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NEW DISSENSION AMONG JEWISH DEPUTIES IN POLISH PARLIAMENT

Agreement With Government Again Proposed

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Nov. 3.—New dissension among the Jewish deputies in the Polish parliament came to the foreground at a session of the Club of Jewish Deputies Friday.

At this session Deputy Isaac Gruenbaum, president of the Club, touched upon the recent conversations carried on by Sholom Asch, well known Yiddish novelist, with members of the Government. No official announcement was made but it is understood that Deputy Gruenbaum related to the Club members the concrete proposals treated of in these conversations.

The deputies from Galicia headed by Dr. Leon Reich sharply attacked the policy of Deputy Gruenbaum. They demanded his immediate resignation from the presidency as necessary to facilitate the inauguration of new reconciliatory methods.

This is urgent in view of the desperate economic situation of the Jewish population in Poland. The debate was postponed for the next session of the Club.

From recent reports in the Polish Jewish press it appears that new negotiations for a Polish-Jewish agreement were inaugurated by Mr. Sholom Asch. Though no details are officially available it was asserted in the reports that leading members of the present cabinet are taking an active interest in bringing about a working agreement with the Club of Jewish Deputies along lines similar to the Ugoia of the Skynski Reich fame. The difficulties found for the consummation of the present plan were attributed by the Galician deputies to the presence of Deputy Gruenbaum at the helm of the Club of Jewish Deputies.

Warsaw Nov. 3.—The members of the executive of a committee named by the Mayor to arrange the celebrations of the City of Warsaw on the anniversary of Poland's independence were announced here today. The list does not contain the name of a single Jewish member.

EGYPT GIVES PALESTINE "MOST FAVORED NATIONS" TARIFF

Jerusalem, Nov. 3.—The Palestine-Egypt provisional commercial agreement was promulgated by the government today. By this agreement Egypt will grant to Palestinian agricultural and industrial products, including tobacco, "most favored nation" treatment.

ACTING HIGH COMMISSIONER ASSURES MOSLEMS STATUS QUO OF WALL TO REMAIN

Believe Present Session of Mandate Commission Will Consider Zionist Petition

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Nov. 3.—Leaders of the Moslem agitation over the Western Wall issue were reassured by Acting High Commissioner H. C. Luke that the government of Palestine will do everything to observe what he termed the status quo of the Western Wall, now the object of controversy between the Jews and the Moslems.

This assurance was given by Mr. Luke Friday when a delegation representing the Moslem conference held in Jerusalem called on him to submit the resolutions adopted by the meeting.

Berlin, Nov. 3.—The petition of the Zionist Executive concerning the Western Wall issue will in all likelihood be considered at the present session of the Mandates Commission is the prediction of the Geneva correspondent of the "Vossische Zeitung." The Commission will be in session until November 10.

The correspondent states that there seems to be no doubt that the League Commission, in acting on the Zionist Executive's petition, will express disapproval of the events which occurred in Jerusalem and will in a polite manner draw the attention of the British Government to the view that the District Commissioner of Jerusalem responsible for the occurrence is, after all, perhaps "not the right man in the right spot."

TEL-AVIV PASSES NEW SABBATH ORDINANCE

Tel Aviv, Nov. 3.—A new Sabbath and Holy Day rest ordinance was promulgated by the municipality of Tel Aviv. The new ordinance permits non-Jews to observe a rest day other than Saturday and supersedes a previous ordinance.

Orthodox members of the municipal council urged a more rigorous ordinance, but were defeated by a laborite majority.

FETE CHANCELLOR BEFORE PALESTINE DEPARTURE

London, Nov. 3.—Sir John Chancellor, new High Commissioner for Palestine, was the guest of honor at a meeting of the British Palestine Mandate Society, held at the home of Mrs. Dugdale. Various problems concerning Palestine were discussed by the speakers. Sir G. MacDonald was among the guests present. The chairman explained the aims and reasons for the existence of the Society. The new High Commissioner is expected to leave shortly to take up his duties in Palestine.

JEWISH MERCHANTS LOSING GROUND IN POLAND'S COMMERCE

4 Years Ago, 70% Trade and Industry in Jewish Hands; Much Reduced

Warsaw, Nov. 3.—Four hundred delegates attended a conference of Jewish merchants held here to discuss the economic position of Polish Jewry.

Whereas four years ago seventy per cent of the trade and industry of the country was in Jewish hands, the present government policy has reduced the number considerably, it was reported to the conference. Upon representations having been made to the government, leaders explained that the economic standard of the Jews is considerably higher than that of the Poles, which is regarded as abnormal.

LONDON MAYOR VISITS GREAT SYNAGOGUE

London, Nov. 3.—Colonel Sir Charles Albert Batho, the Lord Mayor of London, accompanied by sheriffs and several aldermen, attended Friday evening services at the Great Synagogue. He was received by Lionel Rothschild and Ernst Schiff. It was the first time that a Lord Mayor attended synagogue services without a state purpose, a celebration or for the object of worshipping there.

PALESTINE ANTIQUITIES TO REMAIN IN COUNTRY

Jerusalem, Nov. 3.—Henceforth, a part of the antiquities found by archaeological expeditions in Palestine, will have to remain in the country.

A new ordinance promulgated by the government provides that excavations will be permitted only on the condition that the antiquities to be found shall be divided between the Palestine government and the excavators.

ANOTHER SYNAGOGUE INVADED IN GERMANY

Berlin, Nov. 3.—Unknown vandals broke into the Lueneburg synagogue Thursday night.

The culprits, who were not apprehended, tore down the curtain before the Ark and besmirched the objects of worship.

TO DEPORT COMMUNIST FROM PALESTINE

Haifa, Nov. 3.—A fine of £10 and deportation from the country was imposed upon a Haifa resident, Fabricant. He was charged with belonging to the Communist party.

Y., Nov. 3.—The Genesee Home for Jewish Orphans, after fifty years of existence in this city, has been closed as a result of the decision of the executive board of the Jewish Orphan Asylum Association of Western New York, owner of the home, to conform to the modern trend in child welfare work and place children who have been in the asylum under private care.

The Western Wall Issue as Palestine Sees It

(By Our Jerusalem Correspondent)

Jerusalem, Oct. 16.—Three weeks have passed since the incidents which occurred at the Wailing Wall on the Day of Atonement, and we Jews here in Palestine feel that the first round of our fight has been lost. Palestine Jewry has done all that was possible, it is demonstrated, made manifest the indignation of the population. It demonstrated its unity in protest, and the unanimous demand of Palestine Jewry in a manner which is unique in its emphasis and determination. But world Jewry has not given us the support which we expected, nor did the support it did give come in time. There is a proverb which says that "twice blessed is he who gives quickly."

Thousands of protests should have been hurled at the British Colonial Office and the Foreign Office within the first week after the incident at the Wailing Wall. They should have come from every corner of the earth, from every Jewish Community and organization, from San Francisco to Vladivostok. Then the effect would have been felt. We know that telegrams and demonstrations have no longer the importance they had once upon a time, but if they come pouring in suddenly like a flood, in hundreds and thousands, they must compel attention. If the British Government had received simultaneously telegrams from all its Ambassadors and Consuls abroad stating that the Jewish population there was stirred to indignation over the incidents at the Wailing Wall and demanded an immediate and radical solution of the question, Mr. Amery would surely not have been able to content himself with making a formal reply to the Zionist Executive, transmitting to it the official statement of the Palestine Government.

We here in Palestine accuse the Zionist World Executive in London of having failed to rise to the occasion, of not having taken the necessary action, firmly, and in time. This was a moment when world-wide action was needed more than at any time. Only the Zionist World Executive was able to organize a great world-wide Jewish protest movement, and it did not do so. What does it matter if a telegram of protest is received today from the Union of Rabbis in America, and tomorrow from the Jewish Community of Warsaw, and a week later from another Jewish Community somewhere else? It has no effect. One protest is forgotten before the other arrives.

At the present moment the situation is as follows: In Palestine itself the matter will make no progress. The Pal-

HOOVER STRESSES EQUALITY OF OPPORTUNITY WITHOUT REGARD TO RACE OR CREED Makes Clear His Stand on Immigration Question

Herbert Hoover, Republican candidate for the Presidency of the United States, in his address Friday night in St. Louis, Mo., stressing the American principle of equality of opportunity, declared:

"If we would maintain America as the land of opportunity, where every boy and girl has the chance to climb to that position to which his ability and character entitle him, we shall need to be on increasing guard. If I could drive the full meaning and importance of maintained equality of opportunity into the very consciousness of the American people, I would feel I had made some contribution to America's life. It is the most precious of our possessions that the windows of every home shall look out upon unlimited hope."

"Equality of opportunity is the right of every American, rich or poor, foreign or native born, without respect to race or religion. I insist upon the most strict regulations of public utilities, because otherwise they would destroy equality of opportunity. I object to the Government going into business in competition with its citizens because that would destroy equality of opportunity. And equality of opportunity is the flux with which alone can we melt out full and able leadership to the nation."

"The first step to maintained equality of opportunity among our people is, as I have said before, that there should be no child in America who has not been born and who does not live under sound conditions of health, who does not have full opportunity who does not have full opportunity for education from the kindergarten to the university; who is not free from injurious labor; who does not have stimulation by ambition to the fullest of his or her capacities."

Making clear his stand on immigration, the candidate stated:

"I may also add upon the subject of protection that the limitation of immigration is a fundamental part of our protective system, because it prevents a flood of labor from abroad which can only break down our levels. I stand against any increase of the present quotas and for the principle of the 1890 census, with only such changes as prevent separation of families, but not increase in total numbers."

LEEDS JEWRY ADOPTS SCHECHITA CASTING PEN

Leeds, Eng., Nov. 3.—The Weinberg casting pen, an invention modernizing the Schechita, was tested and finally adopted by the Jewish community of Leeds. The test was made in the presence of a representative from London of the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

The process of casting over the animal before it is slaughtered, takes fifteen seconds. Previous defects in the machine have been removed.

PLAN \$100,000 PALESTINE COLONY AS MEMORIAL TO LATE JOSEPH BARONDESS
Colonel Lehman Contributes to Fund of Which Nathan Strauss Is Honorary Chairman

A campaign for \$100,000 has been launched for the purpose of establishing an agricultural colony in Palestine to be known as "Joseph BarondeSS Colony," according to an announcement issued yesterday by David Surdut, chairman of the BarondeSS Memorial Fund Committee, of which Nathan Strauss is Honorary Chairman and Rev. Z. H. Masliansky Honorary Vice-Chairman.

It was decided by the friends of the late BarondeSS to perpetuate Mr. BarondeSS' memory through a Palestinian colony because of the many decades during which Mr. BarondeSS was associated with the Zionist movement for the rebuilding of Palestine, according to Mr. Surdut. The BarondeSS Colony will be turned over to the Jewish National Fund.

Col. Herbert H. Lehman, Democratic candidate for Lieutenant Governor, has contributed \$1,000 toward the fund. Other \$1,000 gifts were made by Morris Eisenman and David Surdut. In the letter accompanying his contribution Mr. Lehman referred to the leadership of Mr. BarondeSS and his services to the Jewish people, saying, "I am sincerely pleased to be able to do this, both because of my interest in Palestine and because of the very high regard in which I always held Mr. Joseph BarondeSS. We worked together closely and in perfect harmony in many movements and I formed for him both a high admiration and a deep affection."

REPORT NEW ANTI-JEWISH BOYCOTT IN POLISH TOWN
 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Nov. 3.—The renewal of an intense anti-Jewish boycott agitation by the Rozowj, is reported from Hrubieszow.

Boycott inciting leaflets of an anti-Semitic character were distributed and anti-Jewish posters were placarded in the town. The agitation led to anti-Jewish attacks.

The local Jewish community directed a request to the Ministry of the Interior to prohibit further distribution of inciting propaganda.

NO CORPSES: JEWISH MEDICAL STUDENTS MUST CEASE WORK
 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Lemberg, Nov. 3.—Jewish students in the medical college of the University of Lemberg will have to cease work in the clinic for the lack of Jewish corpses.

The dean of the medical school informed the Jewish students that unless they secure twelve Jewish corpses they will not be permitted to continue their work in the clinic. The local Jewish hospital declared that so far as it can tell now, it will not be able to furnish the students with more than one corpse up to the end of the year.

DEDICATION OF WATTENBERG HALL TO BE CELEBRATED AT DINNER ON NOVEMBER 15

Philip Wattenberg, Donor, Guest of Honor; Weizmann, Principal Speaker

To celebrate the opening of the Wattenberg Hall of the Einstein Institute of Mathematics and Physics of the Hebrew University in Palestine, a dedication dinner will be given by the American Advisory Committee on Thursday, November 15, at the Hotel Astor, at seven o'clock.

The principal speaker will be Dr. Chaim Weizmann, President of the World Zionist Organization, who will discuss the relation of the Hebrew University to the development of Palestine. Philip Wattenberg, the donor of the Wattenberg Hall, will be guest of honor.

The Wattenberg Hall of the Hebrew University was formally opened in the presence of a large assembly, on October 31. The cornerstone of the building was laid on April 2, 1925, by the Earl of Balfour, coincident with the formal opening of the University. The Wattenberg Hall houses the Department of Mathematics. The Physics Building, towards whose erection Mr. Wattenberg has also largely given, is in process of erection.

The American Advisory Committee, under whose auspices the dinner is to be given, is headed by Felix M. Warburg, Chairman; Judge Julian W. Mack, Mr. Walter E. Meyer, Vice-Chairmen. Among the members are Dr. Cyrus Adler, Dr. S. Benderly, Hon. Benj. D. Cardozo, Hon. Irving Lehman, Dr. Emanuel Libman, Dr. S. Lowenstein, and Dr. Stephen S. Wise.

CANADIAN ZIONISTS MARK BALFOUR DAY
 (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Montreal, Nov. 3.—The eleven anniversary of the Balfour Declaration was celebrated by Canadian Zionists and Canadian Hadassah. In Montreal a large mass meeting was held at the Mount Royal Hotel, under the auspices of the Zionist Order Halbanim, with Abraham Goldberg, of the Zionist Organization of America, as the guest speaker. At this meeting a resolution was unanimously adopted and sent to Dr. Chaim Weizmann and Louis Marshall, congratulating them upon the successful issue of their efforts during the past years toward establishing the Jewish Agency and expressing confidence that these efforts will start a new glorious page in Jewish history.

In Ottawa a large reception was tendered by Mrs. A. J. Freiman, Dominion President of Canadian Hadassah, to celebrate Balfour Day. About four hundred people were present. Rabbi I. L. Zlotnik, executive director of the Zionist Organization of Canada, was the guest speaker.

Similar celebrations were held yesterday by Canadian Jewry throughout the country.

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STUDIES OF LEADING AMERICAN JEWS IS THE SUBJECT OF NEW BOOK

"Analytiks" Attempts Search in "Mirrors of Washington" Style; Speculate as to Author's Identity

A book which is intriguing many circles among American Jews was published this week by Brentano's under the title "Jews Are Like That."

Under the sub-caption "Semitic Silhouettes," the author, who hides himself behind the name "Analytiks," attempts to give an estimate and description of the lives and work of Louis D. Brandeis, Henry Morgenthau, Louis Lipsky, Stephen S. Wise, Ludwig Lewisohn, Felix Adler, Aaron Sapiro, Louis Marshall, and Nathan Strauss.

In his introduction, the anonymous author, referring to the American background and its relation to the Jew asserts: "He is the most assimilated and assimilating being on the American scene—and still an alien being. Passionately at times pathetically anxious to 'belong'—his clothes, his books, his beard, his diet, his mind have been refashioned to suit American conditions and conventions. He will not, he will not be different."

"Superficially he has succeeded. Basically he has failed. For his important and growing share in the nation's industry, in its politics, in its sports, in its education and its culture, not to obscure the fact that into all these spheres the Jew has brought a quality and a flavor uniquely his. American to his fingertips, he remains inwardly and profoundly, an alien, the exotic, the unconquerable Jew. Not inquisition, nor pale, nor pogrom revealed the eternal Jew, as does the freedom to lose himself which in America is his—freedom which somehow, despite himself, he does not, cannot use."

Various suppositions are current as to the identity of the author. The publishers issued a denial of a rumor that Felix Frankfurter, professor of law at Harvard, is the author, who treats some of the American Jewish leaders harshly in the book.

Another rumor, still unverified, has it that James Waterman Wise, son of Dr. Stephen S. Wise, is the author of the book.

NAME NEW DIRECTOR OF BARON DE HIRSCH FUND
 (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Baltimore, Md., Nov. 3.—Alexander Goodman, Baltimore attorney, has been appointed resident director of the Baron de Hirsch Fund at Woodbine, N. J. By the appointment he will become City Manager of the town, his duties to begin November 12.

Comprising an industrial and agricultural community of 16,000 population, Woodbine is a community almost wholly Jewish. It was settled in 1891, when, after social and political upheavals in Eastern Europe, there was an influx of destitute Jews into this country. Baron de Hirsch established the fund for aiding these people. A tract of 5,000 acres of land in the sandy flats of New Jersey was purchased and there the village of Woodbine was founded.

DEMOCRATIC LEADER REITERATES RELIGIOUS INTOLERANCE CAMPAIGN ISSUE

Quotes Editorial from "Chicago Tribune," Republican Paper
(Communication to the Editor)

Sir:

In several issues of the Jewish Daily Bulletin recently you published a number of statements to the effect that there is no religious issue involved in the present campaign and supporting Mr. Hoover's candidacy. For the sake of fairness and impartiality, I urge you to give space in your valuable publication to the following quotation from the "Chicago Daily Tribune," a Republican newspaper, on the same subject. I believe that this information should be presented to your readers, who must be interested in it both as decent Americans and as the first victims of intolerance.

The "Chicago Tribune" writes: "Governor Smith's denunciation of certain influences working in or for the Republican party was a true statement of facts. It is accepted as such by many Republicans. The Klan and the Anti-Saloon League are twin calamities working for the election of the Republican national ticket. Their practices are intolerable. Their intolerance is disgraceful. . . . The Republican Party has these two allies, and its connection with them is sufficiently apparent to expose it to the properly indignant language of Gov. Smith. The Tribune feels precisely as he does in the matter."

I suggest further that for the same purpose you disclose the facts bearing on Mr. Hoover's reception of the campaign waged in his behalf. On that subject the following excerpt from "The World's" editorial of today may suffice to furnish the facts, though the record might be effectively expanded by adducing further evidence of acquiescence:

"Mr. Hoover found himself last July the recipient of support from those organized forces which threaten the integrity of our national life. He has issued two or three Platonic disclaimers. But never in the course of this campaign has he done one indignant and effective thing to discourage them. They are more active and enthusiastic today in his behalf than they ever were. It is idle to say that Mr. Hoover could not have done more. His helplessness is either pretense or weakness. A man of force and character who did not want organized bigotry to support him could have found ways of stamping upon it."

"The reason Mr. Hoover's mild disclaimers have never discouraged his disreputable following is to be found in his moral collapse in the Willebrandt affair. That was the acid test in this campaign of whether or not Mr. Hoover really meant to discourage sectarian support. Mrs. Willebrandt's appeal to the Methodist Conference in Ohio provided the supreme occasion for an effective disavowal. When Mr.

Hoover declined to disavow her, no generalities he could utter had any effective force. For if Mrs. Willebrandt in her official position could do what she did, there was no longer any reason why the unofficial fanatics should stop. The acceptance of Mrs. Willebrandt was an acquiescence in the whole campaign of bigotry."

Further, you would render a service to those whom facts may affect by pointing out or permitting it to be pointed out by publishing this letter, that in 1924 the Republican leaders saved the Ku Klux Klan from extinction.

As to this, too, the record is clear and indisputable.

Early in the campaign of that year, Mr. Davis and Senator LaFollette, the Democratic and Progressive candidates for the presidency united in denouncing the Klan by name and invited Mr. Coolidge to join in that denunciation to the end that the Klan be blotted out as a crying disgrace to American civilization and to American political life. Had Mr. Coolidge accepted the proposal and joined in the denunciation, the Klan would have been a political pariah, and its extinction for all purposes would have been but a matter of brief time.

But Mr. Coolidge preferred to capitalize a vote-catching opportunity and refused to join while Mr. Dawes, the vice-presidential candidate, speaking for the party, held the Klan up to the admiration of the American people as "brave men" and "adventurous spirits" and "law-abiding citizens banded together for law enforcement."

To be sure, he coupled this high praise with tactical generalities about the inconsistency of secret societies, and private law enforcement with the spirit of American institutions. But no one who reads the speech can see in it anything but a servile bid for Klan votes. (See Mr. Dawes' speech on August 23, 1924.)

And finally, and in a similar manner, you might ask your readers to consider whether Mr. Hoover's election will not immeasurably add to the political influence of the Klan and other agencies of intolerance; and whether a vote for Mr. Hoover is not a vote to enhance the prestige of the Ku Klux Klan, stimulate bigotry, and to lend countenance to such despicable publications as the "Fellowship Forum"; and whether they can be confident that if Mr. Hoover were elected the Republican party could clean house as the "Chicago Tribune" would have it do, or whether a group of allies that had played so large a part in his campaign, may not be expected to insist upon and compel recognition for themselves and support of their policies by his administration.

estine Government is against us and has openly declared that under no circumstances will it allow any change of status quo. That is to say, the Jews will continue to have no rights at the Wailing Wall, just as it is now. The Arabs have organized a big counter-movement. The Moslem Supreme Council has interviewed the Acting High Commissioner, who has given them assurances which have entirely satisfied them. The question can be solved therefore only in London, and we here are waiting for a world-wide movement to be started from London. The intervention of the League of Nations is not necessary. The question can be solved here on the spot, if only the British Government will give the necessary instructions from London.

Under Article 14 of the Palestine Mandate, a Commission has to be appointed to settle any disputes in respect to the Holy Places. But there is no dispute about the Wailing Wall. No one has any claim to the Wailing Wall except the Jews. There is no Christian claim to it, and no Moslem claim either. The Moslems own the places around the Wailing Wall, which constitute a Wakf, a Moslem religious endowment, devoted to social, religious, charitable, and suchlike purposes. The houses surrounding the Wailing Wall are occupied by Moroccan Arabs. It is a sort of Moslem "Kolei," like the Jewish "Koleis" here from Warsaw, Hungary, etc. The place provides that land and houses belonging to a Wakf must not be sold, but may be exchanged for land or houses situated elsewhere. The Palestine Government, if only it had wished, could have effected such an exchange long ago in regard to the Moslem property at the Wailing Wall. But the Government is generally against us. Secondly, it is afraid of the protests of the Arabs, whom the Government encourages by its own attitude. Only a definite Order issued in London would be able to make any change in the situation. The British Government can decree that because of the justified demands of the Jews, the question of worship at the Wailing Wall must be regulated, and that to prevent any further disputes and conflicts, the area around the Wailing Wall must be expropriated and handed over into the charge of the Jews, who would have to provide the Moroccan Arabs with land and houses elsewhere in exchange for their present property. If this is not done, we may be certain that there will be fresh incidents at the Wailing Wall constantly.

The cornerstone laying of the temple of Knesset Israel Congregation, Louisville, Ky., will take place May 1, 1929. William B. Harrison, Rabbi Saul Silber, Chicago, and Rabbi Albert N. Mandelbaum, leader of the congregation, will be the speakers.

Ground for the new temple was broken July 31 and the structure is expected to be ready for occupancy May 1, 1929. The new synagogue will have a seating capacity for 1,250 persons, a religious school, ten class rooms, a Rabbi's study, an executive office, library and community house. The community hall will have accommodations for 600 persons.

Knesset Israel congregation was formed through the consolidation of two of the oldest orthodox Jewish synagogues, the Bnai Jacob and Beth Hamedrash Hagodol.
