DAY OF PALESTINE WARFARE FINDS JEWRY IN GRAVE FOURTH DANGER THROUGHOUT COUNTRY

Number of Jewish Dead Mounts to 150 as Jerusalem, Haifa, Tel Aviv and Colonies in Judea and Galilee Are Again Attacked on Monday; Moslem Arabs Commit Unspeakable Cruelties on Women and Children; Country Aflame with Danger; British Rush Troops and Ships; Many Killed in Tel Aviv Clash, 200 Americans in That City (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Aug. 26 (Monday afternoon)-Although British troops and marines have been landed in Palestine and the armed forces of the Mandatory Power have attempted to cope with the situation, the attacks of the Moslem Arabs against the Jewish population of Palestine have assumed the character of a relentless racial war. The number of the dead and injured is mounting hourly. Over 100 Jews have been killed in the attack and in their attempts at defense. The number of the Arab dead could not be ascertained, as the Moslem Arabs, following their custom, clear away the fallen. It is assumed, however, that the dead among the Arabs is at least equal to those of the Jews.

Monday, the fourth day of the Arab-Jewish conflict, witnessed new atacks in the city of Jerusalem, where the British military reinforcements were rushed in largest numbers, and in other Palestine centers with a considerable Jewish population and in the agricultural settlements of the Palestine Jewish pioneers.

The rumor spreading in New York that Dr. Judah Leib Magnes, formerly Rabbi of Temple Emanu-El, New York, and at present Chancellor of the Hebrew University, was killed, is untrue. Dr. Magnes is at present in Switzerland, where he went to attend a meeting of the Board of Governors of the Hebrew University, held in the middle of August.

Monday's Events in Jerusalem Monday morning three more Jews

were added to the growing list of the injured when Arabs exploded a bomb in the Old City.

The dispensary of the Hadassah Hospital at Hebron, maintained by the American Women's Zionist Organization, was burned.

The Jewish quarter Nachlath Zion, near Jerusalem, is being attacked by the Moslem Arabs as this despatch is being written. Armored cars have been rushed to the spot.

The city is full of refugees from the suburbs and the colonies which have been the victims of attacks during the past three days. There is a scarcity of medical supplies and of food. The Jerusalem Jewish Communal Board has started a fund to maintain the refugees.

Looting was going on by the Arabs. The houses of Dr. A. Levin-Epstein, an American, and Mr. Gordon, direc-tor of the Anglo-Palestine Bank here, were totally ransacked during the at-tack on the suburb Talpioth.

Twenty-five Jewish workers in the Novomejski Dead Sea project were brought safely to Palestine under a military convoy. Four Jewish workers throughout the country employed in the construction of the (Continued on P.

Unspeakable Cruelties Committed by Moslem Arabs

A group of American Jews, residents and visitors here, took refuge in the house of the American Consulate and in the building of the French Catholic convent. A report reached this city in the morning that a new band of Arabs is concentrating in Nablus, intending to march on Jeru-

According to hospital records, there were 80 dead, of whom 59 are Jews. Two hundred and thirty-three injured persons were recorded.

Gruesome scenes occurred during the massacres in various parts of the country. Unspeakable cruelties were committed by the savage Arab assailants when even women and small children were ruthlessly murdered and houses were destroyed.

35,000 JEWS DEMONSTRATE IN NEW YORK: MARCH TO BRITISH CONSULATE-GENERAL OFFICE

Huge Peaceful Demonstration Voices Grief and Protest Over Palestine Happenings; Protest Originally Called by Legionaires and Revisionists Joined By All Classes of Jews; Orthodox Rabbis Union Issues Call to Partici-pate; Placards Voice Disappointment in British Rule in Holy Land; Resolution to British Consul-General: Mayor Greets Marchers

Indignation and protest mingled with England can't fulfill the Mandate, let grief and sorrow in a 35,000 crowd of her give it to us"; "We send our peo-New York Jews, composed of all ple to Palestine, but their henchmark classes and shades of opinion which send them to their graves"; "What is marched Monday afternoon along the way to 44 Whitehall Street, the headquarters of the British Consulate General in New York City. James Walker, Mayor of New York, welcomed the demonstration in front of City Hall, and expressed his sympathy for the cause the demonstration championed. No disturbances occurred, the demonstration being one of the most peace-ful marches of large masses New York has ever witnessed.

Orthodox rabbis marched shoulder to Orthodox rabbis marched shoulder with World War veterans who saw service on the Sinai Peninsula and in Palestine, Yeninite Jews and Jewesses from Central Arabia mingled with United States Jewish war veterans, laborer and middle man. Yeshiva student and freethinker, joined in a silent march which gave expression to New York Jewry's feeling of disappointment and resentment.

The support of New York Jewry for the demonstration came spontaneously as the meager details of the gravity of the Palestine situation trickled through the Palestine censorship via the channels of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency and were presented to the New York reading public on the columns of every metropolitan daily.

The Union of Orthodox Rabbis in the United Staes and Canada, upon receipt of the news of the massacre of the Hebron Yeshiva students, including 12 American Jewish boys, broke with its tradition of non-participation in street demonstrations and issued a grief fraught, heart-rending statement and appeal for participation.

The demonstration which occupied twelve city blocks, proceeded peacefully under the leadership of Commander Julius S. Berg of the United States Jewish War Veterans, Elias Ginsberg, Revisionist leader and former member of the Jewish Legion in Palestine, and Samuel Friedlander of the Palestine Legionaires' committee.

American banners were carried and the Zionist blue and white flag was draped in black.

"Give Mandate to U.S." Placard Urges; Other Signs Express Indignation, Disappointment in British

The sentiment pervading the marchers were given expression in the fol-lowing placards carried: "Have we fought in vain with Allenby"; "We fought together with the English Army, now they are going against us" demand dismissal of the guilty officials, send them to their graves"; "What is the Labor Government doing?" Many placards contained anti-British expressions of indignation and grief.

Before two o'clock, Tenth Street and Second Avenue was chocked with peo-Impromptu speeches were made and voices were raised expressing the feelings of the crowd over the mas-sacre of Jews in Palestine. Promptly at two the crowd which was orderly at two the crowd which was orderly formed in line and lead by Commander Julius Berg of the United States Jew-ish War Veterans and Elias Ginsburg of the Jewish Legionnaire, started to march. The procession passed over to Broadway, down that street to City Hall Park where it was reviewed by Mayor Walker of New York and from there on down Broadway to the office of the British Consul at Whitehall Street.

Every phase of New York Jewry took part in the procession; youths, war scarred Jewish veterans, two of whom tapped their way over the pavement with the aid of crutches, because they had lost a leg fighting under General Allenby in Palestine, middle aged shop keepers who closed their little shops so that they, too, could protest, talmudic scholars in their quaint costumes, rabbis, women of all ages, many of them in tears, the Yemenites with their dark features and lively eyes, all marched under a broiling sun through the heated streets of New York to voice their horror at what had happened. Peaceful as the marchers were, the banners they carried expressed what they thought—"We send our people to Palestine but your henchmen send them to their graves," said one. send them to their graves," said one. "We demand the dismissal of guilty officials" was another of the anti-British posters that were sprinkled through the procession. The tone of the march was distinctly one of sorrow and grief mingled with horror. It was a singularly silent procession. As the line went down Broadway the only audible sounds were the shuffling of weary feet and the broken sobs of the women, some of whom carried babies in their arms. The marchers were escorted by the police whose bright uniforms were in contrast with the drab garb of most of the marchers.

Mayor, and the Mayor answered, expressing his sympathy with the spirit behind the demonstration and stating his regret over what had happened in Palestine. He offered his help to stop the bloodshed. Elias Ginsburg, in the uniform of a Jewish Legionaire, then read aloud the following resolution that was being brought to the British Consul, Sir Harry Armstrong:

Text of Resolution

"We, the Jews of New York, includ-ing the Legionaires who fought under the British flag for the liberation of Palestine, and the Jewish War Veter-ans of the United States, this day in mass meeting assembled, record our unbounded grief and horror at the tragedy which has befallen our fellow-Jews in Palestine. We declare to mankind, before God, that responsi-bility for this frightful tragedy rests directly upon England, Arabs and the Palestinian administration. England, which solemnly assumed and accepted from the League of Nations the duties and obligations of the Mandate for Palestine, the chief of which was and is 'to place the country under such pol-itical, administrative and economic conditions as will secure the establishof the Jewish National Home,' has flagrantly ignored and violated these duties and obligations from the very beginning and has, instead, maintained in Palestine an administration which has shown persstent hostility to the Jews and neglected even to accord them the elementary protection of a civilized government. The present massacre of the innocent Jews of Palestine is and was the inevitable con-

sequence.
"In this hour of our grief and mourning, we solemnly resolve and demand: That the Government of England take all possible steps immediately not only to restore order and safeguard life and property in Palestine, but also to wipe out the blot upon England's honor and good name, which the violation of the Mandate has imposed, by immediately and drastically reorganizing the Palestine administration so that it will henceforth take note of and fulfill the solemn duties of the Mandate, and so that the world may know that England means to keep the pledge of the Balfour Declaration.

The Mayor then offered to review the procession, and for nearly an hour he stood as the marchers, four abreast,

walked by him.

The procession then moved down lower Broadway, through the financial section. Again crowds lined the curbs. and windows opened in the towering office buildings added thousands more of spectators to the scene. Shouts, cheers, and here and there a few jeers, greeted the marchers; ticker tape was soon snowing on the streets, but the

SIR HERBERT SAMUEL MAY AGAIN BECOME PALES-TINE HIGH COMMISSIONER; LORD READING MAY BE SENT TO PALESTINE TO TACKLE RACE PROBLEM

Reading Will Insist on Expropriation of Wailing Wall Site and Establishment of Permanent Wailing Wall Commission; Sir Herbert Samuel Recalled from Vacation; Felix Warburg Consulted

London, Aug. 26-In an hour of political need, the Labor government of Great Britain has invited the cooperation of two of the most distinguished British Jews who have rendered great services to the British Empire in administering her colonial possessions. Sir Herbert Samuel, Liberal leader

and former High Commissioner of Palestine, known for his sympathies to Zionism, and the Marquis of Read-ing, former Viceroy of India and also a Liberal, figure prominently in connection with the critical situation in

Palestine.

Sir Herbert, who has been spending his vacation in Prague, Czecho-Slovakia, was recalled to the British capital, where he is expected any hour. The London press suggests that Sir Herbert Samuel's speedy return to London is in connection with the possibility of his reappointment to the post of High Commissioner for Palestine, which he held during the period 1921-1925

In connection with the visit of the Marquis of Reading to Prime Minister Ramsay MacDonald on Sunday afternoon, notwithstanding the tradi-tion of British Prime Ministers not to transact any business on Sunday, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns from reliable sources that the Marquis of Reading is prepared to proceed as a special commissioner of the British

government to Palestine.

It is understood, however, Reading will insist on two conditions prior to the acceptance of the mission to create peace between the Moslem Arabs and the Jews, a task similar to that which he faced as Vicerov of India. The first condition is that the area before the Western Wall of the Temple, known as the Wailing Wall, legally the property of the Moslem Supreme Council, be expropriated by the Palestine government in order to enable the promulgation of regulations fixing certain hours of worship for the lews at the Temple and certain hours for the Moslems, since the site is holy to both religions.

The second condition demanded by the Marquis of Reading is that a permanent commission on the Wailing Wall be appointed by the British government, to consist of an English judge and two Palestinian judges, one an Arab and one a Jew. The commis-sion would be charged with the task of regulating all problems arising in connection with the question of the rights of access and worship at the

ZIONISTS PLAN PROTEST MEETINGS IN LONDON (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Aug. 26-The grave situation in Palestine placed the English Zionists in a predicament and created in the Jewish communities throughout the world, which were accustomed to an attitude of faith and confidence in the British government in regard to Palestine, a bewilderment.

The central office of the World Zionist Organization here at 77 Great Russell Street, W. C. I, was literally deluged by cables from Jewish communities throughout the world, frantically asking for information and advice on how to proceed.

It was learned that a special meeting of the Zionist Executive, together with the Executive of the English Zionist Federation, was held late Monday evening at the Zionist headquarters here, with the participation of Louis Lipsky, president of the Zionist Organization of America, and Harry Sacher, British barrister and member of the Zionist Executive in Jerusalem. It is understood that Mr. Sacher reported on the result of his preliminary interview with the Colonial Office preparatory to Dr. Weizmann's conversation scheduled for Tuesday.

A delegation of Palestine students

at English universities begged permission of the Zionist Executive to arrange a protest meeting and a pro-cession of mourning.

The Anglo-Palestine Club offered the Zionist English Federation to help in arranging a public protest.

The League of Zionist Revisionists here gave notice of its intention to hold a mass meeting under the slogan: "The Lesson of Palestine." The Zionist Revisionist leaders were urged to desist from their plan pending the formulation by the Zionist Executive of a concerted plan of action. JEWISH DAILY BULLETIN U. S. GOVERNMENT INSTRUCTS AMBASSADOR DAWES TO MAKE REPRESENTATIONS TO BRITISH GOVERNMENT ON THE PALESTINE SITUATION

Extraordinary Step Taken to Express U. S. Hope for Restoration of Order and Protection of Americans; Secretary of State Declares He Received Report Conflict Not Only Religious But Racial as Well; Not Yet Officially Known Who Provoked Trouble, He Says

with the press today, stated that he, on behalf of the American Government this morning cabled instructions to Ambassador Dawes in London requesting him to orally express to the British Government the earnest hope of the American Government that immediate and comprehensive steps may be taken for the restoration of order and the protection of lives and property of American citizens in Palestine. Secretary Stimson explained that this was a very extraordinary step as it is unusual to make such a request direct to a foreign government, this being usually addressed by the American Consular representative to the local authority and the action of communicating with the British Government through Ambassador Dawes is intended to impress that Government with the concern felt by the United States over the situation in Palestine especially the killing of 12 American citizens, students at the Slobodka Yeshiya at Hebron, the Kenesseth Israel Yeshiva

Confirmation of the killing of the 12 American Jewish students, all citizens of the United States was received from Consul Knabenshue today. The names of these victims was not indicated but a further report giving these names is expected from the American Consul in Jerusalem momentarily and Secretary Stimson stated that these names will be made public as soon as they are received by the state department.

Secretary Stimson declared that from reports received by the state department the situation in Palestine is very serious

Referring to Talpioth a suburb of Jerusalem, where several American families have been residing, Secretary Stimson said that better news was reported regarding the situation there. The population having evacuated Tal-pioth without casualties although afterwards it was looted by the Moslems.

Secretary Stimson also announced that the State Department had received satisfactory news this morning as to the action of the British troops. They have arrived by airplane and train from Egypt and Consul Knabenshue telegraphed this was expected to improve the situation in Jerusalem. The Secretary, asked for the number of the troops, replied that it was a fair number for police purposes and that they all came from Egypt.

Secretary Stimson further declared that the American Consul had reported that he requested the Government authorities in Palestine to take all necessary steps for the protection of American lives and properties and that to make further and more emphatic requests. The Consul Knabenshue re-

It was indicated by the State Department that reports received in Palestine tended to show that the present conflict arising out of the Wailing Wall controversy was not only reliigous but racial as well and that this kind of a religious and racial clash always creates a serious situation.

Secretary Stimson, asked whether the American government intends to send a warship to Palestine in res-ponse to the request of American Jewish citizens there, replied that Pal-estine is under the British Mandate and that consequently the propriety of such a step is not apparent.

Allusion was also made to the un-favorable reaction in the United States when a British warship was sent to Nicaragua during the trouble in that country

Asked whether a reply had been sent to Congressman Celler's protest, the secretary stated that what he had already said covered the present atti-tude of the State Department with reference to the situation in Palestine, and indicated that he did not care to comment on Celler's communication. He was also asked whether the American citizens who were killed were responsible for the trouble, to which the secretary replied that the only report received is that they are dead, and he also indicated in response to a ques-tion that it was not yet officially known which side was responsible for provoking the trouble.

Congressman Celler Sends Telegram The following telegram was sent to Secretary of State Stimson by Con-gressman Emanuel Celler: "The New York press carries dis-

patches that the general attitude of the State Department is that the British authorities have taken adequate measures of protection for the Pales-tine Jews and that the Department is loath to intervene, since no American interests are involved.

The greatest massacre perpetrated by the Moslem Arabs occurred Saturday at Hebron, the city of Biblical fame, where 45 Jews were slain and 47 seriously wounded. In Hebron the casualties mounted high because of the lack of a Jewish self-defense body, the majority of the victims being pious Talmud students (Yeshiva bochurim) from various parts of the world, including many Americans, who were taken unawares in the famous Tal-mudical academy transferred several years ago from Slobodka, Lithuania, to Hebron. Two rabbis affiliated with the academy, Rabbi Slonim and another whose name could not be ascertained, are among the dead. In the absence of a Jewish self-defense body, the Jewish population of Hebron gathered in the police court yard. number of those who were slightly wounded is great.

Tel Aviv Attacked, 1 Killed, 13 Wounded, Battle Raging

Tel Aviv, Aug. 25-Tel Aviv, first all-Jewish city of modern Palestine, was the center of an organized attack by the Moslem Arabs Sunday afternoon.

The Jewish youth of this city of-fered armed resistance and met the assailants, who came from Jaffa, on the outskirts of the Jewish city. A fierce battle ensued, which is still in progress. The local police, 100 per cent Jewish, led in the defense. The first check showed 1 killed, 8 wounded slightly, 5 gravely.

Among the dead in Jerusalem is an English officer, Mr. Best, of the Pales-Immigration Department, who was killed when he repelled the Arab assault on the Jewish suburb Givath Saul, near Jerusalem. He was to be married this week. Mr. Best was known for his friendship to Jews and Zionism. He was a Catholic.

British aeroplanes today bombed the Arab village Lifta, near Jerusalem, and to be the nest of the Moslem Arabs directing the attack. Six hun-dred British soldiers arrived from Egypt today.

The libraries of Prof. Joseph Klausner, member of the faculty of the Hebrew University, at his home in Talpioth, was partly destroyed and looted. Rare books and manuscripts were destroyed. A similar attack was perpetrated on the library of Prof. Epstein of the Hebrew University, and of S. Agnon, Hebrew writer. Mr. Agnon informed the Jewish Telegraph-ic Agency that all his library, containing three thousand rare documents relating to Palestine during the last three centuries, were destroyed. All his furniture was destroyed. Only half of his manuscripts were saved.

Fire was set by the Arabs to the settlement Bdud Avodah, near Jerusalem. An atack was also made on the suburb Meker Chayim, which was deserted by the inhabitants.

Government Taking Steps to Prevent Further Riots

An official communique issued yesterday by the Palestine government declared that it was "taking measures to restore order." The communique urged "all sections of the population to desist from acts of violence and return to their normal occupations. The government is always prepared to receive deputations representing the demands of the different communities.

The government yesterday invited Musa Kazim Pasha, head of the Palestine Arab Executive, anti-Zionist Arab body, and other Arab leaders and the sheiks and muktars of the surrounding villages, warning them against further riots.

JEWS WILL NOT SURRENDER SACRED TASK OF UPBUILD-ING ZION, SAMUEL UNTERMYER SAYS

British Government Has Failed Miserably in Obligation to Protect Jews in Holy Land, He Declares in Statement

"I hesitate to say anything on the basis of the present incomplete reports and especially in the absence of Dr. Weizmann and Messrs. Warburg and Marshall who are now on the Continent upon the business of Palestine. But as you seem to feel it is important that some one say something on this matter, I have yielded to your judg- Britain Must Restore Jewish Colonies ment

"The news of the terrible anti-Jewish uprising as thus far reported almost reaches the gigantic proportions of an international disaster for which the British government must apparently bear a heavy share of responsibility. It is to be hoped that further reports will place the situation in a less unfavorable light. Apparently the government has long had warning that this fanatical religious war of a semi-savage race was imminent, but has provided only scant protection. If half the stories are true, the present government in Palestine has been not only supine and short-sighted but unfriendly in its deafness to all the signs of the coming of the present debacle.

The Jews of the world and especially those of America who have year by year been pouring tens of millions of dollars into Palestine in the colonization and development of that country in reliance on the will and ability of the British to carry out the spirit of the Balfour Declaration have evidently been relying upon a broken reed. No amount of belated protection can now undo the shock to our confidence of the terrible events of the past week. The least we have the right to expect in return for what American Jews have been doing for Palestine and its Arab population was adequate protection and that has misadequate protection and that has mis-erably failed us. We have generously carried out our part of the bargain involved in the Mandate but the British government has, I fear, fallen down in the performance of its obligations.

"But there should be no thought of our surrender of the sacred task we have undertaken and I am sure that will be the reaction of American Jewry to this staggering setback to our opti-mistic hopes and plans. Hundreds of thousands of Arabs have profited and are daily profiting by our great move-ment. This disaster goes only to con-firm our worst fears that we are dealing with a race of fanatical barbarians who can be governed only by the stern-est repressive measures. The outburst was apparently well-planned and ade-quately financed. We shall now see what the government will do toward inflicting such punishment on the leaders of this rebellion against British prestige as to give assurance against the possibility of recurrence. It is a terrible disappointment to those of us who are interested in Palestine and

As proof, it was pointed out that when the police force of Palestine was organized, the administration at first excluded Jews entirely from that force, and only after strong protests shown how reliable the Arab police wounded, they said.

The Attack on Tel Aviv, Many Killed and Injured

Martial law was proclaimed in Tel Aviv, the all-Jewish city and in Jaffa, the neighboring city with a mixed Arab Jewish population. A troop of 200 sol-dies was stationed at Tel Aviv. Seventy civilians were drafted into the Tel Aviv police service. The Jewish population was moved from the outskirts to the center of the city.

Six armored cars were ordered from Bagdad and more cavalry and infantry were asked from Cairo.

It was impossivle to ascertain the number of those killed and injured in Tel Aviv during the assaults and the defense on the border of Tel Aviv. The trouble started Sunday when the Moslem Arabs desired to march through Tel Aviv under the pretext of burying an Arab who was killed in the fighting in the cemetery situated on the outskirts of Tel Aviv. A number of the Arabs attempted to break into the city proper. The British police fired. Six Arabs were killed.

Fighting also took place in several quarters of Jaffa.

Saturday night, a mob of Moslem Arabs attacked the government offices at Jaffa. The British police opened fire, repelling the attack. Five Arabs were killed and over thirty wounded.

Official Statements Issued by Palestine Government, Mirror Its Views of Situation

London, Aug. 26-The Colonial Office assumes, it was declared officially, that the Palestine government has now the situation well in hand. Prime Minister MacDonald keeps in constant touch with the Colonial Office and is being informed on every development in Palestine. Reinforcements from Malta are expected to reach Palestine Tuesday. It is believed that the prompt despatch of troops will be sufficient to prevent further outbreaks.

Naval and military reinforcements continue to be rushed to Palestine. Three more air craft left full speed for Jerusalem. Many extra aeroplanes and pilots are on board the destroyers "Wanderer" and "Veteran," both warships of 1,325 tons with a speed of 34 knots an hour. "The British Government cannot restore the lives of the Jewish pioneers who have sacrificed themselves for Palestine, but it can and should restore the homes and colonies that have been destroyed. These homes and settle-ments have been built in Palestine by money contributed mostly by American Jews who relied on the British good faith in carrying out the terms of the Mandate and Great Britain either from its own treasury or from the Palestine treasury should make good the loss.

Unjust to Charge British Government with Change of Policy, But Responsibility Is Hers, David A. Brown

David A. Brown, National Chairman of the United Jewish Campaign, deof the Oniced Jewish Campaign, uclared: "The outrages being perpetrated in Palestine during the past weeks are due entirely to the lack of aggressiveness on the part of the British Administration in Palestine.

"Anyone familiar with Palestine and the clashes between the Jews and the Arabs in the past must know that unless those in charge of the government, with the police and military power, take an aggressive position, that there will be trouble and that the Jews will suffer because of smallness of number and the fact that they are without arms of any nature.

"Those of us who are deeply interested in the development of Palestine have always had a fear within us that upon the slightest provocation the Arab would attack the Jew.

"But this fear has been allayed because of our absolute confidence in the British Government and of its understanding in handling situation similar to that which has developed lately in

"The British Government has always been friendly to the Jew. The Balfour Declaration and the Mandate for Palestine are concrete evidences of this. Therefore, it would be unjust to charge the British Government with having changed its policy; yet we must hold the Government responsible because it is the mandatory power and has the possibilities within itself of maintaining peace in Palestine.

"The world is outraged by what has happened in Palestine during the past tragic days. The world, and particularly the Jews of the world, will look to the British Government to deal with the situation quickly, aggressively and in such a manner that it will establish a complete understanding in the minds of the Arab and the Moslem that the Jew is by right in Palestine, intends to remain by this same right in that country, and will develop and grow in accordance with the desires of the Jew throughout the world.

"Tears are being shed wherever there are Jews for the suffering of our peo-ple in Palestine, and whatever demands may be made upon American Jewry will be met speedily and gener-ously."

Grave Fears Entertained for Tel Aviv

Cairo, Aug. 26-An uncensored report which reached here Monday evening expressed grave fears concerning the safety of the Jewish population in Tel Aviv, the all-Jewish city of Palestine. A mass attack on the city was started by an Arab mob from the neighboring city of Jaffa, while the report was being despatched.

British troops have been hurriedly rushed to Tel Aviv. The British battleship Barham is expected to arrive at Jaffa not before Tuesday morning. If a massacre is prevented during the night, the marines of the Barham are expected to have a chance to restore order

Alarm Calls Sent by Labor Leaders to London, Charges Betrayal

London, Aug. 26-The Jewish Labor Office here received today the following cable from the Jewish labor party at Tel Aviv. The cable was despatched from Cairo and was uncensored. It read:

"Isaac Ben-Zvi telephones from Terusalem that the Jewish colonies around the city were burned. Our brethren are being killed. Hebron, Tel Aviv and the colony Rechoboth, were attacked. We are interfered with in our self-defense action. We are being betrayed. We are being cut off from the entire world. Conditions are dangerous throughout the country. have no more strength. Save us. Inform Dr. Chaim Weizmann and S. Kaplansky."

Beirut, Syria, Aug. 26-An uncen-sored report brought here by a reliable messenger from Haifa described the situation of the Jewish population in the various Palestine centers as extremely grave, although the Jewish youth is everywhere organizing itself into a brilliant self-defense corps.

The report charged that the Arabs are carrying on their hostilities openly while the police continue to be unable to master the situation and the authorities fail to furnish the Jewish self-defense adequate arms.

The report further stated that the hositilities continued throughout Pal-Jerusalem was the scene of estine. savage assaults and massacre. Jewish colony, Hartuf, sustained heavy losses. (This cable was despatched at 1:30 P. M. Friday but was retained by the Palestine censor for almost 20 hours.) A representative of the National Council of Palestine Jewry requested the Acting High Commissioner, H. C. Luke, to permit the publication of the Palestine newspapers which were suspended Friday. The Acting High Commissioner promised to consider the request.

London, Aug. 25—The following message despatched from Jerusalem Friday was retained by the Palestine censorship for over 27 hours.
"Latest news. Twelve Jews including a British Jew named Viner, and Arabs were killed. The government

supplied arms to all Britishers in Jerusalem and to a part of the Jewish self-defense corps. Several outlying Jewish quarters were attacked during the night. The famous Jewish orphan home, Diskin, was attacked. The Arabs were repelled.

"The Jerusalem police has just been informed that crowds of Arabs are proceeding to Jerusalem from Hebron and Nablus to join the local Moslems in their attack on the Jews. All shops and offices are closed.

German "Engineer Neumann, a Christian, who is working with Engineer Novomejsky in the Dead Sea project is among those seriously wounded. The British Colonial Office issued

the following statement: "Immediate action is being taken which will enable local authorities to restore and maintain order."
