## Emigdirect Head Appeals to World Jewry to Aid Work of Jewish Immigration Groups

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Paris, Sept. 13.—An appeal to world Jewry to make a special effort to aid the emigration work of the international Jewish organizations responsible for the welfare of Jewish immigrants was made by Dr. Myron Kreinin, president of the Emigdirect, United Jewish Immigrant Aid Society of Europe, at a conference of Jewish press representatives from Europe and America.

After outlining the actual state of Jewish emigration and pointing out that during the last few years countries of Jewish immigration had one after another barred their doors to immigrants, Dr. Kreinin said that American Jewry in particular should do all in its power to assist the HIAS not only in continuing its activities but in extending its activities with a view to helping the unfortunate Jews whom it is still possible to snatch from the torment of Eastern Europe by emigration.

Dr. Kreinin told the Jewish newspapermen that Australia, South Africa and Canada had introduced severe immigration restrictions which, although not particularly directed against the Jews, had hit them first and most seriously. Actually the United States and the republics of South America and to some extent France, still offer openings to the Jewish population of Eastern Europe who apart from economic miseries still suffer from various persecutions, he said.

The head of the Emigdirect called to the attention of the Jewish journalists the fact that the Jewish public was well aware of the work done by the Hicem since its inception, but that assistance and protection for emigrants is more than ever needed now in order to increase the Hicem's activity so as to widen the possibilities of immigration into those countries that are still

## Yiddish State Theatre of White Russia to Tour U. S.

Riga, Sept. 13.—The troupe of the Yiddish State Theatre of White Russia, which has just arrived here and which expects to tour various European countries, will also visit the United States this winter, according to an announcement by its manager, Isaye Fail. The troupe consists of fifty people. Its art director is M. Rafalsky.

The White Russian Yiddish theatrical troupe expects to appear in performances in Latvia, Lithuania, Germany, France, Austria, Holland and America. Plays by Lope de Vega, Peretz, Sholom Aleichem, Bergelson and Kushniroff are included in its repertoire.

## 433 Jewish Immigrants Came to Canada During August

Montreal, Sept. 13.—Of the 15,215 immigrants who entered Canada during the month of August, 433 were Jews, according to figures made public today by the Jewish Immigrant Aid Society of Canada. Of this number 16 were detained but 10 were later admitted. One was deported and the cases of five are still pending. The 433 Jews were destined by provinces as follows: 166 to Quebec, 165 to Ontario, 4 to Nova Scotia, 160 to Manitoba, 28 to Saskatchewan, 4 to Alberta, 2 to British Columbia and 4 to New Brunswick.

## Jewish Deputy Offers Evidence Showing Roumanian Officials Back Anti-Semitic Movement

Bucharest, Sept. 13.—Documents purporting to show that officials of the Roumanian government are openly supporting the anti-Semitic movement were submitted by Michael Landau, a Jewish member of the Roumanian parliament, to the congress of Bessarabian Jews called at Kishinev to take steps to organize for the self-defense of Roumanian Jews. Deputy Landau charged that while the former Liberal government was the first to encourage anti-Semitism in Roumania, the present Maniu government had bitterly disappointed the hopes the Jews had in it, since it, and particularly the minister of the interior, Dr. Vayda Voevod, have supported and helped the growth of the anti-Semitic movement.

Among the confidential government documents offered as evidence by Deputy Landau was the report of the police inspector to the government after the incidents at Targu-Fromus. The inspector had reported that it was necessary to disband forcibly all of the Jewish organizations as a means of quieting the country, since the Jews have created "economic, political and cultural organizations for the purpose of oppressing Roumanians and destroying the Christian elements of the country."

A second document, the minutes of a meeting of peasants held in the village of Cinculeni, near Kishinev, just before the congress of anti-Semitic students was forbidden, indicates that the chief of the gendarmerie in this village declared himself ready to co-operate in a raid of the peasants upon the Jewish population in order to rob the Jews of their property. Another piece of evidence to bear out his charge reported the suspension of two policemen because they had pointed out the ringleaders of the anti-Semitic disturbances in Balaceana, and the promise of anti-Semitic students to have the policemen reinstated if they would withdraw their testimony.

## Jews Here Submit Memorandum to Poland on Abolition of Czaristic Restrictions on Jews

Washington, Sept. 13.—The Polish Embassy here today announced that it has forwarded to its home government a memorandum which it received last week from the Federation of Polish Jews in America urging Ignacy Moscicki, president of Poland, to exercise the power he now has since the dissolution of parliament to promulgate a law abolishing the Czaristic restrictions against the Jews of Poland that are still in force.

The memorandum was based on information contained in a recent dispatch from Warsaw reporting that M. A. Hartglass, on behalf of the Jewish Deputies Club and the Jewish National Council, had informed President Moscicki, the Polish minister of Justice, M. Car, and Premier Pilsudski, that since the dissolution of parliament the president is empowered to publish a law that would do away with the anachronistic Czaristic legislation.

The campaign to wipe this discriminatory legislation from the Polish statute books has been a paramount point in the demands made by Polish Jewish leaders on all Polish governments since the Republic was established. The negotiations for the removal of these restrictions, some of which date back to 1843, appeared to have been successful during the last session of parliament when the bill to void them passed a second reading. When parliament was dissolved this bill came to naught.

## Offers Cornell \$15,000,000

### Dormitory for the Use of White Protestant Students

Yonkers, N. Y., Sept. 13.—Considerable interest was being manifest here today as to whether Cornell University at Ithaca, N. Y., will accept a large fund set aside in the will of Leslie R. Palmer, leading Westchester County banker, who died here August 31.

The "balance of the estate," according to the will filed in the Surrogate's Court at White Plains, after payment of specified legacies and establishment of trust funds, is bequeathed to the trustees of Cornell University to be used for the erection of a dormitory for white Protestant students.

The fund is estimated to be between ten and fifteen million dollars in value.

Some doubt is expressed here whether Cornell will be willing to accept such a bequest from Mr. Palmer, who was graduated from the university in 1897 as a lawyer, practiced at the bar, entered real estate, and then banking, recently engineering a merger of several of the largest banks in this section.

## Figures of Ten Jewish Religious Leaders, Philosophers and Scientists in Baptist Church

The new Riverside Church on upper Riverside Drive is a Baptist congregation but of the 42 world's greatest religious leaders, philosophers and scientists whose figures are represented in stone on the door panel of the entrance to the Church ten are Jews. Prof. Albert Einstein, the only living man included among the figures, is the Jew among the world's greatest scientists.

In planning the Church men and women now living were not considered as possible subjects for the stone figures, but the inclusion of Professor Einstein was made an exception because in the opinion of consulting scientists Dr. Einstein "could not possibly be omitted from any list of fourteen of the leading scientists of all time."

Among the figures of great religious leaders represented in stone is Moses. In the gallery of saints and prophets are the great Hebrew prophets Isaiah, Jeremiah, Hosea, Amos and Micah, and in the niches which are above the west portal are David and Solomon. In the gallery of the philosophers Benedict Spinoza stands between Immanuel Kant and Descartes.

## Two Jewish Painters Will Be Represented at Carnegie Exhibit

Pittsburgh, Sept. 13.—Two famous Jewish painters, Max Lieberman and Maurice Sterne, will be represented in the annual international exhibition of modern paintings which will open October 16th at the Carnegie Institute in this city. Among the members of the American Committee of Selection is Bernard Karfol.

The Albert C. Lehman Prize and Purchase Fund will be offered again this year for the second time. This is a cash award of \$2,000 to the artist whose painting is considered the best one available for purchase. The prize also carries with it a guarantee to purchase for Albert C. Lehman, a Pittsburgh Jewish industrialist, the painting at its list price up to \$10,000.

## Feuchtwanger Sees Jews in Future Playing Leading Role in World's Technical Progress

The Jews, because they have for centuries been more mobile than other peoples, not being bound to any particular soil, will in the future "take front rank in helping to do the work of construction in a world which has changed from a world of farmers to a world of machines." On the other hand, the Jews, being next to the Chinese the most literary people in the world, and having conserved in their books the useful experiences of the white races for thousands of years back, will also in the future "make, through the practice of literature, a heavy contribution to the memory of mankind" in an epoch which has less feeling for such matters than formerly.

This is the opinion expressed by Lion Feuchtwanger, famous German-Jewish novelist and playwright, in an article entitled, "The Trend of the Jews," which appeared in the magazine section of yesterday's New York Herald-Tribune. Speaking of the historical development of the Jews, Mr. Feuchtwanger says:

"The historic development of the Jewish group deviates from the development of the other white-skinned groups. The Jewish group, for a long thousand years at least, had a part in the religious and social achievements of the colored cultural races, and for a short thousand years it shared in the first technical achievements of the white races. Then, through isolation in the ghetto, the Jewish group was excluded from the further technical progress of the white peoples. Only in the last two hundred years has it again been able to participate in this development. It has probably not yet overtaken the leading white groups in this technical field; but it is in advance of them in what it very early appropriated in the way of social instinct from the religious heritage of the colored cultural peoples."

During their early history, according to Mr. Feuchtwanger, the Jews had the

## J. N. F. to Seek Fund of \$1,000,000 in United States

That American Zionists will be asked to raise at least \$1,000,000 as America's contribution towards the Jewish National Fund was disclosed in a circular letter addressed by the American branch of the Fund to its committees and groups of workers in 750 communities throughout the country. The Palestine Land Fund will require for new land purchases with in the next year \$3,000,000, and the America quota of this sum was set at \$1,000,000, the circular indicated.

This statement of the Jewish National Fund of America, came close upon the heels of the announcement of last week concerning the contemplated visit to this country of M. M. Ussishkin, president of the board of directors of the Jewish National Fund in Jerusalem, and internationally known Zionist leader.

## Mrs. Amelia Freud, Mother of Sigmund Freud, Dead at 95

Vienna, Sept. 13.—Mrs. Amelia Freud, mother of Professor Sigmund Freud, world-famous psychoanalyst, is dead here at the age of 95. Her death is attributed to hardening of the arteries and other infirmities of old age.

Until a month ago she was in good health and fine spirits, according to her grandson, Edward L. Bernays, well-known publicity man in New York. She had gone to Bad Ischl with her famous son, Dr. Sigmund Freud, to celebrate her ninety-fifth birthday, a custom which she has followed for more than thirty years.

Frau Freud was born in Vienna, August 25, 1835. At the age of twenty she was married to Jacob Freud, a wool merchant, who died some time ago. Dr. Sigmund Freud was her first-born and according to Mr. Bernays she always referred to him as her "golden-son."

In 1848 Frau Freud was instrumental in aiding two of her three brothers in escaping from Vienna during the revolution. She always took a very active interest in current affairs, and during the course of her life had come in contact with various and prominent personalities.

Frau Freud lived with her daughter, Miss Dolfie Freud, and in addition to Dr. Sigmund Freud, is survived by Dr. Alexander Freud, a Viennese editor and publisher; Rosa Graf, Paula Winternitz and Mitzi Freud, all of Vienna, and Mrs. Anna Freud Bernays of New York. Ten grandchildren and eighteen great-grandchildren also survive her.

Frau Freud was always very proud of her children, and was actively interested in Dr. Freud's theories of psychoanalysis. She was considered a model mother and gave her famous son as well as the rest of her children a good Jewish education.

Reports current in the foreign press that Dr. Freud himself is seriously ill are not true. He is now seventy-four years of age and until his mother's death, visited her regularly every Sunday morning.

## Rabbi Tintner Named Chaplain of New York State Legion

Saratoga Springs, N. Y., Sept. 13.—Rabbi Benjamin Tintner of New York City has just been elected state chaplain of the American Legion, Department of New York, at the closing session of its annual convention here.

This gives the two largest New York State veterans' associations Jewish chaplains, as the Veterans of Foreign Wars of New York State have for some time had Rabbi Emanuel J. Jack of Yonkers in that office, cooperating in his selection as national chaplain at the national convention in Baltimore, Md.

## Jewish Center Executives Adopt Emergency Financial Program

The definite standards that should be observed and the economies that are possible in the general administration and maintenance of Jewish Centers were outlined and a program for the stimulation of essential activities involving a minimum of cost was adopted at a special conference of executives of Y.M.H.A.'s and Jewish Centers called by the Jewish Welfare Board last week to take measures to meet the present financial situation as it affects Jewish Centers. The meeting was held in the new 92nd Street Y.M.H.A.

Pointing out that publicly supported institutions had already begun to feel the effects of reduced giving, the chairman of the conference, Harry L. Glucksmann, executive director of the Jewish Welfare Board, declared that "the present financial situation demands that the executives of Jewish Centers take the initiative in instituting such emergency economies as are compatible with the maintenance of recognized standards of service, but in effecting necessary savings there should be no essential diminution of the benefits of the Jewish Center program."

After Louis Kraft of the Jewish Welfare Board had outlined the various elements that could be considered with a view to affecting savings, the conference gave itself over to a detailed consideration of the data gathered by the Jewish Welfare Board relative to financial operations of Jewish Centers. It was decided to consolidate the detailed recommendations of six committees of executives, who were appointed to prepare detailed recommendations as a guide to Jewish Centers in dealing with the present emergency, in a report that will be made immediately available to all Jewish Center organizations.

## Ort Leader Sees Russian Jewry as Worst Off in East Europe

Russian Jewry still remains the most helpless and the worst off economically among the Jewries of all East-European countries and there are still a million Jews there who are declassed, according to Dr. S. Ellsberg, one of the leaders of the American Ort, who has just returned from a three-months study of the Jewish situation in Eastern Europe.

In a report to the American Ort, Dr. Ellsberg states that even in such countries as Roumania and Poland the Jew has at least the opportunity to show a certain initiative and that therefore, no matter how bad the situation of the Jew may be there, there is still some hope for him in those countries. On the other hand in Russia, where Dr. Ellsberg spent six weeks, the Jewish situation, according to him, is so terrible that it can hardly be described. The Ort, said Dr. Ellsberg, is one of the most important organizations that is trying to save Russian Jewry from annihilation. He appealed therefore for a more intensive campaign in this country for the purpose of raising more funds for the Ort activities in Russia.

## Reports 1,450 Anti-Semitic Incidents in Galatz in Five Months; Only 30 Investigated

Bucharest, Sept. 13—There have been 1,450 anti-Semitic incidents in Galatz reported to the local police since the anti-Semitic disturbances began five months ago and only 30 cases have received police attention, the Bucharest daily, *Dimineata*, says, in reporting that the agitation shows no let-up while the police take an extremely lukewarm attitude toward it. The *Dimineata* charges that M. Amarescu, the chief of police in Galatz, blames the Jews for the disorders and has given instructions to his subordinates to arrest Jews as soon as evidence of disorders are presented.

The guilt of M. Amarescu was revealed after an investigation in Galatz by the general inspector of the ministry of the interior. According to the *Dimineata*, the general inspector as well as the leading Galatz members of the government party demanded the dismissal of the police chief but nothing came of this demand because the minister of the interior, Dr. Vayda Voevod, considered this police official useful for converting the activities of the anti-Semites into safe channels.

Commenting on its own report, the *Dimineata* points out that since the anti-Semitic police chief of Galatz still remains in his post "just as the anti-Semitic cabinet official Tazladanu has retained his job, why then all these investigations if it is known beforehand that they will yield no results?"

## Educators Help Jews to Lessen Prejudice

The handicap of the Jew who wants to get a job, go to college, or enjoy a full social life has been studied afresh by modern educators. The demand for a totally new approach to problems of prejudice has come from prominent Jews who were dissatisfied with over-sentimental methods for increasing understanding between Jews and non-Jews.

At their request, The Inquiry, an un-denominational organization studying racial and religious conflicts, undertook to work with Jewish educators and rabbis in making educational experiments. In this work, methods for group study were evolved which can be adapted to the needs of Jewish clubs, fraternities, and classes. The methods enable a group to start with personal experiences and perplexities and, through discussion of these, to achieve clear thinking and practical solution of difficulties.

These educational procedures are now presented for the use of other Jewish groups in a book, *Jewish Experiences in America*, edited by Bruno Lasker. To help groups and individuals who want the most up-to-date information on Jewish problems, Mr. Lasker has included twenty-four articles by Jewish authorities covering almost every important aspect of the present situation.

## Gutstadt Named Director of B'nai B'rith Membership Bureau

Cincinnati, Sept. 13—Richard E. Gutstadt, San Francisco, has been named the director of the B'nai B'rith National Bureau of Membership with headquarters in Cincinnati, according to an announcement by Alfred M. Cohen, international president of B'nai B'rith. The Bureau of Membership is newly created to make a scientific study of the 60,000 members of B'nai B'rith in America with a view to developing a method for enhancing their usefulness in Jewish and civic activities and to increasing the membership.

Mr. Gutstadt has been executive director of B'nai B'rith District No. 4 since 1924 and his activities there have helped make that district outstanding in the matter of membership. He is a member of the B'nai B'rith Wider Scope Committee and a member of the National Finance Committee of B'nai B'rith.

In addition to his B'nai B'rith activities, Mr. Gutstadt is now serving his second year as campaign director of the National Jewish Welfare Fund in San Francisco and is a trustee of Temple Sherith Israel there. He has been an active worker in his city's community chest campaigns and served on the directorate of the Jewish Committee on Personal Service in State Institutions. He has also been secretary of the Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society there.

Mr. Gutstadt will assume his new duties about Nov. 1st when he will make Cincinnati his home.

## Yonkers Court to Hear Charges of Anti-Semitism by Police

Yonkers, N. Y., Sept. 13—Two New York Jews, who claimed their arrest and subsequent assault by parkway patrolmen in Tibbetts Brook Park swimming pool here July 13 was inspired by anti-Semitism, were freed of disorderly conduct charges by a jury in Special Sessions Court here, before City Judge Charles W. Boote.

Late this week Judge Boote and another jury will hear charges brought by the two New Yorkers against three park policemen. One officer is defendant in an assault case, while the other two are being prosecuted for "omission of duty," in having been present at an assault and not interfering.

Dr. William Cunningham and his brother, Dr. Philip Cohen, both of New York City, had been arrested by Parkway Patrolman Emmett Howell for smoking near the pool, contrary to regulations. The jury disposed of the disorderly charges within 15 minutes, leaving the field clear for the trial of the counter-charges. Howell is charged with assault. Dr. Cunningham explained to the court he changed his name legally before attending the University of Toronto, from which he was graduated as a licensed physician in 1923.

accessible. In this connection Dr. Kreinin said it was unfortunate that simultaneously with the difficulties of the Jewish immigrants an economic crisis had hit the United States which had greatly affected the work of the HIAS and was threatening all Jewish immigration work. The activity of the Hicem was maintained only through the generous support of the Jewish Colonization Association, Dr. Kreinin stated.

## Summer Training School for Jewish Teachers Successful

Hendersonville, N. C., Sept. 13.—The training school for Jewish religious teachers which was held at Camp Osceola near here during the closing days of the summer under the auspices of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations has been pronounced an outstanding success by all who attended it. The school attracted religious school teachers sent by Sisterhoods in every state of the Southeastern District of the Union.

Classes were held in the open for three hours in the morning and a round table on practical problems was held in the evening. The remainder of the day was devoted to an athletic and entertainment program. Dr. Henry Englander and Dr. Emanuel Gamoran of Cincinnati comprised the teaching staff. Rabbi George Solomon served as business executive and Rabbi Milton Ellis as general director.

advantage of living on the edge of three continents and of appropriating three different cultures. "From the East," he says, "the teaching was constantly pressed upon them of the necessity of not willing, of not acting, but of ascending into the Great Nothingness. From the West, the teaching was incessantly hammered in on them that man was born for action and for conflict. To the South of them loomed large and shadowy the Egyptian teaching of the conquest of death through persistence and wariness of the eternal conservation of being. The East taught them to pass away; the West taught them to become; the South taught them to be. They took these three lessons to themselves, fused them one with another, adapted them to one another, until a new, great whole appeared, a law they shaped through two thousand years—the Bible."

Its early history, continues Mr. Feuchtwanger, "modeled the Jewish group into representatives of a strange organic blending of Asiatic renunciation and of European thirst for action. It is no accident that the white race's two fundamental books of doing and non-doing—the Old Testament and the New Testament—sprang from the Jewish intellectual spirit."

Of the Jewish role in the world today, Mr. Feuchtwanger says:

"What their enemies formerly reproached them with and condemned as their most contemptible characteristic—their cosmopolitanism—their lack of roots in the soil, suddenly discloses itself as an immense superiority. That they were intrigued against for centuries, that they were obliged to adapt themselves always to new men and new conditions, makes them, in a quickly altered time of rapid communications, superior to those who can move only on their own soil. It is consequently their historic mission to take front rank in helping to do the work of construction in a world which has changed from a world of farmers to a world of machines."
