BRITAIN WILL ISSUE WHITE

PAPER ON WAILING WAIL, AMERY TELLS HOUSE Government Will Seek Highest Legal Advice Before Definite Decison (Tewish Telegraphic Agency

London, Nov. 13.—A White Paper dealing in detail with the incidents which occurred at the Western Wall of the Temple and the claims and counter-claims raised by Moslen's and Jews of Palestine in connection with Jews of Palestine in connection with this matter will be presented to the House of Commons by the British Government, Col. Leopold H. Amery, Colonial Secretary, stated in reply to a mumber of questions raised at the Monday afternoon session of Parliament

In reply to the question submitted by Lieut. Commander Kenworthy as to whether the British Government is aware that the Moslems in Jerusalem have erected masonry constructions on top of the Wailing Wall and whether it can explain why this was permitted by the Palestine Govern-ment, the Colonial Secretary stated that the British Government proposes to take the highest legal advice before it will arrive at a definite deci-The government wishes to be sure whether there has occurred a violation of the status quo by the build-ing operations over the Wall. Com-mander Kenworthy then drew to the attention of the government that the building on top of the Wall was an entirely new departure, which the Turkish Government never permitted.

Sir Frank Sanderson, Conservative, asked whether the government of Palestine will "in view of the action of certain Jews, take steps to protect the Wall from acts of aggression and so removing the cause of what may be-

come dangerous agitation.'

T. D. Fenby, Liberal, asked what steps have been taken to enable the Tewish worshippers at their Holy Places to conduct services of devotion

without molestation.

To both of these questions, Col. Amery replied by saying that the government intends to submit to the House a White Paper dealing with the matter, and that further steps have been taken to minimize the risk of a recurrence. The Government's concern is strictly to maintain the status quo. The action of the police is di-

EMBRACE WEDGWOOD'S IDEA SEVENTH DOMINION Demand Palestine Set Up Independent Representation in London

idea that Palestine become the seventh dominion within the British Empire was officially incorporated into the program of the League of Zionist Revisionists at a conference of Palestinian Revisionists held here yesterday.

Vladimir Jabetinsky, president of the League, now a resident in Palestine, presided over the conference, which adopted a resolution welcoming the seventh dominion idea advocated by Col. Josiah Wedgwood in his recently published book of that name concerning the subject.

Another resolution urges Palestine Jewry to conduct "its own political activity" and to establish a permanent political representation in London, independent of the Zionist Executive.

ROUMANIAN GOVERNMENT PARTY TO CO-OPERATE WITH JEWISH GROUPS IN ELECTIONS Reported Willing to Include in Lists Zionists from Transylvania and

Bessarabia

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Bucharest, Nov. 13—Juliu Maniu, Roumanian Prime Minister, received Dr. William Filderman, president of the Union of Roumanian Jews of the Old Kingdom, in an audience today to discuss pending matters. It is understood that the subject of the conversation was the possibility of cooperation between the Union and the National Peasant Party, of which Mania is the head, in the forthcoming parliamentary elections. No result was said to have been reached as, according to a report, the Peasant Party declined to enter into an election alliance with the Union. It is stated, on the other hand, that the Peasant Party is willing to include in its lists four Zionist candidates from Transylvania and four Jewish candidates from Bessarabia, principally for the districts of Kishineff, Chotin, Belche and Bender, thickly populated Jewish centers. It is also possible that the Zionist groups in Bukewina and in Old Roumania will cooperate with the Peasant Party. Should the proposal for an election alliance fail, it is possible that the various Jewish groups will seek to establish an all-Roumanian Jewish elec-

MANID COVERNMENT WILE VIGOROUSLY SUPPRESS AT-TEMPTS AT ANTI-JEWISH RIOTS

Disgrantled Parties Apparently Plan Attacks as Pawn in Politics Clewish Belegraphic Agency

Bucharest, Nov. 13-A threat made publicly by Octavian Goga, Roumanian poet and former Minister of the Interior, netorious anti-Semitic agitator, that anti-lewish excesses will be arranged to embarrass the new government, brought forth official and semiofficial statements.

The Maniu Government is deter-

mined to proceed vigorously and mer-cilessly against the intentions of the Averescu party and the Cuza group to interfere with the constructive program of the new Government by staging anti-Semitic attacks, states a semiofficial declaration appearing today in the organs of the National Peasant

Party. A statement to the same effect was made by Prime Minister Maniu to a group of Zionists whom he received in audience today. The head of the government promised the delegation that his cabinet will take all steps necessary to guard the interests of the Jewish population in Roumania.

Hamburg, Nov. 13-The Jewish cemetery in Hamburg was descerated by unknown vandals on Sunday night. Many tombstones were overthrown and graves trampled. The Hamburg Ke-hillah announced a high reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the culprits. This is the 64th case of cemetery desecration in Germany during the past two years.

# JUDAEANS DISCUSS THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF JEWS TO SCIENCE

Professor Cohen and Professor Harrow Present Interesting Papers The Jew and the part he has played in the development of science was de-

In the development of science was de-scribed in two papers presented on Sun-day evening by Professor Morris R. Cohen, Professor of Philosophy at the College of the City of New York, and Professor Benjamin Harrow, noted

chemist. The occasion was a meeting of "The

Judacans, at the Hotel Pennsylvania, attended by some two hundred professional and intellectual leaders in New York City. Hon. Samson Lachman president of the group, presided. Pro-fessor Cohen discussed at length the approach necessary to scientific research, explaining how the Jew came to play the role he does in science and tracing his history up until the present day. Professor Harrow concerned who have been awarded the Nobel Prize established in 1901 by the dis-

coverer of dynamite. While the Jews form 2.4 percent of the total population in Europe and America, Professor Harrow said, they have received 11.4 percent of the Nobel prizes in Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics. Of the seventy nine awards made in these three subjects, nine were

received by Jews.
Despite this large proportion prizes winners, however, in the opinion of Professor Cohen, "contributions to science are not a characteristic of the Jewish race, when I reflect upon Jewish historic analogies. It does not seem to me that race as such can play a part in scientific distinction," was the preface to his remarks. Returning to the Jewish analogy, he said: "We don't find in the Biblical history that Jews made any contributions to science. The Iews made no notable contribution to

science before the Saracen culture.
"We must remember, of course, that Saracen culture was not the culture of the Arab. It was the culture of all the peoples of Asia, Northern Africa and Spain and Southern France. All the histories of science that are worth anything pay respect to the Jews in making the scientific achievements of it so available to Europe. But from the point of view of original contributions, they are in the main in the field of philosophy rather than of science, al-though some of their contributions in the fields of astronomy and mathema-

tics are worthy of note.

"The decline of Sephardic Judaism as the result of the expulsion of Jews from Spain, the impoverishment of Northern Africa led to the decline of the contributions of Jews in the line of science. And it is only at the end of the 18th century that opportunities for Jews to take part in the life of western civilization and to make contributions to science became possible,

he declared.

There are four elements necessary to make the approach to science possible, he said. First, the need of materials and resources. Materials include not and resources. Materials include not merely books, but scientific tradition.

## ORIGINATORS OF KEREN HAYESOD FOUNDATION FETED IN LONDON

Naiditch and Zlatapolsky, Leading Russian Zionists, Celebrate 60th Birthdays

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency

London, Nov. 13-Hillel Zlatopolsky and Isaac Naiditch, leading Russian Zionist, emigres since the Bolshevik revolution, were the guests of honor at a banquet given here Sunday night soldie under the auspices of the Keren front. Hayesod on the occasion of their six-

tieth birthdays.

The two leading Russian Zionists, who are outstanding members of the Keren Havesod administration, are credited with having conceived and sponsored the idea of establishing the Keren Hayesod, Palestine Foundation Fund, which was inaugurated in May

1920, at the London Zionist conference. The idea was based on the Biblical law of Ma'asser, requiring the payment of one-tenth of the annual increase for state and welfare purposes. The originators of the Keren Hayesod idea, who nurtured it until it was adopted, contemplated the raising within five years of the conference date of an amount £25,000,000.

Nahum Sokolow, chairman of the Zionist Executive, Simon Marks, and Leopold Shen were the speakers. They stressed the achievements of the two Zionist leaders for the upbuilding of Palestine, the furtherance of Hebrew literature and the spreading of Hebrew

education. "If Russian Jewry were not pre-vented by the turn of events from participation, the £25,000,000 of the Keren Hayesod would not have remained a dream," Mr. Naiditch stated. "Much, hoowever, is to be expected from the non-Zionists of America," he , said adding that it would not be advisable for the Zionists to turn over the collection apparatus to the non-Zionists.

London, Nov. 13-The responsibility for the upbuilding of Palestine now rests on all Jewry, declared Lord Melchett in a letter he addressed from Paris to the British Keren Hayesed Conference held here on Sunday.

Referring to the recent New York conference of non-Zionists, Lord Melchett added that Jewry's activity in behalf of Palestine is now on trial before the world tribunal. Lord Melchett in his letter paid tribute to Louis Mar-shall, chairman of the New York conference.

Marks, president of British Keren Havesod, who presided, declared that due to his titanic labor, Dr. Weizmann had succeeded in uniting the Jewish communities in the United States and opening the way for world Jewry to assume its rightful respon-sibility toward Palestine. He was particularly proud of the part played by Lord Melchett at the New York conference.

A report on the income of the Keren nounted to £28,423, with a gross expenditure of 20% of the collections, is to stand second to America, Mr. The Jewish National Fund in England Marks declared.

#### IMPRESSIVE ARMISTICE DAY CELEBRATION HELD IN JERUSALEM 200 Former Jewish Legionnaires, In-

cluding Jabotinsky, Parade (Jewish Telegraphic Agency

Jerusalem, Nov. 13-Memorial services were held on Sunday at the British military cemetery, commemorating the tenth anniversary of the Armistice. Wreaths were laid on the graves of soldiers who fell on the Palestine

Two hundred members of the former Jewish Legion which fought in the British Army during the World War for the liberation of Palestine, passed in review before Acting High Com-missioner H. C. Luke. Vladimir Jabotinsky, sponsor of the Jewish Legion idea and one of its leaders, participated in the parade.

Mr. Luke, in his address to the Legionnaires stated that he was confident they will help the upbuilding of the country in peace with the same enthusiasm which they showed during the War. Jabotinsky and the legionnaires were cheered by throngs as they marched along the streets of Jerusalem. Upon returning to their starting point, they were addressed by Colonel Frederick H. Kisch, who emphasized the importance of the Jewish Legion in the Palestine campaign and men-tioned Jabotinsky's leading role in the enterprise.

Two minutes' silence was observed throughout the country. Memorial services were held in the synagogues, mosques and churches.

Kovno, No. 13-Armistice Day was observed with the prominent participation of the Jewish communities throughout the Lithuanian Republic. Sermons on the significance of the day were delivered in the synagogues where memorial services were held.

The Chevra Kadisha of Kovno, Jewish burial society, decided on this occation to erect tombstones on the graves of Jewish soldiers who fell in the World War.

(Continued from Page 1) rected to preserve the delicate equilibrium. At the same time the Government deplores the shock caused to the worshippers by the occurrence on September 24. Col. Amery said fur-ther that Sir Frank Sanderson was "unnecessarily apprehensive on behalf of the Moslems." While it is not contested that the conductors of the Tewish service at the Wall introduced cer-tain innovations, it is true that the Jews have never raised the question of the ownership of the Wall and do not intend to ask anything inconsistent with the inviolability of the Moslem Holy Places. He believes, Col. Amery continued, that a friendly settlement will be possible when the excitement subsides.

Sir Frank Sanderson further asked whether any rioting occurred in Terusalem and how many arrests were made, to which the Secretary replied that none were made. The member then inquired as to whether the Government was aware of the widespread feeling among the Moslems concerning this matter. Col. Amery said that "there was considerable excitement in

all sections of the population."

Geneva, Nov. 13.—Much interest is displayed in political and journalistic circles over the deliberations of the Permanent Mandates Commission of the League of Nations now in session here concerning the petition of the Zionist Executive in the matter of the Western Wall.

The Commission started its deliberations on the question Saturday. While no official statement was issued, the 'Journal de Geneve," influential League newspaper, stated Sunday that it learned on good authority, that the Commission decided to leave the matter to the British Government, following a declaration of intention by the Mandatory that it plans to solve the question in a spirit passifying both

Jews and Moslems. The correspondent or the Telegraphic Agency learns, however, that this statement of the "Journal de Caroue" was premature. The Man-Geneve" was premature. The Man-dates Commission continued its discussion of the subject at its session Monday afternoon. Dr. William Rappard. Swiss member and well known authority on Mandate questions, acted as rapporteur. The session is, as usual, closed and the result will be published only after the Council of the League of Nations accepts the Commission's

report. It was stated that a proposal made at the session that in view of the unusual interest taken in the matter, a statement be issued for immediate publication after the decision is reached.

## JUDAEANS DISCUSS THE CONTRIBUTIONS

OF JEWS TO SCIENCE (Continued from Page 1)

Then, there is the zest of the game of science itself. Science, pure science, may best be viewed as a game. The important thing about a game is that it shall be played according to the rules. The result is not of great importance, or at any rate, not as important as the fact that the rules are kept. The fourth essential is the zest of adventure. Science is the exploration of the unknown, he pointed out.

How is the Jew situated with respect to these four elements? he asked. Up until the 18th century, the Jews had no opportunity to pursue science inasmuch as the Universities were closed to them. since the majority of the Universities were clerical institutions. In addition, they had not the means required for research. Nowadays, he pointed, when they have the means, they have counter

attractions.

The Jews have, however, the zest and spirit of adventure necessary to the pursuit of science, he stated. The 18th century expansion of Europe broke down the walls of the ghetto with the result that the Jews are in a state of flux or transition. "Being in a state of transition, they are fresher and have the zest and the same spirit of adventure which generated modern science,' he declared.

Respect for scholarship is a powerful motive which has induced Jews to go into the field of science, he said. "Science," he believes, "has been easier for Jews than other occupations. It is rather curious that it should have been so. In American universities, for instance, you find that in some branches, like mathmetics or physics, it is easier for a Tew to get a position than it is in sociology or ethics or philosophy. And for obvious reasons. These social questions, or matters relating to morals or philosophy, are parts of Christian civilization. The Jew, after all is more or less of a foreigner, from the point of view of one who regards the Christian element itself as the central civilization of America. And from that point of view, mathematics and physics are harmless subjects and therefore there is no harm in having a Jew teach those subjects.

"I think that you will also find that the laboratories which are opening up in connection with industry are more liberal than the universities would be because these laboratories are run ul-

timately for profit.

"In the fields therefore of applied science the Jews have been doing greatwork in this country. In the field of pure science it is a little more difficult because laboratories do not as yet offer so many places for research in pure science. Certainly we have not done as well in mathematics as in other fields."

A plea that the opportunity be created for scientific students to continue their research work, through scholarship funds, instead of having to go into teaching, was made by Professor Cohen at the conclusion of his address. we believe in letting science prosper naturally, then it seems to me that the way to promote it is not necessarily to

RABBI STEPHEN WISE ATTACKS THE BIGOTRY
DISPLAY IN ELECTIONS

"The election proved there is no such thing as the Jewish vote, but the same cannot be said for the partisan and sec-tarian Christian wete," Rabbi Stephen S. Wise of the Free Synagogue said Sunday in his sermon in Carnegie Hall on "The Sin of Compromise-a Post-Election Challenge to the American People."

He attacked bigetry, which, he said, "has virtually been laid down as a principle of American political life, that, so far as the Presidency is concerned, Catholics are disfranchised."

In regard to the Jewish vote ques-tion in New York, he said, "If the Jew-ish candidates for Governor and Lieutenant Governor had both been elected, the Jewish vote charge might stand, but the Jewish vote charge might stand, the vote proved that Jews voted like other groups, only more so. "They voted for parties, principles and men, and not as Jews for Jews."

Prohibition and immigration, Rabbi Wise mentioned as two of the issues that were left unsolved, and these "two issues, as well as the status of 12,000,-000 American Negroes should be taken out of politics."

endow buildings and laboratories, and give large endowments to universities for that purpose, but to look at the actual elements involved and find out that after all, the pressing things which make for scientific research are the things which are more or less subjective and the things which therefore generally assert themselves more in youth. The kind of a thing that the Guggenheim fellowship is doing in the way of giving young men a chance to do research work without having to do teaching, without having any obligations except the obligation to do research work is the sort of thing which ultimately makes scientific progress possible.

Professor Harrow devoted his address to the prize winners in chemistry, physics and medicine. In physics three Jews won the award-Professor Mi-chelson of the Chicago University in 1907; Professor Lippman of the Sorbonne in 1908, and Albert Einstein in 1925, who curiously enough won the prize not for his theory of relativity but for some other work. In chemistry, the awards went to Professor Wallach of Gottingen in 1910, Professor Willstatter of Munich in 1915, and Fritz Haber of the Kaiser Wilhelm Institute in 1918. In medicine the following won the award: Ehrlich in 1908, Meyerhoff in 1922 and Metchnikoff,

whose mother was a Jewess. There are a number of Jewish scientists, both here and abroad, Professor Harrow declared, who are in line

for the award.
