Report Brandeis Memorandum to Be Withdrawn from Z.O.A. Convention and Plan for Coalition Body, with Brandeis Group in Majority Substituted; Speakers Score Wise Attack on Z.O.A.

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Cleveland, June 30—Just before the Bulletin goes to press, a dispatch from the Jewish Telegraphic Agency's correspondent covering the Zionist convention reports, on the basis of reliable information, that the Brandeis-Mack memorandum, which was to have been submitted today for the discussion of the delegates attending the 33rd annual convention, will be withdrawn and replaced by a plan that calls for the creation of a coalition committee of five or seven.

This committee, on which the Brandeis-Mack group would have a majority, would conduct the affairs of the Zionist Organization of America until permanent plans could be adopted, provided the new plan is accepted. Although at the present time nothing definite had yet been agreed upon, both sides, representatives of which have been in constant session since last night, are reported to be extremely hopeful.

The Brandeis-Mack Memorandum, which outlines the proposals and conditions under which this group is prepared to resume active participation in the affairs of the Zionist Organization of America, was to have been presented for the discussion of the convention at this morning's session, but because of the new developments which are being negotiated in private committee sessions, has been put off until this afternoon's or this evening's plenary session.

Marauding Arabs Kill Jewish Watchman in Emek Colony

Jerusalem, June 30—Arab marauders yesterday shot and killed Itzhak Finkel, watchman for the Tel Yosef settlement of the Emek. Several shots were exchanged between Finkel and his assailants. Police from Ainharod arrived after midnight with pathfinders to search for traces of the assassins. Thirty mounted members of the Transjordanian frontier force are scouring the countryside in cooperation with the civil authorities.

Tracks left by the marauders are said to lead from the village to the hills near Ainharod. The assassins are armed with British rifles, judging from the bullet that killed Finkel, the police report. It is feared that last night's attack is part of a terrorist campaign planned by the Transjordanian Bedouins who have been reported meeting secretly at Irbid. The attack on British troopers, last Wednesday, who were motoring near Hahalal is thought to be traceable to the same clan of highwaymen.

Report Wave of Anti-Semitic Sweeping Mexico; Jews of San Potosi Being Boycotted

Mexico City, June 30—A wave of anti-Semitic agitation against Jewish merchants is spreading through the provinces of Mexico and is assuming threatening proportions according to a letter that has been received here from the Jewish community of San Luis Potosi, signed by the heads of twenty Jewish families, telling of the boycott movement against Jewish merchants which has been organized by Mexican merchants there and asking the Jews of Mexico City to start a fight against the anti-Semites.

The letter, which appears in the local Yiddish weekly, "Der Veg," reads:

"In San Luis Potosi a group of Mexican merchants have started a bitter anti-Semitic campaign against the Jewish merchants. They have organized themselves into a society called 'So-

Jewish Colonies in Ukraine Have 5,000,000 Pud Crop

Moscow, June 30—The Jewish colonies in Ukraine have a 5,000,000 pud crop (200,000,000 pounds) this year compared with one of 1,000,000 last year. There is a danger of insufficient workers which may delay the timely harvesting of this record crop. In order to avoid this the Central Committee of the Young Communists has appealed to the young Communists in the neighborhood of the Jewish districts to assist during the harvest.

It has also ordered that all means be taken to prevent the youth from returning to the towns and to detain them until the harvest has been completed.

Jerusalem, June 30—While Moslem societies in Ramleh, Hebron, Ludd, Gaza and Egypt are deluging the Wailing Wall Commission with resolutions insisting that the Wailing Wall is part of the Aksa, the society for protecting the Mosques, and that the Palestine Moslems are its guardians, the Wailing Wall Commission, here to investigate Moslem and Jewish claims to the Wall, this morning heard Zion Benit-scaak Issachoroff, an aged Bukharian Jewish resident of Jerusalem who has lived here for 43 years, break down and weep at the conclusion of his description of the repeated defilement and

Roumanian Jews Pleased with King's Attitude to Jews

Bucharest, June 30—A favorable impression has been created in Jewish circles here by King Carol's assurance to the delegation of Jewish deputies who visited him Saturday that he denounces anti-Semitism, and that he will protect the Jewish population. The delegation that was received by the King consisted of Senator Meyer Ebner, Deputy Theodore Fischer, Rabbi Senator Neimerow and three representatives of the Sephardic Jewish community.

Commenting on the Baltzi incidents, the King told the delegation to give him time and he would restore order. A government commission has been created to study the status of the national minorities and it will submit a report to the Fall session of Parliament. The chairman of the Jewish sub-commission of this investigating body is Professor Andrei, a friend of the Jews.

Under-secretary of the interior, M. Angelescu, who was assigned to investigate the Baltzi incidents, has established that a number of police officials and policemen are guilty. It has been decided to increase the police force in Baltzi where order now prevails.

Swedish Women to Urge Arab and Jewish Cooperation

London, June 30—The London "Observer" reports that the Swedish section of the International League of Women is planning to send one of its members to Palestine to endeavor to draw together the Jews and Arabs by means of a good-will campaign and by educational propaganda to educate them to a realization of the need for cooperation. The member appointed will leave for Palestine in the Fall.

New Soviet Scheme May Permit Rabbis to Emigrate from Russia

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, June 30—A scheme to permit the emigration of those deceased who will never obtain the right to vote is being considered by the Soviet government, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns from reliable sources. This scheme, if adopted, would permit the emigration from Russia of rabbis and other religious workers who are now outside the pale according to Soviet law.

The scheme concerns only the Jewish deceased and it is meeting with the bitter opposition of the Jewish Communists while the non-Jewish members of the commission recently appointed to work out plans for aiding the deceased Jews favor the plan. Hence there is hope that despite the Jewish Communists the rabbis will be able to leave Russia.

Urges Z. O. Executive to Fight for Admission of Jabotinsky

Jerusalem, June 30—"We expect the Zionist Executive to convince us of its power to annul the government decision which refuses to allow Vladimir Jabotinsky to enter Palestine, a decision by which only Jabotinsky's enemies will benefit, not the British nor the Arabs," says Wolfgang von Weis, journalist, who testified before the Inquiry Commission, writing in the "Doar Hayom," whose staff he has just joined.

It is understood here that the Zionist Executive has been asked to intervene with the British government to reconsider its decision banning Vladimir Jabotinsky, Zionist Revisionist leader from Palestine.

Jerusalem, June 30—An Arab bank with a capital of \$75,000 is to start operations in Jerusalem on July 1, according to authentic reports. The bank will issue 3,750 shares.

Lefkowitz Again Heads Central Conference of American Rabbis; Raffalovich Tells of Brazil's Role in Future of World Jewry

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Providence, June 30—Rabbi David Lefkowitz of Dallas, Texas, was re-elected president of the Central Conference of American Rabbis at the concluding session of its 41st annual convention. Rabbi David Philipson of Cincinnati was named honorary president, Rabbi Morris Newfield of Birmingham, Ala., vice-president; Rabbi Felix A. Levy of Chicago, recording secretary; Rabbi Isaac E. Marcuson of Macon, Ga., corresponding secretary; and Rabbi James G. Heller of Cincinnati, treasurer.

To the executive board for 1930-1932 were elected Rabbi Frederick K. Cohn of Omaha, Rabbi Samuel M. Gup of Providence, Rabbi Irving Reichert of New York, Rabbi Max Reichler of Brooklyn, Rabbi Jacob Singer of Chicago and Rabbi A. J. Feldman of Hartford.

"Brazil is destined to play an important role in the future history of Jewry," declared Rabbi Isaiah Raffalovich, of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, in an address on the conditions of Jewry and Judaism in South America. "It is a painful, but nevertheless true fact that there is practically no religion among the Jews in Brazil," he said. "With few exceptions all customs have discarded the ancient traditions, and since they are unaffected by a modern spirit of Judaism, we have the disheartening spectacle of a religionless Jewry."

No Rabbi in Entire Country

"There being no rabbi in the whole of this vast land, it is natural that from Moranos in Amazonia to the smallest Jewish settlement in the South, they should turn to us for assistance."

Dr. Raffalovich was sent to Brazil in 1923 by the Jewish Colonization Association and has succeeded in winning the confidence of the officials so that 20,000 Jews have entered that land in seven years.

He described Jewry in Rio de Janeiro as of three classes: affluent Jews from Western Europe of little use to Judaism because of their slender connection with Jewish matters; a large community of Oriental Jews, Moroccan, Levantine and Syrian, who are essentially of an apathetic nature, and lastly the live and active section of Russo-Polish and Roumanian groups, newcomers, imbued with present-day Russian Jewry's conceptions.

Jewish Community Slowly Forming

After describing his work at ports of entry, in long journeys to scattered communities and in organizing schools, Dr. Raffalovich said, "It is being patent to all observers that gradually, slowly, but surely, a Jewish community is growing and forming itself in Brazil. Every observer testifies to the notable change in the moral and spiritual life of Brazilian Jewry. Zionist societies are flourishing.

"Amidst the spiritual chaos, which is probably the inevitable characteristic of a conglomeration of Jews, hailing from every part of the world, each one moved by the sole desire of attaining

material prosperity, it is indeed a great satisfaction to perceive an undoubted tendency even for religious organization. It should be the concern of every Jew that this new home should be a Jewish home."

The committee on resolutions declared that Jewish unemployment was a fundamental problem and the Conference moved for cooperation with other groups to effect a solution. The conference also voted to interest American Jews in the establishment of a synagogue in Havana.

Foster Alone Responsible for Address

The conference voted its approval of the footnote to the conference lecture of Rabbi Solomon Foster of Newark, N. J., declaring that he alone was responsible for the ideas expressed in the address. Rabbi Foster had said "Zionism with its nationalistic philosophy has increased anti-Semitism," that "Zionism has diverted funds that were needed in our American Jewish life" and that "Judaism and Christianity cannot be possibly reconciled." He also cited what he termed many indications of demoralization among American Jews.

Rabbi Franklin of Detroit, speaking on the problem of bringing the unaffiliated Jews into religious organizations criticized circuit preaching, which he termed "extensive rather than intensive." He deplored the loss of opportunity in allowing the B'nai B'rith to carry on the work of the Hillel Foundations. Rabbi Franklin saw a crying need for religious work in the West and in rural communities to save the Jews.

Pittsburgh Vaad Ha'Kashruth Reorganizes, Elects New Officers

Pittsburg, Pa., June 30—The "Vaad Ha'Kashruth" of this city, which supervises the slaughtering of animals for kosher meat purposes, has re-organized itself and is now composed of the Rabbinical Assembly of Pittsburgh and eleven laymen. Each congregation will be represented by a committee of three members.

applauding every oratorical shaft aimed by the speakers at the British government.

Score Stephen Wise

Though his name was not mentioned, Rabbi Stephen S. Wise was roundly scored for a statement issued Saturday in New York in which he was reported to have spoken of the Zionist Organization of America as "morally and spiritually bankrupt." After greeting the convention on behalf of the Ohio State Zionists, Rabbi Barnett Brickner, referring to Rabbi Wise's statement, wondered whether "that dear friend of ours has had an aberration of mind or lapse of memory" and added that Rabbi Wise "should have been on this platform where he belongs against his own judgment."

The opening session of the convention was completely overshadowed by Rabbi Wise's statement in which he came out for the Brandeis-Mack memorandum. While Rabbi Brickner was speaking he was interrupted by James Waterman Wise, son of Rabbi Wise, who sought to point out that his father had referred only to the present Zionist administration and not to the entire organization. Confusion was caused for a while until those sitting near Mr. Wise could get him to sit down.

Though the atmosphere was charged with the Brandeis-Mack memorandum and everywhere it was the subject of discussion there was no mention made of it at the initial session, although all speakers alike emphasized the importance of a united front.

Reform Rabbis Turn to Zionism

The convention was opened by Ezra Shapiro, chairman of the local Zionist group, who admonished the delegates "not to dabble in petty differences." In his address, Rabbi Brickner told of the inroads Jewish nationalism has made in the ranks of the Reform rabbinate. Louis Lipsky, introduced as a "prince in American Israel," was given a rousing ovation which ended with the entire audience singing Hatikvah.

Lipsky Attacks Britain

In his presidential message, Mr. Lipsky charged that Great Britain has shown an utter incapacity to administer the Mandate over Palestine, thus compelling the Jews of the world to turn to the League of Nations with the demand that justice be done.

Referring to the recent suspension of Jewish immigration into Palestine, which has aroused the indignation of world Jewry, Mr. Lipsky declared that "there will be no diminution of that protest until the order to suspend immigration is revoked, until the latest White Paper is supplanted by a program calculated to carry into effect the letter and spirit of the Mandate. The right accorded to the Jewish people under the Mandate cannot be withdrawn or temporarily suspended for the purpose of stunting the convenience

of the Mandatory Government. A trust remains a trust, no matter how difficult it may be to execute it, and so long as England holds the Mandate, profits by its presence in Palestine, so long will the world expect England to keep its pledge and to discharge its trust regardless of the difficulties."

Pointing to the coalition of Jewish forces in Palestine which resulted after the August riots, Mr. Lipsky said that "it is the sincere hope of every Zionist present that as a result of our deliberations here there shall be created a union of all forces, a coalition of all our strength in order that the maximum of service to our cause may be achieved."

The convention then elected Louis Lipsky, Judge William Lewis, Rabbi James Heller, Abraham Goldberg, Max Shulman and Mrs. Robert Szold as session chairmen. Menahem Ribalow was appointed Hebrew secretary, Bernard Shelvin, Yiddish secretary and Bernard G. Richards, English secretary of the convention.

Hoover Sends Message

President Hoover addressed the following message to the convention through William R. Hopkins, former city manager of Cleveland:

"Please extend my cordial greetings to the convention of the Zionist Organization of America and my deep appreciation of their service to the spiritual life of the Jewish race. I have followed with deep interest the occurrences of the last year in Palestine and I wish to assure the convention not only of my sympathy with them in their problem but of my hope that the discouragements of the moment will be presently removed and the work of advancing Jewish aspirations go forward to even greater success."

Messages were also received from Dr. Chaim Weizmann who expressed the hope that the American Zionists would present a united front, from the Zionist Executive, from M. M. Ussishkin of the Jewish National Fund and from the American Association of Palestine Settlers.

ciety of Potosian Merchants' Campaign Against Russian-Polish Jews," and are inciting against Jews both orally and in writing. They are also arousing the local government institutions against the Jewish merchants, and have succeeded to such an extent that taxes on our businesses have been increased threefold. Two issues of their organ, "Vanguardia," have already appeared with venomous anti-Semitic articles, in which Jews are reviled and the Mexican masses asked to boycott Jewish places of business and Jewish employers.

"The Jewish colony of San Luis Potosi is in despair and requests the Jewish colony of Mexico City, which numbers thousands of families, to seek ways and means to combat the danger which is threatening the small Jewish colonies in all the Mexican provincial towns. What is happening today in San Luis Potosi is characteristic of all the provincial towns of Mexico where Jews live. Besides, anti-Semitic propaganda in Mexico City itself encourages the dark forces in the provinces. Let the Jewish colony in Mexico City remember that the destruction of the Jewish settlements in the provinces will have an especially harmful effect on the Jews of the capital. Ways and means must be found by the Jews of Mexico City to stop the anti-Semitic agitation, against which we Jews in the provinces, who are only a handful, are powerless."

Shapiro Brothers Arrested for Injuring Arab Trespasser

desecration of the Jewish sanctuary by the Moslems.

Many of the resolutions from Moslem societies assert, "Our lives are cheap where the defence of Burak (the Wall) is concerned."

Issachoroff, who worshipped at the Wailing Wall from boyhood, was wearing a black astrachan cap and a brocaded gray mantle. He recalled that years ago urchins occasionally pelted the Jewish worshippers at the Wall with stones but the congregation did not take any notice of it while responsible Moslems, he testified, never interfered with the worship.

He described the benches of the worshippers that were stored near the Wall at night and enumerated the many gifts he made for the Wall congregations. The 60-year old Jew, who presented a picturesque sight as he testified, described the complete congregational Sabbath service at the Wall and also the service for the high holidays when the shofar is blown and the Pentateuchal portion of the service is read.

Issachoroff's laborious testimony was climaxed by the statement that he and others had often found the pavement in front of the Wall soiled by debris that had fallen from the passing rubbish-laden donkeys and the ofal from a donkey stabled in the chamber, recently converted into the zahweih, by an Arab family which owned the animal. He also declared that this Arab family had built a rest room abutting the Wall, thus forcing the congregation into the other corner.

Weepingly he told how on Succoth, seven or eight years ago, he had found ofal on the monoliths themselves and the worshippers, dressed in their holiday finery, washed and cleansed the stones before starting the service.

Abdul Auni Bey, Arab counsel, after several attempts at obstructing the testimony, including an endeavor to compel the witness to testify in Arabic, rigorously cross-examined Issachoroff.

Zionists Injured as Chalutzim Meeting Raided by Communists

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, June 30—A raid by Communists on a meeting of a Zionist Chalutzim organization that was being held yesterday in Falenica, a resort near Warsaw, resulted in the wounding of six Zionists and two Communists. The Communists suddenly descended on the meeting and began to beat those present. The Zionists resisted them and in the melee several were seriously injured.

Among the Zionists who received serious injuries are: Abraham Naparstek, Chaim Traub, Fania Siedlecka, Hella Miller, Sala Kaufman and Abraham Pinczuk. Communists in Poland have raided Zionist meetings several times before, causing disturbances, and severe injuries to many persons.
