RECONSTRUCTION PLAN

Minneapolis, June 14.—Dr. Louis I. Harris, New York Health Commissioner, a member of the New York Citizens Committee seeking "Peace and Reconstruction" in the Zionist movement to end the present controversy, presented his program to a joint meeting of Zionists and Hadassah leaders of St. Paul and Minneapolis here last night.

Following the presentation by Dr. Harris, the meeting voted approval of the program of the Citizens Committee and recommended its adoption as a platform for the Pittsburgh convention.

AGUDATH ISRAEL ASKS DELAY ON MEMORANDUM DISCUSSION

SEMINARY PUBLISHES

TWO GENIZAH VOLUMES

The Jewish Theological Seminary of America announces the publication of two volumes of "Genizah Studies in Memory of Doctor Solomon Schechter," forming volumes 7 and 9 of the series of texts and studies published by the Seminary.

In 1902 when Doctor Schechter left England to become president of the Seminary, the University of Cambridge permitted him to bring over a considerable number of Genizah manuscripts which he hoped to publish. This he was prevented from doing and members of the Faculty of the Seminary undertook to edit these in his honor.

The first volume is devoted to Midrash and Haggadah and is edited by Professor Louis Ginzberg. The second volume is devoted to Liturgical and Secular Poetry, edited by Professor Israel Davidson. In the latter volume, besides the Genizah Fragments in Cambridge, texts are included from other distinguished public and private collections although the main portion is of the Taylor-Schechter collection. The price of Professor Ginzberg's volume is \$5.00 and the price of Professor Davidson's volume \$3.50.

DR. MAURICE BLOOMFIELD NOTED ORIENTALIST AND PHILOLOGIST DEAD AT 73 Succumbs Suddenly in San Francisco Following Heart Attack

Baltimore, June 14. — Dr. Maurice Bloomfield, for forty-five years Professor of Sanskrit and Comparative Philology at Johns Hopkins University, died Tuesday night in San Francisco, according to a message received by relatives here. He was seventy-five.

Since his retirement from Hopkins at the close of the academic year in 1926, Dr. Bloomfield has been traveling and passed the winter in San Francisco. A little less than a month ago he was afflicted with a series of heart attacks and his death came suddenly.

Mrs. Bloomfield, as well as his son, Dr. Arthur Bloomfield, head of the Leland Stanford Hospital in San Francisco, were with him at the time of his death.

When he retired from the faculty at Johns Hopkins, Dr. Bloomfield was the oldest member in length of service, having been called to Hopkins Philology in 1881. In educational circles he was regarded as the world's most noted orientalist and philologist.

Dr. Bloomfield was born in Bielitz, Austria, and came to America a boy and at the age of 16 entered the University of Chicago. He received his Ph. D. at Johns Hopkins in 1879.

Dr. Bloomfield had been professor of Sanskrit and Comparative Philology at Johns Hopkins University since 1881. He was vice-president of the American Oriental Society (1905-11); member of the American Philosophical Society; president of the Linguistic Society of America, and a Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. In 1908 he received the Hardy Prize at the Royal Academy of Sciences in Munich.

Among his works on history, religion, literature and language of ancient India, Sanskrit, Greek and Latin grammar, ethnology and the science of religions, are: "The Atharva-Veda" (1899); "Cerberus, the Dog of Hades," (1905); "A Concordance of the Vedas" (1907); "The Religion of the Veda" (1908); "Rig-Veda Repetitions" (1916) and "Life and Stories of the Jaina Savior Parvatanatha". He died for the first time from the original Sanskrit manuscript the Grihyasamgraha of Gobhilauputra, and the Sutra of Kauika, and translated the Atharva-Veda in the Sacred Books of the East.

ORT GOVERNING BODY ADOPTS \$400,000 BUDGET FOR ITS EUROPEAN WORK

To be Submitted for Confirmation to the Central Council in July

Berlin, June 1.—A report on the activity of the Central Administration of the Ort Federation since January 1 was submitted to Dr. A. Singalowsky at the plenary meeting of the Central Administration of the Ort held here. Dr. Singalowsky welcomed Dr. Leo Branson, the Chairman of the Central Administration, on his return after a year of successful work in South Africa.

In South Russia, Dr. Singalowsky said, a further 800 families had been included in the working program of the Ort. In the four and a half months of this year they had increased the number of milch cows and horses and continued the building of houses. The Ort was providing seeds and fodder for the colonies which had suffered from the failure of the harvest. In Poland the spring land-work was being continued in their 12 areas. Credits were provided for seed and inventory. The planting of trees was being continued in three colonies and 60 vegetable gardens had been provided with seeds and fertilizers. In Bessarabia the spring preparation work was being carried on successfully. In several places credits were provided for the purchase of land.

With regard to the technical training work, four new institutions had been established since January with 300 pupils, two in Poland, one in Kovno, and one in Czernowitz. In all, the Ort was maintaining 73 institutions with 5,000 pupils.

In the establishment of continuation courses for apprentices in Poland, difficulties were being raised by the Government in the matter of Yiddish being the language of instruction. They would, however, shortly open six such institutions.

Professor S. Frankfort and Engineer Charnass reported to the meeting on the work of the Co-operative Tools Supply Company. In the course of 1925, it was stated, the Company had had a turnover of \$40,000. In 1926 this had increased to \$75,000; in 1927 to \$150,000 and in the first four months of the present year it had amounted to \$100,000. It was decided to transform the Co-operative Tools Supply Company into a joint stock company and to increase its stock.

Dr. Leo Branson said the Ort basis for the whole of the activity of the Ort Federation was to strengthen the network of the Ort organizations and to increase their membership. In order to safeguard the Ort institutions and prevent further financial crises, he recommended the carrying on of a big campaign in America and the intensification of the campaigns in England, Poland and Bessarabia. There were prospects, he said, for an increased raising of funds

PROPOSES MATRIMONIAL AGENCY TO COUNTERACT INTERMARRIAGE IN GERMANY

Prof. Hanauer Would Also Provide Dowry for Poor Jewish Girls
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, June 14.—In an attempt to combat the decreasing number of Jewish marriages and the growing number of mixed marriages, Professor Hanauer of Frankfurt has put forward a proposal for the establishment of a Jewish Matrimonial Agency. According to his plan, the agency would extend all over Germany. It would have a fund out of which to provide trousseaux for poor Jewish girls to help them to be married. It would also make it its business to spread healthy ideas about marriage generally and would act as a matrimonial intermediary.

The cost of administration of the proposed institution is estimated at about 5,000 marks annually.

BEQUEATHS \$27,000 FOR THE ZIONIST FUNDS

The Jewish National Fund and the Zionist Organization of America will receive the amount of \$27,000, by the will of the late Hirsh G. Kliatscho of Brooklyn, N. Y. filed for probate.

Ten thousand dollars will go to the National Fund and \$17,000 to the Zionist Organization. The residue of the estate of \$47,690 will go to children of the deceased.

On Saturday morning, June ninth, the services at Temple B'nai Brith, Los Angeles, Cal., were conducted by Rabbi Edgar F. Maginn, after which the Torah scrolls were removed from the Ark as a symbol of the departure of the congregation from its present edifice. The new temple, which will cost over a million and a half dollars and which is now in course of construction will be ready next Spring. It will consist of three buildings. The congregation was founded in 1862. The present building is thirty-six years old.

Mrs. Sallie Kublic Glauber, founder and former President of the New York Federation of Temple Sisterhoods, died at her home in New York City Wednesday. The funeral services will be held this morning in Temple Emanuel, El, of which she was a member.

Mrs. Glauber was active in Jewish charitable, educational and communal work.

Columbus, O., June 10.—The annual convention of District Grand Lodge No. 2 of the I. O. B. B. concluded here with the election of Isidore Feibleman of Indianapolis, as president.

Other officers chosen were: Samuel I. Seifers, first vice-president; Leonard H. Freiberg, of Cincinnati, second vice-president and also reelected secretary, and William Ornstein, of Cincinnati, reelected treasurer. The new General Committee consists of the following: King Baer, Toledo, O.; Louis Drucker, Cleveland, O.; Herman Cronheim, St. Louis; Eph Levin, Indianapolis; Rabbi Morris Bergman, Pueblo, Colo.; and Abe Weinfield, Columbus, O.

The District Court members are: Jack Friedland, Youngstown, O. president; Leo Sanders, Trinidad, Colo.; William Stone, St. Louis; and Samuel Fleck, Marion, Ind.

Mayor James J. Thomas, of Columbus, welcomed the convention. Mr. Feibleman reviewed his past term as vice-president and gave recommendations for the future work of the order. Louis J. Bornstein, past president of the lodge, paid tribute to Mr. Feibleman in formally placing his nomination before the convention.

Grand President Alfred M. Cohen spoke on "Hopeful Signs," in which he described events in American Jewish life and what B'nai Brith is accomplishing.

Reports from the various committees indicated that the Wider Scope Campaign, which is drawing near its conclusion, has been successful. The State Deputies reported. The B'nai Brith Hill Foundation choir of the Ohio State University entertained the delegates at the Sunday evening banquet at the Deshler-Wallick Hotel and on Monday night Rabbi Abba Hill Silver of Cleveland delivered a thrilling message on Jewish education, in which he declared that two out of every three Jewish children are receiving no Jewish education. He praised the work of the Hill Foundation and asked them to establish as many as possible, so that Jewish education might be furthered. He concluded, "I believe God has destined the Jews of America to produce a Jewish culture that will excel the culture of the Golden Age of Spain."

NEW YORK GREW MORE IN LAST 25 YEARS THAN IN CENTURY BEFORE; DUE TO JEWS

Joseph P. Day Tells Board of Trade of Jewish Influence

Under the influence of the Russian Jew in business, New York City has grown more in the last twenty-five years than the preceding century or more, declared Joseph P. Day, real estate operator, before the monthly meeting of the New York Board of Trade and Transportation.

Beginning with the Indians, Mr. Day named seven major "tribal invasions" which affected the growth of the city. Following the Indians came the Dutch, and the city boundary on the north was advanced to Wall street, he said. After the Anglo-Saxon invasion, he said, the city advanced to the present position of Chamber street, and then extended to Forty-second street with the "invasion" of the Germans.

Subsequent eras Mr. Day described as the Irish, the Italian and the Russian-Jewish invasions.

the club members to vote against the budget of the Pilsudski government. The Galician deputies, headed by Dr. Leon Reich, argued that a vote against the government budget might lead to an overthrow of the Pilsudski government, which would, they asserted, transfer the power to the Pilsudski opposition. This, in turn, would create a catastrophic situation for Polish Jewry.

The Gruenbaumists on the other hand charged that the Pilsudski government has failed to fulfill the demands of the Jewish population in Poland, particularly in the economic field. It is true, the Gruenbaumists argued, that the Pilsudski government has brought consternation in the anti-Semitic camp, but its policy of continuing the anti-Jewish practice in economic branches is disastrous. The Club of Jewish Deputies cannot, therefore, in faithfulness to its electorate, vote to support such a government.

Following the adoption of the Gruenbaum program, the deputies from Galicia read a statement in which it is declared that they decline responsibility for the consequences of the new situation.

Deputy Gruenbaum was elected to succeed Dr. Jacob Wygodski, deputy from Vilna, who acted as chairman of the club because of his seniority.

GERMAN PAY TRIBUTE TO CLAUDE MONTEFIORE ENGLISH LIBERAL LEADER (J. T. A. Mail Service)

Berlin, June 6.—A special issue to observe the seventieth birthday of Claude G. Montefiore, was published by the "Juedisch-Liberale Zeitung," containing articles by Herr Heinrich Stern, the President of the Federation of Liberal Jews in Germany, Dr. Leo Baeck, President of the Union of Rabbis in Germany, and Miss Lily Montague, Honorary Secretary of the World Union of Progressive Judaism.

"If Montefiore, the President of the World Federation of Liberal Judaism, belongs primarily to our movement," writes Herr Heinrich Stern, "it must be remembered, however, that he is no one-sided partisan, but a man who has always kept in touch with Jewish life as a whole. In less than eight weeks from now Claude G. Montefiore, as the recognized and official leader of Liberal Judaism, will open the World Congress of Liberal Judaism here. It will be a public manifestation of what all who stand close to Liberal Judaism now feel inwardly—the leader of our movement will be among us. God keep and guard him that he shall see his work bear fruit. God keep him for his family, his friends and co-workers, for Judaism and mankind."

"On his seventieth birthday," writes Dr. Leo Baeck, "we all who know him give our heartiest congratulations to Claude Montefiore—a septuagenarian whom no one will credit his years. We honor above all his personality. We are grateful to have such a man and we hope that he will longer remain among us."

Miss Lily Montague writes: "He has shown in his life that it is possible to convert the Jewish ideal of sanctification into reality, for he has attained it not only in his work but also in his daily life. His kindness and his child-like spirit have made him beloved among all his co-workers and among the pupils in the various institutions with which he is associated. They all recognize in him a friend."

"There have been times when Claude Montefiore was the most abused person in our public life. "Claude Montefiore has worked not only for Judaism. For fifty years his name has been identified with every social movement in the community. As the Prophet of Liberal Judaism, he will certainly find an important place in Jewish history, but as the friend of the poor and of all who suffer, as the untiring worker for the elevation of the Jewish masses and the purification of Jewish life and as the ever wakeful guardian of Jewish honor he has found a secure place in the hearts of his Jewish brethren. His activity has not been restricted to his own fatherland. As President of the Anglo-Jewish Association and the Joint Foreign Committee, he was for a whole generation one of the driving forces in the great relief work by means of which West European Jewry seeks to liberate the East European Jews from oppression, suffering and ignorance. Although he rejects Jewish nationalism, he is not untouched by what affects the House of Israel; even as he is a religious universalist, he is a universalist in the love of his neighbor and in charity. He is a great Jew and a true and steadfast Englishman."

the daughter of an American Jewish family, whose name was not disclosed. The girl went for a walk at nine o'clock in the evening, accompanied by a young man, also the son of an American Jewish family in Palestine. When they were near the old city wall, on the road to the Polish Consulate, they were attacked by three Arabs.

The young man ran to call the police but when he returned with a gendarme, the girl was found unconscious, her mouth gagged. The assailants had fled after committing the crime. In the majority of cases preceding this one, the assailants have not been apprehended, the correspondent states.

The family appealed to the American Consul and as a result of his intervention, a general search was made by the Jerusalem authorities under the personal direction of the chief of the Palestine police. The three assailants were arrested and tried on May 15, behind closed doors. The American Consul was present at the proceedings. Norman Bentwich, Palestine attorney general, acted as the prosecutor. Large crowds gathered around the court house, awaiting the result of the trial.

Each of the three was sentenced to fifteen years imprisonment at hard labor. This was the heaviest punishment imposed for such cases in Palestine in recent years.

Jerusalem, June 14. — Safonov, a Jewish policeman on guard near the Petach Tikva railway station was shot and instantly killed last night.

The murderers were not caught. It was stated at police headquarters that the crime was committed by thieves in an attempt to escape.
