Sir Israel, who was the brother of the Rev. Sir Herman Gollancz, emeritus professor of University College and distinguished Hebrew scholar, took an active interest in Jewish communal affairs. He was for several years theological tutor to the Jewish students at Harrow School, and in 1903 was elected president of the Union of Jew-

"The English language in America", he then said, "is like the herd of Cadarene swine, but we may hope that it may not altogether annihilate it-self". Feels Hoover Might Intervene for Jews of Palestine If Such Step Became Necessary
