Attack Roumanian Reassuring Statements in View of Spread of Anti-Semitic Disturbances

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, July 19—While King Carol and Premier Maniu are making reassuring declarations regarding anti-Semitism in Roumania, violent anti-Semitic agitation is going on throughout the country, says a report of the Joint Foreign Committee of the Anglo-Jewish Association and of the Board of Jewish Deputies which is to be submitted to tomorrow's meeting of the Board of Jewish Deputies.

Agricultural Depression in Bukovina

The report points out that Bukovina has lately been the prey of a most serious agricultural depression and the anti-Semites are taking advantage of the misery and discontent of the peasants to send emissaries to the provinces in order to stir up anti-Jewish outrages and have held and are holding inciting meetings which have resulted in attacks on Jews which are daily becoming more frequent.

Pointing out that Jewish houses are painted with the Hakenkreuz sign

Sir Herbert Samuel May Be Next Viceroy of India

London, July 19—Sir Herbert Samuel, former High Commissioner of Palestine and secretary of state for home affairs in the Lloyd George cabinet of 1916, will be the next Viceroy of India after the retirement of Lord Irwin, according to the "Daily Herald", organ of the British Labor Party. In the meantime, the "Daily Herald" says, Sir Herbert is Lloyd George's rival for the Liberal leadership.

In 1900 Sir Herbert was aide-de-camp to the Indian Viceroy.

Plumer Says Jews Will Gain Palestine Goal with Patience

London, July 19—The Jews will attain their goal in Palestine if they exercise patience, Lord Plumer, former High Commissioner of Palestine, told M. Nurock, a Jewish deputy from Latvia, who was delegate to the Inter-parliamentary Congress. Speaking to M. Nurock during a reception given to the delegates by the head of the Latvian delegation, Lord Plumer said that the Jews have no reason to despair.

Pointing out that Dr. Weizmann understood that the Jews must have patience, Lord Plumer said that he believed progress would be slow but nevertheless the Jews would attain their goal.

Vogelstein Says Theological Dispute Between Orthodox, Reform, Probably Dead Issue

London, July 19—The theological controversy between Reform and Orthodox Judaism in America is probably a dead issue and it is generally conceded that no new generation will grow up in America with adherence to tefillin (phylacteries) and kashruth, declared Ludwig Vogelstein, chairman of the executive board of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, in responding to addresses of welcome today at the second conference of the World Union for Progressive Judaism which is meeting in the Liberal Jewish Synagogue and the West London Liberal Synagogue.

Pointing out that "the fast moving American panorama inclines us to question the wisdom of attaching too much value to religious slogans," Mr. Vogelstein said that "our Reform synagogues are gracefully yielding to a beneficent invasion by the sons and daughters of orthodox parents. But these sons and daughters are not making our synagogues orthodox." This, Mr. Vogelstein said, indicated that the "vast army of American Jews is marching toward reform."

Zionism Is Dangerous Scheme Seeking Restoration of Kingdom of Judah, Moslem Advocate Charges Before Wailing Wall Commission

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, July 19—"Zionism is a dangerous scheme which seeks the restoration of the Kingdom of Judah," declared Mohammed Ali Pasha, Moslem advocate from Egypt, in speaking for the Arab side yesterday afternoon before the Wailing Wall Commission. "The Jews contend that our fears of their encroachment on our holy places are baseless but the near or distant future will show that our fears are founded on fact," he continued. As a result of these and other similar inflammatory remarks Mohammed Ali was frequently interrupted by Dr. Mordecai Eliash, Jewish counsel.

The Commission, which had planned to finish its hearings today and leave for home Saturday was prevented from carrying out its program owing to the secret negotiations which were continued with the Moslem leaders in an endeavor to reach an accord regarding the Jewish prayers at the Wall. The Moslem Sabbath, which is observed Friday, also intervened so that the session which was supposed to begin at 2.30, did not start until an hour later, following Moslem services at the Mosque.

Maniu Returns to Bucharest from Vacation to Deal with Growing Anti-Semitism

Vienna, July 19—Premier Maniu has interrupted his summer vacation to return to Bucharest to call an urgent ministerial council in view of the growth of the anti-Jewish disturbances, the Austrian papers report. As a result of the continued agitation among the peasants new and large scale attacks on the Jews, in comparison with which the recent troubles will be nothing, are feared, the Austrian papers say. This is another reason for the hurried return of Premier Maniu.

While minister of the interior Vayda Voevod yesterday had a long discussion with members of parliament from Bukovina where the recent disturbances have been concentrated, an official report has been issued assuring the country that peace and order prevail in Bukovina with only occasional demonstrations occurring which the authorities are instantly suppressing.

Promises of moral and financial support were made by the minister of the interior to the notorious anti-Semitic agitators, Danila and Nicolai Totu, who visited him yesterday, according to the

Says Zionists Seek Mosque

The Moslem dignitary charged that "the Zionists persistently aim to seize the Mosque of Aksa and the Dome of the Rock. Such aims are bound to drive the Arabs from anti-Zionism to anti-Semitism, leading to greater violence toward the Jews than they suffered in Europe."

Dr. Eliash vainly tried to interrupt the speaker as he began to cite the threadbare quotations which the Arabs have frequently mentioned to show that the Jews have designs on the Moslem holy places. Mohammed Ali insisted that "Lord Melchett in a speech said that the Jews' dearest wish is to rebuild the ancient Temple of David." He went on to quote the Encyclopedia Britannica's definition of Zionism as "a movement to reestablish a prince from the house of David."

He also quoted the definition of Zionism from the Jewish Encyclopedia and cited a passage from the works of the late Israel Zangwill wherein he

Issue Call for Election of Delegates to Jewish Congress

The call for the election of delegates to the eighth session of the American Jewish Congress which will be held at the Hotel Willard, Washington, October 19 and 20 has been issued. As previously announced the Rt. Hon. Harry Snell, Labor member of the British Parliament and a member of the Palestine Inquiry Commission will be the principal speaker.

In addition to acting on the reports of the work of the Congress to be submitted by the officers the Washington session will deal with problems affecting the Jews in Eastern Europe, the Jewish National Home in Palestine and the various forms of discrimination practiced against Jews in the United States in the fields of education and employment, and the proposed alien registration bills.

Feist Wills \$100,000 for "Welfare of Humanity"

White Plains, N. Y., July 19.—A charitable trust fund of \$100,000, to be known as the "Leo Feist Charities Trust" and to be disposed at the discretion of the majority of its trustees, is provided in the will of the late Leo Feist, the well-known music publisher who died on June 21. The entire estate which Mr. Feist left is estimated at one million dollars.

As trustees of the fund, Mr. Feist appointed his wife, Mrs. Bessie Feist, and their three sons, Nathan, Milton and Leonard. In his will Mr. Feist stated that the income of the fund is to be "devoted to the welfare of humanity".

New \$2,500,000 Building of 92nd St. Y.M.H.A. Opens

Climaxing two years of construction activity, the new \$2,500,000 building of the 92nd St. Y.M.H.A. will be opened this morning to provide a recreational center for the Jewish youth of New York. The largest and most complete of the Jewish community centers in the United States, the structure is the only building of its kind which provides dormitory accommodations for Jewish young men.

2 Auditoriums Seat 1,300

Two auditoriums, one of which is the gift of Henry Kaufmann, Pittsburgh merchant, will have a combined seating capacity of 1,300. The Theresa Kaufmann Auditorium, named in memory of Mr. Kaufmann's late wife, is equipped as a modern little theatre, and cost \$200,000 to construct. Living quarters for 235 young men are provided through the medium of 165 single and 35 double rooms located on the upper five floors.

Formal dedication exercises will be held in the Fall at which time activities will be officially inaugurated by a program representing all departments of the institution and culminating in a formal dinner on the final night of the exercises.

Fund Campaign Started Feb., 1927

The campaign for funds for a new Y.M.H.A. building was first publicly announced on February 6, 1927 by the then Supreme Court Justice Joseph M. Proskauer, president of the Association, at a dinner in connection with the fifty-third annual meeting of the institution held in the old building on the same site. Among the individual contributions to the campaign were a gift of \$100,000 from Felix M. Warburg, a donation of \$50,000 by John D. Rockefeller, Jr., Mr. Kaufmann's gift, and an award of \$175,000 from the estate of the late Conrad Hubert, the executors of which were ex-President Calvin Coolidge, former Governor Alfred E. Smith and Julius Rosenwald of Chicago.

Members of Administration

Those in charge of administration and program of the new building include Jack Nadel, executive director; M. W. Beckelman, membership secretary; David M. Dorin, business secretary; Herman Jacobs, director of social and educational activities; Irwin Rosen, director of vocational guidance; the Rev. Dr. Henry M. Rosenthal, director of religious activities; and Nat Holman, director of the department of physical education.

The present 92nd Street institution is the founder organization of the Y.M.H.A. movement throughout the world, having been organized in 1874. Headquarters have been located during the past 56 years in six different buildings, two of which were given to the organization by the late Jacob H. Schiff. For the past two years, during the construction of the new building, the Association was housed in the building of the Young Women's Hebrew Association. The Association started with a

Zackheim Heads Detroit United Hebrew Schools

Detroit, July 19.—The United Hebrew Schools of Detroit, at its annual meeting elected J. Friedberg, a pioneer worker in the cause of Hebrew education, honorary president for life. Maurice H. Zackheim was re-elected president. Judge Harry B. Keidan was chosen first vice-president and Hyman Goldman second vice-president. David Robinson and Abraham Rogvov were re-elected treasurer and secretary.

Forty-two directors were chosen for three, two and one year terms.

Mr. Zackheim, in his annual report as president, stated that 1,400 boys and girls are receiving a Hebrew education in the schools. He reported that the indebtedness is being reduced, and to wipe out the mortgages he recommended that 2,000 members be enrolled to pay \$5 a year each. The schools receive \$50,000 a year from the Jewish Welfare Federation.

Jewish Philanthropist Gives Negro Institution \$50,000

Chicago, July 19.—Max Epstein, noted Jewish capitalist and philanthropist of this city, has through the University of Chicago made a contribution of \$50,000 to the Provident Hospital and Training School, a negro institution, for the purpose of establishing an out-patient department of the hospital. This is the third gift of the kind that Mr. Epstein has made.

Mr. Epstein, who is the president of the General American Tank Car Corporation, was chairman of the Draft Board during the World War. He is the donor of the Max Epstein Dispensary and Social Hall of the University of Chicago and established the Max Epstein Loan Fund at Harvard Law School.

Soviets to Permit Thirty-six Chalutzim to Leave Russia

Moscow, July 19.—Permission for 36 Chalutzim, Zionist pioneers, to leave Russia, was today granted by the Soviet authorities to members of right and left wing groups of the HeHalutz, pioneer organization. Eighteen of the Chalutzim will be able to enter Palestine without difficulty because their visas have been arranged for.

The others will be compelled to remain in Russia until their visas are obtained, thus facing the danger that their passports will expire making it impossible for them ever to realize their ambition of going to Palestine.

Mayer Wishes for his labors in establishing Reform Judaism in America, Mr. Vogelstein observed that "Reform Judaism, by espousing the cause of scientific truth at its very outset, probably saved a whole generation for our faith."

Nevertheless Mr. Vogelstein told the Conference that perfection had not been achieved in America. He said that Judaism in America had many grave problems peculiar to the American scene, among them the philanthropic Jews, and the racial, cultural and national Jews. Earnest efforts were being made, he said, to enlist the interest of these backsliders.

Sessions Opened

The Conference, which has for its discussion the thesis, "Progressive Judaism and Some Aspects of Modern Thought" was opened this morning with services at the West London Synagogue, and an address by Rabbi David Lefkowitz of Dallas, Texas, president of the Central Conference of American Rabbis.

In the evening Claude G. Montefiore, president of the Liberal Jewish Synagogue, welcomed the delegates, and opening prayers were said by Rabbis Isaac Marcuson of Macon, Georgia, Nathan Stern of New York and Henry J. Stern of Montreal. In response to Mr. Montefiore's greeting Mr. Vogelstein spoke on behalf of the American delegation and Rabbi L. Germain Levy and Heinrich Stern for the French and German delegations respectively.

Gutstadt to Head San Francisco Jewish National Welfare Appeal

San Francisco, July 19—Richard E. Gutstadt, executive secretary of District No. 4 of the B'nai B'rith, who last year put the fifth San Francisco Jewish National Welfare Appeal of \$265,000 over the top, will take charge again this year of the sixth annual Jewish National Welfare Fund Campaign.

Mr. Gutstadt's acceptance of the appointment did not come until a special session of District No. 4's General Committee had first approved a resolution temporarily releasing him from his duties as executive secretary in order to fully prepare for the ensuing drive. He assisted Leon Sloss, Jr. in the 1928 Appeal.

Plans are now under way for the appointment of committees and the setting of the date of the appeal and the amount of the quota which is expected to exceed that of last year by several thousand dollars.

During the year several agencies, which have been deemed worthy by the JNWF committee have been added to the list of 35 agencies in America, Europe and Palestine which benefited from last year's drive.

Two Jews Mentioned for U. S. District Attorney of Maryland

Baltimore, July 19—The names of two Jews are being mentioned among a number of lawyers as successor to Amos W. W. Woodcock as United States District Attorney of Maryland. Mr. Woodcock recently was appointed by President Hoover as United States Director of Prohibition.

Simon E. Sobeloff, now Deputy City Solicitor of Baltimore, is said to be the latest to be added to the list of those whose friends are trying to bring about their appointment.

Mr. Sobeloff refuses to enter into any discussion of the matter. It is reported, however, that certain men of weight in the Republican party have made it their business to speak earnestly to United States Senator Phillips Lee Goldsborough, of Maryland, to the effect that Mr. Sobeloff would discharge the duties in a capable and creditable manner.

Morton P. Fisher, who served as an assistant to Mr. Woodcock for two years prior to 1925 and who is now a Special Assistant Attorney-General in Washington, is another whose name has been mentioned.

Urges Action by Governor to Enable Baltimore Jews to Vote

Baltimore, July 19—A resolution urging Governor Albert C. Ritchie to act in the interest of the Jewish voters of Baltimore by changing the coming registration dates has been adopted by the Albert C. Ritchie Civic Club, the only Jewish civic club in the city. It has been forwarded to the Governor by Joel J. Hochman, president of the organization.

Governor Ritchie is considering the calling of a special session of the Legislature to provide for the registration of the Jewish voters by a change or addition to the present registration dates, September 23 and 24 and October 7 and 8, which fall on Rosh Hashonah and Succoth.

Alumni of Chicago Hebrew Theological College to Meet

Chicago, July 19—The Alumni of the Hebrew Theological College of Chicago will hold its annual conference beginning Friday, July 25, and extending through Sunday, July 27, in the meeting hall of the College of Chicago. Rabbis from forty communities in the middle west are expected to be present. The present officers of the Association are Rabbi Uri Miller, Terre Haute, Ind., president; Rabbi Charles Chavel, Chicago, vice-president; Rabbi David Rosenblum, South Haven, Mich., treasurer and Rabbi Leonard Mishkin, Chicago, secretary. Rabbi Kramer of Gary, Ind., Rabbi Bender of Joliet, Ill. and Rabbi Lehrfeld of Austin, comprise the executive board. The conference sermon will be delivered by Rabbi Miller.

Spanish Foreign Minister Says Expulsion Edict Against Jews Void; Country Welcomes Them

London, July 10—The edict of 1492 which expelled the Jews from Spain no longer exists since Spain is now governed by the Constitution of 1876 under which all laws anterior to 1800 are inoperative, the Duke of Alba and Berwick, foreign minister of Spain, who is now on a visit to England, said in an interview with the Jewish Telegraphic Agency. His statement was in reply to a question as to how matters stand at present constitutionally and legally concerning the edict of 1492.

The position of the Jews now living in Spain is exactly the same as that of any other part of the population, according to whether they are Spanish citizens or foreign nationals, he stated. Jews can acquire citizenship in Spain in the same way as any other people. The Duke was very emphatic when he asked that the idea that the edict of 1492 still stood be smashed. He denied point blank the rumor that the Jews who are now living in Spain do so surreptitiously and that there is still a law in force under which Jews are not allowed to live in the country.

Inquisition and Expulsion Mistakes

After pointing out that in his opinion the Inquisition and the expulsion of the Jews were mistakes he explained that the Spanish government has for many years maintained close cultural relations with the Sephardic Jews in different parts of the world where they have been living since the expulsion.

Turning to the oft-revived report of a large re-immigration of Spanish Jews to Spain he said that that depended largely upon economic and other considerations of a delicate nature, although he sees no prospect of any mass immigration of Jews to Spain. This problem, however is one which is now the subject of examination by the Spanish government, he declared. Nevertheless he wanted it understood that so far as there are economic openings in the country the Jews are welcome to come to Spain just like anyone else and are assured of the most liberal treatment in accordance with the laws of the country.

170 Rabbis Issue Appeal for Tisha B'Av Collection

Sunday, August 3, the 9th day of the Hebrew month of Ab, commemorated in the synagogues throughout the world as the day when the Temple was destroyed by Titus, was urged as a day for increased activity in behalf of the Jewish National Fund, the agency of the Zionist Organization for the purchase of land in Palestine.

An appeal issued by 170 rabbis, representing that many congregations, was circulated throughout the Jewish houses of worship in the United States. Spiritual leaders of varied theological views have affixed their signatures to the appeal.

quoted Henry Wadsworth Longfellow's famous poem, "The Children's Hour," the last line reading, "and fold their tents like Arabs and silently steal away." Mohammed Ali, however, neglected to mention that the poem was not Zangwill's own.

Putts in Mizrach

Passages from a book on Zionism by Herbert Bentwich, father of the attorney-general of Palestine, were also quoted. He succeeded in placing in the record the mizrachis, small paper banners which Jewish children carry on Simchas Torah with an inset of the Scrolls of the Law in an Ark with swinging doors and a picture of the Wailing Wall in the background. This, Mohammed Ali charged, shows that the Jews mean to open a gate leading from the Wall to the Temple.

He also put into the record a cartoon from the "Yiddische Folk" of New York dated April 30, 1920. The cartoon, printed soon after the San Remo decision confirmed the Palestine Mandate to England, was entitled "A Dream Come True" and accompanied by a poem of Philip Kaskin called "It Has Happened." This, the Moslem advocate said, was an indication that the Jews were not concerned about the Wailing Wall but were merely simulating indignation in order to approach the Mosque and remove the Moslems from their most holy temple.

Citing a statement of General Louis Jean Bols, a British officer who fought in Palestine during the War, that Menachem Mendel Ussishkin, head of the Jewish National Fund, had proposed, with the approval of Chief Rabbi Kook, the acquisition by the Jews of the pavement in front of the Wall, Mohammed Ali attacked the memorandum on the Wailing Wall, prepared by Dr. Cyrus Adler, president of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, and submitted to the Commission at its opening session.

He concluded by saying that he had never thought that under the present circumstances the Jews would hasten to make such unreasonable demands.

Session Delayed by Parley

The session was delayed by a last minute attempt to reach a mutually agreeable settlement between the Jews and the Moslems regarding the Wailing Wall dispute. The endeavor was a complete failure because the Moslems declined to yield a single inch from their position, especially as regards the right of the Jews to pray at the Wall, the Moslems merely conceding their right to visit it.

On the eve of the adjournment of the hearings of the Wailing Wall Commission, Eliot Loefgren, chairman of the Commission, called a secret parley of Jewish and Moslem representatives. Those present, in addition to Mr. Loefgren, were David Yellin, Dr. Mordecai Eliash, Rabbi Meyer Berlin and Isaac Ben Zvi for the Jews, and the Grand Mufti, Ameen Tamini, a member of the Moslem Supreme Council from

Haifa; Sheik Hassan Abusoud, Sheik Darwizi and Ajaj Noweihad for the Moslems.

Mr. Loefgren's eleventh hour move to obtain an accord was fruitless because the Moslems declined to recede from their position after a five hour parley. The chairman of the Commission is reported to have deeply deplored the Moslems' unwillingness to compromise. Yesterday similar results came from a conference between Mr. Loefgren and friends of the Grand Mufti who remained adamant and declined to promise in advance that he and his associates would abide by the recommendations of the Wailing Wall Commission.

Additional Playgrounds Opened by Hadassah in Palestine

Playgrounds modelled after and conducted like those in America have become so popular in Palestine that four new summer playgrounds are being opened there, according to word received here by Mrs. Sundel Doniger, chairman of the playground committee of Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America.

One playground will be in Safed, another in Tiberias, and two in Jerusalem, all under the auspices of Hadassah, Mrs. Doniger says. These will be in addition to the three all-year playgrounds which Hadassah conducts—two in Jerusalem and one in Tel Aviv.

during the night so that the peasants will avoid attacking Christian homes, the report says that the agitation has been particularly severe in South Bukovina in such towns as Kimpoling, Vama, Barlaceana and Suceava.

Authorities Passive

The Joint Foreign Committee charges that the local authorities in these towns remained almost entirely passive while the government has done nothing to insist upon the local authorities doing their duty or else placing at their disposal sufficient resources to restore law and order.

After relating the occurrences in Borscha, which the report maintains shows strong evidence for the assumption that the fire was set by anti-Semites, the report proceeds to say that whatever the truth may be regarding the fire, it seems beyond question that both the government and local authorities did nothing until too late to prevent what proved to be a terrible disaster for a considerable part of the Jewish population of Southern Bukovina.

On this point the Joint Foreign Committee uses the testimony not only of the government's critics but also of government supporters in parliament.
