1,500 Certificates for Jewish Immigration to Palestine Be Issued By Commissioner

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Nov. 8.—The Colonial Office today officially announced that the British government had authorized Sir John Chancellor, High Commissioner of Palestine, to issue 1,500 certificates for Jewish immigrants under the Labor schedule. This action confirms the forecast made by Col. Frederick Kisch at the Zionist Actions Committee meeting that 1,500 to 2,100 certificates asked for by the Jewish Agency Executive for the six month period from October 1st to March 31st would be granted.

In Jewish circles the action of the British government is interpreted first as being the first step in modification of the White Paper which has aroused such widespread resentment and criticism, and secondly as a withdrawal of the Colonial Office's order of last May suspending Jewish immigration.

The 2,300 certificates granted under the Labor schedule for the half year beginning April 1, 1930 were suspended. This aroused a tremendous protest among world Jewry. Commenting on the withdrawal of the immigration suspension the Morning Post remarks that this step of the government follows rather strangely on the White Paper but it reveals a desire to modify that document.

Renewed Anti-Semitic Troubles Reported From Roumanian Cities

Bucharest, Nov. 8.—Renewed anti-Semitic disturbances broke out in several parts of Roumania today just as the opposition parties announced that when the new elections are held they will make anti-Semitism one of the principal points in their program. Attacks on Jews took place today in a train going from Novosielcz to Czernowitz and in Jassy, the seat of the anti-Semitic student organizations.

Singing anti-Semitic songs and shouting anti-Jewish cries, a gang of Cuzists beset a number of Jewish passengers on the train bound for Czernowitz. When the Jews set up cries the hooligans shouted louder to drown out the Jews' cries. After dumping the baggage of the Jews from the train they finally pushed the Jews themselves out. Among those more seriously injured were Hirsch Rosenblatt and Moses Lichtig, both of Czernowitz.

In Jassy anti-Semitic demonstrators were routed by a detail of police after they had attacked Jewish passersby near a Liberal political meeting.

MacDonald Denies Ban On Jewish Immigration; Says Colonization Can Continue

Toronto, Nov. 8.—The British government neither intends to nor has it enacted any legislation stopping or prohibiting Jewish immigration and it expressly provides for the continuation of Jewish colonization operations in Palestine, according to a cable received here today from Premier Ramsay MacDonald. The cable, addressed to James Simpson, prominent Canadian labor leader, will be published tomorrow in the Toronto Star and the Toronto Daily Hebrew Journal.

Declaring that the protests against the British government's statement of policy in Palestine are founded on a complete misconception, Premier MacDonald says that the government "has explicitly declared its intention of executing the Mandate exactly in accordance with all of its items. It makes no change whatever in the interpretation of the Mandate as adhered to by all successive ministries since 1922."

Premier MacDonald denies that the government intends to or has already enacted any legislation aiming at the stoppage of prohibition of Jewish immigration to Palestine. On the contrary, he says that the government's new policy "expressly provides for the continuation of colonization operations without a break. It sets no limit whatever to the expansion of the Jewish National Home that in accordance with the terms of the Mandate may prove practicable. It is indeed in order to make available additional land that the government undertakes a large scheme of land development and irrigation."

Government Grants 250,000 Lei to Needy Borscha Jews

Bucharest, Nov. 8.—A decision to grant 250,000 lei for the Jews of Borscha to aid them in their agricultural work, particularly for the purchase of seeds, was made today by the Roumanian cabinet. The government had previously assigned 1,800,000 lei for the victims of the anti-Semitic fire in Borscha. The Jews of Borscha were also recently permitted to use the government timber reserves for the reconstruction of their burned homes.

While these government grants are doing something to mitigate the sufferings of the Jews of Borscha the actual compensation is only a small percent of the damage suffered. With winter coming on their situation is serious. Mayor Protopescu of the second district of Bucharest today issued an appeal to the population to help the Jews of Borscha with money and gifts of food and clothing.

Sabbath Violators, Shavers of Beards Barred From Voting in Elections of Jewish Communities

Warsaw, Nov. 8.—Jews who violate the Sabbath openly or even those who shave their beards may be deprived of the right to vote in the elections for officials of the Jewish communities or kehillahs, and consequently of the right to hold any office in the council or executive committees of the kehillahs in the various Polish cities and towns.

This possibility was discovered today in Jewish circles after a careful reading of the new government ordinance concerning the functions of the kehillahs, the election of rabbis and the methods and regulations for choosing kehillah officials. It was pointed out that if those who violate certain orthodox Jewish precepts are to be barred from participation in the work of the kehillahs, which in all other countries represent the entire Jewish community, such a situation would deprive the Polish kehillahs of any serious claim of representing the entire Jewry of their respective localities.

The new ordinance further limits those entitled to vote in kehillah elections by banning women and Jews who have publicly opposed Judaism, that is atheists and Communists.

8 Jewish Students Hurt in Vienna On Eve of Election

Vienna, Nov. 8.—As the Austrian electorate prepared to go to the polls tomorrow to elect a new parliament the calm of the campaign was broken today when eight Zionist students distributing campaign literature were attacked and injured by a group of anti-Semitic students on the campus of the University of Vienna. The Jewish students were handing out leaflets urging the voters to support Dr. Robert Stricker, a candidate for parliament on an independent Zionist list.

The Jewish students were not the only subjects of attack by the nationalist students. The latter also attacked a number of Catholics who were electioneering for their candidates.

Palestine to be Represented at International Colonial Exhibit

Paris, Nov. 8.—Palestine products, particularly those manufactured by Jews, will have a prominent place in the International Colonial Exhibition opening here next year, as a result of action taken today by the Franco-Palestine Committee and the Franco-Palestine Chamber of Commerce. The two groups in cooperation have acquired a plot on the site of the Exhibition and have started construction of a pavilion to house the Palestinian exhibits.

Liberal Party to Demand Palestine Debate During This Month in Parliament

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Nov. 8.—The Liberal Party today decided to ask for a debate on Palestine in parliament in view of the fact that the proposed Palestine discussion does not figure on the parliamentary agenda for the next few weeks as had been forecasted, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learned today. It is expected that Lloyd George, who has sharply criticized the new British policy in Palestine, will offer the motion for debate and Premier MacDonald will utilize the occasion for an explanatory statement on Palestine and will fix the date of the debate for the third or fourth week in November.

The Liberals, however, have not yet decided whether their motion will take the form of a motion on which a vote may be taken and possibly lead to the defeat of the government. Certain Liberals are anxious to avoid a vote of censure on the Palestine issue in order to allow the numerous friends of the Zionist cause in the Labor Party an opportunity of participating in the debate which, in view of party discipline, they would be unable to do if a vote was taken.

Other Liberals, on the other hand, point out that the disadvantage of a debate without a vote lies in the comparative undecisioniveness of such action, besides furnishing an opportunity for the anti-Zionist members to attack Zionism.

Harry Meyer Elected to Montana Legislature

Helena, Montana, Nov. 8.—Harry Meyer, member of a prominent Jewish family, was elected to the Montana legislature from Butte, on the Democratic ticket. In a long list of candidates for the office of representative, Mr. Meyer was second highest man.

New Law Improves Lot of 10,000 Jewish Artisans

Moscow, Nov. 8.—Ten thousand Jewish artisans will be affected by a new law adopted today to improve the position of artisans in Russia. The bill enables the children of artisans to have equal educational opportunities with workers, permits the artisans equal treatment in the allotment of dwellings, in the receipt of raw material and in industrial organization.

Judge Julian W. Mack Returning on Bremen

Federal Judge Julian W. Mack, Honorary Chairman of the Zionist Organization of America, will return to the United States on the Bremen, which is scheduled to dock at Brooklyn tomorrow. Judge Mack attended the meetings of the Zionist Actions Committee and the Jewish Agency at Berlin in September. From there he went to Palestine to study conditions at close range.

On his way back he attended the first sessions of the Zionist Actions Committee. While in Berlin and London, Judge Mack conferred with various Jewish leaders in regard to the situation that has arisen out of the issuance of the new British White Paper on Palestine. He represented the American Zionist point of view at these conferences.

Ozet Leader Urges Efforts Be Concentrated for Jewish Work In Crimea, Not in Bira Bidjan

Moscow, Nov. 8.—A demand that efforts towards improving the status of the Jews of Russia by settling them on the land and industrializing them be concentrated in Crimea and not in Bira Bidjan, Far Eastern Republic, was voiced today by J. Larin, president of the Ozet, the society for settling the Jews on the land, in a lecture at the Communist Club.

Bira Bidjan is the region where an independent Jewish republic had been planned by the Soviet government but the mismanagement of the Ozet officials entrusted with the job of developing the territory together with the unwillingness of Jews to go to Bira Bidjan brought about a change in the plans and Bira Bidjan is now being administered as an independent economic unit instead of as a Jewish Republic.

The appeal of Larin to lay stress on the work in Crimea instead of in Bira Bidjan was criticized by M. Litvakoff and other Jewish Communist leaders as weakening Jewish interest in Bira Bidjan.

Samuel Wahrhaftig Dead

Cracow, Nov. 8.—Samuel Wahrhaftig, a member of the council of the Cracow Jewish community died here today. He was 54 years old. Wahrhaftig had been prominently identified with the Zionist movement and was a well known lawyer.

Zionists to Hold Another Madison Square Garden Meet

The Zionists of New York will hold another demonstration at Madison Square Garden on Saturday evening, December 13, for the purpose of showing "Zionist sentiment and solidarity," according to an announcement issued by Bernard A. Rosenblatt, chairman of the New York Zionist Region, which is sponsoring the affair.

Coinciding with Chanukkah, the event is to be known as a Maccabean festival. Nathan Straus, the venerable philanthropist, is honorary chairman, Jonah J. Goldstein, chairman, and the other officers are Louis P. Rocker, Morris Margulies and Morris Kramer.

In a statement issued in connection with the announcement of the festival, Louis Lipsky, former president of the Zionist Organization of America, declared that the Maccabean Festival would be an appropriate occasion to evince Jewish solidarity with respect to the upbuilding of the Jewish National Home in Palestine.

Awards Made to Jews In Movie Industry

Hollywood, Nov. 8.—Jewish artists and producers were given recognition this week at the annual dinner of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences, which assembled to distribute the awards for service and to hear Will H. Hays, president of the Motion Picture Producers and Distributors of America. It is significant of the ineffective anti-Semitic campaign conducted by one Major Pease, that the trophy for the outstanding production of the year was awarded to Carl Laemmle, Sr., for "All Quiet on the Western Front."

The award for the best direction of the year went to Lewis Milestone, director of the same picture. It will be remembered that Major Pease, self-styled head of the alleged Motion Picture Technical Directors Association conducted a vicious campaign against the Russian director Eisenstein and the picture "All Quiet."

Norma Shearer, (Mrs. Irving Thalberg) was also awarded first prize as leading actress for her role in "The Divorcee," and George Arliss for his work in "Disraeli."

Bronx Y Gets New Library and Lounge

Jack Selig, president of Piser & Company and Mrs. Selig formally presented the new Selig Lounge to the Bronx Y. M. H. A. yesterday. At the same time, Mr. and Mrs. Ira J. Sobol and Mrs. Benjamin Sobol, members of the board of directors of the Bronx Association, presented the new Sobol Library to the membership.

The Hon. M. Maldwin Fertig, president of the Association; Milton Prager, president of the senior council; Dave Schwartz, president of the senior intermediate council have accepted these additions to the recreational and cultural facilities of the Bronx Y. M. H. A.

Delay in U. S. Action On Palestine Due to Cautious, Not Lack of Sympathy

Washington, Nov. 8.—The failure of the American government up to this time to make known its position on the Passfield White Paper through the State Department is not due to any lack of sympathy for the Zionist side of the present controversy with the British government in its policy of Jewish immigration and land purchase restriction, it is learned here today.

It merely represents an exercise of due care in approaching a complicated problem of international relations in which the United States government wishes first to make sure that any course decided upon will be for the best interests not only of the United States but also for the Jewish homeland in Palestine on behalf of which the United States is greatly concerned, according to information believed to correctly represent the attitude of the state department.

Responsible officials of the American government are believed to consider it premature as yet to issue a statement of the government's official attitude as to whether the American-British convention regarding the Palestine Mandate has been violated by the latest White Paper and to indicate the action contemplated therewith. The American government, however, is understood to be fully alive to its responsibilities in connection with the provisions contained in the Mandate regarding the Jewish National Home and in light of American official approval of the Jewish homeland project.

The resolution endorsing Zionism by Congress in 1922 and the declarations of approval by the last four presidents, Wilson, Harding, Coolidge and Hoover, make it a matter which the state department feels itself bound to approach with sympathy, it is understood. The state department is said to feel, however, that there are a number of elements comprising the background of the situation, which emphasize the need of extreme caution before a line of action is decided upon.

Differences of Opinion

Among these is the impression that not only is there a great difference of opinion in British public and official life, but that the Zionists themselves have had many differences on the meaning of the various papers involving the Jewish homeland, including the Balfour Declaration and the Mandate, and that there has not been a unity of opinion in the Zionist Organization as to what the establishment of the Jewish National Home in Palestine really means and what is involved in its details.

One of the main aspects of the problem calling for care by the state department before proceeding is the fact that the Labor government has been sharply criticized by leaders of the other parties, including Stanley Baldwin and Lloyd George and that the question will soon come up in parliament.

2 Groups of Roumanian Jews Here Unite for Mutual Aid

The two contending factions among Roumanian Jews in America have agreed to unite. As a result of an informal conference held recently between Messrs. Leo Wolfson, A. D. Brahm and Samuel Kanter of the United Roumanian Jews of America, and Messrs. Solomon Sufrin, Leon Fischer, Leon Kuperman and Herman Fischer of the Roumanian Jewish Committee, it was agreed that the following statement be submitted for ratification to the Executive Committee of the respective organizations:

"In view of the critical situation of our brethren in Roumania, the United Roumanian Jews of America have cordially invited the Roumanian Jewish Jewish Committee to join it, so that through a united effort the interests of the Jews in Roumania would be served effectively.

"Realizing the seriousness of the situation in Roumania, the imperative need of unity of action, and being sincerely desirous of serving the common cause, the Roumanian Jewish Committee accepts the invitation extended to it, will discontinue its activities and will lend its entire strength and resources in the effort to carry out such programs as may be formulated in a spirit of co-operation and with a view of genuine service to the Jews in Roumania.

"A number of members of the Roumanian Jewish Committee will be appointed to serve on the executive, administrative, political and organization committees of the United Roumanian Jews of America. The names of the members to be appointed will be suggested by the Committee."

In a letter which Mr. Sufrin, head of the Roumanian Jewish Committee, has written to Mr. Wolfson, president of the United Roumanian Jews, Mr. Sufrin says:

"I have helped bring about this peace resolution because I know that it is harmful and disgraceful for Roumanian-American Jews to show themselves incapable of common action. I am sure that by this peace we will be able to show more strength, more energy and more resourcefulness. After all, we are the ones truly interested in the Roumanian Jewish question."

Youthful Jewish Musicians Invest Photography Process

Leo Godowsky, Jr., and Leopold Mannes, both musicians in their own rights, and both sons of well-known musicians, who have dabbled in amateur photography since they were 15-year old schoolboys, are now invited by the Eastman Kodak Company to develop their color photography process at the laboratory in Rochester, N. Y.

Though the process is still in its experimental stage, the young inventors hope to develop it whereby color photography will be as simple as black and white photographs. Mr. Godowsky was recently married to Frances Gershwins, sister of George Gershwins.

Zionist Movement Caused Many Jews to Come to U.S., Children Reply in Hebrew School Tests

Cincinnati, Nov. 7.—Curious, often humorous, misconceptions of Jewish life and Jewish history on the part of Jewish school children were revealed as a result of the Jewish History Achievement Tests given this year in religious schools in various parts of the United States. These tests, prepared by Dr. Julius B. Maller and Rabbi Jacob B. Pollak, both of New York, were given this year to some 7,000 children, ranging from the third grade through the high school department.

"Anti-Semitism in modern times has been caused by the attempt to bring Jews and Christians closer together." "The Zionist movement caused many Jews to come to this country." "In the year 586 B.C. the Jews were exiled to Rome." "The Israelites received the Ten Commandments at Jerusalem." "The orthodox synagogue does not have music in order not to disturb the people in prayer."

These and other misconceptions are contained in the answers to the tests which have been published by the Department of Synagogue and School Extension in Cincinnati. Dr. Maller's book, Testing Achievement in Jewish History, which will be published soon, deals with the subject of the tests and their findings.

Average Rating Low

The average score of the children on the tests was 37 per 100 questions. This is regarded as a surprisingly low average, inasmuch as only items which

Report Shows Work of German Jewish Center of N. Y. City

The annual report of the German Jewish Center of New York City, which has just been issued, reveals the work which this young organization has been doing for the spiritual and physical welfare of Jewish immigrants who have recently arrived in this country from Germany. The report also reveals that the Center has been aiding Jews in Germany itself who because of the Hitler victory in the recent political election are in critical circumstances.

The religious and social activities of the Center are under the direction of the founder of the organization, Rabbi Max Malina, who obtained his rabbinical education in the Lehranstalt fuer die Wissenschaft des Judentums in Berlin. Julius J. Sichel, president of the organization, is also a graduate of a German university.

Through the interest of Rabbi Jonah B. Wise in the work of the Center, all the activities of the organization are held either in the Chapel of the Central Synagogue or in the Community House of that congregation. Julius Loeb, a trustee of this synagogue, has been particularly interested in the work. In appreciation of their efforts in its behalf, the Center recently elected Rabbi Wise and Mr. Loeb honorary members.

were being taught in the religious schools were included in the tests.

The boys scored higher in history than the girls, despite the fact that the attendance of the girls was higher and more regular. This fact, according to Dr. Maller, may be interpreted to mean that girls may be less interested than boys in the subject of history, or in that phase of history included in the tests.

Some of the quaint answers given by the children to test questions were: Laban was designated by some children as the home (instead of the father) of Rachel and Leah.

Palestine Various Described

Palestine was described as the "land of the lame and the blind" by a few, and as "the land of Jerusalem" by others. In the test covering the period from the Division of the Kingdom to the Destruction of the First Temple, one young man had the idea that the Jews were exiled to Deuteronomy. Many children thought that the name of the prophet who encouraged the people by his words towards the end of the Babylonian exile was Moses.

One child, to whom the name Ezra was apparently unfamiliar, stated that Jesus read the Law of Moses to the people on their return from Babylon. Another question pertaining to Ezra, "Mixed marriages were objected to by" was filled in "Christians," "Chaim Jews," "Rabbis" and "Mormons."

Chaim Weizmann was called the leader of the Reform Jews and the leader of the Radicals; only 11 percent of the children recognized him as the leader of the Zionists. Josephus, the great historian of the first Christian century, was named as a Jewish member of the Supreme Court of the United States. The statement "Joseph H. Herz is the chief . . . of England" was filled in with the words: "of police;" "Zionist," etc.

\$521,000 Secured in Drive for \$2,221,000 By Federation

A total of \$521,000 has already been secured in the campaign for \$2,221,000 which the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies is conducting to complete the budget of \$5,499,000 voted to its ninety-one affiliated institutions at the beginning of the year.

This announcement was made yesterday by George Blumenthal, chairman of the campaign, who pointed out that the sum still to be raised is \$1,700,000.

Roeder Elected Judge

Jehial Roeder, son of the late Simon Roeder, active in Jewish communal affairs in this city, was elected municipal court judge on the Republican ticket from the ninth district of Manhattan. In its report of Tuesday's elections the Jewish Daily Bulletin erroneously reported that all Jewish nominees for the municipal court had been defeated.

Newly Founded League of Jewish Youth in First Meeting

The League of the Jewish Youth, sponsored by the Bureau of Jewish Education of New York, held its first membership rally and entertainment this week at the Theresa Kaufmann Auditorium of the new Y. M. H. A., with an attendance of over 600 Jewish students. This rally marked the launching of the League as a new movement of the Jewish student youth of New York.

In the beginning the benefits of this organization will be extended to those enrolled in the Hebrew secondary schools, as well as the older students of the more progressive Hebrew school of New York City. Ultimately it is hoped that this movement will extend to include the entire Jewish student population.

Judah Lapson, Director of the League addressed the rally and outlined its purposes.

Rabbi Steinberg Heads Indianapolis Zionist

Indianapolis, Nov. 8.—Rabbi Milto Steinberg of Congregation Beth-El-Zion was elected president of the Zionist district of Indianapolis for the ensuing year at a general meeting of the district. At the meeting plans were laid for the Zionist activities in Indianapolis for the coming year, including the membership campaign and the re-organization of the Jewish National Fund collections.

Other officers elected by the Indianapolis district are: vice-presidents, Max Katz and Dr. Benjamin Cohen; secretary, Nathan Toplin; treasurer, A. H. Goldstein. An executive board of thirteen was also chosen.

Mrs. Lindheim to Address New England Jr. Hadassah Conference

McKeesport Congregation Plans \$40,000 New Building

ment in an issue wherein Zionism will have very strong friends. It is felt that where such an internal situation exists in England, other governments must approach a discussion of that sort only with the utmost care since the premature intercession by the American government into this situation would be apt to set an element engaged in that discussion against the United States.

Situation Complex

At present the issue is one which still has to be debated in England, and since the Jews have such strong friends there, the state department is said to consider it the wisest plan to wait for a while and watch developments. The state department is also considered to have examined the various other elements heightening the complexity of the situation, such as the reservations contained in the Balfour Declaration and the old and new economic conditions, all of which are regarded as creating a strong question of differences of opinion and acute feeling. All these elements are a factor compelling the state department to oppose undue haste in formulating an attitude, though not in the least impairing the official interest and sympathy which the American government feels in the Jewish Homeland project.

Mrs. Stern Named President of San Francisco Playground Commission
