Protest of Conservatives On British Palestine Policy

Cowbridge, England, Oct. 24—David Lloyd George, Liberal leader and premier of England when the Balfour Declaration was issued, today completely associated himself with the protest of the Conservative leaders, Stanley Baldwin, Leopold Amery and Austen Chamberlain against the new British policy in Palestine. Lloyd George voiced the hope that the present British government would reconsider its attitude.

Speaking on the occasion of a luncheon given him here in bestowing the freedom of the city upon him, Lloyd George said, "In wartime we were anxious to secure the good will of the Jewish community throughout the world for the Allied cause. The Balfour Declaration was a gesture not merely on our part but on the part of the Allies to secure that valuable support. It was prepared after much consideration, not merely of its policy but

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Smuts Urges Britain to Conform to Balfour Pledge, Recast Recent Plan, in Cable to MacDonald

Capetown, South Africa, Oct. 24—The issuance of a statement by the British government announcing that the terms of the Balfour Declaration would be fully carried out in good faith and the recasting of the recently announced British policy in Palestine in accordance with the Balfour Declaration was urged upon the British government today by General Jan Christian Smuts, in a cable to Premier MacDonald.

General Smuts, former premier of South Africa, was a member of the British war-time cabinet that issued the Balfour Declaration. Shortly after the Shaw Commission hearings had been concluded General Smuts, to-

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Wailing Wall Commission to Meet in Stockholm Next Week

Geneva, Oct. 24—Charles Barde, the Swiss jurist, who is a member of the international Wailing Wall Commission which investigated the Moslem and Jewish claims to the Wailing Wall, told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today that the first meeting of the Commission will be held next week at Stockholm.

At that meeting the Commission will examine the voluminous material representing the claims of Jews and Moslems to the Wall, and will then adjourn. A second meeting will be held during 1930 to formulate the conclusions of the Commission concerning the Wailing Wall controversy, M. Barde stated.

Tel Aviv Heralds Birth of Triplets as Reply to Britain

Tel Aviv, Oct. 24—This only all-Jewish city in Palestine today gave the first direct challenge to the new British policy in Palestine of restricting Jewish immigration by cheering the report from the Hadassah Hospital that a set of triplets had been born to a Jewish woman.

The Hebrew papers here are heralding the birth of this trio of babies as an eloquent reply to the British statement of policy. It is planned to name the babies after past and present Zionist leaders.

Amery Will Move to Amend Britain's Palestine Plan

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Oct. 24—Leopold Amery, former colonial secretary in the late Baldwin cabinet and Sir Herbert Samuel, first High Commissioner for Palestine and Liberal leader, will propose an amendment on the Palestine question immediately following the King's speech to parliament next Tuesday. The amendment will level severe criticism against the government's statement on policy in Palestine.

Simultaneously, Lord Reading, former Viceroy of India will raise the Palestine issue in the House of Lords. A heated discussion on the government's Palestine policy is expected in parliament after the King's speech in view of the distinct division of both houses into definite pro-Zionist and anti-Zionist camps.

The King's speech upon the opening of parliament next Tuesday is awaited with the greatest interest in Zionist circles in view of the possibility that references will be made therein to the Palestine question. Pending the King's speech nothing further on the Palestine subject can be expected by members of parliament before Tuesday as it is unusual to put down on paper any amendments or motions referring to the King's speech before the actual text has been submitted which is usually done only an hour before its actual delivery.

Declines to Pay Income Tax As Protest on British Plan

London, Oct. 24—As a protest against the British government's new Palestine policy, Alfred Felber, a London Jew, today declined to pay his income tax. He informed the Inland Revenue authorities of his refusal in the following terms:

"This refusal is the only means available for me to register an effective protest against the unprincipled action of the British government, namely its attempt to deprive the Jewish people of its rights."

Says American Zionists to Invoke Aid of U. S. in Protest Against British White Paper

Washington, Oct. 24—Influential American Zionist leaders have formulated plans for invoking the good offices of the United States in the controversy which has arisen between the British government and Jews over the Jewish National Home in Palestine, it is asserted in a copyrighted article on the front page of the Evening Star by Frederic William Wile, noted Washington correspondent.

Mr. Wile states that "unless the the House of Commons in London in the preamble repudiates the program just promulgated by the government, whereby drastic restrictions upon Jewish immigration and land purchase in Palestine are decreed, American Zionists will seek to bring about strong representations by the United States. Congress will not have reassembled very long in December before protest action will be called for, the purpose of such action would be to have the State Department, through formal diplomatic channels, bring to Great Britain's attention the resentment felt in this country, both among Zionists and non-Jews toward 'perfidious Albion's' new course in Palestine.

"The United States' interest in taking note of what the Zionists term the 'violation' of the Palestine Mandate rests upon the American-British Palestine Mandate Convention, December 3, 1924. The Convention was signed at London on that date by Austen Chamberlain, then British Foreign Secretary, and Frank B. Kellogg, who was the American Ambassador to Great Britain. The Convention was ratified by the Senate on February 20, 1925, and by

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Austrian Zionist Press Urges Huge Protest at British Policy

Vienna, Oct. 24—The Stimme and the Neue Welt, Austrian Zionist organs, today call upon the Jewish masses of Austria to participate in a great protest demonstration against the British labor government and to march to the grave of Theodor Herzl, founder of political Zionism, and swear to continue the fight for the ultimate victory of Zionism. Herzl's grave is in Vienna.

Both papers see in the government's statement of policy "a betrayal that has no example in history" and "a malicious attempt to throttle the Jewish National Home." In the proposed legislative council the Austrian Zionist weeklies see the desire of England to cater to Arab wishes by granting the latter political and economic overlordship in Palestine.

Jewish and Non-Jewish Public Opinion in America Crystallized Against British Government for Statement on Palestine Policy

A complete recovery from the hysteria brought about by the first publication of Great Britain's new Palestine policy, leading to a new effort toward reaching an understanding with the British peoples rather than with their government, was evident in today's statement by Dr. Cyrus Adler, who, since the resignation of Felix M. Warburg, becomes virtually the temporary head of the Jewish Agency for Palestine.

"It is a heartening thing," said Dr. Adler in a statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, "to find that the leaders of a great political party in England: Stanley Baldwin, Sir Austen Chamberlain, and Mr. Amery, the three responsible officials in the last Conservative Government have completely disassociated themselves from the attitude of Lord Passfield and the present British Government with regard to the Palestinian policy. In effect their letter in the London Times for Thursday, and republished in the American papers of the same date, takes the same ground as does Felix M. Warburg, in his letter of resignation, which is a coincidence so remarkable as to indicate that Mr. Warburg's view was not simply the view of a Jew or member of the Jewish Agency but the view of a fair man.

"It is more than likely that the chiefs of the Liberal party will take the same view but whether they do or not it is plain that the best sentiments of the English people will not tolerate a breach of trust whether it be with a great nation or with a small people whose weight cannot be made felt by navies or armies. I still repose confidence in the honor and good faith of the English people.

Deplores Hasty Sentiments

"For this reason I deeply deplore hasty and ill-considered sentiments which would tend toward an anti-British agitation in this country or in any other country. The English people do not merit this at our hands and any attempt to foster it would react not only upon the speakers who desire a little applause at a momentary excitement but even more heavily upon the Jewish people themselves and upon Palestine. The feeling of anger and despair was natural but no Jew has the right to give vent to his own feelings in a way that will ultimately harm his own people."

This optimistic statement by Dr. Adler, a non-Zionist, was hailed as particularly significant as it pledged the non-Zionists to "remain in the fight," and entirely counteracted the remarks of Rabbi Louis Wolsey of the Rodef Sholem temple in Philadelphia, who, speaking in Cleveland, discussed the "defeat of Zionism."

"The news of the White Paper is not unexpected either on the part of Zionist or the non-Zionist," said Rabbi Wolsey. "This represents the culmination of a tendency in British politics which has been quite obvious for the last two years.

"The unfortunate phase of the whole

question is that the Zionist has placed all of his capital on one number, namely, the establishment of a Jewish national state in Palestine. He was informed by the non-Zionists during the last quarter of a century that not only would he never succeed, but that nationalism did not represent the purpose of the Jew in the world.

"The Zionist attempted during the last 40 years to awaken a national Jewish consciousness and awoke to discover that he provoked a similar national consciousness in the Arab, and this very naturally produced a rather tragic situation, out of which the British government is squirming with its new White paper.

"If the Zionist had accepted the point of view of the non-Zionist and had thrown his strength entirely into a colonization movement, he not alone would have had the heartfelt support of world Jewry, but also of the British government and perhaps of the Arabs as well.

Death-Blow of Zionism

"This white paper is the death blow to Zionism," said Rabbi Wolsey. "The Zionist himself has violated one of the terms of the Balfour declaration when he permitted a nationalistic interpretation of Jewish life to infringe upon the religious liberty of Jews living in other lands.

"The white paper represents the logic of history and the Jew should hereafter address himself to his religious position and interpretation and scrap his national heresy."

Rabbi Wolsey's utterances were immediately deplored by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver and other prominent Jewish leaders. Dr. Samuel Shulman, also a non-Zionist, said, "Of all the cruel ironies of history, the statement of the British Government with respect to the Jewish settlement in Palestine is the most baffling. It is hard to understand. I am filled with sorrow and indignation. Though not a Zionist, nor a Jewish Nationalist, I am vitally interested in the opportunities which were supposed to have been offered to Jews in Palestine by the Balfour declaration. I recently said there should be more Jewish immigration into Palestine. Now, we are told, immigration must stop; that immigration is dependent upon Arab unemployment. With all allowance for the mysteries of political and diplomatic phraseology, it is not too much to say that the so-called national homeland has proven to be a meaningless phrase on a scrap of paper. I do believe, however, that the best interests of the Jews in Palestine demand co-operation with the British government, and confidence that ultimately the Government will not completely discredit the gesture made in the form of the Balfour Declaration. In the meantime, I say, God still lives, and the Jewish people will survive the chagrin of the Simpson report and the Declaration of the MacDonald government."

Britain Will Do Utmost to Render Justice to Both Arabs, Jews, Says Snell, Leaving U.S.

Assurance that Great Britain would, in the long run, do her utmost to render justice to both Jews and Arabs in Palestine was given as a parting message to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today by Harry M. Snell, chairman of the Labor Party of Great Britain, who came to the United States a week ago to address the American Jewish Congress.

"I have absolute faith that my country will try to find the just and right way to deal with this situation," he said in referring to the controversy raised over the new Palestine policy. Mr. Snell, whose own deep-lined face and earnest eyes bear out the traditional conception of the sincere, political-minded Briton, expressed himself as profoundly moved by the events of the past few days. He was one of the Inquiry Commission sent to Palestine after the riots of a year ago, and published a minority report with the report of the commission.

"I had no idea when I sailed that the Simpson report was about to be made public. If I had known, I would perhaps not have come to America. As it was, I believed that my trip here would be in a way the last move in my occupation with the Palestinian problem. But now I don't know. I am sailing tonight in the hope of being home in time to take part in the debates on the subject in the coming Parliamentary session.

"But of this I am sure, no matter what action is taken, it will rise out of my country's desire to be absolutely fair in the matter. I cannot conceive of Britain acting otherwise."

A farewell luncheon, of a purely social nature, was given for Mr. Snell by Bernard M. Deutsch, president of the American Jewish Congress, at the Biltmore hotel today.

Parliament Conservative, Labor Members, Dissatisfied with British Plan for Palestine

London, Oct. 24.—Signs are multiplying that the uneasiness and discontent among Labor M.P.'s at the British government's new Palestine policy will probably find expression during the debate on the King's speech in the next few days. The Conservatives have already made it clear that they intend to attack the government for its Palestine policy and should any considerable number of government supporters back them a position of some delicacy might arise.

John Scurr, Labor M.P. for Mile End, Whitechapel, today declared that he was not in agreement with the policy as announced by the Colonial Office with regard to Palestine. "I think it does not carry out the terms of the Mandate nor is it in accordance with the Balfour Declaration, and I will take the earliest opportunity of raising the question in the House of Commons," he said.

16 Arrested in Demonstration Before British Embassy, Warsaw, Against British White Paper

Warsaw, Oct. 24—Sixteen youthful Zionists were arrested here yesterday following a renewal of the anti-British demonstrations in front of the offices of the British embassy and consulate. The demonstrations were a protest against the new British policy in Palestine.

The British embassy addressed itself to the Polish authorities for protection from further demonstrations. The Polish government has permitted the Jews to organize a huge protest meeting against England on condition that no street demonstrations should follow this meeting, which will be held Saturday night.

Renew Anti-British Demonstrations

Warsaw, Oct. 23—Windows were smashed yesterday in the building of the British consulate today as a result of renewed anti-British demonstrations organized by the 'He'Chalutz, Zionist pioneer youth organization, in protest against the British statement of policy on Palestine.

The demonstrations took place in front of the British embassy and the British consulate. Strong police detachments guarded the buildings and prevented the demonstrators from entering.

In the afternoon a second demonstration took place outside the consulate building under the auspices of the Zionist Labor Party. Poale Zion, shouting, "down with the British government," the demonstrators hurled stones at the consulate building but were dispersed by reinforced police patrols. As they were scattered by the police the demonstrators sang Hatikvah, the Jewish national song.

As a result of the demonstration four Jews were arrested. The building of the British embassy and consulate is now under police guard.

Meanwhile a special meeting of the Agudath Israel, Orthodox Organization, adopted a protest resolution against "the inadmissible British injustice." Similar resolutions were also adopted at a number of Jewish protest meetings held simultaneously throughout the country.

Says Palestine Situation Sounder Than That of Other Countries

Tel Aviv, Oct. 24—The economic condition of Palestine is not merely better but also stronger and sounder than that of many European countries and of the United States, Sigfried Hoofien, manager of the Anglo-Palestine Company and president of the Jaffa Chamber of Commerce told representatives of credit institutions, industrialists and municipal officials today.

Stressing the fact that today's meeting was arranged before the government's statement on policy was published, Mr. Hoofien said that the latest political events would undoubtedly influence all phases of life but it was premature as yet to discuss their influence on economic life.

Zionist Leaders in All British Dominions, Denounce British Policy; Protest Meetings Held in Paris, Others to Be Held in Australia and South Africa

Paris, Oct. 24—Two simultaneous Zionist protest meetings against the new British policy in Palestine were held here last night, one by the General Zionists and the other by the Revisionists. At the first meeting the speakers were Hillel Zlatopolsky, and Isaac Naiditch while the speakers at the Revisionist meeting were Rabbi Eisenstadt and Dr. Tiomkin.

The General Zionists protested against the British breach of the Mandate policy and voiced confidence in Dr. Chaim Weizmann. The Revisionists demanded that their leader, Vladimir Jabotinsky be made chairman of the Zionist Executive whose policies they sharply condemned.

Dominion Zionist Leaders Protest

London, Oct. 24—Zionist leaders in all the British dominions have announced their opposition to the British government's statement of policy on Palestine, according to reports reaching the London office of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

Melbourne, Oct. 24—The Australian Zionist Federation today cabled James H. Scullin, Australian premier, now in London for the Imperial Conference, asking him to convey to the British government the resolution of protest adopted last night by the Australian Zionists.

The resolution declares that "as loyal citizens of the British Empire we deeply deplore the changed attitude of the British government towards the establishment of the Jewish National Home in Palestine. We regard the government's White Paper as a violation in letter and spirit of the Balfour Declaration and a breach of the repeated pledges made by successive British governments and endorsed by all British political parties."

Large mass meetings of protest are planned throughout the country for Sunday night.

Call Protest to Premier

Auckland, N. Z., Oct. 24—A cable signed by Alfred Nathan and Rabbi S. A. Goldstein was sent today to Premier Forbes in London on behalf of the Jews of New Zealand protesting against the British government's White Paper on Palestine. The cable says that the government's new policy marks a changed attitude by Great Britain and a violation of the pledges by British statesmen and by the late John Massey and Sir Joseph Ward, former premiers of New Zealand.

The cable asks Premier Forbes to convey the protest to Premier MacDonald and Lord Passfield.

Denounce British Plan

Johannesburg, Oct. 24—The president of the South African Zionist Federa-

tion today issued a statement saying that the executive of the Federation in expressing the sentiments of South African Jewry is at one with world Jewry in denouncing the Palestine policy of the British government as expressed in the latest White Paper. The South African Zionists term the government's new policy a "deliberate reversal of the Balfour Declaration and a betrayal of the Jewish people."

The Jews of Witwatersrand have convened a mass meeting for Sunday to consider the statement of the British government.

Falastin Urges Arabs to Accept Council Planned by Britain

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Oct. 24—The Arab paper Falastin urges the Arabs to cooperate with the government and accept the legislative council which will be established despite the decision of the Jews not to participate in it since the government is determined to override all opposition.

Although the legislative council now proposed is practically no different from that offered in 1922 and which was rejected by the Arabs at that time, the Falastin argues that there is no reason for the Arabs to abstain now as the British point of view has been so radically altered in favor of the Arabs and because it is unlikely that the British members to be appointed to the council by the High Commissioner will be pro-Jewish.

The Falastin gloats at the discomfiture of the Zionists in finding nothing but the name left of the Balfour Declaration. The Arab organ sees in the new government policy a glorious triumph for the Arabs in that it contains not a single favorable word for the Jews.

Aljamea Al Arabia, the organ of the Grand Mufti's party, on the other hand, does not regard the Jewish defeat as necessarily an Arab triumph. The paper points out that the new policy does not satisfy all of the Arab aspirations and merely undertakes to rectify "some wrongs inflicted on the Arabs since the British occupation."

Brith Sholom Asks Protest Meetings on British Statement

Philadelphia, Oct. 24—A call to all constituent lodges of the Independent Order B'rith Sholom to arrange protest meetings in their respective communities in connection with the new British policy on Palestine was issued this morning by Judge William M. Lewis, grand master.

The grand lodge is taking the initiative in arranging a city-wide mass meeting here November 2. The conference of all B'rith Sholom lodges in New Jersey will take place Sunday in Newark and a similar conference will be held in New York at the Hotel McAlpin, Sunday evening.

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**Imperial Politics Responsible
For British Palestine Plan
Say Varied German Papers**
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Oct. 24—Imperial politics are held responsible for the British government's new statement of policy on Palestine by two such widely-differing papers as the Frankfurter Zeitung and the Berlin Vorwaerts, the central organ of the German Socialists.

The Vorwaerts points out that the British policy in Palestine is influenced by Arab agitation in the East as well as by the colonial psychology of the British officials. "Although Lord Passfield and Arthur Henderson, foreign secretary, are friendly to the Jewish work in Palestine nevertheless the influence of bureaucracy should not be underestimated," the Vorwaerts says.

The Frankfurter Zeitung, opposed to the Zionist ideology finds Dr. Weizmann's protest and the disappointment of the Zionists justified because the White Paper "forgetting the Jewish people, speaks of Arab and Jewish inhabitants in Palestine. England was never enthusiastic for the Jewish National Home, and at times even cold, showing distinctly that it was conducting politics."

The Frankfurter Zeitung declares that England needs the Zionists for bringing in American money, but "it retreats when confronted by difficulties from other parts. The British government cannot afford to annul the Balfour Declaration therefore it is aiming to make it least effective."

**Roumanian Z. O. Leaders Back
Fight on British Statement**
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Oct. 24—Roumanian Zionists leaders today cabled the Zionist Executive in London that Roumanian Jewry was solidly behind the fight against the British government and that it would not "renounce the ideal which has inspired Jewry for the last two thousand years."

**Weizmann Denies Passfield
Offered Round-Table Parley
With Arabs; \$25,000 Raised**
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Oct. 24—Dr. Chaim Weizmann, who resigned this week as president of the Jewish Agency for Palestine and as president of the World Zionist Organization as a protest against the Palestine policy announced this week by the government of Great Britain, today authorized the Jewish Telegraphic Agency to deny emphatically the rumors that Lord Passfield, British Colonial Secretary, suggested yesterday to Weizmann that a round table conference of Jews and Arabs be called, in which Weizmann allegedly declined to participate.

These rumors are entirely baseless, Dr. Weizmann said. No such suggestion was received by him, but on the contrary the Zionist executive made such a suggestion on September 19, which the government rejected.

The rumors which Dr. Weizmann denied were spread today in Poland through the official Polish Telegraphic Agency from their London correspondent. The same rumors tending to discredit the Zionists and to create an impression that they are unwilling to negotiate, were also circulated in the London press.

Twenty-five thousand dollars were raised tonight at a private meeting of Zionists which took place in the Piccadilly Hotel. The meeting was addressed by Dr. Chaim Weizmann, Mr. d'Avigdor Goldsmid, president of the Board of Deputies of British Jews and Harry Sacher, former member of the World Zionist Executive. The speakers emphasized the importance of continuing to support the Zionist fund Keren Hayesod in order to show the determination of the Jewish people to carry on the work in Palestine.

The speakers also pointed out that the Zionists here were determined to increase within the next week the amount raised to seventy-five thousand dollars. A resolution which was adopted at the meeting protested against "the betrayal of promises given to the Jewish people in the Balfour Declaration and the Palestine Mandate" and appealed to the Jews to strengthen the hands of the Palestine pioneers.

**London Mail Attacks Baldwin,
Amery, for "Reckless Letter"**

London, Oct. 24—The notoriously anti-Zionist Daily Mail today sharply attacks former Premier Stanley Baldwin and former colonial secretary Leopold Amery for their "reckless letter" in yesterday's Times "denouncing the government for its one sensible act in recent months and for professing that the abandonment of the Balfour Declaration is contrary to the intention of the Mandate."

Millions of British money has been spent in an effort to uphold the Balfour Declaration, the Daily Mail says, "the only result being to damage the prestige of the British nation throughout the world. The foolish experiment of forcing Zionist predominance on the people of Palestine has got to stop now."

**Weizmann Urges Jews to Display
Courage, Predicts Great Britain
Will Alter Palestine Policy**
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Oct. 24—Sooner or later the British statement of policy in Palestine will be rectified in accordance with the true traditions of the British Empire, Dr. Chaim Weizmann, former president of the World Zionist Organization and of the Jewish Agency, who resigned both offices Tuesday as a protest against the government's statement, declared today in a statement urging the Jews to show the world that in building their national home they have the same courage which enabled other peoples to overcome obstacles as they have arisen.

In an appeal for the Jewish National Fund, whose methods of land purchases were sharply criticized in the Simpson report, Dr. Weizmann pointed out that the government has not definitely prohibited the purchase of land but has merely revealed its intention of sterilizing "our work by administrative action and by placing obstacles in the way of every legitimate effort we make. But they are only obstacles and as such can be overcome by Jewish endeavors."

"There are 150,000 dunams of land held in reserve by the Jewish National Fund, according to Sir John Simpson but most of this land is not yet fully paid for and on some of it only an option has been taken. To complete the purchase and to put the land into condition for starting to colonize it require very large sums of money. There is no intention to interfere with the consummation of these transactions, which whatever may happen are the first steps in further progress," Dr. Weizmann said.

He urged the Jews to strengthen the Jewish National Fund for by so doing they will show their "conviction in the justice of our cause and justice will win through." Speaking of the government statement, Dr. Weizmann defined it as an unfortunate document "more unfortunate in impression than in actual wording and giving an undeserved blow to the establishment of the Jewish National Home. The whole spirit of the statement is contrary to the true traditions of the British Empire," Dr. Weizmann asserted, adding that he believed that sooner or later it would be rectified in accordance with these traditions.

**16th Hadassah Convention
Opens in Buffalo**

Buffalo, Oct. 24—The 16th annual convention of Hadassah opens here Sunday morning and will remain in session until Tuesday. Among the important problems to be taken up are the clarification of Hadassah's connection with the Zionist Organization of America and its relations with the Women's International Zionist Organization.

Among the speakers at the convention will be Miss Henrietta Szold who has come from Palestine to attend, Robert Szold, Mrs. Edward Jacobs and Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver.

Says British Palestine Plan Question for League; Whole Mandate System Involved

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Paris, Oct. 24—A suggestion that Great Britain's new Palestine policy be brought up before the International Court at the Hague since the conflict is not between the Zionist Organization and the British government but involves the entire Mandates question was made here today by Senator Justin Godard, former member of the French cabinet and now president of the French-Palestine Committee.

Senator Godard pointed out that the entire Mandates question was involved because the other powers that signed the San Remo agreement allocating Mandates in 1920 are interested. The French statesman charged that England is taking its "revenge for the blame inflicted upon her by the League of Nations."

"Britain now disavows the Balfour Declaration which is perhaps one of the noblest pages of its history and is trying to disclaim its obligations under the Mandate. The conflict which occurred in connection with last year's outrages was not between the Zionist Organization and Great Britain but between the League of Nations and the signatories to the San Remo agreement which necessitates, upon the violation of a Mandate, bringing the matter up before the International Court at the Hague."

"I had the opportunity to see for myself the Jewish work in Palestine and it is a painful irony to see the Labor Government stand against the most prodigious effort of a modern state to return to the land from which it was turned away by the force of persecutions. It is not a question of the Zionist Organization but entirely a matter of the Mandate," he said.

World Zionist Actions Committee to Meet Nov. 4

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Oct. 24—An emergency meeting of the World Zionist Actions Committee to be held November 4, in London, to deal with the crisis in the Zionist movement created as a result of the government's statement of policy in Palestine, was decided upon today by the World Zionist Executive, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency was informed.

The decision took the form of a resolution after the Executive had been in communication with Leo Motzkin, Chairman of the Committee, who is on the continent. Mr. Motzkin will leave for London at once. It is possible that if the special session of the Actions Committee is well attended the World Zionist Congress, now tentatively scheduled for some time in February, will be postponed to a later date in view of the opposition from various quarters to a Congress for fear that it will interfere with the work of the Keren Hayesod, the chief financial instrumentality of the Jewish Agency, through a mid-Winter campaign.

Orthodox Jews Urged to Redouble Efforts in Palestine

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Oct. 24—Calling on the Orthodox Jews of the world for renewed efforts on behalf of the Jewish National Home, the Mizrahi, Orthodox Zionist party, today issued a declaration rejecting the British statement of policy. The Mizrahi declared that "Jews, true to their past, reject evil edicts calculated to paralyze the efforts of the Jewish people to reestablish the land of their ancestors."

The Mizrahi announce to the world that "Zionists linked with the tradition of their ancestors are full aware that the fate of Zionism is not determined by a transitory government. The Jewish community must firmly unite and eliminate all internal differences, strengthen the Jewish efforts in all parts of the country, solidify industry and Jewish production, redouble energies for reconstruction and summon world Jewry to come and build."

Plan J. N. F. Mass Campaign as Reply to Simpson Report

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Oct. 24—A mass campaign on behalf of the Jewish National Fund is announced for November 2 by the Jewish National Council as a reply to the attack on the Fund in the report of Sir John Hope Simpson and which is echoed in the British statement of Palestine. The Jewish National Council summons the Jews throughout the world to double their gifts to the fund "that redeems the land of Israel as the eternal possession of the people of Israel."

The Council calls on the Jews of the world to respond in a practical way to the attack "levelled against the most precious and the most popular institution of our people. The fund that redeems the land of our fathers is founded on righteousness and its activities on justice. The foundations of this national institution that serves as a central land organ of a nation are bound by countless bonds with the hearts of the masses of Israel in all countries of the dispersion and no power in the world can uproot them."

Jewish Artist's Work Wins Mention at Carnegie Exhibit

Pittsburgh, Oct. 24—Maurice Sterne, nationally famous artist of New York City, who had entered three of his works in the 29th annual International Exhibition of Modern Painting, was awarded second honorable mention for his canvass, "High School Girl." Sterne won this honor from a field of 236 artists from the United States and Europe who had submitted a total of 437 paintings which were shown at the Carnegie Institute galleries.

The Albert C. Lehman \$2,000 prize, with purchase rights up to \$10,000, went to the second prize winner, Alexander Brook, an American, for his painting, "Interior." Bernard Karfiol was a member of the International Jury of Awards, as well as a member of the American Committee of Selection.

Mathieu Dreyfus, Chief Aid of Brother in Dreyfus Case, Dead in Paris at 73

Paris, Oct. 24—Having attained the age of seventy-three, in spite of the tremendous nervous strain of a ten-year period in which he was one of the chief actors in a drama that absorbed the attention of the entire world, Mathieu Dreyfus died in Paris yesterday. It was Mathieu Dreyfus who pressed the struggle against powerful French military officials who had "railroaded" his brother, Captain Alfred Dreyfus to conviction under the charges of having sold French army secrets to a German military chief.

Largely through the efforts of Mathieu Dreyfus, who devoted all of his energy and his entire fortune to the battle, the greatest minds of Europe were enlisted on the side of the Jew Dreyfus, and documents were uncovered proving the entire case to have been "framed" by a Jew-hater who had himself sold the documents to Germany. Emile Zola, the great French novelist, and many other noted writers and lawyers of the time rose to world fame through their participation in the Dreyfus Case. In 1894, the sentence against Dreyfus was reversed, and he was eventually entirely cleared of dishonesty.

Protestant, Catholic, Jew, Urge Better Understanding

Uniting in a plea for better understanding between Christian and Jew in America, the Rev. Dr. Henry Howard, of the Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church, representing the Protestants; Father Francis P. Duffy, of the Holy Cross Rectory, representing the Catholics; and the Rev. Nathan Krass, rabbi of Temple Emanu-El, representing the Jews, urged Friday night over Radio Station WMCA that America set an example for the elimination of inter-religious and inter-racial prejudices for the rest of the nations of the world. The occasion was the celebration by the American Hebrew of the tenth anniversary of the launching of the movement for better understanding between Christians and Jews in America.

Cooperating in the musical program, under the direction of Lazare Saminsky, the conductor of the Temple Emanu-El choir, the three faiths participated through representatives of the choirs of three of the leading churches in New York City—Carlton Boxill of the Riverside Church; Lucien Rutman of Temple Emanu-El; Antonio Augenti of the Church of St. Gille, the Baptist. Joseph Yasser, organist of Congregation Rodeph Shalom, was the accompanist.

At the conclusion of the broadcasting Rabbi Landman, who presided, announced a series of seminars on better understanding to be held at Colleges and Universities, including New York University, during the coming winter, and that balloting is now progressing for the annual award of the American Hebrew Medal for the Promotion of Better Understanding between Christian and Jew in America, which is to be awarded for the first time on Nov. 21.

Stimson Refuses Comment on British - Palestine Policy

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Washington, D. C., Oct. 24—Secretary of State Stimson, at his conference with press correspondents, today declined to make any statement regarding the British-Palestine situation, when an inquiry regarding the subject was directed to him by one of the correspondents. He indicated that he did not wish to make any statement because he was not sufficiently informed regarding the situation, as he had not had the occasion recently to study it.

At the same time the Jewish Telegraphic Agency correspondent learns that when inquiries were made in other quarters of an official character ordinarily conversant with the State Department's attitude in this connection but whose opinion is less authoritative than that of Henry L. Stimson it was indicated in those quarters that the State Department is disposed to pursue a "hands-off" policy, and that present indications would not seem to call for any stand by the State Department.

The refusal, however, of the Secretary of State to comment on the situation is interpreted as meaning that the last mentioned view is not necessarily the policy to be ultimately adopted by the Department, for in the final analysis this policy will be decided by Secretary of State Stimson and President Hoover, probably after consultation with the entire cabinet, in such an important question.

Mr. Stimson's unwillingness to make any statement today may be regarded as a favorable omen for the present, at least, of his favoring the Jewish side. There is no question that in addition to the official pro-Zionist policy, the American Government, as controlled by the Congress resolution in 1922, and several warm pronouncements by President Hoover, would be extremely unlikely to adopt an attitude which would be unsympathetic to the Jews, in view of the fact of the large Jewish voting population, and the fall elections impending in a strenuous campaign, where the Republican administration is under constant attack.

Anti-Semitic Priests Declared Inane by Sighet Court

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Oct. 24—The court at Sighet today declared that the anti-Semitic priests, Fathers Dimitrescu and Berinde had suddenly gone insane. The court said they would be transferred to an asylum, according to newspaper reports. The priests were among the 85 persons awaiting trial for participating in the anti-Semitic disorders in Marmoreash and Borscha.

The Curial Israelite termed the court's decision a maneuver to postpone the trial and asks why the priests were not found insane before. The paper adds that the action of the court probably means that the 18 Jews of Marmoreash also under arrest will be held responsible for the disturbances.

Failure to Merge N. Y.-Brooklyn Jewish Charities Announced

Failure to merge the Brooklyn Federation of Jewish Charities with the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies of New York City, which embraces Manhattan and the Bronx, was announced after a final joint meeting of committees representing the two organizations on Thursday night. A gift of one million dollars for Jewish charities of Greater New York was offered a year ago by Ralph Jonas, provided the two Federations would merge.

No statements were forthcoming from the members of the two committees explaining the reason for the failure of the merger. The committee members representing the New York Federation, whose president is Dudley D. Sicher, were former Justice Joseph M. Proskauer; Leo Arnshein, first vice-president of Mt. Sinai Hospital; Dr. Harry G. Friedman, chairman of the distribution committee of the New York Federation, and Felix M. Warburg, chairman of the board and first president of the New York Federation. The committee members representing the Brooklyn Federation, whose president is Nathan D. Shapiro, were Justice Edward Lazansky; Nathan S. Jonas, founder and first president of the Brooklyn Federation; Justice Mitchell May, former president of the Brooklyn Federation; Benjamin H. Namm, former president of the Brooklyn Federation, and Walter N. Rothschild, first vice-president of the Brooklyn Federation.

When the merger was voted by both bodies last December it was agreed that Brooklyn has as many Jews as Manhattan and the Bronx together, but that while the Brooklyn Federation had during the past year been able to raise only about three-quarters of a million dollars, the New York Federation had during the same period raised nearly five million dollars.

It was also pointed out that the merger was necessary because the Jewish working population had during the past few years moved to Brooklyn in large numbers, while most of the wealthy Jews who could contribute to their relief as well as their employment had remained outside of Brooklyn. It was also pointed out that many of the contributors in Manhattan and the Bronx were under the impression that Brooklyn was also included in the New York Federation appeals.

Detroit Zionists to Mark Jabotinsky's 50th Birthday

Detroit, Oct. 24—The fiftieth birthday of Vladimir Jabotinsky, world leader of the Zionist Revisionist party, will be celebrated by Detroit Zionists at a public meeting at the Philadelphia-Byron Talmud Torah on Sunday evening, Oct. 26. The meeting is being arranged by the Detroit Zionist-Revisionist group, and speakers on the program will include spokesmen for the Zionist District of Detroit, Hadassah, Mizrahi and the Jewish Legionnaires.

Jewish Branch of Anti-Semitic Heimwehr Creates Sensation

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Oct. 24—The organization of a Jewish branch of the Heimwehr, Austria's nationalist private militia which is headed by Prince Ernest von Starheimberg, minister of the interior has created a sensation throughout Austria. The Heimwehr leaders and the rank and file of its members are largely anti-Semitic.

Chancellor Vaugoin, in receiving Leo Berger, president of the Jewish section of the Heimwehr, praised the organization for its patriotism and expressed the hope that Austrian Jews will lend full support to the government in its endeavors to obtain foreign credits and in its fight against unemployment. The Jewish section of the Heimwehr has made public plans for a mass meeting to be held under its auspices to organize Austrian Jewry to fight the Social Democrats who are opposed by the Jewish and Christian Heimwehrs.

Meanwhile the clash between the Christian Socialist and National Socialist elements in the Heimwehr is growing because of the National Socialists' affiliation with Adolf Hitler. Austrian Catholics were warned today against Hitlerism in a pastoral letter from church officials.

The National Socialists and Christian Socialists in the Heimwehr are also at odds over whether Jews who have been converted to Christianity should still be considered as Jews or whether they should be regarded as "one-hundred per cent German Christians." The National Socialists argue that once a Jew always a Jew, while the Christian Socialists are willing to accept the converts.

Agudah Joins Ban on Proposed Legislative Council

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Oct. 24—The united Jewish front against participating in the proposed legislative council for Palestine as proposed by the new statement of British policy will not be broken by the Agudat Israel, Orthodox organization, which is not affiliated with the Jewish Agency. Rabbi Blau, Agudat leader, today said that while the Palestine council of the Agudat has not yet acted he is certain that Orthodox Jewry will stand with the rest of the Jewish community.

This unanimity is expected despite the anger of the Orthodox leaders over the football game played here last Saturday by Jewish teams. Pinchas Rutenberg, chairman of the Jewish National Council, invited the heads of the sports organizations to a conference at which he appealed to them to discontinue their Saturday matches in order not to anger the extreme Orthodox leaders.

Quebec Grants \$300,000 to Montreal Jewish Hospital

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Montreal, Oct. 24—The Quebec provincial government today passed an order in council granting \$300,000 to the local Jewish hospital. This amount was promised last year during the campaign to raise funds for the first Jewish hospital in Montreal which is to be built soon.

Jewish and Non-Jewish Public Opinion in America Crystallized Against British Government for Statement on Palestine Policy

of the causes of its downfall was widely uttered. Senator Royal S. Copeland, addressing the Jewish people, wired, "Of course I am indignant over this narrow and uncalled for restraint upon the very people who should have first call upon Palestine. It is a short-sighted policy and violated the natural proper racial ambitions of an ancient people as well as the solemn mandates given by the British. It will react upon the English government."

Dr. James G. Heller of Cincinnati, addressing the opening of the Allied Jewish Campaign in Uniontown, Pa., was more explicit in his statement of that point of view. "It is my hope that the British people will repudiate the Labor Government," he said. "The truth is that the Labor Party consists of a band of recreant and renegade idealists whom power has prostituted, men who have forgotten their own words in the desire to hold on to office. We must look for our friends elsewhere." The Uniontown meeting unanimously adopted and forwarded to Secretary of State Stimson a strong resolution protesting the Palestine policy of the British government. Mr. Stimson was requested to transmit the resolution to the British ambassador at Washington and to the British government.

Appeal to Allenby

Appealing directly to their general for protection, the five thousand Jewish soldiers who left America to join the Jewish Legion under England's banner wired to Viscount Field Marshall Allenby today, saying, "We were told that we were going to redeem the National Home for the Jewish people. We were promised that upon demobilization we would be given land for colonization on the soil of our forefathers. A special ordinance to that effect was issued by the British Expeditionary Forces in 1919. And now all the solemn promises made to the Jewish people have been faithfully broken."

"Thirteen years ago we stood on the battlefields of Palestine under your leadership, prepared to sacrifice our lives for the redemption of the Holy Land. In those days we learned to look up to you for your integrity and your high sense of honor. In this hour of crisis your soldiers appeal to you to prevail upon your fellow British citizens to resist this latest attempt to impugn British honor and to discredit the British sense of fair play and justice."

American Press Sympathetic

The American press, through its editorials today, showed itself as continually sympathetic to the Jewish cause, though recognizing of the difficulty of the situation from the English point of view. The Cleveland Press said, "In the Middle Ages, when the Black Plague swept over Europe, people looked around for a scapegoat to blame the disaster on. They blamed it on the Jews. Today Europe, in the midst of a severe economic crisis, is again looking for a scapegoat. Anti-Semitism is rife everywhere, particularly in Poland and Rumania.

Jewish leaders say that there are 2,000,000 Jews on the verge of starvation in Poland.

"In 1905 at the time of the terrible pogroms in Russia, the United States was a haven of refuge for Jews. Today, immigration restrictions drastically restrict their entrance here. There has been no place for them to turn but to Palestine.

"And now comes the 'White Paper' formulating a permanent policy of limiting immigration into Palestine. The millions of oppressed Jews in Europe now have nowhere to turn. Their plight is indeed a serious one."

Non-Zionist May Sympathize

The Baltimore Sun said, "The non-Zionist and the non-Moslem observer will tend to sympathize with, if not necessarily approve, the present British position. Economically, to be sure, the Zionists have the better argument. Historically, perhaps, the Arabs possess the edge in the controversy, though there is no evidence that anything the Jews have done to consolidate their position justifies such ferocity and malice and suspicion as the Arabs have exhibited. Politically, it is difficult to see how the British could do much better, though it is likely that some improvement might be made in the selection of certain officials under the Mandate.

"To the leaders of a nationalist group which has made a promising beginning for a new civilization, holding on against frightful odds and in the face of the menace of savage reprisal from jealous and ferocious primitives, the neutral attitude of the government whose solemn pledge is responsible for the achievements so far made and for great hopes of the future must be completely incomprehensible."

School System Loses Nearly \$500,000 by Jewish Holidays

A loss of nearly a half-million dollars to the New York City school system from the state appropriation for the year 1930-31 because of increased absences for Jewish holidays is expected by officials of the Board of Education, according to a statement by Dr. William J. O'Shea, New York City Superintendent of Schools. Nevertheless, Dr. O'Shea said, everyone should observe the holidays of his religion.

The appropriation made by the state for schools is based on the per capita student attendance. Nearly all Jewish pupils in the New York City schools are absent on Rosh Hashanah, Yom Yippur and the first and last days of Passover, while only the children of very Orthodox families are absent on the other Jewish holidays.

"The schools should endeavor to eliminate unnecessary absence, but should not attempt to reduce absence that is justifiable in every respect," declared Dr. O'Shea.

Says American Zionists to Invoke Aid of U. S. in Protest Against British White Paper

President Coolidge on March 2, 1925. The President officially 'proclaimed' the Convention in December, 1925.

"The purpose of our Palestinian treaty with Great Britain was not only to assure the United States every right in mandated territory that the World War conquerors of Germany and her allies acquired, but particularly to give effect to the resolution of Congress with reference to Palestine. In 1922 the Senate and the House of Representatives enacted a joint resolution reading, 'That the United States of America favors the establishment in Palestine of a National Home for the Jewish People, being clearly understood that nothing shall be done which may prejudice civil and religious rights, Christian and all other non-Jewish communities in Palestine, and that holy places and religious sites in Palestine shall be adequately protected'.

"Initiated by George Harvey, the American Ambassador in London, and by the Earl of Curzon, British Foreign Secretary, negotiations for the American-British Palestine Convention were carried on for more than two years. It appears to have been first suggested from the British side that the treaty should contain 'a specific allusion to the policy of establishing a National Home for the Jewish people'.

Zionist Plans

"The Zionist plans to seek American official support in protest against the British Palestinian program are of special importance because of the suggestions just put forward in London as to the future of the World Zionist Organization. Dr. Chaim Weizmann, who has resigned from the organization's presidency, mentions that its headquarters may be transferred to the United States, and that Justice Louis D. Brandeis, of the United States Supreme Court, would be a logical head of the Zionist forces henceforward."

After referring to the fact that Felix M. Warburg and Justice Louis D. Brandeis are the largest industrial American investors in Palestine, Mr. Wile states that American financial interests in Palestine far outstrip those originating in any other country and that hundreds of American citizens of Jewish origin are settled there and are rendering yeoman service in economic, financial, agricultural, engineering and cultural developments.

At far as American Zionists are concerned, Mr. Wile continues to say, they are far from being disposed to throw up the sponge because "of a cruel betrayal in trusteeship" for, according to types such as Mr. Warburg and Justice Brandeis, who are so enthusiastic over progress already achieved and so confident that the future of Palestine holds even more of promise for world Jewry, they seem to feel the hour, however black it may seem at the moment, as one for renewed hope and effort, and not discouragement or despair.

Over \$300,000 Pledged to Boston Jewish Charities at Banquet; Ratschky Gives \$30,000

Boston, Oct. 24. — Over \$300,000 was subscribed for the \$750,000 campaign of the Associated Jewish Philanthropies of Boston at its annual banquet here last night at the Copley Plaza. Six hundred men and women communal leaders signified by their presence their recognition of the dire needs of the poor, sick, hungry, aged and orphaned.

Heading the list with a contribution of \$30,000 was the minister to Czechoslovakia, H. P. Ratschky, who returned from Washington expressly to attend the banquet. Almost equalling this was the \$27,500 contributed by Louis Kirstein, president of the Boston organization. An anonymous contribution of \$65,000 was offered on condition that the entire campaign quota be filled during the present drive. One thousand men and six hundred women have been mobilized for one week's intensive effort to fill the quota.

Several large subscriptions were received from non-Jews, among them being the offerings of General Edward Logan and of the President of the Federal National Bank.

Max Shulman was cheered for his contribution of \$7,500.

Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver received a great ovation for his eloquent plea for the community to answer the cries of the needy when he said, "If the forces of capital do not voluntarily take over the burdens of the crushed, then the forces remain calculating and hoarding and deserve to be destroyed."

A prediction of a return of prosperity was made by Lessing Rosenwald, son of Julius Rosenwald, and president of the Philadelphia Federation, who said, "The financial depression is no reason for holding back donations. Other cities throughout the country will be influenced by Boston's generosity. A cycle of prosperity is not far away."

Jewish Education Association Starts Drive for \$50,000

A drive for \$50,000 to carry on the work of the Jewish Education Association was begun on Wednesday night at a reception held at the Hotel Commodore. According to Jonah J. Goldstein, chairman of the finance committee of the Jewish Education Association, this additional sum is needed to carry on the work of the organization. It is expected that the \$50,000 will be raised through the sale of 1,000 scholarships at a minimum of \$50 each.

The reception at the Commodore was held in honor of four members recently elected to the executive committee of the organization.

gether with the late Lord Balfour and Lloyd George wrote a letter to the London Times last December urging a new commission to investigate the whole working of the Palestine Mandate and to carry out a searching inquiry into the major question of the policy and administration of the Mandate.

Deeply Perturbed

General Smuts, in his cable to Premier MacDonald, declared that "as one of those who was responsible for the Balfour Declaration I feel deeply perturbed over the present Palestine policy. The government statement marks a retreat from that Declaration which was a definite promise to the Jews of the world that the policy of the Jewish National Home would be actively prosecuted and its intention was to obtain the powerful Jewish influence for the Allied cause at the darkest hour of the War.

"As such it was approved by the United States government and the other Allies and accepted in good faith by the Jews. It cannot now be varied unilaterally by the British government. It represents a debt of honor which must be discharged in full at all cost. The circumstances of the original Declaration were far too solemn to permit any wavering now. I most strongly urge the government to issue a statement that the terms of the Balfour Declaration be fully carried out in good faith and the government's Palestine policy be recast accordingly," General Smuts declared.

\$134,000 Raised for Jewish Welfare Fund, Cincinnati

Cincinnati, Oct. 24. — Excellent response from non-Jews as well as Jews to the campaign of the Jewish Welfare Fund was reported at a meeting at the Sinton hotel here tonight as former Mayor Murray Seasongood counted \$134,000 already raised toward the \$190,000 goal. As chairman of the campaign Mr. Seasongood, upon the request of the team captains, extended the time limit one week so that the complete sum may be attained.

"Considering the present economic conditions, this is a remarkable response," he said. "It should help to keep Cincinnati before the nation as a leader in Jewish affairs."

Among the non-Jewish subscribers were Mrs. Charles P. Taft with \$5,000, Mayor Russel Wilson with \$100, and Myers V. Cooper with \$50.

"White and colored, Catholic and Protestant are sympathetic to this cause," said William H. Shroder, executive vice-chairman. "With that sort of spirit we have a right to expect every Jew who can contribute to help us attain our goal."

of the actual wording, by the representatives of all the Allied and associated countries including America, and of our dominion premiers."

Revokes Part of Pledge

The Liberal leader charged that the present British government has issued a statement which in substance is a revocation of a good part of "a solemn pledge given at a most solemn moment" and this without consulting the United States, France, Belgium or the British dominions. "We shall not reconcile the Arabs but we shall alienate an even more powerful race, and what is more, British honor will be tarnished," he said, adding that "we shall be held up throughout the world as 'perfidious Albion'."

Saying that he could understand those who wanted Britain "to scuttle out of Palestine altogether," Lloyd George stated that the "majority of the people of this country are not scuttlers whether in India or Palestine, and they mean to stand up for their responsibilities and pledges of the Empire in both. I earnestly hope that the government will reconsider its attitude. I can hardly think they have given full consideration to its implications."

"I am all in favor of treating both races upon a basis of equality but there is no injustice to the Arabs involved in the policy adopted by the Allies. It is not a question of expropriating the Arabs. No Arab has yet been forcibly expropriated. No Arabs have been bought out of land which they have been adequately cultivating but surely the Jews cannot be excluded from settling down in the land of their ancestors."

"We must never forget that the glory of Palestine is Jewish and that therefore that great race has a special interest in developing and restoring the prosperity of the land which once upon a time flowed with milk and honey," Lloyd George concluded.
