COMMUNIST ORGAN CHARGES RUSSIAN ZIONISTS WITH ESPIONAGE FOR BRITAIN

Accusation Follows Protests Against Soviet Persecutions
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, July 19—The accusation that Russian Zionists are guilty of carrying on espionage in the Soviet Union in favor of Great Britain, was hurled by the Moscow Yiddish Communist daily, "Emes," with the apparent purpose of counteracting the recent sharp protests voiced by Zionist bodies in the United States and in various European countries against the persecution and exile of a number of Russian Zionists.

In a lengthy article which appeared today in the organ of the Jewish section of the Communist party, the charge is made in general, derogatory terms. No facts or evidence are cited in corroboration. The paper states that "the Zionist Organization has established an excellent police and spy apparatus in Palestine, led by Britain. The Zionists have likewise carried their espionage system into Russia, where a number of Zionists have succeeded in finding employment in different Soviet institutions, and often even in the institutions of the Communist party, loyally serving their British masters, with information."

"The Zionist campaign against Soviet Russia has always been consonant with the British anti-Soviet aggressive plans. The Zionist organizations are practically branches of the British Foreign Office for espionage and diplomatic swindle," the "Emes" asserts.

The Communist daily further expresses its view that "the Zionist movement serves in Palestine as a surrogate for the British occupation policy, helping the British to maintain control over the Arab population and giving England the opportunity to decrease its military forces in Palestine. The British maintain in Palestine, 800 soldiers, while France, not having Zionists, must maintain in Syria, an occupation army of 150,000 soldiers."

MEMEL FINDS BLOOD LIBEL GROUNDFLESS

Kovno, July 19—The non-Jewish population of Memel, which was greatly agitated during the Passover week by a rumor that ritual murder was the cause of the death of a Christian servant girl, employed in a Jewish household, has today learned officially that their was no ground for such accusation.

The city directorate issued an official statement declaring that it established beyond doubt that the servant girl, Miss Jakumait, died as the result of gas poisoning.

PARIS JEWISH COMMITTEE PROTESTS TO ROUMANIA ON NEW RELIGIOUS LAW

Expresses Surprise at Non-Consultation of Jewish Leaders on Bill Affecting Jewish Communal Unity
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Paris, July 19—A protest against the action of the Maniu government, in forcing through legislation, despite the protest of Jewish leaders in Roumania, affecting the unity of Jewish communal life in that country, was submitted to the Roumanian Minister in Paris, Diamandy, by the Committee of Jewish Delegations.

The declaration expresses surprise at the fact that the Maniu government has ignored its promises, given to the Jewish population of Roumania during the recent elections and has sponsored a bill for the regulation of Jewish communal life, without consulting the leaders of the Jewish population. The bill threatens the unity of Roumanian Jewry, and has evoked their unanimous opposition. The government has rejected the proposals to convoke a special Jewish conference on the subject. Other governments, such as the German, Polish, Latvian, Estonian and Bulgarian, have adopted the principle of a united Jewish community, which resulted to the benefit of all concerned, the memorandum points out, expressing the hope that the government will reconsider its decision.

STUDENTS IN PROTEST AGAINST NUMERUS CLAUSUS PROPAGANDA IN GERMANY

No Einstein or Ehrlich if Discrimination Practiced 40 Years Ago

Munich, July 19—Had there been a numerus clausus forty years ago, the principle of discriminating against Jews, we would not have today an Einstein or an Ehrlich, declared Bruno Frank, the German poet, in an address he delivered at a mass meeting called here to protest against the recent numerus clausus propaganda inaugurated by the Hitlerite students.

The meeting was called by the socialist student group of the Munich University.

LEMBERG POLICE HEAD GETS AWARD FOR HALTING RIOTS

Lemberg, July 19—The Lemberg police commissioner, who took energetic steps to disperse the student mob which threatened further violence during the anti-Jewish riots, June 2, following the spread of a rumor of Jewish profanation of the Corpus Christi procession, was given an award of 500 Zlotys by the government.

ZIONIST LABOR PARTY, POALE ZION, OPENS INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION IN BERLIN

Delegations from Europe, Palestine and United States Attend
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, July 19—The eighth international conference of the Poale Zion, Zionist Labor Party, was opened here today in the presence of representatives of Jewish labor groups in European countries, as well as Palestine and the United States.

S. Kaplansky, Palestine labor leader, reviewed the progress of the movement, which was started 25 years ago, coinciding with the second wave of Jewish immigration to Palestine. He pointed to the fact that in the recent Zionist Congress elections the party polled a total of 30,000 votes. The party succeeded in securing the interest and cooperation of non-Jewish labor leaders and groups, referring in particular to the establishment of the pro-Palestine committee by leaders of the Second International. Unemployment in Palestine has been liquidated and the country is now on the threshold of a new Jewish immigration. The coming into power of the MacDonald government in England creates favorable conditions for the Zionist labor movement, he said.

The speaker devoted some time to a description of the situation of the Zionists in Russia and, protesting against the persecution of Zionism by the Soviet government, declared that "all hearts in Europe sympathize with the sufferings of our heroes and martyrs, the Zionist-Socialists in the Soviet Union."

The conference will have to consider the present situation of the labor movement in Palestine, conditions in World Zionism, and formulate its attitude toward the extended Jewish Agency. It will also have to consider the problem emanating from the recent amalgamation of the Poale Zion party with the Hitachduth Party in Palestine.

Mr. Segal of New York reported on the progress of the Poale Zion movement. (Continued on Page 4)

HEBREW WRITER
COMMITTS SUICIDE

Vilna, July 6.—A. L. Bisskow, Hebrew writer, and poet, was found dead in his room at the Hotel Riess, in the town of Dalhinow, near here. He was found hanging in the bathroom.

The poet came to the town to deliver a lecture but was prevented from so doing because of difficulties raised by the police authorities. He then announced that he would speak at the local Beth Hamedrash, but only a small audience came to hear him. Broken in health, and without means, the disappointed, aged poet, ended his life.

Bisskow was born in 1859 in St. Petersburg Russia, the son of a soldier under Nicholas I. He was one of the pioneers in the Haskalah movement in Russia and was the author of several books in Hebrew and in Yiddish. He lived, for some time, in London, where he published an Hebrew-Yiddish dictionary. Of special interest was his book on the fundamentals of Jewish music, published in London in 1924. In this book he advocated the adoption of an original Hebrew terminology in music.

TO FURLOUGH JEWISH SOL-
DIERS ON HIGH HOLYDAYS

Washington, D. C., July 19.—Instructions have been issued by Secretary Good to all commanding officers to grant furloughs to soldiers of the Jewish faith for the High Holidays.

Rosh Hashonah begins at sundown, Friday, October 4, and continues until sundown, Sunday, October 6, and the observance of the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur) begins at sundown, Sunday, October 13, and continues until sundown, Monday, October 14. The furloughs are to be for such time as is necessary to permit the men to be at their homes or at places where the observances are held.

Sephardic Jews Demand Representation
on Jewish Agency

Belgrade, July 7.—Dr. S. J. Alkalay, president of the Sephardic Community of Belgrade, urged, in an interview with the Jewish Telegraphic Agency representative here, that the Sephardic Jews should be given greater consideration in the matter of their participation in the Jewish Agency.

"We Sephardim," Dr. Alkalay said, "number one and a half million souls and represent a considerable part of the Jewish people. I cannot understand the prejudice which appears to exist in the Zionist Organization against the Sephardim. Sephardic Jewry is taking an ever-increasing interest in the upbuilding work in Palestine. Yet they are being practically ignored by the Zionist Organization. This is the more remarkable, since the Sephardim are best suited for the colonization work in Palestine. They are accustomed to hard work, and their needs are few. Coming as they do from Arabic centers, they are also better able to live together with the Arabs than are the Ashkenazim."

"The Zionists appear to regard the Sephardic as an inferior element," Dr. Alkalay continued. "Although an agreement was concluded more than a year ago between the World Union of Sephardic Jews and the Zionist Executive under which the Executive undertook to take consideration of the Sephardic elements in colonization, immigration and the distribution of positions, nothing has, nevertheless, been done. I know that we shall be told that owing to the financial difficulties it has been impossible to do anything on behalf of the Sephardim. I should accept this explanation had nothing been done during the same period for the Ashkenazim. The government has now been granted new certificates for immigration, but I am certain that this time, too, no Sephardim will be brought in, although it is cheaper to settle two Sephardim than one Ashkenaz. If it is wished to colonize Palestine more rapidly and to achieve a Jewish majority there, there is no more effective method than the settlement of Sephardim."

"We hope the Jewish Agency will bring about a change in the situation. The report of the experts showed that they understand what is necessary to insure the sound and reasonable development of the upbuilding work. We are, therefore, anxious to be adequately represented in the Jewish Agency, so that we should be able to give proper attention to the interests of the Sephardim, which are identical with the best interests of Palestine," Dr. Alkalay stated.

ISAAC W. FRANK GIVES
\$50,000 TO PITTSBURGH "Y"

Pittsburgh, July 19.—The first major donation to the Pittsburgh "Y" since the dedication of its new headquarters on Bellefield Avenue three years ago, was made public here this week with the announcement that Isaac W. Frank, philanthropist and executive, had made a gift of \$50,000 to the Young Men's and Women's Hebrew Association. Although the local "Y" has been the recipient of donations of a minor nature from time to time, Mr. Frank's contribution is the largest ever received. The money received from this gift will be used to reduce the indebtedness of the association and to increase the scope of its activities.

A member of the Central board of directors of the Y. M. and W. H. A., Mr. Frank has been interested in the Jewish Community Center movement for many years, and is one of the institution's most devoted supporters. He was a member of the original campaign and building committees for the erection of the present structure.

He is a member of the board of trustees of the Montefiore Hospital, the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies, Pittsburgh Association for the Improvement of the Poor, the Rodef Shalom Temple, and numerous other civic, social and educational organizations.

DR. MARGOSHES SAILS TO
ATTEND ZIONIST CONGRESS

Dr. S. Margoshes, editor of the New York "Day," sailed Friday night on the "Olympic" for Europe to attend the Zionist Congress and the Jewish Agency conference in Zurich.

Before his departure, a luncheon in his honor was given by the editorial staff of the "Day" at the Commodore Hotel.

Dr. Margoshes, who was recently elected a member of the Administrative Committee of the Zionist Organization of America, will visit Palestine following the close of the Zurich sessions.

Ephraim Kaplan, a member of the editorial staff of the "Jewish Morning Journal," sailed on the same steamer to attend the Zionist Congress.

Dr. David Yellin, head of the Hebrew Teachers College of Jerusalem, sailed on the "Berengaria," following a visit of several months in the United States and Canada in the interests of his institution. He will attend the Zionist Congress.

The condition of William Fox, motion picture producer, who was injured in an automobile accident on Wednesday, is favorable. Physicians at the Nassau Hospital, where he is a patient, expressed the belief that he would be able to return to his country home, Foxcroft in Woodmere, L. I., in a comparatively short time.

Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein of the Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun, was one of the representatives of the three religious faiths, apostate to the United States District Attorney by the New York "Evening World" to call the victims of the Clarke Brothers Bank collapse.

MELCHETT, SAMUEL AND WISE EULOGIZE HERZL AT MEMORIAL MEETING

London Meeting Largest Since Issuance of Balfour Declaration

London, July 19—A large crowd, the biggest in number since the enthusiastic Zionist meetings held in the British capital following the issuance of the Balfour Declaration, attended the memorial meeting held here last night to mark the twenty-fifth anniversary of the death of Dr. Theodor Herzl, founder of political Zionism and of the Zionist World Organization. Lord Melchett, Sir Herbert Samuel, Dr. Stephen S. Wise and Nahum Sokolow paid tribute to the memory of the late Zionist leader, who was described by Dr. Wise as a "modern Messiah." Messages were read from Dr. Chaim Weizmann, who expressed his regret at his inability to be present to join in the homage "to Herzl's immortal memory," and from Nathan Straus.

Lord Melchett, who presided at the memorial meeting, paid tribute to Dr. Herzl's statesmanship and leadership. "How close is the wording of the Mandate to the program outlined at the Basle Congress!" he pointed out. "It is a sad reflection that Herzl died at the premature age of forty-four."

A tremendous ovation was accorded Sir Herbert Samuel, former High Commissioner of Palestine, when he rose to speak. "There is nothing in modern history, Sir Herbert declared, that is more enthralling, more moving, more inspiring, than Herzl's life and the course of Palestine events in the past few years which represent the triumph of a great idea." He lauded Herzl's vigor and sound instinct which enabled him to foresee developments. He pointed out, as a matter of interest, that Herzl's scheme for Palestine rehabilitation was first published in London. What would Herzl have said, twenty-five years ago, if he could have foreseen that within a generation, Palestine would be secured to the Jews by public law, and the foundation laid for an all-Jewish city, great industries created, the Jordan harnessed, twelve million pounds invested in the country, and the Hebrew language and culture revived? Would that Herzl had lived to witness the magic realization of these dreams," he declared.

Samuel Calls Upon All to Aid Agency

What has already developed in Palestine, Sir Herbert stated, is only a beginning, with the future requiring tremendous efforts and sacrifice. Financial contributions, he said, are the most facile of the gifts to Palestine, compared with the peril faced by fellow Jews against armed attacks in the earlier days of the Palestine rehabilitation efforts. It was fitting, he stated, on this occasion to recall the memory of Joseph Trumpeldor and his companions. He lauded the devotion, idealism and the sacrifices of the Jewish laborers, farmers and factory workers who are the roots of the tree from which the blossom of the revived civilization in Palestine has sprung.

Sir Herbert touched upon the Seventh Dominion idea, calling upon the adherents of this plan to work hand in hand with those who are forming the Jewish Agency. Without arguing the merit or demerit of the Seventh Dominion idea, which, he said, for Jewish, British and international reasons has its opponents, "those who do agree to this idea can still agree with the rest of us in creating a strong Jewish Agency."

He described Dr. Weizmann's invitation to all parties in Jewish life to join the Jewish Agency for Palestine work as a far-sighted and self-sacrificing renunciation, since it meant the voluntary renunciation of one-half of the seats on the Agency to representatives of a majority which has done little for the Palestine cause.

Herzl One of the Few Epochal Men, Wise Says

Theodor Herzl was hailed by Dr. Stephen Wise as "a modern Messiah, who achieved the most wondrous miracle of helping Israel to work out its own salvation."

"Theodor Herzl was one of the few men truly epochal," he declared. "He was epochal because he had dared to bid the Jew to be what, for nearly two millennia he had not dared to be—to be himself—a Jew. And as a result, his entire life was given to this cause and he succeeded, though he never lived to see the rebuilding of the national home in Palestine."

"Before Herzl came, the Jews had been so hurt by the world's ill will that many had denied their own Semitism. Such a denial is infinitely more provocative than a courageous admission. But since Herzl's day, there are fewer Jews concealing their Semitism. I was the last comrade that Herzl talked with. He was a worn and spent man. I asked him whether we could not free him from the necessity of pot boiling for his Vienna newspaper so that he might devote himself altogether to the Zionist cause."

"I dare not," he answered, "lest it be said that I live on Zionism rather than for it. Yet I should be in London, for it is from England that the salvation of the Jewish people will come."

"Herzl was the most vital figure in Jewish history for centuries and his banner must be borne aloft by all of the people of Israel, no matter what their differences," Dr. Wise said.

Dr. Wise recalled that together with Justice Louis D. Brandeis, he received the Balfour Declaration from President Wilson, on the eve of its issuance. "Then I rejoiced, even as I now rejoice that the British Government would not affix its signature to a scrap of paper." Nevertheless, he continued, he believes that despite faith in England, it needs vigilant safeguarding. Jewish interest in Palestine, he said, is vis a vis, with that of the Mandatory.

Nahum Sokolow, head of the World Zionist Executive, delivering an intimate address on Herzl, declared: "Herzl was not a religious man. He did not know the Talmud—he was re-

BIRA BIDJAN SOON TO BE DECLARED JEWISH REPUBLIC. SOVIET VICE-PRESIDENT SAYS

Y.S.S.R. to Be Official Name of Far Eastern Republic

Moscow, July 19—The initials, Y.S.S.R., meaning the Yiddish Socialist Soviet Republic, describing the territory of Bira Bidjan, will soon become a part of the official vocabulary in the Soviet Union.

Peter Smidovitch, vice-president of Soviet Russia, speaking Thursday, at an open air meeting here, devoted to a discussion of the Jewish colonization movement, made the announcement of the Soviet Government's intention to proceed with the colonization by Jews of the territory of Bira Bidjan, Siberia, the territory, slated several years ago for a Jewish colonization project, sponsored by the Ozen society for settling Jews on the land. Several hundred Jewish pioneers were assisted to proceed there and to settle on the land. Some of these pioneers have, however, returned, finding the land unfitted for cultivation. Mr. Smidovitch stated that the official name of the region will soon be changed, and that instead of Bira Bidjan it is to be known as the Y.S.S.R.

"So far, there is not such a republic. The Soviet Union, however, will create a Jewish republic in Bira Bidjan and grant it full membership in the Union on lines similar to those of the other national republics," Mr. Smidovitch stated, adding that the territory of Bidjan is greater than the area occupied by France, and has a good industrial future.

The expedition of American investigators, sent by the American Jewish organization, Icor, to survey the region, left Moscow today for Bidjan. Before its departure, the delegation, headed by Dr. Franklin Harris, visited the Jewish colonies in Crimea.

Two Jewish regions, administrative units comprising Jewish settlements in the Ukraine, will be formed officially during October. The Krivoy Rog regional Soviet yesterday adopted a resolution to proclaim the third Jewish region in that district on October 3rd. The Comzet, governmental department for settling Jews on the land, has allotted 25,000 roubles for the construction of administrative offices in the district, which will embrace all Jewish colonies founded by the Agro-Joint and the Jewish Colonization Association, near Krivoy Rog.

The new Zlatopol Jewish region will be opened officially on October 1 instead of at the end of August as originally scheduled because the government buildings, now under construction, have not been completed.

Eddie Cantor, recently elected president of the National Variety Artists, has consented to serve as an arbitrator for the American Arbitration Association. Not only will he be qualified to serve in commercial disputes, but he will also be called upon to arbitrate differences between actors and theatrical managers brought before the association. Mr. Cantor will be chairman of the arbitral boards of the theatrical and national panels.

ligion and a living chapter of the Talmud. He always dreamed of going to America for he felt the great possibilities of Jewish salvation there. But he never had the opportunity."

Nathan Straus in his message extended greetings, "on this solemn occasion in memory of the great modern prophet in Israel who saw clearly the vital need of Israel's regeneration in the land of Israel's rehabilitation. Herzl had the genius, the courage and the inspiration to see the problem and to open the eyes of the Jewish people to the solution of the problem, a solution for which Jews have prayed for centuries. Herzl's vision is being gloriously vindicated now that Palestine is being rebuilt by our own people with Great Britain as the Mandatory Power, and practically the whole of Jewry united in the formation of the Jewish Agency. He declared he was happy that Rabbi Wise was present to address the conference, who, he stated, expresses also his views and sentiments for unity, harmony, and peace in Israel, as well as among other nations.

ment in the United States. The movement, he said, is responsible for the creation and maintenance of 200 Yiddish schools and of a Jewish Teachers Seminary. It was on its initiative that the Gewerkschaften campaign for Palestine was inaugurated and carried through.

Morris Gest, theatrical producer, was a passenger on the train which plucked off the bridge at Arroyo, near Stratton, Cal., on the main line of the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad, taking a toll of nine lives.

The heroism of Mr. Gest and his assistant secretary, Abie, in aiding in the rescue work was lauded by the survivors.

The late Jules E. Mastbaum of Philadelphia, who prior to his death was the president of the Stanley Company of America, left an estate of \$5,565,073.84, exclusive of large realty holdings. In addition, the estate includes \$2,007,000 in life insurance.

prising the German National Party, headed by the big industrialist and newspaper magnate, Herr Hugenberg, the National Socialist Party, led by Adolf Hitler, and the Steel Helmet Brigade.

A meeting of the committee of the new organization was held today, at which, it is stated, the discussion turned on how to bring about a change in the present Constitution of Germany. Speeches urging the unity of all the Nationalist forces were delivered by Commandant Seldte, the leader of the Steel Helmet Brigade, Field-Marshal von der Goltz, Adolf Hitler, Herr Hugenberg, and Herr Thyssen, the great coal magnate.

When Hugenberg, some months ago, assumed the leadership of the German Nationalist Party, the Democratic organizations expressed the fear that the addition of a new strong and reactionary personality with a wide range of economic power would lead to the fusion into one big body of all the reactionary parties in the country. He is looked to as aiming to overthrow the present Democratic regime in Germany and replace it by a dictatorial government based on Fascist lines. Herr Hugenberg is an avowed monarchist and anti-parliamentarian. From the time he accepted the leadership of the German Nationalist Party, he has been working for a close collaboration with the Steel Helmet Brigade and the Hitlerite Party, both organized on semi-military lines.

To Vacate Premises for Violation of Sabbath

Tel. Aviv, July 10.—The Magistrate's Court here has ordered the keeper of a soda-water stand in the Rosenfeld Quarter to vacate his premises, for having kept his place open on the Sabbath.

He had violated the terms of his lease, by which he was obliged to keep his premises closed on Saturdays.

Free Admission of Palestinians to Transjordan

Jerusalem, July 8.—According to the Passport Ordinance recently published at Amman, permanent Palestine residents are permitted to enter Transjordan free, if they come directly from Palestine. Foreigners are admitted to the country only if they are in possession of a British visa. Those who enter the country without a visa are liable to L. P. 100 fine or one year's imprisonment and deportation.
