

JEWISH NATIONAL FUND CONFERENCE REAFFIRMS FAITH IN PRINCIPLE OF LAND ACQUISITION; PLANS TO RAISE \$500,000 TO EXTEND ACTIVITIES IN 1930

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Philadelphia, Jan. 20—A reaffirmation of their whole-hearted faith in the soundness of the principle which calls for the acquisition of land in Palestine as the inalienable property of the Jewish people under the aegis of the Jewish National Fund was given by upwards of 500 delegates attending the National Conference of the Jewish National Fund which ended here last night. After listening to stirring addresses by Emanuel Neumann, president of the Jewish National Fund, Louis Lipsky, president of the Zionist Organization of America and Major Daniel Hopkin, Labor member of the British House of Commons, the enthusiastic delegates pledged their support during the coming year with a view to raising at least \$500,000 for the Jewish National Fund.

With virtually every part of the country represented, the conference for conviction and loyalty will go down as one of the most animated gatherings ever held. All the speakers were unanimous in emphasizing the increased importance which the Jewish National Fund has taken on in recent months.

Major Hopkin stirred the delegates by the assurance that the British government, regardless of political complexion, will stand firmly on the Mandate. He urged American Jews to set the standard for the Jews of the whole world for the purchase of land in Palestine. Major Hopkin exhorted them not to be side-tracked by propaganda of one kind or another from the main issue of setting up the Jewish National Home by the acquisition of land. He assured them that the Zionist cause was not without influential friends in the House of Commons and he declared that had "a man been in Palestine instead of Luke there would have been no riots."

The Conference was opened by Rabbi Max D. Klein of Philadelphia, who turned the chair over to Emanuel Neumann, president of the Jewish National Fund, who in his presidential address declared emphatically that

Economic Anti-Semitism in Hungary Is More Effective

the Jews had been derelict in their duty, that they had not acquired enough land in Palestine. "Twenty percent of the population in Palestine is Jewish but only 6 percent of the land is in Jewish possession. This includes both privately owned land and that in the possession of the Jewish National Fund," he stated.

Says No Government Schools in Poland Where Jewish Is Instruction Language

Warsaw, Jan. 20—There is no government public school with Jewish as the language of instruction, declared the Jewish Deputy, Isaac Gruenbaum, during the debate on the educational budget at a Sejm session. Deputy Gruenbaum pointed out that while there wasn't a single government public school with Jewish as the language of instruction, of each thousand school children of Polish nationality a thousand attend elementary schools with Polish as the language of instruction, 553 out of every 1,000 German children attend schools with German as the language of instruction, 273 out of each 1,000 Lithuanian children attend schools where Lithuanian is the language of instruction and 41 White Russian children out of each thousand of them attend schools where their language is used for instruction.

He also declared that the teachers' positions in the government public schools for Jewish children where Polish is the language of instruction were filled mostly by non-Jews. Of a total of 4,800 teachers there are 1,889 Jewish teachers in these schools.

New Law Seen as Ban on Schechita in Bavaria

Berlin, Jan. 20—In accordance with a recent decision of the Bavarian parliament, the Bavarian government has submitted a bill to parliament which prohibits slaughtering without previously stunning the animal, which practically means a ban on schechita. German Jewish circles are depressed because the Bavarian government, which had previously been of the opinion that a schechita ban was unconstitutional has now abandoned that stand and given assurances that the bill will be passed. The Jews also fear that this will affect the status of schechita throughout Germany.

Jewish Colonies in Russia to Be 100% Collectivized in 1930, Comzet Declares

Moscow, Jan. 20—The Jewish agricultural colonies in Soviet Russia must be 100 percent collectivized during 1930. This is the decision adopted by the Comzet conference in Charkoff, which lasted three days and in which Merezkin, leader of the Comzet, and Dr. Rosen and Mr. Lubarski of the "Agrojoint" participated.

The conference also resolved, first, that individual Jewish colonists must submit their entire livestock, as well as their inventory, to collective barns; second, that cows which have been given in credit to new Jewish settlers be henceforth not given them directly, but be given to the collective; third, that houses which the American Joint and other organizations build for colonists should henceforth have no stables; fourth, that in the future, houses be built to accommodate several families instead of one; fifth, to remodel houses built since 1925 so that they should now have two families living in one house, instead of one as formerly.

The last two resolutions, especially the fifth, will undoubtedly meet with tremendous opposition on the part of the Jewish colonists, because it means not only merging the land or livestock but even people which is a blow to the settlers, who consider their houses as their own property, because many have already repaid the credits which they received for house-building.

Reports received from the regional Comzet representatives at the conference, related that the Kherson region is already 100 percent collectivized, in the Krivoy-rog region is 82 percent collectivized, Zaporozhie region 77 percent, Nikopol region 80 percent, and the Odessa region almost totally. In the Odessa region many Jewish kulaks have already been expelled from the collectives. In the Zaporozhie region, no Jew is accepted in the collective unless he submits into the collective treasury all the cash received for selling part of his inventory before joining the collective.

Appeal in Halsmann Case To Be Heard Tomorrow

Vienna, Jan. 20—The appeal in the Halsmann trial, which will begin its hearing tomorrow, is now occupying the center of interest of the Austrian public and press. Several famous non-Jewish experts in criminology have issued an article in which they show that the verdict of guilty rendered by the Innsbruck court against Halsmann has no basis in fact.

Mark 50th Anniversary of Tietz Department Stores

Cologne, Jan. 20—Representatives of the municipal government and of international commerce, as well as thousands of friends and employees, celebrated yesterday the fiftieth anniversary of the founding of the great chain of department stores in Germany by Leonhard Tietz, famous for the social welfare work the chain does on behalf of its thousands of employees.

In connection with the celebration, Alfred Tietz, the main stockholder, has donated 400,000 marks for the benefit of the poor. The University of Cologne has conferred upon him an honorary doctor's degree.

Denies "Welt am Montag" Is Anti-Semitic Periodical

Berlin, Jan. 20—The leader of the German Democratic party, Helmut von Gerlach, is aroused over the fact that the "Palestine Weekly" has said recently that the "Welt am Montag," Democratic organ, is an anti-Semitic article, while quoting an anti-Semitic article that appeared in it.

Gerlach asks the German Zionists to explain to their Palestine friends that the "Welt am Montag" is not responsible for the anti-Semitic opinions expressed in the article. He is the editor and owner of the paper.

2 Jews, 2 Arabs with District Officer to Rule Safed

Jerusalem Jan. 20—The "Official Gazette" announces the demotion of the local councils in the Arab villages of Yahudieh and Baitdajan and also the appointment of a district officer, two Jews and two Arabs to constitute the local authority in Safed in place of the municipal council.

Judge David A. Lourie of Boston, Zionist Leader and Civic Worker, Dies at 51

Boston, Jan. 20—Judge David A. Lourie, superior court judge, civic worker, Zionist leader and distinguished public figure, died here Saturday at the age of 51. He was appointed to the bench in 1922 by Governor Cox and in 1924 was elevated to the Superior Court, the first Jew to be so honored. His death was due to a recurrence of a physical ailment following a record-breaking session in the East Cambridge criminal court where he had tried several criminal cases. Known as the "faithful and honest Lourie" he stuck to his post although Chief Justice Hall offered to relieve him.

Judge Lourie was the best-loved Jew in the community. He was greatly in demand as a public speaker and until his illness a year ago was glad to go everywhere. Before he came on the bench he was a lawyer and a realtor. Judge Lourie came to the U. S. at the age of six. He was a newsboy and later taught English to other immigrants. By virtue of his sheer ability he worked his way to the leadership of the community.

He had served as a member of the Chelsea School Board, chairman of the Chelsea Board of Health, honorary president of the Zionist Organization of America, vice-president of the Bureau of Jewish Education, president of the Home for Jewish Children, chairman of the Executive Committee of the Federation of Jewish Charities, a member of the American Jewish Committee and a delegate to the American Jewish Congress.

Judge Lourie is survived by his wife and four children.

Philadelphia, Jan. 20—Elihu D. Stone, an assistant U. S. District Attorney for Boston and a vice-president of the Zionist Organization of America and an associate of Judge Lourie and Mendel Fisher, for many years executive secretary of the New England Zionists, also close to Judge Lourie, when informed of Judge Lourie's death issued a joint statement eulogizing the leader of Boston Jewry.

The Conference of the Jewish National Fund also adopted a resolution of regret and sympathy and the delegates stood in silent tribute for a moment in memory of Judge Lourie.

Jewish Women Turn Over Gold, Silver to Soviet Fund

Moscow, Jan. 20—Tass, the Soviet news agency, reports that in Minsk, Mohilev and Korosten, the Jewish women have voluntarily submitted gold and silver articles for the Soviet gold industrialization fund. The newspaper "Oktjabr" describes the scenes in Minsk when aged Jewish women brought their candlesticks, rings, necklaces earrings and even samovars for the fund.

Canadian Zionist Chief Would Have Extraordinary Conference of Agency Called in London

Montreal, Jan. 20—A suggestion that the Administrative Council of the Jewish Agency call an extraordinary congress of the Jewish Agency in London after the report of the Palestine Inquiry Commission is announced was made by A. J. Freiman, president of the Canadian Zionist Organization at the 22nd national convention of the Canadian Zionist Organization, which met here Sunday. Over 50 delegates representing Jewish communities from Halifax to Vancouver were present.

A resolution was adopted declaring that "whilst the Canadian Zionists expressed their regret that the Palestine administration did not take sufficient precautions to prevent the outbreaks nor proceed with the necessary rapidity and effectiveness to quell them, we hope that the proper authorities will continue their present efforts to assure order and security and we express our renewed loyalty to Great Britain in the knowledge that it will continue to carry out in spirit and in letter the terms of the Mandate and while respecting the safeguards therein expressed the inhabitants of the country will lend needed active support for the creator in Palestine of the Jewish National Home."

In his presidential address, Mr. Freiman referred to Dr. Magnes as having "made extremely ill-considered remarks when he defined a cultural center as the only goal of Zionism, and called upon Jews to aid in establishment of an international holy land for Jew, Christian and Moslem alike. We especially deplore misleading impressions created unwittingly by Dr. Magnes's rash utterances," declared Mr. Freiman.

He also reviewed the activities of the Canadian Zionists, and mentioned their acquisition of 48,000 dunams of land in Emik Ha-Sharon, for which \$400,000 of the million pledged has already been paid. In connection with his suggestion for an extraordinary congress of the Jewish Agency Mr. Freiman declared it was too important a matter to be left to the Zionist Executive.

France to Guarantee Loan for Rebuilding in Damascus

Damascus, Jan. 20—News has been received here that France will guarantee a million dollar loan to repair the area of the city devastated during the bombardment of 1925.

Claims Mouzza Far's Jailing Is Affront to All Moslems

Jerusalem, Jan. 20—The continued imprisonment of the boycott agitator Mouzza Far, is an indignity to all Moslems, says the latest telegram from Arab notables to High Commissioner Chancellor.

Widow and Son of Late Canadian Jewish Magnate Sue to Depose Executors

Montreal, Jan. 20.—The millions of the late Canadian Jewish tobacco magnate and philanthropist, Sir Mortimer B. Davis, have become involved in a court action here, taken by his widow and son, who seek to depose Lord Shaughnessy and Alexander M. Reaper from the executorship.

Sir Mortimer's widow, is his second wife, a Christian and a former manicurist who is now in France. His son is in New York. The plaintiffs complain that maladministration of the estate has caused a depreciation in value and demand an account of monies.

Sir Mortimer Davis died March 22, 1928, in Cannes, France, leaving his wife and son \$67,000 a year for the period of their life. Lord Shaughnessy, a well-known barrister, was appointed executor of the fortune of many millions. According to the will if at the end of 50 years Sir Mortimer has no legal heirs the entire estate is to be devoted to Jewish and non-sectarian charitable institutions.

Just before his death Sir Mortimer contributed \$300,000 for a new Y. M. H. A. building.

Jewish Peasants Organize Matzoth Baking Cooperatives

Moscow, Jan. 20.—With Passover not so far off, the Jewish colonists are asking "what about matzoth?" and are answering the question by organizing special artisans' cooperatives in the colonies for baking matzoth, not only for themselves, but to sell. The Moscow Jewish Communist newspaper reports that in the colonies of Nahartiv, Lvov, Neizhitomir and Kherson in the Batriki region, meaning the poorest, the Jewish peasants have organized such cooperatives, some even under the chairmanship of young Jewish peasant Communists to provide matzoth from their bakeries for the entire region.

The "Emes" terms it "tolerance towards religion," and urges strict opposition.

Communist Paper Does Not Trust Rabbis Who Deny God

Moscow, Jan. 20.—"We should not trust those rabbis who denounce their past even if they do publish open letters in our press," declares the "Oktiabr," referring to the action of Rabbi Moïshe Gelman, for 24 years a rabbi, who last week announced that he no longer believed in God and had nothing more to do with Rabbinism or religion.

The "Oktiabr" distrusts Rabbi Gelman's statement. "Gelman and also the rabbis who convert themselves do it only to fool us so that we will discontinue our fight on the Jewish religion. We shall unmask their new tactics."

More Geniuses Among Jews Than Numbers Warrant

Indianapolis, Jan. 20.—The Jewish people today, as well as in past history, had more geniuses proportionately to their number than any other people of history, Prof. A. C. Garnett, head of the department of philosophy of religion, Butler University, this city, declared in an address to the Bible Investigation Club at the Y. M. C. A.

Prof. Garnett, a native of Australia and a graduate of King's College, London, and the University of Melbourne, asserted that the Bible is the most remarkable of classics.

Says "American Hebrew" Shows U. S. Jewry's Contribution to Country Valued by Statesmen

Budapest, Jan. 20.—The Hungarian press, quoting from the fiftieth anniversary number of the "American Hebrew," shows the Hungarian people how greatly the contribution of American Jewry to the upbuilding of the United States is valued by American statesmen.

The "Pester Lloyd" shows that American Jewry has been able to contribute so much to the general welfare of the country because of the full freedom and equal treatment that it enjoys. Quoting also from the articles on the Hungarian-Jewish question in the "American Hebrew," especially Minister Korn's conclusions, the same paper says that if Hungary will treat Jews as they are being treated in America, it will also gain very much.

Sorry Mandates Body Special Session Was Postponed

London, Jan. 20.—Regret at the postponement of the extraordinary session of the Mandates Commission because such action is calculated to delay the final pacification of Palestine was expressed by Lucien Wolf, secretary of the Joint Foreign Committee of the Board of Jewish Deputies and the Anglo-Jewish Association, in presenting the report of his committee to the Board of Deputies. He did however, recognize the need for a thorough investigation, and he reported that the Committee, in agreement with other Jewish organizations was considering steps for the adequate defence of Jewish interests before the Commission of Inquiry.

Report Parley Planned Between Saud, Dawish

Jerusalem, Jan. 20.—A parley between Faisal El Dawish and Ibn Saud, king of the Hedjaz, in a neutral zone between Iraq and Nedj is soon to take place, according to a report from Bagdad. The main object of the parley is the prevention of tribal raids.

Sees Jewish Townships Near Collectivized Villages as Facing Complete Destruction

Moscow, Jan. 20.—That the Jewish townships and neighboring regions where the villages have been totally collectivized, will face total destruction, is the opinion of J. Kantor, Comzet leader of Ukraine, upon his return from a trip to the Odessa region, where total collectivization has been accomplished.

Kantor reports that in those townships even the "kustars" (artisans) are without prospects, because everything has been centralized and is being done by cooperatives in collectives, including the mending of shoes and clothes.

Kantor believes that part of the Jewish "kustars" can be settled in collectives and utilized there in special professions. The majority, however, will have to migrate from the townships, because it will be absolutely impossible for them to earn anything there.

The "Emes," Yiddish Communist daily, asks today that the Jewish kulaks (richer peasants) be expelled from the collective farms immediately.

Tools Received from Ort By Individuals Must Not Be Taken, Soviet Rules

Moscow, Jan. 20.—An order which is of tremendous importance to Jewish artisans in Russia who are former traders, was issued yesterday by the finance commissary Brukhanov upon the request of the Ort. The order instructs the Soviet tax collectors not to confiscate machines and tools received by individuals through the Ort from relatives abroad.

Lately there have been many cases where machines were confiscated under the pretext that the owners owe the government treasury old taxes. Brukhanov now orders that the confiscated machines be immediately returned to their owners. A copy of Brukhanov's order was dispatched to every tax department throughout the Soviet Republic. Every owner of a machine will also receive a copy of the order, to enable him to show it to tax collectors in case of a misunderstanding. Brukhanov's order insures complete ownership only for those machines received through the Ort.

Arab Leader Protests Against Arab Shopkeepers' Profiteering

Jerusalem, Jan. 20.—Hassan Sidki De-jani, one of the most active members of the Arab Executive, in an open letter to the Arab press, deplors the fact that Arab merchants are profiteering on account of the boycott against the Jewish merchants and shopkeepers. He says that the Arabs have thus shown themselves unfit for freedom, and he threatens to publish the names of offending Arab shopkeepers.

port, indicated that from October 1, 1924 to October 1, 1929, the period during which the J.N.F. was a part of the United Palestine Appeal, the total revenue of the National Fund had been \$1,562,807 and that of this sum \$1,132,103 was derived from the ordinary sources of income of the National Fund such as flag day, flower day, corrections and Golden Book. Greetings were brought to the conference in person by Louis Lipsky on behalf of the Zionist Organization of America, Mrs. Robert Szold for the Hadassah, Rabbi Wolf Gold for the Mizrahi, Dr. I. J. Bluestone for the Order Sons of Zion, Berl Locker for the Poale Zion, Chaim Greenberg for the Zeire Zion, Samuel Dayan for the Palestine Labor Delegation and Judge William Lewis, National Chairman of the U. P. A. on behalf of the Independent Order of Brith Shalom.

Messages of greetings were read from M. Ussishkin and Albert Einstein. Mr. Ussishkin wrote that "the severest attacks on us and our activity is directed against the land question. . . . In the present circumstances we cannot be satisfied with the J. N. F.'s present rate of activity. . . . At the instance of the highest Zionist authority . . . you have the right and duty of extending J. N. F. activity and I call on you to strain every effort to do so."

Dr. Einstein wrote "The sublime social idea of the Jewish National Fund lifts the movement for the rebirth of the Jewish people in Palestine to the zenith of a high humanitarian ideal upon which attacks and atrocities are ineffective; but only by Jewish strength and effort can the realization of this beautiful idea be realized. May American Jewry never forget that in this the greatest Jewish task of the generation is at stake."

During the course of the day the delegates listened to addresses by Dr. Schmarva Levin, Joseph Simon and Elias M. Epstein, secretary of the J. N. F. head office in Jerusalem. Both Mr. Epstein and Mr. Lipsky in their addresses pointed out the falsity of the charge that the Jews by acquiring land in Palestine are doing an injustice to the Arabs. They showed that on the contrary the Arab fellahen had been liberated by this land purchase and been treated with unprecedented generosity.

Of the 20 resolutions presented by the resolutions committee headed by Prof. Gustave Klausner, the Conference approved 17. The resolutions were: 1, pledging the J.N.F. to an extension of its land-buying activities and to expand and further develop its resources; 2, that special emphasis be placed on dunam land donations; 3, that the conference should encourage the practice of American Jews of making the J.N.F. beneficiary of policies, bequests and endowments; 4, the setting aside by all congregations of one high festival for a J.N.F. appeal and the holding of a special function for

the benefit of J.N.F. by all Jewish communities; 5, to hold an annual J.N.F. conference; 6, to spread J.N.F. ideals among the youth and to get them into J.N.F. work; 7, appreciation for work of M. Ussishkin, President Emanuel, Secretary Rubin and the Philadelphia Zionists; 8, Jewish organizations to make annual contributions to J.N.F. and Jewish congregations to buy land as units; 9, the creation of an Ussishkin week and support for a Louis Marshall memorial in Palestine.

Announcement was made of a gift of a \$45,000 piece of land on Mt. Scopus by Solomon Lamport to the J.N.F. to build a botanical garden as a memorial to Mr. Lamport's son, Joseph Montague. Israel Rokeach also contributed \$50,000 and an anonymous gift of \$70,000 was made.

Near its end the Conference voted for the creation of a national council of 150, 75 members to be elected and 75 to be named by the board of directors but the conference agreed to have the names of those to be elected referred to the board of directors.

Lack of Bank Credit Perils Jewish Fields in Ukraine

Moscow, Jan. 20—Jewish fields in the Ukraine are in danger of being behind in the Spring sowing because the Agrarian Bank is not anxious to grant the Comzet, government department for settling the Jews on the land, a three million rouble credit for the Jewish colonists. The entire Comzet budget is seven million roubles, including these three millions, which, if not granted, will affect the Comzet plans.

A. Merizhin, a leader of the Jewish Communists, openly declared that if the three million roubles are not received, the Comzet will be compelled to refuse credits to the Jewish colonists in Ukraine and limit itself to aiding the Crimean colonists only.

Greek Orthodox Patriarch Is Reported Paralyzed

Jerusalem, Jan. 20—The Greek Orthodox Patriarch is paralyzed, the Arab paper "Flestin" reveals, in demanding immediate changes in the administration of the Patriarchate and disclosing a conspiracy among a group of priests against the committee temporarily administering its affairs.

Hear Government Lifts Ban on "El Jamal Arabie"

Jerusalem, Jan. 20—The Hebrew paper "Doar Hayom" reports that the government has lifted the ban on the Arab paper "El Jamal Arabie," which was suspended for printing the fake story about a Jewish plot against the Mufti's life.

English Jewry Mourns Passing of Mrs. Hertz

London, Jan. 20—Jewish circles here are in mourning at the sudden death of Mrs. Joseph Hertz, wife of Chief Rabbi Joseph Hertz. She became ill following an car operation from which she had not yet entirely recovered, but her condition was not considered serious. Mrs. Hertz was a graduate of an American university and was very prominent in communal affairs. She was president of the Grocery Relief Fund, Domestic Training School for Girls in Jerusalem, and active in the work of the London Jewish Hospital.

Says 65,000 Deceased Jews Need Relief in Ukraine

Moscow, Jan. 20—There are 65,000 deceased Jews in Ukraine now that need special relief, according to the statistics offered by the "Emes," organ of the Moscow Jewish Communists. These figures refer only to ex-traders and not to artisans, who, as the "Emes" emphasizes, also need relief, but of a different kind.

\$125,160 Paid in Advances to Riot Sufferers in 4 Cities

Jerusalem, Jan. 20—Nearly \$125,160 in advances have been received by the riot sufferers in Safed, Haifa, Tel Aviv and Jerusalem, according to an announcement by the Palestine Emergency Fund. Safed was granted \$35,000, Haifa \$15,345, Tel Aviv \$9,815, and Jerusalem \$65,000. All of these advances are temporary, pending government compensation and the final disposal of the Jewish fund.

Oranges of Jewish Groves Fetch Highest Prices
