ROSEN AND HYMAN CONTINUE NEGOTIATIONS WITH SOVIET ON ROSENWALD PLAN

Condition of Jewish Colonies in
Crimea and Ukraine Improving
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Oct. 25.—Dr. Joseph Rosen and Joseph C. Hyman arrived here from Berlin where they conferred with Dr. Bernard Kahn, European director of the Joint Distribution Committee, on the details of the agreement with the Soviet government for the \$10,000,000 Rosenwald fund for further Jewish colonization in Russia.

Dr. Rosen and Mr. Hyman will continue negotiations with Soviet leaders. Several points have not yet been settled, they stated.

Moscow, Oct. 25.—An optimistic report of conditions in the Jewish colonies in the Ukraine and Crimea was brought back by Y. Lubarsky, head agronomist of the Agrojoint, who returned from a tour of the colonies.

Conditions are better in Crimea, good in the Krivoy Rog region and fair in Cherson, he stated in an interview with the Jewish Telegraphic Agency correspondent. The winter seeding has been completed and the outlook for the crop is good.

The survey of the 109,000 hectares recently granted for Jewish colonization in Crimea is proceeding with the participation of Agrojoint agronomists. They expect that a large proportion of the land is fertile.

ZIONIST OPPOSITION SILENT ON AGENCY CONFERENCE RESULT

London, Oct. 25.—Leaders of the Zionist opposition groups in Europe have declined to comment on the outcome of the Non-Zionist Conference in New York relative to the formation of the extended Jewish Agency, it being declared that at the present moment any criticism voiced will not be of a constructive nature.

Further comment in the European Jewish press welcomes the decisions of the conference as a step forward in the unification of Jews. The hope is expressed that the Palestine work will now be put on a broader economic footing and that the situation in Palestine will become stabilized.

FORMER CAIRO CHIEF RABBI DIES AT AGE OF 85

Tel Aviv, Oct. 25.—Rabbi Rafael Ben Shimon, former Chief Rabbi of Cairo, died here today at the age of 85. Rabbi Ben Shimon was the author of many Talmudic works.

HUNGARIAN UNIVERSITY CITIES PERMANENT BATTLE- FIELD OF ANTI-SEMITIC WAR

Government Threatens, and Does
Nothing; New Demonstrations
Result in Property Damage
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Budapest, Oct. 25.—The Hungarian University cities continue to be the battlefield of anti-Semitic warfare against the small number of Jewish students admitted to the colleges this year.

The newspapers have introduced a permanent feature captioned "From the anti-Semitic Battlefield," wherein the news of the anti-Semitic demonstrations is given. Usually, nothing happens in the forenoon, but in the afternoon hours the fights are resumed. Up to today no one has any idea as to when and how the government will restore order in the colleges.

Both the university authorities and the police seem to be surprisingly powerless toward the hundreds of nationalistic students, the government doing nothing except issue threats couched in conciliatory terms.

The anti-Semitic demonstrations continued yesterday on a large scale in Debreczin where they resulted in much damage to Jewish property. All stores in principal thoroughfares are closed today due to the fear of a renewed attack. Similarly Jewish homes were kept locked and shutters closed. The city authorities urged the police to increase its patrols. The police detachments did not succeed until today to penetrate into the Agriculture College where five hundred students were driven by the police last night. Siege was waged by the police.

ARABS CALL SPECIAL CONFERENCE ON QUESTION OF WAILING WALL

Agudath Israel Sends Memorandum
to Colonial Office
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Oct. 25.—A special all-Palestine conference to consider the question of the Wailing Wall has been called by the Moslem Supreme Council.

London, Oct. 25.—A memorandum of protest against the incidents at the Wailing Wall was presented to the British Colonial Office by the Agudath Israel, Orthodox world organization.

The memorandum, which suggests that the Colonial office call a conference of all parties interested, says "It is a scandalous thing which has occurred ten years after the issuance of the Balfour Declaration. The occurrences are without precedent."

AGUDATH ISRAEL ASKS LEAGUE COMMISSION TO POSTPONE CONSIDERATION OF ITS MEMO

Deals with Objections to Palestine
Communities Ordinance
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Geneva, Oct. 25.—The Permanent Mandates Commission of the League of Nations, which will open its session here tomorrow, was requested by cablegram despatched by the Orthodox world organization, Agudath Israel, to take off the Commission's agenda the discussion on the organization's petition setting forth its objections to the Palestine Communities Ordinance.

The minutes of the Commission's last session held in June reproduce the remarks made by the representative of the British government in comment upon the memorandum submitted by the Zionist Organization concerning the land question in Palestine. The government of Palestine, the British representative declared, is endeavoring to arrive at some satisfactory arrangement with the Arab inhabitants who still regard with considerable suspicion the actions of the Palestine government on matters pertaining to the possession of state lands. It is the first duty of the Palestine government to discharge its obligations with essential caution for peaceful order, without which the Jewish National Home cannot be established on a sure foundation, the representative stated.

With reference to the claims on the Beisan land, an investigating commission is making satisfactory progress. Attention is also being given to the possibility of acquiring land from the beneficiaries under the Beisan agreement.

With regard to immigration, the representative explained that the Chief Immigration Officer acts under explicit directions from the High Commissioner, without exercising any arbitrary powers regarding the admission of immigrants and persons of independent means.

PROF. AULARD, NOTED FRIEND OF JEWS, DIES

Paris, Oct. 25.—Alfonse Aulard, Professor at the University of Paris and noted friend of the Jewish people, died here at the age of 79. Professor Aulard was the head of the International League for Human Rights, which was ever zealous to stand against any persecution of the Jews in Western Europe. He was a witness for the defense at the trial of Sholom Schwartzbard. He also aided suffering Jewish students.

UNION PLANS NEW TRACTS ON JUDAISM

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Cincinnati, O., Oct. 25.—Proposed publication of two tracts in Yiddish for distribution among Eastern European Jews was approved at a meeting of the Tract Commission of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations and the Central Conference of American Rabbis, at the Hotel Stinton, Cincinnati, Ohio. "What is Reform Judaism?" and "The History of Reform Judaism" will be the subjects of the tracts and they are to be prepared by European Jews.

The Commission also endorsed a proposal to issue a tract on "Judaism and Mental Healing."

A series to be called "Notable Sermons" and consisting of outstanding addresses by rabbis influential in the progress of Reform Judaism will be issued under the supervision of Rabbi Israel Bettan, Professor of Homiletics and Midrash, Hebrew Union College.

Those attending the Tract Commission's meeting included the chairman, Rabbi Leo M. Franklin, of Detroit, Mich.; Rabbi B. Freuch, Chicago, Ill.; Rabbi Samuel Hirschberg, Milwaukee, Wis.; and Rabbi George Zepin, Cincinnati.

Since December, the Commission has distributed the tract, "Judaism's Influence in the Founding of the Republic," by Rabbi Morris M. Feuerlicht, of Indianapolis; "Philanthropy in Rabbinical Literature," by Prof. Abraham Cronbach, Hebrew Union College and "The Jewish Prayerbook," by Rabbi Freuch.

REUTER REPORTS QUEER JEWISH SECT FORMED ON POLISH BORDER

Accepting Divinity of Jesus, They
Adhere to Rabbinical Regulations
(J. T. A. Mail Service)

London, Oct. 11.—A new Jewish sect has been established on the eastern border of Poland, near Vilna, with headquarters at Kucevitz, its adherents numbering, it is said, about 15,000, states a Reuter report from Warsaw appearing here today in the "Daily Telegraph."

It has been decided, the report further says, to form a Jewish Church, recognizing the divinity of Jesus and also to study the New Testament, adhering, however, to the general rabbinical regulations. The recent development of this and other sects, the report adds, is an entirely new feature in Poland, where until lately any movement of this kind has always been extremely insignificant.

FELIX WARBURG LAUDS HOOVER IN MESSAGE READ AT CIVIC LEADERS' AUDIENCE

J. N. Rosenberg Acts as Spokesman
in Absence of Warburg
(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Washington, Oct. 25.—James N. Rosenberg, vice-chairman of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, in the absence of Felix M. Warburg who was unable to attend, acted as spokesman for the delegation of civic leaders who were received by Herbert Hoover yesterday at his headquarters here. The delegation included a number of outstanding philanthropists and social workers.

Mr. Rosenberg read a message from Mr. Warburg, highly lauding Mr. Hoover and declaring it is a "privilege to join this group who have had experience in social work and express to you, as we have done elsewhere, our satisfaction that in all probability you will be in charge of the social well-being not only of the suffering but of the strong citizens of the United States as well, when you take office as President.

"It is not an empty phrase when I express this heartfelt belief. It is based on the privilege I enjoyed while I worked under you in the census of foodstuffs to which you invited me, then in the relief action during the famine in Russia where, as chairman of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, I could admire at the same time your splendid judgment and deep feeling for all suffering humanity. When the famine was over, when an effort was made to plant some of the thousands of people who were deprived of their livelihood in the trades and on the farms, in consequence of the revolution in Russia, you showed a marvelous understanding of and sympathy with that new problem.

"Your expressed approval and the interest which you have shown in this experiment have not only helped us in perfecting so successfully what we have been trying to do, but have persuaded others of the merits of this problem. These persuasive powers, due to your actions more than to your words, which, through contact with you, turned people who were mere acquaintances into staunch admirers, will I am sure bring you success in the exalted office which I trust will soon be yours. Problems which seem to be nearly impossible to be solved by simple legal efforts may, in my opinion, be solved if you deem it advisable to call upon good citizenship to follow your's and others' splendid example."

MASS MEETING PROTESTS RELIGIOUS PERSECUTIONS IN SOVIET RUSSIA

No Recognition Unless Policy is Changed, Congressman Fish Urges

The American public and the Government of the United States were urged to take steps to bring about the cessation of anti-Jewish religious persecutions in Soviet Russia at a mass meeting held Wednesday evening in Cooper Union Hall, New York City. Over 1,000 persons were present.

The meeting was called on the initiative of the Orthodox Rabbinical Board of Greater New York and was presided over by Rabbi Abraham Miller of Brooklyn, who recounted the facts showing it to be the constant policy of the Soviet Government to persecute all those who strive to maintain Hebrew schools, Chederim and Talmudic academies and houses of study. Rabbis and teachers are imprisoned at the instigation of the Jewish Section of the Communist Party. The Soviet Government cannot disclaim responsibility for the action of the Yevsekstia as it does nothing to stop them.

Congressman Hamilton Fish, Congressman Emanuel Celler, Congressman William I. Sirovitch, Congressman La Guardia, Congressman Samuel Dickstein and State Senator Charles S. Lockwood addressed the gathering in a similar vein. Besides the chairman, the case in behalf of the Rabbinical Board was presented by Rabbi Inselbuch, Rabbi Gusik, Rabbi Kaplan, Rabbi Schotland, Rabbi Burak and Rabbi Pfeiffer, who declared that the persecutions in Soviet Russia against the Jewish religion have reached such a stage that intervention of American public opinion is imperative.

A resolution was adopted which will be forwarded to the State Department at Washington. Congressman Fish also presented a resolution in which he urged that the Government be urged not to entertain any proposals for the recognition of Soviet Russia before the religious persecution policy is abandoned.

He suggested that in this action the rabbis join the representatives of the Christian churches in the presentation of a petition to the United States Congress. "The desecration of synagogues and churches is contrary to the traditions and institutions of civilized nations and of the United States," he declared.

Telegrams joining in the protest were received from Albert Ottinger, Republican candidate for New York Governor, Franklin D. Roosevelt, Democratic candidate for New York Governor, Col. Herbert H. Lehman, Democratic candidate for Lieutenant-Governor and Senator Royal S. Copeland.

MANY HUNGARIAN NOTABLES ARE OF JEWISH DESCENT LEXICON TO SHOW Majority Take Pains to Deny Their Origin

Budapest, Oct. 25.—A Jewish Lexicon is now being printed and is to appear this winter. The Lexicon will give the biographies of famous people who are Jewish or of Jewish origin. It will include scholars, artists, political leaders and financiers, who have played an important part in public affairs, if there is any Jewish blood in their veins, although they or their forebears have left the Jewish faith.

It is estimated that the Lexicon will embrace seventy-five per cent of the government councillors, nearly all the big bankers, university professors, theatrical stars, painters, sculptors, musicians, ministerial officials, army officers of the rank of major upwards, authors and journalists, including such who work on Christian papers and have denounced and denied their Jewishness and even hold prominent positions among the leaders of the anti-Semitic organizations. Political leaders in large numbers, ex-ministers, ambassadors, knights, barons and earls, will all meet in the Lexicon on the common ground of a Jewish origin which they are at great pains to deny, it was declared.

JEWISH STUDENTS RESENT SLUR IN MCGILL MAGAZINE

Montreal, Oct. 25.—Vigorous protest against what is said to be a slur on Jewish girl students at McGill University is being made by Jewish students at McGill through the Maccabean Circle of McGill University, the only Jewish group at the college.

The protest was called forth by an editorial which appeared in today's "McGill Daily" the newspaper edited at McGill by students. The editorial, which berates women students in general for coming in late and creating disturbance at college rugby games goes one to say: "We would like to suggest that a separate section be reserved for women of Semitic origin, as they seem to be much the worst offenders. Then perhaps a greater co-operation might be secured in rendering the Hebrew version of the McGill yell."

MORRIS SIGMAN RESIGNS AS INTERNATIONAL HEAD

Morris Sigman, president of the International Ladies Garment Workers Union, one of the leading Jewish labor unions, resigned from his position at a meeting of the General Executive Board held late Wednesday afternoon.

No official statement concerning the resignation was issued. The Union was recently torn by internal strife resulting from the protracted fight between the Right and Left Wings.

JUGO SLAVIA CLAIMS JEWISH INVENTOR OF THE ZEPPELIN AS NATIVE SON Want to Bring Body from Vienna for Re-interment at Zagreb

Zagreb, Oct. 25.—Jugoslavian newspapers, in commenting on the trans-Atlantic flight of the Graf Zeppelin, claim that the Jewish timber merchant, David Schwartz, be recognized as the inventor of the Zeppelin.

A plan is put forward by the papers to bring Schwartz's body from Vienna for re-interment with honors at Zagreb. In presenting the claim for honor to be paid to David Schwartz, the newspapers recount the history of the invention of the first dirigible. David Schwartz, Jugoslavian Jew, who later lived in Vienna, died there of shock when he received a telegram telling him that the German Government was interested in his work and would further it. Count Zeppelin afterwards purchased the invention from Schwartz's widow.

David Schwartz was a timber merchant of Zagreb, at that time a part of the Austro-Hungarian Empire. Besides his activity as a timber merchant, he studied engineering and mechanics. His early experiments showed that no airship could be built of textiles and he was the first to utilize aluminum for the purpose.

He negotiated with the German government and also with the Czarist government when his own funds were used up and he needed financial support for further experiments. Schwartz went to Petersburg and built his model, making two successful experimental flights. But he felt uncomfortable in anti-Semitic Petersburg and fled on the eve of his third experimental flight, destroying his model.

The German government then agreed to back the experiments. On January 13, 1897, Schwartz was notified by telegram from Berlin that everything was in readiness for the flight. He was so overjoyed that his heart gave out.

OZET SENDS INVESTIGATION COMMISSION TO BUREYA

Moscow, Oct. 25.—A special commission to investigate the charges against the Ozet representatives in Bureya, made at a meeting of the Jewish transmigrants at Chabarovsk, was despatched by the Central Committee of the Ozet.

The commission is composed of a representative of the Central Committee of the Ozet, the Ukrainian Ozet Committee and the Far Eastern Committee of the Comzet, governmental department for Jewish land settlement.

own association with Mr. Hoover in the relief work in Europe, stating: "The comradeship in relief work which it has been the privilege of my colleagues and myself to have with you these many years has left us priceless memories. It is perhaps permissible for me on this occasion to state one or two of them.

"On a broiling day of August 1921, some forty men and women, representatives of American relief organizations, gathered in Washington, at your invitation, to discuss the famine relief for Russia. When a timid person feared lest the feeding of Russians would subject us in America to criticism, your curt reply, which I shall always remember, was that the only thing that concerned you, and the only thing that ought to concern any human being was that 10,000,000 starving children in Russia must be saved. No further fears were voiced. That the relief proceeded and the children were saved all the world knows.

"As administrator for Jewish famine relief overseas, I went to London the following October. Data just then received by the London office of the American Relief Administration indicated that the Russian famine extended into the Ukraine, but no one was sure, for that part of Russia had been inaccessible owing to counter-revolution and brigandage. The situation seemed however so acute that despite the lack of certain knowledge, I cabled you for help. Yours was the instant response of the man of deeds. You dispatched representatives to the Ukraine to get the facts. As a result the famine work for the Ukraine, conducted under your leadership, meant the feeding and the saving of over 2,000,000 men, women and children who otherwise would literally have starved to death.

"On a bitter winter day a week before Christmas of that same year, I was in the typhus stricken village of Sokachev, twenty miles from Warsaw. There I saw the children of Poland being rescued by your organization. Charts and graphs on the walls showed the age of each child, the number of calories it received, its gain in weight, the nutrition necessary for it. The charts showed nothing as to the child's religion. Tolerance is so often glibly preached. Your organization practiced it. It is no wonder then that the word ARA has throughout Europe come to mean a blessing.

"And so to you, comrade and leader in manifold missions of mercy to fellowmen in despair, wherever their land, whatever their creed, we pledge again the full measure of our devotion

and affection," Mr. Rosenberg concluded.

Mr. Hoover, who seemed much moved, in replying said: "The great tasks of life-saving in which it has been my privilege to have a part with you are, thank God, things of the past, and today we look at a more hopeful world. The disaster of the war is behind us. Today we have but one problem before us—to bring up those who lag in the great march of progress to the front ranks—for we are all marching.

I should like only to add that this great relief work in which the lives of tens of millions were preserved was only possible by the wholehearted generosity of my countrymen and women, who always respond to the call of need without regard to nationality or religion."

SEABORD ZIONIST REGION EXECUTIVE ADOPTS BUDGET

Washington, D. C., Oct. 25.—A sum in excess of \$121,000 was raised in the Seaboard Zionist Region during the past year for Zionist work in Palestine, according to a report made to the semi-annual meeting here of the Seaboard Zionist Region Executive. The meeting which was called jointly by the Seaboard Zionist Region, of which Harry T. Kellman is President, and the Hadassah Regional Unit, of which Mrs. Israel Shapiro of Baltimore is president, devoted itself to planning for the stimulation of Zionist activities throughout the Seaboard territory and for the adoption of quotas and budgets for the United Palestine Appeal Campaigns.

One of the sessions of the Conference was addressed by Bernard Stone, Executive Secretary of the United Palestine Appeal.

The Executive Committee adopted a program for cultural and educational work in the region, which will be carried on by a Committee headed by Louis E. Spiegler of Washington. Simon J. Levin, Regional Director, reported that all the chapters in the Seaboard Region have unanimously endorsed Hadassah's continued participation in the United Palestine Appeal.

only three who resisted the police were held, the rest having been released after identification. The College of Agriculture granted a "leave of absence" to seventeen Jewish students, declaring that the authorities were unable to provide special protection for every Jewish student.

In Parliament Deputy Bela Fabian submitted the material on the basis of which he formulated his charges against the Understate Secretary in the Ministry of the Interior, Sztranyavsky. The documents dealt with the anti-Semitic bomb attack made in Scongrad in 1923 and confirmed the charge that in due time a secret report was submitted by the Chief of Police of Scongrad giving the names of the perpetrators and proving their guilt. However, the trial was not reopened, it was declared because the investigation was not completed. Deputies on the opposition benches exclaimed that during two years nothing has happened and no witness was interrogated. Minister of the Interior Bela Sztranyavsky threatened that he will insist upon Fabian giving satisfaction for his insult to the government. Deputy Fabian replied that the government may start court proceedings against him since he has already submitted proof of his charges.

The Parliamentary Committee on Immunity decided that the Scongrad documents have nothing to do with the present case and therefore ordered entry in the records that Fabian did not substantiate his charges. The government party representatives, however, were dissatisfied with the Committee's decision, insisting that Fabian be excluded from the House for one session as punishment.
