New Soviet Decree Enables All Jews of Small Towns to Quality as Artisans

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, June 5—A decree which enables the entire Jewish population of the small towns to become artisans, relieves them of the fear of high taxes and will eventually permit them to go into Soviet industry as qualified workers, was issued today by the Soviet cabinet. This decree, which fully verifies the Jewish Telegraphic Agency's reports about expected fundamental relief measures, is only a part of the relief program which the Soviet government has in mind for the Jews of the small towns.

The decree orders preparations to convert all impoverished Jews in the small towns of White Russia and Ukraine into artisans this year, requalifies all the artisans now in the small towns into workers fit for heavy industry, grants all artisans the same rights as factory workers provided they work in cooperatives of not less than 30 members and produce the type of goods which go for export, discontinues the high taxation system on the artisans, orders an end to the policy of arresting artisans for failure to pay taxes and also ends the confiscation of their property, promises severe punishment for tax officials over-taxing artisans and discontinues the practice of enforced mergers of artisans' cooperatives.

This decree actually means giving every declassed Jew in the small towns an opportunity to become an artisan and eventually a full-fledged worker. The decree opens wide the field for those who will receive in the shortest possible time tools and machines from their relatives abroad and will undoubtedly also widen the scope of industrial relief work being done by the Agro-Joint and Ort since the qualified artisans will have to be organized by social organizations.

French Zionists Call on Britain to Lift Immigration Ban

Paris, June 5—Fifteen shouting Arabs were arrested by police detachments that surrounded the hall here where 6,000 Jews joined in a meeting of protest against the suspension of immigration to Palestine. Speakers at the meeting, which was under the auspices of the French Zionist Federation, were Mirtil Preszko, Hillel Zlatopolsky, Shalom Asch and Bernard Lecache.

The gathering greeted with cheers M. Lecache's statement that the guilty one in Palestine was the Grand Mufti. Other speakers were Rabbi Eisenstad, Joseph Fisher, and Rabbi Louis G. Levy. Before the meeting a Zionist delegation handed a memorandum of protest to the British ambassador here.

Mandates Body Questions Luke on Events Leading to Riots

Geneva, June 5—H. C. Luke, Secretary of the Palestine government and acting High Commissioner of Palestine during the disturbances of last August, appeared before the Mandate Commission at yesterday's session and gave information about the causes of the disturbances with a view of supplementing the material already before it, according to a communique issued by the Commission, holding its sessions behind closed doors.

The communique states that the whole day was devoted to an examination of the Palestine incidents from September, 1928, until August, 1929. In accordance with its program the Commission began a chronological examination of the incidents and a study of their immediate causes. Mr. Luke will continue his testimony at today's morning session.

The correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns that the afternoon session dealt mainly with the subject of the garrison in Palestine during the disturbances last Summer. The British representatives cited the disturbances that took place in 1920 and in 1921, stating that they occurred regardless of the presence of the military in the country.

Wailing Wall Commission to Leave for Palestine June 16

Geneva, June 5—The recently appointed Wailing Wall Commission that will investigate the Moslem and Jewish claims to the Wailing Wall will leave for Palestine June 16, it was learned here today. The Commission, anxious to avoid the hot weather in Palestine at this time of the year will stay in the country only about two weeks.

It was learned today that Dr. Cyrus Adler, president of the American Jewish Committee, who had been named to represent the Jewish Agency before the Wailing Wall Commission will be unable to go to Palestine at this time. A successor to Dr. Adler is now under consideration.

The members of the Wailing Wall Commission, nominated by Great Britain and approved by the Council of the League of Nations, are Emil Loefgren, former foreign minister of Sweden; Charles Barde, a Swiss jurist and G. Van Kempen, a former Dutch colonial official.

Two Get Army Commissions

Chicago, June 5—Albert J. Mandelbaum and Jaquard H. Rothschild are two Chicago Jewish men who will receive second lieutenantcies at West Point Military Academy on June 11, according to official word from the U. S. Army received here today.

British Jews in First Protest Meeting Against England Urge Lifting of Immigration Ban

London, June 5—For the first time in the history of the Jews in England a protest meeting of English Jews against the British government was held here today. Over 2,000 Jews gathered at Kingsway Hall where the order of the English government to suspend immigration into Palestine was denounced by Zionist leaders.

Bitter indignation against the motives which impelled the British government to issue its suspension order withdrawing the 2,300 immigration certificates issued to Jewish immigrants, was expressed by Dr. Selig Brodetsky, member of the Zionist World Executive; Harry Sacher, former member of the Executive; Mrs. Sieff and other prominent Jewish leaders. The speakers pointed out that the motives were political and contrary to the economic needs of Palestine.

A resolution calling upon the government of Great Britain to revoke the suspension of immigration and to adopt such an administrative policy that will indicate its clear determination to carry out its obligations under the Palestine Mandate, and to assist the Jewish people in the rebuilding of the National Home in Palestine was unanimously adopted at the gathering.

The Chief Rabbi of England, Dr. Joseph H. Hertz, was absent from the mass meeting due to indisposition.

Say Anti-Semitism Abandons Moral Ideas of Christianity

Munich, Germany, June 5—"Anti-Semitism abandons the moral ideas of Christianity, endangers peace and is detrimental to Germany's position abroad", is stated in a resolution passed today at the fortieth anniversary celebration of the Society to Combat Anti-Semitism, which took place here today.

Archbishop Hauck of Bamberg and numerous church-leaders, professors and political leaders telegraphed their greetings to the Society.

200,000 Able-bodied Jews Unemployed in Ukraine

Moscow, June 5—Over 200,000 physically able Jews willing to work still have no prospects of employment in Ukraine it was reported today. Most of them are between the ages of 15 and 50, are lishetzky (people without rights) and declassed who have no professions which would enable them to make a living.

Land Court Rules for J.N.F. in Wadi Hawareth Case

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, June 5—The land court at Tulkarem today ruled that the Palestine government was entitled to sell the Wadi Hawareth lands to the Jewish National Fund. This important decision may facilitate immediate possession by the Jewish Fund. The land court had previously held that the title of the Jewish National Fund was in perfect order but possession was prevented by administrative measures.

The Wadi Hawareth lands of 45,000 dunams were bought by the Jewish National Fund with \$1,000,000 in funds raised by Canadian Zionists. When the purchase was made most of the Arab tenants had already evacuated but a number of squatters refused to move. The Jewish National Fund obtained an order for their removal from the land court but the government interposed objections.

Rather than antagonize the Arabs the Jewish National Fund let the matter rest. The present decision ends the matter and the Fund can occupy the land.

On this same matter the High Court has dismissed the complaint of four of the squatters, pointing out that the purchases had fulfilled all the conditions of compensation to the tenants and entitling the land court to order the Jewish National Fund to take possession. Whether the governor has the right to sell the land to the Jewish National Fund the High Court has not yet decided.

14,468 Jewish Students in Higher Schools of Ukraine

Moscow, June 5—There are now 14,468 Jewish students in the universities, technical schools and high schools of Ukraine. This number is 25 percent of the entire number of students in the higher schools of Ukraine. The number of Jewish students will undoubtedly increase now that the children of artisans and even of the declassified are accepted in the schools.

Zevi Perelmutter, Oldest

Rabbi in Poland, Dead

Warsaw, June 5—Rabbi Zevi Perelmutter, one of the leading rabbis of Poland, died today at his home at the age of 90. The rabbi had been ill for the past few weeks, and because of his advanced age doctors gave up his case as hopeless.

Rabbi Perelmutter was the oldest rabbi in Poland. At the time of the German occupation of Poland during the war, he was a member of the Council of State. Later on, when Poland became an independent republic, he was elected as a member of the first parliament.

A grandson of Rabbi Perelmutter, Rabbi L. Shotland, now lives in Paterson, N. J.

Cardinal Wants to Supervise Montreal Jewish School Board

Montreal, June 5—Cardinal Rouette intends to exercise surveillance over the new Jewish school board through the Catholic committee on the Council of Public Instruction. Beginning in September he will ask regular reports as to the progress of the Jewish school board.

At the last meeting of the Catholic committee he moved a resolution to that effect which was unanimously adopted. Although Cardinal Rouette claims that to the Jews have the right to decide as to the education of their children he still wants the jurisdiction of the Council of Public Instruction over the Jewish schools. The Council consists of Protestants and Catholics only.

Lawyer's Survey in Los Angeles Omits Jews

Los Angeles, June 5—A questionnaire is being sent out now by the Los Angeles Bar Association to every lawyer in this city, asking its members, among other things, to state whether they are Catholics or Protestants, without any alternative if they belong to another faith. With the aid of the questionnaire the association intends to issue cards which will help inquirers obtain the services of competent Los Angeles lawyers.

Commenting on this, the "Bnai Brith Messenger" of last week says:

"Evidently our bar association is under the impression that all Los Angeles lawyers are either Catholics or Protestants. Or is this card so worded that only Catholics and Protestants will be given the names of persons applying for legal service? But why designate ones religious affiliations altogether? Does being a Catholic or a Protestant make one a better lawyer than being a Jew or a Mohammedan? Or does the bar association want to defend the public against Jews and other religious beliefs in the practice of the law? One wonders what has got into our organized groups of professional men, that they lose all sight of decency—in the matter of employment?"

Court Throws Out Suit

Against St. Louis Orthodox
Board in Kashruth Case

St. Louis, June 5—The suit brought by four butchers here to restrain the St. Louis orthodox city board from boycotting slaughterers and butchers not affiliated with the official organization responsible for kashruth control here was thrown out of court today when the board's demurrers were sustained.

The action was recently brought by Abraham Spasser who asked for an injunction and \$25,000 in damages. Simultaneously with the decision of the court, Louis Goodman, president of the board, announced that Rabbi Jacob J. Grodsky had been expelled from the organization for blocking efforts to supervise kashruth. Rabbi Grodsky was said to have accepted a fourth of a cent for every pound of kosher meat sold by two local packing houses while receiving a salary from the orthodox board.

Rabbi Grodsky was suspended last January pending a further investigation but he defied the board and brought in a scab slaughterer. Benjamin Rosenfeld, a former member of the board, and Abraham Bernstein, a Chicago ritual slaughterer, were associated with Grodsky. Twenty-one congregations and fifty delegates took part in ousting Grodsky.

Huge Crowds Greet Arab Delegation in Jerusalem

Jerusalem, June 5—The Arab delegation returned today from England. Its arrival was an hour late owing to the demonstrations along the rout and the way through the city to the office of the Arab Executive where a reception was held.

No demonstration was allowed within the city, the police commandant and police superintendent shepherding the huge crowd around the Damascus Gate.

Moghaneim, one of the members of the delegation, told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that the delegation could have had more apparent success if it had not taken a strong line, but he said the country was grateful for the delegation's uncompromising policy.

Abdul Auni did not return with the delegation but proceeded to Geneva. No statement will be issued by the Arab Executive on the return of the delegation for three or four days.

Report 38,737 Jewish Communists in White Russia and Ukraine

Moscow, June 5—When the sixteenth congress of the Communist Party opens here June 15 it will hear that there are 29,222 Jewish Communists in Ukraine and 9,515 in White Russia. The bulk of the Jewish Communists in Ukraine are concentrated in the industrial centers like Kiev, Odessa, Charkov, Dniepropetrovsk and Atriovsk. These cities have 20,000 Jewish Communists.

Cuza Looks Like Jew Senator Ebner Says; Sure He Has Jewish Blood

Czernowitz, May 15—It is a joke of history that the apostle of anti-Semitism looks like a typical Jew, Senator Mayer Ebner, the president of the Club of Jewish Deputies in Roumania, writes in his paper, the "Ost-Juedische Zeitung." Anyone who sees Professor Cuza for the first time, he says, will unmistakably take him for a Jew. At the May 10th celebration in 1927, when the representatives of the various parties stepped on the platform to read their declarations on the occasion of the Roumanian national festival, Senator Ebner recalls, Madame Sanders, the wife of a prominent Jewish lawyer, asked her husband whether no Jewish representative was to speak. A Belgian lawyer, one of the distinguished guests present, who was sitting beside her, pointed to Cuza, remarking that probably that gentleman was the Jewish representative. He was no little astonished when he was told that that gentleman was the Jews' most bitter enemy, Professor Cuza.

Professor Cuza, Senator Ebner proceeds, looks a typical Jew. "He has a hooked nose such as is seen very seldom among East European Jews, except in anti-Semitic caricatures. The whole cut of his features is Jewish. His way of talking, his method of dialectic, his peculiar wit, are all typically Jewish." There is no question about it, Senator Ebner goes on, the man has a "Jit."

"He has a wide education, and if it is true that anti-Semitism in Roumania has prospered more than elsewhere, it must be ascribed to the fact that there is a Jew at the head of the business. All the circumstances point to the fact that Cuza is of Jewish origin. There can be no doubt about it that there is Jewish blood in his veins. Race peculiarities sometimes jump several generations, and then reappear, and there is no question that has happened in Cuza's case, and that he presents us with an instance of Jewish atavism."

Professor Cuza claims to be descended from Prince Cuza under whose leadership the union of the Roumanian nation was accomplished in 1861, when his election as Ruler was ratified by the Powers and the Porte. This Prince founded the Universities of Bucharest and Jassy (at the latter of which Professor Cuza teaches). He was, however, a despot and dissolute and in 1866 he was compelled to abdicate, his successor being the Hohenzollern Prince Carl who became King Carol, the founder of the present dynasty in Roumania.

Schiff Gives \$25,000 to A. J. C.

A gift of \$25,000 by Mortimer L. Schiff to the Allied Jewish Campaign was announced yesterday by the New York committee, which is raising \$2,500,000 toward the \$6,000,000 which is being sought nationally for the 1930 budgets of the Joint Distribution Committee and the Jewish Agency for Palestine.

Dear Mr. Rosenberg:

You ask why I support the Allied Jewish Campaign.

The Allied Jewish Campaign has enlisted my interest and my activity because it serves two causes which profoundly touch the welfare of my people:

1. Aiding in the development of a Jewish homeland in Palestine where Jews may dwell "as of right and not on sufferance," and where Jewish spiritual and cultural values may once more be created which will enrich the Jewish community in Palestine and be a source of credit to Jews living the world over;

2. Extending a helping hand to millions of Jews in East European lands, so as to enable them to cope with the heartbreaking adversity which has been their lot since the beginning of the world war. Despite heroic efforts on their part to extricate themselves from the economic disaster that followed the war, the Jews in those lands are still faced with conditions which threaten their very existence if the Jews of America, the fortunate of Israel, fail to continue the brotherly aid which they have been giving them during the past fifteen years, a work that has constituted one of the most beautiful chapters in the history of our race.

I know of no cause that so challenges the concern of American Jews with the future of the Jewish People, as does the Allied Jewish Campaign.

Jewish Social Service Parley Opens in Boston Tomorrow

Boston, June 5—The opening session of the National Conference of Jewish Social Service will take place here tomorrow night, at Temple Ohabei Shalom, under the chairmanship of Louis E. Kirstein, president of the Associated Jewish Philanthropies of Boston.

The subject which will be discussed is "Social, Economic and Cultural Changes in American Jewish Life during the 20th Century." The speakers will be A. W. Rosenthal, president of the National Association of Jewish Community Center Secretaries, of New York; Michael Freund, Bureau of Jewish Social Research of New York, and Dr. Ben M. Selekman, executive director of the Associated Jewish Philanthropies of Boston. Dr. Solomon Lowenstein, executive director of the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies of New York, will deliver an address in memory of Dr. Boris D. Bogen, who died shortly after his election to the presidency of the Conference.

Will Build Mikveh in Exclusive Cincinnati Residential Zone, Home of Prominent Jews

Cincinnati, June 5—The Zoning Board of Appeals has granted permission for the erection of a "mikvah" or ritual bath-house, on Washington Avenue, in an exclusive residential section of Cincinnati, with the provision that it is not to be used for hire in oil hours.

Irwin M. Krohn, president of the Park Board and the only Jewish member of the Board of Appeals, in answer to objections that were raised against the erection of the "mikvah" said that he did not think it made any difference whether the "mikvah" was part of a synagogue or not, since it was a place of worship anyway. Comparing it to a Catholic shrine, Mr. Krohn said:

"It is not a question of whether we would like to live next door to one or not. I would not like to live next to a church where they play basketball in the cellar or to a fire-engine house. But that is not saying I oppose churches or fire stations."

Mr. Krohn explained that only those Jews who sincerely believe in it will use the "mikvah", and that Reform Jews won't go near it. He declared he did not know there was such a thing as a "mikvah" until this case came up. He expressed however the opinion that the "mikvah" will promote sanitation and hygiene.

Protests against the erection of the "mikvah" in the exclusive Avondale section of this city had been raised by several prominent Jews living in the section, who argued that it was a business and not a religious matter and should therefore be prohibited in accordance with the zoning laws. Among those who appeared against the "mikvah" were Mrs. J. Walter Freiberg, past president of the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods; Samuel Ach, former County Treasurer; Frank Wolpa and Mrs. Leopold Straus Wolpa. Those who asked permission to build the "mikvah" represented an association composed of representatives of practically every orthodox synagogue in Cincinnati and headed by Hirsch Manishevitz.

Jews to Aid Smith in Ridding New York City of Slums

In an effort to wipe out the slums in New York City, a group of prominent citizens and welfare workers, among whom there are many Jews, have organized the Housing Association of America, of which former Governor Alfred E. Smith is president.

On the Board of Directors are included Lieutenant-Governor Herbert H. Lehman, Aaron Rabinowitz, member New York State Board of Housing, Roger W. Straus, Leo Wolman, Mrs. Julius C. Bernheim, Dr. S. S. Goldwater, Stanley M. Isaacs, Mrs. Henry Moskowitz, Dr. Felix Adler, Dr. Solomon Lowenstein, Robert E. Simon and Lillian D. Wald.

Yiddish Press on the Palestine Situation; "Forward" Defends Government; "Morning Journal" Assails Its "False Principles"

An effort by the British government to correct its previous action in stopping temporarily Jewish immigration into Palestine is seen by Jacob Fishman, writing in the "Jewish Morning Journal" of Thursday, in the speech delivered by Dr. Shiels, British under-secretary for the Colonies, before the Mandates Commission of the League of Nations.

"The most important point in Dr. Shiels' speech," says Mr. Fishman, "is his statement that the government expects to have Simpson's report with regard to immigration in a 'few weeks', and that the number of the halutzim-immigrants for the six months ending September has not yet been finally determined.

"This statement shows perhaps a way out for the London government of the ugly situation in which it has placed itself now that the injustice has been committed. But all this cannot excuse the false principle upon which the stoppage is based. When we protest against the act we do so because we say, with justice, that no Simpson can determine the fate of our halutzim, and that his report concerns us little. We protest because we regard the appointment of Simpson and the revocation of the halutzim certificates as a political, and not an economic, act. We regard Simpson's appointment as a political trick, meant to satisfy the Arab delegation, and we protest against political tricks on the part of a Labor government."

British Empire Facing Crisis

Two things must be borne in mind with regard to the present crisis in Zionism, according to Chaim Lieberman, writing in Thursday's "Forward". The first is that Englishmen and Jews, who are partners in the Palestine undertaking, are temperamentally very different from each other, the English being calm, sober and patient and the Jews being of a restless and impatient nature. In the second place, the entire British Empire is now undergoing a severe crisis.

"The crisis in the British Empire is more serious than the crisis in Zionism," says Lieberman. "The British Empire is a great net which covers half of the world, and Palestine is part of it. And when part of the net, in some remote corner of the world, begins to tear away, all the rest must feel it. It is a great historic misfortune that the fate of the Jewish Palestine should have been linked with England, just when the latter is beginning to go down-hill. If the case were the opposite, if England were now in the period of constructing, and not of repairing, the structure which is now beginning to totter, Jewish Palestine would be built up much easier and quicker."

Asserts Protests Hurt Zionism

A defense of the MacDonald government's recent action towards Zionism, which is linked up with the situation in India, is contained in an editorial in last Saturday's "Forward," which says among other things:

"Hysterical cries and condemnations

of the MacDonald government will only serve to enrage, and perhaps to antagonize, the best friends which the Palestine Jews have in England. One must bear in mind that Jewish Palestine never had too many friends in the governing circles of England. One must remember that the Jews cannot afford to drive away those friends which Palestine has made for itself. The language which some patriotic Zionists are using nowadays against MacDonald, the hysteria which they show, their inciting cries, may have this effect. These people are doing the workers in Palestine more harm than good."

Says Government Inherited Policies

In the same issue of the "Forward," Dr. A. Ginzburg argues that the MacDonald government was not the first to issue orders restricting immigration and land purchase in Palestine, but that it inherited its Palestine policies from former governments, just as it inherited the troubles in India and the unemployment situation in Great Britain itself, and that it is not so easy for the Labor government to rid itself of these heritages, especially when it has no majority.

"The first one who instituted the British policies with regard to Palestine was none other than the Jewish High Commissioner, Sir Herbert Samuel, a Zionist," says Dr. Ginzburg. "He was the first to close the doors of Palestine for Jewish immigrants after the Jaffa pogrom. He was the first who found it necessary to reward the pogromists for their noble work. He appointed the Grand Mufti of Jerusalem to the important post which he now occupies. Through his initiative the Churchill White Paper which virtually abolishes the Balfour Declaration was issued."

Chicago Business Men Form Club to Study Jewish Problems

Chicago, June 5.—The "Masadah," a society formed of Jewish professional and business men who wish to study the situation of the Jew wherever he may be, has been formed here. The society, whose development is sponsored by Jewish leaders in this city headed by Judge Harry M. Fisher, already has seven chapters in Chicago. Fred I. Simon is president of the central administrative body, comprised of representatives of the seven chapters of "Masadah." The other officers are: Max B. Bregman and Maurice Greiman, vice-presidents; A. Weinberg and Saul Gurewitz, secretaries; S. I. Zack, treasurer. Benjamin B. Chodash and Jack Morris are members of the board.

Jewish Legion Members Here Urge Britain Either to Carry Out Mandate or Give It Up

An appeal to Great Britain either to carry out the Palestine Mandate in letter and spirit or give up the Mandate is contained in a message sent today by the American members of the Jewish Legion, a regiment of Jewish soldiers who fought for Great Britain to Sir Eric Drummond, secretary general of the League of Nations.

The full text of the message to Sir Eric follows: "The American Jewish Legion, which fought under the British flag for the liberation of Palestine, at a general meeting, directed the undersigned to express deep indignation at the attempt to nullify the Palestine Mandate through the suspension of Jewish immigration and the curtailment of elementary Jewish rights in Palestine.

"We appeal through you to the conscience of the civilized world, which you represent, that Jewish rights in Palestine, for which we made untold sacrifices, be upheld and that Great Britain be instructed to carry out in letter and spirit the Mandate or surrender it to a more willing and sympathetic Mandatory."

Protests of Jews Cancel Permit for Construction of Mikveh
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

St. Louis, June 5.—Protests by Jews against permitting the Congregation Thaarat Haimeschpocho to alter a residence for a ritual bath (mikveh) in accordance with orthodox ritual, has caused the St. Louis Board of Adjustment, which hears appeals from the action of the building commissioner in the issuance of building permits, to postpone granting the permit.

Permission had been granted for alterations by the building commissioner but this was revoked after a remonstrance from the owners of an adjacent residence on the ground that the bath was undesirable. Thirty residents presented a protest, including Morris Lazarus, who expressed the opinion that it was a commercial enterprise.

A successful campaign was recently conducted here to establish a sanitary ritual bath.

2,000 Volunteers for Palestine Flower Day on Sunday

Two thousand men and women have volunteered to conduct the sale of Palestine flowers on Palestine Flower Day, which will be observed on Sunday, June 8 in New York and in 200 other cities in towns throughout the United States, it was announced yesterday by Emanuel Neumann, president of the Jewish National Fund of America, the Zionist agency for the acquisition of land in Palestine with headquarters at 111 Fifth Avenue.

The Flower Day, the 17th annual one to be held, will be conducted in New York under the auspices of the Jewish National Fund Council for Greater New York of which Dr. Norman Salt is president.
