

Canadian Premier Praises Jewish Achievements; Says Canada Has No Time for Anti-Semitism

Banff, Canada, Aug. 30.—"When you stop to realize that out of a world population of nearly two billion, only 13,000,000 Jews have exercised so commanding an influence in world affairs, it is some indication that they are indeed the Chosen People." Thus spoke the Hon. R. B. Bennett, Canada's newly elected Conservative premier in an interview with Betty Ross, Jewish writer and novelist, as she interviewed him in his private train on the Canadian Pacific Imperial Limited en route to Banff.

Banff is the Premier's home. Returning after seven long weeks of campaigning, at each station he was enthusiastically welcomed by throngs of people with contingents of Jewish supporters everywhere in evidence. The tall, well-knit Canadian prime minister was so weary from his numerous political activities that he did not permit even one secretary to journey with him.

He was accompanied only by his sister, Miss Mildred Bennett. Reporters and photographers were denied admittance to the private train but when the Premier was informed that an American representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency was present, he paid tribute to Canada's Jewish citizens.

"When we hear how other countries are torn by anti-Semitic revolts and anti-Jewish strife, we in Canada cannot understand it. We do not know what anti-Jewish feeling means. This is a country where people of all races 'Jew or Gentile, Greek and barbarian, bound and free,' are working together to develop our common country. We have no time to waste our energy in internecine strife," Premier Bennett said.

The Canadian Premier pointed out that "we have only to turn to Leviticus to realize the wisdom of the old Jews. We are glad to have their spiritual heritage as one of the assets of our country. From time immemorial, the antiquity of this race has brought beauty and art to whatever land it graced."

Jobless Moslems Unite to Urge Government Jobs for Natives

Jersusalem, Aug. 30.—Jobless young Moslems, many of them graduates of various European universities, have organized an association to oppose the appointment of foreign government officials and to urge the Palestine government to fill positions with native Palestinians only as is being done in the neighboring countries of Iraq and Transjordan. The leaders of the association say that it is not directed against Jewish applicants.

Prohibition of Shechita in Norway May Be Lifted

Riga, Aug. 30.—There is a possibility of the prohibition of Shechita in Norway which went into effect in the New Year, being lifted, Aaron Grudz, a leading Jewish communal worker in Norway, President of the Norwegian Keren Hayesod and leader of the Jewish Youth Federation in Norway, who is now on a visit to Latvia, has told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency representative here.

The question has come up, he said, in connection with the export of pigs to England. The buyers insist that the pigs must be slaughtered by incision and not by stunning, and the leaders of the Jewish Community intend if this is agreed to, as they expect it will be, to demand that Shechita should again be permitted.

Shechita Exception Asked

When the prohibition of Shechita was decided on by the Norwegian Parliament, the Prime Minister, M. Moewinkel, speaking in the debate, said that he was of the opinion that the law should contain provisions for the exemption of Shechita. The arguments brought forward against Shechita had not convinced him that it was a cruel method of slaughtering. So

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German Election Characterized by Anti-Semitic Wave and Hence Jewish Interest Stronger Than Otherwise, Jewish Leader Says

Berlin, Aug. 30.—The general German election of 1930 is characterized by an exceptionally strong wave of anti-Semitism and Jewish interest in its outcome must, therefore, be more intense than otherwise, declared Dr. Bruno Weil, vice-president of the Central Association of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith, in an interview today with the Jewish Telegraphic Agency. Dr. Weil has just been nominated as the candidate in the Berlin area of the newly organized Constitutional Party.

The present wave of anti-Semitism, Dr. Weil pointed out, can be compared only with that of the 1880's, but now it seems to embrace a much wider section of the population. Explaining that the German defeat in the War and the present tense economic situation have created what is partly a sentimental and partly a deliberately exploited ground for modern anti-Semitism, Dr. Weil said that while the anti-Semitism of the 1880's sought to justify itself on ethical, moral and even religious grounds, today it is national and racial.

"There are, unfortunately, very strong romantic and mystical ideas existing in Germany on this subject now

Jewish Agency Makes Plans to Settle 1,000 Families on Palestine Coastal Plain

Berlin, Aug. 30.—A project to settle one thousand Jewish families on small holdings in the plantation belt along the coastal plain of Palestine, probably on the Wadi Hawareth lands of the Jewish National Fund, was advanced with the announcement at the meeting of the Administrative Committee of the Jewish Agency that the funds necessary are available.

Dr. Maurice Hexter, American member of the Palestine Executive of the Jewish Agency and one of the triumvirate in charge of the distribution of the Palestine Emergency Fund, outlined his plan for the settlement of the thousand Jewish families which it is estimated will cost \$2,175,000. This sum includes the \$250,000 set aside for this purpose by the Palestine Emergency Fund.

Describing Dr. Hexter's reference to the settlement project as "a lunch appetizer," Felix M. Warburg, chairman of the Administrative Committee, requested Bernard Flexner, chairman of the Palestine Economic Corporation, to report on the progress of negotiations with the Jewish labor groups concerning the settlement project. 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Zionist Actions Committee Sets Aside \$1,335,000 for Colonization

Berlin, Aug. 30.—The annual budget, as approved by the Zionist Actions Committee, appropriates \$1,335,000 for colonization and consolidation of existing settlements; \$235,000 for approved immigration; \$45,000 for labor activities; \$155,000 for health work, and \$360,000 for education. It also contains grants of \$1,080,000 for paying outstanding debts; \$105,000 for the expenses of the Palestine Executive and \$100,000 for the expenses of the London Zionist Executive.

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Zionists to Found Research Library Here

In order that there may be available an adequate source for all those who wish to do research work in current Palestine problems, the Zionist Organization of America has determined to establish a research library at its headquarters, according to an announcement issued by Emanuel Neumann, Chairman of the Committee on Public Information.

A preliminary sum has been set aside to secure the foundation for the library but it is proposed that the Jews throughout the United States, interested in making an important research instrument out of the library, should contribute pamphlets, manuscripts, books and other material that might find a place in such a library.

In announcing the library, Mr. Neumann has issued an appeal for contributions in the form of books, pointing out that a research library is a necessity in order to develop a more accurate and intimate knowledge of Zionist problems in America.

British Zionists to Arrange Palestine Exhibition in London

A Palestine Exhibition and Fair will be held in London, England, in February, 1931, it was officially announced by the Jewish National Fund Committee for Great Britain. The Exhibition, which will be the second of its kind to be held in the British Empire, will seek to acquaint the British public with the accomplishments of the Jewish pioneers in Palestine, the progress of the Jewish National Home, the produce of Jewish agriculture, and the products of Jewish industry. The proceeds of the Exhibition will go towards the Jewish National Fund.

The first Exhibition was held in London under the auspices of the Jewish National Fund in 1928 at Queen's Hall.

Rabbi Cohen Raps Rongy's Claim That Charge of Bias to Jewish Medical Students Unwarranted

Those who impose restrictions on Jewish candidates for admission to various medical schools in the country will "welcome with glee" the recent survey prepared by Dr. A. J. Rongy, prominent Jewish physician of New York, according to Rabbi J. X. Cohen, executive secretary of the Free Synagogue. Dr. Rongy, in his survey completed early last month, which drew wide comment, concluded that charges of unfairness against Jewish students in medical colleges were not warranted; that present restrictions safeguard the welfare of medicine, the public and Jewish doctors; and that Jews should themselves curtail the number of persons of their faith entering the medical field.

Rabbi Cohen, in a spirited reply to Dr. Rongy made public today, asserts that "psychological tests, territorial apportionments and other devious exclusionist devices will henceforth be abandoned by entrance examining boards. Jewish applicants will be handed a marked copy of the Rongy statement and sent home to doting parents, with the advice that social prestige for 'low-strata parents' can no longer be so easily acquired through the medical course at XYZ University." He adds that "to damn Jewish medical candidates as social climbers is unfair to (Continued on Page 4)

Despite Exodus, 75 Percent of East Side's Business is Jewish

In spite of the Jewish exodus from the East Side in the last few years, and in spite of the fact that there are 2,000 stores and many houses vacant in that section as a result of the exodus, the East Side is still a great centre of business and 75 per cent of that business is in Jewish hands, according to an investigation made by the East Side Chamber of Commerce.

The northern boundary of the territory covered by the survey is East 14th Street, New Chambers Street and the East River are the southern boundary, the Bowery and Third Avenue the western boundary and the East River the eastern boundary. The territory includes about 85 streets and avenues and about 500 blocks. There are over 12,000 stores in the section of which 2,000 are vacant. Considering the fact that a large number of stores were torn down on account of public improvements, one may well imagine how large the number of stores was before. It is pointed out however, that decrease in their number was not due to bad business, but to orders by the city.

Many of the stores are of a local character, catering to their immediate neighborhoods. Among them are 556 butcher shops, 444 restaurants and lunch rooms, 117 delicatessen stores, 516 candy and soda stores, 165 bakeries, 376 cafes, 150 drug stores, 253 laundries, 396 cleaning and dyeing stores, 329 shoemakers, 480 barber shops and numberless small business establishments.

American-Jewish Labor Group Welcomed at Two Meetings

Jerusalem, Aug. 30.—Expressing his interest in the Jewish National Home not as a private Jewish enterprise but because it is important for the whole world to believe that the bridge between the East and the West will be built by Jews, R. E. Denman, pro-Zionist Labor member of the British Parliament, speaking at a public meeting here in honor of the American Jewish labor delegation, pointed out that if that is the meaning of the Jewish National Home then "it is the most important work of our days."

In conveying the greetings of British labor, Mr. Denman admitted that he had heard criticism of the British government but was pleased with the work of Jewish upbuilding. He told the assemblage that the British government moves slowly but when it builds it builds permanently and well.

Morris Kentridge, Labor member of the South African Parliament, now touring Palestine, began his address in Hebrew, saying "these few words convey to you my feelings," and then continued in English. Saying that he had seen miracles in Palestine, particularly in the Emek, in Tel Aviv and at the Rutenberg works, Mr. Kentridge declared that, "Jewish achievement here is an advance in world civilization. Both workers and employers here do not care for getting more but for building the National Home. Jewish energy also betters the position of the Arabs. Despite the mistakes that have been committed the British government will carry out its pledges."

The members of the American delegation, Abraham Shiplacoff, Morris Finestone and Isaac Hamlin, in whose honor the meeting was held, gave their enthusiastic impressions of Palestine and declared that they would devote all their forces to Palestine upon their return to America. They also warned the Revisionists against the proposal to establish separate trade unions. Yesterday the American delegation was honored at a meeting of 4,000 people in Haifa. Among the speakers were Schmarya Levin, Zionist leader, and Philip Hassan of the Arab Workers' club.

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vide up the population of Germany, apart from the Jews, into at least five different blood groups, only a small section being treated as belonging to the Nordic, the superlative race. The idea of belonging to the supreme race of mankind naturally flatters the instinct of the masses, and it is this that the National Socialists have to thank for their undeniable successes, and not the imbecility of their race teachings."

Traces Make-Up

Tracing the make-up of the German political parties and their attitude towards the Jews, Dr. Weil said that hitherto the Liberal and Democratic elements of the German bourgeoisie, politically represented by the People's Party and the Democratic Party as well as the Centre Party and the Social Democrats and Communists, have held aloof from this idea. Of late, however, he explained, the People's Party has joined a National Socialist cabinet in Thuringia and the People's Party failed in a similar experiment in Saxony only because of the opposition of the Democrats and the People's National Federation.

Dr. Weil pointed out that because the two workers' parties, the Communist and the Social Democrats, are interested in the specific question of fighting anti-Semitism only in so far as it affects their general party principles, but not in the special needs of German Jewry, and because the Centre Party is a purely Catholic party, German Jewry in so far as it is not identified for class reasons with the workers' parties, has since the days of Jewish emancipation found its political representation within the bourgeois Liberal and Democratic Parties.

The Democratic Party

It is in the Democratic Party, Dr. Weil said, that the Jews have played their most important part in German political life. "It has had," he declared, "among its members, Hugo Preuss, Dr. Theodor Wolff, Georg Bernhard and the late Walter Rathenau and Ludwig Haas. Its danger of being crushed between the purely economic parties and the agrarian parties on the one hand and the religious parties on the other compelled its leaders to liquidate it and form the new Constitutional Party together with the People's National Federation, a number of young People's Party men and some Christian Trade Union members.

"This fact has caused some concern among the Jews of Germany since the most important element in the new party, after the Democrats, is the People's National Federation which is, to a large extent, in personal union with the Young German Order, whose constitution restricts its membership to people of German (Aryan) blood, and which sprung out of the soil of anti-Semitism, although it has developed along different lines from the National Socialists.

"While the latter are bitterly op-

posed to the Versailles Treaty, the Young German Order has come to accept the Republic and its leaders and has recognized that German foreign policy can succeed only by conciliation with France. Its leaders claim that it is now completely free from anti-Semitic prejudices. It must be remembered, however, that the Constitutional Party had been founded not together with the Young German Order but with its ally, the People's National Federation, which, from its inception, has guaranteed equal rights to all, and is also the only organization of its kind that has been vigorously fighting the National Socialists," Dr. Weil concluded.

Says England Will Issue New Policy on Palestine Soon

London, Aug. 30.—"We may expect from the British government the formulation of a new policy in Palestine based not merely on the forthcoming report of Sir John Simpson but on the study of the whole matter to be made by Dr. Drummond Shiels on his visit to Palestine," says the "New Statesman." The paper also points out that "what the Jews and Arabs mean to do next is also important, because on them more than on us, the hopes for making a Palestinian nation depend."

The Liberal weekly, "The Nation," commenting on the Mandates Commission's report declares, "It is highly salutary that our membership be impartially surveyed by men of Lord Lugard's calibre and experience, and we will make ourselves ridiculous if we are unable to bear their measured criticisms and suggestions without the official outburst of indignation echoed with megaphones in certain sections of the British press."

Six Jews Running for Office in Cincinnati

Cincinnati, Aug. 30.—Jews have a prominent place in the political arena in Ohio at the November election. Those nominated who will be voted on by the people of this city this Fall include: Gilbert Bettman, present Ohio attorney general, renominated by the Republican party; Willis D. Gradison, member of the New York Stock Exchange, who rose from board boy to millionaire in 15 brief years, Republican candidate for state representative; Samuel Ach, former county treasurer, who is running as a fusion candidate for county commissioner and Edgar Friedlander, incumbent, who is running for reelection as a fusion candidate.

On the Democratic ticket this Fall there will appear the name of Frederic W. Johnson, candidate for state representative and great grandson of the first Jew to be born in Cincinnati. He is the son of Simeon M. Johnson, former vice-mayor and nestor of the Democratic Party here.

Chicago Zionists Provoked at Tribune's Editorial Commenting On Mandates Body's Report

Chicago, Aug. 30.—Chicago Zionist leaders are considerably provoked at the editorial in the "Chicago Tribune," commenting on the report of the Mandates Commission. The "Tribune" had pointed out that the assertion that the Commission's decision was a neutral one or that it had been reached without the influence of outside interests was not warranted.

Max Shulman, president of the Chicago Zionist District, said that the "Tribune's" editorial shows that the paper is either unfamiliar with the work being done by the Zionists or it had "a malicious desire to create trouble." Chicago Zionists are planning to draw up a reply to the "Tribune's" editorial and to demand that the "Tribune" either retract or explain its original statement.

A committee consisting of Judge Harry A. Fisher, Rabbi Solomon Goldman and Max Shulman will call on Col. R. R. McCormick, editor of the "Tribune," after Labor Day to demand an explanation of the editorial.

Charges Jews Don't Receive Due in Federal Appointments

Yonkers, N. Y., Aug. 30.—Jews are not receiving their just due in the matter of Federal appointments, former Assistant Corporation Counsel Charles S. Witwer of this city charged today.

"At the present time the Jews do not have equal representation with Gentiles," he declared.

Mr. Witwer is a candidate for the Republican nomination to Congress from the 24th Congressional District. In a campaign statement, he declares he will "immediately proceed to bring to bear every possible influence to secure for the Jews federal appointments in Washington in proportion to the Jewish population." That is, of course, if he is nominated and elected.

Sole Jewish Colonist in Motza Feels Insecure

Jerusalem, Aug. 30.—Simon Broza, the first Jewish colonist to return to Motza since the riots of last year, is not entirely secure from attack by his Arab neighbors. This was learned by a detachment of police who went to investigate Broza's status. While the police went to visit Broza's vineyard, which is near the Arab village of Kolonia, the Arabs sought to prevent their visit. Later a mukhtar from Kolonia sent a letter to the policemen at Broza's house telling them that he would not be responsible if the Kolonia villagers attacked Broza.

When Broza first returned to Motza he reported that his Arab neighbors were still threatening vengeance because one Arab was killed during the riots, this despite the fact that seven Jews were murdered there.

Jewish National Fund Near \$500,000 Annual Quota

With \$158,000 still missing to complete its \$500,000 quota for the year 1930 to round out American Jewry's contribution towards carrying out the land purchase program for the current year, committees and workers of the Jewish National Fund of America, the agency of the Zionist movement for the acquisition of land in Palestine, have undertaken to make special efforts during the High Holiday season for "going over the top."

The decision to raise \$500,000 for the Jewish National Fund in the United States was reached unanimously at an enthusiastic Conference of American Zionists held in Philadelphia, Pa., on January 19, 1930. To date the Jewish National Fund income netted \$342,000, notwithstanding the fact that no special campaigns or "drives" were held in any of the 750 Jewish communities where Jewish National Fund committees are functioning. The special efforts will aim at enlisting the interest and contributions of worshippers whose attendance at synagogue during the High Holidays reaches nearly 100 per cent. Appeals in behalf of the Fund will be made in many synagogues throughout the country.

The Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns that a large part of the funds needed for financing this project will be subscribed by the Palestine Economic Corporation, Simon Marks of London, a German group including Oscar Wasserman, president of the Dentsche Bank and chairman of the board of directors of the Keren Hayesod, and Max Warburg, Hamburg banker and brother of Felix M. Warburg.

The settlers who will be placed on the land in connection with this project will contribute \$1,115,000 in labor over a long period of time and \$150,000 in cash. The entire investment will be based on long term credits.

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those students who work their way through what is admittedly the hardest professional course.

"Dr. Rongy says, 'Every Jewish student of proper competence and talent can eventually succeed in entering the doors of almost any medical school in this country.' Does Dr. Rongy mean by this that the many Jewish students who have been excluded from American medical schools are both incompetent and untalented? If he does, then he adds fresh insult to deeply wounded spirits."

Exclusion Policy Dangerous

Rabbi Cohen takes the view that "the exclusionist policy that has won the approbation of Dr. Rongy is dangerous to both public health and private welfare." He maintains that hundreds of young men, excluded from American colleges, go to foreign schools "some of which are admittedly sub-grade in laboratory equipment and teaching personnel. These men will later practice in America," says Rabbi Cohen, "with possible ill results to patients and mayhap serious harm to the general reputation of Jewish physicians." The spiritual leader declares further that "no friend of Jewish youth can accept Rongy's tacit position that, because discrimination exists in employment, therefore discrimination in medical education is justifiable. The second is as indefensible as the first."

Quoting Dr. Rongy's statement: "It is very, very rare that a Jewish doctor can gain a first-rate appointment to a medical faculty," Rabbi Cohen asks: "Is such a situation fair to Jewish candidates for medical education, and to the millions of Jewish citizens in America?"

The rabbi further takes the view that "this exclusionist virus from medical departments" is linked considerably with increasing discrimination against students in schools devoted to other professions.

Furthermore, the rabbi decries the Rongy attitude that "we have too many Jewish doctors." "Preventive medicine," says Rabbi Cohen, "is rapidly coming forward. So likewise is the socialization of medical practice, in the opinion of former City Health Commissioner Harris and other authorities as well. . . . This will call for more physicians." Besides, he believes there is an increasing tendency of young Jewish physicians to practice in suburban and rural areas.

"The existence of discrimination against Jewish medical candidates," Rabbi Cohen says in summarizing, "constitutes a focus of infection that must be studied and adequately treated by wise Jewish leadership. It must neither be condoned nor approved by specious reasoning or by jugglery of questionnaires."

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far as he was concerned, the decisive argument was that they must have consideration for the religious feeling of the Jews, and not prevent them because of their faith from being able to eat meat. He urged Parliament, therefore, not to prohibit Shechita, particularly since all over the country methods of slaughtering were being employed which could not be described as commendable.

The leader of the Conservative Party, Deputy Lykke, a former Prime Minister, also spoke in the debate in favor of the exemption of Shechita.

It is certain, therefore, that there is a strong body of important opinion in the country which would support any effort to lift the present ban on Shechita.

Small Jewish Community

The Jewish community in Norway, according to the late Lucien Wolf's memorandum, is one of the smallest in Europe. The last religious census, in 1920, showed that it numbered only 1,457. Since then it has not very appreciably increased. Previous to 1851 there were no Jews in the country, owing to an old law forbidding their entry, which was reaffirmed in 1814 when Norway was united to Sweden.

The repeal of this law was not due to any overtures made by the would-be Jewish immigrants, but by a manifestation of public indignation against it, set in motion by the poet, Henrik Wergeland. Until four years ago this small community had no history. When the doors were opened to them in 1851 no conditions were imposed, and they found themselves in the enjoyment of all the civil and political rights extended by the Constitution to friendly foreigners, and eventually to native-born Norwegians. They proved a modest, industrious and inoffensive element in the population, and at no time came in conflict with national sentiment.

\$7,500 Gift for Worcester Home for Jewish Aged

Worcester, Aug. 30—A gift of \$7,500 in the campaign to raise \$125,000 for a new home for aged and orphaned Jews in Worcester was announced by drive officials today. The donation is claimed to be the largest single contribution ever made to a Jewish cause in this city. Except to say that he was a prominent local merchant, directors of the campaign would not divulge the name of the donor.

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
