## TO SUBMIT NUMERUS CLAUSUS QUESTION TO THE LEAGUE INTELLECTUAL INSTITUTE

Decision Announced by International Students Service  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Paris, Jan. 9.—The discrimination practiced in some of the European universities against Jewish students, through the medium of numerus clausus laws or procedure, will be submitted to the session of the League of Nations Institute for Intellectual Cooperation which will meet in Geneva in April.

This was decided upon at a conference held at Bierville at the initiative of the International Students' Service, which is affiliated with the Christian Students' Movement. The conference was convened to seek ways and means of combating anti-Semitism in the European universities. Forty-eight delegates of student organizations attended. Among them were 25 non-Jews.

## COMPLIMENTS DO NOT IM- PROVE JEWISH SITUATION, KVNO PAPER COMPLAINS

Urges Government Take Action to Fulfill Promises  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Krivo, Jan. 9.—The government has lately made ostentatious declarations of friendship to the Jews, as have Prime Minister Valdemars and Lithuanian representatives abroad, especially in the United States, who have made flattering remarks about Lithuanian Jewry, writes the "Yiddische Stimme," Yiddish daily, in an editorial.

However, the paper declares, these fine words are not paralleled by deeds. Jewish traders and Jewish artisans are still subjected to economic ruin because of the compulsory Sunday rest law. They are still barred from government positions. Two Jewish doctors were recently dismissed from state positions, the few Jews holding state positions are soon compelled to leave. The paper adds that this list of complaints against the government could be continued.

A conference of Jewish merchants held at Shayle, decided to ask the government to postpone the date of collecting taxes, because of the difficult situation in the trades. The Jewish merchants declared that they face complete ruin.

## FLEMINGER, ROUMANIAN JEWISH LEADER, DIES

Czernowitz, Jan. 9.—Bernard Fleminger, former president of the Czernowitz Kenessiah, died there today at the age of 55.

Mr. Fleminger was a prominent merchant in Bukowina and was the vice-president of the Chamber of Commerce.

## PORTER TO DROP PREAMBLE TO CALENDAR REFORM RESOLUTION

Eliminates Commitment to Change; Seventh Day Baptists Also Voice Opposition  
(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Washington, D. C., Jan. 9.—Rev. A. J. Bond, pastor of the Seventh Day Baptist Church, Plainfield, N. J., appeared on behalf of the Seventh Day Baptists as the second witness before the House Foreign Affairs Committee at its hearing yesterday, opposing the proposed change in the calendar.

In an impressive speech, Rev. Bond pointed out that the proposed change would infringe upon the Seventh Day Baptists Sabbath, which is observed on Saturday, the same day as the Jewish Sabbath.

As a result of the vigorous opposition which has been made against the resolution now before the Committee, Congressman Porter of Pennsylvania, chairman of the Committee, who introduced the resolution, informed Congressman Bloom, who has been leading the fight as a member of the Committee, that he would consent to strike out the preamble to the resolution containing commitment to the thirteen 28-day month year and will shortly offer this in the form of an amendment.

Congressman Bloom stated to the Jewish Daily Bulletin correspondent that he intends proposing an additional amendment, making it obligatory upon American representatives to the proposed international calendar reform conference to oppose any change in the calendar interfering with the sequence of the days of the week.

## ARREST "UNEMPLOYED" JEWS AS MERCHANTS

Riga, Jan. 9.—The Yiddish Communist daily "Eman" of Moscow reports in a dispatch from Odessa that the local OGPU, Soviet political police, arrested a great number of Odessa Jews on the charge that they were merchants, although they had registered as unemployed.

Among those arrested there is a member of the Odessa Soviet, Magidson, who was charged with accepting bribes to register the merchants as unemployed workers.

## SOKOLOW'S SON WAS POLITICAL EXILE UNDER CZARIST REGIME

Warsaw, Jan. 9.—The Polish press eulogized the late Henryk Sokolow, oldest son of Natum Sokolow, Zionist leader. It is now recalled that during the Czarist regime, Henryk Sokolow was arrested by the police on charges of political activity and was imprisoned for six months in the Warsaw fortress. Following his release he emigrated to Germany.

## STUDENTS FEDERATION MUST BE ALL EMBRACING BEFORE IT CAN GET FEDERATION SUPPORT

Nationalists Unwilling to Admit Assimilationists to Body  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Jan. 9.—The gulf between the two sections of the Jewish academic youth in Poland, the nationalists and the so-called assimilationists, came to light when the Jewish Students Association of Warsaw submitted a petition to the Joint-Ica Foundation for support.

A delegation representing the Students Association, now composed of a membership recruited wholly from the nationalist groups, called on Mr. Golde, representing the Joint-Ica Foundation, and asked for an allotment for the cooperative kassa of the Association. The kassa, loan institution, is an important factor in student life in Poland as it enables many of them to continue their studies through granting them loans.

It was reported in the local press that Mr. Golde stated to the delegation that unless the Students Association changes its articles of incorporation, it cannot receive the support of the Joint-Ica Foundation. Under the present articles only those students who declare themselves to be members of the Jewish nationality are admissible. Jewish students who do not adhere to the nationalist doctrine or, as they are known in Poland, "Poles of Mosaic faith," cannot be members of the Association. Mr. Golde is reported to have advised the delegation to change its statutes to read that its members are to be "of the Mosaic faith." The delegation indignantly rejected this suggestion arguing that even the Polish authorities recognize the distinction between the nationalist Jewish students and the "Poles of Mosaic faith."

## DICTATORSHIP RULE IN JUGO-SLAVIA DOES NOT ADVERSELY AFFECT MINORITIES

Official Communistic Allies Fear of Jewish Religious Leaders  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Belgrade, Jan. 9.—What is regarded as a semi-official statement issued today by the government following the decree establishing a dictatorship rule in Jugoslavia, allayed the fears of Jewish and other minority leaders in the country.

The decree ordered the dissolution of all parties and associations of national and religious character. It was feared that the order would also affect the Kehilah associations and perhaps the Zionist organizations in the country. The semi-official statement gives the assurance that the new government decree will not affect the religious and cultural institutions of the national minorities and least of all the Jewish associations, as they have taken no part in the internal party strife in the country.

**OPPOSITION GROUPS  
LEAVE POLISH ZIONIST  
PARTY COUNCIL**  
Conflict Arises After Their Meeting  
Are Defeated

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Jan. 9.—The representatives of the opposition groups, Al Emanuim and the Zionist Revisionists, left the sessions of the Zionist Party Council following a stormy meeting.

The conflict arose after the motions introduced by the opposition groups were defeated by the majority. The defeated motions called for the holding of elections to the all-Polish pro-Zionist conference for the designation of Poland's representatives to the Jewish Agency, the adoption of a statement of principles for the policy of the Club of Jewish Deputies in the Polish Parliament, and third, that the board of elections which is to supervise the election of delegates to the forthcoming Zionist conference be composed of an equal number of representatives of the majority, the Al Emanuim and the Zionist Revisionists. The opposition groups declared that they would have no confidence in the fairness of the election if the board would be in the control of the majority.

**ZIONIST ELECTED PRESIDENT  
OF BERLIN KESHLIT**

Berlin, Jan. 9.—George Karski, a Zionist, was chosen president of the Berlin Keslitz at a meeting of the Keslitz Rab Ropel last night.

Eliezer Karski is a leading merchant and has been affiliated with Jacob Michael Griffoitox, whose phenomenal rise in industrial and commercial enterprises attracted wide attention several years ago.

It is the first time that a Zionist was elected to head the Berlin Keslitz. Gerson Simon, former Keslitz president, and member of the religious Center Party, was chosen vice-president.

**URGES PRESIDENT-ELECT  
HOOVER TO APPOINT JULIUS  
ROSENWALD TO CASINO'S  
"Day"**

Says Rosenwald is of Cabinet  
Tumber, Even If He Were Not a Jew

The appointment of Julius Rosenwald to his cabinet was urged upon President-elect Hoover in an editorial published in the New York "Day," leading Yiddish daily, a Democratic paper.

"It is not yet known upon whom will fall the choice to add Mr. Hoover to bearing the great responsibility for the administration of the country during the next four years. Uninformed readers mention the names of various statesmen concerning whom it is said that they have been almost slated to be members of Hoover's future Cabinet. Among those mentioned, the name of Julius Rosenwald, the great Jewish merchant and philanthropist, comes us most," the paper writes.

Julius Rosenwald would have interested us as a possible Cabinet member even if he were not a Jew. He is undoubtedly of Cabinet timber, of that material from which our most efficient and honest government officials are recruited. His wide experience in financing enterprises and his immense interest in the needs of the masses qualify him for the highest positions in our government.

The fact, however, that Mr. Rosenwald is, in addition, a Jew, we confess, strengthens our interest in his selection as a Cabinet member, for with Mr. Rosenwald in the Cabinet we gain not only as American citizens but also as Jews.

Mr. Rosenwald, the merchant of great scope and the philanthropist of high lumen, is just the type of Jew whom all Jews of America, without regard to party affiliation, would like very much to see in the cabinet. Mr. Rosenwald is just that sort of Jew whom we all love to consider as the symbol of our achievement in America and as the

**SCHEINMANN, CHAIRMAN  
SOVIET STATE BANK, HERE**

Aaron L. Scheinmann, chairman of the board of directors of the State Bank of the Union of Socialist Soviet Republics, arrived in the United States on Wednesday on board the steamer *Minneumia*.

He and Valerian I. Mezhluk, who also arrived on the steamer, are heading a delegation which came to the United States to further several financial projects of the Soviet government, in particular the projected subway and water works for Moscow. The State Bank of the Union of Socialist Soviet Republics is the largest banking institution in Soviet Russia.

**NEW PALESTINE HIGH  
COMMISSIONER VISITS  
JAFFA AND TEL AVIV**

Receives Enthusiastic Welcome in  
Jewish City

Tel Aviv, Jan. 9.—All Tel Aviv turned out to meet Sir John Chancellor on the occasion of his visit here where the streets were decorated with the British and Zionist flags.

Referring to the greeting of M. Dizengoff, newly elected mayor, the new high Commissioner declared that he believes in the free development of the Jewish race in Palestine. The Jews will know how to use the liberty presented to them here by Great Britain. The Jews have achieved striking things in Palestine, but should remember that Palestine can be built only on a sound economic basis. Industry must conquer markets in neighboring countries. This is impossible without reducing its expenditures. The question of Jewish labor in the Haifa harbor construction is being given the best attention, the High Commissioner declared.

Jaffa, Jan. 9.—A reception was given by the municipality yesterday in honor of Sir John Chancellor on the occasion of his visit here. The Arab and Jewish Chambers of Commerce gave a tea in his honor in the afternoon.

The new High Commissioner declared that he is glad to see the operation of both Chambers. The upbuilding of the country will progress only if the Jews and Arabs cooperate. The transfer of the central railway station to Jaffa has not been cancelled but postponed because it involves an expenditure of \$25,000, he stated.

**ASKENAZY EDITOR OF  
STORY BY NAPOLEON**

Warsaw, Jan. 9.—A short story of Napoleon, previously unpublished, entitled "Gislon et Eugene," is among a number of Napoleonic manuscripts which will shortly be published here, largely in facsimile, under the editorship of Professor Simon Askenazy, the famous historian and statesman. The papers were among those which Napoleon took with him to St. Helena.

Count Drubinski, a Pole, who brought them from one of his suite after their return from St. Helena, placed them in his library in the Palace of Konik, in Posen. Because Rosen was at that time German, the Palace was then uninhabited, and the contents of the great library were not accurately investigated. It was finally bequeathed to the Polish nation.

The manuscripts were found shortly before the war by Professor Askenazy, but public affairs prevented him until recently from finding the necessary time to publish them in full.

Emmanuel Aronson died suddenly in New York at the age of 70. In 1886 he established the firm of Aronson Brothers & Co., diamond

Mr. Aronson was an active supporter of many charities, including the Hebrew Orphan Asylum, of which he had been a trustee since 1923.

**RABBI GOLDSTEIN PLEADS WITH HOME MISSION COUNCIL TO CEASE WORK AMONG JEWS**  
 Presents Plan for Cessation of Proselytizing at Annual Meeting  
 (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Atlantic City, Jan. 9.—A plea for cessation of missionary activities among Jews was presented to the annual meeting of the Home Missions Council, a Protestant body comprising representatives of thirty denominational groups, in session here. Dr. Israel Goldstein, Rabbi of Congregation B'nai Jeshua, New York, who was invited to present to the meeting a statement regarding the attitude of Jews toward Christian missionary work among Jews, pleaded for the cessation of proselytizing activities.

"As a member of the National Conference of Jews and Christians, which is interested in continuing relations of mutual good-will and understanding, I can assure you that no single act on the part of our Christian brothers would so surely cement mutual good-will and understanding between them and the Jews of this country, as their decision to stop the proselytizing of the Jew," Dr. Goldstein declared.

"Many Jewish leaders," he continued, "feel appalled to see Christian missionary efforts being directed towards Jews. I do not refer to those instances where Jews happen to be situated among other elements in a neighborhood where the *missionaries*

**FIND ANTI-SEMITISM IN SMOLENSK UNIVERSITY**

Moscow, Jan. 9.—An investigation commission substantiated charges that anti-Semitic practices were prevalent in the experimental school at Smolensk University. Teachers in the school encouraged the pupils in their persecutions of their Jewish fellow students. One Jewish boy was injured, nearly fatally, by a knife stuck in the throat. Recently a group of pupils attacked Jewish pupils and a Jewish teacher in the corridor of the school, compelling them to call a passing soldier to subdue their assailants.

The students and the anti-Semitic teachers insulted the Commissioner of Education, who headed the investigation commission, when he sought to establish the facts.

Reports of anti-Semitism in the factories are again being received. In the Belorushev sugar factory, the Jewish worker Nemirovich, well known in labor circles, was beaten by his fellow workers, who attempted to murder him. Nemirovich narrowly escaped. The assailants were arrested.

Workers in the Odessa chemical factory found guilty of anti-Semitic practices were discharged from the factory and expelled from the chemists' union.

The "Communistskaya Pravda," the Communist youth organ, again published an editorial denouncing anti-Semitism and terming it an enemy to the revolution. The paper calls upon the Communist youth to clean the ranks of the youth organization of anti-Semitic propaganda.

**ROSENWALD GIVES \$175,000 FOR CHILDREN'S NERVOUS DISEASES RESEARCH**  
 \$125,000 to Construct New Unit; \$100,000 to Harvard for Research  
 (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Boston, Jan. 9.—The work of Dr. Breeson Crothers at the Children's Hospital in helping children suffering from disorders of the nervous system has been recognized by the Rosenwald family of Chicago, who have made a gift of \$175,000 to assist Dr. Crothers and his associates in extending their researches. The donation was announced today by Gordon Abbott, vice-chairman of the hospital building fund and Louis E. Krasner, who has been in communication with the Rosenwald family.

The amount of \$75,000 is to provide for the construction of a unit at the Children's Hospital as part of the new building program. The \$100,000 was given by Julius Rosenwald to the Harvard Medical School, to make possible an adequate and trained staff necessary for the experimental work.

Mr. Krasner, who is a member of the executive committee of the building fund committee in making the announcement stated:

"It is an intimation of the national significance of the work of the Children's Hospital and of the interest in the nervous disorders of childhood. The Rosenwald family and the trustees for the fund looked the ground over very carefully. They had experts from other medical centers give opinions on the whole situation. After careful study they decided that the present work which originated at the Children's Hospital many years ago, and the special program of development was of the greatest importance in the field of investigation of childhood diseases."

**PLAN NEW IMMIGRATION BARS IN CANADA**

Ottawa, Jan. 9.—New restrictions on immigration to Canada, limiting the entry of immigrants from Central and Southeast European countries, are planned by Robert Forke, Dominion Minister of Immigration, it was stated here.

It was decided that the Railways Continental Agreement, concluded in 1925 and expiring October 1, 1930 would not be renewed. It was reported that during the last three years the number of non-British immigrants to Canada was greater than those arriving from Great Britain.

**RABBI BERLIN COMING TO U. S. IN MIZRACHEI INTERESTS**

Rabbi Meyer Berlin, leader of the Mizrachi Orthodox World Organization, will arrive in New York on Thursday, January 15 on the Majestic. Rabbi Berlin will spend about two months in the United States and will also visit Canada in the interests of the Kerem Eretz Mizrahi of the Mizrachi. The Executive Committee of the Mizrachi is arranging a reception in his honor for Thursday evening, January 17.

**BUND, JEWISH LABOR PARTY IN POLAND, DECIDES TO REMAIN INDEPENDENT**  
 Finds It Impossible to Affiliate with Polish Socialist Party  
 (Jewish Telegraph Agency)

Warsaw, Jan. 9.—Presented with the question as to what the Bund, the leading Jewish labor party in Poland, is to do in regard to its political and theoretical affiliation, the 95 delegates assembled at the fourth national convention of the party decided to let the status quo prevail.

Three groups within the party advocated three different courses of action. One urged that the Bund join the Second International under certain conditions; the second advocated the joining of the International without any conditions, and the third urged that the Bund remain as it is now, independent of any of the international socialist associations. The last group won when the decision was taken to let the matter rest until the next convention, while the executive committee was instructed to confine its relations with the Left Wing of the Second International.

As to the party's attitude toward the P. P. S., the Polish Socialist party, the convention went on record as finding it impossible to ally itself with the P. P. S. as long as the latter will not change its general policy and in particular its policy toward the national minorities in the country.

Matters of internal Jewish interest were also discussed at the convention. It was reported that the Bund has 378 elected representatives in Kadish boards, and in sick benefit funds, and in city governments. The question as to whether the Bund is to continue to participate in the work of the Kadishim was debated, but it was decided that the matter be further discussed in a debate in the party press.

Reports submitted showed that during the period under review the party membership has doubled, while the circulation of the party organ, the *Paleseitung*, published in Yiddish, has increased four times.

The convention lasted three days and was presided over by Kramer, known in the party under his name de Plume, Arkadi. Messages of greeting were received from the Pacific International Bureau, the party council of the Italian Maccabees, and others. Deputy Medvedowski greeted the conference in the name of the Polish Socialist Party. A new executive committee consisting of 12 members and a party council consisting of 20 members were elected.

**ABRAHAM REISIN ARRIVES IN MOSCOW**

Moscow, Jan. 9.—Abraham Reisin, noted Yiddish novelist of America, arrived in Moscow on a visit here. He was greeted at the station by a large crowd.

work which we would like the American to recognize as our contribution to the Republic.

"It happens too frequently that men of less importance who have a slight connection with Jewish writers but who understand how to ingratiate themselves in the political parties for reasons of an altogether different nature, are placed in our government as Jews who occupy high positions. We are tired of such a method of taking into political consideration the strength of American Jews. We confess we are quite favorable towards such favors. The mere fact that somebody who happens to have been born among Jews was elevated to a high position does not tell us with pride any more. The question which the Jewish community in America asks itself nowadays when a great honor is conferred on one of its members, is, first of all, the following: Does he represent the best and the finest which we possess as a group?

"Julius Rosenwald is just the embodiment of the best and the finest of our group. It is for this reason that it is certain this party which would honor him with a cabinet position would not only serve the best interests of the country, but would also gain the gratitude of the Jewish population in this country," the paper concludes.

## POLISH FOREIGN MINISTER LAUDS JEWISH PATRIOTISM

Lugano, Dec. 20.—The Polish Foreign Minister, M. Zaleski, in a statement which he gave here to the representative of the Anglo-American Newspaper Service spoke highly of the Jews of Poland, calling them a legal element in the country, thus repudiating the accusations made about them in the notorious Foreign Office bulletin which has now been suppressed and disavowed by his ministry.

"The Jews of Poland," M. Zaleski said, "constitute a legal element, and the Government gives them every protection. There are no longer any complaints against Poland made by the Jews. This," he added, "is particularly interesting, because the Jewish minority in Poland is very numerous, and in many towns constitutes as much as 40 per cent of the total population."

## JEWISH LADS BRIGADE WINS SHOOTING CHAMPIONSHIP

London, Dec. 22.—The Jewish Lads Brigade has won the Michelin Cup for shooting in the amateur section of the S. M. S. C. Junior Winter Competition which has just been completed.

There were 25 teams of four boys between 10 and 18 years of age shooting in the major section. The Jewish Lads Brigade showed a very high standard of shooting, winning the cup with a score 10 points higher than the winning figure of 2027.

## ADVISES SCHWARTZBARD NOT TO COME TO U. S.

Schwartzbard's decision to come to the United States is contained in an editorial by Jacob Fishman in the "Jewish Morning Journal."

"The World Federation of Jewish War Institutes," writes Mr. Fishman, "has invited Sholem Schwartzbard to come to the United States in the interest of a fund for Jewish War Institutes. We hope that Mr. Schwartzbard will not hasten to accept this invitation. We say this not because Sholem Schwartzbard would not have been a welcome guest among us under other circumstances. We believe, however, that neither the cause nor the time is appropriate for Schwartzbard's visit."

"The cause has once been tried and suffered failure. We do not care to dwell at length on the question as to whether the failure was justified or whether American Jews are to be blamed for their indifference. The fact of the matter is that American Jews are asked to contribute to voluntary funds so that even the older and more firmly established funds are now suffering from a decline. The failure of Schwartzbard would appear worse than the failure of Dr. Lazarus, the former delegate."

"There are also other reasons. Experience has, to our regret, shown that Jewish popular heroes suffer spiritually and materially upon their arrival in the United States. There is the case of Mendel Weiss and others. We hope that Mr. Schwartzbard will understand that these words come from a friend who speaks out of deep conviction."

## IMMIGRANT AID GROUPS AT ALL BRAZILIAN PORTS

Paris, Dec. 24.—Rabbi Rudofsky, delegate of the Jewish Colonization Association of Israël, and representative of the Hebrew in Brazil, has just made a journey to the North of Brazil, the return dates have announced.

Among other cities, he visited Parámania and Bahia, where communities affiliated to the Hebrew have been constituted. In Parámania, the committee has appointed an officer who will take charge of the work of receiving the immigrants landing at this port. The reception of immigrants is now provided for in all the Brazilian ports where steamers discharge passengers, Parámania, Rio and Santos, arranged under the auspices of the Hebrew.

The Brooklyn Chapter of Hadassah, women's Zionist Organization, will give a tea on January 14, at the Community Hotel.

## RABBI GOLDSTEIN PLEADS WITH HOME MISSION COUNCIL TO CEASE WORK AMONG JEWS

program aims at the neighborhood as a whole, without special appeal to Jews as such, but I do refer to instances where the appeal is directly directed to the Jew as such. There are missionary institutions who are established in neighborhoods which are predominantly Jewish, where there can be no mistake as to who is intended to be reached. There are missionary pamphlets published in English and Hebrew. There are institutions bearing the name of Hebrew Christian missions, whose program is specifically that of seeking the conversion of Jews to Christianity.

"Such activity is being conducted under the auspices of some group which is included in the Home Missions Council.

"The Jewish feeling is especially offended by those Christian missionary activities which bring Jewish children under their influence.

"With reference to the adult, it might at least be offered as an argument that he has the right and the power to choose the religion that he may desire to follow. There can be no justification, however, for victimizing children of Jewish parents, and without the explicit consent of their parents, predisposing them to a religion different from the faith into which they have been born. That such situations do exist is indicated by evidence which must be as well known to many of you as it is to many of us." Dr. Goldstein stated.
