Jews Urge Arabs to Show Tolerance in Closing Wall Case: Arab Spokesman Defiant

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Jerusalem, July 18-Under no circumstances does the Palestine nation, meaning the Arabs, recognize the Pal-estine Mandate nor does it bind itself to any law derived therefrom nor does it recognize the Jewish National Home. This statement was made by Ahmed Zaki Pasha, prominent Moslem dignitary and scholar from Egypt, in be-ginning the summing up of the Arab case before the Wailing Wall Commission vesterday afternoon.

Prior to his address he read a statement in Arabic in which he welcomed the commissioners in the name of the Almighty and said that lovers of justice hoped that the verdict would be impartial and would bring peace and amity to the city whose name is peace. Claiming to speak on behalf of 400,-000,000 Moslems he said that they were all determined to defend their established rights and holy shrines.

Saying that he had discussed the matter with his colleagues, Zaki Pasha then submitted a series of reservations in which he stated that the Arabs can not recognize the Mandate or the Jewnot recognize the Mandate of the Jew-ish National Home. He said that his defence will not change any of the rights which the Arabs possess be-cause they are exclusively entitled to decide their own destiny. Any dispute regarding the ownership of the places of worship must be submitted to a competent authority, he declared.

Government Ending Bukowina Disturbances as Agitation Spreads to Bessarabia (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, July 18-While the government is carrying out its plans to stamp out the anti-Semitic disturb-ances in Bukowina new anti-Semitic agitation has broken out, this time in Bessarabia. The peasants there are being incited against the Jews by propa-ganda stating that the Jewish bankers are responsible for the low prices being received for this year's crops. Reports in the Roumanian press indicate that the anti-Semitism of the peasants is in some measure traceable to the difficult agricultural situation.

Disturbances are reported in Teghina Zimislea where the gendarmes have arrested a priest, a school teacher and three students, indicating that the government is actually determined to suppress the attacks of the peasants.

The Jewish community of Kishinev has addressed a telegram of protest to King Carol, minister of interior Vayda Voevod and Premier Maniu regarding the troubles in Bukowina. On the other hand Vayda Voevod has issued a vigorous denial of the reports in the Roumanian papers that there have been new outbreaks in Southern Bu-kowina. He termed the story that the "Czernowitz Morgenblatt", a Jewish paper had been confiscated, fantastic and declared untrue the report of ex-

The notorious anti-Semitic agitators Danila and Nicolai Totu who called on Vayda Voevod today to protest against their being detained in a pig-sty were declined an audience and their immediate arrest was ordered.

Jewish Members of Parliament Ask Punishment for Anti-Semites (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, July 18—A request that those guilty of inciting the peasants to attack the Jews and those participating in the attacks be punished was made to Vayda Voevod, Roumanian minister of the interior, by a delega-tion of Jewish members of parliament in the course of a four-hour conference with him today. During the con-ference the situation created by the anti-Jewish disturbances in various towns and cities of Bukowina was dis-

The delegation consisted of Senator Meyer Ebner, Deputies Joseph Fisher and Michael Landau and Dr. I. Marton. The minister promised that those found guilty would be punished.

Michigan Hillel Foundation . Chief Called to Spokane Pulpit (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Ann Arbor, Mich., July 18-Announcement has been made of the ap-pointment of Rabbi Adolph H. Fink, director of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation at the University of Michigan, to Temple Emanu-El congrega-tion at Spokane, Washington.

Rabbi Fink entered the field of student religious work as associate director of the University of Illinois Hillel Foundation at Champaign in 1925. In the Fall of 1926, he assumed the direc-torship at the Michigan Hillel Foundation where he has remained until the present time.

Delivery of an attack on discrimination against Jewish students by University of Michigan landladies, made at an interdenominational Goodwill banquet sponsored last Spring by the University, drew nation-wide prominence to Rabbi Fink. He delivered the invocation and benediction at the Bacculaureate exercises held in June, in connection with the Commencement program of the university.

on Calendar Reform Plan (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, July 18-The orthodox Jewish point of view against the proposed calendar reform which is to come up before the League of Nations this Fall will be supported by the Polish delegate to the League, Franciszek Sokal. This promise was made today by the Polish vice-minister of foreign affairs, Dr. Wysocki, to a delegation from the central council of the Agudath Israel, orthodox organization. The delegation consisted of Rabbi Lewin, president of the council, and former Senator Mendelsohn.

In presenting the orthodox Jewish attitude toward the calendar reform plan the delegation showed that if it was adopted it would threaten the fixity of the Jewish Sabbath, Dr. Wysocki informed the delegation that he understood and appreciated the Jewish point of view and he assured the delegation that Poland's representative would not support any movement for calendar reform that would affect the Jewish religion.

United States Still Largest Jewish Immigration Country

Contrary to an opinion that prevails in some circles, the Unite States of America is still the largest Jewish im-migration country. Official figures America is still the largest Jewish immigration country. Official figures just issued by the Bureau of Immigration of the U. S. Department of Labor, and which have been carefully analyzed by the Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society, most conclusively show that the number of Jewish immigrants arriving in this country is considerably larger than the number of non-lewish immigrants coming from the same countries in Europe from which these Jews hail, such as Poland, Russia, Lithuania, Rou-mania and Latvia.

In the month of May, there arrived on these shores 913 Jews, 439 Poles, 100 Russians and 362 from all other nations which are not enumerated, such as Lithuania, Latvia and Roumania because of the small quotas. The official figures also state that from omciai ngures also state that from July, 1929 to May, 1930, there came to this country 10,800 Jews, 4,607 Poles, 1,527 Russians and 5,743 of all other nations not enumerated separately. This means that during the period referred to the number of Jewish im-migrants was approximately 1,000 less than all the other nationalities men-

When, in addition, the fact is taken into account that in the same period that is from July, 1929 to May, 1930, there departed from this country 1,726 Poles, 451 Russians, 3,018 of all other nationalities and that only 277 Jews returned to their respective native countries, the number of Jewish immi-grants who remained in the country is hence twice as large as the number of immigrants of all other nationalities mentioned which have settled here per-

Peruvian Government Denies Negotiations Under Way for Colonizing Jews in Peru

(Tewish Telegraphic Agency) Washington, July 18-The report from Berlin that negotiations had been undertaken in Germany for Jewish colonization in Peru was definitely branded as false today by the Pernyian ministry of public works in a communica-tion to the Peruvian embassy here, which transmitted this information to the correspondent of the Jewish Tele-

The communication from the ministry of public works came in response to an inquiry sent by the Peruvian embassy as a result of the original publication of the report some weeks ago The embassy at that time expressed doubt as to the truth of the report. and this position has now been confirmed by the communication from

Following a report from Berlin which appeared in a New York Yiddish daily, May 9, to the effect that the Peruvian government was prepared to offer 2,000,000 hectares of land in Eastern 2,000,000 nectares of land in Eastern Peru for exclusive Jewish colonization, inquiries by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency in Berlin showed that a yearold project of a former German marine officer, Captain Perl, to settle Jews in Eastern Peru had been revived by a Dr. Kirschberg, a Jewish lawyer who was cooperating with a group interested in German colonization in Peru.
Unsuccessful attempts were made by

Dr. Kirschberg and his associates to interest Jewish leaders in the plan. Later it was reported that the German colonization group, in which Baron von Maltzan, an uncle of the former Ger-man ambassador to the United States, was interested, had completed the draft of an agreement with the Peruvian

Those backing the project had also enlisted the interest of Lawrence Groves, American commercial attache in Berlin, who sent a communication regarding the matter to the United States department of commerce, Some days later the proponents of the Peruvian colonization scheme were given an opportunity to put their plan before Jewish leaders at a meeting called on the initiative of the Emigdirekt. this meeting much skepticism was expressed but there was a feeling that Jewish leaders abroad should be given an opportunity to discuss it. Since then nothing has been heard of it until the denial of the Peruvian government.

Says Success of Jewish National Home Depends on Cooperation of Jewry and Great Britain

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) success of the Jewish National Home depends largely on cooperation between Jewry and the British government, the "Near East and India" in an Allied Jewish Campaign to begin on editorial in the current issue argues that "nothing hinders this cooperation more than the constant holding of a pistol, albeit unloaded at the head of the British government". The "Near East and India," reputed to be close to the British Colonial Office, is criticizing the repeated protests of Jewry against Britain's policy in Palestine

The magazine says that if the present tactics of the Tews towards Great Britain had been employed in 1917 there would have been no Balfour Declaration. If ever a return to "sweet reasonableness" was necessary, writes "Near East and India," "now seems the time when circumstances compel a careful stock-taking in Palestine in the interests of the Jewish National

Charge British Policy in Palestine Aimed to White-

Wash Administration There (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, July 18—The entire present policy of the British government in Palestine is only meant to white-wash the former actions of British officials there, declares a statement issued yesterday by the British Palestine Committee, among whose members are many prominent Englishmen. Because of that, declares the Committee, the government is endeavoring to show that Jewish immigration and Jewish land purchase are responsible for the Arab riots of last Summer.

The committee also criticizes Prime Minister MacDonald for accepting the report of the Shaw Commission on Palestine, which it declares consisted of "second-rate men," while refusing to accept the report of the Simon Commission on India, which it declares consisted of first-rate men. It points out that while the conclusion of the Simon Commission were arrived at unanimously and were all within the sphere of its authority, the conclusions of the Shaw Commission were not unanimous and exceeded its authority

The Palestine government is also condemned in the report for indicting more Jews than Arabs for complicity in the murders of last August. the riots were organized by the Arabs, declares the Committee, 25 Jews against 19 Arabs were arrested in Jerusalem for murder, while in Haifa 42 Jews all the Jews in these two cities were later freed.

Probe of Kovel Incidents (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, July 18-A demand for a thorough investigation of the recent incidents at Kovel where a number of Jews were injured following clashes with hooligans growing out of a swimming pool altercation was made today by the Jewish National Council of Poland in a memorandum to M. Skladowski, minister of the interior.

The memorandum quotes the "Kovel Voice" which says "that in spite of M. Filipowicz's communique the attacking party was Christian while the Jews retaliated in self-defence. Among the Jews injured were elderly people, women and children. Naphtali Salz, Hirsch Boxer, Eliezer Beiler and Abraham Biner were badly hurt and seventeen others were slightly injured". On July 9 Titus Filipowicz, the Polish ambassador to the United States, replying to inquiries made regarding the Kovel incidents by the Federation of Polish Tews in America, reported that the trouble started when "two Jewish youths overturned on the Turia river a boat occupied by two Christians and the latter retaliated

Philadelphia Synagogue in Danger of Being Converted Into Church for Negroes

(Jewish Daily Bulletin) Philadelphia, July 18-The synagogue Anshe Tifereth Israel and Mastbaum Talmud Torah are in danger of being converted into a church for the colored residents of that section of the city, it was disclosed today by S. Na-thanson and Isaac Lieberman, two of

the leading synagogue supporters.

The facts as presented by these men are as follows: Three years ago the synagogue was erected on a lot estimated at \$20,000. The cost of building was \$60,000 and the cost of equipment \$10,000. This was in 1926 immediately following the death of the millionaire philanthropist Jules E. Mastbaum and the Talmud Torah connected with the synagogue and accommodating ap-proximately sixty-five children was named in his memory. At that time it was hoped that some the wealthier men in that section of the city would contribute towards the maintenance of that institution.

This, it seems, did not materialize with the result that the synagogue was bought in by a local trust company holding a first mortgage of \$30,000. All that was left to the officers and members of the congregation were the seven Torahs. This trust company is of colored people living in the neighborhood are negotiating for its pur-

Hoover Asked to Name Jew Assistant Labor Secretary (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Washington, July 18-Mayor William Broening of Baltimore and Rabbi Louis J. Schwefel of Washington D. (Continued from Page 1) the Wailing Wall and saving that they are frank and want the commissioners to feel their frankness, Dr. Eliash declared that "the Wall is the eternal sign of the Jews' own preservation and a promise for the future. Wherein is there any irreverence in this attitude?

What grievance can the Arabs juxta-pose? What can the Moslems lose?" Dr. Eliash vigorously stated that if fear motivated the Arab opposition to Jewish rights at the Wall "this ghost has now been laid. The sanctity of has now been faid. The sanctity of the Wall prevents our claiming ownership. We believe with the Moslems that things vested in Allah are too sacred for ownership."

Attacks Building Operations

Strikingly, if indirectly, he attacked the Moslem building operations in the vicinity of the Wall. "It is only right", he said, "that we claim that the Wall be inviolable and unchangeable". Re-futing the latest attempt of the Moslems to make it appear that the Jew-ish prayers at the Wall are sinful in Moslem eyes, he said "I warn and beg the other side not to play with reli-gious bigotry. If the Palestine Moslems spread through Transjordania and other Arab countries statements that the Jews contemplate building a synagogue at El Burak when the Jews merely stand at some distance from El Burak for their devotions, they are using a most dangerous weapon.
"If the other side wants to foster

hate I know they can. That is why I say it shouldn't be done", he said, looking directly at Auni Abdul Bey, Arab counsel. Dr. Eliash concluded with an appeal to the Commission to consider the widening of the approaches to the Mosque area and also the pavement in front of the Wall for the sake of sanitation, comfort, and for bringing about a solution to satisfy the 400,000,000 Moslems "with whom you have been threatened" and also the Jews.

Two More Policemen to Face Charges in Beating of Jews (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Yonkers, N. Y., July 18-Two more of an alleged beating of two New York Jews, one a physician, according to an-nouncement by Irvin E. Klein of this city, attorney for the victims, who also plans to file racial prejudice charges.

Sergeant Orville Perry and Patrolman Charles Smith, both of the Westchester County Park Police, will face charges of disorderly conduct in Court of Special Sessions here, according to the lawyer, for witnessing the allegel beating of the two in a shack in Tib-betts Brook Park Sunday by Patrol-man Emmett Howell, and not inter-fering. This, Mr. Klein claims, "aided and abetted in the assault."
