RERLIN CITY FATHERS NOW BEG EINSTEIN TO ACCEPT THEIR GIFT Mayor and Member of Anti-Semitic

Deutschnationale Party to Intervene Personally with Scientist

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Berlin, May 16-The Berlin city gov-

ernment, embarrassed over Prof. Einstein's decision not to accept the much talked of and long delayed gift on the occasion of his fiftieth birthday, has now decided to resort to personal intervention with the famous scientist in an attempt to persuade him to withdraw his rejection of the gift.

The city government asked Mayor Boess and Councillor Zangenmeister, a member of the anti-Semitic Deutschnationale party, to call on Prof. Einstein and to ask him to accept the gift offered.

The inclusion of Councillor Zangenmeister in the deputation is of special interest since his party was the one which opposed the grant and whose CANADIAN PARLIAMENT TO bickerings most likely determined Prof. Einstein's action.

DEFEAT BILL TO SEIZE

JEWISH PROPERTY (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, May 16-A bill to confiscate the property of East European Jews domiciled in Germany was brought to a vote in the Reichstag today and was defeated by an overwhelming majority. The bill was sponsored by the anti-Semitic National Socialist Party and called for the confiscation of the properties of "bank magnates, stock exchange members and Eastern Jews." The vote against the bill was 382 to 8.

GERMAN JEWS PLAN TO MARK 200th BIRTH ANNIVERSARY OF MOSES MENDELSOHN Extensive Plans for Celebration Sep-

tember 6 Under Way (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, May 16-Extensive plans are now under preparation for the celebration by German Jews of the 200th an-niversary of the birth of Moses Mendelsohn on September 6, 1929.

The Berlin Jewish community will arrange for services in all synagogues on that day, public demonstrations and the exemption of Jewish children from

A gala presentation of Ephraim Lessing's "Nathan the Wise" will be given at the State Theatre. A pilgrimage to the grave of the famous philosopher will be made and the grave decorated. An exhibition of Mendelsohnalia in-

cluding prints, facsimiles and pictures will be arranged at the Prussian State Library. The Jewish community of Berlin is cooperating with the Prussian State Library in arranging this exhibition.

TAKE UP IMMIGRATION (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

Montreal, May 16-The estimates of the Immigration Department of the Canadian Government will shortly be discussed in Parliament at Ottawa and a recurrence of the prolonged discussion of last session is in view.

While the discussions of last session did not touch openly on Jewish immigration in particular, it is felt that the results of this parliamentary debate will have some bearing on the future status of Jewish immigration into the country. The feeling in some circles is that the proportion of continental to British immigration is too high. The immigration statistics show, however, a slight increase in the proportion of British to continental immigration. This is not regarded as sufficiently satisfactory and that aspect of the problem is to be given special prominence in the forthcoming discussion.

IN ODESSA DISTRICT (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, May 16-Three new Jewish collectives were created in the Odessa district. One hundred and two Jewish families, settled on 1,500 hectares of land, comprise the three collectives.

FORM AMERICAN COMMITTEE TO AID SCIENCE DEPARTMENT OF THE HEBREW UNIVERSITY 43 Americans Join Body; Will Provide Annual Budget of \$25,000; F. Julius

Fohs Is Chairman The formation of a American Committee on Science and Technicology for the Hebrew University in Jeru-salem and the launching of a campaign for \$25,000 to cover the budget the scientific department of the Hebrew University were announced by F. Julius Fohs, oil geologist, who has accepted the chairmanship of the commiltee

Forty-three scientists and technical research workers of repute comprise the executive committee which will act in an advisory capacity to the Science Department of the Hebrew Univer-

The committee, in addition to as-suming responsibility for the annual budget of the Scientific Department of the University, will undertake to sup-ply the equipment for the Physics Laboratory now being built and for the departments of Geology, Botany and Zoology. It is also making arrangements for the establishment of a meteorological station to be attached to the Department of Mathematics, to coordinate meteorological data.

The committee will endeavor to obtain endowments and the establishment of special institutes in the Scientific Department and the acquisition of a comprehensive scientific library

In a statement issued by Mr. Fohs, he declared: "We contemplate disseminating information concerning the scientific and technical departments of the Hebrew University in all quarters where Jewish men of science and engineering are to be found, in cooperation with the American Advisory Committee of which Felix M. Warburg is chairman.

The Scientile and Technical Department of the University should be of great service to the development of Palestine industry, Mr. Fohs stated. In America, industries are increasingly showing an interest in research and major industries have equipped laboratories in which skilled workers are delving for new discoveries to lighten the burdens of mankind and to economize production and distribution.

"Palestine industry, which is still in its formative stage, is unable to un-dertake of itself, this extensive and expensive operation. It therefore naturally falls to the lot of the University to provide a laboratory for the re-search worker in the scientific departments with an eye to specific Pales-tinian needs," Mr. Fohs stated

Mr. Fohs, who made an investigation of the natural resources of Palestine in 1919-1920, is a member of the Geological Society of America, the

CHARGE ANTI-SEMITISM IN RESIGNATIONS OF FOUR U. S ASSISTANT DIST. ATTORNEYS Assemblyman Wires President Hoover

Asking Investigation

The charge that anti-Semitism was a motive in the acceptance of the resignations of four assistant United States Attorneys in Brooklyn attached previously to the office of William A. De Groot, removed by President Hoover at the request of the Department of Justice, was denied by United States District Attorney Howard W. Ameli of Brooklyn, appointed to succeed Mr. De

Murry Boxer, Morris Scheinick, Julius Braunschweig and Arthur A. Kestler are the United States Assistant District Attorneys whose resignations were accepted by the new incumbent. Mr. Ameli stated that he would have no further announcement to make within the next few days. Mr. Boxer. after his resignation was accepted declared that the only reason for his work on Saturdays or Jewish holidays. The United States District Attorney replied that the question of office efficiency alone had guided him in accepting the resignations.

Assemblyman Julius S. Berg of the Third Assembly District, Bronx, Com-mander of the Jewish War Veterans of the United States, made public yesterday to the press the text of a tele-gram he addressed to President Hoover asking that an investigation be ordered into the matter. Assemblyman Berg stated in his telegram that he did not know whether religious bias played any part in the acceptance of the resignations and added that his organization would be just as zealous in finding out the Yew who would make a false accusation to arouse Jewish sympathy as it would be in acting to protect Jewish interests.

UNITED SYNAGOGUE OPENS CONVENTION SUNDAY

The convention of the United Synagogue of America begins this Sunday. the 19th, at the Hotel Astor in New York City and will be continued through Monday and Tuesday.

The convention marks the end of the 16th year of existence of the United Synagogue. It was organized as a result or a study made by the late Dr. Solomon Schechter. Begun with a mere handful of synagogues, the institution has grown to include over 700 synagogues, sisterhoods, men's clubs and young people's groups in the United States and Canada.

The convention will be opened by Mr. S. Herbert Golden, President, on Sun-day morning at 10:30, and will be followed by an opening prayer by Rabbi Jeremiah J. Berman of Rochester. Mr. Golden will report on the year's activi-ties, and will be followed by a report by Rabbi Samuel M. Cohen, executive director, and other leaders in the United Synagogue.

Coincident with the convention will be held the convention of the Women's League. The Women's League session on Sunday will be held jointly with the men's group. Beginning with Monday morning, the sessions of the women will be held separately and will continue to noon on Tuesday when the New York Branch of the Women's League will give a luncheon in honor of the delegates from various sister-hoods. The luncheon will be followed by a sight-seeing tour through New York.

BROOKLYNITE, NON-JEW, OFFERS \$200,000 TO FOUND JEWISH UNIVERSITY IN N.Y. Meeting Called by Murry Boxer, Dis-

cusses Plan; Committee Named to Obtain Written Pledge from Donor Leading Jewish organizations in New York City learned yesterday with sur-

York City learned vesterday with surprise of a meeting held Wednesday might at the Aster Hotel, where plans for the establishment in New York of a Jewish university of a non-sectarian character were discussed and the satement made that a Brooklynite who wished to remain anonymous is ready to subscribe the amount of \$200,000 toward the project, provided an additional sum of \$300,000 is raised by subscription. The \$500,000 are needed in order to comply with the New York State law which provides that a charter for a university may be issued if this amount is at hand.

Inquiries made by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency as to the identity of the anonymous donor brought forth the reply that he was a Catholic, a resident of Brooklyn.

Murry Boxer, former Assistant United States Attorney, over whose reent resignation from office a controversy is raging as to whether it was caused by anti-Semitism or not, was the convener of the meeting. Mr. Boxer, in an interview with the representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency at his office, 303 Broadway, declared that it was he who persuaded the anonymous Catholic donor to pledge the amount of \$200,000 toward the project.

Mr. Boxer admitted that he has not consulted any of the prominent Jewish leaders or any of the leading Jewish organizations, as he felt, he stated, 'they will oppose the project just as they have been in opposition to other vital Jewish projects and movements, including the Zionist movement." The project of a non-sectarian university under Jewish auspices is not motivated by opposition to other universities, Mr.

Choulguine Formulates New Philosophy for Russian Anti-Semites Special Correspondence

Paris, May 4—Like revolutions and revolutionists, emigrants of all times and of all countries present certain common traits of psychology. Exile does not attenuate their grudges of party and does not at all change their political ideology.

A Russian Jew, a well-known journalist, Poliakoff Litovtzeff, recently addressed in good faith the following appeal to the anti-Semites: What is it that you dislike in us? The time has perhaps arrived to submit this question to a public debate. Russians are no less interested in it than are the Jews."

The head of the Russian nationalists, V. Choulguine, took it upon himself to reply by a book which appeared last month, "The Philosophy of Anti-

Semitism."

Mr. Choulguine finds an ever-grow-

ing recrudescence of anti-Semitism in Soviet Russia. "The time no longer exists when one could say and believe that it was an artificial movement, created by the Czarist rulers, fostered by mercenary publicists and maniacs, obsessed by a fixed idea. Anti-Semitism exists and its scope is broadening in all circles and in all the Russian parties; among the intellectuals as a manifectual to the working the working the continuity of the community, to less than among the "Whites." What is the cause of this movement and of its progress?

Before answering this question, V. Choulguine believes it incumbent upon him to discern three different aspects of anti-Semitism; the one, purely instinctive, racial anti-Semitism; the other, political; finally, a third one, mystic. Referring to those papers which attacked the ideals of the Italo-Vatican agreement as being anti-Papal, Mussolini declared that he disliked men who feared non-existent dangers.

mounts all obstacles, triumphs over all legal restrictions. "The Jews love one another." That says everything, accounts for everything. According to the Polish saying: when a Jew sneezes in Warsaw, all those from Cracow reply: "God bless you!"

In order to understand their cohesion, their mutual good-will, their power, there is no need to imagine any Protocols, nor any Elders of Zion. There is no conspiracy for the con-quest of the world, no password, but an irresistible instinct that links the sentiments, harmonizes the intentions and concentrates the efforts, without the aid of any guide, without the com-mand of any chief, towards an identical end, not expressed, perhaps un-known and nevertheless certain. Because there are two kinds of solidarity: the one spontaneous, unconscious; such as the mind of the bee-hive, which animates the bees and the Jews. other is obtained by the action and the will of the master, by the application of the yoke and the sting of the goad, as among the oxen . . . and the Russians. Let them make not the moon, but the sun of truth: give us a Jewish government, wise, clement, which will lead us to the good. Let the chosen people deserve being so, and from this day on irrational anti-Semitism will disappear and, with it, political anti-Semitism. Mr. Choulguine is convinced that a cruel and ferocious struggle will break out in Russia. He is ill at ease and disturbed about it and would like "to limit this struggle within certain quar-ters." In this Judeo-Russian war, "it would be necessary, as in all other wars, to distinguish and designate the forbidden blows, and already to catch a glimpse of and prepare the conditions of peace. In order to effect the mitigation of this brutal struggle, a double obligation imposes itself; that the Jews should refuse to produce social revolutions in Russia; that the Russians should refuse to commit pogroms. To which the Jews reply that they are not the authors of the revolution; that it has been brought about by the Russian people. But in this case, the Russians can also reply that they are innocent of the pogroms; that the Jews have been massacred by individuals with whom the Russian nation has nothing
