SAYS RUTHLESS PROCEDURE OF SOVIET OFFICIALS AFFECTS LARGE NUMBER OF JEWS

Communist Writer Ascribes Increasing Misery of Deceased Jews to Soviet Officials

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Oct. 26.—The ruthless procedure of local Soviet officials, disregarding later amendments of government instructions, is responsible for increasing misery among the deceased Jews, complains B. Slutsky, Communist writer, in the Communist Yiddish daily, "Ems."

Soviet local officials obstruct the proletarianization of the deceased Jews, the writer charges. The ruthless misapplication of the laws drives the Jewish poor to the depths of despair. The writer cites the Ukrainian law requiring eviction from municipal dwellings of former Nepmen which was active until July 1927 and later amended to apply only to Nepman who earn 3,000 rubles annually. The officials disregarded the amendment and evict former Nepmen who are now artisans and many who are unemployed.

In the Kiev eviction campaign there was a real orgy hitting exclusively the category of ex-Nepmen who had long ago become artisans or who are unemployed. The Housing Committees acting illegally strike terror in the hearts of the Jews, ruining hundreds of families. Many Jews who have been working less than five years are classified as non-workers.

Many who were evicted have appealed to the courts, but in the meantime they are facing complete ruin.

YEVSEKZIA PREPARES FOR TENTH ANNIVERSARY

Moscow, Oct. 26.—The Yevsektzia, Jewish Section of the Communist Party, held by many Russian Jews responsible for many anti-Jewish measures under the Soviet regime, will soon celebrate the tenth anniversary of its existence.

Yevsektzia leaders are making extensive preparations for the celebration in towns of large Jewish population.

REFUSED PALESTINE NATURALIZATION IF WIFE LIVES ABROAD

Tel Aviv, Oct. 26.—Because his wife is living abroad, Jacob Falevich, a resident of Tel Aviv, was denied naturalization.

Falevich was summoned before the Permits Section where his application for citizenship was refused.

ANTI-SEMITIC LEADERS APPEAL TO STUDENTS TO CEASE ANTI-JEWISH DEMONSTRATIONS IN HUNGARY

Mounted Police Guard Threatened Quarters in University Towns; Legal Fight for Numerous Clausus Recommended to Students; Attacks Continue in Budapest Colleges

Budapest, Oct. 26.—Detachments of mounted police continue to guard the threatened districts in Fuenfkirchen and Debreczin, following the anti-Semitic disorders which occurred yesterday at Fuenfkirchen, where the Jewish students, hitherto unmolested, were attacked.

It is learned from reliable sources that attempts are being made by the government to influence the anti-Semitic professors to exercise persuasion with the student groups to discontinue the anti-Semitic warfare. Pressure is also being exercised upon the nationalistic political groups who are fanning the anti-Semitic movement. These efforts are being made because of fear of the effect of the riots on Hungary's international situation.

A proclamation issued today by the central organization of the nationalistic student groups urges the students to discontinue the demonstrations. This will still leave to the nationalistic students the possibility of continuing their fight for the numerous clausus law limiting the number of Jewish students through legal channels, it is urged in the appeal. The hope is expressed here that this action may be the beginning of a pacification.

During the riots yesterday at the university of Fuenfkirchen, the Jewish students present at the Medical School were severely beaten. Professor Hein and Dean Imre were insulted by the nationalistic students for their intervention on behalf of the Jewish students.

Attacks Continue in Budapest

Budapest, Oct. 26.—The few Jewish students who were enrolled in the Pathological Institute were thrown downstairs by their classmates when they attempted to enter the clinics on Thursday. Professor Buday, a Christian, who attempted to protect the Jewish students was similarly treated.

An attack on the Jewish high school on Abovi Street was perpetrated, the attackers smashing all the windows before the police arrived.

In Debreczin the students have quieted down, the police have taken energetic action after it was established that several members of the police force had been beaten by the students. One hundred students of the University of Debreczin will be tried for disorderly conduct. The University of Fuenfkirchen is the only happy exception to the general disorders. The Jewish students there were not molested.

A special despatch to the New York Times from Budapest reports that thirty-three Budapest students who participated in the riots, were fined \$2 each, which many Budapest citizens considered a light penalty because workers who opposed the students were fined \$40 and sentenced to fifteen days in jail.

WAILING WALL QUESTION BROUGHT BEFORE LEAGUE MANDATES COMMISSION Arabs Plan to Build Mosque at the Wailing Wall

Jerusalem, Oct. 26.—Memorandum on the question of the Jewish right of access to the Wailing Wall and the recent interference there with Jewish worshippers were despatched by the Jerusalem Zionist Executive and the Vaad Leumi, National Council of Palestine Jews to the Mandates Commission of the League of Nations which opens its sessions in Geneva today.

An appeal, calling for peace between Arabs and Jews, on the Wailing Wall question was published by Mr. Kalverisky in "Al Jamaica," organ of the Moslem Supreme Council. The appeal urges that there should be no quarrel over such a simple question.

The all-Palestine conference called by the Moslem Supreme Council to consider the question of the Wailing Wall will be held next Sunday. The agenda includes a discussion of a fund collection to build a mosque at the Wall.

POLICE GET NOMINAL TERMS FOR PARTS IN RIOTS

Kovno, Oct. 26.—Punishment of not more than three days in jail was meted out to members of the police of Wolkowishki, Lithuania, where serious anti-Jewish excesses took place early in September, who were guilty of participation and encouraging the riots. The sentences were imposed by the Ministry of the Interior.

Hooligans who perpetrated the excesses, in which twenty were injured, have not yet been tried.

POLEISH GOVERNMENT ENCOURAGES INDUSTRIES IN PALESTINE

Purchases Tobacco Crop of Jewish Growers in Galilee

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Oct. 26.—The Polish Government, today called a purchase order to the syndicate of Jewish tobacco growers of Galilee, taking their whole stock of six zlotys a kilo. The Polish government also intends to buy the total future production of the tobacco growers and to send an expert to Palestine to aid in improving the growing and packing of the tobacco; it was learned.

The Commercial Attache at the Polish consulate in Haifa, Hausner, received a cablegram from the Polish government granting permission for the importation into Poland of Palestinian wines, oranges, bananas and almonds.

FRANZ MOLNER HONORED ON 50th BIRTHDAY

Budapest, Oct. 7.—"I was born a Jew and I shall remain a Jew," Franz Molnar, the famous dramatist whose fiftieth birthday is being celebrated here, declared.

Messages of congratulation were received by Molnar from all parts of the world. The French Government conferred on him the Order of the Legion of Honour. He is praised in the Hungarian Press as one of the greatest playwrights of modern times, ranking with George Bernard Shaw, Gerhardt Hauptmann, Pirandello and John Galsworthy, and as such he has brought great honor to his native country, Hungary.

CHASSIDIC RABBI OBJECTS TO MOVING PICTURE FILM

Warsaw, Oct. 26.—Objection to moving picture films as offending the sensibilities of certain groups, has spread to Poland.

Rabbi Mordecai Ater of Gora Kalwarja, the Gerer Rebbe, made strong presentations to the Polish motion picture company which produced a moving picture depicting the part played by Polish Jews in the rebellion of 1863, based on the novel of the American Jewish writer, J. Opatoschu. The Rabbi objected in particular to those scenes where the life of the Kotzker Rebbe was depicted, and asked for their elimination.

The school of the Gerer Chassidism was a branch of the Chassidic school inaugurated by the Kotzker Rebbe, regarding whose life many tales and legends are current.

AUSTRIAN HEIMWEHR DISCLAIMS ANTI-SEMITISM

Vienna, Oct. 9.—After the fears of a clash between the "private armies" of the Fascist Heimwehr and of the Social Democratic Party at their rival demonstrations last Sunday in the Wiener-Neustadt, which owing to the action of the Government, passed off without disorder, the two bodies are now engaged in a controversy on the subject of whether the Heimwehr is or is not an anti-Semitic organization.

The Socialist papers are trying to show that the Heimwehr is an anti-Semitic organization and reproach the Jewish industrialists here for supporting it. "Are they going to continue to support an anti-Semitic body?" the papers ask. "Dr. Steidle, the Heimwehr leader," they declare, "speaking at the Heimwehr demonstration on Sunday in the Wiener-Neustadt made use of anti-Semitic phraseology, but when the reports were given to the press afterwards, these passages were cut out because it was feared that the Jewish capitalists would take fright and withdraw their financial support."

The Heimwehr Organization immediately issued an official communique denying there were any anti-Semitic passages in Dr. Steidle's speech at Wiener-Neustadt. "The Heimwehr," the communique says, "is in no way directed against any religious community. It has no anti-Semitic tendencies whatever. The only purpose of the Heimwehr Organization is to protect all citizens without distinction against Marxist terrorism."

JEWISH WRITER GIVES RECEPTION TO PAINLEVE

Vienna, Oct. 26.—The elite of Vienna society was present at a reception given in honor of Paul Painleve, French statesman, who is on a visit here, by Madame Bertha Zuckerkandl-Szeps, well-known German Jewish writer.

Representatives of the Austrian government, of the diplomatic corps, artists and writers, including many Jews, were among the guests. Among those present was Madame Clemenceau, wife of Georges Clemenceau's brother, a sister of Madame Zuckerkandl-Szeps. They are the daughters of the late Moritz Szeps, founder of the "Wiener Tageblatt," a native of Western Galicia. The hostess is the widow of Emil Zuckerkandl, a native of Hungary, a Yeshiva student, who acquired wide fame as a Professor of Anatomy.

TRADE RESOLUTION THREATENS LONDON JEWISH MERCHANTS

London, Oct. 26.—A resolution forbidding Sunday market trade was adopted by the drapers' Chamber of Trade. At present sixty markets out of the 168 in the city of London are open on Sundays. If the government would enforce an ordinance based on the resolution, Jewish merchants would lose fifty percent of their weekly turnover.

ARAB ATTACKER'S SENTENCE REDUCED

Jerusalem, Oct. 26.—A reduction of the sentence imposed on one of the two Arabs who attacked a Jewish worshipper at the Walling Wall last Saturday was ordered by the Jerusalem District Court. The sentence was reduced from six months imprisonment to three months. The second Arab has not yet been tried.

LONDON CHRONICLE CRITICISES AGENCY CONFERENCE

London, Oct. 26.—The London "Jewish Chronicle," leading British Zionist weekly which has consistently opposed for the extension of the Jewish Agency, publishes in its current issue a leading editorial in which the results of the Non-Zionist Conference on Palestine held in New York on Sunday, October 21, are sharply criticised.

JACOB KUHN, HUNGARIAN JEWISH PATRIOT, DIES

PALESTINE FUNDS AGAIN JOIN FOR UNITED APPEAL THIS YEAR

Hadassah Enters U. P. A. Effort to
Raise \$7,500,000

The United Palestine Appeal, the united fund-raising agency for Palestine which has represented the various Zionist elements in this country during the past two years in raising money for Palestine, will continue its existence next year, according to a decision arrived at by the Board of Directors of the Appeal at a meeting at the Olcott Hotel, Morris Rothenberg, Chairman of the Board of Directors, announced.

The quota will amount be \$7,500,000 and the campaign will be sponsored by the Palestine Foundation Fund; the Hadassah, Women's Zionist Organization, of which Mrs. Zip F. Szold is Acting President; the Jewish National Fund; Miz-rachi, Orthodox branch of the Zionist movement in America, of which Gedaliah Bublik is president; and the Hebrew University Fund Committee, of which Dr. David J. Kaliski is Chairman. There has been some doubt as to whether the Hadassah would join in the U. P. A. this year. A referendum among the Hadassah chapters was ordered by Hadassah National Executive Committee on the question. The negotiations were brought to a successful conclusion, the official announcement indicates.

The third annual National Conference on Palestine will be held in Boston at the Hotel Statler on Saturday evening, November 10 and Sunday, November 11. Acceptances of the invitation that has been issued to leading Jews throughout the country indicate that 1,000 delegates will attend the conference which will adopt a program for further upbuilding work in Palestine and take measures to have Palestine benefit from the union of American-Jewish forces, which resulted from the decision of non-Zionists to participate in the upbuilding of Palestine, Mr. Rothenberg said.

Health Institutions in Denver and
Los Angeles Mark Progress in
Welfare Work

(By our Denver Correspondent)

Denver, Colo., Oct. 22—Dedication of two buildings at the Jewish Consumptive's Relief Society was held Sunday, October 21, honoring two deceased benefactors of the institution, Dr. C. D. Spivak, one of the founders; and Max D. Neusteter. The dedication was made a year after the death of the late Dr. Spivak, and honored him doubly. The post-office station of the institution, which is located several miles out of the city limits was changed from Sanitorium, Colo., to Spivak, Colo. And the administration building was renamed the C. D. Spivak Administration Building.

The new building housing the rehabilitation activities of the organization will be designated as the Max D. Neusteter Rehabilitation Building.

The dedication of this latest building brings the total number of buildings in the institution to thirty. In addition there are forty-eight tents. When Dr. Spivak first founded the institution in 1904, there were six tents and six patients.

Now there are 300 patients under the collective roofs of the J. C. R. S. The total number of patients admitted since that day in September, 1904, when Dr. Spivak opened these few little tents is \$780.

There were only twenty acres in the hospital which was incorporated in 1904 and now there the 150 acres included in the lands of the J. C. R. S. A portion of this is used for farm land, and it are raised alfalfa and corn, and eggs—all of which aid the institution. A dairy has been installed from which milk enough to supply the entire wants of the hospital is received.

In the twenty-four years of the existence of the J. C. R. S. more than \$1,200,500 have been spent for buildings and equipment for the institution which patients enjoy free of charge.

Los Angeles, Oct. 15—A meeting of the membership of the Jewish Consumptive Relief Association of California and of the Tubercular Jewish ex-Patients Home Society ratified the amalgamation of the two organizations.

The Jewish Consumptive Relief Association maintains a national sanatorium of 150 beds, and the Tubercular Jewish ex-Patients Home a capacity of fifty beds.

Recently the two boards appointed a joint committee to bring about closer relations and if possible, an amalgamation of the two organizations. This committee, under the chairmanship of

MARSHALL REBUKES 'NATION'
FOR ASSERTING OTTINGER
WAS SOP TO JEWISH VOTERS
Lillian D. Wald and Robert Szold
Urge Support for Democrats

A strong rebuke to the editor of "The Nation" for an assertion made in the liberal weekly, which is supporting the Democratic ticket, that the Republican nomination of Albert Ottinger for the governorship of the State of New York was "merely a sop to the Jewish voters" was administered by Louis Marshall in a communication he addressed to the weekly.

Mr. Marshall in resenting this remark declares that Governor Smith has no proprietary interest in the voters of the Jewish faith in the State of New York who are, Mr. Marshall declares, "the most independent of the American electorate." Mr. Marshall's letter to "The Nation" read:

"In your issue of today, lauding Mr. Franklin D. Roosevelt you, though a pretended liberal, evince a spirit of bigotry unjustly condemned by all lovers of justice. You say:

"His chief rival, Attorney General Ottinger, has shown himself unworthy of public trust in that he is absolutely wrong on the water power question. His nomination is merely a sop to the Jewish voters of the cities of the State in order to draw them away from Governor Smith. It is political subterfuge which deserves rebuke."

"Attorney General Ottinger probably entertains views concerning water power as to which decided differences of opinion exist. Mr. Roosevelt certainly holds views on many subjects which are likewise opposed by many good citizens; so does Governor Smith, and for that matter there is scarcely a single public question as to which men do not honestly differ. For you to set up the editorial chair as a court of last resort and with innate modesty to announce that the Attorney General is 'absolutely' wrong on this subject, and from that premise to deduce the conclusion that he has shown himself unworthy of public trust, would appear to the ordinary man as presumptuous. His integrity and uprightness are not and cannot be impugned. His loyalty and fidelity to the public as State Senator, as Assistant Attorney General of the United States, and as Attorney General of this State, have been generally conceded. He is a man of unimpeachable character, and yet, speaking in an utterly irresponsible manner, you do not hesitate to blacken his name merely because he does not see eye to eye with you and has dared to accept a unanimous nomination for Governor at a time when your candidate had publicly refused to run. This kind of talk is the ebullition of a political brainstorm and bears its own comment.

"But you have gone further and at a time when men with whom you have

associated yourself are prating of religious bigotry as a campaign issue you, supposedly overflowing with the milk of human kindness (though frequently curdled), range yourself on the lowest plane of fanaticism by advertising to Mr. Ottinger's religion and characterizing his nomination as a sop to the Jewish voters in order to draw them away from Governor Smith, apparently intimating that the Governor has a proprietary interest in those whom I know to be the most independent of the American electorate. In other words, you turn your back on all that you have said concerning bigotry and your suppressed emotions bursting all bonds lead you to resent the nomination of a Jew as Governor and to insult your Jewish fellow-citizens by intimating that when they vote they are swayed by unworthy motives.

"I have observed for many years that men of your ilk, though parading as broad-minded, never hesitate by word and act to belittle the Jew when it suits your purpose. It is regarded as meritorious to resent what you look upon as his intrusion into public office, however qualified for it he may be. With all your culture you are unable to get away from the atavistic urge which unconsciously causes your mental processes to culminate in the cry of 'Jew! Jew!'"

The Democratic National Committee made public a statement yesterday by Robert Szold, counsel of the Amalgamated Clothing Workers of America, urging support for the candidacy of Alfred E. Smith for President. Mr. Szold also urged support for Col. Herbert H. Lehman for Lieutenant-Governor of New York, declaring:

"I have worked with him (Col. Lehman) in certain philanthropic enterprises. I have seen his work on the Governor's Mediation Commission in the Cloak and Suit industry. He is simply the finest of the fine."

Lillian D. Wald, founder and director of the Henry Street Settlement House, joined Dr. Lovejoy Elliott of the Hudson Guild, in appeal to 4,000 social workers throughout the United States, urging support of Governor Smith.

Former representative Martin C. Ansorge, Republican candidate for Justice of the Supreme Court, in a statement he issued replied to Samuel Untermyer's attack on Albert Ottinger.

"The religious issue was unfortunately dragged into the State campaign," Mr. Ansorge said. "Samuel Untermyer, hiding behind the cloak of religious tolerance, makes a bitter racial attack against a man of his own race and says that the Republican party named its candidate for Governor,

solely because of his religion. The fact that General Ottinger was nominated because of his remarkable record as Attorney General and by reason of his tremendous popularity with the voters of the State, as evidenced by the fact that he was the only Republican elected to office on the State ticket in the Democratic landslide of 1926. He was nominated in spite of his religion, and not because of it. Just as will might Mr. Untermyer have said that the Democratic candidate for President was nominated because of his religion, and the statement would have been equally ludicrous.

"If, as Mr. Untermyer says, the Republican party named General Ottinger because he was a Jew, will he also say that his own party named Colonel Lehman for the same reason? Although the sentiments which I have expressed are my own, I believe that all right-minded people will agree with me. Religion should play no part in a campaign."

"I submit, with all due respect to the great ability of Mr. Untermyer, that his letter to Mr. James of the Roosevelt Committee was in poor taste and will act as a boomerang. As between him and Louis Marshall, his law associate who is supporting General Ottinger, let the people decide whom they will follow," he declared.

I. Irving Lipsitch, Executive Director of the Federation of Jewish Welfare Organizations of Los Angeles, recorded that in the interests of a more effective service to the indigent Jewish tubercular and to avoid conflict and duplication, the two associations should be operated under one management.

The Jewish Consumptive Relief Association was established in 1913, by a committee of Los Angeles Jews, and incorporated under the name of the Jewish Consumptive Relief Association of California.

Since its establishment the Sanatorium has treated over 2,400 consumptives, hundreds of whom left its care entirely recovered or in improved condition.

The Sanatorium occupies twenty acres of land, with twenty-nine building and a capacity of 136 beds; seven acres of land were recently purchased through the Long Beach, California, Community, which plans to equip and stock them for a dairy and poultry ranch for the Sanatorium.

The Sanatorium spends \$250,000 annually, depending for its funds entirely on the contributions from Jewish communities throughout the country.

In the past year the Sanatorium cared for 283 men and women from all parts of the country. Of these 128 were residents of Los Angeles.

The maintenance, treatment and care of these Los Angeles patients is

Boston, Mass., Oct. 26.—Zionists from every part of New England are expected to attend the reception to be given to Dr. Chaim Weizmann, President of the World Zionist Organization, on Sunday evening, October 28, which will mark the launching of Boston's United Palestine Appeal Campaign for 1928-29. More than 1500 persons will attend this reception, according to A. E. Wagman, Chairman of the Boston U.P.A. Campaign.

The results of the Jewish Agency Conference at New York City on October 20 and 21 will have its first tangible results when, it is expected, numerous non-Zionists will attend the opening of the Boston Drive. Preliminary efforts for stimulating interest in the campaign include the observation of "Palestine Sabbath," which has been proclaimed throughout New England for Friday evening, October 26, and Saturday morning, October 27. Rabbis throughout the territory will preach on Palestine during those two days.

A rally of workers for the Boston Campaign was held on October 25, which was addressed by Dr. I. M. Rubinow, Executive Director of the United Palestine Appeal. An announcement that was greeted with enthusiasm by the campaign workers was that the Boston Chapter of Hadassah had unanimously adopted a resolution to enter into the United Palestine Appeal Campaign, as in previous years.

It is a convalescent home for destitute consumptives from the time they leave the sanatorium for hospital until they become able to care for themselves, and are provided with suitable employment, and where a conscientious effort at a rehabilitation of the patient is being made.

Abraham Shohan, executive secretary of the Jewish Consumptive Relief Association, is to be the executive secretary of the amalgamated institutions. Mr. F. Flanzner, head of the Tubercular ex-Patients Society is expected to be associated in an executive capacity.
