MARTIAL LAW DECLARED IN PETROVO SELO FOR THE HIGH HOLIDAY SEASON

Special Commission with Full Power
Sent by Belgrade Government
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Belgrade, Sept. 18.—Martial law was declared by the Yugoslav government in Petrovo Selo and the vicinity, the scene of the ritual murder agitation on the eve of Rosh Hashanah.

Rosh Hashanah passed quietly but in a painful atmosphere for the Jew-community. On Saturday morning, it was discovered that the previous night the Jewish houses in the town were painted with anti-Jewish hatred inciting inscriptions. Hotels and public inns in the city were closed and people were prohibited from going abroad in the evening unless they were provided with special permits.

The Belgrade government despatched a special ministerial commission to Petrovo Selo with full power to take measures for the maintenance of order and the protection of the Jewish population.

ANTI-JEWISH DISTURBANCES TAKE PLACE IN POSEN (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Posen, Sept. 18.—Several persons were arrested by the police yesterday in Bromberg, Posen, when a free-for-all fight of an anti-Jewish nature developed.

The disturbance was caused by the editor of an anti-Semitic newspaper, "The Sabbath Courier," who attacked Jewish merchants on the street. The police intervened.

Jews have no right to complain, was the reply of a railway official to a Jewish merchant, Epstein, who was injured by a Polish co-passenger on the Lodz-Posen express. When the Jewish passenger attempted to seize his assailant who was escaping, the railway official stopped him. When the Jew asked for the complaint book, the official replied, "There is no such book for Jews," newspapers report.

MARKOV, ANTI-SEMITIC, KILLED IN RAILWAY ACCIDENT (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Sept. 18.—Valerian Markov, notorious Russian anti-Semitic agitator and contributor to the "Novoye Vremja," chief exponent of the anti-Semitic doctrine during the Czaristic regime, was killed today in a tragic railway accident.

While attempting to board a train near Zagreb, Yugoslavia, Markov made a misstep and fell on the tracks. The train getting into motion, passed over his body.

ASSURED ROUMANIA PLANS NO DEPORTATION OF UNNATURALIZED JEWS

Head of Roumanian Legation of
Geneva Makes Pledge to
Lucien Wolf
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Geneva, Sept. 18.—The Roumanian authorities do not contemplate any deportation of unnaturalized Jews belonging to the class of "Staatenlose" or foreigners living in Roumania, was the assurance given by the head of the Roumanian Legation here to Lucien Wolf, secretary of the Joint Foreign Committee of the Board of Jewish Deputies and Anglo-Jewish Association.

Mr. Wolf drew the attention of the Legation to the recently promulgated ordinance for an aliens control in Roumania which gave the local authorities discretion to determine the procedure in each case. It was feared by a large number of unnaturalized Roumanian Jews that they would be the first victims of the ordinance. The Legation here assured Mr. Wolf that no secret instructions were given to the authorities in this respect. The new ordinance merely lays stress on the customary notification and the annual revision of permits for sojourn.

TEL AVIV DEMANDS TRANSFER OF RAILWAY JUNCTION (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Tel Aviv, Sept. 18.—A memorandum demanding that the central station of the Palestine Railway be transferred from Ludd to Tel Aviv, was presented by the municipality to H. C. Luke, Acting High Commissioner, who visited Tel Aviv yesterday.

The memorandum pointed out that the creation of the junction at Tel Aviv would connect the railway directly with the Jaffa harbor.

The municipality also asked that the Palestine government contribute to the Tel Aviv budget on an equal basis with its contributions to other municipal budgets.

The Haifa-Damascus Railway was deviated yesterday from its former route to pass across a bridge built over the Jordan by Engineer Pinchas Ruttenberg.

LITHUANIA TAKES DRASTIC STEPS AGAINST INSTIGATORS OF WOLKOWISHKI EXCESSES

Dismissed from Posts, Will Soon be
Tried
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Kovno, Sept. 18.—Three Lithuanian officials in Wolkowishki, Lithuania, where serious anti-Jewish excesses occurred last week, resulting in 20 injured, were dismissed from their posts by an order of the Kovno government.

The officials will soon be tried. The three, the secretary of the County Council, the tax inspector and the detective in charge of the criminal division of the local police, were charged with organizing the anti-Jewish riot. It was said to be the first instance of the Lithuanian government taking drastic measures against those responsible for anti-Jewish disturbances.

The elections to the Sick Fund, a semi-official welfare organization, which were originally scheduled to be held on Rosh Hashanah and later postponed for Yom Kippur when the Jewish members protested, have now been set for October 7, which is Simchath Torah, the last day of the Feast of Tabernacles.

Vilna, Sept. 18.—Pious Jews of the Vilna district who were anxious to visit the old Jewish cemetery in Ligmjany, in accordance with time-honored local custom, were prevented from doing so by the Lithuanian frontier authorities.

The cemetery lies on the Polish-Lithuanian frontier and custom calls for visiting the cemetery on Tisha B'ab and Gedaliah's Fast Day, which occurred yesterday, Monday, September 17. The frontier authorities drove back all Jews who attempted to cross the border to the cemetery, declaring "visiting the cemetery on Tisha B'ab is sufficient."

U. S. EXPLORER REACHES MOUNT NEBO BY AUTO (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Sept. 18.—What is said to be the first ascent of Mount Nebo by automobile was accomplished yesterday by Dr. A. F. Futterer.

Dr. Futterer, who represents the Los Angeles Bible Institute, was granted permission by the Palestine government to seek the Ark of the Covenant on Mount Nebo, where he believes it was hidden, following the destruction of the First Temple. He arrived in Palestine in June 1927 to begin his search.

KAUFMAN CASE RETRIAL IN MOSCOW, SEPTEMBER 21

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Sept. 18.—The new investigation ordered by the Soviet authorities in the famous Kaufman case, which demonstrated the existence of Czaristic pogrom tortures in Moscow, under the very eye of the Soviet authorities, was concluded yesterday, and it was announced that the new trial will take place on September 21.

Besides Golovkin, Lubimov and Lichovanov, who were arrested for torturing their neighbor Kaufman, three more arrests were made, A. Lubimov, I. Zhelez-nov and A. Zhelesnov.

D. Lubimov, the fifteen year old boy who participated in the tortures, has been placed in an institute for minors. Zaitzen is being sought by the police.

AGED RABBI APPEALS FOR U.S. SUPPORT OF POLISH LOAN

Warsaw, Sept. 18.—Rabbi Abraham J. Perlmutter, former member of the Polish parliament and oldest rabbi in Warsaw, confirmed today the report of the Crakow Jewish conservative newspaper, "Czas," that he had issued a Rosh Hashanah message to American Jews in which he pleaded for their support of the new Polish loan.

In his message Rabbi Perlmutter points out that the consummation of the loan will contribute toward a betterment of the economic situation of Polish Jewry. He also pointed to the fact that the Pilsudski government has a favorable attitude toward the Jewish population.

FLEXNER WARNS AGAINST DISINTEGRATING ETHNIC AND CULTURAL GROUPS IN U.S.

Advantage of Mixed Composition of
Races Not Made Use Of, He Says

"Far from regarding the mixed composition of races in this country as unfortunate, I regard it as fortunate and as an advantage of which not enough use has been made," Dr. Abraham Flexner, who recently resigned as director of the General Educational Board of Rockefeller Foundation, told members of the graduating class of the Training School for Jewish Social Work at the graduation exercises on Monday.

"Every one of the alien stocks brought to this country their own native culture. Short-sighted reformers think they will help matters if they were to disintegrate these racial groups as fast as possible. To destroy their contribution would be to take away something important from our too-barren civilization. If the folk-lore and the cultures of these races were obliterated, the country would lose instead of gaining.

"Short-sighted people would think to Americanize these alien races and would by their premature dissolution destroy their standards of conduct and picturesqueness.

"There is no subject on the face of the earth about which more nonsense has been spoken than the subject of racial characteristics," declared Dr. Flexner. I doubt if there has ever been anywhere a Nordic race on the face of the earth. It is just as absurd to apply the terms Christian, Jewish, Protestant, Catholic or any such single term to this nation.

Eighteen students received their certificates in the auditorium of the Federation Building, 71 West 47th Street. Addresses were made by Felix M. Warburg, chairman of the executive committee of the school who presided, Maurice J. Karpf, director of the school and Dr. Solomon Lowenstein, executive director of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies.

Mr. Warburg addressing the graduating class in behalf of Louis E. Kirstein, president of the school who was absent, declared that the members of the board of trustees of the school stood for adequate professional recognition and dignity for the work.

"We shall strike for this recognition and dignity in two directions," said Mr. Warburg, "personal appreciation of professional capacity, and financial compensation worthy of professional preparation and effective work. The School will do all it can to foster these two aims to the end that out of this new profession the Jewish communities of this country may receive trained, effective, intelligent and loyal service. Un-

less these things are achieved the School will be a failure. We recognize our obligation, we have accepted the challenge and we shall look to you to help us meet them."

The social sciences present peculiar difficulties and upon social science the schools of social work must ultimately be based, Dr. Flexner said in his address. "If you are to make a contribution towards this end, you must continue to be social students of social problems; continue to be stimulated by every concrete experience; to study critically this situation with which you are practically called on to deal. There are routiniers in law and medicine despite the fact that these are admitted to be professions. They are admitted to be professions because they have an established technique and an established literature. To the extent that your work is that of the scientific student or practitioner of law or medicine, you will have contributed towards making the social science real science and towards making social work a real profession.

"This institution is specifically a training school for Jewish social work; in other words, for social work among the Jewish communities throughout the country. You are aware of the discordant opinions held respecting the so-called foreign element within the so-called American people. As a matter of fact, the American nation is made up of a great variety of racial, religious, political and social strains so that no single comprehensive title nor anything else can accurately or truthfully describe it. Nay more, everyone of the stocks represented in the American people has made to this country its own unique contribution in the establishment of native culture. Our own literature, philosophy, and art will be enriched if pains are taken to preserve the essence of each of these national cultures.

"These groups naturally form separate communities within the larger American cities. The members of each community exercise positive and beneficial influence in holding these groups together for the time-being so that their traditional standards of conduct and behavior are not too suddenly disrupted. You are Americans as well as Jews. You must therefore mediate the gradual transformation of the Polish, Russian or German Jew living in these communities in the Russian, Polish or American Jew who retains everything that is valuable, beautiful and rich in his native setting and yet observes everything that is essentially important or worthwhile in America of which he and his family are to become citizens.

"In dealing with your specific problems you will need tact, insight, sympathy. For your real task is to substitute ties of one kind for another set of ties and in the process to save for

ZIONIST ORGANIZATION ELECTS A GOVERNING COUNCIL OF NINE

Body to Manage the Affairs of the
Z. O. A.

A body of nine, together with the officers, will constitute the Governing Council of the Zionist Organization of America, according to an announcement issued yesterday by Louis Lipsky, President of the Organization. These nine are recruited from the larger Administrative Committee of forty, and will directly manage the affairs of the organization.

The Governing Council was made up at the last meeting of the Administrative Committee which also elected Dr. Abraham J. Rongy, New York physician, as secretary of the organization. The Council consists of the following chairmen of committees, as follows: Herman Bernstein, Foreign Affairs; David Freiberger Organization; Abraham Goldberg, Propaganda; Rabbi Israel Goldstein, Youth and Education; Irving Rosenzweig, Palestine Investments; Dr. David J. Kaliskis, Hebrew University; Dr. Nathan Ratnoff Relations with other Organizations; Abram J. Liebovitz, Finance; William B. Leaf, Publications. Mr. Lipsky is Chairman of the Governing Council.

ARREST ANTI-SEMITIC LEADER AS BLACKMAILER

Warsaw, Sept. 18.—J. Chamic, Polish lecturer, one of the notorious anti-Semitic agitators, was arrested last night at his hotel by the Warsaw police on charges of fraud and blackmail.

Chamic, a self-styled professor, recently toured the country in the interests of the Polish boycott organization, "Rozwoj, preaching everywhere the gospel of hatred and discrimination against Jews. It was now disclosed that during his visit to many towns he obtained large sums of money through blackmailing and extortion methods from Polish merchants.

PROHIBIT FREETHINKERS MEETING ON ROSH HASHANAH

Warsaw, Sept. 18.—The Free Thinkers' Society of Warsaw called a huge mass meeting for Saturday, the first day of Rosh Hashanah, to propagate the atheistic doctrine. A hall for this purpose was secured in the Kaminsky Yiddish Theatre and the speakers were announced.

At the last moment, however, the authorities withdrew permission to hold the meeting.

TO ASK NEW YORK JEWRY TO CONTRIBUTE \$150,000 TO UNITED SYNAGOGUE

Plans for Campaign Discussed at
Luncheon Meeting Called
by Dr. Adler

Plans for New York to take the initiative in the \$500,000 national campaign to strengthen traditional Judaism in this country were formulated yesterday at a luncheon conference called by Dr. Cyrus Adler, president of the Jewish Theological Seminary and Dropsie College.

Thirty-five rabbis representing the leading conservative congregations in New York City attended and pledged their aid in raising the sum of \$150,000 for the United Synagogue of America, which is to be New York's quota.

Organization of campaign machinery is now under way and the campaign will be officially launched at a conference to be held either late in October or early in November.

According to the present plan, the sum of \$150,000 is to be raised by committees representing each of the forty conservative synagogues in New York.

Judaism in this country is in a most critical position, declared Dr. Cyrus Adler, due primarily to the fact that the last thirty years has seen the virtual transference of an entire people, Conservative Judaism, such as expounded by the United Synagogue of America, is most calculated to meet the sound needs of American Israel. Neither extremes will serve as well, for the one is too attenuated, and the other is too rigorous.

There is a definite and very dissatisfying relationship, he declared, between the less than 3,000 synagogues in this country and the more than 4,000,000 people who constitute the Jewish population of America.

The United Synagogue is faced with large responsibilities and great possibilities, in meeting this important problem. The deplorable condition which exists in virtually all Jewish communities is due in part to lack of co-ordinated effort, he stated, calling upon those present to work together for the increased activity of the United Synagogue.

Referring to the criticism which has been launched against the mushroom synagogues, Dr. Adler said, If there were no mushroom synagogues in New York, there would be no place for those who want to go to High Holiday services. While I do not like to see men advertised as the greatest Chazanim in the world, such as was done in Philadelphia, and eight, nine and ten dollars charged for admission, the fact remains that the Academy of Music of Philadelphia was filled and these men are doing something we have not been able to do.

The entire country is looking to New York for inspiration, Dr. Adler said. Insofar as Judaism is concerned, as New York goes, goes the entire country. The

N. Y. FEDERATION SETS \$5,300,000 FOR GOAL FOR 1928 APPEAL

Fund to be Raised Through Trades
and Professions

A goal of \$5,300,000 was set yesterday by the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies as the quota of the 1928 appeal to be made next month in behalf of its ninety-one constituent institutions, according to an announcement by Felix M. Warburg, chairman of the Federation board.

The goal, Mr. Warburg stated, was based on the recommendations of the Distribution Committee of the Federation, no member of which is connected with any of the affiliated societies. "The committee," stated Mr. Warburg, "prepared its annual budget after a most careful investigation and the funds are distributed with a complete understanding of the community problem and with a fair proportion to each type of work and each individual institution."

Mr. Warburg said that in line with the policy inaugurated last year, the Federation will not countenance the more sensational features usually associated with a big-scale money-raising program, and although the sum requested from the Jewish community is said to be the greatest any local family of philanthropic agencies has asked for maintenance purposes, the committees directing the campaign have put their official disapproval on "ballyhoo" methods.

Campaign organization is being effected in the 124 trades and professions which comprise the Business Men's Council of the Federation, under the chairmanship of Dudley D. Sicher. For the first time in the twelve years of its

Sol. M. Stroock, president of the Federation, in a statement accompanying the announcement by Mr. Warburg, declared that the task of the Federation is greater this year than at any previous time in its history and "that every Jew must be asked to join in this high comradeship of service."

An Association of Synagogues, Temples and Men's Clubs of Brooklyn was formed at a dinner Monday night in the Jewish Centre, 667 Eastern Parkway, Brooklyn.

The association will aid the \$1,035,000 campaign that the Brooklyn Federation of Jewish Charities plans, starting October 17.

Judge Grover M. Moskowitz and Nathan D. Shapiro are joint chairmen of the association. Speakers at the meeting were Samuel Rothenberg, president of the Jewish Centre; Rabbi Shapiro and Dr. Samuel C. Kohn. Thirty-four presidents of synagogues, temples and centres were present.

GERMAN GOVERNMENT HONORS JEWISH SOCIAL WORKER

Berlin, Sept. 3.—Mrs. Paula Ollendorf, the well-known Jewish social worker of Breslau, was honored by the Prussian Ministry of Social Welfare with a medal in recognition of her services for the benefit of youth.

In a letter accompanying the decoration, the Minister praised the activities of Mrs. Ollendorf in the field of social service. Mrs. Ollendorf has distinguished herself especially in her work in connection with the founding of a children's home under the auspices of the Jewish Women's Association in Breslau.

The School was organized five years ago by the Hebrew Union College in cooperation with the Association of Reform Rabbis of New York City and vicinity.

Abraham N. Franzblau is principal of the Hebrew Union College School for Teachers. Dr. Samuel Schulman is Chairman of its Joint Governing Committee.

POLISH JEWISH DAIRYMEN TO ORGANIZE ON MODERN LINES

Warsaw, Sept. 18.—The efforts of Polish boycott organizations to drive out the Jewish small traders have now been extended to the dairy industry.

With this end in view, cooperative societies of Polish dairymen are now being organized to drive out the Jewish dealers. To counteract this, the Jewish dairymen have decided to organize their industry on a modern basis, both in production and delivery. It was estimated that Jewish dairymen bring to the capital about 30,000 pints of milk daily.

TITLE OF CHIEF RABBI DISPUTED IN SOUTH AFRICA

Cape Town, Sept. 18.—A controversy over the title of Chief Rabbi for South Africa is now threatening, it was disclosed at the annual general meeting of the local Hebrew Congregation.

Speakers at the meeting protested strongly against what they termed "assumption and continued use" of the title Chief Rabbi by Dr. Judah Leo Landau of Johannesburg. It was stated that the matter is likely to arouse disunion between two chief communities of South Africa.

LAY CORNERSTONE FOR NEW JEWISH SCHOOL IN SOFIA

Sofia, August 31.—A number of high Government officials, including representatives from the Ministries of Education and Foreign Affairs, were present today at the laying of a cornerstone for a new Jewish school to be maintained by the Jewish community of Sofia. The building of the school, when completed, will cost about three million Levas.

The Chief Inspector of the Ministry of Education was one of the speakers at the ceremony. In the course of his address he stated that the Ministry of Education is greatly pleased with the excellent record of the Jewish schools which, he said, were turning out loyal and enlightened Bulgarian citizens.

The ceremony was attended by delegations from all Jewish organizations in Sofia.
