HITLERITES ATTEMPT TO STORM SYNAGOGUE, CHECKED BY AUTHORITIES

Another Jewish Cemetery Desecrated in Westphalia

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Sept. 7.—An attempt to storm the synagogue in Gennunden was made by a horde of Hitlerites following a mass meeting held by them in that city.

Leaders of the local Jewish community persuaded the district authorities to provide police protection and to ward off the attack.

Another case of Jewish cemetery desecration occurred in Luedinghausen, Westphalia, last night. Thirteen tombstones were destroyed. The police have started an investigation. This is the sixtieth desecration of a Jewish cemetery in Germany since 1923.

OZET WISHES TO CONCENTRATE ON BUREYA PROJECT

Moscow, Sept. 7.—Wishing to concentrate its efforts on the colonization project in Bureya, the Ozet, the society for settling Jews on the land, forwarded a proposal to the Agrojoint with regard to the colonization work in Eupatoria.

The agency of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee was asked by the Ozet to assume the entire Jewish settlement work in Eupatoria. Negotiations concerning the matter are being carried on.

The Soviet Labor Unemployment Insurance Department has agreed to allot to the Comzet 135 roubles for each unemployed worker, toward settling him on the land.

TO FURNISH INDUSTRIAL CREDIT FOR INDUSTRIES IN PALESTINE

\$100,000 Raised Here for Holding Corporation

The sum of \$100,000 was subscribed yesterday at an inauguration meeting of the members of the Board of Directors of the Palestine Holding Corporation at a luncheon held at the Hotel Pennsylvania. The Corporation was incorporated in June 1928 under the laws of the State of New York with an authorized capital of \$500,000.

The purpose of the Corporation is to acquire at least seventy-five percent of the capital stock of the National Bank for Industry, Ltd. of Palestine, which has been founded by several manufacturers' groups in Palestine. The purpose of this bank is to supply manufacturers in Palestine with industrial credit.

Jacob Goell expects to leave for Palestine early in December and the bank will start operation under his management.

"Jewish manufacturers in Palestine could easily dispose of ten times their present output if they were in a position to finance their operations," declared Jacob Siegel, president of the Palestine Holding Corporation.

"Unfortunately industrial conditions in Palestine are radically different from those prevailing in other industrial centres of the world.

"The manufacturer in Palestine cannot hire space in a loft building at a monthly rental. He must buy land, build his factory, buy and install the machinery, for all of which he must pay cash, and by the time he has his factory equipped and ready to do business, he finds himself without money necessary to operate his business.

"In spite of all these difficulties, the manufacturers of Palestine have made wonderful progress, opened new markets for their products in neighboring countries and reduced the importation of finished products into Palestine.

"There are, at the present time, 343 manufacturers in Jerusalem, Tel Aviv and Haifa, organized in manufacturers' associations, whose total investment in their business is about \$8,000,000.00 and who employ more than 5,000 workers.

"It is readily conceivable how much more could be accomplished if these manufacturers had the ordinary industrial credit available in other countries."

The officers of the Corporation are Jacob Siegel, president, Morris Eisenman, vice-president, Jacob Goell, treasurer, and Isaac Allen, secretary. HIGH COMMISSIONERSHIP OF PALESTINE OFFERED TO GENERAL SMUTS

Famous South African Statesman Declined

(J. T. A. Mail Service)

Johannesburg, Aug. 3.—General J. C. Smuts, South African statesman and friend of Zionism, was offered the post of High Commissioner of Palestine by the British Government, it was learned here.

At the first meeting of the Executive Council of the South African Zionist Federation held after receipt of the news of the appointment of Sir John Chancellor as High Commissioner for Palestine and of the offer of this post having been made to General Smuts, a resolution was adopted and conveyed to General Smuts. The resolution read:

"The Executive Council of the South African Zionist Federation has learned with the utmost satisfaction that the position of High Commissioner for Palestine was offered by the British Government to so distinguished a son of South Africa and so outstanding a friend of the Jewish people as General Smuts; and whilst regretting that General Smuts was unable to accept the invitation, it regards the offer as further evidence of the earnest desire of the Mandatory Power to establish the Jewish National Home in Palestine in the spirit of the Balfour Declaration."

In his reply General Smuts declared: "I am much gratified by the kind resolution of your Executive. And I agree with them that the offer to me was an unmistakable indication of the earnest desire of the British Government to carry out the policy of the National Home, of which I am a well-known advocate."

At the same meeting a resolution on the appointment of Sir John Chancellor to the post was adopted.

"The Executive Council of the South African Zionist Federation conveys hearty congratulations and best wishes for a prosperous and fruitful term of office to Sir John Chancellor on his appointment as High Commissioner of Palestine," the resolution declared. "It views his appointment with special interest and pleasure by reason of Sir John Chancellor's close connection with Southern Africa."

Announcement has been made of the appointment of Paul Berman as Assistant City Solicitor of Baltimore, Md. to succeed William Lovitt.

Mr. Berman is a member of the House of Delegates from the Fourth district. It was said it would not be necessary for Mr. Berman to resign from the Legislature to take up his new post. Mr. Berman is 26 years old.

JEW TO CREATE MASARYK FUND TO HELP GIFTED STUDENTS TO EDUCATION

Foundation to Mark 10th Anniversary of Czechoslovakian Republic

Prague, Sept. 7.—On the occasion of the forthcoming tenth anniversary of the Republic of Czechoslovakia, Jewish leaders plan the creation of a fund in honor of President Masaryk.

The fund is to be known as the Masaryk Foundation and its proceeds are to be used to assist talented Jewish students to pursue their studies.

In connection with the forthcoming elections to provincial diets and district councils, the Jewish Party consisting of all Jewish groups in Slovakia and Carpatho-Russia, decided to go to the polls as an independent party.

Extensive preparations are being made here by leaders of the Jewish community to take a prominent part in the celebration of the Republic's tenth anniversary.

ARAB LEADER MODIFIES STAND ON BALFOUR PAPER

Jerusalem, Sept. 7.—Mussa Kazim Pasha, leader of the anti-Zionist Arab Executive, modified his statement he made some time ago in an interview with the representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, in a declaration he now publishes in the Arab press.

In his interview Mussa Kazim Pasha stated that "the Arab demands do not contradict Great Britain's international obligations." The Arab newspapers criticised the Arab leader and demanded that he retract his statement.

In his present explanation he declared that the Arab demands do not contradict Britain's international obligations "in general matters, like religious freedom and trade and sanitary treaties," but with regard to Great Britain's commitments to the Jews, he has to stress that the Arabs "have refused to extend these privileges." Palestine Jews should have equal rights and duties in proportion to their number. He swore at the fifth Arab Congress to fight against the Balfour Declaration with all his force and he is faithful to this pledge, he stated.

MOSCOW YIDDISH THEATRE WINS PRAISE IN VIENNA

Vienna, Sept. 7.—The Moscow Yiddish State Theatre was praised by the Vienna press following its performance given last night at the Carl theatre.

Although all newspapers devoted much space to reviews of the performance, the Right press took a reserved attitude, while the Left newspapers published enthusiastic accounts concerning the staging and ensemble work of the troupe.

JEWIS RELATIVELY IMMUNE TO TUBERCULOSIS, IS PHYSICIAN'S ASSERTION

London, Sept. 7.—The Jewish race is relatively immune to tuberculosis, declared Dr. W. Miller, speaking before the congress of the Medical Veterinary Association in session here. The subject of Dr. Miller's address was disease resistance among men and animals.

The Jewish people in America and the populated parts of Europe are less susceptible to infection than the Nordic race, he declared. Jewish deaths from tuberculosis in America is thirty-seven per thousand, while others number 138 per thousand.

The Jews remain healthy due to adherence to their hygienic traditions and dietary laws, stated Dr. Morris, chairman of Sanitary Inspectors of North Wales, in his address before the Congress.

PHILADELPHIA JEWISH AVIATOR IN AIR DERBY

Philadelphia, Sept. 7.—The first aviator to leave Roosevelt Field, Long Island, in the cross-country air races was Albert R. Jacobs, Philadelphia, aviator, and accompanying him was a passenger Samuel Gordon, also of this city. Jacobs based his hopes in the races on a plane which is powered by a motor which he designed and built in his own shop in this city. His was the only "home made" entry in the contests. Jacobs is sole owner of Fisher and Jacobs, Inc. manufacturers of airplane motors, and it was in the small shop of his firm here that he built, with the assistance of two mechanics, the motor which powers his Waco 10 plane.

Gordon's father, Max Gordon, and two brothers, went to Harrisburg to greet the fliers. Gordon is a close friend of Jacobs and an aviation enthusiast.

OLDEST ROUMANIAN JEWISH ARTISAN DIES

SOCIAL OSTRACISM AT POLISH PHYSICIANS' CONGRESS CAUSES RESENTMENT

Jews, Invited to Banquet, Seated in
Separate Hall

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Sept. 7.—A striking case of social ostracism in the medical profession has called forth wide comment in Poland, in connection with the annual convention of Polish physicians held in Ciechocinek.

Of the 300 physicians attending the convention, 150 were Jews. A banquet was arranged in honor of the delegates. The invitation cards were of two colors, red and blue. When the guests arrived, it developed that the banquet was being held in two halls in the same restaurant and that those holding blue invitation cards were directed to one hall and those with red cards to the other. When all the guests were seated it became clear that all the Jewish physicians had been given blue invitation cards, while the rest held red cards. There was thus a complete segregation of the Jews from the Christians. When the discovery was made, the Jewish physicians left the banquet hall in a body, abandoning both food and addresses.

The president of the Physicians' Association later offered an apology, declaring that the incident was the result of a misunderstanding.

JEWS CHEMIST CLAIMS NEW CANCER CURE

Prague, Sept. 7.—Dr. Oscar Huppert, a Jewish chemist, has discovered the possibility of producing albumen synthetically. Dr. Huppert claims that synthetic albumen could be used in the treatment of cancer. Great interest has been aroused in medical circles by Dr. Huppert's discovery.

COMMUNIST OFFICIALS PUNISHED FOR RIOT

Moscow, Sept. 7.—Two Communist officials were punished for their passive attitude in the recent anti-Jewish riots of a group of Red Army recruits and railway officials at Mohilev.

The Control Commission voted to dismiss Mazumovitch, secretary of the Velikoluki Communist Youth Organization and in charge of the railway workers' collective. The editor of the Communist paper, "Nash Fut," who suppressed the news of the riot, was severely reprimanded. The petition filed in the higher court to hold a trial of those who perpetrated the riot in Velikoluki instead of Mohilev has so far brought no result.

CONDUCTING LATE FRIDAY SERVICES DISQUALIFIES RABBI FOR ORTHODOX POST

Orthodox Rabbis Render Decision in
Dispute in Pennsylvania Town

Easton, Pa., Sept. 7.—The conducting of late Friday night services and consent to officiate in a congregation where men and women worship together, innovations widely practiced by Conservative congregations, disqualify a rabbi for holding a position in a strictly Orthodox congregation. Such was the decision of a court of three Orthodox rabbis, members of the Union of Orthodox Rabbis in the United States and Canada, called upon to settle a dispute which arose in the local congregation B'nai Abraham. The congregation, which is a member of the United Synagogue of America, belongs to the class usually referred to as Conservative. Due, however, to the efforts of Reverend Gerson Weinberg, the cantor and shochet of the congregation, the introduction of innovations practiced by Conservative congregations was prevented. Two years ago Rabbi S. B. Jampol, an ordained Orthodox rabbi, was called to the pulpit of the B'nai Abraham. He introduced late Friday night services, organized a sisterhood, inaugurated a Sunday school and a daily Hebrew school. Interest in congregational activity increased as did the membership.

Soon, however, the congregation split into two opposing camps, the strictly Orthodox siding with Reverend Weinberg, the Modernists supporting Rabbi Jampol. The dispute continued for a long time, until the Conservative officers were compelled to resign, giving way to the Orthodox. With an agreement for another year's service already concluded with the Rabbi, the officers returned to the Orthodox rites and sought to oust Rabbi Jampol.

The matter was submitted to Rabbi Eleazar Silver of Springfield, Mass.,

JEWS COLONIES UNHARMED BY HURRICANE IN CRIMEA

Moscow, Sept. 7.—The hurricane which swept the Crimea did not affect the Jewish colonies according to a telegraphic report received by the Agropoint, the agency of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee.

The Jewish colonies experienced merely a heavy rainfall, with no attendant overflow of rivers, which followed in the wake of the hurricane.

JEWS FORM ASSOCIATION FOR ENFORCING SABBATH REST IN PALESTINE

Says Zionist Executive Responsible
for Infringement

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Sept. 7.—An association for the enforcement of Sabbath rest in the Jewish communities in Palestine in accordance with Jewish tradition was formed in Tel Aviv last night at a special conference called to consider ways and means to protect the Sabbath.

Forty delegates of Tel Aviv and twenty-five from the Jewish colonies participated in the deliberations. The proposal to form a lay society for the protection of the Sabbath was made by M. Dizengoff, former mayor of Tel Aviv.

In resolutions adopted the conference called on all communities to enforce a Sabbath ordinance similar to the one promulgated by the municipality of Tel Aviv, urges all merchants not to unload goods from the customs and railway stations on Saturday and insists on the release of Jewish officials from their duties on Saturday.

The conference declared that the Zionist Executive is responsible for infringement of Sabbath observance in its colonies. A central committee was chosen.

COMPLAINS TRAINED WORKERS NOT PLACED IN POSITIONS

Charkov, Sept. 7.—Although new professional schools for the training of Jewish workers have been opened, no effort is made to place graduates in positions, complains the "Stern" Charkov Yiddish Communist daily.

The paper cites an instance in the Jewish mechanical school at Dnepropetrovsk where the graduates last year were compelled to take unskilled jobs. This year twenty-two graduates were sent to the unemployment bureau.

JEWS STREET VENDORS PROTEST NEW LAW

Warsaw, Sept. 7.—A protest meeting attended by two thousand Jewish street vendors was held here last night to protest against the recently promulgated city ordinance prohibiting street trading.

The Jewish members of the City Council were asked to intervene for the withdrawal of the ordinance which in prohibiting street trading in old clothes, deprives three thousand Jewish families of their livelihood.

SIR JOHN MONASH HEADS THE AUSTRALIAN ZIONIST FEDERATION

(J. T. A. Mail Service)

Sydney, July 26.—A call for increased activity in the Australian Zionist Federation was issued by Sir John Monash, Honorary President of the Australian Zionist Federation.

"The establishment of the Australian Zionist Federation marks a new era in the life of the Jewry of our Commonwealth. For the first time, Jews of all States are united for a common purpose. We have joined our fellow Jews all over the world in the task of building up the Jewish Homeland," he declared.

"The Great Powers have approved the Zionist program and have given us their support. The British Empire has accepted the mandate for Palestine and has challenged the Jews of all countries to make use of the unique opportunity of once more making Zion shine in its glory. As Jews living in Australia, we have a double responsibility. Both as Jews and as British citizens, we have to do our share in rebuilding the land of Israel and reviving the cultural and spiritual centre of Judaism. We are in honor bound to do our utmost and to make our share a prominent one.

"Jews of Australia! In my capacity of Honorary President of the Australian Zionist Federation, I call upon you to join the ranks of the Australian Zionist Federation to make it into a powerful body and give it the force it requires for its immense task. I am confident that you will do justice to this historical moment.

"Organization is the first step. The Australian Zionist Federation has secured the services of an able organizer, of a man thoroughly acquainted with the needs and problems of Palestine. I understand that the Australian Zionist Federation calls for a minimum of 2,000 members in Victoria; 5,000 members in time is the figure aimed at for the whole of Australia. With such an army of organized Zionists, their power to cope with our great task is assured. I rely upon my fellow Jews of Australia to rally and support the Australian Zionist Federation," the call concluded.

The new Beth David synagogue in Detroit was dedicated last week before an overflow congregation of 2,000 persons.

A parade preceded the ceremony. Mounted officers and motorcycle patrolmen headed the procession with a 50-piece concert band.

Rabbi Ezekiel Aishkik, spiritual leader of the congregation, Henry C. Keywell and Louis Starfield Cobane, who presided, were the speakers.

The new structure was erected at a cost of \$250,000 and has seating space for 1,600.

GOVERNOR SMITH ISSUES ROSH HASHANAH MESSAGE

Albany, Sept. 7.—Governor Alfred E. Smith of New York issued his annual message on the occasion of the High Holidays. The message read:

"Following my annual custom as Governor, I desire with the approach of the High Holy Days to wish my fellow Jewish citizens a good and prosperous New Year.

"The conception underlying the Jewish observance of the New Year has always appealed to me. It is a day of self-examination with a view of correcting one's shortcomings in the year to come. It is not a day of carnival but rather of the religious spirit. This is the spirit which animated the original settlers of our country, Puritans, Quakers, Catholics, Baptists, and all the other denominations which came to our shores to seek freedom to worship God according to their own conscience.

"The separation of church and state is a fundamental American principle. The pursuit of virtue sanctioned by religion is at the basis of any civilized state. Because the Jewish people have a genius for religion they have made their great contribution to civilization from which men and women of every race and creed have benefited.

"May the New Year bring to all of us a better understanding based upon respect for our differences and the recognition of our common humanity."

TEL AVIV TO MARK 100th ANNIVERSARY OF TOLSTOI

Tel Aviv, Sept. 7.—The one hundredth anniversary of the birth of Leon Tolstoi will be celebrated in Tel Aviv on September 9.

Extensive arrangements were made by a specially created committee consisting of Hebrew writers and communal leaders. A concert will be held on Sunday evening.

A special publication in Hebrew and English to commemorate the event has been prepared and will contain articles on Tolstoi by well known Hebrew writers, including essays by Alexander Ziskind, Rabinovich, I. Ch. Ravnitzki. A letter written by Sophia Tolstoi in 1891, stating that a certain anti-Semitic article attributed to Tolstoi, was not written by him, will be included in the publication.

Rabbi Natanelowitz of Harrisburg, Pa. and Rabbi Krevski of Allentown, Pa. After hearing the evidence, the three Orthodox rabbis decreed that Rabbi S. B. Jampol, having been ordained as an Orthodox rabbi, committed an offense by the introduction of late Friday night services and other Conservative innovations. This action disqualifies him from holding a position in an Orthodox congregation, it being further complicated by the fact that his congregation is now anxious to return to the strictly Orthodox rite. Because of the fact that the contract with Rabbi Jampol was broken, the congregation is to compensate him to the amount of \$1,200. For amity's sake, the rabbis also decreed, that Reverend Weinberg is to leave his post with the congregation.

Rabbi Jambol did not accept the decision, demanding that the matter be submitted to another body of rabbis. The congregation leaders however, insist that if the matter is to be reopened it can be submitted only to strictly observant rabbis.

Jewish boys are coming to the fore in athletics in the Lehigh Valley colleges in Pennsylvania.

At Lehigh University, Bethlehem, Pa., Hyman Goldman, of Easton, a former football star, has been appointed assistant coach of the varsity team, while two of the team's stars are Jews, Art Davidowitz of Scranton, and Levitz of Atlantic City.

Lafayette College, Easton, Pa. has a Jewish star in Nate Soloff, of Bridgeport, Conn. who is a tackle. Lehigh College, Allentown, has a Jewish star in Dave Greenberg, Philadelphia, fullback of the team.

Ground breaking exercises for the New Beth El educational Center of Milwaukee will be held Sunday morning, on the lot adjacent to the present Temple structure.
