## Carol Says Government Will Not Support Anti-Semitism

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, June 12—The new Roumanian government of King Carol will not support anti-Semitism, declared King Carol yesterday in response to a question by the representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency for an assurance to American and world Jewry that the Jews of Roumania would be protected under his rule against anti-Semitic incitement and violence and the enjoyment of full rights as in all Western countries.

King Carol said that the Roumanian people are naturally tolerant but that unfortunately an anti-Semitic party existed but it was not countenanced by the government. He said he regards the minorities as Roumanians and true sons of the country within a common fatherland.

He joyfully recalled his reception from thousands of Roumanian Jews in the United States when he visited that country. King Carol said that the Roumanians in America continue to be attached to the mother country and he will always cherish affectionate memories of them.

## Name Special Committee to Prepare Palestine Observations of Mandates Commission

Geneva, June 12—A special committee of four has been appointed by the League of Nations Mandates Commission to consider the definite questions that will be incorporated in the Commission's observations on the Palestine question following its examination of the problem for submission to the Council of the League of Nations.

The committee consists of D. van Rees, the Dutch member, William Rappard, the Swiss member, Pierre Orts, the Belgian member and M. Merlin, the French member. This committee will act as an editorial committee to which each member of the Mandates Commission will submit a draft of the observations according to a fixed programme.

There will be no session of the Commission today but the editorial committee will meet.

## Jewish Watchmen Sentenced for Firing on Arab Trespassers

Haifa, June 12—Rejecting a plea of self-defence the court today sentenced A. Rody and M. Spilner, watchmen on the Roumanian-Jewish estate known as "Abuzat Herbet Samuel", to eight months each in prison or fines of \$200 for firing on Arab trespassers shortly after last summer's riots.

## 50,000 Jews in Warsaw Parade in Protest Against Palestine Immigration Ban

Warsaw, June 12—Fifty thousand Jews last night paraded and demonstrated through the streets of Warsaw in protest against the suspension of immigration to Palestine. The outpouring that far exceeded expectations overflowed into many side streets and filled the squares. It began at 6 P.M. from different centres passing separately through the Jewish quarter and uniting in the center of the city.

Jewish shops and factories closed in response to a call from the merchants' union. The impressive procession was headed by the rabbis, officials of the Jewish communities, Jewish members of parliament, Zionist leaders, representatives of various Jewish organizations and a multi-colored procession of school children.

The black-framed banners carried by the protesting marchers asked: "England Where Is Thy Conscience?" and "Down with Luke." Exemplary order was manifested throughout the long four-hour demonstration. The streets leading to the British embassy and consulate were closed by the police who stood guard over the British buildings. Throughout the march the demonstrators lustily sang Jewish national songs while the balconies and roofs and windows of all buildings along the line of march were filled with cheering watchers. The Polish populace watched the parade with the greatest of reverence.

## Approve Dreyfus Objection to Dreyfus Play in France

Berlin, June 12—Hearty approval is expressed in German-Jewish circles at the news from Paris that Captain Alfred Dreyfus, central figure in the sensational Dreyfus affair of two generations ago, and his son have objected to the French production of the German Dreyfus drama in order to prevent demonstrations from the extreme radicals.

Jewish leaders here see in this a brave attitude on the part of Captain Dreyfus who is willing to retreat into the background in order to prevent ruffling Franco-German relations.

## Ex-Kaiser's Son Joins Anti-Semitic Party

Berlin, June 12—August William, reputed to be the cleverest son of the former Kaiser, and called by the people "brainy Fritz", today publishes an announcement that he is joining the National Socialist party, one of whose major planks is anti-Semitism.

## Says Australia Wants Sir Isaacs for Governor

Sydney, Australia, June 12—The Sydney "Evening News" in an article headed "Behind the Scenes of the Battle About the Governor-Generalship" says that the Federal ministry is making an intense effort to have Sir Isaacs Isaacs, chief justice of Australia, appointed as governor-general to succeed Lord Stonehaven. It is pointed out that the name of Sir Isaac is the only one submitted to the Home government and it was volunteered without special invitation from London.

It was yesterday reported that the British government had rejected the nomination of Sir Isaacs and the matter of a new governor-general left in abeyance until August when Premier Scullin will come to London to discuss the matter.

## Hungarian Parliament Debates Jewish Aid to Socialism

Budapest, June 12—The Hungarian parliament was the scene of an interesting debate today on whether the Jews have particularly sympathies for Liberalism or Socialism. Karl Wolff, parliamentary leader of the Christian National Economic party, blamed the Jews for supporting Socialism. He said he would rather that they had supported the Christian National policies.

He expressed surprise that "even the rich Jews sympathize with Socialism while the Jewish youth in many countries follow revolutionary movements. The best medium for fighting anti-Semitism would be a united front of Jews and Christians against Marxism."

The Social-Democratic deputies denied that the growth of Socialism was due to Jewish sympathies but said it was rather the result of the Christian National party's failure. Thus far the Jewish members of parliament have not taken any part in the discussion.

## Jews Condemned to Death for Communist Activities

Lemberg, June 12—Three Jews, one a government official and the others students, none over 23, have been sentenced to death by the Court of Assizes here for belonging to the Communist Party, and for Communist activities.

The three condemned are Samuel Jugend, 22, the government official, Naftali Propper, 22 and Israel Hirsch, 23. Another Jew, Akiba Kahn, an engineer, also suspected of membership in the Communists party, was released. Counsel for the three condemned men has filed an appeal.

**Reports Jewish Family Welfare Organizations More Efficient Than Non-Sectarian Groups**  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Boston, June 12—Jewish family welfare organizations do less emergency work, give a greater proportion of long-time service, keep their cases under care longer, use financial relief more freely where it is used at all, have larger staffs, burden the workers with fewer cases and pay their staffs somewhat better, Ralph C. Hurlin, director of the department of statistics of the Russell Sage Foundation, declared before the National Conference of Jewish Social Service. His facts were based on a study of Jewish family welfare organizations in comparison with other organizations in the same field.

A. W. McMillan, director of registration of social statistics of the University of Chicago submitted charts showing that the average expenditure of Jewish family welfare organizations for relief in a studied area was 72 per cent higher than the expenditure of the leading non-sectarian agencies. Mr. McMillan also presented evidence from a large group of cities showing that 93 per cent of the children under the care of Jewish placing-out agencies were in foster homes provided and supervised by specialized agencies, while among the entire group of Jewish and non-Jewish institutions in the same area 66 per cent of the foster home children were in foster homes.

**Republican Press Welcomes Ban on Hitlerite Uniforms**

Berlin, June 12—The prohibition on the wearing of uniforms by the members of the Hitlerite party in Prussia is welcomed by the Republican press which sees in the ban a possibility that the Hitlerite agitation will be allayed by depriving the nationalist youth of an opportunity to play at soldiering.

**American Jewish Historical Society Concludes Sessions**  
(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Boston, June 12—At the closing session of the American Jewish Historical Society, held last evening in Adath Israel Temple, the speakers gave the historical background of prominent Jewish men and women. A. S. W. Rosenbach of Philadelphia, presided. The purpose of the conference was to gather material on what the Jews gave in art, literature and other lines to the history of this country from the earliest days, to form a reference library in the new Jewish seminary in New York.

Speakers included Rabbi David B. Swiren of Philadelphia on the civil marriage and the Jewish law. "Jews in the History of Columbia University" was given by Leon Huhner of New York City. Max J. Kohler, New York City, spoke on "The Abrogation of the Russian-American Treaty." Miss Blanche London of Cambridge, spoke on "Gertrude Stein, Modernist, Her Career and Influence." Rev. D. de Sola Pool, New York City, gave a paper on "Saul Brown, the First Hazan in North America." Benjamin Wole, the third recorded Hazan, was also the subject of a paper. Mrs. Bessie L. Pouzner of Lowell gave the life of Benjamin S. Pouzner, and Mrs. Hannah London Seigel of Belmont, spoke on early American Jewish portraits.

**Three Jews Die in New England Sea Tragedy**

Boston, Mass., June 12—Three Jews lost their lives in a disaster which has taken a toll of at least 47 lives when the passenger liner, the Fairfax, collided with the oil tanker, Pinthos, off the New England coast. The crash was the scene of a tragedy in which a young Jewish mother and her 14-months old son lost their lives.

Mrs. Ida Berkowitz of Roxbury, Mass., the 22-year old mother who dashed through the flaming corridors to save her 14-months old son, M. Robert Berkowitz, who was sleeping peacefully in their cabin, died on her way to the hospital, the baby dying a few hours later.

A. Friedman, a Jewish steward on the tanker Pinthos is believed to have died with the rest of the crew.

**Young Mizrahi Convention to Meet Here Sunday**

Nearly 100 delegates from New York, Boston, Philadelphia, Chicago and Detroit are expected here for the ninth annual convention of the Mizrahi Hazair (Young Orthodox Zionists) who will meet for two days starting Sunday at the Hotel Pennsylvania. Rabbi Aaron Teitelbaum will address the convention in the name of the World Central Executive of Mizrahi. Other speakers will be Gedaliah Bulbick, president of the American Mizrahi, Rabbi Z. Wolf and Rabbi J. Levenson.

**Pittsburgh's Jews and Non-Jews Mourn Passing of Judge Cohen, Oldest Jurist in the State**

Pittsburgh, June 12—Tributes from leaders in Pittsburgh communal, welfare, legal and judicial circles are pouring in for Judge Josiah Cohen, the oldest jurist in Pennsylvania, who died yesterday in his 90th year. Funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon from Temple Rodef Shalom of which Judge Cohen was the president for the past twenty years. He was the first Jewish lawyer and first Jewish judge in Allegheny County.

Mayor Charles H. Kline, who served with Judge Cohen before being elected to the chief office of the city, said: "I was deeply shocked to learn of the death of my dear friend, Judge Josiah Cohen. While on the bench it was my good fortune to come in closer contact than before, and it was then that I learned of his many beautiful and manly characteristics. He will be missed not only by Jewry, for whom he labored so well, but by the Gentile as well, for among both he had thousands of friends. His place in society will be difficult to fill."

Robert S. Frazier, justice of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court, said: "I knew him intimately previously to his becoming a member of the bench and since that time have been closely connected in matters pertaining to the court. He possessed a good legal mind and in all respects was an able, conscientious and diligent judicial officer."

Herman Passamaneck, executive director of the Pittsburgh Young Men's and Women's Hebrew Association, an institution with which Judge Cohen was actively identified, said: "Not only Pittsburgh but all America will feel the loss of Judge Cohen. He was a leader in everything Jewish. His efforts for the 'Y' are unparalleled. He was an inspiration to all of us at all times."

**Pacific Coast Zionists to Hold 1st Regional Conference**

Los Angeles, June 12—Zionists from various cities on the Pacific Coast will meet in a regional conference here on Thursday and Friday, June 25 and 26, according to arrangements made by Aron Riche, president of the Los Angeles Zionist District, and Judge I. M. Golden, president of the San Francisco District. This will be the first conference of Pacific Coast Zionists ever held, and will take place just prior to the opening of the annual convention of the Pacific Coast District No. 4 of the Bnai B'rith in San Diego.

Invitations to the coming conference have been sent to Zionist districts Hadassah chapters, Junior Hadassah chapters, Mizrahi organizations, Poles Zion organizations, Jewish National Fund committees, Young Judea Clubs and all other working Zionist groups in the Pacific Coast territory. Assurances have been received from leaders of various Zionist groups all over the Coast that their organizations will be represented at the conference.

## Brooklyn Zionists Turn Down Brandeis Proposal

Zionist district No. 14, which is the largest Zionist unit in New York City, has rejected the proposal submitted by Supreme Court Justice Louis D. Brandeis for the administration of the Zionist Organization of America, at a meeting held last night at the Brooklyn Jewish Center, under the Chairmanship of Henry Seinfeld, president of the district.

The meeting adopted a resolution placing the district on record as against the Brandeis Memorandum on the ground that it was not a genuine effort to create a union of forces in American Zionism.

At the same time, the district elected six delegates to the forthcoming convention of the Zionist Organization of America to be held in Cleveland on June 29, and instructed these delegates to vote in accordance with the resolution which was adopted. The delegates are Samuel Inselbuch, Morris Gogolick, Moe Werbelovsky, Morris Weinberg, Nathan Elkin, and Norman Salt.

The text of the resolution adopted by the district is as follows:

"Resolved, that district No. 14 places itself on record as rejecting the Memorandum submitted by Supreme Court Justice Louis D. Brandeis and his associates for the reorganization of Zionist affairs in America, and recommends to its six delegates to the next Zionist convention to vote in accordance with this resolution. But if a proposal which indicates a sincere desire for union between the Brandeis group and the Zionist Organization of America be submitted to the Convention, district No. 14 hereby recommends to its delegates that they support such a proposal."

## St. Paul Raises \$10,000 in Allied Jewish Campaign

St. Paul, June 12—Ten thousand dollars was raised here for the Allied Jewish Campaign from a group of 800 hundred men and women at a dinner following an address by Rabbi Samuel Goldman of Chicago. The drive to raise St. Paul's quota of \$30,000 starts today with forty teams of men and women taking the field.

Dear Mr. Rosenberg:

Congratulations on the vigorous manner in which you and your associates are pressing toward the goal of the New York Allied Jewish Campaign.

May I not assure you of my earnest desire to be of all possible service in this effort to which no Jew in self-respect can afford to remain indifferent?

For the first time in its history, American Jewry, acting as a single unit, is able to envisage the problems of the Jewish people as a whole. This union of forces spells not alone fortification for the financial resources so necessary to the relief activity in Europe and the restoration program in Palestine, but it is to be hoped, a significant step forward in the spiritual progress of American Israel.

The Allied Jewish campaign is the affirmation of the old axiom that the whole is greater than any of its parts, that no ideology can be foreign to the consideration of Jews, so long as it is a contributory factor to the well-being of Jewry as a whole. The allied campaign for Palestine rehabilitation and European relief represents the hope of all progressive Jews that a new era of parity and reciprocity, which have for too long been one-sided, is now in store for American Israel, of which world Jewry will be the beneficiary.

Every Jew who has the welfare of Jewry at his heart must, at this juncture, give his moral and financial support to the campaign.

## Hadassah Protests Immigration Ban to League Secretariat

The headquarters here of Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America, yesterday cabled its protest against the suspension of immigration into Palestine to the Secretariat of the League of Nations to be submitted to the Permanent Mandates Commission, now meeting in Geneva. The protest was in the form of a resolution passed by the national board of Hadassah.

The cabled resolution reads: "Whereas Jewish immigration into Palestine is essential and basic for the upbuilding of the Jewish national homeland in Palestine, and

"Whereas a ban against immigration, even though temporary, is contrary to the fundamental principles of the Balfour Declaration and the Mandate,

"Be it resolved that Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America, voice its protest against the immigration restriction imposed by Great Britain the Mandatory Power, to the League of Nations for transmission to the Mandates Commission."

## Nathan Straus and Sons Give \$25,000 to Allied Drive

A contribution of \$25,000 from Nathan Straus and his sons Nathan Straus, Jr., and Hugh Grant Straus, through the Nathan Straus Foundation, was announced yesterday by James N. Rosenberg, chairman of the New York Allied Jewish Campaign. Ten thousand dollars of this sum is to be credited to the Brooklyn section of the campaign.

Nathan Straus is a national honorary chairman of the Allied Jewish Campaign. He has been one of the most generous contributors in all of the campaigns to raise funds for war-stricken East European Jewry since 1914, and one of the leaders in the efforts to ameliorate their lot. He is also one of the most liberal supporters of the effort to rebuild Palestine as a Jewish Homeland, and a generous contributor to Hadassah, the women's Zionist organization of America, to whom he and his late wife recently presented two buildings, one in Jerusalem, and another in Tel Aviv, Palestine, as centers for its medical and sanitary work in the Holy Land.

Nathan Straus, Jr. is one of the chairmen for Manhattan, and Hugh Grant Straus is actively identified with the business and philanthropic interests of Brooklyn. Last fall the Straus family gave \$75,000 to the Palestine Emergency Fund for the relief of Jewish sufferers from the Arab uprising there last August.

Other contributions announced yesterday were: \$2,500 by Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Levy, \$1,500 by Dr. Frank Leavander, \$1,000 by A. Adelberg, Henry J. Bernheim, Samuel M. Kaplan, Julian Clarence Levi and Mrs. Albert A. Levi, Mrs. Marcus Loew and Abraham Siegel.

The Bronx section of the New York Allied Jewish Campaign formally opened the uptown drive for \$100,000 toward the \$2,500,000 city quota at a dinner in the Concourse Plaza last night, with more than 500 guests attending. County Judge Albert Cohn, chairman of the Bronx committee; Dr. Nathan Krass of Temple Emanu-El, and Jonah J. Goldstein, spoke.

## Hear Luke to Be Promoted by the Colonial Office

Jerusalem, June 12—Harry C. Luke, chief secretary of the Palestine government, and during last Summer's disturbances, in charge of the country's administration in the absence of High Commissioner Chancellor, may be appointed deputy governor of Malta. The reports current in local official circles seem to bear out the rumors that Luke will not return to Palestine from which he has been absent several months on a leave of absence and then as one of the British spokesmen at the special session of the Mandates Commission on Palestine. The Malta post is considered more important than the chief secretaryship of the Palestine government.

## Charging Its Activities Bring Confusion, Jewish Congress Calls on Roumanian Jewish Committee to Discontinue

The American Jewish Congress has through its president, Bernard S. Deutsch, called upon the Roumanian Jewish Committee, headed by Saul S. Myers and Solomon Sufirin, to abandon its activities, since it feels that the Roumanian Jewish Committee has only been organized in opposition to the United Roumanian Jews of America and can only bring confusion and harm to the efforts to aid Roumanian Jewry in this country. This action by the Congress was revealed yesterday by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

### Committee to Adjust Differences

Before calling upon the Roumanian Jewish Committee to disband, the American Jewish Congress had through correspondence with the former sought to adjust the dispute which has arisen between the two groups. The Roumanian Jewish Committee, however, had declined to appear and discuss the situation with the special committee which the Congress had appointed for the purpose.

In his first letter to Mr. Myers, head of the Roumanian Jewish Committee, Mr. Deutsch, on behalf of the Congress, wrote:

"Through the publication of a letter, written by Leo Wolfson, president of the United Roumanian Jews of America, the attention of our Administrative Committee has been called to the serious dispute which has arisen between the above organization and a number of former members of the same, including yourself, who are opposing the policies of the United Roumanian Jews of America.

### Sought to Remove Differences

"In order to prevent a continuance of this controversy, which it was felt could only bring injury to the cause of Roumanian Jewry, it was decided that we offer our good offices in an effort to clarify the situation and to bring about cessation of this controversy. We therefore appointed a special committee to hear statements from both sides of the dispute and to give its judgment on the merits of the issues involved. Our committee consists of the Hon. Carl Sherman, Israel N. Thurman, Nathan D. Perlman and Louis Lande. On hearing from you a meeting will be arranged to suit the convenience of all concerned."

In answer to this Mr. Myers wrote: "We all appreciate the splendid thought which prompted you as president of the American Jewish Congress to write us.

### Say No Dispute

"We have carefully considered your communication. There is no dispute, serious or otherwise, with the United Roumanian Jews of America. We are not opposed to its policies nor those of its president. In fact, we are not paying the slightest attention to any of those policies. We believe that the president of that organization is so radical, so unrestrained in his addresses and so violent in his other attitudes towards those who do not share his views that, irrespective of whom he ad-

resses, he shows that he is unmindful of the very rule which common decency and respect for our fellow-men demands. Because of that, we cannot ever think of associating with him or the organization which he represents."

### Efforts of Accredited Group Thwarted

In reply to this, Mr. Deutsch wrote: "I should think that common decency and respect for your fellow-men would demand that you justify at least in some small measure, the astounding performances of a handful of men forming themselves into a so-called Roumanian Jewish Committee and proceeding not only to arrogate unto themselves the status of a central and representative Roumanian-Jewish organization, but actually to thwart and discredit the efforts of a long established and duly accredited group, and to create such confusion and calumnious misunderstanding on the part of the Roumanian authorities as to ensure an unhappy consequence. So vital and precious is the cause of unity and harmony in Jewish endeavor that only the most compelling cause could justify such action. In the case of yourself and your associates, viewing your previous connection of high trust with the United Roumanian Jews of America and your subsequent action as disclosed in Mr. Wolfson's letter without denial on your part, there is a presumption of disloyalty that I should think you would want at any cost to overcome!"

### Wolfson Devoted to Jewish Cause

"You must pardon my speaking with such frankness. You must pardon, too, my unwillingness to take any notice whatever of your assault upon the manner and character of Mr. Wolfson, whose unflinching courtesy and whose every act in his many years of splendid devotion to the Jewish cause hardly square with the accusations in which you unfortunately see fit to indulge. Fair dealing with our unhappy brethren in Roumania, downright honesty and loyalty, and justice to your own good repute demand that you wash your hands of all this and that you insist with me upon an immediate abandonment of an adventure that can add nothing but ill and mischief to our already too numerous and intolerable problems."

## Groups Interested in Jewish Immigrants Meet Here Sunday

A conference of all Jewish organizations interested in the fate of Jewish immigrants everywhere will be held this Sunday, June 15 at 2 P. M. at the "Hias" building. The conference is being called by Albert Rosenblatt, vice-president of the "Hias" and chairman of its membership committee. At the conference there will be unveiled a portrait of the late Dr. David Bluestone, one of the first directors of the "Hias", and former superintendent of the Educational Alliance on East Broadway.

## Chicago Zionists Table Motion to Negotiate With Brandeis-Mack Group; St. Paul for Memo

Chicago, June 12—A proposal that the Chicago Zionists negotiate separately from the New York Zionist administration with the Brandeis-Mack group for a Zionist alliance was tabled here last night at a meeting of the Chicago Zionist district presided over by Max Schulman, in order to permit more careful study of the matter and an opportunity to get more information about it.

It appears that some time ago Judge Harry Fisher communicated with Judge Mack and asked if he would see Judge Fisher, Max Schulman and Rabbi Samuel Goldman to discuss certain modifications in the Brandeis memorandum. This was agreed to but before they decided to go to New York it was thought well to see that they represented other Chicago Zionists than themselves. Presumably last night's meeting was the endeavor to do this.

St. Paul, Minn., June 12—The St. Paul Zionist region, after a thorough discussion of the present Zionist situation, unanimously adopted the following motion:

"The St. Paul region favors the adoption in principle of the Brandeis-Mack proposal and urges the Administrative Committee of the Z.O.A. to negotiate further with the Brandeis group prior to the convention with a view to bringing about an agreement as to the reorganization plan to be presented to the convention."

A circular letter has been sent out by the St. Paul district to all Zionist regions in the United States and to members of the National Executive Committee urging similar action.

## 300 Attend 5th Anniversary Celebration of Avukah

Avukah, the American student Zionist Federation celebrated its 5th anniversary on Wednesday evening at the Town Hall Club in New York. The celebration took the form of a "Chalutz" dinner under the honorary chairmanship of Dr. Stephen S. Wise and the chairmanship of Cyrus Leventhal. More than 300 representatives of the Jewish community attended this function, including many students from the New York chapters of Avukah, as well as out of town representatives.

Among the speakers of the evening in addition to Dr. Wise and Mr. Leventhal were the Hon. Julius W. Mack, Prof. Horace M. Kallen, Max Rhoads, Honorary President of Avukah, Isaac Imber, President of the New York City chapter and James Waterman Wise, Executive Secretary, Samuel Blumenthal, National President of Avukah was the toastmaster of the evening.

Judge Mack denied that there was any cause for despondency in Zionist ranks today. He stressed the fact that none of the occurrences of the last month must cause Zionists here and elsewhere to retreat from the position which they have taken.
