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## German-Jewish Leaders, Headed by Einstein, Urge Jews Not to Despair Over Hitler Victory

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Sept. 18.—Not to despair but to close ranks and establish a united Jewish front against the growing anti-Semitic danger is the keynote of statements made by Professor Albert Einstein and other prominent Jewish leaders of Germany who were queried today by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency regarding the tremendous victory of the Hitlerites in Sunday's Reichstag elections.

"There is no reason for despair," declared Professor Einstein, "for the Hitler vote is only a symptom, not necessarily of anti-Jewish hatred but of momentary resentment caused by economic misery and unemployment within the ranks of misguided German youth. I hope that the momentary fever and wave will rapidly fall. During the more dangerous Dreyfus period, the entire French nation also was to be found in the anti-Semitic camp. I hope that as soon as the situation improves the German people will also find their road to clarity."

Dr. George Kareski, president of the Berlin Jewish community, said, "Nothing will deter us from positive Jewish work. We are not terrified by Hitler's obtaining eight times as many votes as he received in 1928. Now, more than ever, we must proudly and publicly confess our adherence to the Jewish people." The president of the Association of Prussian Jewish Communities, M. Wolff, declared, "We must now put an end to all of our internal disputes."

Dr. Alfred Klee, vice-president of the Association, stated that Cuzist methods are impossible in Germany, "nevertheless the Jews must organize anew for their defence. Let us work and not despair." The president of the Association of Liberal Jews, M. Stern, declared that the Jewish problem is a side issue among Hitler's voters, "nevertheless Hitler will attempt to injure the legal

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## Hans Herzl to Be Buried in Bordeaux Jewish Cemetery

Bordeaux, Sept. 18.—Hans Herzl, only son of Theodor Herzl, who shot himself in a hotel here after the funeral of his sister Paulina, will be buried tomorrow or the next day in the local Jewish cemetery together with his sister, in accordance with his last wish. The police hesitated to permit his burial in the Jewish cemetery since it had not been definitely established whether he had died a Jew.

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## Report of Halsmann's Pardon Is Semi-Officially Denied

Vienna, Sept. 18.—A semi-official denial was issued today of the report published last night by the Austrian Press Bureau that Philip Halsmann, a young Jew serving a prison sentence at Innsbruck for patricide, had been pardoned by Dr. Wilhelm Miklas, president of Austria. While official government quarters have refused any information, the Austrian Press Bureau insists that its story was partly correct, intimating that the pardon, in principle, has been decided upon, and the official publication of the pardon act would take place next week.

The reports in the Austrian papers had said that not only had young Halsmann been pardoned but that Chancellor Johan Schober had signed the pardon act and Halsmann had been immediately released. It was also reported that Halsmann would now be given an opportunity to vindicate his name, it having been widely believed

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## Roumania Takes First Step Towards Rebuilding Borscha

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Sept. 18.—The first practical step towards rebuilding Borscha, which was almost entirely destroyed in July as the result of a fire of anti-Semitic origin, was taken by the Roumanian government today when it ordered that all those who suffered as a result of the incendiary blaze should receive free supplies of timber from the government forests. The order becomes effective immediately and enables an immediate start on the rebuilding of the hundreds of destroyed houses.

Deputy Fischer, a Jewish member of parliament, today conferred with Premier Maniu, minister of the interior. Vayda Voeyod and under-secretary of state Andrei concerning the possibility of getting a greater share for Borscha of the 12,000,000 lei assigned by the government for the relief of all the towns that suffered from the anti-Semitic disturbances. He was assured that the proportion for Borscha would be increased.

Deputy Fischer also suggested that Borscha be rebuilt on a cooperative basis as was done with the war-torn cities of Belgium. The government agreed to assist in such a project. At the same time the minister of the interior ordered the provincial government of Bukowina to make an estimate of the damages suffered by the Jews of Suceava, Balaceana and other places where the anti-Semitic agitators had been active, saying that these damages would be covered by a special fund entirely apart from the relief fund.

## No Water Sales to Christians, Moslems Announce, as Arab Moslem-Christian Split Widens

Jerusalem, Sept. 18.—Moslem well-owners today announced that in mixed Moslem-Christian quarters they would refuse to sell water to Christians. This is the latest development in the breach between the Moslem and Christian Arabs growing out of a dispute over the ownership to a cemetery in Haifa, a dispute that led to a fatal street affray.

The Moslem paper El Yarmouk, accuses the Christian Arabs, who are Catholics, of conducting propaganda favoring the transference of the Palestine Mandate to Italy. The paper asks, "Are Arabs chattel, transferable from one power to another? The Christians are not entitled to speak for the Arab nation."

The trouble between the Christian and Moslem Arabs reached an acute stage when Jamal Bakhrri, editor of a Christian-Arab paper, was killed in the street affray. The Haifa Y. M. C. A. has decided to form a separate All-Christian Union, refusing all contact with the Moslems, while the Christian Arab women have seceded from the Haifa Arab Women's Association and formed their own group.

## Jewish Physician Is Elected Head of Sex Reform Congress

Vienna, Sept. 18.—Dr. Magnus Hirschfeld, eminent German authority on sexual problems and professor of sexual knowledge in the Hombold Hochschule, was today elected president of the International Sexual Reform Association at its fourth congress now in session here. Dr. Hirschfeld was instrumental in the calling of the first congress in 1921.

Known for his wide knowledge of sexual problems and a pioneer advocate of sexual reform, Dr. Hirschfeld organized the Institute of Sexual Reform in Berlin in 1918 which was later taken over by the Prussian government and renamed the Magnus Hirschfeld Institute. His services have frequently been utilized in sexual-analysis of criminals.

## Polish Officials Confer on Palestine-Poland Commerce

Warsaw, Sept. 18.—Titus Zhyzsevsky, Polish consul-general in Palestine, arrived here today to confer with Dr. Arthur Rupp of the Zionist Executive, B. Hausner, Polish consul in Tel Aviv, and with officials of the Polish ministry of commerce and foreign affairs concerning Polish-Palestine trade relations as well as middle class immigration from Poland to Palestine.

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## Rabbis Urge Fight Against Anti-Schechita Law in Bavaria

Berlin, Sept. 18.—Pointing out that the Bavarian law prohibiting schechita, the Jewish method of slaughtering goes into effect October 1, the eve of Yom Kippur, an appeal of the Bavarian Rabbinical Council calls on the Jews to fight for their religious liberty. The appeal characterizes Yom Kippur of this year as a day of "mourning and spiritual suppression."

The law was passed early this year in the form of animal protection legislation which has been interpreted to ban schechita. There had been considerable talk of a change in the German penal code which would declare that schechita was not animal torture and thus make the law inoperative in so far as it affected the Jewish method of slaughtering.

## Exile of Arab Agitator Meets General Approval

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Sept. 18.—The exile of Subhi Al Khadra, manager of the Arab Executive's office, to Safed for one year and his being put on parole for a similar period of time as a dangerous person, has strongly impressed everybody here. High Zionist leaders consider the stiff punishment to Khadra as the most important British measure against agitators.

The Hebrew paper, Doar Hayom, describes the sentence as unprecedentedly logical but thinks it is due to the fact that Khadra's proclamation calling for a general strike on August 23 was more anti-British than anti-Jewish and light in comparison with the crime. The paper adds that Khadra was only a tool in the hands of other persons "whose activities are shrouded in mystery," an obvious reference to the Grand Mufti. The Doar Hayom says that permanent peace is impossible "so long as British policy enables secret sedition to thrive."

## Chances of Polish Jewry Winning Adequate Representation in Elections for New Sejm Seen as Slim, Although Pourparlers for United Jewish or Minorities Bloc Are Making Headway

Warsaw, Sept. 18.—The chances of Polish Jewry winning a representation in the forthcoming elections to the fourth Polish parliament proportionate to its numbers are decidedly unfavorable, according to the opinions of various Jewish leaders here. The elections for the Sejm, or lower house, will be held November 16 while the elections to the Senate will take place on November 23.

In the first Sejm, which lasted from 1919 to 1922, the Jewish Parliamentary Club had 11 members; in the second Sejm, lasting from 1922 to 1927, the Club had 46 members, in addition to one member of the Jewish Folkist Party, while in the third Sejm, which was recently dissolved, the Jewish Parliamentary Club had 19 members.

The great increase in the membership of the Club during the second Sejm is traceable to the election union of the Jews with the White Russian, Ukrainian and German minorities, together with the fact that Ukrainians of Eastern Galicia boycotted the elections, giving the Jews of that section an opportunity to elect a large number of candidates. The Jews lost this advantage in the elections for the third Sejm when the Ukrainians in Eastern Galicia again participated in the elections.

The failure of the minorities bloc in the elections for the third Sejm was also in large measure due to the weakening of the Slavic minorities because their own radical elements deserted the minorities bloc, and because of the government's persecution of the minorities bloc itself. After the Polish Supreme Court had declared the elections in some districts null and void, the minorities ticket gained three seats in the supplementary elections. At the third Sejm elections the Agudath Israel, Orthodox Organization, joined the pro-government forces while the Jews of Eastern Galicia also declined to support the minorities bloc.

The formation of a minorities bloc in the coming elections is improbable because of changed political conditions. The White Russian bourgeois parties have lost their influence with the masses of White Russians and the Left parties among them are unwilling to join forces with the anti-Socialist White Russians. The Ukrainians, on the other hand, whose chief strength is in Eastern Galicia, will probably conduct an independent campaign there.

That the Jews will unite with the Ukrainians is also unlikely since the latter, of recent years, have been carrying on an economic fight against the Jewish population of Eastern Galicia and have ruined the Jewish shopkeepers by organizing their own cooperatives. It is extremely improbable, too, that the Jews will join forces with the German minority in the Lodz district, particularly since the Germans are asking a change in the present boundaries of Poland and Germany. Nevertheless the idea of the

minorities banding together for the parliamentary elections has not been entirely given up, although its realization is rather doubtful.

In the meantime the question of the Jews themselves uniting for the elections is making progress. The proposal for the formation of a united Zionist bloc of the territorial Zionist organizations as well as of the Zionist fractions within these organizations is making progress. The Hitachduth of Poland proper as well as of East and West Galicia have now agreed to concerted action in the forthcoming elections, although the East Galician Zionists had hesitated for sometime. Negotiations for a union of the Zionist fractions to include the Mizrahi, the Orthodox Zionist party and the general Zionists are still continuing.

The Agudath Israel, Orthodox Organization, has officially declared itself in favor of a united Jewish bloc on condition that no Jewish party, particularly the Zionists, exercise a hegemony in such a bloc. As a matter of fact, however the attitude of the Agudath has not yet crystallized, being dependent upon a number of factors. The same is true of the Jewish economic organizations, of the associations of Jewish merchants, manual workers, petty tradesmen, etc.

In the meantime, the leaders of the pro-government forces are negotiating with the leaders of the Jewish parties for a united ticket. As a condition for their joining the government forces, the Zionists demand the fulfillment of the principal Jewish demands which include mitigation of the enforced Sunday closing law, the abolition of the Czaristic restrictions against the Jews, Jewish equality before the law and a government subsidy for at least one Hebrew high school. Thus far the government has not accepted these demands.

The government leaders, on the other hand, are asking that the Jews nominate Jewish candidates only in those districts where Jewish candidates are certain of election. They also demand that the Jews create among themselves a united bloc which should include the Agudath together with the pro-government bloc of former Deputy Kirschbraun and Wislicki. 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that he was convicted only because of the anti-Semitism of the jury.

The Halsmann case, which dates back to the summer of 1928, has become a cause celebre. Halsmann and his father Max had come for an excursion to the Tyrol Mountains where the elder Halsmann was later found dead in a ravine. Chiefly on the evidence of a Tyrolean shepherd boy, Philip Halsmann was found guilty of murder and sentenced to ten years in prison. With young Halsmann protesting his innocence it was believed that the verdict of guilty was traceable to the anti-Semitism of the Innsbruck jury.

In view of the widespread feeling that Halsmann had been found guilty because of the anti-Semitic inclinations of the jury, the Austrian Supreme Court granted an appeal and annulled the sentence, ordering a new trial at Innsbruck, a hot-bed of anti-Semitic activity. Careful preparations were made for the new trial and new evidence accumulated. At the second trial in October 1929, Halsmann was sentenced to four years in prison at hard labor.

Since the second trial, strenuous efforts have been made to obtain a third trial. Public opinion in Austria, Germany and Czecho-Slovakia was aroused at what was generally believed to be a tragic miscarriage of justice. Editors who deplored the resentencing of Halsmann were fined. A fund was then raised to lodge a new appeal with the Supreme Court. The appeal was heard and denied and Halsmann remanded to prison. Since he has been in prison he has contracted tuberculosis.

## 20 Jewish Cooperative Bank Leaders Imprisoned by Soviet

Moscow, Sept. 18—All of the 20 Jews among the 32 arrested leaders of the cooperative industrial credit bank Selbststetigkeit, have been found guilty and sentenced to prison. Most of the accused received sentences at hard labor varying from nine months to two years, while others were sentenced to from 18 months to five years.

They were charged with negligence, bad management, ignoring the policy of the Soviet cooperatives in supporting the wealthy artisans and not granting credits to the poor artisans, and with giving bribes.

## Jews Fail in Daring Attempt to Bring Esrogim Into Russia

Warsaw, Sept. 18—Risking their lives, three Jews today took desperate chances to deliver esrogim (the citron required in the ritual of the Jewish festival of the Feast of Tabernacles which starts October 7) from Poland to Russia where esrogim are unobtainable. Their daring attempt was unsuccessful and they were caught at Stolpce, on the Russo-Polish border. Their load of esrogim was confiscated and all three arrested as smugglers.

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position of the Jews, therefore the reply of the Jews must be an intensifying of Jewish sentiment by arming ourselves spiritually against external hardships by supplementing the slogan 'right or wrong, my country' by 'right or wrong, my Judaism.'

Dr. Bernard Kahn, European director of the Joint Distribution Committee's work, stated that the election results symbolize the "tragic position of the Jews in the provinces who have been boycotted socially and professionally. I fear that the position of the Jews will be aggravated but the lasting political suppression of the Jews in Germany is impossible. It is now necessary to carry out well-planned social and economic work to strengthen the economic position of the Jews."

The director of the Central Association of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith, Ludwig Hollander, declared that anti-Semitism had had no decisive influence in the election, but he feared that the non-anti-Semitic supporters of Hitler would gradually adopt anti-Semitic ideas which "would create a tremendous danger, even the danger of civil war. Our aim must be to mobilize the Jewish forces as well as the non-Jews, and to conduct an educational campaign to enlighten people as to the danger of National Socialism."

Ernst Wallach, vice-president of the Central Association of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith, said that the Hitlerites' triumph represents the answer of 3,500,000 unemployed and another 3,000,000 starving people who "believe that a radical upheaval would save the future. These masses will soon learn that National Socialism is not the best road. Momentarily, however, the victory of the National Socialists, presents an extraordinary danger as regards the boycott of the Jews and personal persecution. Germany Jewry, nevertheless, must not despair, but must, on the basis of the patriotic idea, intensify its fight for honor and equal rights."

Dr. Herman Badt, ministerial director in the Prussian government declared "Gamzu Letovach (perhaps all is for the best), perhaps German Jewry will now recognize that the problem of the Jews in Germany is only part of the Jewish world problem and will recognize the need for unified action."

## 34 Jewish Charities Benefit in Will of M. Meiselman

Thirty-four Jewish charities will benefit from the will of Morris Meiselman who left an estate of \$750,000 of which \$179,000 will be distributed to the various charitable organizations devoted to Jewish interests. Mr. Meiselman, who came to this country as an immigrant, states in his will: "My estate represents the hard work and savings of a life-time, and as it will not be my good fortune to leave any descendant, I desire in this way to leave behind a record of my earthly existence."

## Jewish Communist Press Admits War on Religion Fails

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Sept. 18—The anti-religious campaign, timed to coincide with the Jewish High Holidays, is a failure, the Moscow Jewish paper, Emes, admits today, and calls for the immediate mobilization of all forces to save the so-called culture march, which is to urge Jewish workers to remain at work on the holidays, from failure. In White Russia every Jewish teacher has been mobilized for the campaign, but many of them are openly refusing to participate, saying that the Jewish children are not religious anyhow.

The Oktiabr, Jewish Communist paper in Minsk, urges "unmerciful measures" against the teachers who do not take part in the campaign. The Oktiabr also utilizes the anti-religious campaign to insinuate that rabbis are hoarding silver and thus "deliberately increasing the difficulties of the Soviet government. We have proof that the Jewish clericals are hiding silver, participating in the food speculation and also obtaining foodstuffs illegally from the government cooperatives while they are engaged in spreading malicious rumors. This must be stopped."

Reports from Kiev, Vinnitza, Kamencz-Podolsk and dozens of other cities in Ukraina complaining that nothing is being done for the anti-religious campaign, are published today in the Emes.

## Polish Legal Projects May Ease Jewish Economic Status

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Sept. 18—Thirty legal projects, including many recommending decreases in taxation, were submitted today by the ministry of finance to the Polish cabinet. The projects, which may mean tremendous economic relief for the Jewish population which suffers most from the burden of taxation, will be compiled and issued in the form of a decree signed by the president, who, according to the constitution, is empowered to issue such decrees. The projects contain a number of recommendations which have been repeatedly demanded in memorandums of the Jewish leaders to the Polish government.

## League Not to Create Special Commission for Minorities

Geneva, Sept. 18—The permanent minorities commission in the League of Nations will not be established, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns. The German delegation to the League's sessions has decided not to recommend to the sixth or political commission of the Assembly that a permanent and independent minorities commission be added to the existing League commissions. Instead of an independent commission the Germans, at the last minute, have decided to suggest that complaints of minorities be discussed as hitherto with the usual procedure.

With the death of Hans Herzl and his sister Paulina, the only survivor of Theodor Herzl's family is Mrs. Trude Neuman, a married daughter living in Vienna.

## Chances of Polish Jewry to Win Adequate Representation In Sejm Seen as Slim

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are met the government forces are ready to maintain a neutral attitude toward the Jewish candidates.

These conditions have been declared unacceptable by the Zionists who claim that if they do not nominate candidates in all districts they will arouse tremendous anti-Semitic agitation throughout the country on the part of all those groups who are fighting the government, including the Socialists, peasant groups and Ukrainians. Other Jewish groups, however, are inclined to accept the offer.

Elections prognosticators see the outlook poor for Jewish success no matter what combinations the Jews make. The recent division of election districts gives the Jews, with a few exceptions, little chance of electing their own candidates.

The situation of the Jewish Labor parties, is also critical. The ambition of the Jewish Socialist Party, the Bund, to create a unified ticket of all the minority Socialist parties has little chance of being realized because the Ukrainian and White Russian Socialist parties exert little influence on the masses of voters. The German Socialist party will probably join the German bourgeois parties or the Polish Socialist party. The Bund and the Left and Right Poale Zion, even combined, would be unable to elect their own candidates, even in the large industrial centers.

## Sees Zionist Future Based on Role of U. S. Non-Zionists

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Sept. 18.—The future of the Zionist movement is greatly dependent on the role to be played by the American Non-Zionists in the colonizing efforts in Palestine, writes the Near East and India. Commenting on Dr. Chaim Weizmann's statement at the recent meeting of the Zionist Actions Committee in Berlin that Palestine must become a bi-national state, and on the opposition that this statement aroused, the paper says, "There still exists a considerable section of Zionists that overlooks the Churchill White Paper of 1922 and that believes that the best way of furthering Jewish interests in Palestine is by placing right in the forefront of the Zionist program the desire to form a Jewish state."

"Dr. Weizmann, who knows the idealistic side of the Zionist movement as well as any man living, naturally pointed out that he is concerned with the program of the immediate future and not with obscure and distant prospects." Terming the Actions Committee's refusal to accept Dr. Weizmann's resignation common sense, Near East and India notes that the "future of the Zionist movement is most uncertain. It is not yet known how great a part the Non-Zionists, chiefly Americans, will play in the colonization of Palestine, but is perfectly evident that many difficulties are in store unless the Jewish colonization movement strives unceasingly concentratedly to put itself on an economic basis." Commenting on the meaning of the term "Jewish state," the paper says "Jewish state is but an untimely phrase and it is not even a geographical expression."

## Telling Man He Is of Jewish Descent Is Insult in Budapest

Budapest, Sept. 18.—Telling a man he is of Jewish descent is an insult, according to a decision rendered by the Budapest court today during the trial of the anti-Semitic railway official M. Kinzler. During a quarrel with Disder Buday, a member of the Hungarian parliament, and leader of the Awakening Magyars, Kinzler wrote to Buday that he was "of Jewish descent."

Buday brought charges against Kinzler, charging him with throwing "a shadow on his past." The court fined Kinzler.

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
