Acquittal of Anti-Semitic Leader Codreanu Causes Astomishment in Bucharest

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Aug. 14—The entirely unexpected acquittal of Zelea Codreanu, anti-Semitic agitator who had been charged with inciting to riot and murder, has created general astomishment here. While the court acquitted him by a majority of eight, the public prosecutor has lodged an appeal against his release. Pending action on this appeal Codreanu will remain under arrest. The failure to release him after his acquittal brought no demonstrations from his student followers.

In the meantime Dr. Alexander Vayda Voevod, minister of the interior; Gregory Junian, minister of justice; Virgil Madgearu, minister of commerce and M. Manoilescu, minister of communications, are consulting regarding the anti-Semitic agitation and its effects abroad. M. Vayda Voevod outlined a plan for the establishment of order and the adoption of the necessary measures.

Says Zionists See No Chance of Continued Cooperation With the Non-Zionists

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Aug. 14—The Zionists are convinced that there are no prospects of continued cooperation with the non-Zionists and the latter are not unpleased to discontinue the agreement, alleges the Hebrew daily, "Doar Hayom," today, quoting an "authoritative source."

Opining that the recent statement of Louis Lipsky, former president of the Zionist Organization of America, characterizing the Jewish Agency as unrepresentative, and the supposed admission of the Jewish Agency's collapse by Kurt Blumenfeld, president of the German Zionist Federation, foreshadow a decisive retreat of the official Zionists from the Jewish Agency, the "Doar Hayom" says that Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the Jewish Agency and of the world Zionist Organization, has intimated through friends that he favors a firmer stand concerning Great Britain but that his colleagues are preventing it.

Gurevitz, Soviet Official, Killed Trying to Escape from Russia

Berlin, Aug. 14—M. Gurevitz, former director of the Soviet petroleum syndicate in Latvia, who was recalled to Russia some time ago, was shot and killed today when trying to leave Russia illegally, it is learned here.

National Socialists Seek to Ban Jews as German Citizens and to Oust Them from Country

Berlin, Aug. 14—If the National Socialists get control of the German government at the forthcoming Reichstag elections and carry out to the letter their campaign planks no Jew will be permitted to be a German citizen. The program of the National Socialists, led by Adolf Hitler, himself not a citizen of Germany, calls for a national program to deprive the Jews of citizenship or to rid the country of them entirely.

Hitler's plank contains 21 issues on which he is appealing to the German electorate and six of them are aimed at the Jews. In addition to the one banning Jews as citizens he would not permit anyone not of German blood to live in Germany except under special laws, he would bar those not of German blood and not German citizens from holding public office, he would oust all non-Germans and non-citizens so long as unemployment lasts, he would not permit immigration of non-Germans and would immediately expel all non-Germans who came to Germany after August 2, 1914.

Although the National Socialists demand the freedom of all religions, this liberty does not apply to those who "offend against the moral feelings of the German people." The National Socialists believe that Judaism is offensive to the moral feelings of the German people.

Arab Political Leader Charges Government Suppresses Those Who Seek Arab-Jewish Peace; Say Mufti's Policy Harmful to Fellaheen

Vienna, Aug. 14—Blaming the Grand Mufti for conducting political agitation among the Arab masses of Palestine that is in every way harmful to their interests, Mohammed Tawil, an Arab political leader from Tiberias who gave evidence friendly to the Jews at the Shaw Commission's hearings, declared today in an interview with the "Vienna Stimme" that the Palestine government instead of doing anything to abolish antagonism between the Jews and the Arabs is protecting the Grand Mufti, supporting his anti-Jewish policy and going so far as to suppress those who favor peace.

Saying that he stands for an Arab-Jewish understanding because he is an Arab patriot, Tawil stated that he is convinced that the Arabs will benefit from an understanding with the Jews because the Arabs can learn much from the Jews, particularly as regards systematic work and because the development of the country is impossible without the collaboration of the Arab fellaheen and the Jewish cultivators.

Tawil charged that he has twice been arrested because he "endeavored to

Revisionist Delegates Opposed to Creation of Independent Palestine Labor Unions

Prague, Aug. 14—The consequences which England will have to face regarding the Palestine Mandate if no improvement is shown toward Jewish interests and the consequence to the Zionist Organization if a special Zionist Congress is not called in December were discussed here at a closed session of the fourth annual conference of the Union of Zionist Revisionists.

While the session was closed to the public, it is understood that Vladimir Jabotinsky, Revisionist leader, and a number of other speakers, urged extreme measures. No resolutions were adopted, although general agreement was expressed with the extremist recommendations.

During the day a number of reports were rendered. M. Leiserovitch described the youth movement, Dr. Feldshuh spoke on the Tel Hai organization and S. Schechtman reported on organization problems. Following these reports the general debate was continued.

Most of the delegates here are opposed to the creation of Revisionist labor unions in Palestine to compete with the General Federation of Jewish Labor as was suggested yesterday by a delegate from Palestine, Mordecai Danzig, the only American delegate, emphasized

unmask the personal interest of the Arab leaders in the agitation. I came to Europe to tell the world how England treats Palestine because I am convinced that the Palestine government is largely responsible for the events of last August. If the government withdraws its support from the Grand Mufti and the Arab Executive perfect peace will be immediately established," he declared in replying to a question about hopes that the tension between the Jews and Arabs will decrease.

He said, "The key to the situation is in the hands of the Palestine government which can clear the atmosphere. I have thousands of supporters who are afraid, however, to disclose their opposition to the Mufti. The fellaah does not hate the Jews but is fanatical religious and of a primitive culture. Seventy-five percent of the Arab peasantry generally do not know the meaning of the Balfour Declaration while the educated town inhabitants, although opposed to the Mufti do not dare to take a stand against him be-

**20 Jews Arrested in Case
Against Moscow Cooperative**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Aug. 14—Twenty Jews are among the 32 persons who have been arrested in the case against the members of the cooperative industrial credit bank "Selbstatekte," whose trial is the sensation of the day. Among the arrested Jews is the 68-year old famous Jewish lawyer, Liev Bisk. For a number of years he was chairman of the cooperative which was created for Jewish artisans, but he resigned last year in view of his conflict with other members of the executive.

Bisk is now accused of negligence in his duties, bad management, and ignoring the policy of the Soviet cooperatives in supporting the wealthy artisans and not granting credits to the poor artisans. Six other members of the cooperative's executive are charged with accepting bribes from artisans who were shown special favors. Twenty-two artisans, including ten of the Jewish accused, are charged with giving bribes and other illegal transactions with members of the executive who now face serious punishment.

Eight of the best lawyers in Moscow are appearing for the accused. Their trial is expected to last a full week.

**Report Intensified Missionary
Activities Among Polish Jews**

Warsaw, Aug. 14—Intensified missionary activities among the Jewish population of Poland are revealed in a number of cases brought to the notice of the local Jewish community. After a short absence, Chaim Solnik, a resident of Lodz, returned today and declared that in a villa near Lodz, a missionary called Father Simon is preparing a number of Jewish youths for conversion. At Radosc missionaries are also said to be organizing a propaganda center.

**Waterbury School Board Says
Religious Training in Schools
Backed by U. S. Constitution**

Waterbury, Conn., Aug. 14—Far from being unconstitutional the religious plan for school children, approved by the Waterbury Board of Education on the petition of the Protestant and Catholic churches, is supported by the Constitution of the United States, according to a report made by the board committee.

The committee report is in answer to the protest by the Jews of that city through the Hebrew Institute against the plan which is to be inaugurated with the opening of the new school year in September and which will permit pupils to be excused from school one hour a week to be instructed in religious places outside of school property. The board accepted the report, the only dissenting vote being made by Nathan Freedman, a Jewish member. Injunction proceedings will be brought to block the plan with the inauguration of the new school term.

Jews Want Public Hearing

The Jews, with Attorney Herman Weisman and Rabbi Isadore Breslau as chief spokesmen, have insisted that the plan should not have been adopted without a public hearing. The Jews are claiming that the plan is unconstitutional. In answer to the latter charge, the board committee says:

"The one sentence in the Constitution of the United States touching on the matter not only does not prohibit the privilege; it actually ends by propherically presupposing that the privilege might some time be necessary. This sentence occurs in the first amendment to the Constitution which runs as follows:

"Congress shall make no law respecting the establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof."

"The spirit of the first amendment to the Constitution is that Congress—and the elected representatives of the people all the way down, including this honorable board—shall yield every possible point in order to favor the free exercise of religion. It is in this spirit that the Board of Education of Waterbury many years granted a like privilege. That grant of favor excused pupils from attendance at school on the holy days of certain churches. Orthodox Russian Catholics and Episcopalians are included in this. But it is the Jewish pupils of the schools whose privilege is most absolute. On all the holy days of their church they are not only excused all day, but by force of the effort made in their favor, they are not even marked absent from school."

Plan Operating in 600 Cities

The report recites that the plan is in operation in 600 cities and towns in this country, two of them being in this state, New Britain and Bridgeport.

"Does anyone in his senses believe that there is any danger of the actual establishment of a religion now?" the committee declares. "Isn't the danger entirely in the opposite direction now?"

**Roumanian Envoy Expresses
Hope Attacks Will Disappear
and Agitation Be Ended**

Hope that as a result of the strong measures taken by the Roumanian government to definitely put a stop to the anti-Semitic disturbances the outbreaks will gradually disappear, and confidence that the agitation will shortly cease was expressed late Wednesday afternoon by Carol Davila, Roumanian minister to the United States in a statement issued after a delegation from the American Jewish Congress had called upon him at the Ritz Carlton Hotel to urge immediate efforts on the part of the Roumanian government to suppress the anti-Semitic agitation and the attacks upon the Jews.

In a statement made on behalf of the delegation by Dr. Stephen S. Wise, honorary president of the American Jewish Congress, he recited a list of lamentable occurrences which have recently taken place in various parts of Roumania, causing much injury to Jews, bringing destruction to Jewish property and resulting in the state of uncertainty and mental anguish to the Jews of Roumania. Dr. Wise made reference to the pillaging which has been going on for many weeks, the burning of Borscha and the killing of the Jewish leader, Sholom Landau.

In a formal memorandum presented to M. Davila by Bernard Deutsch, president of the Congress, and signed by all members of the delegation, the Roumanian minister was requested to convey to his government the very imperative necessities of the situation which include the immediate liquidation of the various organizations which have been perpetrating and inciting the outrages, the suppression of all propaganda and the punishment of those guilty, prompt compensation to Jewish victims of the excesses, and an unequivocal declaration on the part of the government that will make absolutely clear its firm determination to assure the safety of Roumanian Jewry.

In addition to Dr. Wise and Mr. Deutsch, the delegation that waited on M. Davila was comprised of Judge Gustave Hartman, representing the Independent Order Brith Abraham, Leo Wolfson, president of the United Roumanian Jews of America, Herman Speier, executive secretary of that organization, Israel Thurman, Dr. Joseph Tenenbaum, Baruch Zuckerman and Bernard G. Richards, executive secretary of the Congress.

**Tammany Picks Kahn for
City Court Nomination**

The Tammany executive committee yesterday nominated Louis L. Kahn, prominent Jewish attorney, as the Democratic candidate for city court judge to fill the vacancy left by the appointment of Justice Bernard L. Shientag to the state supreme court. It is expected that Mr. Kahn will be named to fill out Justice Shientag's unexpired term so that he can campaign in the Fall elections as a sitting judge.

Reports Show Synagogue Fire in Maramoresh Sighet Incendiary

Bucharest, Aug. 14—Details now available of the fire that damaged the largest synagogue in Roumania at Maramoresh Sighet, Tuesday, definitely point to the fire being of incendiary origin. Rafael Kreidel, a Jewish merchant, saw clouds of smoke coming from the synagogue. Together with two other Jews, Ignaz Gross and Ferdinand Perl, he broke into the building.

They found all the furniture overturned and soaked with gasoline. The floors were on fire and the Torah scrolls had been profaned while scattered around the synagogue were a number of empty gasoline bottles. Raising the alarm the three Jews tried to fight the blaze until the fire brigade arrived. Thousands of Jews gathered outside of the synagogue making it necessary for the police to surround the building to facilitate fighting the fire. It was extinguished before much damage was done.

A preliminary investigation has established that the incendiaries entered the synagogue by the back door but their identity has not yet been learned.

Christian Sect of Australia Backs Jewish National Home

Jerusalem, Aug. 14—A unanimously adopted resolution conveying to the Jewish Agency and to the Jews of the world sympathy in their endeavors to build the Jewish National Home in Palestine and expressing a firm belief that "the Mighty One of Israel will demonstrate His power and perform all written in the Holy Prophets" was passed at the 1930 conference of the Christian sect of Christadelphians recently held in Brisbane. A copy of the resolution has been submitted to the Jewish National Fund here.

In submitting the resolution the secretary of the conference wrote, "It affords me much pleasure to convey this resolution to you, as coming from those who are lovers of Zion and who are watching events in the Holy Land with fervent zeal, at the same time praying for the peace of Jerusalem."

Roumania Unconcerned About Balaceana Jews, Charges Press

Vienna, Aug. 14—The Roumanian government shows no concern about re-establishing the 26 Jewish families who were the victims of the anti-Semitic disturbances at Balaceana, the Czernowitz press complains, pointing out that the victims remain homeless because their houses were destroyed, their property looted and they have no occupation because normal trade relations with their Christian neighbors do not exist. The papers charge that the government has not fulfilled its promise to grant compensation and has indefinitely postponed the investigation with numerous suspects not even examined nor the complaints of the Jews yet heard.

Sir Boyd Merriman, in Canada for Convention, Declines to Make Statement on Palestine

Montreal, Aug. 14—Sir Boyd Merriman, counsel for the Jewish Agency before the Palestine Inquiry Commission's hearings, arrived in Montreal with a party of English jurists and lawyers on their way to the convention of the Canadian Bar Association in Toronto. Sir Boyd absolutely refused to express any opinion on the report of the Inquiry Commission or to discuss the situation in Palestine.

He explained that professional ethics do not permit him to make any statement regarding the findings of the Commission, as he has an inviolable rule not to make any public statements regarding a case in which he appeared professionally. For the same reason, he declared, he will not voice any opinion if the question is raised in Parliament. He added that he was personally interested in the Palestine question and that Felix M. Warburg and Dr. Chaim Weizmann were fully acquainted with his attitude.

The party of over 200 English and French advocates includes seven Jews, one from France and six from England. Those from England are Lionel Leonard Cohen, W. Frampton, Simon Nissim, Miss Sara Moskowitz, A. S. Cohen and M. M. Block. M. Weill is from France.

Sir Boyd, who received the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws from McGill University yesterday, will come to the United States later in the month to attend the American Bar Association convention in Chicago. He will return to England from New York on August 27, sailing on the S. S. Berengaria.

6 Jews Named for State Office in Cleveland Republican Primaries

Cleveland, Aug. 14—For the first time in the political history of Cuyahoga county, which includes the city of Cleveland, six Jews were nominated on the Republican ticket in yesterday's primaries. Joseph N. Ackerman, twice elected state senator, was renominated and David Copland was also named for the senate. Joseph G. Ehrlich, Joseph H. Silbert, Martin Blum and Ben F. Sacharow were nominated for the assembly.

The result was a great surprise in view of the fact that the opponents of Maurice Maschke, leader of the Republican party here, and a Jew, staged an open fight against Jews and raised the Jewish question.

Rabbi Jacob Rubenstein Dead

New Orleans, Aug. 14—Rabbi Jacob Rubenstein former spiritual head of Congregation Anshe Sfard is dead here. He was 66 years old and a native of Russia. Two years ago he retired from the pulpit following years of service with the local synagogue and a congregation at Hattiesburg, Mississippi.

Government Probe Establishes Trotsky Not in Czechoslovakia

Prague, Aug. 14—An investigation by the Czechoslovakian government into the sensational rumor that Leon Trotsky, exiled Soviet leader, had come to Franzenbad to discuss with George Tchicherin and A. V. Lunacharsky plans for Trotsky's return to Russia, established that not only had Trotsky not entered Czechoslovakia but he could not be in the country even under an assumed name.

A high government official who inquired on behalf of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency from all government departments concerned with Trotsky's possible entry was informed by different authorities that there was not the slightest suspicion that Trotsky was in Franzenbad or in any other place in Czechoslovakia.

M. Papoušek, Czechoslovakian ministerial director for foreign affairs, informed the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that the government had never issued a visa to Trotsky and that Trotsky had never asked for one. He also said that no visa had recently been granted to M. Tchicherin.

When interviewed by the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, M. Lunacharsky, former Soviet commissar of education, smiled and appeared surprised at the report linking him to a rendezvous with Trotsky. He explained that he had arrived in Prague a few days ago but was not going to Franzenbad or anywhere else to meet Trotsky. The government confirmed the fact that he had arrived a few days ago. He registered as coming from Berlin and not from Moscow.

While the Czechoslovakian papers appear to be entirely uninformed on the entire matter, carrying not a single line about it, the Soviet legation explained that Lunacharsky is here on his way to London to attend an international literary and philosophical convention.

Worcester Drive for Home for Aged Off Till Fall

Worcester, Aug. 14—Postponement, until September 14th, of the drive for a \$125,000 Home to house the aged and orphaned in this city, which was launched Sunday, August 10th, was announced today by the general committee in charge of the campaign. The shift in dates came after a conference between George Greenspan of New York, who is directing activities and the committee. The canvass of the city by 500 volunteers for the benefit of the drive has been held up. Instead the entire efforts of the workers will be concentrated during the week between September 14th and 21st.

An announcement from the headquarters of the drive stated that the intervening month will be devoted to preliminary organization and planning for the drive. The present home has been condemned as a fire trap and is proving inadequate to care for the increasing number of men, women and children clamouring for admission.

surprising acquittal of the anti-Semitic agitator, Zelea Codreanu, is the sensation resulting from the publication in the Bucharest newspaper, "Vittorul," the Liberal party organ, of a document from the ministry of the interior addressed to Codreanu, informing him to appear before the court calmly as nothing will happen to him.

The "Pester Lloyd," in reporting the publication of this document, remarks that if the allegation of the "Vittorul" is correct it foreshadows a serious effect upon the entire Roumanian cabinet. In the meantime the Hungarian Telegraphic Agency reports that the renewal of the anti-Semitic agitation is again causing anxiety as the populace is being urged to commit excesses against the Jews. The authorities are reported to have suddenly dropped the investigation into the activities of Carol Danila, anti-Semitic agitator, and his associate, Nicolai Totu, who have not been found since they slipped through a police dragnet in Dorna some weeks ago after a bomb had been thrown into a Jewish house.

Kosher Butchers to Protest Plan to License Them

A meeting of kosher butchers of Greater New York to protest against the plan of Commissioner of Markets Dwyer whereby all kosher butchers would be required to have licenses will be held on Sunday afternoon in Clinton Hall, Manhattan. The butchers believe that instead of doing away with graft, this plan would make the situation even worse.

Commissioner of Accounts Higgins, who is conducting the investigation into the charges of graft in Markets Department, declared on Wednesday that he would endeavor to obtain immunity from prosecution for those kosher butchers who are now afraid to testify about graft which they gave to Markets Department supervisors, after the latter had accused them of selling non-kosher meat for kosher.

Shiels Going to League Parley Before Visit to Palestine

London, Aug. 14—Before Dr. Drummond Shiels, under-secretary for the colonies, proceeds to Palestine for a visit in September, he will accompany the British delegation to the meeting of the League of Nations, the Edinburgh "Scotsman" reports. At this meeting the report of the Mandates Commission on the Palestine disturbances will be taken up by the Council of the League of Nations. Dr. Shiels will probably be accompanied by Sir John Chancellor, High Commissioner of Palestine.

Waterbury School Board Says Religious Training in Schools Backed by U. S. Constitution

Isn't there fear among those who know the condition of the world now that we shall have too little religion, not too much? Isn't that the honest fear of church leaders who have asked for this privilege?"

The report goes on to point out that while the Jewish petitioners say they do not favor the use of school time for sectarian instruction, Jewish pupils are nevertheless out seven days a year for religious reasons. When this point was brought out in previous discussions, the Jewish leaders answered that the same privilege is granted the Christian pupils during Easter, which is not a Jewish holy period, and that the Jewish pupils obtain their religious instruction in Hebrew schools after school hours.

With regard to the use of school time for sectarian instruction, the point is also made by the committee that the state requires but 20 hours a week in school, whereas a schedule of 25 hours a week is maintained in Waterbury schools. The extra time, the board thinks may quite rightly be utilized for religious instruction.

"The Jews will not be required to leave; the others, by supposition, want to leave. There is no compulsion on the part of the school in either case. There is no possible union of church and state. It will be the parents in control and doing the compulsion in the overplus hours. There is abundance of proof in American history that such liberty rests upon sound American foundations."

that the establishment of such unions contains dynamite for the Revisionists because it would split the labor ranks and would result in bitter internal fights similar to the fights over the Communists in the ranks of American labor unions. A great impression was made on the conference by a promise to assist the Revisionist activities in the United States and to support the demand for a special Zionist Congress made by Jacob de Haas, chairman of the organization committee of the Zionist Organization of America, in a message delivered through Mr. Danzig.

cause he enjoys the support of the government.

"Nevertheless I believe that the Jews also made mistakes in not satisfactorily preparing the chalutzim by initiating them into the differences in Oriental life and customs and the habits of the Arab population. Consequently the chalutzim are immediately stamped as a foreign element. It is also necessary for the Palestine Jews to speak the language of their neighbors because this stimulates understanding. It is also important to establish more factories and to introduce private capital because Jews and Arabs working together in a factory are a most important factor for peace.

"Those who believe that the Palestine problem is chiefly political are mistaken because the center of gravity is in economic problems. Release the fellah from the grip of the effendis, to whom he is largely indebted due to the effendis' usury, and it will be of the utmost importance because the fellah does not forget his benefactor."

Tawil favors free Jewish immigration because with 700,000 Arabs and 180,000 Jews in Palestine "the problem of a Jewish majority is remote and at the moment the question is not urgent." He is going to Geneva to inform League of Nations circles concerning the actual situation in Palestine.

Brodetsky Denies He Will Resign from Z. O. Executive

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Aug. 14—Professor Selig Brodetsky, a member of the world Zionist Executive, today denied in an interview with the Jewish Telegraphic Agency the rumors spread at the conference of the Zionist Revisionists at Prague that he intends to resign from the Zionist Executive. He declared the rumors without the slightest foundation.

Professor Brodetsky, who outlined the attitude of the Zionist Executive on the current Zionist situation at the Revisionist conference, explained that he represented the Zionist Executive at the conference because the Executive was invited to send a representative and because he believes that the Zionist Executive should keep in touch with all groups and parties within the Zionist movement to learn their attitude and to represent the views of the Zionist Executive.

His impression of the conference was that it manifested a lack of positive plans and merely shifted criticism and responsibility from the British government to the Zionist Executive. He declared that the lack of a positive policy was even complained about by some Revisionist delegates.
