## Britain Invites Leaders of Jewish Agency to Confer on Policy in Palestine

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Nov. 15.—An invitation of the British government to leaders of the Jewish Agency to confer regarding the interpretation of the Palestine Mandate, and the government's readiness to modify its Palestine policy were revealed in a communique issued from Downing Street, Premier MacDonald's official residence.

"Doubts have been expressed," the communique reads, "as to the compatibility of some passages in the White Paper with certain articles of the Palestine Mandate. Other passages having proved liable to misunderstanding His Majesty's Government has invited representatives of the Jewish Agency to confer with it on these matters.

"As the parties to the Mandate are strongly desirous of securing its correct interpretation and impartial administration it is hoped that an agreement will be reached on any point of difference when a further statement concerning these issues will be made."

## Arab Executive Warns Britain of Arab Resentment If White Paper Is Modified

Jerusalem, Nov. 15.—The long official silence of the Arab Executive regarding its attitude toward the British White Paper was broken this afternoon when the Executive issued a communique regarding an interview, held earlier in the day, with High Commissioner Chancellors.

The communique intimates that general excitement will be caused among the Arabs by any modification of the White Paper. The statement of the Arab Executive says:

"The members of the Arab Executive did not prepare any statement previous to their interview with the High Commissioner. Following their interview they left with him a message for the British Colonial Office. In this message the Executive deprecated the govern-

## Lloyd George, Samuel, Amery, Morris, and Perhaps Snell, Will Take Part in Palestine Debate

London, Nov. 15.—When the debate on Palestine opens in the House of Commons Monday afternoon, Col. Leopold Amery, former Colonial Secretary, and Major Walter Elliot, former under-secretary of state for Scotland, will speak for the Conservatives, and Lloyd George and Sir Herbert Samuel, former High Commissioner of Palestine, will speak for the Liberals, it was learned today.

While the spokesmen for the government are not yet known it is expected that R. Hopkin Morris, the Liberal member of the Shaw Commission, will take the floor in defense of the White Paper as will a number of other pro-Arab members. It is possible that Sir Harry Snell, Labor member of the

## Protests Ban on Jewish War Heroes from Veterans' Union

Budapest, Nov. 15.—Protests that not only are ordinary Jewish war veterans barred from membership in the Ex-Servicemen's Union but even those Jewish ex-servicemen who earned decorations for bravery under fire are excluded were made today by the Jewish deputy, M. Fabian, before a parliamentary commission investigating the matter.

Recalling the names of such Jewish war heroes as General Zoeld, Colonel Bleyer and M. Stella, who were honored by Hungary for war-services, Deputy Fabian complained that their applications for membership in the Ex-Servicemen's Union have been rejected.

## Carol Holds Out Hope for Disfranchised Roumanian Jews to Regain Their Rights

Bucharest, Nov. 15.—Thousands of Jews in Roumania will regain the citizenship rights they lost as a result of the post-War map changes if King Carol's recommendation, in his message to parliament today, advocating a revision of the existing citizenship law is carried out.

The royal message opening the new session of parliament also assured that the various minorities in the country, of which the Jews are one of the most important, shall in the future, as in the past, enjoy the complete good-will and rights of which Roumania has already given proof in solving its great minorities problems.

Assurances of equal treatment for all religious and national minorities in accordance with Roumanian constitutional institutions were also voiced in the royal message. The King mentioned in passing the demand of the Jewish Parliamentary Club for the enactment of a Jewish communities ordinance.

## Melchett Lays Britain's Anti- Zionist Policy to Unfriendly Views of Palestine Officials

Vienna, Nov. 15.—The ill-concealed unfriendly attitude of the Palestine officials charged with carrying out Britain's obligations to the Jews under the Balfour Declaration and the Palestine Mandate is blamed for the British government's anti-Zionist policy by Lord Melchett, prominent British industrialist, who resigned as chairman of the Council of the Jewish Agency and of the Agency's political commission as a protest against the White Paper, in a statement today to the Vienna Freie Presse, Austria's leading paper.

Lord Melchett charges that the Palestine problem has been acute since 1921 because of the unwillingness of Palestine officialdom to execute the Mandate, and particularly because of the "dualism between good-will expressed by the various London governments and the executing officials who created for us only obstacles and difficulties because they do not believe in the possibility of the realization of the Balfour Declaration. Hence they used their utmost efforts through the years to prove the impossibility of its realization."

Offering to produce a list of all the high British officials in Palestine who had repeatedly told him of the impossibility of carrying out the Balfour Declaration, Lord Melchett says that this official lack of sympathy created in Palestine "a direct and indirect atmosphere of friendly neutrality against the

## Vienna Business Men Rap Anti-Semitic Student Riots

Vienna, Nov. 15.—A city-wide movement of protest among business men and industrialists has arisen against the anti-Semitic student outbreaks at the commercial college, the rector of the college was informed today by the senate of this commercial institution. The chambers of commerce and the various merchants associations informed the senate that those taking part in attacks on Jewish students will receive no business appointments upon graduation.

The intervention of the various official commercial organizations of the city to prevent a repetition of the disturbances is expected to be effective as the students of the commercial colleges are dependent for positions upon these organizations. The latter have received many letters protesting the attacks on Jewish students.

## Create Fighting Fund to Oppose British White Paper

Berlin, Nov. 15.—A political fighting fund to oppose the British White Paper was created here today by the international League for Working Palestine. Eduard Bernstein, famous Socialist, has agreed that contributions to this fund should be addressed to him.

The League also plans a campaign of education among the Arab workers and will seek to obtain a petition of a million signatures to be submitted to the British Labor Party.

## First J. N. F. Campaign Opens Today in Danbury

During the past several days sixteen American Jewish communities have responded to the call issued by M. M. Ussishkin, president of the Jewish National Fund in Jerusalem, Dr. Chaim Weizmann, resigned president of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, and Emanuel Neumann, president of the Jewish National Fund of America, to rally to the defense of the Jewish National Fund, the Zionist land purchase and reclamation agency, which was severely attacked in the Simpson Report and in the British government's White Paper.

Local committees which have been formed have accepted considerable quotas which are to be raised in early campaigns, according to an announcement by the New York headquarters of the Jewish National Fund. The first Jewish National Fund campaign will be held in Danbury, Conn., today.

A Connecticut state conference of the Palestine Land Fund of the Jewish National Fund will be held in December. The conference will be addressed by M. M. Ussishkin who, it is expected, will be presented with a check for a considerable amount as Connecticut Jewry's contribution toward the Fund.

The following communities are among the first to commence the organization of campaigns for the Palestine Land Fund: Montgomery, Ala., Bridgeport, Danbury, Hartford, New Britain, New Haven and South Norwalk, Conn.; Washington, D. C.; Indianapolis, Ind.; Baltimore, Md.; Mt. Vernon, N. Y.; Columbus, Ohio; Cincinnati, Ohio; Philadelphia, Pa.; Harrisburg, Pa.; and Providence, R. I.

## Wise and De Haas Write New Book on Palestine

What is described as another "J'accuse!", directed at those British officials who are attempting to repudiate the Balfour Declaration, has been written by Dr. Stephen S. Wise and Jacob de Haas, noted American Zionist leaders, in a book called "The Great Betrayal," according to an announcement issued by the Zionist Organization of America. The volume is to be published by Brentano's within the next ten days.

Both of the authors were important factors in securing American adherence to the Balfour Declaration which was issued by the British Government on November 2, 1917. In their volume they make public documents affecting American relations to the Balfour Declaration which have not hitherto been known. Included among these is the draft of a note by President Wilson directed to the British Cabinet, in regard to the Declaration.

"The Great Betrayal" gives a history of the background of the Balfour Declaration and the events that have transpired since then, culminating in the latest White Paper on Palestine issued by the British Colonial Office, headed by Lord Passfield. The Zionist Organization announcement says of the book that it "is much more than an indictment of Passfield and his malign and masterful underlings of the Colonial Office. It is an appeal from Passfieldian partisanship and prejudice to the wise and just statesmanship of Balfour's England."

## Jewish Experts to Play Big Role in White House Paper on Child Health, Protection

Washington, Nov. 15.—A large number of Jewish experts in child care will participate in the work of the White House Conference on Child Health and Protection which will meet here from Nov. 19 to 22. Secretary of the Interior Wilbur will preside. Jewish authorities on medical, welfare and educational subjects are included in the committee personnel of all four sections of the Conference.

### Frankel on Planning Committee

Lee K. Frankel, vice-president of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company, is a member of President Hoover's Planning Committee for the Conference. Mrs. Henry Moskowitz, former chairman of the Committee on Amusement Resources for Working Girls in New York, is chairman of the sub-committee on Commercialized Recreation, while Mrs. Fred M. Stein is Associate Chairman of the sub-committee on Summer Vacation Activities of the School Child, of which sub-committee Joshua Lieberman is also a member. Lillian D. Wald, founder and head resident of the Henry Street Settlement in New York, will report on visiting nurses to the sub-committee on neighborhood agencies. Robert Ro-

## Jewelry, Coins of Byzantine and Roman Eras Uncovered by Archaeologists in Palestine

Philadelphia, Nov. 15.—Gold jewelry and coins of the Byzantine Empire, as well as articles of bronze, glass and terra cotta from the Roman period have been excavated at Beisan with the renewal of archaeological work here by the University of Pennsylvania Museum's Palestine expedition, according to a report received by Horace H. F. Jayne, director of the Museum.

### Discovery of Importance

In addition to finding these objects, all of which belong to about the Sixth Century, A. D., the expedition also made a wholly unexpected discovery of importance when it unearthed a building, believed to be either a chapel or villa of Byzantine origin, whose rooms still retained much of their original mosaic paving. The Palestine expedition is directed this year by Gerald M. Fitz-Gerald who served for several years as Acting Director of Antiquities in Jerusalem.

"Since beginning its work at Beisan this season the expedition has concentrated its efforts chiefly on the excavation of a cemetery and we have succeeded in excavating about thirty tombs there thus far," Mr. Fitz-Gerald writes in his report. "Nearly all of them," he continues, "have proved to be of Roman or Byzantine date but one tomb we discovered was of a different type, namely a ledge of rock on which lay five of the pottery sarcophagi of the 'slipper' type with lids representing human heads, which have been associated with the Philistine or other Egyptian mercenaries of about the 12th century B. C."

### Principal Finds

"The principal finds in the Roman and Byzantine tombs consist of lamps, glass vases and small objects of bronze. An extremely graceful terra cotta figurine is a noteworthy find and of the same material is the figure of a cock. Some gold earrings and a large number of carnelian beads were among other objects unearthed."

"A wholly unexpected discovery was made on the summit of the cemetery slope when a stone gateway over three metres wide was uncovered leading into a room paved with a mosaic floor. On the threshold the mosaic bears a Greek inscription, obviously of the Byzantine period. Beyond the inscription part of a pattern has been uncovered, including figures of birds in square panels, apparently arranged round an octagonal figure."

## Seeks Maryland Ban on Religious Oaths for Non-Believer, Religious Minorities

Baltimore, Nov. 15.—An amendment to the Maryland Constitution whereby religious oaths would not be required of non-believers and religious minorities is being advocated here by B. H. Hartogensis, Baltimore Jewish lawyer. In a recent letter to the local press Mr. Hartogensis says:

"Many a disability of religious minorities and non-believers in this mis-called free state can be effected by a change in the statutes. Thus we compel a non-believer to have a religious ceremony for his marriage; again despite the Constitution of the United States, we require here the oath of office on the 'faith of a Christian' with exception to the Jew, who must proclaim his creed, with exclusion from office of non-believers and believers in exotic religions, Moslems, Hindus, Confucianists and the like, and all the hundreds of non-believers in our midst, distinguished alike by their learning and good morals. But since our Court of Appeals has elaborated the Constitutional provision 'the duty to worship God,' by saying 'this is a Christian community' and further adding 'it is a duty to foster and encourage Christianity,' by enforcing Sunday as a Sabbath for religious reasons, a new Constitution should say this union of church and state is unconstitutional, as decided by a Federal Court in the District of Columbia 22 years ago."

## Socialist Organ Urges Prussia to Probe Student Outbreaks

Berlin, Nov. 15.—The Berlin Vorwaerts, leading Socialist organ, today demands that the Prussian government institute an inquiry into the anti-Semitic student disturbances on the grounds of the University of Berlin. The probe, the Vorwaerts says, should expose the intention of the National Socialist students to subject their Jewish classmates to abuse and humiliation.

Meanwhile Dean Deismann has organized a monitor service composed of students from all parties in order to maintain order. The press complains, however, that a majority of these monitors are National Socialists who are patrolling the University's corridors wearing swastika badges and abusing all Jewish-looking students, thus defeating the purpose of the monitors.

## Oberdorfer Retires from Georgia National Guard as General

Atlanta, Nov. 15.—Colonel Eugene Oberdorfer, Jr., insurance agency head and prominent member of the local Jewish community, was retired from the Georgia National Guard with promotion to the rank of brigadier general.

The order elevating Colonel Oberdorfer and announcing his retirement in recognition of a long and distinguished service in the military was issued by Governor L. G. Hardman. Up to his retirement, General Oberdorfer was assistant adjutant-general of the national guard and one of the most widely-known officials of the organization.

He retires as brigadier after the equivalent of 20 years of service in the United States army and Georgia militia, including active duty with the "Fighting Fifth" regiment on the Mexican border and with the American expeditionary forces abroad.

## Mrs. Sporborg Heads N. Y. Federation of Women's Clubs

Port Chester, N. Y.—Mrs. William Dick Sporborg of this village has just been elected president of the New York State Federation of Women's Clubs, at the annual convention in Utica, N. Y.

Mrs. Sporborg is widely active in the Council of Jewish Women, having served not only her local council in an official capacity, but also having been head of the New York State Branch and an honorary vice president of the National Council of Jewish Women. She is also a past president of the New York City Federation of Women's Clubs.

## Kansas B'nai B'rith Holds Fifth Annual Convention

Wichita, Kansas, Nov. 15.—The fifth annual convention of B'nai B'rith lodges of Kansas was held recently in Wichita with more than 500 members in attendance. Among the lodges represented were those of Kansas City, Topeka, Leavenworth and Coffeyville. At the banquet, which was presided over by Max Levand, president of the Wichita Beacon, addresses were delivered by Simon Heller of Denver, first vice-president of District Grand Lodge No. 2, and by Rabbi I. J. Sarasohn of Leavenworth.

Among the resolutions adopted at the afternoon session was one protesting against the British White Paper on Palestine. Arthur M. Sickel, first vice-president, was elected president of the Kansas B'nai B'rith and Leavenworth was selected as the place of meeting of next year's convention.

## Defeat Attempt to Offer Courses in Religion in Schools of San Antonio

San Antonio, Texas, Nov. 15.—A recent attempt by the Ministerial Association of this city to introduce religious training in connection with the school curriculum of San Antonio has been defeated and the Ministerial Association will not pursue its efforts in this direction any further. Among those who opposed the plan was Rabbi Ephraim Frisch of Temple Beth-el. Editorials in local newspapers also denounced the plan.

The committee of the Ministerial Association, of which the Rev. Rolfe P. Crum of St. Mark's Episcopal Church is the chairman, proposed to Superintendent of Schools Hartley that school children take one hour of religious training during the week in a neighborhood church and that credit for the term's work be granted by the public schools. It was planned to make the religious courses voluntary and to provide a course in art appreciation for those children who did not care to take the religious course.

In opposing the plan, Rabbi Frisch stated in an interview in the San Antonio Evening News:

"This proposal is but another attempt at the regulation by the strong arm of the state of the private conduct and beliefs of our citizens. Such endeavors have been made thousands of times before and have always been looked upon as they should be, as acts of tyranny and misguided zeal, since they violate the justly cherished American principle of freedom of conscience and the separation of church and state."

The plan was also opposed by the Baptist churches of this city.

## Seek to Organize United

### Kehillah of Canadian Jewry

Montreal, Nov. 15.—A movement to unite all Canadian Jewish congregations into one national group has been gaining ground and appears to be on the verge of realization. Toronto has already taken the first step with the organization of a local kehillah.

On Monday, Nov. 17, a dinner will be given by A. Raginsky, president of the B'nai Jacob Synagogue, for the purpose of uniting all local congregations under a single kehillah. Once the local effort is crowned with success, steps will be taken to organize the United Jewish Kehillah of Canada, which is to serve as a medium of Canadian Jewry primarily for religious matters.

ment's proposed conference with the Zionist leaders in London to explain the alleged vagueness of the White Paper in Palestine despite its clearly expressed terms.

"The Arab Executive fears that any explanation will lead to modifications which would make the Arabs despair of the government's good intentions to preserve the small area of land left in possession of the Arabs in Palestine and to halt immigration.

"The Arab Executive firmly believes that explanations of any kind will cause general excitement among the Arabs, especially in view of the government's recent approval of the 1,500 labor certificates for Jewish immigrants which is absolutely contrary to the White Paper."

High Commissioner Chancellor, the Executive reported, informed the deputation that the Colonial Office had directed him to reassure the Arabs and to inform them that the British government will not neglect its duty to all sections of the Palestine population.

Jerusalem, Nov. 15—It is learned here that the Arab Executive's communique regarding the White Paper, which was presented to High Commissioner Chancellor today for transmission to the Colonial Office, was prompted by the advice of Jamal Hussein, Arab Executive representative in London, and other friends of the Arabs in London. The communique follows close upon the publication of Premier MacDonald's invitation to the leaders of the Jewish Agency to confer with the MacDonald government on the British policy in Palestine as outlined in the recently published White Paper.

## Professor's Praise of Jewish Students Led to Outbreaks

Budapest, Nov. 15—A professor's praise of his Jewish students and the resentment of this praise by the non-Jewish students is blamed for the anti-Semitic occurrences this week at the Franz Joseph Royal Hungarian University at Szeged by Dr. Kovacs, the chancellor, in an interview today with the Hungarian Telegraphic Agency.

Dr. Kovacs said that Prof. Albert Szentgyorgy had praised the Jewish students in his chemistry class as the best in the university and advised the non-Jewish students to learn from the Jews how to study. Although Professor Szentgyorgy quickly conciliated the non-Jewish students by explaining that he had not meant to insult them but from purely patriotic motives wanted them to study instead of demonstrate. Dr. Kovacs said that the demonstrations then took place.

## Jewish Charities Remembered in Fanny Henning's Will

Lake Placid, Nov. 15—The Lake Placid Synagogue and the National Variety Artists Tuberculosis Sanatorium in Saranac Lake, N. Y. are named among the many beneficiaries listed in the will of the late Mrs. Fanny Henning of New York, a summer resident of this community for the past three years.

In her will filed for probate in New York there are listed 31 charitable, religious and medical institutions in this country and abroad which will receive a total of \$146,500 in bequests. Eighty friends, relatives and employees of Mrs. Henning also share in her estate, which is estimated at about \$365,000.

She left \$6,000 each to the Lake Placid Synagogue and the National Variety Artists Sanatorium. The largest single bequest is made to the Institutional Synagogue, New York, and amounts to \$35,000 to be used for a scholarship fund. Bequests of \$5,000 each are also made to the Beth Israel Hospital, Jewish Theatrical Guild and Daughters of Israel of Harlem, all in New York City, and to the British Home for British Soldier Blind in London, England.

Mrs. Henning was the widow of Gus C. Henning, steel testing expert and inventor of a testing apparatus, who died in 1910.

Shaw Commission who dissented from the majority findings of that body, will counteract Morris' speech by a stand friendly to Zionism.

Commenting on the debate and on the invitation of the government to leaders of the Jewish Agency to confer on the Palestine policy, the Manchester Guardian today warns that the negotiations with the Agency officials must not be made an excuse for postponing again "that full examination which is at once the right and duty of the House of Commons."

Welcoming the proposed conference between the government and the Jewish Agency, the Guardian says that the function of the negotiations is "to resolve doubts and to clear away misunderstandings, but unless the government's explanation is in part at least an explaining away it is doubtful whether the Jewish leaders will be satisfied. Is the government prepared to admit that its White Paper was mistaken in content as well as in expression? It would have been better for all parties if Lord Passfield had granted Dr. Weizmann's request to consult him before publication of the White Paper, for by this the unedifying spectacle of official vacillation might have been avoided."

Jewish work in Palestine to which I have often drawn the attention of premiers and colonial secretaries as well as the high commissioners."

Summarizing the outlook for the future, Lord Melchett believes that no real progress is possible in Palestine so long as the "spirit of individual officials is unchanged and so long as the government leaders do not realize that it is not sufficient to say a few friendly words regarding the Mandate and the Jews." Lord Melchett voices the conviction that the White Paper is also the work of the Palestine officials assisted by the younger officials of the Colonial Office.
