Austrian Jewry Worried at Return of Major Pabst, Anti- Semitic Heimwehr Founder

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Nov. 13—Jewish leaders here are voicing considerable anxiety over the return yesterday of Major Walde-mar Pabst, former leader of the Heimwehr, whose exile on a charge of high treason some months ago by ex-Chancel-lor Schober was recently cancelled by Prince Ernst von Starhemberg, Heimwehr leader and minister of the interior in the Vaugoin cabinet.

When he was expelled last June, Aus-trian Jewry breathed a sigh of relief be-cause it was felt that he was the prin-cipal cause of the anti-Semitic policy of the Heimwehr, of which he is the founder. Pabst is an intimate friend of Adolf Hitler with whom he was asso-ciated in the abortive Munich putsch.

Although Major Pabst's youth was spent in a Jewish home in Berlin he has been a leader of the anti-Semitic faction of the Heimwehr. His return to Aus-tria, which was accompanied by a trium-phant march from the time he crossed the border from his Italian refuge, coupled with the untrammelled anti-Semitic agitation of the Heimwehr Min-ister of Justice, Franz Hueber, is causing serious concern to Austrian Jewry.

Labor Party Organ Forecasts Retreat on White Paper

London, Nov. 13—A hint of what the government's explanatory statement on the White Paper will contain is given today by the Daily Herald, government organ. The statement will make clear that the government does not regard un-favorably the exclusive employment of Jewish labor on Jewish land and Jewish enterprises and that it has no intention of stipulating that while some Arabs are unemployed Jewish immigration must be restricted, the Daily Herald forecasts.

As proof that normal conditions have been restored, the Daily Herald points to the release of 1,500 certificates for Jewish immigration under the labor schedule. Moreover, the government organ concludes, the new declaration will make it clear that there is no in-tention of altering the interpretation placed upon the Mandate by successive British governments since 1922.

Premier MacDonald yesterday told the House of Commons that no ordi-nances would be promulgated based on the White Paper until after the debate on Palestine had been held. The debate is scheduled for Monday or Tuesday. The Prime Minister's announcement is in accord with the forecast of the Daily Herald.

Many Jewish Students Beaten in Renewed Berlin Outbreaks

Berlin, Nov. 13—Scores of Jewish students were beaten and manhandled today on the grounds of the University of Berlin in a renewal of yesterday's student riots. While the National So-cialists formed a corps and shouted, "Out with the Jews," the Socialist stu-dents formed a similar group and shouted, "Out with the Nazis." The uproar was so great that the day's classes were suspended and the police were called in to disperse the rioters.

The intervention of the police estab-lished that many of the National So-cialists were not students but merely hoodlums seeking a fight. When they were expelled from the University buildings they formed a street demon-stration which was quickly broken up by the police who swung their rubber clubs vigorously.

In connection with yesterday's at-tacks in which two Jewish students, one a girl, were badly injured, a num-ber of letters are published in today's press protesting against the brutal beating of harmless girls. One student protested against the "barbarism and repulsive behavior" of the Nazi stu-dents.

Dean Deissmann today issued a state-ment warning the students against mal-treating minority students and offering to establish a neutral public forum where the students could air their dif-ferences peacefully.

Parliamentary Palestine Debate Scheduled for Monday Afternoon

London, Nov. 13—Monday afternoon at 4 p. m. was set, today, as the time for opening the long-awaited debate on the Palestine question in the House of Com-mons. The debate may continue until almost midnight. It is not yet known, however, whether Premier MacDonald himself will open the discussion by an-nouncing the government's supplement-ary statement on the Passfield White Paper.

It is possible that some other member of the cabinet will inaugurate the dis-cussion.

Rumors of Oil Find Near the Dead Sea Persist

Berlin, Nov. 13—Yesterday's sensa-tional reports in the Jerusalem press that oil had been found in the vicinity of the Dead Sea were confirmed to some extent today by the Jerusalem correspondent of the Berliner Tage-blatt. He cabled that a concession for the exploitation of the oil field alleged to have been uncovered will be granted to an English oil company represented

May Annex Transjordan to Palestine to End Quarrel Between Arab Tribesmen

Jerusalem, Nov. 13—Transjordan, an independent state from Palestine, of which it was once part, but under the responsibility of the High Commis-sioner for Palestine may be annexed to Palestine by the British government in order to settle the quarrel between the tribesmen of the Nejd and Trans-jordan, the usually well-informed Amman correspondent of the Egyptian daily, El Ahram, reports today.

The British government has rejected the demand of the opposition in the Transjordan legislature that the tribal agreements of Syria and the Jebel Druses be laid before the legislature. The government considers that these international pacts require only the assent of Emir Abdullah, the ruler of Transjordan.

Unless peace is made shortly be-tween the tribes in Nejd and Trans-jordan, Great Britain will end the quar-rel between Ibn Sand, the sultan of Nejd and Abdullah by unseating the latter and replacing him by an Arab prince acceptable to Ibn Saud, the Ah-ram's correspondent asserts.

Peace in the desert is a great de-sideratum now for Britain because of the proposed Haifa-Bagdad railway and the Mosul pipeline. Transjordan, which has been closed to Jewish col-onization, was detached from Palestine and set up as an independent Arab state within the Palestine Mandate on September 1, 1922.

Ussishkin, Head of National Fund, Coming Here Dec. 2

Jerusalem, Nov. 13—Mendel Men-achem Ussishkin, head of the Jewish Na-tional Fund and known as the "grand old man of Zionism," will leave for the United States shortly where he is due to arrive December 2nd coincidental with the launching of a campaign by the Fund in America to further its work of land-buying in Palestine.

Ussishkin, who was born in Du-browna, Russia in 1863, founded a branch of the Chovev Zion (lovers of Zion) in 1882 while at college. His first visit to Palestine was made in 1891 in the company of Achad Ha'am. An active member of the first Zionist Con-gress in 1897 he has always emphasized the policy known as practical Zionism.

In 1903 he established the Palestine Hebrew Teachers Organization. His emphasis on the practical aspect of Zionism led him to place in the forefront the acquisition of land, and as head of the Chovev Zion he made a number of purchases. Subsequently he became the head of the Jewish National Fund which

Raps Liberal Party's Admission of Turkish Jews to Elections

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Istanbul, Nov. 13.—The organ of the Turkish government, Vakıf, today attacks the Liberal party for permitting the various minority groups, especially the Jews, to become candidates in the forthcoming municipal elections. Vakıf claims that Fethi Bey, leader of the Liberal party, has "created a new menace which we thought we had got rid of" by granting the minorities the right to be elected.

The criticism of the government's organ is believed due to the fact that the Liberal party has drawn to its support almost all the Jews of the country who have hitherto not been permitted to be candidates for public office. Because of the Liberal party's promise of economic and political equality, and its program of tax reduction and economic reforms the Jews have flocked to its banners.

The economic policy of the Mustapha Kemal Pasha government has impelled some 50,000 Jews to emigrate from Turkey and those left see in the Liberal party hope of restoring their former position.

Senator Vandenberg Backs U.S. Inquiry Into Palestine

Detroit, Nov. 13.—United States Senator Arthur H. Vandenberg of Michigan, member of the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations, in a statement to be published in the Detroit Jewish Chronicle of Friday, Nov. 14, declares that he favors a complete and official inquiry into the present conditions affecting the pledge to the Jewish people for the establishment of the Jewish National Home in Palestine.

Senator Vandenberg reiterates his interest in and friendship for the Zionist cause and declares that "the ideal is too powerful and too sound to be shattered by transient difficulties."

Zionist as Candidate on Liberal Ticket Makes White Paper Chief Issue in Whitechapel Election

London, Nov. 13.—The fact that George Lansbury, a member of the Labor cabinet, today threw himself fully into the election campaign in Whitechapel, an overwhelmingly Jewish constituency, is the latest indication of the heroic efforts being made by the government to elect a Laborite in the by-election called to fill the seat left vacant by the death of Harry Gosling, Labor minister of transport in 1924.

Speaking of the Palestine question at a campaign rally, Mr. Lansbury declared that "if we have made a mistake we ought to be treated as friends," thus indicating the government's readiness to retreat from the White Paper and moderate its Palestine policy. He refrained from discussing fully the Palestine question in view of the Premier's declaration yesterday in the House of Commons regarding the forthcoming debate on Palestine, but assured his listeners that the Mandate would be honored and carried out to its full extent.

The nomination of Barnett Janner, Zionist leader and Jewish communal worker, as the Liberal party's candidate in Whitechapel makes it certain that the Palestine question will be one of the, if not the most, important issues in the campaign. With Janner being supported by many Jewish voters who would otherwise have voted for the Labor candidate and the official Labor candidate being supported by the most

American Ort to Hold National Conference in N. Y., Nov. 30

More than a hundred delegates, representing various "landsmanshaften", Jewish societies in this country organized according to the cities of their former countries, have already registered to attend the national conference of the American Ort, which will take place at the Hotel Pennsylvania on November 30th in New York.

The conference, according to a statement made yesterday by Murray Levine, chairman of the American Ort, and Dr. Henry Moskowitz, chairman of the executive committee, will discuss the report from the Ort representative in Moscow that the Soviet authorities in Ukraine signed an agreement whereby the former will grant the declassified Jews in Ukraine raw material and space for factories, provided the "landsmanshaften" in the United States will furnish part of the money to equip the factories.

L. B. Boudin, chairman of the landsmanschaft department of the American Ort, will preside, and Dr. B. Dubovsky, acting chairman, will render a report on the Ort's recent accomplishments and on its plans for the future. Among those scheduled to speak are: Dr. H. Moskowitz, Murray Levine, Dr. B. Dubovsky, Dr. Ch. Zhitlovsky, Dr. S. Ellsberg, Dr. A. Boranik and B. Charney Vladok.

Brandeis Passes His 74th Birthday Quietly at Home

Washington, Nov. 13.—Supreme Court Justice Louis D. Brandeis, the only Jew ever named to the highest court in the land, marked his 74th birthday at his home here today. Justice Brandeis passed the day quietly in his study in the company of his family and friends.

The new developments in the Zionist situation have given rise to many rumors that Justice Brandeis would resign from the Supreme Court to take over the leadership of the Zionist movement. These reports have brought forth numerous editorials deploring the possible loss of Justice Brandeis from the Supreme Court where, since his appointment in 1916 by President Wilson, he has been one of the Liberal minority.

Justice Brandeis was born in Louisville, Ky., November 13, 1856. He is a former honorary president of the Zionist Organization of America. From 1914 to 1918 he was chairman of the Provisional Committee for General Zionist Affairs.

Boston, Nov. 13.—Telegrams of congratulation were sent to Justice Louis D. Brandeis from leaders here on the occasion of his 74th birthday today. Some of the organizations who remembered the Justice were the New England Zionist Region, the Palestine Labor Committee, and the Associated Congregations of the city.

American Zionist Women Make Fund Raising Plans

The committee on fund raising of Hadassah, at a meeting in the home of Mrs. Irma L. Lindheim, chairman, outlined its plans to raise the \$610,000 budget undertaken by Hadassah, for the year 1930-1931. Mrs. A. A. Silberberg, member of the New York chapter praesidium, Miss Hortense Levy, Mrs. J. J. Levinson, Mrs. Cohen, Mrs. Simon Ruskin and Mrs. Robert Szold, national vice-president, were present.

Part of the fund-raising program is a tour of the larger cities of this country by Mrs. Irma L. Lindheim. The national office is also sending out a "Ways and Means" list to the 300 chapters in 39 states of the union as a good part of the money raised for Palestine is earned by the women themselves. Taxing people home from meetings, caring for children in the absence of their parents, baking and selling cookies, the \$25 and \$50 "Give and Get" luncheons, and even the more ambitious undertaking of community bazaars will be among the various enterprises launched by the American Zionist women who support the Hadassah Medical Organization in Palestine.

These plans are in line with the resolution recently passed by Hadassah at its 16th annual convention in Buffalo—that "our answer to the Passfield White Paper, breaking faith and abrogating England's pledges to us shall be no verbal protest, but shall take the form of raising funds and more funds..." and that "Palestine shall be rebuilt!"

Italian Jewish War Heroes Reburied with Military Honors

Rome, Nov. 13—Thirteen Jewish soldiers who fought in the Italian army during the late war were reburied in the Jewish cemetery at Merano today with full military honors in the presence of officers of the garrison, officials of the Jewish War Veterans Organizations and representatives of the Austro-Hungarian army that fought against Italy in the Alpine mountain passes.

Today's reburial was the result of the Italian government's recent decision to re-inter all soldiers previously buried at various cemeteries in the main military cemetery at Trento. The appeal of Chief Rabbi Joshua Gruenwald for separate burial for the Jewish soldiers was granted and the first 13 of the exhumed Jewish bodies were brought to Merano today on a special gun caisson.

The bodies were received by a detachment of city police in full uniform, an infantry regiment playing the funeral march, representatives of the Fascist party, Chief Rabbi Gruenwald and a number of Jewish dignitaries. Rabbi Gruenwald's eulogy for the Jewish war veterans was followed by a religious service.

Jewish-Christian Good-Will Seminar at Bucknell, Nov. 21

Lewisburg, Pa., Nov. 13—The second seminar to be arranged by the National Conference of Jews and Christians this month and held on a Christian denominational College Campus will take place on November 20th and 21st at Bucknell University. The leaders of the seminar will be President G. W. Richards of the Lancaster Reformed Seminary, Father F. Fay Murphy of Georgetown, Rabbi Abram Simon of the Washington Hebrew Congregation and Rev. Everett R. Cliney of the Federal Council of Churches of Christ. The Religious Education Association is cooperating in the seminar. Rev. A. W. Gottschall of Baltimore, Rabbi Charles Mantinband of Williamsport and Prof. Bond of Bucknell University are acting for the local committee.

Discussion topics will include occupational discrimination against Jews, areas of misrepresentation in religion and possibilities for community cooperation. Two hundred clergymen, educators and lay people will attend. The earlier seminar in Pennsylvania was held November 2nd and 3rd at Dickinson College.

Portland Hebrew School Head Resigns

Portland, Ore., Nov. 13—Bert L. Treiger, principal of the Portland Hebrew School since 1916, has resigned his position to take up work in New York. A testimonial luncheon to the occasion of Mr. and Mrs. Treiger's departure from Portland was held recently at the Heathman Hotel, at which Mr. J. Shemanski presided. Announcement was made of the appointment of Mr. Treiger as honorary principal of the Portland Hebrew School.

Jewish Baker Gives 1300 Bread Loaves to Jobless

I. Wisotsky, a Jewish baker of Brooklyn, has come to the aid of the unemployed in what was probably the most timely and efficacious expression of human kindness. This week he loaded a wagon with 700 loaves of bread and 600 rolls and stationed himself within the vicinity of the city's free employment bureau where more than 1,500 discouraged, hungry men were crowding outside the building.

It did not take long for the men to realize that Mr. Wisotsky had come to their aid, and the bread and rolls were distributed in record time, almost causing a riot.

60% of Winnipeg Jewish Children Learn Yiddish

Winnipeg, Manitoba, Nov. 13—The Yiddish language is taught to a larger extent in Winnipeg than in any other city on the North American continent, according to an article in a recent issue of *Dos Yiddishe Wort*, local Yiddish daily, which reports that sixty per cent of all the children who attend Jewish schools in this city are taught Yiddish.

Nine hundred Jewish children attend the purely Yiddishist schools here, including kindergartens and day-schools, which the Winnipeg Yiddishists were the first in all North America to install. The Winnipeg Talmud Torahs and Hebrew schools also employ Yiddish either as the language of instruction or as an important subject in their curriculum.

Even in the B'nai Brith lodge in Winnipeg, continues the article, Yiddish is often spoken at meetings. Courses for adults which were recently announced by the Yiddishist Peretz-Schools attracted more than 150 pupils, so that the number of teachers for these courses had to be increased. A large library of Yiddish books is very much utilized by Winnipeg Jewry.

9th Annual Dinner of Jewish Education Association, Dec. 14

The annual dinner of the Jewish Education Association will be held on Sunday, December 14th, it was announced by Bernard Semel, honorary secretary of the Association. Mr. Semel further announced that Mark Eisner who was recently elected a member of the Executive Board of the Association has agreed to serve as chairman of the committee of arrangements for the dinner.

The event this year, as in previous years, will take the form of a Chanukah celebration. Mr. Semel stated, and will be marked by a program designed to bring home the outstanding importance of the Jewish educational problem for American Jewry at large, and for the Jews of New York in particular.

Berlin Student Riots Blamed on Hitlerites and Socialists

Berlin, Nov. 13—The student riots yesterday on the campus of the University of Berlin, in which a number of Jewish students were injured, are being variously ascribed to a pre-conceived plan by the National Socialist students and to propaganda by the Socialist students, both of which groups were participants in the clash.

One version has it that the Fascist students prior to the outbreak held a meeting at a beer-house near the University where their leaders, Herr Von Buenau egged them on and laid plans for a number of anti-Jewish attacks in the future carefully arranged to look like spontaneous affrays. Simultaneously the Fascist students are said to have organized a girls' detachment under the leadership of a professor's daughter.

Dean Adolf Deismann, however, claims that the disturbance was started by the Socialist students by their distribution of anti-Hitlerite leaflets. The National Socialist students too blame the Socialists charging them with shouting anti-Semitic slogans, including "death to the Jews," which were not discontinued when the police dispersed the rioters.

Meanwhile the Democratic press is critical of Dean Deismann's actions but praises the energetic intervention of the police which prevented a more serious affair. A belief that the University enjoys extra-territoriality was dissipated by the police commandant, M. Heilmannsborg, who announced that the police would intervene when outbreaks that endangered public safety took place.

Guttmacher Named Physician for Baltimore Supreme Bench

Baltimore, Nov. 13—On the recommendation of some of the country's most distinguished physicians and psychiatrists, Dr. Manfred S. Guttmacher, son of the late Rabbi Adolf Guttmacher, was appointed yesterday medical officer of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore. In order to take the post, Dr. Guttmacher plans to resign as assistant in clinical neurology at Johns Hopkins University.

Dr. Guttmacher, who was born in Baltimore thirty-two years ago, received his bachelor of arts degree from Johns Hopkins in 1919 when he was 21. Four years later he received the doctor of medicine degree. For two years he studied abroad, having been awarded the Emmanuel Libman European fellowship. Returning to the United States in 1927, Dr. Guttmacher became assistant medical officer of the Boston Psychopathic Hospital, serving simultaneously as psychiatrist of the John Baker Foundation, Boston. In these posts he gained considerable training in legal medicine and criminal psychology. Since 1928 Dr. Guttmacher has been assistant in clinical neurology at Johns Hopkins and psychiatrist for the Mental Hygiene Society of Maryland.

in the decade of his administration has increased the amount of land owned from 20,000 to 300,000 dunams.

At the Peace Conference in 1919, Ussishkin was elected to present the Zionist case in the Hebrew language, after which he proceeded to Palestine where, as the head of the Zionist Committee, he transferred its headquarters from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem. He has since resided there, having earned the appellation of "chief citizen of the Yishuv."

prominent members of the party, the government is apparent. Labor is not desirous to add to its losses in other constituencies one in Whitechapel because it is now functioning without a majority and another loss may irreparably weaken its position.

Further evidence that the government is moving heaven and earth to return a Laborite from the Whitechapel district is seen in its decision to nominate as its candidate Sir Stafford Cripps, the newly appointed Solicitor-General, who is the son of Lord Parmoor, the Lord President of the Council in the Labor government and the leader of the government party in the House of Lords. The Conservatives have selected M. Guinness, who unsuccessfully contested the constituency in the last general election.

There is a strong feeling among the Jewish voters of Whitechapel and East End that in view of the government's stand on the Palestine question they should not support the Labor candidate. The Liberal candidate, Mr. Janner, is a member of the executive of the English Zionist Federation and of the Board of Jewish Deputies and is prominently identified with a number of other Jewish organizations.

Jewish School Population of Pittsburgh Drops from 1928

Pittsburgh, Nov. 13—The Jewish child population of the elementary and high schools of Pittsburgh is 8,743, as compared with 9,129 two years ago, or 386 less than in 1928, according to a census of Jewish children absent from the public schools last Yom Yippur which was taken by the Hebrew Institute of Pittsburgh, with the cooperation of School Superintendent Dr. Graham.

The census also reveals that out of 8,743 Jewish children, 2,417 or 27.6% attend high school, while out of a total Gentile child population of 99,400 only 16,000, or 16% attend the high schools, and out of the parochial child population of 43,200 only 3,200 or 7.5% attend the parochial high schools. This indicates that in proportion to the total child population in the schools, the percentage of Jewish children who attend high schools is the greatest—27.6% as compared with 16% and 7.5%.

DEBATE: Is Religion Necessary?

Rumors of Oil Find Near the Dead Sea Persist

by D. A. Sutherland, mining engineer, who has already purchased 250,000 hectares of petroleum lands.

Jerusalem, Nov. 13—The news that the agent of an English oil company had found oil in the neighborhood of the Dead Sea was not taken seriously today in quarters closely connected with interests engaged in the development of the Dead Sea. Persons well-informed as to the mineral resources of the Dead Sea and the territory around it denied that oil had been found.

Some years ago a similar report became current but investigators who examined the alleged oil field definitely declared that there was no oil in the entire region.

The government permit under which D. A. Sutherland has been prospecting around the Dead Sea permits him to explore 100,000 hectares between Beer-sheba and the Dead Sea, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns. The permit, which appears to be the basis for reports that "black gold" has been found near the Dead Sea, expires shortly. Mr. Sutherland has previously explored for oil near Akaba, a town on the Eastern side of the Gulf of Akaba, which is the eastern division into which the Red Sea bifurcates at in northern extremity.
