DR. LEON REICH, NOTED POLISH JEWISH LEADER, DEAD AT FIFTY-ONE

Noted Zionist Mourned by Jewish Organizations

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Lemberg, Dec. 2.—At the funeral today of Dr. Leon Reich, notable leader of Polish Jewry and one of the pioneer Zionists of Poland, government officials, Jewish leaders and representatives of the many Jewish organizations with which he was affiliated and in whose service he dedicated most of his life paid a last tribute to one of the most popular members of the Polish Seim.

Deputy Reich, who was 51, died after an unsuccessful operation for appendicitis had been performed.

From all parts of Poland have come expressions of regret at the passing of the great Jewish leader. While Deputy Greenbaum represented the uncompromising wing of Polish Jewry, Dr. Reich was a realist, and it was through his efforts that the Polish-Jewish agreement was reached some years ago. During the Paris Peace Conference Dr. Reich was a member of a committee of Jewish delegations and assisted in the drafting of the minorities treaty.

The Zionist Executive for Eastern Galicia convoked a session of mourning. The Mizrahi, the Kehillah and the Hitachduti participated. Mr. Barth, a member of the World Zionist Executive has joined the funeral committee. On behalf of the Kehillah a grave of honor has been provided. Hundreds of telegrams of condolence have arrived from every part of the country, and from abroad. The Wlojwod, the district chief, and the various parliamentary clubs have sent condolences to the Zionist Executive.

Warsaw, Dec. 2.—A special meeting of the Zionist Central Committee was convoked in order to honor the memory of Dr. Reich. The Polish section of the Jewish Agency also gathered to mourn his death.

A message issued by the Zionist Executive states that the Jewish people suffered a great loss in the decease of a great fighter for the Jewish renaissance and people's tribune. The message proclaims a week of mourning for the whole of Polish Jewry.

ARRESTED FOR DEFENDING HIMSELF FROM MURDERERS

GRAND MUFTI TO GIVE HIS VERSION OF RESPONSIBILITY OF OUTBREAKS TO INQUIRY COMMISSION IN OWN HOME; PRESS BARRED

Subhi Khadra Named Inciter of August Bloodshed by Merriman; Made Tour of Country to "Stir Up Trouble," Asserts Latter; King Feisal's Letter Approving Zionist Policy Discussed; "Never Saw It," Asserts Khadra

Jerusalem, Dec. 2.—Amin El Husseini, Grand Mufti of Jerusalem, and head of the Moslem Supreme Council, charged with the chief responsibility for the riots of August, will today tell his version of the Palestine outbreaks to the Parliamentary Commission of Inquiry, in the privacy of his own home. On the strength of an ecclesiastical privilege handed down by the Turks, the Grand Mufti's testimony will not be given in public. While counsel for both sides will be present, no arrangements have been made for the accommodation of the press, the Mufti evidently desiring no publicity.

At Saturday's session of the Inquiry Commission, Subhi Khadra, known as the Jabotinsky of the Arabs, was confronted point blank by Sir Boyd Merriman as an inciter of the August bloodshed. By a series of brilliant questions, Merriman made it clear that the young Arab leader, who is certain that the Jews intend to capture the Mosque, but doubts that Arabs murdered Jews at Hebron, knew precisely when the outbreak was scheduled to begin.

Tall, stern, youthful, and almost British in expression, Khadra figured in the evidence of District Commissioner Farraday as the agitator who took the Mufti of Safed toward Jerusalem several days before the massacre at Safed occurred. Described as a member of

the Arab Executive and an attorney, Khadra's chief evidence under the examination of Silley tended to show that in the period between the stabbing of the Jewish youth, Abraham Mizrahi, and the beginning of the Jerusalem riots on August 23, the police were busy arresting Arabs on the complaints of the Jews, while all the Arab complaints were ignored. Under cross-examination of Freedy, government counsel, the witness was forced to admit that the police had dealt with both Arab cases which he previously cited.

One of the three Moslems who met at the house of H. C. Luke on the eve of the riots with the Jewish representatives, Isaac Ben Zwi, Jewish labor leader, Braude in behalf of the Zionist Executive, and Dr. Levy, Khadra testified he understood the Jews believed that the Arabs did not come to discuss amicable relations but to settle the question of the Wailing Wall.

This contention was shattered by Merriman, who introduced the evi-

BENTWICH ATTACKER SAYS HE WAS INCITED

As an inveterate reader of the Arab newspapers, he knows the Arab, Edgar Bentwich as their greatest enemy. Therefore he decided to take revenge, Tabek asserted.

WITHDRAWAL OF JOLSON'S "JAZZ SINGER" DEMANDED

Berlin, Dec. 2.—"Angriff," a Hitlerite newspaper, today demands that Hugenberg, the principal owner of the Ufa Film Company and head of the German Nationalist Party, remove within three days the Al Jolson film, "The Jazz Singer." The paper calls the picture a "nauseating, all-Jewish propaganda film." If Hugenberg, doesn't comply with this request, the paper threatens that the National Socialists, throughout the country will compel the removal of the film.

JEWS IN MANCHURIAN CITY REPORTED VICTIMS OF WHITE GUARD RAID

Women Attacked, Houses Looted, and Young Jews Killed; Red Army Success Stops Pogrom

Moscow, Dec. 2.—Jews in a city in Manchuria were the victims of a pogrom perpetrated by former Russian White Guards, reports received here state. A number of Jewish casualties occurred.

The attack upon the Jews was made in the course of the White Guard retreat. Jewish houses were plundered, Jewish women attacked and the Jewish youth killed. The pogrom was halted only with the capture of the station by the Red Army. Many Jews were permitted by the Red Army to cross the Soviet border and to proceed to China.

SOKOLOV CONFERS WITH M. DUKA ON ZIONISM (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Dec. 2.—Nahum Sokolow, noted Zionist leader now visiting here, today met M. Duka, former minister of foreign affairs. They discussed Zionism at some length.

Theodor Fischer declared in Parliament today during the debate on the Royal Message that he would only vote for the Message if the Government submitted to Parliament the law concerning the minorities and the naturalization law.

Professor Jorga, president of the University of Bucharest, declared in Parliament today that he had not been consulted regarding the students' congress at Kraiova. He said he had been compelled to leave the responsibility to the Government. Thousands of students have already arrived at Kraiova where the authorities have taken care to provide them with lodgings while the students have promised to maintain order.

SOVIET GOVERNMENT BANS TALMUD AND KORAN (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Dec. 2.—Herr Stoeßinger, one of the publishers of the German edition of the Talmud, reveals a secret decree issued by Lenin's sister, Madame Krupskaya, on behalf of the Soviet government, ordering the libraries of Russia to destroy all copies of the books of Kant, Plato, Spencer, Carlyle, all evangelical works, the Koran and the Talmud. Only the academies, according to this decree, are permitted to retain one copy.

DALLAS SEEKS \$60,000 FOR JEWISH SOCIAL SERVICE (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Dallas, Tex., Dec. 2.—The seventh annual campaign of the Jewish Federation for Social Service opened here today with the goal set at \$60,000, the highest ever sought. M. I. Freedman is chairman.

LEAGUE OPPOSED TO ANTI- SEMITISM CONVENTION IN PARIS NOW IN SESSION

Opening Day Marked by Controversies
on Language and Zionist Questions;
Schwartzbard Guest
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Paris, Dec. 2.—Sessions of the League Opposed to Anti-Semitism opened here today. The morning sitting was devoted to technical questions and the acknowledgment of greetings, especially one from the Paris municipality. Eighty-nine delegates, mostly from Paris, are in attendance.

The afternoon session heard reports from the various sections and a general debate. Bernard Le Cache, executive chairman, is the only prominent figure present. A heated debate on what language was to be used for the League's publication, French or Yiddish, was settled in favor of French when La Cache pointed out that the League was a general organization and not a Jewish one.

The French committee elected I. Goldenberg president. At an exciting debate over Zionism, the Congress declined to vote a protest against the events in Palestine on the grounds of neutrality.

Sholom Schwartzbard, one of the guests, received a tremendous ovation. A night session is probable.

PARLIAMENT STUDIES UNIVERSITY PROBLEM (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Dec. 2.—The question of the universities was discussed today by a financial committee of Parliament. The minister educator condemned the recent anti-Semitic disorders and promised to establish quiet. The Socialist deputies opposed the claims of the anti-Semites that aliens are over-running Austrian universities. The Socialists presented figures to prove that alien students comprise only 17 per cent of the Austrian student body. German students are 15 per cent and native Austrians make up the rest. With these figures as a basis the Socialists argued that the so-called need of a numerus clausus is only a rally cry of the anti-Semites. The Socialist deputies also declared that university authorities have given subventions to anti-Semitic publications issued by the Nationalist student organizations. Anti-Semitism caused a fight between members of the Heimwehr and Austrian Hitlerites at Gmunden, an Austrian province, where a Heimwehr leader slapped the guest speaker at a gathering. Deputy Von Ribbentrop, because the latter said that the Heimwehr was financed by the Jews.

DENIES REPORT JEWISH BEGGAR INHERITED MILLION (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Dec. 2.—The United States Consul denies the report recently published in newspapers here regarding the inheritance which a Jewish beggar, Feingold, was reported to have received from a brother in Texas.

CONVENTION VOTES FUND OF \$500,000 TO BE RAISED FOR PALESTINE WORKERS

Nathan Straus Receives Ovation at
Organized Workers Convention

A fund of \$500,000 will be raised during the coming year for the organized Jewish workers of Palestine it was announced at the closing session of the convention of the Organized Jewish Workers in Palestine held in New York City.

The convention also issued a call to all union members to subscribe an hour's work for Palestine. Plans are under way to mobilize 100,000 subscribers for the half million dollar fund. Nathan Straus, one of the speakers at the last session, received an ovation from the delegates. A message of greeting was received from William Green, president of the American Federation of Labor.

WARNS AGAINST RUSSIAN COLONISTS' MIGRATION (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Dec. 2.—A warning is voiced in the Soviet Press against the migration of colonists from Russia pointing to the difficulties met everywhere abroad. As an example the case of a group of Jews who left Russia six years ago and are still isolated in barracks in Southern England and living there in miserable condition and unable to proceed to the United States because of the immigration quotas, is cited as how blood brothers provide for their relatives living in Russia whom they had encouraged to leave the country.

HISTORICAL FIND IN VILNA OF GREAT JEWISH INTEREST (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vilna, Dec. 2.—A find of great Jewish historical value has been made by the Jewish Scientific Institute here in discovering in the city archives forty volumes of the records of the Vilna Kehillah from 1809 to 1844 when Czar Nicholas I dissolved all of the kehillahs in Russia.

All of the volumes as well as the kehillah seal are undamaged. The find includes thousands of orders, letters, documents, meeting reports, etc. The discovery will make possible a reconstruction of Jewish kehillah life in the 18th and 19th centuries.

CHARLES SANGER, TEXAS CIVIC LEADER, DEAD (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Dallas, Tex., Dec. 2.—Charles L. Sanger, prominent Dallas business man and civic leader, was buried here yesterday. He died Thursday in Waco while visiting his brother. Until last year Mr. Sanger was president of Temple Emanu-El. He was 62 years old.

He was the son of the late Samuel Sanger, a Texas pioneer, and a founder of the Sanger Bros. Stores in Dallas, Fort Worth, Waco and Wichita, of which he was for many years general manager. He was also the first president of the Kessler Plan Association, an organization for civic improvement here.

dence of Luke, who stated that the Jewish representatives had distinctly declared they were unauthorized to negotiate the settlement of the Wailing Wall question, but were authorized only to seek a joint appeal in order to calm the excited populace.

Khadra insisted that the Moslem representatives should not entertain the ciliatory statement drafted by Braude, as to have done so would have been treachery.

After testifying concerning the pacifying activities of the Grand Mufti on August 23, Khadra said he started on a tour of the country the following day in order to mobilize the members of the Arab Executive for an urgent meeting of that body. He visited Nablus, Jenin, Haifa, Tiberias, Safed, everywhere telling the Arabs that their leaders were watching out for their rights.

The witness showed confusion when Merriman tried to show that the real purpose of his journey was to stir up trouble.

Sir Walter Shaw and the members of the Commission displayed much interest in Subha Khadra's movements, inquiring why it was necessary to personally invite members of the Arab Executive, instead of telegraphing or telephoning them to attend the meeting.

Hedging, Khadra replied: "The situation was dangerous. It was my duty to collect members of the Executive establish contact with the government, and in conjunction with the government take measures and plead against the disturbances and the bloodshed."

"I put it to you," at this point interposed Merriman. "Your object was to incite these places."

"You are free to think what you like," the witness answered wearily.

Denying that he is a member of the Society for the Protection of the Mosque, the Aksa, but admitting belief that the Jews intend to take the Mosque of Omar from the Arabs, Khadra played into the hands of Merriman.

The counsel for the Jewish Agency has awaited the opportunity of meeting a responsible Arab leader to confirm such a belief, as did the Elder of Nablus, Hammud, on Friday, it being the Zionist case that the circulation of this monstrous charge was largely responsible for provoking most of the trouble.

"Did you tell your friends of this belief?" asked Merriman.

"No," answered Khadra.

"Had anything occurred in the ten days before the riots to strengthen your belief?" continued Merriman.

"Yes," replied the Arab witness.

"Did you discuss this?" asked Merriman. "I might have done so," said Khadra.

"Then you dropped a bombshell," declared Merriman, asking: "What time were the Jerusalem riots really intended to start?"

"I don't approve of the question in this form," countered Khadra.

Merriman then asked: "Were the riots in Jerusalem intended to start at a certain time?"

"Ask your clients," was Khadra's answer. "I want an answer not your inference," insisted Merriman.

Silley objected to Merriman's question on the ground that it assumed Khadra knew the riots were intended.

When Khadra declared that he does not understand what is meant by "intended," Sir Walter Shaw insisted that he should reply either "yes" or "no" to Merriman's query. Finally Khadra replied that he does not agree with the assumption that there was any intention.

Turning to another field, Merriman queried: "Did you, as a member of the Arab Executive and an advocate, sign the protests against Sir John Chancellor's proclamation?"

"Yes," replied Khadra.

"Was the Hebron case warfare or murder?" Merriman asked.

"I knew nothing about it," the witness replied.

Merriman repeated the question, instead of answering which, Khadra countered with naming the Arab family which was killed in Jaffa. Sir Walter Shaw interposed: "You are not answering the question."

Merriman declared: "You signed this protest. I ask again—Was Hebron a fair fight or murder?"

"Cafferata is the proper person to ask," Khadra then replied.

"Your protest says there was a popular rising in Hebron," Merriman continued.

"We based our denial of Jewish charges of savagery on the statement by the British Doctor of the Public Health Department," asserted Khadra.

"Do you agree with the High Commissioner about the unspeakable savagery?" queried Merriman.

"I protested against the proclamation," replied Khadra.

"Was the High Commissioner right or wrong?" demanded Merriman.

"I disapproved of the proclamation," Khadra maintained.

Sir Henry Betterton, member of the Commission, at this point, turning to an interpreter, said: "Ask the witness if he agrees the acts at Hebron were murder?"

"No," was Khadra's reply.

"Was it a question of suicide?" R. Hopkin Morris then wanted to know. Khadra finally agreed that it was not suicide.

After questioning Khadra about his service in the Turkish Army and de-

ARAB PAPER PRAISES DR. MAGNES'S ATTITUDE AS ONE OF MODERATION Blames Zionists for Extremist Policies; "Al Carmel" Compares Chancellor to Pontius Pilate

Jerusalem, Dec. 2—The "Felestin," Arab publication, in its English edition yesterday praises the stand taken by Dr. Judah L. Magnes and Professor Hugo Bergmann, declaring that they are propagating moderation.

Blaming Dr. Chaim Weizmann, President of the Jewish Agency and the World Zionist Organization, and Vladimir Jabotinsky, head of the Zionist Revisionists, for extremist policies, the "Felestin" urges Dr. Magnes and his friends to continue the propagation of their ideas, because only with them can the Arabs negotiate.

The "Al Carmel" compares Sir John Chancellor to Pontius Pilate, charging that while the Jews are ruining the Arabs, Chancellor is washing his hands and delivering the Arabs to the mercy of the Jews.

PALESTINE HEBREW PRESS DENOUNCES MAGNES'S ACT

Jerusalem, Dec. 2—The Hebrew press of Palestine is unanimous in its opposition to the article in the New York "Times," in which Dr. Judah L. Magnes gave utterance to his views on Palestine.

The "Ha'Arezt" calls it a "negation of Zionism," declaring that Magnes does not believe in Zionism and its righteousness. The "Davar" is indignant that Magnes permitted the intrigue of St. John Philby, and asks: "Why is only Palestine to be delivered to all humanity? Why not Athens and Rome? They are also sacred to humanity."

The "Doar Hayom" asserts that the Magnes negotiations with St. John Philby are treacherous and asserts that he must resign from his post as Chancellor of the Hebrew University.

NORMAN BENTWICH RETURNS TO HIS OFFICE

Jerusalem, Dec. 2—Norman Bentwich, Attorney-General of Palestine, who was shot by an Arab last week, returned to his office today feeling quite well.

The Court of Appeal today confirmed the death sentence of Mustapha Derbes, who murdered Teledano, an advocate, in Safed. Derbes is expected to appeal to the Privy Council.

2 JAILED FOR HANDING OUT COMMUNIST PROPAGANDA

sersion to the British in 1917, Silley introduced a facsimile of propaganda material dropped on Turkish lines by British planes, in which Arabs were urged to desert the Turks and help "Sherif and Emir of Mecca and King of the Arab countries," on the British side.

When the Commission doubted the relevancy of this material to the subject of the inquiry, Silley declared: "The Zionists stand on what is known as the Balfour Declaration. My clients stand on this proclamation."

Betterson then interposed: "Is it your case that the existence of this proclamation contributed to the mental state producing the recent disturbances?"

"Yes, that is so. It is the latent feeling which contributed to the discontent," replied Silley. The Commission then permitted the introduction of the facsimile, following which Silley launched into the story of Khadra's movements between Palestine, Egypt and Hedjaz.

"What have this gentleman's movements after he deserted the Turks to do with us?" asked Shaw.

"It is material that the Commission should know what the class, which this witness represents, feels. We propose to show what influence the promises exerted on the mentality of the people," explained Silley.

The story Khadra told was that following immediately upon the heels of the issuance of the Balfour Declaration, he left Palestine, proceeding to Hedjaz. He had noticed that the Arab people, who always craved independence, were causing trouble under the Turkish regime, many of them have been martyred, while thousands deserted the Turks and fought with the British as allies.

Khadra said that he was a lieutenant King Feisal in Damascus, later being elevated to the rank of major.

Merriman then read King Feisal's letter to Professor Felix Frankfurter, member of the American Jewish Delegation at the Peace Conference, in which he gave his approval to the Zionist policy.

Khadra insisted that the independence promised to the Arabs included Palestine. He had never seen Feisal's letter, he asserted.

Silley introduced the Peace Treaty, showing that Abdul Hadi and a Syrian named Haidar, had signed in behalf of King Hussein, and that Feisal's signature was not there. He neglected to mention, however, that Feisal headed the Hedjaz delegation, but was absent from Versailles at the time the treaty was signed. Silley pressed this point, going as far as to say that Feisal was ignorant of the English language and did not know the contents of the statement to Professor Frankfurter.

Jerusalem, Dec. 2—Meir Franko, head of the Hebron Sephardic rabbis, has sent a memorandum to the Zionist executive protesting that until now the Hebron horrors, especially the government's responsibility for the massacre, has not been revealed before the Inquiry Commission, and demanding that the Hebron Jews and the district officers be called to give evidence before the Commission. The memo also insisted in an immediate beginning of the restoration of Hebron where many industries such as tanneries, soap manufacturing, glass, rugs, religious objects and hotels are possible.

KEREN HAYESOD OFFICIAL RESIGNS UNDER FIRE

Jerusalem, Dec. 2—Hans Kohn, director of the propaganda department of the Keren Hayesod, has resigned. Certain quarters here have been demanding an immediate because his articles have been regarded favorable to the British Shalom Society and harmful politically.

RESULTS OF RESEARCH AMONG BERLIN JEWS

Berlin, Dec. 2—Ministerialrat Gosler today published the results of a sociological research among the Jews of Berlin which shows that the greater part of the Jewish middle class has been economically ruined. Jewish commercial firms and banking houses have either dissolved or been taken over by non-Jews. Anti-Semitic economic envy is responsible for the dismissal of Jewish workers and office clerks. Gosler demands a Jewish economic conference in Germany to take steps to prevent complete ruin.

JEW REPRESENTS SULTAN'S HEIRS IN SUIT FOR FORTUNE

Constantinople, Dec. 2—Samir Gunsberg, a well-known Jewish dentist of this city, is representing the heirs of the famous Turkish Sultan, Suleiman Hamid, in a suit against Italy, France and Great Britain for the return of property belonging to the Sultan and that was seized by those powers. Gunsberg has retained the services of three local lawyers to aid him.
