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Jewish Proselyte's Brief To Be Used in Fight on Arab Death Sentences

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Jan. 29—Abcarius, a Jewish proselyte, is preparing the briefs that English counsel for the Arabs will plead before the Privy Council in the fight against the Arab death sentences. His brief argues, first, that the Court of Appeals was improperly composed, since the judges were familiar with the proceedings of the lower courts; second, that all premeditated murder cases should have been postponed pending the Inquiry Commission's findings if the riots were organized; third, that there are discrepancies between the British and Ottoman law as regards premeditation; and fourth, that the presence of 30 or 40 people, all charged with murder, constitutes a problem of unusual gravity.

400,000, Not 65,000 Jews, Need Relief, "Emes" Admits

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Jan. 29—Not 65,000 Jews need urgent relief in Ukraina as stated by the Jewish Communist daily "Emes" ten days ago, but 400,000, says an article in the same newspaper by L. Zinger, director of the Ort Statistical Bureau in Moscow.

In a lengthy article containing much data, Zinger shows that immediate relief is necessary for 125,000 unemployed individual Jews and for 60,000 Jewish ex-traders' families and 36,000 Jewish artisans' families.

In a footnote to Zinger's article, the "Emes" admits that its previous estimate of 65,000 was "absolutely incorrect." However, the "Emes" thinks that Zinger's figures are exaggeratedly pessimistic.

Anti-Semites Disturb Lecture of Prussian Education Minister

Vienna, Jan. 29—Hakenkreuzler students repeatedly disturbed the lecture on "The Present Cultural Crisis" by the Prussian Minister of Education, Becker, which he was giving today before members of the Austrian government. Police finally removed the anti-Semites. The trouble started when Herr Becker mentioned Dr. Sigmund Freud's new work on the "Cultural Crisis."

TEL AVIV'S SLAUGHTER HOUSE SITE APPROVED

Tel Aviv, Jan. 29—The government has officially informed the municipality that the site for the new slaughterhouse has been approved. Building will start at once.

Bavarian Parliament Passes Law Forbidding Schechita

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Munich, Jan. 29—The Bavarian Parliament today passed the law which in effect is a prohibition of schechita, the Jewish method of slaughtering animals. The law forbids the slaughtering of animals without first stunning them. Parliament approved the law by a vote of 65 to 42, the opposition votes being all cast by members of the People's Party. The law goes into effect October 1.

Bavarian Jewry has decided to appeal to the Central Parliament in Berlin and to the highest Reich court to annul the Bavarian Parliament's action because it infringes the German constitution's guarantees of religious freedom.

Takes up Silesia's Refusal of Rights to Jewish Peddlers

Warsaw, Jan. 29—Heschl Farbstein, a Jewish deputy in the Polish Sejm, has intervened with the Minister of Home Affairs, Jozewski, regarding the refusal of Silesia to grant trading rights to Jewish peddlers, and also in connection with the incitement of the weekly paper "Do Czynu," accusing Jews of ritual murder. Deputy Farbstein also discussed the question of Jewish corpses for Jewish medical students. The Minister promised favorable action.

Court Restrains Orthodox Rabbis On Cleveland's Unsupervised Kosher Slaughter Houses

Cleveland, Jan. 29—The orthodox rabbis and the Vaad Hakashruth (board supervising sale and manufacture of kosher products) have been restrained and enjoined, and consequently are not permitted to issue a prohibitory decree against unsupervised alleged kosher slaughter houses, by a decree handed down today by Homer G. Powell, chief judge of the Court of Common Pleas, who some time ago ruled in the Jewish Center case that civil courts in Ohio have no jurisdiction over ecclesiastical matters.

The decision was given on an application for a temporary restraining order in a suit brought by an alleged kosher meat wholesaler, Benjamin Cohen, representing Swift & Co. of Cleveland. The plaintiff has been opposed to the Vaad Hakashruth for several years, at all times refusing to recognize its authority and that of the rabbis affiliated with it. In an attempt to smash it he began to undersell alleged kosher meat.

Several weeks ago, the Orthodox

Hear Arab Official Going to London to Lay Groundwork for Visit of Arab Delegation

Jerusalem, Jan. 29—Following favorable conversations with Arab leaders and with British officials who are pleased with the decision to send an Arab delegation to London and who are willing to assist it in the Colonial Office, George Antonius, an Arab government official, will precede the delegation to London to prepare the ground work for it, declares the Arab paper "Annafir," published in Haifa. Antonius is an assistant director in the Palestine department of education. During the Inquiry Commission hearings he was called as a witness.

While the "Annafir's" report may or may not be true the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns that the Palestine government does not intend to offer any objection to the Grand Mufti or Mayor Nashashibi going to London as members of the Arab delegation, although both are pseudo-government officials.

Working on Palestine Police Reform Plan

Jerusalem, Jan. 29—Inspector-General Dowbiggin, formerly of the Ceylon police, has arrived here and is already working on a plan to reorganize the Palestine police force.

rabbis affiliated with the Vaad Hakashruth issued a prohibitory order against the Jewish ritual slaughterers affiliated with Swift & Co. To overcome this order, an agent for the wholesaler engaged a former slaughterer, himself under a ban from the rabbis, and who proclaimed himself a rabbi without authorization, declared that the ban of the rabbis was contrary to Jewish law. Named Counsellor to Legation in Moscow

Kovno, Jan. 29—Henrikas Rabinavicius, formerly first secretary of the Lithuanian legation in Washington, and later Lithuanian consul-general in New York, was today appointed counsellor to the Lithuanian legation in Moscow. Mr. Rabinavicius has also served in the Lithuanian diplomatic service in Latvia, England and Denmark.

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Rosenwald Again Honorary Head
of Chicago Jewish Charities

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Chicago, Jan. 29.—At the annual meeting of the Jewish Charities of Chicago, Julius Rosenwald, noted American-Jewish philanthropist, was re-elected honorary president. All the other officers were unanimously re-elected. They are: Alfred Foreman, president; Sol Kline and Samuel Philipson, vice-presidents; James H. Becker, treasurer; and Maxwell Abbell, secretary. Louis M. Cahn, executive director, at his own request was not re-elected.

In his annual message to the organization, Mr. Foreman declared that plans are being made now for the building of a Jewish convalescent home in Chicago. The Jewish Consumptive Relief Society, which is expected to sponsor this project, already has voted \$100,000 toward the hospital.

"While the income of the Chicago Jewish Charities of \$1,501,778, was \$9,223 greater than for 1928 and the largest in our history," Mr. Foreman warned, "the growth of our income has been practically at a standstill for the past three years. More money must be raised or we are falling down on our jobs."

In September, 1929, the list of contributors to the Chicago Jewish Charities decreased to less than 9,000, out of a Jewish population here of about 300,000. This resulted in the discovery that 100 subscribers were contributing more than \$657,000, or more than 51 percent, of the total income, outside of interest from the endowment fund. To help this situation, Max Adler volunteered to lead a campaign for new members only. In one month, more than 2,100 new members, at an average subscription of \$32 each, were secured.

"In this campaign," said Mr. Foreman, "it was found that at least 15,000 Chicago Jews able to contribute \$15,000 a year and over were not doing so."

Dormitory Asks Dismissal of
\$10,000 Suit of Jewish Co-Ed
Who Charged Discrimination

Madison, Wis., Jan. 29.—Declaring that the \$10,000 suit of Mildred L. Gordon, Jewish co-ed at the University of Wisconsin who is suing the operators of Langdon Hall, one of the University's women's dormitories on the charge that it refused to admit her because she was a Jewess, was a "fictitious claim and not substantial," the Mendota Building Corporation, defendant, filed its answer in the Federal Court here yesterday.

The defense claiming that the matter in controversy does not exceed three thousand dollars and that hence the court has no jurisdiction asks that the suit be dismissed. In the answer filed by William Ryan, attorney for the Mendota Building Company, a denial is made that the company had any knowledge that the student was "a devout member of the Jewish faith" or that at any time it had refused to "furnish the plaintiff with accommodations at Langdon Hall."

A counter charge is made by the defendant that Miss Gordon refused a room in a neighboring house or hotel until she could be assigned to a room and had demanded instead that her money be returned and her baggage sent to an address where she had already engaged a room. With Judge Carl Z. Luse ill, it is doubtful whether the case will reach the calendar until next December.

On January 10 Miss Gordon had filed suit on a charge of discrimination, basing her charge on the fact that after the dormitory had approved her application she was denied admission when she arrived with her baggage. She pointed out that on the application blank she was asked her religious affiliations.

Harbin Jews Fear Pogrom
as White Guards Protest

Moscow, Jan. 29.—A Jewish pogrom in Harbin, Manchuria, is feared in connection with Russian White Guard demonstrations against the Soviet management of the Chinese Eastern Railroad. Reports wired from Harbin to Moscow tell of several hundred ex-Czarists who were discharged from the railroad's employ, attacking the Soviet offices, holding mass meetings, proclaiming anti-Semitic slogans, and calling for a pogrom.

The reports add that the Jewish population is in a panic because the White Guards are meeting with no opposition from the local authorities.

Lemberg Jewish Physician Killed in
Auto Accident on Way to Rabbi

Warsaw, Jan. 29.—A Lemberg Jewish physician, by name of Selzer, was killed in an automobile accident yesterday, while on his way to treat the sick rabbi of Magerow.

Prof. Jorga Claims Trivial
Disturbances in Roumania
Are Over-Emphasized

Too much attention has been given to the small disturbances in some Roumanian universities, declared Prof. Nicholas Jorga in an interview with the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, on his arrival in New York. Prof. Jorga, who in 1895 established, together with Prof. Cuza, the Alliance Anti-Semite Universelle, in Bucharest, is today an opponent of the anti-Semitic movement.

Prof. Jorga stated: "They were considered as manifestations of a general anti-Semitic feeling. The Roumanians know no pogroms; they are incapable of committing them. According to the new constitution, the Jews enjoy equal rights and opportunities with the other citizens of Roumania. Their duty is to work together with the others to the furthering of their Fatherland's interests."

"As president of the University of Bucharest, the highest institution of learning in Roumania, and as leader of the National Party, I condemn any disturbance of any kind. When casual hostile manifestations occur, they are only due to competition between the various national elements for free professions. The government has never approved of such disturbances, and measures were taken to suppress them. This is all I can say."

Disappearance of Koutiepoiff
Recalls His Anti-Semitism

Paris, Jan. 29.—The news of the strange disappearance of General Alexander Paul Koutiepoiff, former head of the staffs of Generals Denikin and Wrangel, and now chief of the White Russians living in exile, is recalling his notorious anti-Semitic activities. It was General Koutiepoiff who was largely responsible for the anti-Jewish violence of the White Armies.

To him Jew and Communist were synonymous and he therefore "decorated" the streets of Rostoudon, Khar'kov and the smaller cities with hanged innocent Jews. His name is remembered with horror by all Jews in Southern Russia. He was responsible for the ill-treatment of the Jews who were seized by the White intelligence service.

After General Wrangel's death he was named chief of the White Guards living abroad. He has lived in fear of the Bolsheviks and his Jew-hatred has become intensified.

One Dead, Two Hurt as Fire
Guts Jewish Orphan Home

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Kovno, Jan. 29.—A fire in the Jewish Orphan Home here last night resulted in the death of a 4-year-old boy, Segalowitz, and in two children being seriously hurt. Eighty-three children were saved, but the damage to the Home is so great that they are now all without shelter.

Rabbi Louis I. Newman Calls for Peace and Unity in Ranks of American-Jewish Leaders Working for Palestine Upbuilding

A call for peace and unity in the ranks of those American-Jewish leaders who are working for the upbuilding of a Jewish Palestine has been issued recently by Rabbi Louis I. Newman, writing in one of his syndicated articles, "Telling It in Gath." Rabbi Newman sees the friends of Palestine endeavor in this country divided into three antagonistic groups, the non-Zionists of the Agency, the Brandeis-Mack and the Lipsky group. He mentions seven leaders, whom he regards as the "key-people" in American Zionism—Felix Warburg, Louis D. Brandeis, Stephen S. Wise, Julian W. Mack, Louis Lipsky, Bernard Flexner and Jacob de Haas.

"Would it not be a splendid day for world Israel if these seven men could sit down amicably at the conference table, resolve their differences, and agree upon the common denominator of their program?" asks Rabbi Newman. "Dissension within our ranks is suicidal. We are facing our adversaries at the bar of the nations; Great Britain, the Arabs and the Christian world, rapidly turning against the Zionist project. I have been told that my advocacy of consolidation is 'ideally desirable, but practically impossible,' human nature being what it is. I shall, however, refuse to be discouraged, though when I left the office of Louis Lipsky, I was profoundly depressed. Another public fight in the ranks of Palestine's purported friends would cripple the movement even more tragically than now.

"It has been suggested that a great American convocation of all of Palestine's friends be summoned; but if these 'key-people' cannot find a basis of mutuality at a private conference table, if necessary behind locked doors, the press excluded, what earthly purpose would a public convention serve?

"Perhaps it is better that the Brandeis-Mack group go its way on worthwhile economic plans, supported by private investors, quietly reached; perhaps it is better that the Agency plan its joint campaign, with monies for Eastern Europe and Palestine to be gathered in a single appeal, such as we advocated in the unhappy days of 1925-26; perhaps the Z. O. A. should continue to amuse itself with Zionist 'Roll-calls' and the like. The danger is, however, that the three major groups—the Agency, the Zionists and the Brandeis-Mack economic unit—tend to go off on cross-purposes. Barriers mountain-high separate the parties today, except in the recent rapprochement between Mr. Warburg and Justice Brandeis.

"I appeal to the friends of Palestine: 'Come and let us reason together; let us have peace. Let the miserable warfare of the last ten years be forgotten; let us banish pride, fear and prejudice; let us trust each other; let us demonstrate how good and how pleasing it is for brethren to dwell

together in unity; let us remember our heroic pioneers in Palestine rather than our own individualities; let us seek for that which will unite rather than divide us; let us seal a covenant of peace, in the spirit of mutual concession and good-will, on behalf of Zion that lies stricken.'

"Gentlemen, we appeal to you. Who will take the first step? Who will renew our drooping hopes by this dramatic symbol of comradeship and reunion in the broken cohorts of Palestine's friends?"

Rabbi Newman says that when he discussed recently the matter of peace with Mr. Lipsky, he "found the door barred and locked firmer than ever against the welcoming of the Brandeis-Mack group into the leadership of the Z. O. A. Mr. Lipsky, though grayer and older by reason of his Zionist burdens, was as masterful, unyielding and uncompromising as ever. 'The Zionist Organization,' he said, 'will rise and fall with the rise and fall of the Zionist movement.' The key to Zionist reconstruction lies in the hands of Louis Lipsky at 111 Fifth Avenue. Perhaps the time has not yet come to speak as frankly and directly as I should like."

According to Dr. Newman, it is Dr. Stephen S. Wise who "has it in his power to consolidate anew the Brandeis-Mack group, to effect a rapprochement with the Lipsky group, and to present a solid, united front on behalf of essential Zionism within the Agency itself."

Warsaw Writers' Union Fetes Nahum Sokolow

Warsaw, Jan. 29.—The Warsaw writers' union tendered a reception yesterday to Nahum Sokolow, noted Zionist leader, who is now visiting Poland. All newspapermen and writers except those of the left wing were present. The speakers included Karlinski, Heftman, Zeitlin, Zwi Priluzki, Jatzkan, N. Schwalbe, I. Fichman and Gottlieb, who was chairman. In his address, Sokolow reminisced about the days of the "Haze-fira," the first Hebrew paper, of which he had been the editor.

MUFTI MAY NOT GO TO LONDON

Jerusalem, Jan. 29.—The Grand Mufti may not go to London as one of the Arab delegation on account of continued dissensions in the Arab Executive concerning the composition of the delegation and resentment that the Mufti was not named chairman.

Robbers Kill Jewish Banker

Warsaw, Jan. 29.—A well-known Jewish banker of Katowice, Danziger, who was a member of a large credit corporation, was killed yesterday in an attack by robbers.

Conference Discusses Crisis in Polish Economic Life

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Lodz, Jan. 29.—With Minister of Labor Rystor present and Governor Woyevoda as a chairman a conference of industrialists, representatives of the professional unions, religious heads of the municipalities and the kehillahs was held here. Minister Rystor suggested the establishment of an emergency committee to support the unemployed for which the government is willing to grant a million zlotys.

The delegate from the professional unions, Milman, described in sharp terms the deplorable situation of the Jewish workers who are suffering doubly through the boycott and the crisis, and expressing little hope for the achievements of the emergency committee because the bourgeoisie would avoid financial support.

This last remark caused a considerable row among the industrialists, compelling the chairman to withdraw Milman's right to speak.

Witnesses Heard in Safed Punishments Hearings

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Jan. 29.—Forty Arab notables, including the Mukhtars of the neighboring villages, were summoned in the hearings on the imposition of the collective punishments on Safed. Ahcarius, a Jewish proselyte, appeared in behalf of the Arabs. Captain Faraday and other police officers were the principal witnesses for the prosecution, which called three Jews on behalf of the kehillah.

The Mufti of Safed appeared for the defence. Judge Colville stated that for the present he was examining rather than judging.

Investigation of the Arab villages around Beertuvia with a view to collective punishments was also begun by examining-magistrate Miller, while the investigation of the villages in the neighborhood of Motza will start Friday.

Melchett Approves English J.N.F.'s Land Redemption Plan

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Jan. 29.—Lord Melchett, president of the English Zionist Federation, has lent his influence to the novel scheme of land redemption in Palestine devised by the Jewish National Fund for Great Britain and Ireland. The scheme calls for all Jews to redeem a piece of land in Palestine equal to what they own in England or Ireland.

In a letter to the president of the Jewish National Fund for Great Britain and Ireland, Lord Melchett declared that he "learned with great pleasure of the new scheme for land redemption in Palestine, and I feel confident it will meet with a ready response from every member of the Anglo-Jewish community."

New Bill Would Register Every Alien Annually to Prevent Illegal Entry

Washington, Jan. 29.—While Chairman Johnson of the House Immigration Committee was declaring the necessity for a cessation of the illegal entry of aliens as means of relieving the unemployment situation, Representative Cable of Ohio introduced a bill calling for an annual compulsory registration of all aliens, in order to facilitate the ascertaining of names and addresses of illegally resident aliens and thus make it easier to deport them.

Representative Cable's bill also seeks to simplify the process of naturalization by making eligible an alien who had complied with the requirements of his registration bill for five consecutive years without any other declaration of intention. Aliens failing to register annually would be ineligible for citizenship until after meeting the regulations for another three years.

The labor market is being glutted by the illegal influx of aliens, declared Representative Johnson, and to back up his statement, he offered clippings from Western papers that substantiated him.

Judaism and Christianity in Seminar at Michigan U.

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Ann Arbor, Mich., Jan. 29.—Opening of the second semester at the University of Michigan will witness the unfolding of a novel experiment in extra-curricular religious study on this campus—the combination of Jew and Christian in a weekly seminar on Judaism and Christianity.

Formation of a limited and selected group of Jewish and Christian men and women students is being completed under the joint leadership of Rabbi Adolph H. Fink, director of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation, and Rev. Thomas L. Harris, director of Harris Hall, Episcopalian student guild, which will meet for twelve weeks at the Hillel Foundation. A simultaneous presentation of the development of Christianity and Judaism, approached from a historical standpoint, will be given by both men, while the closing meetings will be devoted to a comparison of the respective religious prayerbooks and discussions of the problems of establishing more than a mythical good-will between Jew and Gentile.

Communists Disturb Lecture at Yiddish Writers' Club

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Jan. 29.—Communists last night broke into the club rooms of the Yiddish Writers' Club here while a lecture was being given by the former Soviet Commissar, Steinberg, on the topic "Jew and Man." Rotten eggs were thrown, the furniture of the club rooms was destroyed, and the lecture had to be stopped. Police arrived later and made several arrests.

Soccer Magazine Resents Slur on Jewish Followers of Hakoah All-Stars

The attack upon the Jewish followers of the Hakoah All-Star soccer team made in a recent issue of the "Daily News" by C. A. Lovett, is sharply rebuked in the current issue of the "Soccer Star." Mr. Lovett had characterized the Hakoah supporters as "the unforgivable excitable partisans . . . who have marred almost every close game in which their able favorites have participated in the last season or two hereabouts . . . the fans trailing it (Hakoah) have gone far beyond the bounds of sportsmanship and reason to assault visiting players whenever a mix-up occurs on the field and as a result, police reserves more often than not have had to wield night sticks, carried in the day-time only for Communist strike mobs and Hakoah team followers. . ."

Declaring that Mr. Lovett has "sorely lacerated the feelings of thousands of Jewish fans," the "Soccer Star" lambastes him and terms his language "a positive outrage." The magazine also points out that two weeks ago the same writer described those who invaded the playing field as a "swarm of foreigners."

Mr. Lovett has something of a reputation for his ill-will to the Hakoahs. A year ago, when the Jewish team had won the United States soccer championship, he came out with an article in the "Daily News" protesting against the title going to a "foreign team," and declaring that the United States Football Association Challenge Trophy, emblematic of the national championship should be won only by an American team.

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Court Bars Rabbis from Passing on Unsupervised Kasher Slaughter Houses

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continued to perform their duties.

The Vaad Hakashruth then posted pickets around the stores owned by Cohen and where the alleged kosher meat was being retailed. This action called forth the petition for the restraining order in which it was charged that the Vaad Hakashruth was racketeering and that it was limiting the production of kosher meat and fixing prices. Judge Powell's decision restrains the Vaad Hakashruth from asserting orally or in writing that the meats sold by Cohen for Swift & Co. are not kosher or that they are not prepared in strict accordance with the dietary laws of the Jewish people.

The attempt to secure the restraining order was strenuously fought by attorney Joseph H. Mellen, chairman of the executive board of the Federation of Jewish Organizations in Cleveland, who maintained that the right to interpret the Jewish laws on the question of kashruth was a matter to be determined by the authorized orthodox rabbis and not by the civil courts. Mr. Mellen pointed out that 60,000 Cleveland Jews are interested in having kashruth maintained.


It was generally expected that the judge who once ruled favorably that religious matters have no standing in the civil courts, would make a similar ruling in this case. Mr. Mellen will file an answer shortly and the case will be fought to the limit.

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
