Entire Jewish Population of Trusheny Flees to Kishinev to Escape Anti-Semites

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Aug. 1.—The entire Jewish population in the township of Trusheny, in the Kishinev district, arrived in Kishinev today in great haste, fleeing from their home town because of the arrival of twenty-five anti-Semitic students who called on the peasants to kill the Jews.

The correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency was informed by telephone today from Kishinev that not a single Jew remains in Trusheny because the Jews fear for their lives. The Kishinev regional police have been urged by local Jewish leaders to take urgent measures to make possible the safe return of the Jewish refugees to their homes in Trusheny.

Dr. M. Schaffer, executive member of the Union of Roumanian Jews, today submitted an official memorandum to Victor Cadere, chief of the Roumanian secret police, about the recent events in Bereshy which were yesterday reported by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency on the basis of official government documents. New Restrictions Imposed at Wailing Wall for Tisha B'Ab Services

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Aug. 1.—Unprecedented restrictions for the Jewish worshippers at the Wailing Wall during the Tisha B'Ab services which begin tomorrow at sunset were promulgated today by Keith Roach, district commissioner of Jerusalem. The restrictions include a prohibition of the use of candles at the Wall for the reading of the Lamentations of Jeremiah, the use of mats for sitting in accordance with the mournful custom and a ban on the Kidush Levana service, the blessing of the new moon which is observed immediately after the Fast of Ab (Tisha B'Ab).

The news that these restrictions would be imposed was given by Mr. Roach to Joseph Meyuhas, president of the Vaad Hair, the Jewish council of Jerusalem, and to Rabbi M. Blau, of the Agudath Israel, Orthodox organization.

Jewish Scientist Heads British Institute in Munich

Munich, Aug. 1.—Dr. Alfred Loewenstein, Jewish scientist, has been appointed director of the newly established British Institute here which is being supported by both the British government and the Munich municipality. The Institute seeks to advance cultural and economic relations.

New German Political Party Gives Assurances That It Is Opposed to Anti-Semitism

Berlin, Aug. 1.—Assurances that the newly organized Constitutional Party, which is comprised of the old Democratic Party and the nationalistic Young German League, is not anti-Semitic and that its leaders have no religious prejudices, were vouchsafed today at a meeting of the Democratic Party called to consider its affiliation with the new group.

In view of the apprehensions felt in Jewish circles here concerning the possibility that the Young German League might introduce its racial policy into the platform of the new party, the question of the Constitutional Party's attitude towards the Jews was raised at the meeting by Bruno Weil, prominent Jewish leader, who demanded that the Constitutional Party publicly announce that it would not tolerate anti-Semitism.

Dr. Erich Koch-Weser, former minister of justice in the Mueller cabinet, and a leading member of the Democratic party, who presided over the meeting, declared that he had never belonged to an anti-Jewish party and that the leader of the Young German League, M. Mahraun, had also stated that he was not an anti-Semite.

M. Weil then announced that German Jewry welcomed the fact that an important part of the German people was opposed to anti-Semitism and that the new party would take over the leadership in fighting the anti-Semitic National Socialists.

Officials of the new party have written to the Central Association of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith informing the Association's leaders that the Constitutional Party is without religious prejudices and that its leading officers as well as its representatives in the Reichstag are similarly free of anti-Semitic bias.

Probe Commission Sets Borscha Fire Damage at 25,000,000 Lei

Bucharest, Aug. 1.—The government commission investigating the recent fire in Borscha, which left several thousand Jews homeless, estimates the damages at 25,000,000 lei, which the government will have to pay if the commission establishes that the fire was not an accident but a well-planned anti-Semitic act.

Officials of the commission today explained to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that the distribution of the damage fund will be made with the cooperation of the Jewish members of Parliament.

MacMahon Letters Not to Be Published; Incompatible With Public Interest, Commons Told

London, Aug. 1.—There is not sufficient ground for holding that the MacMahon-Hussein correspondence either intended to do or did in fact pledge the British government to include Palestine in the promises of a projected Arab state made by Sir Henry MacMahon, the House of Commons was informed today by Dr. Drummond Shiels, under-secretary for the colonies, in replying to a question from F. S. Cocks, Laborite. The House of Commons will recess today without time having been granted for a full Palestine debate.

Dr. Shiels said that Sir Henry himself had denied that the inclusion of Palestine in the proposed Arab state was his intention. Dr. Shiels explained, however, that the ambiguous and inconclusive nature of the correspondence might have left the impression

Status of Moroccan Jews Now Worrying French-Jewish Circles

Paris, Aug. 1.—With the return from Morocco of Professor Victor Basch, president of the League for Human Rights, with the tragic tale of the situation of the Moroccan Jews, their status is beginning to attract the attention in French Jewish circles. The Jews of Morocco, which is under a French and Spanish protectorate, are not permitted to acquire either French or Moroccan citizenship.

The protection of Sultan Moulay Mohammed III means that the Jews are subjected to backward and often arbitrary Moslem jurisdiction. Flogging of

Anti-Semitic Paper Boasts It Helped Elect Conservatives

Montreal, Aug. 1.—Under the caption of "Tascherau Next," the anti-Semitic French-Canadian weekly, "Le Goglu," hails with delight the great victory of the Conservative Party in Monday's national elections, and states that the "patriotic" Goglu order consisting of 62,000 members will now endeavor to oust the provincial Liberal government headed by Premier Tascherau and "its friends the Jews."

"Le Goglu" boasts that the Goglu order helped to elect more than a score of Conservative candidates in the province of Quebec, which has always been a Liberal stronghold. The current issue of "Le Goglu" is full of malign accusations against the Jews, and contains a cartoon showing the Jews "robbing the safe of the Catholic school commission for funds to educate Jewish children."

**Labor Department Grants Appeal
of Hakoah for Stay in U. S.**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Washington, Aug. 1—The United States department of labor today granted the request of the Hakoah-Al Stars, the famous Jewish soccer team, to be readmitted to this country following its return from a tour of South America. The appeal had been originally denied because of a decision to discontinue the waiving of the contract labor clause of the immigration law which is necessary in the case of foreign professional athletes.

When it was learned that the Hakoah's request to be readmitted to the United States had been denied, its counsel, Louis Gribetz, together with a delegation of leading officials of the United States Football Association and the American Soccer League, went to Washington to protest. The interest of Senator Robert Wagner and Congressman Hamilton Fish, both of New York, was also enlisted.

It had been believed that the refusal to permit the Hakoah team to remain here was instigated by a St. Louis soccer team, said to be the one which two years ago lost the American championship to the Jewish players.

**Arab Leader Urges Jews and
Arabs to Unite for Peace**

Jerusalem, Aug. 1—"Now is the time to toll the bells of peace and it is the duty of the Arabs and Jews to meet and settle political and religious questions along the lines of the teachings of Moses and Mohammed," writes Nasser El Taher, an Arab leader from Nabulus, writing in the Arab paper, "El Salaam."

He asks that there "be an end to bloodshed instigated by the professed leaders of the people seeking their own interests."

**Deny Baron Rothschild Offered
to Purchase Wailing Wall**

Paris, Aug. 1—The report in yesterday's "New York Evening World" from its foreign correspondent, Pierre Van Passen, to the effect that Baron Edmond de Rothschild, head of the Paris branch of this famous family, had made a proposal to buy the land on which the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem stands, is absolutely unfounded, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns following an investigation of the report.

The "Evening World's" correspondent also reported that this was the second offer of Baron Rothschild to purchase the site of the Wailing Wall. This, too, is inaccurate, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns.

The first proposal of Baron Rothschild in connection with the Wailing Wall was not to buy the Wall itself but an offer to buy the territory adjacent to it on which stand a number of dingy buildings occupied by the Mugharbi Wakf. These buildings, which are within the Haram area, form a sort of enclosure around the Wailing Wall. A similar proposal was also made by Sir Moses Montefiore, the distinguished English-Jewish philanthropist.

The proposal was repeated in the memorandum on the Wailing Wall presented on behalf of the Jews to the Wailing Wall Commission which recently completed its investigation into the claims of the Moslems and Jews to this ancient vestige of the Temple of Solomon.

3 Jews Named to Legislative**Tax Survey Commission**

Albany, Aug. 1—Professor Edwin R. A. Seligman of Columbia University, New York City; Jesse Straus of New York City; and Charles L. Feldman, Corporation Counsel of Buffalo are among the eight members of the legislative commission which was named yesterday by Governor Roosevelt, Senator Knight and Speaker McGinnies to study the tax laws of New York State and recommend changes to the next Legislature.

Professor Seligman, who is 69, is one of the most noted economists in this country, being the author of many books on economic problems and having often served in the past on various municipal, state and federal commissions that dealt with problems of taxation, finance, unemployment, etc. Mr. Straus is a well-known New York merchant, president of R. H. Macy & Co.

**2 Pioneer Jewish Citizens
of Chicago Die Past 90**

Chicago, Aug. 1—Two of the oldest Jewish residents of Chicago, Mrs. Bella Cohen, 90, and Louis Ginsberg, 93, died today. Mrs. Cohen, who was the mother of Barney Cohen, state director of labor, came here in 1870. Mr. Ginsberg, a retired manufacturer, had lived in Chicago since 1865.

**Land Settlement Officer Rules
for Jews in Infat Dispute**

Jerusalem, Aug. 1—A two-year old dispute over 10,000 dunams of land at Infat near Hederah which Bedouin squatters claimed did not belong to the Jewish colonists there and consequently frequently interrupted the Jewish cultivators, resulting in clashes, was today settled in favor of the Jews by F. G. Lowick, government land settlement officer.

Deprecating the manner in which the Infat Bedouins parted with their lands in 1880 to an Arab broker who later sold them to the Jews, Mr. Lowick decided that the Jews' purchase was bona fide. He expressed himself as being unconcerned with the terms of the original transfer of the title.

Mr. Lowick ruled, however, that 2,500 dunams of the disputed acreage were sand dunes recognized as government property on which the Arabs were morally entitled to grazing and watering rights. The case had been taken up before the land court early this year but had several times been postponed. Several of the postponements were due to negotiations between counsel for the Bedouins and the Jewish counsel. A temporary agreement had been reached but when this fell through the matter was again referred to the land court.

**Mufti Seeks Pan-Islamic and
Christian Bloc Against Jews**

Jerusalem, Aug. 1—Close cooperation between all Islamic countries along Pan-Islamic lines and a pact with the Christian nations is reported to constitute the program of the Grand Mufti as outlined at the recent meeting of the Arab Executive. As this meeting he undertook to take up a half share of the proposed Arab land purchasing company and said to the members of the Executive, "Do not ask me where I will get the money. I am responsible for getting it."

Moghanni, a prominent member of the Arab Executive, is understood to have demonstratively left the meeting because the plans for the land purchasing company were not expedited and the Islamic-Christian alliance against the Jews discussed instead.

**Prominent Jewish Merchant,
Dies at Danville, at Age of 81**

Danville, Ill., August 1—Julius L. Straus, one of the most successful business men in this neighborhood who, though totally blind for the past fifteen years, took an active part in business and civic affairs here, died yesterday at a Danville hospital after a long illness. Mr. Straus, who was 81, had been associated for twenty-five years here with his brother, Alfred, in the development of the Wideawake store. He was born and raised in St. Louis and in 1870 went to New York, where he engaged in business for thirty years. He came to Danville in 1900.

has promised to investigate and to punish the guilty Bereshty officials for permitting the anti-Semitic disorders to last for two full days.

Minister of Justice Junian today issued an order to the provinces not to auction the property of peasants who are unable to meet their taxes, thus avoiding possible anti-Semitic excesses on the part of the dissatisfied peasants.

Senator Meyer Ebner, the Jewish representative from Czernowitz, today received a telegram from Dr. Constantin Angelescu, assistant minister of the interior, who was shot two weeks ago by an anti-Semitic student, thanking the Senator for the sympathies he expressed in connection with the attempted assassination.

Deputy Theodor Fisher, in a long letter in the Bucharest newspaper, "Lupta," makes it clear that he never said that the recent fire in Borscha was not started by anti-Semites and that it was an accident, as government officials, including the minister of the interior, had quoted him as saying.

Acting Premier Lugoianu Promises End of Attacks on Jewish Population

Bucharest, Aug. 1.—A request that public opinion abroad be informed that the Roumanian government is now in complete control of the situation and will henceforth not permit any repetition of the anti-Jewish events was made yesterday of the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency by Ion Lugoianu, acting for Premier Maniu.

In the course of an audience lasting more than an hour, M. Lugoianu frankly declared that "perhaps we were too lenient in the last few months in combating anti-Semitism but now we see that stricter measures are necessary and we are taking them. We have made sincere efforts to check anti-Semitism, but while any government can change the laws it cannot rid the people of their inherited traditions.

"Anti-Semitism was planted in our people by several previous governments and we cannot be held responsible for the thousands of anti-Semitic students or even for the officials whom previous governments inspired in their anti-Semitism. Neither can we dismiss 300,000 state officials in one day. All this requires time, but I assure you that our present policy is to free the country of anti-Semitism, to check the students' agitation, and to bring the legal status of the Jews in our country to the highest point."

To support his statements, M. Lugoianu pointed out that never had the Jews in Roumania had so many representatives in Parliament and in municipal and communal institutions as under the Maniu government. "Give us two or three years and anti-Semitism will be uprooted," he concluded.

Maniu Cabinet to Remain in Office Until September But Vayda Voevod May Quit Soon

Bucharest, Aug. 1.—The Maniu cabinet, which last week offered to resign because of the continued anti-Semitic disturbances, will probably remain in office, at least until the coronation ceremonies of King Carol which will take place in September, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency is reliably informed. This, however, does not exclude the possibility that Dr. Alexander Vayda Voevod, minister of the interior, will resign before that.

It is understood that Dr. Vayda Voevod is extremely dissatisfied that the entire blame for the anti-Semitic events is put on him. He is also resentful of the criticism in the press, even the government papers, and he feels hurt that he is still suspected of keeping in touch with the anti-Semitic leaders, although M. Tazladanu, his anti-Semitic aide, is no longer chief of his cabinet.

Meanwhile a strict investigation is being continued to establish from what source the anti-Semitic organization, the Iron Guard, is obtaining its funds. Although the investigation, which is being directed by Victor Cadere, chief of the secret police, has thus far been unproductive of any results, it is reported that one of the by-laws of the Iron Guard, which are kept secret, provides that any member who discloses its secrets will be murdered.

Three prominent members of the Iron Guard today invaded the office of the Bucharest newspaper, "Adevarul," and demanded that the editor publish an article white-washing the organization, and threatened his life. The invaders were unceremoniously thrown out of the office.

Palestine Jewish Workers' Parley Delegates Sail for Visit to Palestine

Abraham Shiplacoff, chairman; Morris Finestone, vice-chairman and Isaac Hamlin, secretary of the National Labor Committee for the Organized Jewish Workers in Palestine, sailed Saturday on the "Leviathan" for a visit to Palestine. After staying in Palestine a few weeks, they will go to Berlin where they will participate, together with other American delegates, in the first world congress for the Jewish workers of Palestine which will take place on Sept. 20. The other American delegates, Joseph Schlossberg, Chaim Greenberg and Mr. and Mrs. Brown, will sail from this country about August 15.

A farewell evening in honor of the delegation took place on Thursday evening in Beethoven Hall, Manhattan. I. Segal, general secretary of the Jewish National Workers' Alliance, was chairman. Among those who spoke were representatives of the United Hebrew Trades, Amalgamated Clothing Workers' Union, International Ladies' Garment Workers' Union, Poale Zion Party and Zeire Zion.

Jewish Leaders and Pro-Carol Editor See New Attacks on Jews Expected in Autumn

Bucharest, August 1.—The Roumanian government could put an end to the anti-Semitic outbreaks if it so desired but it does not want to do so, was the unanimous opinion expressed by prominent Jewish leaders here of all shades of political opinion beginning with Dr. William Filderman, president of the Federation of Roumanian Jews, who is a Liberal, and ending with Senator Meyer Ebner of Czernowitz, a supporter of the Maniu government.

These Jewish leaders, who were queried by the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, agree that after the statement of the minister of the interior, Dr. Vayda Voevod, to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, that military force would be used if necessary to suppress the anti-Jewish attacks, and the impeachment of the anti-Semitic government official M. Tazladanu as well as the arrest of Zelea Codreanu the outbreaks are likely to be discontinued for a while but they may begin again in the Fall.

This belief is supported by Panfil Sheikare, editor of the "Cuvantul," a pro-Carol paper, and a member of Parliament, who writes in his paper today that "we have definite information that anti-Semitic outbreaks of a violent nature will recur in the Autumn. Dr. Vayda Voevod, speaking to the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, made assurances for order which we consider sincere, although we think they came too late.

"If the government is really ready to show active will-power it ought to do it in such a way that nothing will happen, even in the future, otherwise the expected anti-Jewish events in the Fall may lead to such anarchy that Dr. Vayda Voevod will not be able to suppress it even with military force."

In connection with the forthcoming trial of Zeal Codreanu, anti-Semitic leader now under arrest, M. Tazladanu, the impeached anti-Semitic official of the ministry of the interior, today

Rabbi H. H. Rubenovitz Honored by United Synagogue

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Boston, Aug. 1.—At the last meeting of the executive council of the United Synagogue of America, Rabbi H. H. Rubenovitz, for twenty years spiritual leader of the Temple Mishkan Tefila, Roxbury, was honored by being elected director of the United Synagogue for life in recognition of his services to the cause of Conservative Judaism.

When the United Synagogue was first organized in 1913, Rabbi Rubenovitz was a member of the organization committee, and has served as director from its inception. He has been instrumental in the establishment of Conservative congregations throughout New England, and from his pulpit has expounded the theory and practice of Conservative Judaism for the past twenty years.

Charges of Unfairness Against Jews in Medical Colleges Untrue, National Investigation Proves

That charges of unfairness against Jewish students in medical colleges are unwarranted; that present restrictions safeguard the welfare of medicine, the public and Jewish doctors; and that Jews should themselves curtail the number of young men entering medicine, are the conclusions arrived at as the result of a national investigation conducted under the auspices of the National Conference of Jews and Christians by Dr. A. J. Rongy, an eminent Jewish physician of this city.

Hon. Newton D. Baker, Professor Carlton J. H. Hayes and Roger W. Straus are co-chairmen of the executive board of the National Conference of Jews and Christians.

Revelations of the investigation, (which was undertaken by the National Conference as the result of an article by the Rev. Frank Gavin in "The Living Church" of April 12, 1930, charging discrimination against Jewish medical students) appear in this week's "Jewish Tribune."

Dr. Rongy made a nation-wide poll among American and Canadian medical colleges covering 1925-1929, and also circulated a set of questions among fifty chapters of a large medical fraternity. On the mass of data received he tabulated statistics embracing 15,262 students of whom 3,232 were Jews. "The Jewish population of the country aggregates 3½ percent of the total; Jews are represented by six times their ratio percentages among the medical student body," said Dr. Rongy. "One out of every three Jewish students who apply is admitted to a medical college, but if all were admitted the Jewish ratio would swell to more than 43 percent of the total student body... what would happen if a racial group forming 3½ percent of our national population were permitted to supply 43 percent of our new doctors?... Since the Jewish physician's clientele is almost entirely Jewish, ... an economic problem would arise of severe competition conducive to a lowering of ethical standards."

That Jews, being urban, would practice in cities where medicine is already an overcrowded profession, while rural districts, which need more practitioners, have a largely non-Jewish population, is the real basis of the seeming discrimination, according to Tufts College, Mass., the University of West Virginia, the University of Alabama, the Vanderbilt University of Nashville, Tenn., and many others. The fact that preference is given to students of rural districts, and that among the latter Jews are as welcome as non-Jews is uniformly stressed by the colleges. The study revealed, however, that not all medical schools are free from religious and racial discrimination in the admission of students.

Jews by local judges is an almost daily occurrence.

Professor Basch declares that the cultural standing of the Jews is low and any change in their civil status is impossible and undesirable. He believes that "schools and more schools are a first desideratum" because political considerations make it impossible for France to interfere. Professor Basch points out that "it is impossible to deprive the Sultan of his prerogatives, or rather his courtesans who oppress the people and despise and harass the Jews."

Most of the Jews in Morocco are descendants of the Spanish Jews who fled from Spain in 1492 during the Inquisition and after the expulsion edict. Morocco, being a Mohammedan country, was more hospitable to the Jews, although even there they have had great miseries to contend with. There were, however, important Jewish settlements in Morocco during Roman days. Many of the Jews were of Berber origin.

In the middle of the 19th century the Moroccan wars with Spain and France brought great hardships to the Jews. In 1864, through the intercession of Sir Moses Montefiore, the Sultan issued an edict emancipating the Jews but local officials practically vitiated this measure. The Alliance Universelle Israelite of France has been active in Morocco in establishing schools and sanitary organizations.

Shiels Leaving for Palestine to Confer with Gov't Officials

London, Aug. 1.—Dr. Drummond Shiels, Undersecretary for the colonies, will go to Palestine to confer with Government officials there regarding the political situation. He is due to arrive in Palestine some time in September. An official communique concerning Dr. Shiels' forthcoming visit will be issued shortly by the Colonial Office.

Jacob de Haas to Speak at Boston at Herzl Meeting

Boston, Aug. 1.—Jacob de Haas, chairman of the organization committee of the Zionist Organization of America, and a close friend and biographer of the late Theodor Herzl, will be the chief speaker at the Herzl Memorial exercises planned by the local Zionists here, to take place on Monday evening, August 11, at the Copley-Plaza Hotel.

This is the first public appearance of Mr. de Haas in Boston in the last nine years under Zionist auspices. Others on the program will include Rabbi H. H. Rubenowitz, for 20 years spiritual leader of the Temple Mishkan Tefila, who is shortly to leave for Palestine; Hon. Elihu D. Stone, president of the New England Zionist Region, and Hon. Albert Hurwitz, former Assistant Attorney General.

Continuing, Dr. Shiels said, that the government, impressed by the feeling of Parliament regarding the correspondence, had reexamined it fully in the light of the history of the period and the interpretations put upon it and there were still valid reasons, entirely unconnected with the Palestine question, which render it in the highest degree undesirable in the public interest to publish the correspondence.

The matter of making public the MacMahon-Hussein correspondence had been repeatedly raised in Parliament during the last few months. Each time Dr. Shiels avoided any definite answer but always promised a statement in the future. It is presumed that today's explanation is the promised statement. It appears to put an end to the demand for the publication of the correspondence.

asked Professor Mitschesku, famous lawyer and dean of the All-Roumanian Lawyers' Association, to defend Codreanu. Professor Mitschesku flatly refused, saying he would never defend anti-Semitic leaders.

The police today finally discovered the secret publishing plant of the anti-Semitic organization, the Iron Guard, from which all the anti-Semitic posters and manifestos were being printed.

In the meantime a number of the Jewish members of Parliament, including Theodor Fisher and Senator Ebner, considering that the Jewish situation has now quieted down more or less, have left Bucharest for a vacation. Dr. William Filiderman is leaving next week.

419 Jews Came and 105 Left Palestine in June

Jerusalem, Aug. 1.—A total of 419 Jews entered and 105 left Palestine during June, according to figures made public today. In the same period 113 Christians, including 74 British constables, were admitted and 76 emigrated. Eight Moslems came and 27 left. Thirty immigrants, an unprecedented large number, were refused admission.

Crimea Agrees to Soviet Order for Land for Jewish Settlement

Moscow, August 1.—After strong objection had been voiced and lengthy negotiations conducted, the Crimean government today agreed to apportion 100,000 hectares of new land allotted for Jewish colonization in Crimea, according to the decision of the Soviet cabinet. The decision must be carried out within the next fortnight.
