MINORITIES CONGRESS DEMANDS A CHANGE IN LEAGUE PROCEDURE

Present Method Termed Inadequate in
Bringing About Speedy Redress
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Geneva, Aug. 31.—A change in the procedure for the submission of complaints by national minorities against the violation of their rights, guaranteed in the international peace treaties, was demanded by the National Minorities Congress in session here in a resolution adopted today.

The resolution gives expression to the dissatisfaction prevailing among the minorities with the present procedure which is termed "inadequate" to bring about speedy redress and protection for the national minorities by the League of Nations.

DISTRICT GOVERNOR ANNULS JEWISH COMMUNITY ELECTIONS

Warsaw, Aug. 31.—The Jewish Student House was raided last night by the Polish political police.

The search lasted four hours. Nothing of a compromising nature was found on the premises and no arrests were made.

LONDON PRESS SAYS CHAPLIN'S MOTHER WAS JEWESS

London, Aug. 31.—London newspapers in reporting the death of Mrs. Hannah Chaplin, mother of Charles Chaplin, definitely states that Mrs. Chaplin was a Jewess.

Mr. Chaplin on several occasions in press interviews denied that he was a Jew or of Jewish origin.

SENIOR DIRECTOR OF LEAGUE'S MINORITIES' SECTION

VIENNA GOVERNMENT DIS- CRIMINATES AGAINST JEWISH APPLICANTS FOR CITY POSTS

Democrats at Helm; Accept them Only
When They Leave Jewish
Community

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Aug. 31.—The municipal government of Vienna, now under the control of the Social-Democrats, is discriminating against Jewish applicants for city posts and, by its action, is responsible for a number of withdrawals from the Jewish community.

This charge was made today by the "Neue Welt," Zionist Weekly published here. The paper gives names and cites specific instances when Jewish applicants for the municipal civil service were rejected only to be accepted later when they presented proof that they had declared themselves to be "Konfessionlos" (without a faith) and had withdrawn from the Jewish community.

The newspaper quotes the utterances of several influential city officials who frankly stated that belonging to the Jewish faith was a hindrance.

DESI, JEWISH JURIST, NAMED TO HUNGARIAN GOVERNMENT POST

Interpreted as Attempt to Appease
Jewry for Notorious Anti-Semite's
Inclusion in Ministry

Budapest, Aug. 31.—Geza Desi, Hungarian Jewish jurist, member of the government party, will be appointed State Secretary in the Ministry of Justice, it was stated today on good authority.

In parliamentary circles the announcement called forth the comment that Desi's appointment was a move on the part of the government to appease Hungarian Jewry for the appointment of Julius Goemboes, notorious anti-Semitic leader, to the position of State Secretary in the Ministry of the Interior. The official announcement of both appointments is to be made simultaneously.

PALESTINE AGAIN FACES SERIOUS WATER SHORTAGE

Jerusalem, Aug. 31.—The population of Palestine is again facing a serious water shortage.

The authorities have ordered measures to be taken to furnish the cities and towns with an adequate water supply. Jerusalem will have to receive water by train from Ramleh.

DECLARES RUSSIAN JEWS LOOK TO AMERICA FOR CONTINUED RELIEF

Rabbi Goldman Gives Pessimistic Report
on Condition of Russian Jews

That Russian Jews are in need of further relief and look to American Jewry for this assistance was the statement made by Rabbi Solomon Goldman of the Jewish Center Cleveland, on his return to New York following a three months trip in Europe.

Speaking on conditions in Russia, the Rabbi described the pessimistic impression which he carried away from that country.

"Help us, help us" were the words that greeted me on all sides," Rabbi Goldman said. "In a restaurant in Leningrad, on the Tverskaya in Moscow, in the synagogue court of Minsk, everywhere in Russia Jews told a tale of misery and poverty and pleaded for more relief. The American Jew is still considered the fore-ordained Joseph.

"If synagogue attendance is any indication of the spiritual status of the Jewish community, then the integrity of Russian Jewry remains unshaken. But somehow one senses little or no future for minorities under the present Soviet regime. The Jewish youth is caught up in the maelstrom of the proletarian philosophy, he has turned his back on the problems of his people. He sees no Jewish people. Inter-marriage is growing by leaps and bounds. The reader of Jewish literature and the student of Jewish history are hardly to be found. The children with but few exceptions receive no Jewish education. The Yiddish language is rapidly losing ground. It is now used largely as a vehicle for Bolshevist propaganda. The Russian Jew has weathered many a storm. Can he save himself now? Only extreme optimists or pessimists will speak with definiteness," Rabbi Goldman concluded.

RABBI HERTZ TO PRESIDE OVER RELIGIOUS PEACE CONGRESS

Geneva, Aug. 31.—Dr. J. H. Hertz, the Chief Rabbi of England, will preside at one of the sessions of a Conference called in Geneva for September 12th, for the purpose of preparing for a world congress of religious factors for world peace.

The Conference is being arranged by the Association of Churches for World Peace. The object of the Conference is to prepare for a congress uniting all those who see in religion a stimulus for world peace.

JEWISH IMMIGRANTS IN PARIS SECURE EMPLOYMENT (J. T. A. Mail Service)

Paris, Aug. 20.—In the month of July, the percentage of placements by the employment offices for Jewish immigrants here was greater than in the previous month, according to figures made public.

There were received 751 visits by 375 persons, of whom 133 were placed in positions; sixty-one of the total number of applicants were specialists and sixty-two were manual laborers and domestic servants.

During the month of June the employment offices recorded a total of 629 visits by 300 persons, of whom 147 were registered in June and the remaining 153 in the preceding month.

Ninety-six of the 300 applicants were placed in positions exclusively in the provinces, outside of Paris. Of this number, fifty were specialists and the rest manual laborers and domestic servants. Twenty were given work in the metallurgical industries, six at building construction, thirteen at dress-making and other needlework, three in the liberal professions, two in commercial business, and five at various other occupations.

JEWISH CENTERS HOLD THREE STATE AND REGIONAL CON- VENTIONS OVER LABOR DAY Hundreds of Delegates to Attend Sessions

Hundreds of delegates from Y. M. H. A.'s, Y. W. H. A.'s and Jewish community centers are attending the three conventions of the Y. M. and Y. W. H. A. Federations being held over the Labor Day week end, according to an announcement from the Jewish Welfare Board in New York.

In New England, the Associated Y. M. and Y. W. H. A. are meeting in Portland, Me. On the program are the Governor of Maine, Hon. Ralph O. Brewster; Dr. Augustus, Commissioner of Education in the State of Maine; Hon. Albert Hurwitz, president of the Associated Y. M. and Y. W. H. A.'s of New England; Louis E. Kirstein of the Executive Council of the Jewish Welfare Board; and Dr. Maurice B. Hexter, Executive Director of the Federated Jewish Charities of Boston.

There will be a discussion on "The Program of the Jewish Center," opening with an address by Rabbi Aaron G. Robinson Executive Director of the Y. M. and Y. W. H. A. of Newark, N. J. Benjamin Rabinowitz, the Jewish Welfare Board's field secretary for New England, will report on the work of the Board in that territory.

Allentown, Pa., is acting as host to the convention of the Pennsylvania Federation of Y. M. and Y. W. H. A.'s.

The Middle Atlantic States Federation of the Y. M. H. A.'s and Kindred Associations are meeting at Richmond, Va. An address will be delivered by Attorney General Saunders of Virginia, Samuel Leff, field secretary of the Jewish Welfare Board, will discuss "Essentials of Sound Y. M. H. A.'s and Y. W. H. A.'s"

For the observance of the Jewish New Year, Rosh Hashonah, and the Day of Atonement, on September 15, 16 and 24, the Jewish Welfare Board has issued a bulletin containing questions and answers relating to the High Holy Days; a list of subjects for essays, sermons, and addresses; directions for conducting religious services for young people; selected references; quotations in prose and verse and an outline of the main facts concerning the significance and observance of Rosh Hashonah and Yom Kippur.

Continuation classes for girls who have graduated from a Talmud Torah or from some other qualified school will be conducted by the Women's Branch of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America, Mrs. Herbert S. Goldstein, president of the Women's Branch, announced.

The classes will meet in the evening at the Community House of the Ohav Zedek

\$125,000 PLEDGED BY QUEBEC GOVERNMENT FOR JEWISH SANATORIUM RECONSTRUCTION Complete Rebuilding Cost Placed at \$300,000

Montreal, Aug. 31.—The government of Quebec will contribute the amount of \$125,000 for the reconstruction of Mount Sinai Sanitarium, a Jewish institution.

The sanitarium was built fifteen years ago and is now maintained by the Federation of Jewish Charities in Montreal. The structure was found to be unsafe and inadequate for the growing needs. According to the plan the sanitarium is to be equipped with a new building, the erection of which will cost from \$250,000 to \$300,000, and when completed will have a bed capacity of 100.

FELIX WARBURG DECLARES FOR HOOVER AS PRESIDENT

The Republican Campaign Committee in New York issued a statement yesterday by Felix M. Warburg, in which the philanthropist declared himself in favor of Herbert Hoover for President.

"I am not only for Mr. Hoover, but I am an enthusiastic supporter of his," said Mr. Warburg, who is a Republican. "My conviction is based on my personal acquaintance with him. I have been associated with him in a number of ways, from which I have been able to satisfy myself that his heart has always promptly responded to people in need, that his judgment in matters American and international has been excellent and that his leadership is irresistible. I am sure I am only one of many who admire him because they have worked under him."

"I am not influenced entirely by the fact that Mr. Hoover is unquestionably the ablest man we have to administer the business affairs of the nation. It is important that our material prosperity continue and increase, but it is far more important that the well-being of humanity in general be furthered. Mr. Hoover has the advantage of having done this."

Mr. Warburg was closely in touch with Mr. Hoover in the latter's relief work abroad, especially in connection with the Jewish Joint Distribution Committee. Through his philanthropies in America Mr. Warburg has been further in touch with Mr. Hoover's child welfare work and other efforts to bring about better living conditions.

JABOTINSKY JOINS JUDEA LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY, LTD. AS VICE PRESIDENT

Head of Zionist Revisionists Will Take Up Residence in Jerusalem

Jerusalem, Aug. 31.—Vladimir Jabotinsky, head of the League of Zionist Revisionists, has joined the Judea Insurance Company, Limited, it became known here today.

Mr. Jabotinsky will act in the capacity of vice-president and will take up residence in Jerusalem.

The Judea Industrial Corporation of New York which owns and controls the Judea Insurance Company Ltd. of Palestine, in a statement given today to a representative of the Jewish Daily Bulletin confirmed the report that Vladimir Jabotinsky was elected vice-president and treasurer of the Judea Insurance Company Ltd. at the statutory meeting of the company held in Jerusalem, August 14, 1928.

Mr. Jabotinsky who is residing in Paris intends to leave with his family about the middle of September to settle in Jerusalem.

At the same meeting Mark Schwartz who was the director of the Palestine Department of the Zionist Organization of America, was elected Executive Director of the Judea Insurance Company Ltd. Mr. Schwartz is now in Jerusalem in charge of the head office of the Company.

Judge Jacob Strahl, the president of the Judea Industrial Corporation left Jerusalem on August 28. While there the president concluded an agreement with a large reinsurance company for reinsuring the excess business of the company which is being done in Palestine and Egypt. This agreement provides for the investment of all premiums collected by the company to be retained for investment in Palestine according to the statement of the New York company.

The office of the company in Cairo, Egypt is headed by the well-known Egyptian-Jewish financier, Cattaui Pasha, the president of the Commercial Bank of Egypt.

The offices of the company in Alexandria, Egypt are in charge of the bankers, Aglion Freres, who are the general agents for the Judea Insurance Company Ltd. for that section of Egypt.

The seventh annual convention of the Young Poale Zion of America and Canada opened its sessions in Milwaukee on Friday. The convention will continue through Monday. The first session was held at the Golden Links Temple. William Henry, national executive of the Socialist Party was the principal speaker.

The closing session will be in the nature of a memorial meeting to Dr. N. Sykin, Poale Zion leader who died four years ago. The business sessions will be held in the Jewish Folk Institute.

Yiddish in South Africa

Johannesburg, July 29.—A great deal of Yiddish is spoken in South Africa, but only among the unfashionable classes for unofficial purposes.

Practically no Jew in South Africa speaks Yiddish who was born outside of certain countries in Eastern Europe, or who left those countries before adolescence, or who has had what is known as an "education," very rarely does a Jew speak Yiddish who is a member of a profession, or who has been admitted into "society." Moreover, one of the greatest ambitions of any Jew, wherever born and of whatever status, who comes to South Africa, is to learn English; which he has no sooner done to his own satisfaction than he discards Yiddish for any official business or public purpose; when buying or selling, talking over the telephone or shouting across the street, addressing a Barmitzvah party or the Snipshok Benefit Society—he talks English.

Nevertheless, it is true to say that a great deal of Yiddish is spoken in South Africa, for there is a large population of Jews who have come from the Eastern European countries after the onset of adolescence, who speak a language at home, sometimes in the street, and occasionally even in public—that has a system of sounds, a sentence-structure and a spirit of its own. And while this element is diminishing on the one hand by natural decrease, it is increasing on the other by an inflow of immigrants from the Yiddish-speaking centres. If there were no such immigration, Yiddish would very likely die out in the course of the next three generations. For whatever the language of the South African-born Jewish child may be, it is not Yiddish; although perhaps 50 per cent. of the second generation understands the language to some extent, and perhaps 50 per cent. of these again can, upon compulsion, speak a garbled form of it.

When one comes to consider Yiddish as the basis of some culture, even if only to the extent of newspaper publication, one is confronted with a very sad situation indeed; for, from that point of view, Yiddish in South Africa hardly exists.

In the history of the Jews in South Africa, I really believe there have been more than a dozen attempts to have a periodical published in Yiddish. Yet there has been in existence up to now just one paper—a weekly. As for books, the records are not worth looking into. If we again say a dozen, I think we are in no danger of understatement.

There does exist in Johannesburg a

HEBREW UNIVERSITY OFFERS COURSES IN JEWISH AND HEBREW STUDIES

Applicants May Enter Country upon Financial Guarantee

Jerusalem, Aug. 31.—The detailed program of the extended scope of courses to be offered by the humanities department of the Hebrew University during the year 1928-29 was made public today by Dr. Judah L. Magnes, Chancellor of the University.

The courses include Talmudic philosophy, Gaonic, Hebrew jurisprudence, Hebrew literature, Palestine research, Jewish philosophy, Bible, Jewish sociology, Arabic literature, Islamic history, Islamic art, modern philosophy, Hellenistic history and Greek literature.

Applicants for admission to the Hebrew University may receive a permit from the Palestine government to enter the country through the offices of the Hebrew University, if such students produce a guarantee from a financial institution in Palestine that they will be in possession of £180 for three years' expenses.

PALESTINE ARTISTS' CANVAS AT LONDON EXHIBIT

London, Aug. 15.—Mr. David Bomberg, a prominent Jewish Palestinian artist, is among the exhibitors at the Canadian National Exhibition arranged by the Canadian Government now open here.

Mr. Bomberg went into the deserts of Transjordan travelling by donkey and camel. Several attempts were made upon his life by Bedouins. However, he succeeded in reaching Petra, where he stayed for six months, painting the great rock facades. The picture which he is showing at the Canadian National Exhibition is "The Rock Facade, North East Wall, Petra."

When he exhibited in London a few weeks ago, showing many of his Palestine paintings, Lord Melchett and Sir Philip Sassoon, the British Assistant Air Minister were among the patrons, and Sir Ronald Storrs, who bought many of Bomberg's paintings when he was Governor of Jerusalem, wrote the introduction to the catalogue. Bomberg has a war picture in the Government House in Toronto, and recently a picture of his "Outside Damascus Gate, Jerusalem," was bought by the City of Manchester for its Art Gallery.

The thirty-sixth anniversary of Rabbi William Rosenau's service at the Entwaw Place Temple, Baltimore, occurred on Friday. Dr. Rosenau is now on his way home from Europe. His congregation is planning a three-day celebration of its diamond jubilee in October.

ASCRIBE DELAY IN GERMAN POLISH COMMERCIAL TREATY TO FEAR OF JEWISH INFLUX

Charge of Anti-Semitism Made by Well Known German Publicist (J. T. A. Mail Service)

Berlin, Aug. 23.—That anti-Semitism has been made one of the main issues in the negotiations now pending for a Polish-German Commercial Treaty is the charge of a well-known German financial publicist, writing under the pen-name of "Morus" in the radical-pacifist "Weltbuehne." The writer accuses the German representatives of dragging out the negotiations deliberately, because they are fearful of a heavy influx of Polish Jews into Germany under the new treaty.

"Morus" asserts that "in concluding a commercial convention for a long term, both parties should have mutually guaranteed the citizens of each country the right of residence and business in the other country. This, however, is where the difficulty arises. On the German side the official apprehension has been lest Poles should emigrate in large numbers to East Prussia; but unofficially the real trouble has been the fear of Polish Jews entering Germany in large numbers. This problem is, fundamentally, merely a Jewish problem. It is high time to raise the question, the writer says, as to whether the Germans ought to forego the right to settle in Poland because of the fear of Polish Jews entering Germany."

The article has created a mild sensation in Germany, and the Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith has sent an inquiry to the Vice-President of the Province of East Prussia as to the reliability of the charges made by "Morus." The Vice-President, in his reply, denied existence of any official anti-semitic considerations on the German side, whose sole considerations are political and economic.

PALESTINE JEWISH DOCTORS AT TROPICAL MEDICAL CONGRESS

Jerusalem, Aug. 21st.—Jewish physicians of Palestine will take a prominent part in the International Congress on Tropical Medicine which will be held in Cairo, it became known here today, when it was announced that about fifty Palestinian doctors will participate in the Congress.

Papers on various subjects concerning the medical status of Palestine will be read by a number of Jewish doctors at the Congress. Over a thousand delegates from all over the world are expected to participate. The hundredth anniversary of the Medical School in Cairo will be celebrated during the Congress.

Rabbi A. B. Rhine of Hot Springs, Ark., pronounced the benediction at the ceremonies notifying Senator Robinson of his choice as Democratic candidate for the Vice-Presidency of the United States.

Yiddish Literary Society—a very small body, very limited in power and influence, that yet forms a small centre where Yiddish retains a little of its vitality and cultural value. This society has from time to time issued a journal, always a short-lived affair. It is the first issue of a renewed attempt that has stimulated these remarks. The introductory editorial admits that what has been an encouragement is the inflow of immigrants "who cannot and do not desire immediately to cut themselves adrift from what has been part of their life in Eastern Europe."

The editors state that the journal will keep up contact between South African Jewry and the cultural centres of Yiddish will discuss specifically Jewish problems, and will reflect the life of all the peoples of South Africa. They consider it of importance that a Yiddish culture should be developed here, and they promise to encourage local literary talent. They are proud of the fact that almost the whole of the first issue consists of local contributions.

In an article, E. M. P. point out that, although we give large sums of money for Jewish causes in other countries, we do next to nothing to foster Jewishness in South Africa itself: "Upon platforms we hear of Jewish interests, the Jewish spirit, Hebrew culture, but at home we speak English, and attach ourselves and our children by a thousand bonds to English culture, English life, and show no signs of Jewishness."

Another contributor, A. A., shows succinctly and clearly the necessity for Jews becoming a productive element in South Africa.

Rabbi Nathan Krass and Samuel Untermyer are among the thirty-six members of the Advisory Board of the Religious Film Trust which will film religious talking pictures in Palestine.

The project is to be non-sectarian. It was said, providing films suitable for presentation in churches of all creeds throughout America.

Professional players will be chosen for the principal roles with the cooperation of the Episcopal Actors' Guild of America, the Catholic Actors' Guild of America, the Jewish Actors' Guild and others.

PALESTINE TEACHERS DEMAND AUTONOMY FOR HEBREW SCHOOLS

Conference Also Urges Zionist Executive to Cancel Dismissal Notices (J. T. A. Mail Service)

Jerusalem, Aug. 16.—A demand for the maintenance and autonomy of the Hebrew schools in Palestine was voiced in a resolution adopted at the annual conference of the Hebrew Teachers in Palestine, which concluded its session today. The resolution refers to the Draft Education Ordinance, which was published in October 1927 and aroused opposition among all sections of the population, Arab and Jewish, including both the Zionist and the Orthodox sections of the Jewish Community.

The Conference also adopted a resolution urging the Zionist Executive to cancel all the dismissal notices to teachers and kindergarten workers.

The Conference elected a new Central Committee composed of Mrs. Feinsud-Sukenik, Drs. Engel, Rivlin and Hayoth, and Messrs. A. Yellin, Erlich, and Kim. chi.

The twenty-fifth anniversary of the Teachers' Organization will be celebrated in December, during Chanukah week, it was announced at the Conference.

TO LAUNCH OTTINGER BOOM AT DINNER

The move to make Attorney General Albert Ottinger the Republican nominee for Governor will be launched officially at a dinner at the Hotel Astor Monday evening, September 10 on the occasion of Mr. Ottinger's fiftieth birthday.
