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Three Jews Win Seats in Canadian Parliament; None Members of Conservatives (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Montreal, July 29—Despite the smashing victory of the Conservatives in yesterday's dominion-wide elections to the Canadian parliament, three Jews, not members of the winning party, were elected. In Toronto Alderman Samuel Factor, running on the Liberal ticket, defeated his Conservative opponent in the Centre West district, being the only Liberal elected in Toronto. Not only is Alderman Factor the first Jew from Toronto to be elected to the Canadian parliament but he is the first Liberal from Toronto to win in thirty-eight years.

The other two Jews elected were incumbents, S. W. Jacobs from the Cartier division in Montreal, and A. A. Heaps, Laborite from Winnipeg. Mr. Jacobs was an easy victor over his Conservative opponent, Louis Wolfe, also a Jew. During the campaign the Conservatives had frankly sought to defeat Mr. Jacobs because he, a Jew, was representing a district where the French-Canadian Catholics predominated.

The surprising victory of Alderman Factor now gives the Jews of Canada three representatives in the Federal parliament. When the returns definitely showed that Mr. Factor had won despite the triumph of the Conservatives the thousands of people gathered in front of the offices of the "Hebrew Journal" in Toronto burst into cheers. As the news trickled in that Mr. Jacobs and Mr. Heaps had been re-elected the excitement became even greater.

While the Canadian Jews were increasing their representation in the Federal parliament the candidates of the "Le Goglu" and the other anti-Semitic French-Canadian weeklies in the province of Quebec went down to defeat.

Congratulate Frick on Racial Science Chair

Berlin, July 29—By an overwhelming majority a conference of German students meeting at Breslau today voted a resolution of thanks to Dr. Wilhelm Frick, the National Socialist minister of education in Thuringia, for establishing a chair in racial science at the University of Jena. Professor Gunther, a noted anti-Semite, has been named to the chair.

The resolution, which passed by a vote of 128 to 27, recommended the establishment of similar courses at other German universities.

Parliamentary Debate on Palestine Off Till Fall

London, July 29—The long-expected debate on the Palestine question in the House of Commons is unlikely to take place before the House of Commons recesses for the Summer, it is learned here today. This means that the debate will be impossible until the Fall.

The Palestine debate has not been placed on the agenda for the closing days of the session but Premier MacDonald recently suggested in replying to an inquiry from Leopold Amery that those who want the debate could utilize some of the supply days for the discussion, during which time any questions may be raised.

In the meantime it is understood that after consulting with Sir John Chancellor, High Commissioner of Palestine, the Colonial Office has recommended to the Conservative leaders, who have been foremost in demanding a day for the Parliamentary debate, not to provoke a debate until Sir John Simpson has made his report.

Sir John is not due in London for some time yet. He is now staying in Athens where he is said to be preparing the draft of his report based on his three months of investigating problems of land settlement, immigration and development in Palestine. It is also learned from an official source that the members of the Wailing Wall Commission are expected in London August 1.

Wailing Wall Commission Going to London First

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Geneva, July 29—The international Wailing Wall Commission which spent several weeks in Jerusalem investigating the Jewish and Moslem claims to the Wailing Wall is proceeding to London before going to Geneva, it is learned here. The members of the Commission will presumably not formulate any verdict immediately but will meet later at a fixed place for the purpose of passing judgment on the evidence they heard. In the meantime each one of the three members will probably draft a separate conclusion.

Dr. Cyrus Adler, a member of the administrative committee of the Jewish Agency and author of the memorandum on the Wailing Wall submitted to the Commission at its opening session, has arrived here, probably to appear before the Commission after its return to Geneva.

Soviets Abandon Plan for Jewish Republic in Bira Bidjan; Colonization to Go on

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, July 29—The proposed plan of a Jewish republic in Bira Bidjan, Far Eastern Republic, has apparently been given up in leading Soviet circles but the colonization of Bira Bidjan will form part of a general scheme of settlement and cultivation in the Far Eastern area of the Soviet Union it is revealed in the resolutions of the recent plenary session of the Ozet, society for settling the Jews on the land, that have just been published.

Work Justified

The Ozet's resolutions point out that the work in Bira Bidjan in the last few years has fully justified the colonization scheme for the region, but emphasize the unsatisfactory tempo of the work which must be intensified. The Ozet says that the future methods and forms of activities in Bira Bidjan must aim at the development not only of agriculture but the entire economic sphere.

After pointing to the great defects in the management of Bira Bidjan in the past, the Ozet resolved to adopt the recently announced recommendations of the special investigating commission of the land commissariat and also the suggestions of the Ozet's revisory committee in order to prevent mistakes in
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Say Mexican Immigration Law Aimed Only at Those Without Capital or Means of Support

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Washington, July 29—While the text of the proposed Mexican immigration law, which is reported to be particularly aimed at Jews and Chinese, is not yet available here, the Mexican Embassy today informed the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that it believes that the bill does not specifically mention any nationalities, being intended merely to exclude immigrants without capital or special means of support.

It is explained that it is this provision which has been interpreted as affecting Jews and Chinese. From a previous statement by the Embassy, however, it appears that Jews and Chinese are the primary object of the contemplated restrictive legislation, notwithstanding Mexico City's endeavor to reduce this impression.

The second statement of the Mexican Embassy here explained that the reply received to its first inquiry in Mexico City did not state that Jews and Chinese were the only nationalities against whom the proposed immigration bill was aimed, but it did admit that Jews and Chinese were included.

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Jewish Bureau Aids 492 Needy Children in 6 Months

Four hundred and ninety-two children were placed in institutions, foster homes and hospitals during the six months ending June 30 by the Jewish Children's Clearing Bureau, one of the ninety-one social agencies affiliated with the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies, it was announced yesterday by Herman W. Block, president of the bureau, in his semi-annual report.

Of a total of 1,588 cases, which included 629 pending at the beginning of the year, 1,045 were disposed of, either by placement, reference to various agencies for other action, or discharge, the report discloses. Five hundred and forty-three cases were carried over into this month.

The Hebrew Orphan Asylum accepted 107 children, and 26 in its Boarding-Out Department, according to Mr. Block's report. The Hebrew Sheltering Guardian Society received 30, and its Home Bureau, which corresponds to the Boarding-Out Department, 138. Ten children were placed with the Brooklyn Hebrew Orphan Asylum, 57 with the Home for Hebrew Infants in the Bronx, and 36 were received by the Children's Haven of Far Rockaway. The remainder are now cared for by the Godmothers' League, the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children, Riverdale, and a number of other child-caring institutions. Fifty-two cases were referred to other agencies, among them the Jewish Social Service Association, and the Jewish Board of Guardians, for solution of individual problems other than placement.

The Clearing Bureau, organized in 1922, represents a cooperative attempt on the part of all Jewish child-caring agencies and family welfare societies in the Federation. It investigates applications for placement of Jewish children for long term or temporary care, and determines the disposition of each child in accordance with definite principles of child care in so far as the facilities of the community allow.

Representatives of 3 Faiths Attend Temple Emanu-El Funeral of Dr. Silverman

Representatives of three faiths were present yesterday morning at Temple Emanu-El when the last rites for the Rev. Dr. Joseph Silverman, rabbi of the Temple for thirty-four years, and rabbi emeritus since 1922, who died Saturday, were held yesterday morning. The services were conducted by Rabbi H. G. Enlow, one of the three rabbis of the congregation, the other two, Rabbis Samuel Schulman and Nathan Krass, being abroad. Burial followed in the family plot at Salem Fields Cemetery, Long Island.

Rabbi Stephen S. Wise of the Free Synagogue delivered the eulogy. Characterizing him as "a Jew first and ever," Rabbi Wise said that Rabbi Silverman fought and combated with native and high courage whatever seemed to threaten Judaism. "All power for Israel, that is to say, all power for righteousness, all power for service throughout his days, he remained unflinching in his zeal for that cause which was interchanged with his life," said Dr. Wise.

Honorary Pall-bearers

The honorary pall-bearers represented every organization in which Rabbi Silverman was an officer. Sidney Herman, vice-president of the congregation, Philip J. Goodhart, Ben Altshuler, Arthur Zinn, Carl Rosenberg, Roger Straus and Edward Schafer represented Temple Emanu-El. Rev. Dr. Walter Laidlaw, a Presbyterian, and the Rev. Victor G. 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Macedonians Here Deny Would- Be Murderer of Dr. Angelescu Is Member of Their Party

George Beza, the student who attempted to kill Dr. Constantin Angelescu, Acting Rumanian Minister of the Interior, is unknown to the Macedonian national movement, which has no relation whatsoever to Rumanian politics. This was the statement issued to the press yesterday by the Central Committee of the Macedonian Political Organization of the United States and Canada.

It had been reported in dispatches from Bucharest that Beza was a Macedonian nationalist and an anti-Semite. In denying that the Macedonian nationalist movement has anything to do with anti-Semitism or with Rumanian affairs, the Macedonian Committee here stated:

"The Macedonian movement aims at the liberation of Macedonia from Yugoslavia, Greece and Bulgaria. It is not an anti-Semitic movement. The Macedonians know too well what persecution means and especially when it takes place in the Balkans. For many years we have been subject to such persecutions and we cannot be in favor of acts and activities like these of the Rumanian anti-Semitic movement. The Jews living in Macedonia have always been in sympathy with our cause for liberation and they have always helped it morally, materially and by active participation. The fate of the Macedonians does not differ from the fate of the Jews who are enjoying our full sympathy in their struggle for fair and just treatment throughout the world."

Hirschberg, Pioneer in Florida Tobacco Industry, Dies at 72

Jacksonville, Fla., July 29—Julius Hirschberg, 72, prominent Jacksonville realtor and Florida chairman of the American Jewish Relief Committee, died here yesterday of heart disease. Mr. Hirschberg, who had formerly been a cigar manufacturer in Philadelphia, was instrumental in the development of tobacco-growing in West Florida when he started in business a generation ago.

A. S. Guggenheimer, New York Philanthropist, Is Dead at 63

Alfred S. Guggenheimer, prominent New York Jewish philanthropist, died on Monday night from heart disease. Mr. Guggenheimer, who was born in Rochester, was 63 years old. Mr. Guggenheimer was a director of the Home for Hebrew Infants in the Bronx and an officer and supporter of many other philanthropic institutions. He was president of the United Manufacturing Company, a paper firm, and vice president of the Fibrelord Corporation. He is survived by his widow, two children and two brothers.

Meyer Lissner, Civic Reformer and Ex-Member, U.S. Shipping Board, Dies in Los Angeles

Los Angeles, July 29—Meyer Lissner, former member of the United States Shipping Board and active in state and national Republican party circles, died here suddenly of heart disease at the age of 59. He is survived by a wife, two sons and a daughter. He was a member of the U. S. Shipping Board from 1921 to 1926. At the time of his death he was also a member of the State Industrial Accident Commission which he founded in 1920.

Born in San Francisco, he was graduated from the Los Angeles Law School in 1899. In 1906 he organized the Non-Partisan City Central Committee of which he was later secretary.

Mr. Lissner organized the Los Angeles City Club in 1907. Two years later he was named president of the Good Government Organization. He was also the founder of the Good Government Fund in 1911 and a member of the executive committee of the California Direct Legislation League. He took an active part in organizing California for the Progressive Party in 1912. When Roosevelt announced his candidacy in 1912 Mr. Lissner was chairman of the California Republican state committee, an office he resigned to become California chairman of the Roosevelt campaign. From 1912 to 1916 he was a member of the national executive committee of the Progressive Party.

His other public activities included the chairmanship of the Los Angeles Board of Public Utilities from 1909-1911 and the editorship of the "California Outlook." He worked with former governor, now United States Senator, Hiram W. Johnson, to redeem California from the political domination of the Southern Pacific Railroad.

Wile's Son Named Aide to U. S. Envoy to Italy

Washington, July 29—Frederick William Wile, Jr., son of the noted Washington political writer, has been appointed private secretary to John W. Garrett, American ambassador to Italy. He is sailing this week to assume his duties in Rome. Young Wile was graduated in June from Princeton University as an honor man of his class.

Shweid Takes Over Former Bronx Schildkraut Theatre

Mark Shweid, the well-known actor, took over the former Schildkraut Theatre, in the Bronx.

Mr. Shweid was a member of the Jewish Art Theatre during the period of its existence. He is also the author of several volumes of prose and poetry. Mr. Shweid is planning to open his theatre during the coming Jewish holidays, and expects to produce a number of original Yiddish plays.

"Times" Compares Anti-Semitic Disturbances in Roumania to Last Year's Palestine Riots

Sharp criticism of the admitted action of the Roumanian minister of the interior, Dr. Alexander Vayda Voyvod, in giving a high post in the ministry to M. Tazladanu, a noted anti-Semite, in the hope of appeasing the anti-Semitic organizations and at the same time keeping tabs on their activities is expressed in an editorial in yesterday's "New York Times" which sees the promises of Premier Maniu to put an end to the anti-Semitic disturbances as unfulfilled.

After pointing out that the attacks on Jews have increased the "Times" says that the reports of the disturbances in Roumania "begin to sound ominously like the 'incidents' in Palestine last year which government neglect permitted to flare up into tragedy." Admitting that it may be true that the disturbances are being instigated against the Maniu government by the Liberals, the "Times" see the prestige and good name of Roumania at stake, apart from the danger to the Jewish population.

Saying that in Roumania "the anti-Semitic mischief makers seem often to have been met more with sorrow than anger," the "Times" admits that the agricultural depression may be making the peasants more amenable to anti-Semitic incitement, but it points out that "in the history of modern minority-baiting it is established that primary responsibility is with the government authorities. Mobs will go in for riot when assured of protection, and will hesitate when the government makes it plain that it will suppress and punish rioting."

Austrian Socialist Chief Says Rich Jews of Austria Prefer Protection of Class to Race

That the Jewish bankers and big industrialists in Austria seem to prefer the protection of their class rather than their race, for they do not hesitate to give their financial support to the obviously anti-Semitic Austrian-Fascist organization, "Heimwehr," was the statement made by Dr. Robert Danneberg, president of the Viennese Landtag, to a representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, after his arrival in this country.

Dr. Danneberg, who is himself a Jew, is here with a party of 89 Socialists composed of political leaders, educators and trade unionists to study the political and educational development of the U. S.

"Although political and social anti-Semitism has lessened of late in Austria, there is still a great anti-Jewish feeling in the economic world, thus adding to the economic sufferings of a great number of Jewish employees who are victims of the economic crisis in the country," declared Dr. Danneberg.

To the question as to whether there is any acute danger of Fascist dicta-

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the future. Immigration to Bira Bidjan in the future will be aimed chiefly at attracting Jewish immigrants into the general Soviet collectives and industrial undertakings. In the neighborhood of these general undertakings there will be concentrated the Jewish collectives, the workers' settlements, the artisans' guilds, all of which should be, according to the Ozet, financially and organizationally amalgamated with the general collectives.

Welcomes Decision

The Ozet also welcomed the decision of the Far Eastern executive committee to separate Bira Bidjan into an independent administrative district which will include all the sections allocated for Jewish colonization. Measures to realize the decision of the Soviet government for the creation of a separate economic body to direct the entire work in Bira Bidjan will also be taken by the Ozet.

Indications that the plan of a Jewish Republic in Bira Bidjan had been abandoned have become frequent of late, the most recent being the suggestion of an investigation commission of the land commissariat that the colonization work in Bira Bidjan be transferred from the Ozet and the Comzet to the land commissariat.

Name Special Government Commission

The vitiation of the scheme began last January with the appointment of a special government commission to build up Bira Bidjan and to colonize it. The commission, being composed of representatives of the different government trusts was primarily interested in Bira Bidjan from the commercial point of view and Jewish interests played a secondary role.

In recent months the management of Bira Bidjan, where in 1927 Michael Kalinin proclaimed the Soviet's intention of establishing a Jewish republic, has been under continual fire. The Comzet and the Ozet, charged with the administration of Bira Bidjan, have been subjected to severe criticism and a number of investigating commissions have turned in reports condemning the work in Bira Bidjan.

Body of Leopold Auer to Be Brought to N. Y. for Burial

Dresden, July 29—The body of Leopold Auer, famous violin teacher who died here recently, will be taken to New York for final interment. His widow announced yesterday that she would sail for New York aboard the steamship Reliance on Aug. 12 with the body of her husband.

The hundreds of expressions of sympathy which have poured in here from American friends immediately after Professor Auer died, said Mrs. Auer, have convinced her that his final resting place should be New York. The exact date of the burial has not yet been announced.

He won for himself a high place in the history of his people in America, and the regard and affection of his fellow Jews throughout the world."

"More particularly do we desire to pay tribute to the splendid services rendered by Rabbi Silverman during the past eight years of his life to the cause of the upbuilding of Palestine. Upon his retirement from active service in the rabbinate, at a time of his life when he might have felt he had earned his rest, he gave himself anew to the study and revaluation of the cause of Zionism to which he had been for many years opposed."

With fine and youthful courage he identified himself with the movement, and with energy and ardor equally youthful, threw himself in the work of raising funds and securing adherents to the Zionist cause. He did much more for Zionism during these last years than most men do in a life-time.

"In his passing has departed a loyal comrade who has made his mark in the history of American Zionism and whose absence from among us will be deeply felt and mourned."

"We extend to the family of Rabbi Silverman our profoundest sympathy sharing with them their sorrow, but also solemn pride in his character and accomplishments."

Palestine Pays Polish Jewess \$1,250 for Death of Son

Warsaw, July 29—Compensation of \$1,250 was today paid to Mrs. Pesse Birnbaum, a Polish Jewess, and a resident of Radom, by the Palestine government for the death of her son, Chaim Opatowski, who was killed in Palestine while defending the Jewish settlement of Mekor Hayim, a suburb of Jerusalem, during the riots of last Summer.

Charges Two-Thirds Communist Party Members Here Are Jews

Chicago, July 29—That two-thirds of the Communist Party membership in this country, which numbers about 30,000, is Jewish, was the charge made yesterday by Harry Jung, executive for several employers and vigilance organizations which distribute blacklists, while testifying before the Congressional committee investigating Communism under the chairmanship of Representative Hamilton Fish of New York. Mr. Jung urged stricter immigration and deportation laws and the registration of aliens to fight the Communists.

"I should say there are at least 30,000 Communists in this country, not counting some 80,000 sympathizers. Two-thirds of the membership is Jewish," said Mr. Jung in answer to a question. Later he stated that fifty percent of the Communist members in this country are American-born.

William J. Page, principal of the Brown Elementary School, told the Committee that on four occasions during the last year groups of six or eight Communist sympathizers, children of Jewish origin, were found in the schoolyard, with Communist circulars. N. E. Hewitt, representative of the American Intelligence Vigilantes, said he had found evidences of Communism in the universities, and named David Gordon, a Jewish student at the University of Wisconsin, as one of the leaders.

"Communism is not now a menace in America," said Mr. Jung, "but it will become one if it is not liquidated, to use a Communist term. Immigration and deportation laws should be strengthened to deal with Communists. The United States should compel all aliens to register."

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
