## APOLOGIES OFFERED, MASSENA INCIDENT CLOSED, OFFICIAL POLICE INVESTIGATOR REPORTS

Lieutenant Heim Renders Report to N. Y. State Police  
(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Malone, N. Y., Oct. 3.—With the apologies offered by the local officials to the Jewish congregation of Massena, N. Y. in the incident arising out of the interrogation of Rabbi Berel Brennglass following the disappearance of the child, Barbara Griffith, and the subsequent suspicion cast against the local Jewish community, the matter is now closed, was the report submitted by Lieutenant E. F. Heim of Troop B of the New York State Police to the Commanding Officer of the Troop at Malone. Lieutenant Heim was sent to Massena to investigate the matter. Lieutenant Heim's report follows.

September 26th, 1928

To: Commanding Officer, Troop 'B', N. Y. S. T., Malone, N. Y.,  
Subject: Joseph Stone, Massena, N.Y.,  
—Complaint.

"1. Lieutenant Heim proceeded to Massena on Sunday afternoon September 23, and received a complaint from Mr. Joseph Stone, a prominent Jewish business man of Massena, to the effect that Corporal McCann had asked Rabbi Brennglass, whether or not it was customary in the old Jewish days to sacrifice the blood of a Gentile child on the Jewish Day of Atonement. Mr. Stone claimed that the Rabbi and members of the Jewish church in Massena, were very much incensed at this question and demanded that an investigation be conducted.

"2. On Saturday afternoon, a four-year-old child disappeared from the vicinity of her home in Massena and was not found until about five o'clock Sunday afternoon, just previous to my arrival in Massena. During the in-

## FEAR ANTI-SEMITIC ATTACKS; CALL OFF HOLIDAY SERVICES IN VIENNA SYNAGOGUE

Expect Clash between Socialists and Nationalists on Simchath Torah  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Oct. 3.—Fearing anti-Semitic attacks as the result of the awaited clash between the socialists and the nationalists in a march scheduled for Sunday, October 7, the congregation of the Neustadt Temple announced that no services will be held in the synagogue on Sunday when the final day of Succoth, Simchath Torah, occurs.

By an order of the State Attorney the police today removed a large number of placards of an anti-Jewish inciting character posted in the Vienna streets. The placards were posted under the auspices of the Austrian Hitlerite party in connection with the forthcoming public demonstration on Sunday. Proceedings will be started against those responsible for the placards, it was stated.

## RUSSIAN ICA WARNS AGAINST MIGRATION TO SOUTH AMERICA

Moscow, Oct. 3.—A warning to Russian emigrants not to lay false hopes of improving their position by emigrating to Mexico, Cuba or Uruguay was issued by the Russian branch of the Ica; Jewish Colonization Association.

The statement points to the difficulties of earning a livelihood encountered by immigrants in those countries and of the impossibility of their securing a visa to proceed from those countries either to the United States or Argentina.

## PROF. M. MARGOSCHES, CHEMIST, DIES IN BRUENN

Bruenn, Oct. 3.—Professor Max Margosches, well known chemist, formerly dean of the Bruenn Technical School, died here.

A large number of friends of the late Professor were present at the funeral in the Jewish cemetery here.

## 137 JEWS ENTERED PALESTINE IN JULY

Jerusalem, Oct. 3.—Of the 193 immigrants who entered Palestine during July, 137 were Jews according to figures which have just been made public.

## MOSLEMS WARN GOVERNMENT AGAINST GRANTING JEWS FULL ACCESS TO WAILING WALL

Threaten Grave Disturbances, Jews in Poland Call Mass Meetings  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Oct. 3.—Grave disturbances of an anti-Jewish character were threatened in a memorandum submitted to the Acting High Commissioner H. C. Luke, by a Moslem delegation in the question of the Jewish right of access to the Western Wall which still continues to agitate public opinion in Palestine, following the disturbances at the Wall on Yom Kippur.

In their memorandum the Moslem delegation declared that they consider the Wailing Wall a part of the Mosque of Omar and they will therefore never permit the Jews to acquire any ownership right over it. The memorandum demanded of the government to prohibit Jews from placing or keeping at the wall any objects of worship. What the memorandum concedes to Jewish worshippers at the Wall is not to go "beyond the rights they enjoyed under the Ottoman regime."

The Moslem Supreme Council of Palestine announced today that it was in receipt of telegrams from Moslem leaders in Haifa, Jaffa, Hebron and other places in which it was insisted that the aspiration of the Jewish people to gain full access to the Wall be opposed.

Warsaw, Oct. 3.—October 8 was designated as the day of protest against the interference with Jewish worshippers at the Wailing Wall, in a proclamation issued by the Mizrahi: Orthodox Zionist Organization of Poland, containing a call to pious Jews to gather at protest meetings on that day.

The meetings are to be held in synagogues throughout the Republic of

## JESSE I. STRAUS NAMED TO HARVARD OVERSEERS BOARD

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Cambridge, Mass., Oct. 3.—Jesse I. Straus of New York City has been elected a member of the Board of Overseers of Harvard University for a six year term.

A gift of \$156,000 from Lucius N. Littauer for the establishment of the Nathan Littauer Professorship of Jewish Literature and Philosophy at Harvard University has been announced. Among other recent gifts to Harvard University are \$10,000 from Julius Rosenthal of Chicago for a publication fund in the law school; \$750 from Louis Bamberger of Newark for the binding and cataloguing of the Yiddish collection in Widener Library; and gifts of books and money from Herbert Lehman, Paul Warburg, and Prof. Paul Sachs.

## WARSAW KEHILLAH CABLES ITS PROTEST TO BRITISH GOVERNMENT

Victims in Walling Wall Incident Institute Legal Action (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Oct. 3.—The protest of Polish Jewry against the police interference with Jewish worshippers at the Walling Wall on Yom Kippur was expressed in a cable despatched to the British government by the Executive of the Warsaw Kehillah, the largest Jewish community in Europe.

The Kehillah expresses its hope that the Palestine government will see to it that such events as give offense to the deepest Jewish religious feelings will not again occur.

Jerusalem, Oct. 3.—Legal action was instituted by two Jewish women, one of them an American, who were among those beaten while worshipping at the Walling Wall when the Jerusalem police interfered with the worshippers on Yom Kippur.

The two women followed complaints against the policemen whom they charge with having beaten them during their effort to tear down the screen separating the men and women worshippers.

## POLISH GOVERNMENT ORGANS CONDEMN ANTI-SEMITIC PRACTICES

Censure Segregation of Jewish Physicians at Convention (J. T. A. Mail Service)

Warsaw, Sept. 14.—A strong condemnation of anti-Semitism, especially as demonstrated recently at the annual convention of physicians held at Ciechocinek this month, when the Jewish physicians attending found themselves segregated from the rest of the delegates and left the Conference in protest, is made in articles published by the Government organs, "Glos Pravyd" and "Eko."

"Anti-Semitism," they write, "is without question one of the most foolish and most animal forms of Nationalism. Foolish because in modern society it can never attain its aim, and instead of weakening those against whom it fights, it strengthens them. And animal because it arouses the lowest instincts of people and destroys all human feeling. In Poland," they proceed, "anti-Semitism has been spread by the Endeks (National Democratic Party), which has poisoned the soul of the people with anti-Semitism, exploited as a political weapon with which to mislead the masses.

"The Endek spirit is still dominant in the secondary and higher schools, in the law courts, and in the liberal professions. Anti-Semitism follows the line of least resistance. It acts as a narcotic, lulling the people to sleep, and it is a greater danger than what it purports to fight. Also anti-Semitism has no true relation to the real feeling of the people towards the Jews. We therefore regard it as an essential task of the State to put down this anti-Semitism and to solve the Jewish question, which anti-Semitism like its colleague—Jewish Chauvinism—only renders more acute, but can never alleviate."

Referring to what happened at Ciechocinek, the papers say: "No one wants to compel the Endeks to meet with Jews or to compel Jews to meet with Endeks. That is their own private affair. But if the people who are responsible for what happened in Ciechocinek think that Poland is an Endek Club, the sooner they get the idea out of their heads the better. Scientific conferences which are held under the patronage of the State must not be turned into an occasion for the Endeks to demonstrate their idea of what constitutes gentlemanly behavior. If the public sees the kind of thing that goes on at these conferences of medical men, lawyers, engineers, etc., it will soon lose all its respect for the professional ability of these people. We certainly think that the State ought to take up this matter and teach a lesson to those who are responsible for what took place at Ciechocinek."

# AVUKAH ANNOUNCES NEW PLANS FOR CURRENT COLLEGIATE SEASON

**Board of Trustees to be Formed at  
New York Conference**

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Washington, D. C., Oct. 3.—New plans for the present collegiate season were announced by Max Rhoads, president of the Avukah, American student Zionist Federation.

A Board of Trustees is to be formed which will take care of the financing of the Avukah, removing the burden from the student ranks. A conference for the formation of this Board of Trustees will be held in New York, Sunday, October 28, at which Rabbi Stephen S. Wise will act as chairman. Charles J. Rosenbloom, of Pittsburgh has been chosen treasurer of the Board of Trustees.

In accordance with the resolutions adopted at the last annual convention of Avukah at Pittsburgh, and a referendum vote recently conducted, new policies will be carried into effect within the organization, as regards membership and cultural work. Membership will henceforth be selective, on the basis of character and Zionist attainments, and admission to full fledged membership in the Avukah will require a majority vote of the members of the local chapter, Mr. Rhoads announced. At the same time there will be a class of associate members entitled to all privileges except the vote, composed of "novice members."

The president also announced the appointment of Samuel S. Grossman of New York as National Executive Secretary of the Avukah. Mr. Grossman was for a number of years manager of the Jewish Art Theater, and last year was associated with Dr. S. Benderly in the work of the Bureau of Jewish Education. He has also been Educational Director of the Brooklyn Jewish Center. He is the author of a number of plays and poems of Jewish interest.

Among the publications planned by Avukah are a Zionist text book and a Palestine and Zionist anthology.

A "Echazlutz" book, as a tribute to the Chazlutz movement on its tenth anniversary, will shortly be off the press. It is being published by Avukah with the cooperation of the Zionist Labor Party, Zeire Zion. The book, published in English, contains a number of essays translated from the Hebrew of Chaim Nachman Bialik J. Ch. Brenner, Shlomo Schiller, A. D. Gordon, Trumpeldor, with an introduction by Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff. Miss Rebecca Schmuckler, head of the Avukah Hebrew Translation Department, is editor of the work.

## J.D.B. NEWS LETTER

**Jewish Community Chest Planned for  
Boston**

(By our Boston Correspondent)

Boston, Oct. 3.—The two outstanding problems that seem to overshadow all other questions before the Jewry of Boston are politics and campaign fund raising to meet the growing budgetary requirements that have been mounting up as a result of the expansion building program. Just what the outcome will be is still speculative although it is stated that a larger Federation—that is a Jewish community chest may result from the present discussion to have one organization to raise all the funds required to meet the needs of the community.

Too, Boston is threatened with a large number of drives that are bound to conflict with each other unless radical steps are taken to cope with the problem. Boston has a well organized Federation. When the Federation was formed it was the hope of those that made it a reality that one annual drive for funds for all local needs would be made. New situations have arisen and in the last few years independent organizations requiring large sums of money have grown up, creating new problems.

With the opening of the new Jewish hospital, one of the best in this country, the question now is what shall be done to secure all the money needed to cover the needs of all institutions? The proposal that Boston should have a Jewish Community Chest was put forward. A drive for one million dollars is contemplated. This will not solve the whole problem as the million dollars is for local needs only. A number of the leaders propose that United Palestine Appeal should be included in the chest. Max Shoolman one of the largest contributors to both the hospital, the Federation and who is the chairman of the New England U. P. A. is in favor of including the U. P. A. in the chest. But the suggestion to be carried into effect will require the endorsement of the Zionists and the non-Zionists and it is difficult to tell how this will be taken by both. Meanwhile, the local United Palestine Appeal is awaiting definite agreement on the chest proposals.

As for the political situation, it is noteworthy to call attention to the recent primaries. Two Jewish candidates were on the Democratic State ticket, Mr. Scharton as a candidate for Attorney General and Daniel England of Pittsfield, Mass., as candidate for State Treasurer. These candidates were put on the Democratic ticket with a view of attracting the Jewish Republicans but both candidates were defeated. Mr. England has been a candidate before on the Democratic ticket.

## UNNATURALIZED ROUMANIAN JEWS NOT CONSIDERED AS ALIENS WHO MUST REGISTER

**Government Promises Status of this  
Category Soon to be Established**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Oct. 3.—Unnaturalized Roumanian Jews, constituting a large group of the so-called "men without a country," particularly in the new provinces annexed to Roumania, do not come under the heading of aliens obliged to register under the recent ordinance issued by the Roumanian authorities.

This interpretation of the ordinance is contained in an article published in the "Curierul Israelitei." The paper simultaneously reports that the Jewish senator, Horiah Carp, received an assurance from the Roumanian government that the status of this category will soon be regulated. The article, which was apparently published for the purpose of easing the minds of those affected, did not have the effect desired as the Roumanian authorities have not made any official statement in this regard changing the general ordinance calling for the registration of all those residents in the country who are not citizens of the kingdom.

As a whole the candidacy of Frank G. Allen the present Lieut. Governor who is the Republican nominee for Governor to succeed Gov. Alvan T. Fuller has attracted many leading Jews to his support.

The only woman on the Governor's Council, Mrs. Esther M. Andrews who was appointed by Governor Fuller to fill the vacancy caused by the death of a member of the Council, was nominated by the Republican party to that office. This virtually means her election as she comes from a district that is overwhelmingly Republican. She is the first woman and the first Jewess to sit in the chamber of the Governor's Council. Mrs. Andrews has a reputation as a champion of social legislation.

Preparation is under way for the National Conference of the United Palestine Appeal, which takes place here on November 10 and 11. Boston is looking forward to this conference. It is the hope of the Zionists to heal the breach that has been caused as a result of the last convention in Pittsburgh.

Negotiations are well under way to include the local Hadassah in the U. P. A. drive that will be launched simultaneously with the coming of the National Conference. Moses Mishel, president of Temple Mishkan Tefilah who has accepted an important post in the New England Zionist movement, is the leading spirit to restore harmony in the Zionist ranks. He is receiving the cooperation of the administrative board of the New England Zionists.

 investigation made by Corporal McCann and the other officers, a Jewish boy who is admittedly of low intellect, voluntarily came to the Police Office at Massena, giving the name of 'Jacob Shulkin' and stated in a rambling conversation, that the girl might be in any one of several different places, among which was Hogsburg. After some conversation with this boy, the investigators realized that he was of low mentality, and at midnight Saturday, he was sent to his home in the custody of an officer and turned over to his father for safe keeping.

"3. After all other efforts to find the child had failed, investigators began to work on the theory that possibly some person or persons had kidnapped the child and destroyed her in some manner, and starting on this theory, the first person to be investigated was the Jewish boy 'Jacob Shulkin'. With this in mind and knowing that Monday was the Jewish holiday of Atonement, it was deemed necessary and essential to find out whether or not it was customary in the olden days, for the members of the Jewish faith, to offer a blood sacrifice, the investigators feeling that if it was so and the Shulkin boy was familiar with the fact, he might in his condition, have taken it upon himself to offer such a sacrifice.

"4. Morris Goldberg, was the first Jewish person to be questioned about this custom, and he apparently knew nothing about it and suggested that the Rabbi be interviewed. On Sunday afternoon Corporal McCann telephoned to the Rabbi and asked him to stop at the Police Station when he came by as there were some questions which it was necessary to ask him. The Rabbi, during the afternoon, did come to the Police Station voluntarily, and he was questioned in the private office of the Chief of Police by Corporal McCann and Corporal McCann states that the question which was asked was: 'Was it the custom in the olden days of the Jewish faith, to offer a blood sacrifice on any of the Holy Days?' At this question Corporal McCann and also the Rabbi stated that the Rabbi became very much incensed and denied that was the custom at any time in the Jewish Faith, after which an apology was offered by Corporal McCann.

"5. The matter was reported by the Rabbi to the members of his congregation who reported it to the Commanding Officer. This investigation is the result of such report.

"6. On Tuesday afternoon at two o'clock, Mayor Hawes, Chief of Police Sanjuel, Attorney A. J. Hanner, Corporal McCann and Lieutenant Heim, proceeded to the Synagogue and there met the Rabbi, Mr. Stone and several

Poland with the participation of the rabbis and community leaders.

The Executive Committee of the Zionist Organization of Poland also announced that it will summon its members to participate in protest meetings. At a conference of Zionist students of Eastern Galicia held today in Lemberg a resolution of protest against the incident at the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem was unanimously adopted.

A cabled protest against the action of the Jerusalem police at the Wailing Wall on Yom Kippur was despatched to Acting High Commissioner of Palestine, H. C. Luke, by Rabbi Israel Rosenber, president of the Union of Orthodox Rabbis of the United States and Canada. The cablegram read:

"We learned with profound sorrow about the scandalous disturbance at the Western Wall on the Day of Atonement by the Jerusalem police, and we protest emphatically against such outrageous offenses to the Jews at our most sacred place. We demand that the Palestine Government and the Mandatory Power take proper steps to secure the Jews' rights over the space before the Western Wall."

Dr. Nathan Krass of Temple Emanu-El, New York, delivered the consecration oration at the presentation of the Warner Memorial Gymnasium, the gift of Harry M. Albert, Jack L. and Dave Warner, to the Hebrew Orphan Asylum of New York. The Bulletin regrets the omission from yesterday's issue of the report of Dr. Krass's address, dedicating the new building.

A fund to erect a synagogue in Dillon, S.C., where there is a small Jewish community, was launched at the recent holiday services held in the home of Max Fassa, president of the Theresa Witconer Fassa congregation. A site for the temple was donated by I. Blum.

The Jews of Dillon have always been liberal contributors to local church building funds; and it is expected that Dillon citizens, irrespective of denomination, will contribute to the temple fund.
