

## Hitlerites Plan Coup While Jews Organize to Fight Anti-Semitic Menace

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Sept. 19.—Flushed with the sensational victory they won in last week's Reichstag elections the storm squads of the Hitlerites, organized on a military basis, are preparing a coup d'etat. National Socialist headquarters semi-officially admitted that excited groups were planning to use force although the official spokesmen are endeavoring to calm the hotheads by admonishing them that the government is strong enough to suppress any rising.

In the meantime the mobilization of the Jewish forces against the rising anti-Semitic danger began today when a number of Jewish leaders and representatives of the press met for a conference in the headquarters of the Central Association of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith. All the speakers

## Charges Mandates Section of League's Secretariat Pro-Arab

Geneva, Sept. 19.—The Mandates section of the secretariat of the League of Nations was openly accused today of having become pro-Arab by William Martin, political editor of the influential Journal d'Geneve. Analyzing the Balfour Declaration, M. Martin says that after Great Britain received all the political advantages it wanted through the Declaration it began to assume a pro-Arab attitude.

"It was believed," M. Martin writes, "that England entered Palestine to create there a Jewish National Home. This was a mistake. England went there to protect the Arabs." He then charges that the Mandates section of the League's secretariat began to sympathize with the pro-Arab interpretation of the Palestine Mandate as given by Great Britain. This pro-Arab sympathy became evident, M. Martin claims, since Dr. William Rappard, now a member of the Mandates Commission, left the directorship of the Mandates section of the secretariat.

M. Martin notes with satisfaction that the Mandates Commission "which had for a long time tolerated this interpretation has finally put an end to it." The criticism voiced by so influential a newspaperman and political observer is considered extremely important here and not to be underestimated in view of the fact that the Mandates section, just as other sections of the secretariat, is supposed to maintain a strict impartiality.

The present head of the Mandates section of the secretariat is Vito Catantini, an Italian. The other members are F. T. B. Friss of Denmark, N. de Freire de Andrade of Portugal and E. R. de Haller of Switzerland.

## Urges League Be More Liberal in Acting on Minority Complaints

Geneva, Sept. 19.—A more liberal interpretation of the procedure by which national minorities submit complaints to the League of Nations was demanded by M. Koch, a member of the German League delegation, speaking at today's session of the Assembly's sixth or political commission. He criticized the League of Nations way of interpreting the decision of the Madrid meeting of the Council regarding improvement and changes in the procedure.

During M. Koch's address and the discussion that followed Aristide Briand, August Zaleski, Polish foreign minister, Dr. Eduard Benes, foreign minister of Czechoslovakia, and Count Albert Apponyi, former Hungarian foreign minister, were present.

M. Briand expressed confidence in the present system of minorities procedure as adopted by the Council at Madrid, emphasizing that the previous speakers, representatives of Japan, Germany and Austria, had not demanded any change. Adding that the League of Nations had not failed to protect the minorities and hence does not deserve criticism on this score, M. Briand took a definite stand in opposition to the proposal for the creation of a special minorities commission in the League.

Dr. Benes declared that changes in the procedure were impossible without having consulted all the powers signatory to the minorities agreement. Count Apponyi criticized the basis of the existing procedure and expressed his approval of the suggestion for a special minorities commission.

## Jews Flee Germany, Fearing Anti-Semitic Disturbances

Berlin, Sept. 19.—A large number of Jews from various parts of Germany, especially from Bavaria, are leaving for Holland, Switzerland and other nearby countries, fearing serious anti-Jewish developments as a result of the great election victory of the Hitlerites, today's German provincial press reports. The papers add, however, that the flight of the Jews is due to over-anxiety because thus far there have been no attacks on the Jews.

A number of Hitlerites who raised the cry of "down with the Jews" in the streets of Berlin today were badly injured in a clash that followed. Their injuries were too severe to be attended to at a first aid station and they were taken to the nearest hospital which happened to be a Jewish institution where they were immediately operated on by Jewish physicians and are now resting in a ward with Jewish patients.

## Only 106 of 900 Jewish Applicants at University of Budapest Are Admitted

Budapest, Sept. 19.—Only 106 of the 900 Jewish applicants for admission to the University of Budapest have been accepted this year following competitive examinations, while an additional 46 Jews who passed the examinations, were advised to apply to other institutions, the Hungarian-Jewish paper Egyenloeseg reveals in a Rosh Hashanah review of the tragic effects of the numerous clauses. The 794 rejected Jewish applicants received a printed circular informing them that the University's council could not recommend their admission.

In the provincial universities the situation appears to be even worse. The University of Debreczin declined to admit Eugene Samuel, a Jewish applicant who had passed all the entrance examinations with honors and had won high distinction in mathematics as a high school student.

## Brith Trumpeldor's Campaign Conflicts with J. N. F. Drive

Jerusalem, Sept. 19.—A fund-raising campaign among its branches in Poland and other Eastern and Central European countries to start next month has been announced by the Brith Trumpeldor, the Jewish youth organization named for Joseph Trumpeldor, who fell in the defence of Tel Hai during the riots of 1920. The period set for the campaign coincides with that set aside by the last Zionist Congress solely for the intensification of efforts for the Jewish National Fund.

The Zionist Executive in London has cabled the Brith Trumpeldor centers concerned to respect the decision of the 16th Zionist Congress and to abandon the campaign. It is expected that the Brith Trumpeldor will comply and the period be left free for intensive activity on behalf of the Jewish National Fund.

## Jews Total 33 Percent of Foreign Students in Czechoslovakia

Prague, Sept. 19.—The statistics of foreign students who study in Czechoslovakian schools, which have just been issued by the government, show that the Jewish students among the foreigners are not at all as large an element as some Czech nationalists alleged recently. Jews constitute 46.1 per cent of the foreigners studying in the Czechoslovakian universities. In the technical schools Jews are 27.7 of the foreign students, while in the Art Academy they are only 4.5 per cent. Altogether there are 4,137 foreigners studying in the higher schools of the country, of whom just one-third are Jews.

## Palestine Rabbinate Will Not Support Campaign Against Evils of Child Marriage

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Sept. 19.—Although recognizing the evils of child-marriage, the rabbinate of Palestine has declined to become an outspoken supporter of the Jewish Women's Rights Association in its struggle to obtain legislation making 16 the minimum age at which marriages may be contracted. The Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns that the Palestine government, on the firm intimation from the League of Nations, is now drafting a bill making 14 the minimum age.

The compromise figure is due to the government's reluctance to introduce legislation that may lead to opposition among the Palestine Moslems similar to that evoked among the Hindus of India over the Sarda act which forbids marriages between children under 14 years of age, a fine of \$300 being levied for violations.

Boy and girl marriages are still very popular in the Sephardic Jewish communities of Palestine, which explains the hesitation of the rabbis to join wholeheartedly in the fight on this recognized evil. The child marriage problem in Palestine was raised at the extraordinary session of the Mandates Commission last June by Mlle. Valentine Dannevig, the Norwegian member of the Commission.

Replying to her question of what was the situation in regard to child marriage and whether any legislation on the lines of that recently passed in India and Egypt had been provided or contemplated by the Palestine administration, Harry C. Luke, former chief secretary of Palestine, said there was no problem of the sort that existed in India and he could not say what were the minimum ages of marriage. Mr. Luke took note of Mlle. Dannevig's remark that she had been informed that not a few Arab girls were married before the age of 14.

## Zionism Only Hope Against World Anti-Semitism, Lipsky Says, Differs with Weizmann

Zionism is the only solution of an anti-Semitism whose menace is rising in all of Europe and jeopardizing the future of the Jews in most of the Western European countries, according to a statement made by Louis Lipsky, former president and now honorary vice-chairman of the Zionist Organization of America, on his return Friday on the S. S. Mauretania from an extended visit abroad where he attended the meetings of the Zionist Actions Committee and the Jewish Agency at Berlin.

With the Jewish position in Europe constantly becoming less stable, it is all the more important that Zionists become more determined and assertive than ever, Mr. Lipsky declared, taking issue at the same time with Dr. Chaim Weizmann, President of the World Zionist Organization, who at the Actions Committee meeting at Berlin had declared that moderation ought to be the watchword of Zionist effort now.

In his statement, issued at the offices of the Judea Life Insurance Company, of which he is president, Mr. Lipsky said: "On this background of anti-Semitism, Zionism assumes a greater significance and importance than ever before. It is no longer a negative problem with which Jews must deal. Zionism is not a luxury of philanthropic sympathies, but an economic and political necessity. Establishment of the Jewish National Home is a goal which is inescapable."

"Under these circumstances the program of Zionism must be clearer and bolder than ever. It must demand with definiteness the fulfillment of the pledges of the Allied nations, because the needs of the Jewish people are so great. That is why every Zionist resented the address made by Dr. Weizmann at the Actions Committee meeting at Berlin. There can be no doubt that Dr. Weizmann did not have the proper perspective on the situation today in the address he delivered there. The policy of moderation and compromise, of avoiding a clear enumeration of Zionist principles, of giving way for the moment for the sake of ultimate gain, which might have worked a decade ago, is no longer practicable. If put into practice it can only jeopardize Zionist interests for all time; it may succeed in undermining the great constructive Jewish achievements of the past ten years in Palestine."

## Maccabee Sports Federation Aided by Czech Government

Prague, Sept. 19.—The Czech-Slovakian government through its Ministry of Health has granted a subsidy of 10,000 kronen to the Jewish Maccabee Sport Federation of Czechoslovakia. The significance of the subvention lies in the fact that the Maccabee Federation is thus recognized by the government as one of the leading organizations promoting sport and health activities in Czechoslovakia.

## Polish-Jewish Leaders Appeal for Aid to HIAS at Report It May End European Activity

Warsaw, Sept. 19.—The possibility that the Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society (HIAS) of New York may discontinue its activities on behalf of Jewish emigrants in Europe because of a lack of funds, has thrown Polish-Jewish leaders of every shade of opinion into a panic over the fate of thousands of Jewish emigrants who have until now found relief in the HIAS' institutions.

The Warsaw Jewish Emigrant Aid Society has issued through the Jewish Telegraphic Agency the following appeal to New York Jews:

"The discontinuance of the activities of HIAS in Eastern Europe would leave the Jewish wanderer in a dangerous and helpless state, and under prevailing economic conditions would result in great hardship and misfortune. We appeal to the friends and supporters of HIAS to overcome all obstacles and continue the present useful relief, protection and guidance of emigrants. Don't abandon the Jewish wanderer!"

The Warsaw rabbinate has cabled to the HIAS in New York the following appeal:

"To our brothers in America the undersigned are powerless to express their sorrow and pain caused by the report of the discontinuance of the work of the HIAS in Europe. At a time when we Jews are so poor in real Jewish democratic institutions it would be unthinkable for the only connecting link between brothers in the East and West to cease functioning. The HIAS has rendered great services in the past. It helped widows and orphans, aged and young and reunited families. There is no one to take its place."

"Let every Jew at this time of the year when his heart is more responsive to charity than usual think of his unfortunate brothers and sisters who are compelled to abandon their land to seek new homes. Our prayer to you is do not fail your institution, the HIAS. May the Almighty bestow upon you Kesiva Wachsimna Tovo. Amen."

The appeal is signed by Rabbis Aron Shengram, Chaim Joshua Gutshechter, Chaim Posner, Chaim Leib Judkowsky, Isaac Meir Kanal, Jechiel Michelson, Jacob Silberstein, Shlome David Kahane and Jacob Gesundheid.

## Haverhill Jews Plan Kehillah to Link All Philanthropies

Haverhill, Mass., Sept. 19.—Haverhill Jews will be organized into a Kehillah, as a result of preliminary steps taken last week at a meeting in the Beth Jacob synagogue which was attended by leaders of the Jewish community. The Kehillah plans to federate the religious, educational, welfare and fraternal organizations of Haverhill Jewry. Rabbi Alfred H. Kahn, who called the meeting, was elected temporary chairman, and Sarah Lissman was named secretary.

## Induct Rabbi Newman as New Leader of Temple Rodeph Shalom

Rabbi Louis I. Newman, for six years rabbi of Temple Emanu-el, San Francisco, was formally inducted as Rabbi of Congregation Rodeph Shalom on Friday evening. Rabbi Nathan Krass of Temple Emanu-el and Rabbi Stephen S. Wise of the Free Synagogue delivered the addresses of induction. Alexander Pfeiffer, chairman of the induction committee, made the opening remarks, and Ernest J. Wile, president of the congregation, gave an address of welcome. Rabbi Newman then delivered the induction sermon, entitled "The Indwelling Presence of God."

Rabbi Newman, before his ministry in California, was associated with Rabbi Stephen S. Wise of the Free Synagogue, and with the late Rabbi Maurice H. Harris in Temple Israel, New York City. He is a graduate of Brown University, University of California and Columbia University where he received his doctorate for a volume entitled "Jewish Influence on Christian Reform Movements." He is the author also of "Studies in Biblical Parallelisms," two volumes of poetry and essays in the field of Jewish scholarship. He is the author of a weekly column of comment in the Anglo-Jewish press, entitled "Telling it in Gath," and for several years was associated with the San Francisco Call-Bulletin as a feature writer. He is a former president of the Intercollegiate Menorah Association.

In his induction sermon on Friday night, Rabbi Newman declared that economic restoration in this country will follow religious reconstruction. "Chaos in religion has brought chaos in social and economic life," he stated. "The gambling mania was merely a symptom of America's irreligion. We are paying the penalty today not only for disaster on the exchange, but for prior disaster in our spiritual outlook. Restoration of religion as a central force in modern life will give man control not only of himself and his intellect, but of all his energies as an economic upbuilder and a social organizer."

## No Rosh Hashonah Registration for City College Jewish Students

Every Jewish student who will bring a letter from a rabbi stating that he attended religious services on Rosh Hashonah will be allowed to register for the evening courses of City College after the High Holy Days, President Robinson of City College informed a committee of the Rabbinical Board this week.

The committee, which consisted of Rabbi L. Predmesky of the Tremont Talmud Torah, Rabbi Solomon Reichman of the Bronx Y. M. H. A., and Rabbi J. N. Charlop of the Bronx Jewish Center, visited Dr. Robinson and called his attention to the fact that Jewish students will be unable to register for the evening courses because of the fact that registration for those courses begins on the evening of September 23rd, which is the eve of the Jewish New Year.

## Arab Executive Officials Charged With Giving Documents to Police

Jerusalem, Sept. 19.—Omar Saleh, one of the three secretaries of the Arab Executive, founder of the independence party aiming at the abolition of the Mandate, and organizer of the so-called defence league to promote a political and economic boycott against the Jews, is now undergoing a severe examination at the hands of a disciplinary tribunal specially constituted by the Arab Executive, according to the Arab paper Al Hayat.

It is alleged that he divulged to the police the proclamation calling for a general strike on August 23, the first anniversary of the riots. For being the author of the proclamation, Subhi Khadra, manager of the Arab Executive's office, has been exiled to Safed for one year and sentenced to pay security to keep public order. It is also understood that Moghanem, the Christian secretary of the Arab Executive, is also being charged with smuggling secret documents of the Arab Executive.

## Theodor Wolff Would Be First Jew Expelled by Hitlerites

Berlin, Sept. 19.—Theodor Wolff, editor-in-chief of the Berliner Tageblatt, the leading Democratic paper of Germany, will be the first Jew to be expelled from Germany as soon as the Hitlerites get control, says today's Voelkische Beobachter, the organ of the Hitlerites. The paper says, "This Galician Jew must be the first one expelled." This is in accordance with the Hitlerite program to eliminate all Jews from the German press.

Theodor Wolff, a member of the editorial staff of the Berliner Tageblatt since 1887, and its editor-in-chief since 1906, is not a Galician Jew, having been born in Berlin in 1868. He is one of the outstanding journalists of Europe.

## \$5,499,000 Total Quota for New York Federation Drive

Quotas totaling \$5,499,000 were yesterday announced for eighty-six trade and professional groups of New York, at a luncheon meeting in the Hotel Biltmore of the Board of Directors of the Business Men's Council of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies, to discuss plans for the 1930 campaign of the federation. The object of this year's drive will be to wipe out a deficit of \$2,221,000, which sum is necessary for fulfillment of the federation's obligations to its ninety-one affiliated social agencies until the end of the current year.

In order to attain their goals, the industrial and professional groups must raise this deficit, it was stated by Samuel D. Leidesdorf, chairman of the council. The remainder has already been credited to them in the form of annual recurrent subscriptions and donations already secured. According to Mr. Leidesdorf, the work of the campaign this year will be in the hands of a larger volunteer army than ever before in the local charities' history.

## Characterizes Judaism as Static But Immortal

In the October issue of Scribner's Magazine, Charles Hall Perry writes a Christian's appreciation of "The Hebrew Advantage." In stating that two religions exert an important influence in the Western World, he nevertheless characterizes Christianity as dynamic and Judaism as static.

He explains that the one does and the other is: "The Hebrew advantage or contribution, in its people and its religion, is involved in that for which it stands; to that which it gives unequivocal witness."

He nevertheless sees Israel, "scattered among the nations, not as a national failure, but as a divine purpose," and believes that "unborn peoples... will reap where Israel shall be sown," and in the faith and moral standards accepted by these peoples, Judaism will find its immortality.

The contributor of this article asks "how long our modern civilization will ignore its indebtedness to the Jewish race?" Though he suggests that the Church, as "the heir of the spiritual fortune of Judaism" ought to "originate the approach" of gratitude, he proposes no procedure for achieving it. The article deals essentially with the merits of the Jew and Judaism which he finds in the unique and significant history of Israel; the resolute and dauntless spirit of the Jew through the centuries; the sense that "they were called of God for a great purpose;" their "national celibacy demanded by their ordination;" Israel's monotheism "unique in deistic concepts"—a Jehovah solitary, supreme and absolute, yet imminent and intimate, "revealed in every phase of nature; manifest in the trend of history; associated in all human affairs; exacting for righteousness, yet sympathetic and forgiving."

In discussing the Jewish attitude toward Jesus, he states his opinion that Jesus does not represent an impassable barrier between Christianity and Judaism, as "the Hebrew rejection of Jesus... has no basis in fact." Jesus, in his estimation, was crucified by an arrogant and frightened lot of ecclesiastics: "The Jews never rejected the historical Jew, Jesus of Nazareth. Only the human God whom theology has created out of the superlative." He quotes Rabbi Lazaron in substantiation of his interpretation.

He also finds among the moderns many Jews "who have fed the hungers of the heart, soul and mind of men."

## Poland May Aid Jewish Artisans, Industrialists to Go to Palestine

Warsaw, Sept. 19.—Dr. Arthur Ruppin of the Palestine Zionist Executive, is now conferring with officials of the Polish government concerning the immigration to Palestine of groups of Jewish artisans and small industrialists with the government's assistance from Poland, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns. Government circles are said to favor the plan.

## 87-Year Old Jew Elected

### Tennessee Judge for 7th Term

Nashville, Tenn., Sept. 19—Jacob Levine, 87 years of age and a long time resident of Nashville, Tennessee's capital, has just entered upon his seventh six-year term as a member of the county court of Davidson County, the county in which Nashville is located. Mr. Levine, who is familiarly known as "Squire Jake," has the distinction of having served as a member of the Davidson County court longer than any other man in the county. He was first elected magistrate in 1894 and has been a winner in every election since that time at the expiration of his terms.

Re-elected in August for the seventh term, Mr. Levine took the oath of office early in September, the occasion being attended with much ceremony. He has served under four county judges and has been a member of a number of the court's most important committees and a leader in many forward movements, including an equitable tax rate for the county and the establishment of charitable and welfare institutions.

Mr. Levine also has the distinction of being the last surviving member of the original B'nai B'rith organization in Nashville.

## Dr. Sachar Heads Illinois

### Hillel Foundation, Not Wisconsin

In the report of the meeting of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Convention in Cincinnati it was erroneously reported that Professor A. L. Sachar was the director of the Hillel Foundation of the University of Wisconsin. Dr. Sachar heads the Hillel Foundation at the University of Illinois, while the director of the Foundation at the University of Wisconsin is Rabbi Solomon Landman.

## Trenton Synagogue Marks

### Its Seventieth Anniversary

Trenton, N. J., Sept. 19—Congregation Har Sinai has just brought to a close a five-day period of festivity celebrating the dedication of its new Temple. The occasion also marked the seventieth anniversary of the founding of the congregation, the oldest Jewish group in Trenton. The Temple was built at a cost approximating \$200,000. Rabbi Abraham Holtzberg is spiritual head of the congregation and Julius Schafer, one of Trenton's outstanding merchants, is the president.

## 8 Jewish Students Awarded

### Pulitzer Scholarships

Of the twelve high school graduates of Greater New York who were awarded Pulitzer Prize scholarships, eight of them were Jewish, according to an announcement made at Columbia University Friday. The awards will entitle each of the recipients to four years' free tuition at Columbia, in addition to \$1,000 cash.

Henry Bretzfeld, seventeen, attained the highest rating in the college entrance examinations, with Harold L. Posner, rating second. News of the award was made to Herbert Goldstein while he was suffering from a severe attack of pneumonia, and though he had 104 degrees fever at the time, "a smile spread all over his face," when he was informed of the prize. The other winners are: Jacob Kivatinetz, Hyman R. Hellman, William Golub, Walter Solomon, and Irving Rogovsky.

## Sol Levitan to Be Treasurer

### of Wisconsin for Fifth Term

emphasized the need for continuing the fight against anti-Semitism because of the danger that hundreds of thousands of voters who supported Hitler, and who are interested in the Jewish problem, may gradually take an active part in the anti-Semitic activities.

While this conference was in session it was learned that all of the Jewish Socialists elected to the Reichstag, with one exception, had severed their connections with the Jewish Community, becoming "confessionless," because the Socialist party during the elections had issued a slogan that its "candidates must be confessionless." The Socialists leaders were influenced to take this step by the labor masses who did not want Jewish candidates.

## Eastern Pennsylvania Completes

### \$125,000 in Gifts to U. J. C.

Philadelphia, Sept. 19—With the forwarding of a check for \$25,000 to Paul Baerwald, national treasurer of the United Jewish Campaign, by Albert H. Lieberman, chairman of the U. J.
