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## Comzet Will Settle 5,376 Families on Land in 1930

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Jan. 9.—During 1930 the Comzet will settle 5,376 Jewish families on the lands, according to a decision taken today. Of this number 2,500 will be sent to Crimea, 2,176 to the Ukraine and 700 to Bira Bidjan.

Differences of opinion have now arisen as to whether it pays for the Comzet to continue the settlement of colonies in Birafield, Bira Bidjan where there are now 85 families. The opposition claims that the Birafield section lacks water and timber for house-building and is also far from the railroad, handicaps which other sections of Bira Bidjan do not suffer. It is likely that henceforth Birafield will get less settlers than other places in Bira Bidjan.

## German Press Has High Praise for Henri Torres

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Jan. 9.—The Berlin press is lavish in its praise of Henri Torres, the eminent French-Jewish lawyer and defender of Schwartzbard, who has come to Berlin at the invitation of the German-French Society to lecture on legal subjects.

To a newspaper representative here, Torres stated that the French jury that freed Schwartzbard represented the conscience of the French people. He believes that trial by jury should again be established in Germany.

The Chief Justice of Berlin has ordered that Torres be conducted on a tour of the prison institutions of the German metropolis.

## Report Rift Between Moslems and Christians

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Jan. 9.—Reporting the rift between the Moslems and the Christians, the Moslem daily "El Sarraat Moustakim" complains that an organization favoring the Mandate is gradually penetrating and bossing the Arab Executive. The same paper prints a letter from Tulkarem merchants flaying the Arabs who are exploiting the anti-Jewish boycott to profiteer.

## Traffic on Palestine Railroads Increases

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Jan. 9.—Passenger traffic on the Palestine railways increased 430,000 in 1929. A total of 1,200,000 used the railways as compared with 770,000 in 1928. The increase is partly due, undoubtedly, to the lack of security on the highways since August.

## Dickstein Only Jewish Member of Immigration Committee as Golder and Sabath Resign

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Washington, Jan. 9.—Shortly after Congressman Samuel Dickstein of New York made one of the longest single speeches in the House in recent years on the subject of immigration with reference to the five immigration bills he introduced at the opening of the 71st Congress, it became known that Congressman Adolph Sabath of Chicago and Congressman Benjamin Golder of Philadelphia had both resigned from the House Immigration Committee, leaving Dickstein as the only Jew and only avowed friend of immigration on the Committee.

The resignations of Sabath and Golder mean that the brunt of the fight for liberalizing the immigration law and preventing further restrictions, hitherto principally shared by Sabath, has been transferred to one individual, Dickstein, for the other Jewish members of Congress, not members of the Immigration Committee are not in a position to give material aid, as immigration policies are shaped within the committee.

As a result of relinquishing his post on the Immigration Committee, Congressman Sabath was promoted to membership on the powerful Rules Committee, one of the most important

## Kastl Quits Mandates Body But Will Hear Palestine Question

Berlin, Jan. 9.—Although Dr. Ludwig Kastl, the German member of the Mandates Commission of the League of Nations, has resigned in order to be free for other duties in Germany, he is expected to take part in the March sitting of the Commission which will deal with the Palestine situation. His successor to the Mandates Commission will no doubt be a German.

## Anti-Semites Quit Heimwehr as Propaganda Is Forbidden

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Jan. 9.—Since the anti-Semitic wing in the Heimwehr has until now been unsuccessful in imposing its policies upon the Austrian Heimwehr, prominent Hakenkreuzler, including the national leader of the Vienna "Heimatschutz," Pichl, have resigned, because the leaders of the Heimwehr, especially Steidle, had forbidden anti-Semitic propaganda at the Heimwehr meetings. Pichl argued that this attitude against anti-Semitism is creating a growing mistrust in the "Voelkische" anti-Semitic circles towards the Heimwehr.

## Inquiry Commission in Private London Hearing

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Jan. 9.—The Palestine Inquiry Commission held its first meeting today in the Colonial Office in order to further consider procedure in connection with the hearing of several witnesses in London. The sitting was private and no communique was issued.

It is learned that for the present no developments have occurred since the Commission left Palestine. The only delay in presenting the report is due to the necessity of taking further evidence. The Commission feels that it stayed rather long in Palestine owing to the volubility of the witnesses and it is now anxious to speed up its work in order to present its report as soon as possible, but not before the end of the month.

## Yevsekzia Says Plans to Better Conditions Ignored

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Jan. 9.—The recent recommendations of the Sovnarkom to improve the economic conditions of the Jews are being ignored by the commissariats concerned, complain the Yevsekzia leaders today in reporting that twice when a conference to consider the details of how to carry out these recommendations was called it did not meet because the representatives of the different commissariats who must participate did not attend. Basence, the government bank's representative, was especially criticized because the government bank has to approve all financial plans regarding the buying of raw materials and also the granting of credits.

## Cairo Synagogue Honors Italian Prince's Wedding

Cairo, Jan. 9.—The Italian and Belgian ambassadors and government representatives participated in a special synagogue service here in honor of the wedding of the Italian Crown Prince Humbert. The Chief Rabbi in his address thanked Italy and Belgium for the good relations with the Jews in those countries.

## To Renew Boycott Agitation With Financing by Merchants

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Jan. 9.—The relaxing of the anti-Jewish boycott agitation previously reported as due to the non-payment of the agents, will be energetically resumed, says the "Ha'Arezt," following a meeting of Arab merchants who decided to finance the boycott hitherto managed by the Arab Executive.

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### Labor Party Denied Use of Large Hall Due to Red Flag

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Tel Aviv, Jan. 9.—Because the meeting called to organize the Palestine Jewish Labor Party by a union of the two older parties used a red flag as part of its decoration, the committee administering the Ohel Shem Community Centre erected with funds contributed by S. Bloom, a Philadelphia Zionist, declined to permit the meeting to use this most desirable hall in Tel Aviv, reports the "Davar," labor daily, describing the hardships of thousands of delegates and visitors who were obliged to meet in the only partially roofed Peoples' House. The committee, headed by Chaim Bialik, declared that the hall was only available to Judaistic, cultural and artistic groups but "Davar" asserts that businessmen meet there often.

### Husein Says Transjordania More Independent than Iraq

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Jan. 9.—Former King Husein considers Transjordania more independent than Iraq, he told Mohammed El Dabaj, a Palestine Arab who visited Cyprus recently. Husein also denied the report that he intends to spend the rest of his days in Bagdad.

Declaring that he does not wish to see Arab land under foreign rule, Husein said that he prefers settling in Transjordania, although the real reason is that the exiled monarch probably feels closer to Abdullah than to Feisal.

El Dabaj also visited Imam Yehia, ruler of Yemen, who boasted of his fully equipped army of 40,000 and its ability to outmanoeuvre the British, whose air force is allegedly backing his enemies. Yemenite Jews are responsible for the damaging reports about him circulated in Palestine, said Imam.

### Prussian Jews Complaint at Delay in Enactment of Jewish Communities Law

The question of why a Jewish community ordinance for Prussia, giving the Jewish communities there the same rights as were recently accorded to Catholics and Protestants in Prussia, has not as yet been put into force by the Prussian government, was recently discussed at a meeting of a special committee of the German Zionist Federation, according to the "Juedische Rundschau." That the delay in enacting this law is threatening the very existence of Prussian Jewish religious life was pointed out by several speakers, who showed how the law which doesn't allow East European Jews who are not citizens to pay taxes to the Jewish communities is threatening to ruin many synagogues.

"More than a year and a half ago we were promised a Jewish community ordinance by the ministry," said Arnold Wiener at the meeting. "During that time hundreds of wealthy Jews had to leave the Jewish community as taxpayers. When one considers that these people may not pay any more synagogue taxes for the rest of their lives, the total loss of the Jewish community within a few years will amount to millions of marks. And what reason is there anyway for the delay in the enactment of this Jewish communities law?"

"The Evangelical and Catholic churches were recognized and their relation to the government was established even as far back as 1924. The Jewish communities of Prussia are today, 12 years after the establishment of the republic, still governed by laws, some of which are a century old.

"Our Jewish religious federation has almost unanimously decided for equal treatment of foreigners in the voting in Jewish communities. What justification has the ministry in acting against the will of Prussian Jewry?"

"The minister has even interfered in the religious life of the Jews. In smaller communities a decree is even being enforced that an East European Jew can never be called to the Torah—something which can no more be regarded as Judaism."

### ORDERED TO REINSTATE JEWISH ALPS CLIMBERS

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Jan. 9.—A German federal court has annulled the decision of the "Deutscher Alpenverein," society of German Alps climbers, expelling its Jewish members, whose reinstatement it has now ordered.

Some time ago, the "Deutscher Alpenverein" had decided that in the future it would limit its Jewish membership to a certain percentage. As a result of this, the Jews who were already members, organized a democratic Alps-club, which would place no restrictions upon Jewish membership, upon which the executive of the older Alps-club expelled them.

### Finnish State Opera Chief Kills Himself Because of Anti-Semitic Persecution

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Helsingfors, Jan. 9.—Because of persecution resulting from anti-Semitism and the fact that he was a citizen of Soviet Russia, Louis Laber, chief producer of the Finnish State Opera, committed suicide here yesterday. When he was engaged as manager of the State Opera his nationality was unknown since he had been living in Czecho-Slovakia for the last ten years and he was thought to be a Czech.

It was only when he applied for a renewal of his permit to stay in Finland that it was disclosed that he was a Russian subject and a Jew. Since then anti-Semitic artists have subjected him to various forms of persecution which caused him great unpleasantness. The refusal of the Finnish authorities to prolong his permit ripened his decision to commit suicide.

For the past two decades Laber has lived abroad and it was only last year that he took out a Soviet passport because he desired to visit his parents in Russia.

### Ramsay MacDonald Sends Greetings to Bernstein

Berlin, Jan. 9.—Prime Minister Ramsay MacDonald of Great Britain has sent a telegram to Eduard Bernstein, German-Jewish socialist leader, congratulating him upon attaining his eightieth birthday. "I hope that you will spend many more years in well-earned happiness," writes MacDonald. "Your many old friends here remember you with love."

Bernstein has received congratulatory telegrams from the Labor Party and from Socialist leaders from all parts of the world.

### Shochet Announces He Is Now a Horse Driver

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Jan. 9.—From orthodox meat slaughterer (shochet) to horse driver, is the step made by the well-known shochet of Dobrush, Nachman Hirschorn. "Not desiring to be considered as being part of the Kleikodish (rabbits, teachers, models and slaughterers) I hereby announce that instead of being a shochet I become from now on a horse driver," says Hirschorn's written notice to the local Soviet.

Reports of rabbis and shochetim quitting religious work increase daily, especially from White Russia. Rabbis Cjaim Muzhes of Homelm, Shimen Bolotin of Borodianke, and Moisse Yuditsky of Vietke, declared today that they are quitting the rabbinate.

### CHOSEN TO SENATE

Budapest, Jan. 9.—The Budapest Jewish orthodoxy has elected the Jewish banker Adolf Frankl as a member of the Hungarian senate.

## Recent Anti-Semitic Outbreaks at Jassy University and in Bucharest Described in Roumanian Papers Just Reaching U. S.

The various anti-Semitic student outbreaks that occurred in Roumania during the month of December are described in the Roumanian newspapers that have just arrived in this country.

A group of students who were dissatisfied with an item that appeared about their congress in the newspaper "Ellenzek" of Cluj, broke all the windows in that newspaper's building and then wrecked several Jewish shops in the neighborhood, reports the "Bukowiner Volkszeitung" of December 13. As a result the property of the Cafe Metropol was completely destroyed to the extent of 700,000 lei, the Fischer firm sustained a loss of 180,000 lei, the Erdely firm 100,000 lei, the Dazkal firm 450,000 lei, Judowitz firm 35,000 lei, Berenyi firm 15,000 lei, Safurth firm 14,000 lei, and Auslander 10,000 lei.

The Community Temple on Calea Regele Ferdinand was profaned and devastated. The government officials were advised of that and promised to take precautionary measures against any attempt of attack, yet the Czuzists have done their disruptive work unmolested, points out the "Curierul Israelit." Yet the official communication mentions that only a few windows were broken in Cluj.

The "Dimineata" of December 23 tells of the riot which students caused in the National Theatre of Bucharest on December 20 when they discovered that one of the performers that evening was a Jewess, Miss Leny Caler. The affair was arranged to commemorate the second anniversary of the death of Robert de Flers, a great friend of Roumania. France was represented through its minister in Bucharest, and the Roumanian government by two ministers, all of whom had to leave the theatre when the riot broke out. "It was an act which has shamed Roumania before the civilized world," says the newspaper.

That the recent anti-Semitic student congress in Roumania was held without the consent of the university authorities appears from a statement by Professor N. Jorga, rector of Bucharest University, which is reproduced in a recent issue of the Czernowitz "Bukowiner Volkszeitung." The statement reads:

"The rector wishes to state that he received neither a request from the students nor a notice from the Ministry of Education with regard to the convening of a student congress in Craiova. There could be no demand from the Ministry of Education upon the University, since the latter insofar as its inner affairs are concerned has the right to act for itself. Therefore the responsibility for this congress—just as for the one in Oradea—falls entirely upon those who approved it and organized it."

Professor Jorga also brought an interpellation with regard to this matter in the Chamber of Deputies, during which he said that "nationalism means order, but Christianity means tolerance and kindness."

This statement by Prof. Jorga, says the "Volkszeitung," is added proof that the anti-Semitic student movement has been organized by people who have no connection with the University of Bucharest.

How Jewish students were mistreated by their Christian fellow-students in the Jassy University on December 16th was told by some of the students themselves to a writer in the Kishineff Yiddish daily, "Unser Zeit." Among other things he tells:

"At the end of Professor Shumilian's lecture that day, the first one to try to leave the classroom was the student Wolfensohn. But the Christian students began to beat him in barbaric fashion and to yell at him for pushing. Afterwards they started beating other Jewish students. A turmoil ensued and the Jews began to run to the exit. A narrow stairway leads from the classroom. On both sides of the stairway, students armed with sticks were standing and hitting the Jews over their heads. The Christian students also began to push the Jews down the stairs. Many of them fainted and fell to the floor. Standing over their bodies they pushed the other Jews, and in that manner they reached the balcony where many Jewish students were sitting. A group of students came along and virtually threw them off the balcony.

"Many fainted. A young lady grabbed a glass of water, in order to give a student who had fainted a drink. But an assistant slapped her over the hand and threw the glass down. In general the Jewish girl students weren't spared and one of them was even seriously wounded. One student ran up to Professor Shumilian and asked him to take measures to stop the fight, upon which the anti-Semitic professor began to yell, 'It's none of your business! No one asks you.' Then Shumilian asked the student Missis, 'Aren't you ashamed to be a Jew?' And when the latter replied, 'No,' Shumilian slapped him twice.

"It is interesting that when the Jewish students wanted to send on Tuesday a dispatch to Deputy Landau in which they reported the situation, they were told in the post-office, 'We cannot accept lies!'"

## Hebron Arabs Complain as Police Seek Massacre Chiefs

Hebron, Jan. 9.—"Arrest, exile and torture us all you wish," said the Arab headmen of Hebron to the district officer demanding that they surrender the organizers of the massacre, according to a report in the "Felestin." Speaking on behalf of the notables, the mayor of Hebron is reported to have said: "Why ask us to surrender the conspirators after arresting hundreds, and imprisoning and sentencing to death others during the last four months?"

## 9-Year-Old Motza Survivor Tells of Murder of Almost Entire Macclef Family

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Jan. 9.—The nine-year old Mordecai Macclef, a survivor of the Motza tragedy, was among the witnesses called yesterday in the case against the twelve Arabs charged with the murder of his parents, brothers, sisters and guests, when the trial was resumed after several weeks adjournment owing to the illness of the public prosecutor Sherwell.

Regarding the little orphan as perhaps the youngest witness that ever appeared before him Chief Justice McDonnell enjoined the sobbing child to tell the whole truth. Thus reassured Mordecai described the attack and repeated his mother's words to the assailants in the dock, "what do you want of us." The child told of seeing his brother felled by a bullet in the garden and his parents, shot, rolling downstairs from the terrace.

The last witness for the prosecution was Mordecai's twelve-year old sister Hannah who briefly confirmed her brother's evidence about the attackers swooping down from the village of Kolonieh on the hillside overlooking Motza.

The defense submitted alibis for three of the prisoners.

## Arab Police Jailed for Neglect of Duty at Attack on Beertuvia

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Jan. 9.—Two Arab policemen of Gaza were sentenced to six months in prison in the district court at Jaffa, for neglect of duty during the attack on Beertuvia. Judge Copland pronounced the sentence behind closed doors because he did not wish "to wash dirty linen in public." Both were found guilty of deliberately having neglected their duty in time of danger to the settlement when people were killed and property destroyed.

Another policeman had been charged with neglect of duty in connection with the attack on Beertuvia. Wolinsky, one of the Jewish witnesses before the Inquiry Commission, had told how the three concealed themselves in a stable during the peak of the attack.

## Plan Conference of All Polish Zionist Groups

Warsaw, Jan. 9.—Upon the initiative of Nahum Sokolow, a conference of the central committees of the various Polish Zionist groups will be held for the purpose of creating an all-Polish Zionist central committee.

## Soviet Grants Subsidy to Jewish Theatre in Ukraine

Moscow, Jan. 9.—The Kharkov Soviet today assigned 15,000 rubles for the Jewish state theatre in Ukraine which has been undergoing a serious financial crisis.

## First Jew in Russian Diplomatic Corps Dead

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Jan. 9.—Gregory Wilenkin, former attaché at the Russian Embassy in Washington and Tokio and during the World War the special representative in the United States of the Russian minister of finance, died here today at the age of 66.

During the Portsmouth negotiations between Japan and Russia in 1905 he acted as chairman of the Russian financial commission. He was for many years private secretary to Count Witte, the Russian diplomat. Wilenkin was the first Jewish member of the Russian diplomatic corps and he used his influence for the improvement of the position of the Jews of Russia.

## Canadian-Jewish Statesmen Feted at Testimonial Dinner

Montreal, Jan. 9.—Declaring that while he was opposed to separate schools and did not want separate schools in the Province, he would be the first to ask for Jewish schools if the Protestants declined to cooperate, Peter Bercovitch, K.C., M.L.A., discussed the Quebec school situation at a dinner given in honor of himself and Joseph Cohen, M.L.A. for St. Lawrence, and Anatole Plante, M.L.A. for Mercier, on the eve of their departure to attend the opening of the Quebec legislature.

## Elected President Pro Tem of Cincinnati City Council

Cincinnati, Jan. 9.—Julian A. Pollak, Cincinnati steel manufacturer, recently elected as one of the nine city councilmen under the charter form of government, was appointed president pro tem of the council when it was formally organized recently. This makes him third in line as mayor of the city.

## Goldner and Sabath Resign From House Immigration Committee; Dickstein Left

in the House, and Goldner was named to the Banking and Currency Committee. Sabath, however, will probably have an opportunity of assisting friendly immigration legislation in the Rules Committee for this committee controls the consideration given to bills on the floor of the House.

In his speech, Congressman Dickstein severely criticized the policy heretofore pursued by the Immigration Committee of postponing action on friendly legislation until the very last minute which made it impossible to obtain enactment of such bills before the adjournment of each session of Congress. He made a strong plea for the amendment of the existing law as proposed by his bills to relieve some of the present hardships.

Congressman Dickstein was frequently interrupted by various members who showed an interest in his proposals but most of them seemed to be hostile, although Congressman Crisp seemed favorably inclined toward one bill regarding extending the period for legalizing the status of aliens who entered unlawfully.

The proposals put forward by Dickstein include the following: the exempting from the quota of parents and husbands of citizens who would be placed on an equal status with the wives of citizens, whereas now only husbands married to citizens prior to June 1, 1928 are exempt; legalizing the status of aliens entering unlawfully prior to July 1, 1924 instead of June 3, 1921; exempting from quota of refugee immigrants who obtained visas prior to July 1, 1924 but have been excluded because of an excess in the quotas; family visas to husband or wife enabling the entire family to emigrate immediately or within one year and thus prevent separation of families; allowing immigrants admitted temporarily to remain permanently, if during their stay they become eligible for permanent admission, such as by marriage to an American citizen. Now such aliens must go to Canada or Mexico to re-enter.

Congressman Dickstein pointed out that these bills would not conflict with the fundamental policy of immigration restriction but would simply humanize the law by removing some of its obvious defects. He also called attention to the fact that a number of his proposals were similar to those approved by Immigration Commissioner Hull.

## Jewish Children's Home to Mark 75th Anniversary

## Prof. Baron Invited to Chair in Jewish History at Columbia

Announcement has just been made that Professor Salo Baron of the Department of History of the Jewish Institute of Religion, has been invited by the Board of Trustees of Columbia University to become Professor of Jewish History, Literature and Institutions, which chair has been made possible through the recent gift to Columbia University by Mrs. Nathan J. Miller, in memory of her husband, Nathan J. Miller. This Chair constitutes a part of the Graduate Faculty of Philosophy and is primarily designed to foster research and interest in Jewish studies among the thousands of Jewish graduates and undergraduate students of that University.

Professor Baron was called to America in 1925 to serve as head of the Department of Jewish History at the Jewish Institute of Religion, where he has taught during these years. Two years ago he was invited by the Rabbinical Seminary of Breslau to accept its chair in Jewish History, made famous by the occupancy of the greatest of modern Jewish historians, Professor Graetz.

Professor Baron holds the degrees of Doctor of Philosophy, Doctor of Political Science and Doctor of Jurisprudence from the University of Vienna and the rabbinical degree from the Jewish Theological Seminary of Vienna. From 1919 to 1925, Dr. Baron served as Professor of History at the Vienna Paedagogium, then under the leadership of the late Chief Rabbi of Austria, Professor H. P. Chajes.

## ELECTED PRESIDENT OF RELIGIOUS TEACHERS

Richmond, Va., Jan. 9.—Dr. E. N.
