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## BUDAPEST AGAIN EXCITED OVER ISSUE OF NUMERUS CLAUSUS

Jewish Students Absent; Police Guard  
College as New Outbreaks  
Feared

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Budapest, Oct. 18.—The Hungarian capital was again thrown into excitement over the numerus clausus issue as the matter was taken up in the House of Parliament and a wave of restlessness among the Hungarian students interfered with regular university attendance.

Strong police and military detachments guarded the university campus today, because of the fear of an outbreak of new anti-Jewish excesses. The small number of Jewish students who were permitted to enroll this semester were absent from their classes in view of the fact that mammoth placards were posted in the streets last night threatening that the Hungarian students will eject the Jewish students from the classrooms.

The issue was raised in Parliament yesterday by the Jewish deputy, Pakots, a member of the Liberal party, who introduced an interpellation charging Minister of Education Count Klebelsberg with failure to carry out energetically the program he considered fair. The interpellation referred to the policy pursued by the colleges during the enrollment period and to the astounding fact of the University Senate's refusal to carry out the order of the Minister of Education that thirty additional Jewish students, who had graduated with high honors from the secondary schools, be admitted.

Jewish students, although they had the highest marks of distinction, were rejected and instead, "race pure" members of the nationalistic student organization, though ranking low in the entrance examinations, were admitted. In some cases the examining commission admitted students who must submit to additional examinations, having failed to pass the first. In this manner the college quotas were filled, leaving out those students who had the highest marks, just because they were Jews.

The intervention of the Minister to secure their admission will in all probability remain without result, in view of the threatening attitude of the Hungarian students who called protest meetings against Count Klebelsberg, threatening excesses at the university and declaring that the student body will refuse to sit together with those Jewish students who were previously

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## NEW ATTACKS UPON JEWS OCCUR IN THE ISMAIL REGION OF Bessarabia

Rabbi Zirelson Urges Bucharest to  
Take Vigorous Action

Bucharest, Oct. 18.—Anti-Jewish attacks were renewed several days ago in Chisme, district of Ismail, Bessarabia, from where anti-Jewish attacks were reported several weeks ago.

Hooligans invaded the local synagogue and set fire to the Aron Kodesh, the Ark. Five Scrolls of the Law were burned. The damages were estimated to be one million lei.

The entire Jewish press in Bessarabia openly condemns the savage vandalism and urges the authorities to institute an investigation.

Chief Rabbi Zirelson of Kishineff despatched a telegram to the Roumanian Ministry of the Interior protesting against the outrage and demanding immediate vigorous measures.

Deputy William Fielderman and Senator Niemerower have intervened with the authorities in this matter.

## HAPPIEST DAY SAYS PHILADELPHIAN EMBRACING JUDAISM

Warsaw, Oct. 18.—Today is the happiest day of my life. Now I am assured that when I die Jewish burial in consecrated ground will be accorded me," declared Harry Hirschfeld, aged Philadelphian, when he left the Warsaw Rabbinate building bearing a document to show that he was admitted into the fold of Judaism.

Hirschfeld, who is 77, was born in Warsaw, the son of a converted Polish Jew and his Christian wife. Reared to his seventeenth year as a Christian, he came to the United States where he made his home with his uncle, a Jew, and lived for sixty years as a Jew, married to a Jewish woman and rearing a family in the Jewish faith.

Achieving the purpose of his journey, his official acceptance into the Jewish faith, Hirschfeld left for America.

## JERUSALEM JEWS PROTEST; BUT ARABS CONTINUE TO BUILD ON WAILING WALL

Question Discussed at Stormy Session  
of Vaad Leumi; Ussishkin Urges  
Bold Action

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Oct. 18.—While Palestine Jewry continued to give vent to their feeling in the much discussed question of the Jewish right of access to the Western Wall of the Temple, known as the Wailing Wall, the Moslem Arabs contesting this right continued the building operations on the Wall started at the beginning of this week. The building work is being carried on on the top of the left side of the Wall.

Presentations made by Col. Frederick H. Kisch, political representative of the Zionist Executive and by the Vaad Leumi, National Council of Palestine Jews, brought no result.

A session of the Vaad Leumi was held today to consider the situation. A stormy discussion developed when M. M. Ussishkin, well known Zionist leader and head of the Jewish National Fund, demanded of the Council that "bold action be taken to stop the building operations." Vladimir Jabotinsky proposed that Palestine Jews through their National Council set up a permanent agency for carrying on political work in London and Geneva, in addition to the political department of the Zionist Executive. No decision was reached. Another session of the Council was called for Sunday, October 21.

## HALPERN RESIGNS AS MANAGER OF COLONIAL TRUST

London, Oct. 18.—Dr. George Halpern, managing director of the Jewish Colonial Trust, Zionist Bank, will retire from his position beginning November 1, the Zionist Organization here announced today.

It was recalled that during the Fifth Zionist Congress in Basle, Dr. Halpern expressed his desire to resign. He was persuaded to remain in his post in order to be able to conclude current affairs, it was stated. He will remain a member of the board of the Jewish Colonial Trust and the Anglo-Palestine Bank.

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## ENGLISH ZIONISTS PROTEST

## WAILING WALL INCIDENT

(J. T. A. Mail Service)

London, Oct. 2.—The Executive of the English Zionist Federation has unanimously adopted a resolution protesting against the incident at the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem.

"The Executive of the English Zionist Federation," the resolution reads, "consider it their duty to protest most emphatically against the action of the responsible officials of the Palestine Administration in their interference with the Jewish worshippers at the Kotel Ma'arabi in Jerusalem on the Day of Atonement, and to voice the pain and indignation that has been aroused by this outrage on Jewish national and religious sentiment.

"The Executive of the English Zionist Federation, who feel that, in this respect, they are interpreting the views of all loyal Jewish subjects of His Majesty, realize keenly the humiliation which the action of the authorities in Palestine has put upon the Jews in their National Home, and beg to urge upon His Majesty's Government that immediate steps be taken to make impossible any repetition of any similar incident in the future. It is the confident hope of the Executive of the English Zionist Federation that His Majesty's Government will also take such measures as it may consider expedient to ensure that the Jewish traditional rights at the Kotel Ma'arabi, embodying the profound attachment of all faithful Jews to this august relic of the ancient temple in the Holy City of Jerusalem, will be safeguarded in a manner worthy of the spirit as well as the letter of the Mandate under which the establishment of the Jewish National Home has been assumed by Great Britain," the resolution declares.

## Jewish Congregational Activities

Baltimore, Md., Oct. 18.—Clergymen of various denominations in Baltimore took part in a discussion of a proposed civil-marriage bill Wednesday afternoon at the office of Rabbi Morris S. Lazar, of the Madison Avenue Temple. The meeting was called by Seymour Phillips, member of the Maryland Legislature and an advocate of the civil-marriage ceremony.

According to Rabbi Phillips nothing definite was decided but it was the first step in a campaign to "educate" the people of Maryland in support of the bill.

In addition to Rabbi Lazar, the meeting was attended by the Rev. Dr. Peter Ansiehl, pastor of the Christian Temple; the Rev. Dr. Hugh Brickman, rector of Emanuel Protestant Episcopal Church; the Rev. Kingman A. Handy, pastor of Miller Memorial Baptist Church, and the Rev. Daniel G. Mack, pastor of the Macedonia Baptist Church.

A three-day celebration of the seventy-fifth anniversary of the congregation of the Eutaw Place Temple, Oheb Shalom Congregation, will begin with services Friday night, October 19, at the temple. Several out-of-town rabbis will take part in the program.

Rabbi William Rosenau, of the Temple, will deliver the introductory address and will unveil a tablet. Rabbi Morris S. Lazar, of the Baltimore Hebrew Congregation, will speak for the other synagogues in the city. Rabbi H. G. Enelow, of Temple Emanu-El, New York, and President of the Central Conference of American Rabbis, will deliver the anniversary address.

In addition to regular services Saturday morning, Rabbi Simon Cohen, of New York, will give an address and Rabbi Sidney Tedeschi, of New Haven, Conn., will preach.

Sunday morning the young people of the religious school will join with the congregation and take part in the services. Various phases of synagogue work and influence will be discussed by Rabbi Bernard J. Bamberger, of Lafayette, Ind.; Rabbi Daniel L. Davis, of Lancaster, Pa., and Rabbi William F. Rosenbaum, of Washington.

A congregational dinner is planned for Sunday night at the Southern Hotel, with A. I. Weinberg as toastmaster. The past, present and future work of the congregation will be the topic of discussion.

The plans call for the erection of a modern building involving the expenditure of more than \$1,000,000. Leo C. Fuller was elected chairman of the Consolidation Committee.

It is not certain whether consolidation measures will proceed, inasmuch as there appears to be some question as to the wisdom of such a plan.

Detroit, Mich., Oct. 15.—Judge Harry B. Kidan was honored at the recent primaries. He was elected to the municipal court twice before, and on both occasions either led the field of candidates or came in second.

Several months ago, Judge Keidan was elevated to the circuit court bench, by the appointment of Governor Fred Green, to fill a vacancy. At the primaries he was voted on for the short term ending next spring, and he received 111,490 votes. The next candidate trailed Judge Keidan with 66,370 votes.

Judge Keidan is a devout Orthodox Jew, walks to court on Saturday, does not write on that day, and is observing almost to the letter of the law.

Postmaster Charles C. Kellogg estimated the number of New Year's cards which went through the Detroit Post Office at approximately 400,000. At this rate, \$8,000 were spent in postage on Rosh Hashanah greeting cards. All of American Jewry, if Detroit Jewry's expense be considered an average, should therefore have spent about a half million dollars for postage on New Year greeting cards.

## GERMAN GROUP SEEKS TO DISPROVE ANTI-SEMITIC CHARGES

Berlin, Oct. 4.—The main task of the Union for Combatting anti-Semitism, a non-Jewish organization, which held its annual meeting here this week, is to show up the falsity and injustice of the anti-Semitic allegations. Dr. Horlacher, director of the Union, declared in submitting the annual report to the meeting. Ex-Federal Minister Dr. Gothein, the president of the Union presided.

The Union, Dr. Horlacher said, had to convince the people that anti-Semitism could not go together with a sound normal political life, with real religion, with true national unity. Anti-Semitism was a two fold danger. It was a danger to the inner national life of the country because it created factions and strife. It was dangerous also in foreign affairs. Its greatest menace was that it bred the habit of putting the blame for everything that was unsatisfactory in the political, social or economic life of the country upon the Jews, instead of finding the real cause

## AGREEMENT WITH SOVIET GOVERNMENT ON FURTHER JEWISH COLONIZATION WORK UNDER ROSENWALD PLAN NOW BEING PERFECTED

Figures Show Agricultural Movement's Progress in Past 14 Years; 6.3% of Jewish Population in Russia Now Farmers

Work on completing the details of an agreement to be concluded with the Soviet Government for the extension of Jewish colonization work in Soviet Russia under the Julius Rosenwald plan for which he pledged the sum of \$5,000,000, is being hastened, James N. Rosenberg, chairman of the Agrojoint announced. Dr. Joseph A. Eisen, Dr. Bernard Kahn and Mr. Joseph C. Hyman, secretary of the Joint Distribution Committee, are now in Berlin completing the detail work. Up to date an amount somewhat in excess of \$7,300,000 was subscribed toward the \$10,000,000 fund, Mr. Rosenberg stated, expressing the hope that the rest will soon be forthcoming to complete the fund.

The chairman of the Agrojoint invited the attention of American Jewish leaders to a table of figures made public recently by the Soviet Government containing official data on the progress of Jewish colonization work in Russia during the past fourteen years. In 1913 there were 52,758 Jews on the soil. These were the old colonists whose forebears had been permitted to go to the soil by the Czars Alexander and Nicholas. In 1927, the report shows over 165,000 Jews on over 1,200,000 acres. This means that over 6.3 percent of the Russian Jewish population (of 2,600,000 souls) are now farmers. Less than one-half of one percent of the total sown area of Soviet Russia is occupied by the Jews.

Beginning with 1924, the total number of Jewish agricultural population and the area of the land tilled by it have been showing a rapid increase," the official report states. "This remarkable progress of the back-to-the-land movement of the Jewish masses is explained by the fact that in the fall of 1924, there were founded two special Jewish organizations entrusted with the carrying out of the tremendous

## MILLION DOLLAR DEDICATION DINNER TO BE GIVEN BY YESHIVA COLLEGE, DECEMBER 9th

Morris White Accepts Chairmanship of City Wide Representative Committee for Dedication Exercises

"The movement to complete the buildings of the Yeshiva College, the first college in the United States under Jewish auspices, and to insure a sufficiently large endowment fund for the maintenance of the institution for higher learning, gained impetus with the announcement made yesterday that Morris White, the well known realtor and industrialist of New York City, responded to the call of the Yeshiva College Executive Committee and accepted the chairmanship of the dedication dinner, which will be held at the Astor Hotel on Sunday, December 9th.

The announcement of Mr. White's assumption of the chairmanship of the exercises, which will mark the culmination of a three-year effort, was greeted with wide applause at a meeting of the Yeshiva College Executive Committee held at the Jewish Center, 131 West 86th Street. The meeting was presided over by Samuel Levy.

Building activities at Washington Heights, where the institution is being erected, are rapidly nearing completion, and the leaders of the movement have now turned their attention to securing a sufficiently large endowment fund, which would provide the necessary upkeep and maintenance cost. For this purpose the opening exercises will be concluded with a mammoth dedication dinner, at which at least one thousand couples are ex-

## JEWISH MINISTERIAL DIRECTOR LEFT BEHIND BY ZEPPELIN EXPLAINS WHY Refutes Assertions of Anti-Semitic Discrimination

Berlin, Oct. 19.—Two versions as to why Dr. Herman Badt, Ministerial Director in the Prussian Government, a Jew, scheduled to be a passenger on the Graf Zeppelin on its trans-Atlantic flight, was left behind are current in Berlin today.

According to a report published in the "Vossische Zeitung," Dr. Badt arrived a few minutes too late to board the Zeppelin. Another version ascribes his being left behind to his being Jewish. Another version ascribes his being left behind to including a Jew on the historic flight.

Dr. Badt, interviewed by the representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, denied both assertions. Dr. Hugo Eckener had decided to invite representatives of eighteen German states to participate in the flight. Due to the fact that the Prussian government members were detained by their parliamentary duties, Dr. Badt was originally slated to represent Prussia. However, shortly before the flight, the Prussian parliament adjourned, thus enabling Dr. Albert Grzesinsky to make the journey, Dr. Badt

did was to provide for the Jewish education of their children. This has preserved their strength and given them courage and endurance to withstand the onslaught of persecutions at the hands of their enemies," Mr. White declared.

"With the establishment of the Yeshiva College, we are building a tower of strength for Jewish learning in America. An institution like the Yeshiva College will build a line of defense against the inroads of indifference and desertion, which is noticeable among our young in this country.

"America, as well as the world at large knows of the magnificent buildings built and erected by the Jews of our country. They tower in the skies, arousing both enthusiasm and confidence in the great spirit of enterprise in America.

"Never in our history, however, have we built such edifices for Jewish learning. Never has an attempt been made to combine a Yeshiva with a college, an experiment in which leading American educators are keenly interested. We are now writing history and future generations will look upon this work of ours with pride and point to all those who have made it possible as the pioneers of a new Jewish era in this country, an era that brought about the revival of the Jewish spirit and added credit to the Jewish name in the United States.

"The former Mayor of the State of New York, the late Seth Low, when he attended the first international peace conference at the Hague in answer to a question of how big the standing army of our nation is and how many arsenals America possesses, answered: 'We have thousands of schools, high schools and colleges in America. These are our arsenals and the millions of pupils in them, receiving a thorough American education, are our soldiers who will give their lives to defend the existence of our nation.'

"The Yeshiva College will be the arsenal of the Jewish people in America, where the spiritual equipment for the defense of our existence will be stored and treasured. The combination of Jewish idealism with modern education will produce a type of American Jew of whom we will be able to be proud.

rejected by the examining commission.

Count Klebelsberg, answering the interpellation promised to exert every effort for the admission of the limited number of Jewish students. He confirmed that the university authorities rejected Jewish students with high marks and even such applicants who were the sons of war invalids and of war heroes. The university authorities pursued an unpermissible policy along religious lines. The numerus clausus question is undoubtedly one of a political nature, but the policy is within the province of the Minister of Education and not of the subordinate authorities. The rejection of the Jewish students must be therefore be withdrawn, he declared.

The explanation of the Minister of Education was accepted by the parliamentary majority. The interpellants, however, remained dissatisfied with Count Klebelsberg's reply, because he declined to discipline the professors who are now ready to comply with the Minister's order. The interpellants charged that the professors are now inciting the student body, causing danger of new disorders.

One of the speakers disclosed that the diplomatic representative of the Italian government in Hungary, Romanelli, intervened in favor of the Jewish students whose admission was denied over the Minister's order. One

## COMMUNICATION TO THE EDITOR

Sir:

In your issue for Tuesday, October 16, 1928, at the beginning of page four, you report me as having stated at the New York meeting of the Association for Z. O. A. Reorganization as follows:

"The naming of an estimable gentleman as Executive Director, whose mental operations are more difficult to understand than any one I know, does not alter the situation so long as the present cabinet is not discharged."

Your quotation is in error. I did not make the remarks attributed to me. I said in substance that the Executive Director recently appointed by the Z. O. A. is an estimable gentleman but I did not think his appointment would change the situation and I cited the recent instance where the Executive Director, together with the Chairman of the Administrative Committee made specific recommendations as to a matter of major policy, namely, certain conditions as to participation by Hadassah in the U. P. A. and their recommendations were overruled and disregarded. I did not say, however, that the mental operations of the Executive Director "are more difficult to understand than any one I know" or anything like it. My remarks on that score expressly and plainly referred to another gentleman whose mental operations I am unable to comprehend, not to the Executive Director.
