Special Police Patrols Guard Bucharest Against Anti-Semitic Attacks; Debated in Parliament

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, May 10—Special patrols of gendarmerie have been organized by the police prefect here with instructions to arrest immediately all those disturbing the peace. This drastic action follows yesterday's anti-Semitic disturbances here in which Jews in various parts of the city were maltreated by anti-Semitic students.

While the judicial tribunal of Jassy has confirmed the arrest of the Targufromos Jews for being implicated in last week's clash with Cuzist students returning from an election victory, the Roumanian parliament was the scene of heated questions and cross-questions concerning the Targufromos incident and the part played in it by Professor Alexander Cuza, anti-Semitic leader, who was recently elected to parliament.

Professor Riskanu of the University of Jassy asked on his own behalf and also in the interests of Professors Mironcesh and Boila regarding the Targufromos occurrences, emphasizing that the Jews were not guilty but that Professor Cuza was responsible and demanded a thorough inquiry.

While the Social-Democratic Deputy Jumanka supported Professor Riskanu, Deputy Rang endeavored to throw the blame for the Targufromos affair on the Jews. Professor Cuza charged that the Jews had started the trouble and described the Jewish religion as "criminal" and used the invective "jidani."

Deputy Fagure protested against Professor Cuza's language and was supported by a majority of the deputies, including the presiding officer, Professor Andrei. Deputy Joseph Fischer declared that there were grave anti-Semitic disturbances in Maramures. The assistant secretary of the interior promised an investigation and punishment for the guilty persons.

European Conference of Jewish Ex-Soldiers Opens

Paris, May 10—The All-European conference of Jewish ex-soldiers opened here today with Deputy Heller, a member of the Polish parliament as chairman. Delegates were in attendance from Austria, the Baltic states, England, France and Poland. Among those present were many who hold decorations for valor.

The chief business on the agenda is the creation of a world union of Jewish ex-soldiers. Deputy Heller, in the principle address of the day, traced the history of the ex-soldiers' movement and set forth its professional aims. In the evening the delegates laid a wreath on the tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

Doubts Whether Peru Has Yet Taken Official Action on Jewish Colonization Plan

Washington, May 10—Doubt whether the plan reported from Berlin to colonize Jews in Peru has reached the stage of serious consideration or at least whether the Peruvian government has yet taken official action upon it was expressed by Senor L. Alvarez de Buenavista, Charge de Affaires of the Peruvian Legation, in the absence of Ambassador Velarde, in response to inquiries here today by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

No information whatever concerning the plan described in a Berlin dispatch to the New York "Forward" has been received by the Peruvian Embassy here. Senor de Buenavista stated, adding that if the project had received the official sanction of the Peruvian government some announcement to this effect would undoubtedly have been published in the Peruvian newspapers, which, however, as yet have carried no reference whatever to the subject.

This, however, does not necessarily imply that the report regarding the plan has no basis in fact. Senor Buenavista indicated that the Embassy did not intend to send an inquiry to the Peruvian government, inasmuch as the matter was beyond the sphere of the Embassy. Since the report emanated from Berlin, he declared that perhaps the Peruvian Embassy in Berlin had some information on the matter.

Anti-Semitic Propaganda in Bessarabian Villages Makes Jews Fear Tense Situation

Kishinev, May 10—An atmosphere that the Jews fear may produce anti-Semitic excesses now prevails in various Bessarabian towns as a result of the reaction to the election to parliament of the anti-Semitic leader, Professor Alexander Cuza, and from the after-effects of an Easter fight near a Kishinev church in which a Christian boy was stabbed.

A number of the participants in the brawl, including one Jew, were arrested but in the meantime the stabbed boy died of his injuries. While the police have been investigating the affair the anti-Semites have utilized the incident for open propaganda. Windows in many Jewish shops have been smashed.

The anti-Semitism is particularly strong in the secondary schools among the students. In the meantime the Jewish community of Kishinev has intervened with the local authorities calling their attention to the danger from the growing agitation.

Jewish Collectives Successful But Communist Paper Says They Maintain Religion

Moscow, May 10—The only thing the matter with the Jewish collectives is that their members insist on observing their religious practices, the Minsk "Oktiabr" complains in an article recounting the growing success of the Jewish collectivization movement in White Russia. Although the collectives have been in existence for a considerable time there are still a very large number of Jewish collectives and collectivists who stand firmly by their religion, the "Oktiabr" reports.

In many collectives, for instance, the congregations have arranged services with preachers, and maintain scholasticism. Religion is especially strongly implanted among the women. The "Oktiabr" points out that in Coloss in the Minsk district, they are now preparing kosher meat for the use not only of the inhabitants of the collective but for the entire Jewish population of the neighborhood.

At the same time the "Oktiabr" is satisfied that the number of Jewish collectives is growing from year to year and that the system of collectivization is beginning to embrace the entire Jewish working class population.

Although there is very little vacant land in White Russia the government takes the attitude that the Jews have as much right to the land as the peasants.

Anti-Semitic Uproar Staged in Prussian Landtag

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, May 10—An anti-Semitic uproar was staged today in the Prussian Landtag when the National Socialist Deputy, Ley Kube, vigorously objected to the fact that a Jew had dared to criticize a Voelkische institution. Deputy Kube called out to Deputy Kuttner, "we shall settle in the streets with you Jews." Deputy Kuttner retorted, "I esteem the German race but you are either not a German or of an inferior quality." His remark was applauded by a majority of those present.

Deputy Kube's indignation was due to the fact that Deputy Kuttner, on behalf of a state committee, had reported the collapse of the Voelkische Cooperative Bank, which was established in an attempt to break the influence of Jewish capital but its bankruptcy ruined thousands of Germans instead.

The National Socialist deputy urged the Prussian premier to follow the example of the Thuringian Minister of the Interior, Dr. Frick, and "throw out all Hebrews and Zionists" from the various ministries.

Says England Will Maintain
Peace in Palestine

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, May 10—England will undoubtedly do everything to maintain peace in Palestine and a repetition of the troubles is not to be expected particularly since the Nebi Musa festival passed quietly, declared Maurice Hexter, a member of the Jewish Agency's Executive in Palestine, in an interview published today in the Vienna "Journal."

Pointing out that "a permanent state of war is impossible" and that on the other hand "collaboration by the American non-Zionists in the upbuilding of Palestine is ever growing," Mr. Hexter said that "England will guarantee peace in the future too until a suitable form of peaceful cooperation with the Arabs is worked out."

He said, too, that the upbuilding work is proceeding chiefly on a private economic basis and that therefore many people are following Felix Warburg's example and buying and developing Palestine land privately.

Imprisoned Zionist Dies After
Fourteen-Day Hunger Strike

Riga, May 10—Solomon Lifshitz, a youthful Zionist, who had been arrested for Zionist activities, is dead in a Leningrad hospital following a fourteen-day hunger strike which he began as a protest against the prison regime in Leningrad where he was being held.

Warsaw, May 10—Stanislaw Posner, vice-president of the Polish Senate and a leader of the Polish Socialist Party, died here yesterday at the age of 64.

Rabbi Disowns Daughter Who
Is Charged with Inciting to Riot

Milwaukee, May 10—A drama replete with pathos was enacted in the municipal court here today as Sonia Mason, a 19-year-old girl, was disowned by her pious father, Bilba Margarchak, beadle in a local synagogue, for her Communistic activities. The sensation became even greater when in reply to a question from the district attorney he admitted he was also a rabbi.

Wearing a skull cap, he took the oath and admitted that the girl was his daughter Haia. When she was arrested she told the police that her parents were dead and gave no hint of her family connections. Her tear-filled eyes were glued to the floor as her aged father, with tears welling up in his eyes, broke his daughter's defiant attitude.

"She is no longer my daughter," he declared. "I had a daughter named Haia but she is Sonia Mason." The father was a surprise witness for the prosecution. When she was arrested for inciting to riot the newspapers featured her as the daughter of a rabbi. Her radical tendencies are said to have created a conflict in her family.

Jabotinsky Terms Allegation
of Arab Delegation "Invention"

London, May 10—The allegation of the Arab delegation to the United States that Vladimir Jabotinsky, leader of the Zionist Revisionists, had once said that "the Zionists will only allow enough Arabs to remain in Palestine to be hewers of wood and drawers of water" is an invention, the Executive of the Revisionist Organization here declared today after receiving word from Mr. Jabotinsky. Emir Ardel Arslan, head of the Arab delegation, made this assertion in an interview with the Jewish Telegraphic Agency in New York, April 29.

What Mr. Jabotinsky did say is incorporated in the report of the Palestine Inquiry Commission (page 176). He said "there is not one Zionist who really dreams of ousting the existing rural population of Palestine. Suppose that practically all the available land in Palestine is occupied by fellahen who actually work it. I would say, irrespective of whether I desire to oust them or not, it is impossible. They will remain, therefore, nothing remains for me. Then I would try another avenue."

"Perhaps it is possible, despite all, to constitute a nation simply by urban population, waiting for such time when the intensification of cultivation will allow the Arabs to live on a smaller area so that we can buy the remainder. If I came to the conclusion that that cannot be done, I would go to the Jews and say, 'Commit suicide or go and become, I do not know what, Bolsheviks, anything, because you have no hope.'"

Asks Immediate Aid to Prevent
Closing of Jewish Orphanages,
Other Institutions in Lodz

An appeal for immediate assistance to prevent the closing of Jewish orphanages, and other philanthropic organizations of the city of Lodz, Poland, was received yesterday by James N. Rosenberg, chairman of the New York Allied Jewish Campaign.

The appeal, which was cabled by Dr. Wachs, head of the Jewish community of Lodz, reads as follows:

"It is my duty to inform you that at a general meeting of the community and of officers of the orphan houses, sanatoria for tubercular children and all other philanthropic institutions, it was stated that the situation here is hopeless without your help. The children under our care are actually going hungry."

"Give or Get" luncheons, at which each woman present will represent a contribution of \$25 to the New York Allied Jewish Campaign, will be held by two chapters of Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America, on Wednesday, May 14, it was announced yesterday by the Women's Division of the Campaign, of which Mrs. Felix M. Warburg, is chairman.

At the Westchester Hadassah luncheon, in the Hotel Delmonico, many of the guests will be young Mount Vernon, Yonkers, and New Rochelle matrons who earned their contributions by using their private automobiles to taxi persons to and from New York for the price of a railroad ticket, and within the county at the regular taxi rates. Under the leadership of the co-chairmen of the luncheon, Mrs. Alexander Lamport and Mrs. Jacob Sincoff, the Mount Vernon women formulated the plan of working for their contributions rather than drawing them from the family bank account.

Rev. Dr. John Haynes Holmes, Mrs. Robert Szold, national president of Hadassah, and Mrs. Frieda Silbert Ullian, national vice-president, will be the speakers.

The second luncheon Wednesday will be that of the Brooklyn chapter of which Mrs. Adolph Slomka is the president. It will be held at the Hotel Astor, with Mrs. Warburg as the guest of honor and principal speaker.

Leading Jewish congregations of this city pledged their cooperation at a luncheon-meeting at the Hotel Biltmore Friday, to the New York Allied Jewish Campaign, in the effort to raise \$2,500,000, this city's quota of the \$6,000,000.

Among them are the Free Synagogue, Temple Israel, the West End Synagogue, Shearith Israel Synagogue, Temple B'nai Jeshurun and congregation Kehilath Jeshurun.

600,000 Marks for Jewish
Religious Education in Prussia

Berlin, May 10—An annual subsidy of 600,000 marks for Jewish religious instruction and the salaries of rabbis has been granted by the Prussian Landtag.

Says Africans, Not Jews or Arabs First in Palestine

London, May 10—Africans and not Jews or Arabs were the earliest inhabitants in Palestine, declared Sir Arthur Keith, eminent scientist, in the course of a discussion on the recent Mount Carmel excavations before the Royal College of Surgeons.

"The early Palestinians had short faces and long heads, very different from their tall, strong Cornagone contemporaries in France. Their faces were short and their noses low-bridged and flat, with a distinct suggestion of African origin."

Professor John Garstang, lecturing at the Royal Institute, declared that judging from recent excavations it is believed that the earliest Jewish inhabitants of the Holy Land date back to about 1400 B. C.

Hebraists Celebrate Seventieth Birthday of Nahum Sokolow

The national Hebrew organization, Histadruth Ivrit, yesterday celebrated the 70th birthday of the well-known Zionist leader and Hebrew writer, Nahum Sokolow.

Abraham Goldberg was chairman of the meeting. Professor S. Baron of Columbia University, Rev. Zvi Hirsh Masliansky and M. Ribalov were the principal speakers.

Give Contributions in Name of Mrs. Nathan Straus

Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America, has received a number of contributions for its medical and health work in Palestine in memory of the late Mrs. Nathan Straus, it was announced yesterday at the Hadassah headquarters here. A contribution of \$250 was sent by Mrs. Henry J. Bernheim, of this city, a niece of Mrs. Straus. One of the contributions is from a neighbor in Larchmont, where the Straus Summer home is located.

Mrs. Straus was honorary vice-president of Hadassah for a number of years and was especially interested in the organization's preventive health work for mothers and children through its twenty-one health welfare centers in Palestine.

As a tribute to Hadassah's benefactress the members of the national board of Hadassah will plant trees in Mrs. Straus' memory in the new Hadassah Grove in Palestine, which is near the Einstein Forest.

Rosenberg Discusses Aspects of Allied Jewish Campaign

This is the first of a series of daily interviews with James N. Rosenberg, chairman of the New York campaign of the Allied Jewish Campaign, in which he discusses various aspects of the \$6,000,000 campaign for the Joint Distribution Committee and the Jewish Agency.

"A little more money has already been raised than anybody would suppose. Hardly a man who has been asked but has given generously. If half a dozen or a dozen men would drop their occupations for ten days and do some canvassing we'd have this campaign finished successfully within a month.

"All this talk of difficulty doesn't frighten us a bit. Like General Grant, we're going to fight it out on this line if it takes us all Summer, but it isn't going to take all Summer. My mail this morning brought me a check of \$25,000.

"The New York campaign will get started with a real bang with the meeting in Town Hall, May 27, which will have some features in the shape of a tribute to Felix N. Warburg."

Nathan Straus to Take Rest Cure Abroad

Nathan Straus sailed Friday night bound for an English seaside resort where he expects to stay for an indefinite period of time, and if his health permits will later on promote the cause of pure milk in England.

Before he sailed Mr. Straus paid a tribute to his departed wife, Lina, in which he says:

"She sympathized with and perhaps in a measure inspired my own conviction that charity is the expression of Divine love, and like Divine love can not be limited by race, creed or country. In all our works together that has been our guiding principle. Everyone knows, I think, that our pasteurized milk work was conducted for all alike."

Says Anti-Semitic Charge Against N. Y. U. Publicity

Paterson, N. J., May 10—The charge of anti-Semitism recently brought by Dr. Anna K. Bruenn against the New York University's College of Dentistry, was declared to be nothing short of a publicity stunt by Dr. Samuel Singer, himself a Jew, dentist in Paterson, to a reporter of the "Jewish Post."

"We were both on the staff in the New York Dental School together," he said. "She was a junior students' instructor in operative dentistry and I a senior students' instructor. She was absolutely incapable. There was no discrimination shown at New York University. What is more, 80 percent of the students at the university are Jewish and a greater part of the faculty is Jewish."

This corroborates the statement made by Dr. Allen T. Neuman, Dean of the College of Dentistry on April 30, that Dr. Bruenn was not reappointed to her post as instructor in the Department of Operative Technology because she was incompetent.

Call Attention to Fake Rabbis in New York

A resolution which calls attention to the fact that there are a number of people in New York City who are falsely posing as rabbis and which calls upon the Jewish public of New York City to withhold invitations to officiate at religious functions without first ascertaining that the officiants are bona fide Jewish Ministers, was adopted at a special meeting of the Brooklyn Jewish Ministers' Association held last week and was endorsed by a unanimous vote at a meeting of the New York Board of Jewish Ministers, which was held at Temple Emanuel of New York last Wednesday afternoon.

The president of the New York Board of Jewish Ministers is Rev. Dr. Elias Solomon, Rabbi of Temple Shaare Zedek, New York, and the president of the Brooklyn Jewish Ministers' Association is Rabbi Israel Herbert Levinthal of the Brooklyn Jewish Center. It is hoped that once this matter is brought to the attention of the general public no further action will be necessary—that the community at large will cooperate with the rabbis to do away with this evil that has lately sprung up in the Jewish communal life.

Hadassah to Participate in Red Cross Conference

Jerusalem, Apr. 24—The Palestine Medical Organization Hadassah will be represented at the Imperial Red Cross Conference to be held in London from May 19 to May 24. This is the first time that the Hadassah has been invited to participate in such a conference. The invitation came through the Health Department of the Palestine Government. Dr. R. Katzenelson, the assistant director of the Hadassah in Palestine, will represent the Hadassah at the conference.

Foreign Service division of the Department of Commerce, yesterday admitted that his department had recently received two communications from H. Lawrence Groves, American commercial attaché in Berlin (mentioned in the "Forward's" story as being interested in the Peruvian project), reporting that two gentlemen, whose names the Department of Commerce declined to make public, had called to see him regarding the scheme for Jewish colonization in East Peru.

The commercial attaché reported that the plan seemed to be very well thought of in Peru and was progressing but that they (the two gentlemen) indicated that additional funds were needed and they inquired whether the U. S. Department of Commerce could enlist the support of philanthropists in the United States.

To Mr. Groves' report the Department of Commerce replied that although the plan was interesting and seemed practical, the Department obviously could not accede to the request, especially as it did not involve American citizens. Mr. Miller said that nothing was known of any plans of American capitalists to build a railroad in Peru in connection with this colonization scheme nor was this mentioned in the correspondence.

Berlin, May 10—It is reported in German emigration circles here that those interested in Peruvian colonization have concluded the draft of an agreement with the Peruvian government and that Baron van Maltzan, an uncle of the former German ambassador to the United States, is trying to get into touch with Jewish circles to obtain the participation of Jews. Thus far Dr. Kirschberg, a comparatively unknown figure in Jewish circles, is the only one interested.

ants. While in 1924 there were only 31 Jewish collectives in White Russia with a total of 336 families, at the beginning of 1929 there were no less than 245 Jewish collectives in White Russia. In 1929, 47 more were established with 733 families.

Actually the number of Jewish collectives in White Russia is even larger but some were "internationalized," that is they were merged with collectives of non-Jews. By January of this year 26 Jewish collectives had been "internationalized" and in March this number had been increased to 45. This has been achieved despite the fact that large numbers of the Jewish collectivists are opposed to internationalization.

The collectives now embrace not only the poorer artisans and workers and peasants but also the former traders living in the neighborhood. In the Vitebsk region, for instance, the Jewish collectives include in their membership 29.6 percent ex-traders and in the Bobruisk region this percentage is 37.4 percent.

Speaking of economic conditions in the Jewish collectives the "Oktiahr" writes that on July 1, 1929 the collectives were burdened with very heavy debts. They owed the state and various social organizations no less than 1,711,071 roubles, an average of 7,281 roubles for each collective. This did not include debts to private persons. This great indebtedness was due to the fact that the membership of the collectives was drawn from the poorest section of the Jewish population who brought neither implements nor cattle. For that reason the Jewish collectives were forced to resort extensively to the credit aids granted by the state.

Today, the "Oktiahr" concludes, the situation is vastly improved and the collectives have not only established themselves successfully, possessing all of the necessary machines and implements but they have also been able to rid themselves largely of their indebtedness.
