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HUNGARIAN STUDENTS REFUSE TO GUARANTEE SAFETY TO COLLEGE JEWS

Opening of Colleges Doubtful as New Acts of Violence Occur
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Budapest, Nov. 6.—The normal resumption of studies in the Hungarian universities and colleges, closed because of the anti-Semitic student riots, announced for tomorrow, November 7, appears doubtful as new acts of violence occurred in the capital.

Although an agreement was reached at a conference of the Minister of Education with the college deans and representatives of the nationalistic student groups, it appears that the frenzied students decline to abide by this agreement.

New acts of violence against Jewish students occurred today at the Veterinary College in Budapest. Some of the Jewish students who appeared on the campus and in the class rooms were beaten and driven away. Many Jewish students were compelled to jump out of the windows of the classrooms.

The leaders of the anti-Semitic student groups declared that there will be no pacification until the fulfillment of their demand by the expulsion of the seventy-four Jewish students, with high scholastic standing, who were admitted this year in all the colleges above the quota prescribed by numerous clauses law.

Similarly, the student body at the University of Debreczin rejected the demand of the dean to guarantee the safety of the Jewish students. They will not accede to this demand as long as it is possible to admit Jewish students above the quota, they declared.

BENTWICH'S KIN INSPECTOR PALESTINE HEBREW SCHOOLS

Jerusalem, Nov. 6.—Joseph Bentwich, brother of Norman Bentwich, Palestine Attorney-General, has been appointed inspector of Hebrew schools in Palestine, by the government. He is the third Jew to hold this post.

Haifa, Nov. 6.—The right of student participation in the pedagogic council of the Beth Sefer Reali, Hebrew secondary school here, was demanded by the upper grade classes, which have declared a strike.

The seventh and eighth classes, in striking, demand recognition of their committee and the right to participate in the Council for the purpose of advising on matters concerning pupils.

SIR HERBERT SAMUEL MARKS 54TH BIRTHDAY

LATVIAN JUDGE DEPOSED AND SENTENCED TO JAIL FOR PREJUDICE TO JEWS

Duzman Achieved Notoriety as Anti-Semite
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Riga, Nov. 6.—Latvian citizens, believing that "justice should be blind," applauded the verdict of a higher court deposing and sentencing to six months imprisonment Justice of the Peace Duzman of Swinsk.

Duzman, through his application for many years of anti-Jewish prejudice while on the bench, achieved wide notoriety as an anti-Semite. He was in the habit of giving heavier sentences to Jews who appeared before him, unless he was bribed. Finally, the patience of the people of Dvinsk was exhausted and a popular petition was directed to the Ministry of Justice, which ordered an investigation. The investigation led to a trial and to the sentence.

LUNACHARSKY MAKES CLEAR HIS STAND ON HEBREW LANGUAGE

Would Not Be Permitted for Instruction; Only as Subject if Demanded
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Nov. 6.—Anatole Lunacharsky, Soviet Commissar of Education, regarding whose attitude toward the Hebrew language several contradictory reports were published in the Soviet press, made clear his stand in a statement he issued in reply to an inquiry of the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency here.

"Under no circumstances would we introduce dead Hebrew as a language of instruction, regardless of the desires of the population," Lunacharsky declared. "Moreover, I doubt extremely whether it is possible to find anywhere a Jewish population, except small groups, who would demand this. Hebrew, like Latin, should be permitted, I believe, if the population somewhere demanded that in a certain school Hebrew be introduced among other subjects on the curriculum."

EINSTEIN DENIES THAT HE HAS NEW DISCOVERY

Berlin, Nov. 6.—Prof. Albert Einstein, famous Jewish scientist, denied today the newspaper report that he is about to make a new discovery of greater importance than that of his relativity theory.

Dr. Einstein declared that he had submitted two papers dealing with the subject of relativity to the German Academy of Sciences. During his convalescence this summer he merely pursued research work which he has further developed, he declared.

RIGOROUS ANTI-JEWISH DISCRIMINATION IN TURKEY REPORTED AND DENIED

Ambassador to Washington Contradicts Report of Constantinople Resident

A report of a continuous, rigorous policy of anti-Jewish discrimination in present day Turkey, brought to Sofia, Bulgaria, by a leading Jewish resident of Constantinople, whose identity can not be disclosed for obvious reasons, was denied by Ahmed Moulkhar Bey, Turkish Ambassador to Washington, in reply to an inquiry by the "Jewish Daily Bulletin."

The query was motivated by the following report received from the Jewish Telegraphic Agency correspondent in Sofia.

"A member of the community of Constantinople, well abreast of Jewish affairs in his country, while en route to Sofia, stated the following to our representative in this city on the subject of the situation of the Jews in Turkey.

"There exists at the present time in Turkey an exceptional regime against the Jews. The latter have been entirely alienated from all the official departments and from all public administrations. The doors of the upper-grade schools of the Government have been closed on them tightly. No longer is any Jewish student seen at the University of Turkey. We no longer have, as before, any representative of our element either in the legislative chamber or in the municipal councils."

"Our schools do not receive any material support on the part of the Government. There are imposed upon us, on the other hand, Turkish instructors for the teaching of the Turkish language to whom we have to pay high fees. We

FORM SOCIETY TO COMBAT ANTI-SEMITISM IN MOSCOW

Moscow, Nov. 6.—A society for combating anti-Semitism in Soviet Russia was formed by a number of Russian scholars. The society has for its purpose the publication of books, articles and newspapers. It will also compile periodically, black lists of the names of anti-Semitic agitators in the Union of Soviet Republics.

The founders of the society are S. Oldenburg, M. Malikh, A. Zarudni, N. Morozov, and K. Fedin.

ERNEST MARCUS, KANTIAN SCHOLAR, DIES AT 73

Berlin, Nov. 6.—Ernst Marcus, famous Kantian scholar, jurist and former judge, died here today at the age of 73. The German press paid warm tribute to the late scholar who, without an academic training, won a wide reputation as a philosopher in Germany.

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MURDERERS OF JEWS OF CONSTANTINOPLE GET REDUCED PRISON TERMS

Assassins of Jewish Peddlers, at New

Trial, Get from 10 to 30 Years

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Constantinople, Nov. 6.—A prison term of 30 years at hard labor was imposed upon Nazim, found guilty of the murder of two Jewish peddlers, Abram Ben Yehar and Isaac Eskopido, when the case came up on appeal here. He was previously sentenced to life imprisonment, but as he is under 21, the sentence was commuted to a term of 24 years.

Tevfik, an accomplice to the murderer, was sentenced to 10 years imprisonment. The lower court had imposed a sentence of 15 years imprisonment.

The sentence of 10 years imprisonment imposed on Emin, the master of the murderer, a girl of 13, who acted as a decoy, calling the peddlers into the house where they were killed, was permitted to stand by the appeal court.

One thousand persons attended the funeral on Monday of the late Otto El Drivier, a trustee and associate treasurer of Temple Emmanu-El, who died on Sunday. Dr. Samuel Schuchman officiated at the services.

The funeral cortege proceeded to Beth-El Cemetery, where the body was placed in the family mausoleum.

NO RELIGIOUS DENOMINATION HAS CLAIM TO DOMINANCE IN U. S., BAPTISTS' VIEW

Rights Are Not Measured by Numbers,
Baptist Organ Says

Chicago, Ill., Nov. 6.—Interesting comment in connection with the campaign is made by "The Baptist," official newspaper of the Northern Baptist Convention, published here. Under the caption: "Whose Country Is America, Anyhow?," the paper writes:

"One of the vices of majorities is a habit of claiming a monopoly of possession, power and rights. In the United States this vice takes the form of claiming the nation for the major group. Because more people profess to follow Christianity than any other religion, this is called by some Christians a Christian country; for a similar reason a Protestant country, a white man's country, an Anglo-Saxon country, and so on. Such assumption on the part of majorities of any sort, contains a vicious fallacy. Rights are not measured by numbers. A nation that has 4,000,000 Jews, 12,000,000 Negroes, 18,000,000 Catholics and more than 40,000,000 people of other origins than English, is neither Christian, Protestant, white nor Anglo-Saxon. It is what it is, a mixed nation, with population classifiable on lines that run crisscross in many directions, and with all groups equally American and equally entitled to all American rights. This is not even a business men's country, or a capitalist country. It is everybody's country. Whenever any group shall arrogate to itself special prerogatives and dictatorial powers, a revolution of the sort provided in the national constitution is morally and politically due."

SAN FRANCISCO PLANS \$500,000 COMMUNITY CENTER

San Francisco, Nov. 3.—This city is to have a \$500,000 Jewish Community Center, it was announced by Sidney M. Ehrman, who has been named chairman of a committee of eleven authorized to make preliminary arrangements for the preparation of plans, selection of a site and means of financing the building.

The announcement indicated that the drive for funds to erect the building would be made in the Spring of 1929 in accordance with the recommendation embodied in the report of the sub-committee which named Mr. Ehrman as chairman.

Although the idea of the center is not a new one, it having been discussed over a period of six years, this is the first time that any definite action has been taken. The building will afford more than a score of local Jewish organizations with social and educational features. The present Y. M. and Y. W. H. A. of which Lloyd W. Dinkelspiel is president and Louis H. Blumenfeld, executive director, will be merged with a new center when erected, it was stated.

The International Good-Will Congress, sponsored by the World Alliance for Peace and Friendship Through the Churches, will hold its general sessions at the Waldorf-Astoria in New York on November 12, 13 and 14.

JASSY UNIVERSITY SENATE RULES AGAINST FOREIGN GRADUATES

Jewish Daily Declares Measure Aimed
Against Jews

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jassy, Nov. 6.—A new ruling by the Senate of the University of Jassy will further bar Jewish students from that institution. The Senate decided that students returning from Italy will not be permitted to continue their studies at the University unless they will again pass the entrance examinations.

The "Curierul Israeli," Roumanian Jewish daily, commenting on this order, declares that it is directed against Jewish students.

REFUGEES ARRIVE IN URUGUAY FROM TURKEY

The arrival of 100 refugees who had been expelled from Turkey was reported by the Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society in Uruguay to the main headquarters of the Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society of America, New York City.

The refugees are but the forerunners of similar groups expected to arrive shortly, the report states. The Hias Bureau is engaged in seeking homes and employment for those who have arrived and also those who are expected.

In a single month, eleven Jewish settlers asked for and received permission to bring relatives from Poland. They will join those who are already settled in Uruguay and begin life anew.

Spanish being the native language of Uruguay, the Hias Bureau has inaugurated a free school where courses in Spanish are given four times a week. This is an increase of two classes a week over the previous method. The classes are conducted in government school buildings with the permission of the National Educational Council and receive favorable cooperation from the government in the conduct of this work.

Another feature of the Hias work in Uruguay is the extension of the activities of the employment bureau through which Jewish immigrants find employment. In addition to seeking employment, the Society has arranged a budget through which loans are made to the immigrants and by means of which they are enabled to buy tools and pursue their labors. Another feature of this department's work is the advancement of cash loans to small tradesmen.

B'NAI B'RITH TO LAUNCH "WIDER SCOPE" DRIVE

Washington, D. C., Nov. 6.—The B'nei B'rith Wider Scope Campaign will start in the District of Columbia November 11. The quota is \$25,000 for the five-year budget. Joseph A. Wilner, president of District No. 5 Grand Lodge of the B'nei B'rith, and co-chairman of the District Wider Scope Committee, will direct the campaign.

PICA PLANS TO EXTEND COLONIZATION WORK IN PALESTINE

**Alliance Allots Funds for Increasing
Educational Facilities**
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Paris, Nov. 6.—The Pica, Palestine colonization agency created by Baron Edmund de Rothschild and his son James Rothschild, plans an extension of its colonization work in the country, it is stated here on good authority.

The new development is to be carried out near Hedera, where new colonies are to be established. A sum running into many thousands of pounds has already been allotted for this purpose. The amount of £2,200 for the erection of synagogues in the old Rothschild colonies has also been allocated. Suitable sites for the erection of synagogues have been purchased. The model synagogue to be erected will be in the colony Benyamina.

It was also learned that the Alliance Israelite Universelle has decided to expand its network of schools in Palestine. An amount of £3,000 has been allocated for this purpose by the organization.

ZIONIST REGION GREETS NON- ZIONIST CONFERENCE RESULT

Pittsburgh, Pa., Nov. 6.—A resolution favoring the outcome of the Non-Zionist Conference held in New York was adopted at the last meeting of the Zionist Regional Conference, Number 5, comprising Western Pennsylvania, West Virginia, and Eastern Ohio.

In addition, two resolutions of protest were adopted, one against the persecution of Zionism and Hebrew culture by Soviet Russia, and one requesting the safeguarding of Jewish rights by the Mandatory Powers in an effort to stamp out occurrences similar to the Wailing Wall incident. The delegates of the region, which has raised \$55,000 for the United Palestine Appeal during the past year elected Dr. M. B. Lichtenstein, Pittsburgh, president.

Kansas City, Mo., Nov. 6.—A season of enlarged Zionist activities and of increased results for the United Palestine Appeal is expected as a result of the recent election of officers of the Kansas City Zionist District, which made Harry Friedberg, President.

Preliminary plans for the adoption of a cultural program for the Kansas City Zionist District were discussed at the meeting.

FRENCH ZIONISTS PROTEST WAILING WALL INCIDENT

Paris, Nov. 6.—A mass meeting to protest against the incidents at the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem was held last night at the Hotel Wagram under the auspices of the French Zionist Federation.

Prof. Victor Bache, Dr. Leo Motzkin, Rabbi M. Eisenstadt, Hillel Slatopolski, Rabbi Israel Levi, Victor Jacobson, Sholom Asch and M. Palliere were the speakers. A strong resolution of protest was adopted.

**The "Father" of House of Commons
Chats on Jewish Subjects, Com-
ments on American Conditions**
(By Our London Correspondent)

London, Oct. 30.—The Right Hon. T. P. O'Connor, M.P., recently celebrated his eightieth birthday.

"Tay Pay," who has spent fifty of his eighty years in the British House of Commons, took occasion to state his views on Jewish questions and to comment on conditions in the United States in so far as the Irish and the Jews are concerned, when the representative of the Jewish Daily Bulletin called to interview the Irish leader on his eightieth birthday.

"There is much anti-Semitism in the United States," said Mr. O'Connor, when the present outlook of the Jewish population in that country was mentioned. "But," he added, "I should not worry too much about it, if I were a Jew."

"Why?"
"Because there, they have all the means of fighting against it successfully. They enjoy all those political rights which make it possible to fight it effectively," he said.

"As for the Jews in England," he continued, "you know, of course, how little they feel the effects of anti-Semitism. Speaking for myself, I may say that I have a large number of good friends among Jews here. There is Mr. Bernhard Baron, for instance. There is Lord Rothschild. Mr. Joseph Gluckstein, and many others. And in the United States, likewise, I have plenty of good friends among your people, for instance, Mr. Rosenwald of Chicago."

At this point Mr. O'Connor recalled a dinner which the Chicago Jewish philanthropist gave in his honor during a visit to the United States. Someone at this dinner told him that the reason they liked him so well was that he "spoke our own language," meaning evidently that Irish brogue which has clung to him all these long years with all the faithful loyalty with which he himself has stuck to the guns of his many battles for Ireland. It was an allusion to the power which the Irish element exercises in the political life of Chicago and so many other big cities in the United States, of course, and a man called O'Connor should have felt quite at home in such company, and he probably did feel so.

Asked for his opinion of Governor Smith's chances, Mr. O'Connor naturally, as befits a parliamentarian, preferred to express no opinion at the present moment.

Recalling the prejudices against which Irish immigrants had to contend in earlier years in the United States, Mr. O'Connor was able to point with much gratification to the present position of his people in that country. In this connection he related an experience he had during one of his visits there. At some gathering arranged in his honor, a typical Yankee lady from

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WEDGWOOD'S TOUR IN ROUMANIA FOR KEREN HAYESOD SUCCESSFUL

**Visit Aroused Wide Interest; Will Be
Feted by Minister Duca**
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Nov. 6.—Col. Josiah Wedgwood, well-known British Labor M. P., and friend of the Zionist movement, is meeting with great success in his tour of Roumania in the interests of the Keren Hayesod, the Palestine Foundation Fund.

His visit has aroused wide interest in the Jewish communities. Jewish delegations wait for many hours at stations where he is expected to pass through. Roumanian Minister of the Interior Duca is arranging a dinner in honor of the Keren Hayesod delegate. Princess Bibescu will give a tea in his honor.

Warsaw, Nov. 6.—An all-Polish conference to inaugurate this year's Keren Hayesod campaign in the Republic of Poland was opened here Monday evening. Delegates from 442 cities, towns and villages are attending. The Speaker of the Polish Senate, Mr. Szymanski, the Wojewoda of Warsaw (Governor), Minister of the Interior and a representative of the foreign office were among those present.

Leib Jaffe, Jewish poet, who has been delegated to Poland to inaugurate the Keren Hayesod campaign, delivered the keynote address after the opening speech by Deputy H. Farbshteyn. If Palestine had a population of 200,000 Jews, an incident like that at the Wailing Wall could never have occurred, was the statement made by the Keren Hayesod delegate, calling forth the widest applause.

Prior to the opening of the conference, Mr. Jaffe was received in audience by the President of the Republic, Ignace Moscicki. The President, it is reported, expressed his deep interest in the Palestine upbuilding and pointed to the great economic and cultural contributions of Polish Jewry to the development of Eastern Europe as the all-important link between Europe and the Orient in the beginning of Europe's civilized period.

UNEARTH WALL OF SOLOMONIC PERIOD

Jerusalem, Nov. 6.—A portion of an ancient wall, believed to be a part of a Jerusalem city wall dating back to the time of Solomon, was unearthed by the Palestine Exploration Fund in its excavations in the vicinity of Mount Ophel. It is certain that the wall dates back to the time of the Hebrew monarchy.

The archaeologists have also discovered that the continuation of a Byzantine street running to the pool of Siloam. Houses with mosaic floors were also found.

The contract for the new Jewish community center and synagogue in Morristown, N. J. was let on a bid of approximately \$100,000. 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even are obliged to pay them regularly at the end of each month without caring whether or not we have funds to pay to the other instructors. Our school teachers are forbidden to teach the Turkish language in our own school. Upon the least resistance on our part we are threatened with the closing of our schools."

The Turkish ambassador in his reply declared:

"I wish to reply point by point to the accusations of this gentleman, which are devoid of all foundation.

"It is absolutely false that any exceptional regime is being applied to the Jews in Turkey.

"The public administrations continue to avail themselves of their services, unless they do not know Turkish, which is obligatory, as French is in France, English in England and so on.

"The liquidation of the monarchical regime at the time of its removal from the capital to Angora did away with a certain number of officials of the departments, among whom were Turks, Jews, Greeks and Armenians. As to the Jews particularly, they were very scarce, since it has been the private enterprises that have at all times attracted them. Moreover, they did not ask to follow the Government to Angora.

"The higher-grade schools hold their doors wide open to them and they even have professors at the University. If they have no representatives in the Chamber, it is because they are in a weak minority, incapable of convincing public opinion and mustering votes. It is understood of course that as anywhere else the Turkish Parliament is represented by political parties and not by ethnic elements. The same is true with municipal boards. Legally, there is no opposition to election of a Jew.

"No private school, none whatever, is supported materially by the Government. However, in the Jewish schools, as in any other establishments of tuition, Turkish must be taught regularly by instructors the selection of whom must be approved by the competent authorities in order to put an end to the quibblings looking to a curb on the language of the country.

"It is not true that high fees are allotted to these instructors, save a normal minimum commensurate with the salaries of the school establishments of the State, often lower than those allowed by private schools to their own teaching bodies. A Jew is not forbidden to teach Turkish if, possessing the qualifications necessary, he is in a position to do so. There is nothing more normal than to demand regular payment of salaries, at the end of each month.

"Upon the least resistance on our part, it is said, we are threatened with the closing of our schools." It is a question of knowing, in order to be able to reply to you on this score, when this threat took place, and whether the resistance that provoked it was minor or liable to fall under the hand of the law.

"I am surprised, for my own account, to see this gentleman bring his outcry

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one of the New England states condescended to the distinguished visitor nothing more nor less than that he was "the first Irish gentleman she had ever met!"

There was a half wistful, half amused smile on the aged statesman's lips as he related this incident, to illustrate the prejudice against which the Irish had to fight also in the United States before they reached their present state. The moral of the story being, he said, that the prejudices against Jews would likewise diminish as soon as they made themselves more felt in the political life of America. He felt certain that they would ultimately win all the respect and fair treatment to which they were justly entitled, the Ku Klux Klan to the contrary notwithstanding.

Turning to the question of Palestine, Mr. O'Connor expressed himself as not very optimistic about the future of that country as a Jewish National Home. Its resources, in his opinion, were not adequate to support a large population, and he did not feel as if Zionism were really a solution of the Jewish problem.

"While I can understand that Jews all over the world are interested in helping this experiment to succeed, I should advise them to work for Palestine as loyal patriotic citizens of their present native countries, and establish themselves more firmly wherever they are at present."

Speaking of his views upon Jewish character generally, Mr. O'Connor said:

"The abject and dismal ignorance prevailing among most people in the world as regards the virtues of the Jew, especially in his home life, would seem incredible, if it were not so sadly true. What does the world know of that intense family life, of that respect of children for their elders, and of that sympathy with the poor, which I know of among Jewish people? Nothing!"

After a moment of silence, he continued: "I could tell you of a Jewish woman in Chicago, whose name I do not just now recollect, who devoted her entire vast fortune to the building of houses for the poorer sections of the population. And then, after she had spent her last penny on these houses, there came a day when she herself had to move into a few small rooms in one of these houses, because she could no longer afford to pay any rent!"

VALUABLE GIFTS TO HEBREW UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

Dr. Nathan Korn of Vienna sent an agricultural library consisting of about 400 volumes, the donation of the Society of Jewish Students at the School of Agriculture in Vienna. The shipment contained also: The Proceedings of the Academy of Sciences in Vienna, Department of Mathematics and Natural Science, Vol. 117-132 (both sections) donated by Dr. Isaac Robinson of Vienna; a series of old Latin works donated by Mr. Marcus Satz of Vienna; the Arabic-Persian-Turkish dictionary by Meminski (1780); many valuable medical books previously belonging to the library of the late Dr. S. Kornfeld.

Dr. Thachater of Breslau sent a case of books containing, among others, many publications relating to the history of the Order B'nai B'rith and the Alliance Israelite Universelle. These were donated by Dr. Theodor Breslau, Dr. Adolph Mandowski, Ludvig Schachne and the publishing firm of Dr. Freibatsch.

From Dr. Julius Jarcho of New York the Library received a large collection of new medical books and periodicals.

Dr. E. Libman of New York sent a case of books containing new medical works and editions of medical classics, among which was the ten-volume edition of "Hypokrates."

Dr. Emanuel Hertz of New York donated a manuscript "De Natu Human" (ae intelligentiae?) by one of the commentators of Descartes, and the edition of the Hebrew Pentateuch, Anvers 1573.

Prof. Theodor Lessing sent all of his works, at the request of the Library.

Dr. Alfred Adler, the well-known psychoanalyst, sent his book "Der Nervöse Charakter," and many of his individual studies. Mr. Chaim Enzo Seneni sent to the Library the edition of "Diologhi di Amore" by Leone Ebree, printed in 1538.

Mr. Jechiel Kurz of Tarnow sent eight very old Hebrew books, among them the Augsburg edition of "Akvath Rohel" (1536).

Mr. Ludvig Ikenberg of Dresden bought for the Library editions of Kant and Schopenhauer which the Library had hitherto lacked.

The printing firm of Meyer of Halberstadt again sent a large number of its publications.

The Library Committee in Rome recently photographed many materials and works of art in Italy relating to the history of the Jews in that country, and donated the collection to the Library.

In Slovakia, Dr. M. Oettinger collected for the Library interesting posters relating to the history of the Jews in that country.
