Zionist Actions Committee Overwhelmingly Turns Down Proposal of Revisionists to Call Special Zionist Congress This Year: Dr. Weizmann Replies to Points Raised in Debate

this year. Only five votes were recorded in favor of a special congress.

Meer Grossman, Revisionist leader, arguing in favor of a congress to be held in September of this year, also pleaded for the creation of a special Political Committee, the membership of which would contain fifty percent of the Oppositionists and would be elected with powers to act until the next Congress. He denied that such a Committee would usurn the functions of the Zionist Executive. On the contrary, he said, it would strengthen the morale of the Executive.

Dr. A. Coralnik, an American mem-ber of the Actions Committee, opposed the plan for a special congress because he felt it would serve no pur-pose, for "if a political contingency arose, the Actions Committee could deal with it." Dr. Coralnik also said that political work should not be con-fined entirely to Great Britain, but more attention should be paid to the United States which, he thought, was a very favorable field for political work. Berl Locker, a Poale Zion member from Germany, also opposed a special congress, pleading that political activity should be dominated by the

realities of the situation.

Catholic Archbishop Denounces Montreal Jewish School Bills As Infringements (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Montreal, Mar. 20-The Jewish school bills now pending in the Quebec legislature were denounced as measures that infringed on Catholic and Protestant rights and might lead to the establishment of an exclusive laity teaching in Quebec schools by Archbishop George Gauthier of Montreal, addressing thousands of pilgrims at St. Josephs's Oratory yesterday. In a letter to the Provincial Premier Taschereau, Archbishop Gauthier said that "under no consideration whatsoever should any privileges be granted which might disturb the present school system

In his address to the pilgrims Archbishop Gauthier asked why the Council of Public Instruction had not been consulted on the Jewish school bills. The main point of the present school regime, he said, is the confessional character of the teaching, but "this bill teaching. The legislature has the right to create a non-Christian system only if the Catholics and Protestants are not prejudiced against it. Our fathers would feel aggrieved if they would see Christians and non-Christians sitting together in counsel," said the Arch-

Messages of regret and sorrow at the passing of Lord Balfour continue to passing of Lord Baltour continue to pour in from all parts of the world. Today, the Jewish Daily Bulletin and Jewish Telegraphic Agency received statements from: Dr. Albert Einstein, Jan Christian Smuts, Alfred N. Ratify Election of Jew

(Tewish Telegraphic Agency) Budapest, Mar. 20—The Hungarian Senate has ratified the election of the Jewish banker Frankel as a member of the Senate by representatives of the Jewish orthodox congregations of Hungary. In order to become a Senator, Frankel first had to be elected rabbi, since according to the Hungar-tian law, only a rabbi could represent the Iews in the Senate. A great opposition to Frankel's election to the Senate arose as a result of this procedure, his opponents claiming that since he was not really performing the duties of a rabbi, he is not entitled to sit in the Senate.

However, the Hungarian Minister of fustice has now decided that the authorization as a rabbi which Frankel got from the Jewish community here is sufficient to entitle him to a seat in the Senate, even though he doesn't actually perform the duties of a rabbi.

That the fears of the leaders of the Central Association are not unfounded is indicated from recent dispatches reporting that the Hitlerites are making concerted efforts to have anti-Schechita legislation adopted in various parts of Germany, and even going so far as to attempt the passage of a bill that would make it a crime for Germans to inter-marry with Jews. Repeated desecrations of Jewish cemeteries, interruptions of synagogue serv ices and the refusal of large employers of labor to hire Jewish workers are other manifestations of the growing anti-Semitism in Germany about which the Central Association is con-

Unity of American Jewry Being Translated Into Action As Many Cities Plan Drives

The enthusiasm aroused throughout the entinustasin aroused unroughout the entire country, by the national con-ference of the Allied Jewish Campaign in Washington, on March 8th and 9th. is according to advice received at national headquarters from many sources being translated into action. Reliminary steps are being taken in a number of communities for "drives" at the earliest possible dates.

This course is being urged by the chairman of the campaign, who pointed out that unless this is done it will be difficult for the beneficiaries of the Al-lied Jewish Campaign to carry out the projects to which they are committed.
Another motive force is the solidarity of American Jewry that was given tan-

gible form at the conference.

In a number of communities, unification of Jewish effort has been carried another step forward by combining the local "drive" for the Allied Jewish Campaign with the annual cam-paign for the Federation. The first community actually to get under way with such a combined campaign is Detroit

As an important means of stimulating quick action, national headquarters has requested all of the rabbis of the United States, Orthodox, Conservative and Reform, to make the Allied Jewish Campaign the theme of their sermons Sabbath morning the 29th.

Meanwhile assurances of coopera-tion are being received from many who, throughout the country, are recognized leaders of their communities. From Los Angeles, Col. Irving H. General Smuts, who was a member of the British war-time Cabinet that issued the Balfour Declaration, some weeks ago joined with Lord Balfour and Lloyd George in writing a letter to the "London Times," calling for a new commission to investigate the workings

(Continued from Page 1) situation would never have arisen because the greater the achievements in cause the greater the achievements in Palestine, the stronger we would have become politically. That is why we devoted our energy to the Keren Hayesod, viewing it as a tremendous political factor." This was his answer to those who had taunted him that there were more problems in America than in London.

Dr. Weizmann also said that he had always felt it necessary "to speed up the creation of values in Palestine which in the long run count more than anything else. Unfortunately, we were caught in a period of transition, which perhaps made the work a little more difficult for the moment, but there is no reason to lose courage; but, on the contrary, it should inspire the Jewish people to more vigorous effort

"The success of the work during the last decade was a thorn in the eyes of our enemies, and, while on the one hand I am convinced that with a larger number of Jews in Palestine the August tragedy would not have happened, on the other hand, with a smaller number, the Jewish community would have been shattered, which again proves the urgent need of pro-ceeding with the practical work." Declaring that he had complete faith in the Jewish people, Dr. Weizmann con-cluded by saying, "There may be difcluded by saying, "There may be dif-ferences regarding methods, but re-garding the fundamentals of Zionism there is no divergence of opinion.'

Isaac Gruenbaum, a member of the Polish Parliament, President of the Polish Zionist Federation, and one of the leaders of the radical Zionist group (in opposition to Dr. Weizmann), thought it fruitless to discuss the past and said that with the new epoch a new system should be evolved Mr. Gruenbaum declared that the present policy "is lacking in initiative, as a result of which there is a shrinkage from Herzl's Zionism. Achad Ha'am's Zionism was sterile, too rationalistic and too calculated to be fruitful.'

Pointing out that he differs fundamentally from the Revisionist concep-tion, he expressed his agreement in many respects with Dr. Ruppin's colonization plan

Nahum Sokolow, Chairman of the World Zionist Executive, did not share the view of M. M. Ussishkin, head of the Jewish National Fund, to single out colonization as supreme, maintaining that immigration and colonization are equally important. Mr. Sokolow said that only another wave of immi-gration could rescue the Jewish youth who would otherwise be lost due to the trying position of the Jews of Eastern Europe, not only in the mate-rial sense but also in the spiritual.

Kurt Blumenfeld, President of the German Zionist Federation, expressed his support of Dr. Weizmann's political views and objected to the continued allegations that the German Zionists tend towards a weakening policy in spite of the resolutions adopted at the

Jena conference.

In no other countries are minorities given similar rights," said Archbishop Gauthier, who claimed that there was danger in this bill if other provincial minorities should demand the same privileges. He felt that the greatest danger in the bill is that it might create a system for

the teaching of secular matters only. Cardinal Rouleau, Archbishop Quebec, has also declared himself as strongly opposed to the Jewish school bills. In a letter to Premier Taschereau, he says that the project will cause difficulties in the Province, and though the bill is intended only to adjust the Montreal problem, he fears that it may result in an attempt to impose upon the entire Province a neutral school system which has been condemned by the Vatican.
