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Failure to Elect Ten on Jewish Tickets Costs Polish Jewry Parliamentary Rights

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Nov. 18.—The failure of the electorate to return more than eight Jews running on Jewish tickets to the Sejm in Sunday's national election, thus making it impossible for the Jewish members to form a Parliamentary Club because the constitution requires at least 10 members for such a club, will prevent the Jews from having any representation in the various Parliamentary commissions.

With 13 Jewish members in the last Sejm, the Jewish Parliamentary Club was unable to put up a strong fight for Jewish rights in the budget and education commission. The sweep of the pro-government bloc not only resulted in the defeat of five of the previous thirteen Jewish deputies but also led to the triumph of the National Democrats and the Korfanty Party, both anti-Semitic groups. The National Democrats increased their mandates by 30 seats while the Korfanty wing gained four seats.

Of the eight Jews who won, seven were elected on the United Zionist ticket, while one was elected on the Agudist ticket. In addition to these five Jews were elected on the pro-government ticket. In Warsaw only Isaac Gruenbaum, dean of the Jewish deputies and former president of the Jewish Parliamentary Club, was elected.

Raps Hungarian War Heroes Exclusion of Jewish Heroes

Budapest, Nov. 18.—The statement made by Hungarian Minister of War, M. Goemboes, in a speech at a meeting in the City of Keckemet, in which he justified the exclusion of Jews from the Ex-Service Men's Union, saying that the organization is limited exclusively to Hungarians of Aryan origin, called forth great excitement among Hungarian Jewry and among many liberal Christian circles, producing a stormy debate in Parliament today.

A number of liberal deputies participated. "No one will understand the racial differentiation of the fallen or wounded heroes," declared the Jewish deputy, Paul Sandor, replying in Parliament to Minister Goemboes' speech. "I am anxious to know if Hungary will make such differentiation between Jews and Christians when the sons of the nation will be called to serve during a possible new war." Deputy Sandor then mentioned that he presented M. Goemboes with a list of Jewish war heroes for approval, but he never received a reply, "although the minister is primarily obliged to respect the laws."

Would Ban Old Testament from Christian Faith

Berlin, Nov. 18.—A demand to eliminate the Old Testament from the Christian faith is made by Prof. Willy Hellpach of the University of Heidelberg in a two-volume work "Between Wittenberg and Rome," which appeared today.

In eliminating the Old Testament Professor Hellpach suggests that an exception be made to the Psalms of David and the Prophets. The stories of creation and the fall of man in the first book of Moses are cited by him as "dangerous and immoral."

Trial of Borscha Anti-Semites Finally Opens in Satu-Mare

Bucharest, Nov. 18.—The much postponed trial of the anti-Semitic peasants charged with having started the fire in Borscha, where many Jewish homes were destroyed last July, opened today in Satu-Mare with the government taking emergency measures to preserve order. In addition to the anti-Semitic peasants on trial 15 Jews are also implicated.

Throughout the town, police patrols are on guard and are not permitting gatherings of more than five persons. The attorneys for the peasants are the well known anti-Semitic leaders, Zelea Codreanu, M. Catuneanu and M. Ionescu. The attorneys for the Jews are Joseph Borshida and Samuel Fischer. Although more than 500 persons sought permission to enter the court-room, only 100 have been admitted.

The attorneys for the peasants moved that Constantin Danila, himself a number of times arrested for anti-Semitic agitation, be permitted to participate in the hearing against the Jewish defendants, but the court denied the request. Throughout the day the 15 Jewish defendants were questioned, all denied the accusations against them.

In the afternoon the leaders of the anti-Semitic defendants, the priests, Fathers Berindei and Dumitrescu, took the stand, and made a point blank denial of the charges against them, impugning to the Jews the responsibility for the agitation.

200 Roumanian Jews Reach Argentine; 2 Got to ICA Farms

Buenos Aires, Nov. 18.—Thirty Jewish farming families from towns in Transylvania, Roumania, arrived here today to take up homesteads on the land of the Jewish Colonization Association. The new arrivals number 200 people. Forty more families are expected shortly.

Conference Between Britain and Jewish Agency Leaders on Palestine Gets Started

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Nov. 18.—The announced conference between representatives of the Jewish Agency and the British government regarding the interpretation of the Palestine Mandate and a discussion of the government's Palestine policy is now under way in the foreign office with Arthur Henderson, Foreign Secretary, as chairman. The Jewish Agency is represented by members of its political committee, consisting of Dr. Chaim Weizmann, d'Avigdor Goldsmid, Dr. Selig Godetsky, M. Namier.

Although the conference is behind closed doors, the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, visiting the Foreign Office, was reliably informed that a preliminary list of questions prepared by the Jewish Agency Political Committee and placed before the conference for discussion included proposed changes in the text of the White Paper regarding the questions of immigration and land.

The Jewish Telegraphic Agency also learns that after an understanding has been reached with the Jews the government intends to initiate negotiations with the Arabs so that any possible changes in the text of the White Paper will probably be submitted for consideration to the Arabs also.

This information coming from reliable sources is borne out by the statements of Dr. Drummond Shiels and Prime Minister MacDonald, who hinted during yesterday's Parliamentary debate on Palestine that "at present the government is consulting Jewish representatives and will be only too glad to keep in similar touch with the Arabs."

Canadian Z. O. Approves Plan for Congress in Montreal

Montreal, Nov. 18.—The national council of the Canadian Zionist Organization today endorsed the proposal of H. Wolfsofsky, editor and publisher of the Montreal Jewish Eagle, that the seventeenth world Zionist Congress be held in Montreal. The Congress is to convene February 5th at a place as yet undecided.

Following the endorsement, the council took steps to initiate immediate negotiations with the Zionist Organization of America for that purpose. In local Zionist circles it is reported that a delegation of American Zionist leaders may be sent to London to convince the World Zionist Executive of the advisability of holding the Congress in the Canadian metropolis.

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Montreal Jewry Aroused Over Mayor's Anti-Semitic Speech

Montreal, Nov. 18—Montreal Jewry today began to voice its indignation over the open anti-Semitic attitude taken by its Mayor, Camilien Houde, who stated during a political speech in the city of Quebec that Jews should leave Montreal and go to Palestine.

"Such words uttered by the first magistrate of a city with over a million population must not be tolerated," declared Alderman Joseph Schubert. "If such a statement were made by the Mayor of New York, Chicago or any other North American city steps would immediately be taken to have him impeached. I call upon the responsible Jewish leaders of Montreal to voice their protest."

Max Seigler, another Jewish alderman who was previously a Houde supporter, declared that if the Mayor's statement as reported in the press is true, then the Mayor does not deserve to be the leader of the Conservative Party.

Under the heading "Demasked," the Canader Adler, local Yiddish daily, declares in an editorial that the mayor has steadily been veering towards the anti-Semites. It cites the mayor's actions until now in opposing the Jewish School Bill and finds that his anti-Semitic outburst in Quebec City a couple of days ago was only the logical result of the anti-Jewish stand which he had decided to take in connection with the school bill. As leader of the Conservative Opposition in the Province of Quebec, says the editorial, Mayor Houde has stooped to demagoguery and hasn't even shied at anti-Semitism in order to "prove" that the Liberal Premier Taschereau had "betrayed" the French-Canadian population of the province and had "sold out" to the Jews, by giving the latter the right to have their own schools.

Weizmann, Sitting Next to Moslem Leader at Historic Palestine Debate, Touched by Statesmen's Friendship for Zionist Cause

London, Nov. 18—The British government last night was put on trial in a hearing that lasted from four in the afternoon until very near midnight. The prosecutors were Lloyd George, Liberal leader, Col. Leopold Amery, Colonial Secretary in the last Conservative government, Sir Herbert Samuel, former High Commissioner of Palestine, James de Rothschild and half a dozen other powerful leaders of the Conservative and Liberal parties. The defenders were Prime Minister MacDonald and Dr. Drummond Shiels, under-secretary for the Colonies.

Impressive and severe was Lloyd George's half hour speech in which he openly and unhesitatingly termed the White Paper a most expressive anti-Semitic document. Amery was bitter; Samuel's words nettled. Dr. Shiels taking the floor after Lloyd George had a difficult job to weaken the strong impression which the Liberal spokesman's arguments had made.

Even more difficult was the same job for MacDonald who this time spoke colorlessly and said almost nothing. The crowded galleries were obviously disappointed at the Premier's fifteen minute speech which reminded his listeners of nothing but a preacher's Sunday sermon, being replete with good but meaningless phrases.

First Debate on Jewish Question

The high lights in last night's historic parliamentary debate, historic because it was the first debate in the existence of the British parliament where the Jewish question was so openly and broadly discussed, were first the fact that both Liberals and Conservatives openly cheered Lloyd George's assertion that the White Paper is an anti-Semitic document; secondly the disclosure made for the first time by Dr. Shiels that the British government has decided to assign \$12,500,000 as a loan for the development of Palestine and will submit its decision to Parliament after Christmas for sanction; third MacDonald's declaration that the British government will confer with the representatives of the Jewish Agency to adjust misunderstandings and specifying that the government does not intend to curtail immigration; fourth that all speakers, including the Prime Minister and Dr. Shiels, admitted that the Arabs had benefited by the Jewish settlement; fifth the demand by Lloyd George that the present government should give up the Palestine Mandate if it was inclined not to fulfill it in the sense of creating the Jewish National Home.

Just because there was no desire by the opposition parties to embarrass the government by bringing forward a hostile motion on the subject the debate was not put to a vote. If a vote were taken, however, three quarters of the members present would have openly voted against the White Paper. Such was the general spirit.

Dr. Chaim Weizmann, who resigned as president of the Jewish Agency and

of the Zionist Organization in protest against the White Paper, was in the audience eagerly taking in every word. He was to all intents and purposes the hero of the drama being enacted in the staid precincts of the House of Commons. Not a speaker failed to mention his name or to praise him as "wise leader and statesman."

Sitting next to him your correspondent watched him closely and could see that the compliment paid to him personally in the world's oldest parliament touched him almost not at all. He was, however, much touched by the fact that his cause, the cause of Zionism found so many friends among leading British statesmen. He could at this moment wish nothing better than such speeches as Lloyd George's, Amery's and the others which were full of acknowledgement for the abilities of the Jews to fulfill their historical duties when given an opportunity.

Side by side with Dr. Weizmann sat another man. It was Agha Khan, the millionaire Indian prince, Moslem pillar and head of one of the most important Moslem communities. He was also absorbed in watching every speaker but his interest was contrary to Weizmann's. He expected to hear a good word for the Arabs but instead he heard the cheers which the pro-Jewish speakers received.

In the visitor's galleries there was also a dramatic scene where Jews could be seen sitting next to dark-faced Arabs who exhibited great interest in witnessing the historic discussion on Jewish-Arab rights in the Holy Land. Leo Motzkin, chairman of the Zionist Actions Committee, could be seen in these galleries

David Belasco, veteran playwright and producer, is seriously ill from lobar pneumonia it was reported today by his personal physician. He was brought to New York in a Pullman compartment from Baltimore where he was working hard prior to the opening of his new play, "Tonight or Never."

His condition is critical and little hope for his recovery is offered. His daughter, who is the wife of Morris Gest, was permitted to see him for a few minutes. Mr. Belasco, who is 76 years of age, was born in San Francisco, but has made his home in New York.

Mrs. Arthur Brin's Father Dies in Minneapolis Accident

Minneapolis, Nov. 18—John Fligelman, 75 years old, prominent in Jewish activities for the past forty years, was run down and killed by an automobile here last night.

Mr. Fligelman was the father of Mrs. Arthur Brin, vice-president of the National Council of Jewish Women. Besides Mrs. Brin another daughter and four sons survive.

Work on Haifa-Bagdad Rail Line Starts in Fortnight

Bagdad, Nov. 18.—Work on the proposed Haifa-Bagdad railway, which will link Egypt and British India by rail via Haifa, will start within a fortnight it is learned here today in connection with the arrival of 80 British engineers from India. They are leaving shortly for Haifa where work on the project, which together with the Mosul pipe-line will entail an expenditure of \$100,000,000, will start.

Late in September the British Colonial Office issued a statement granting assistance from the Colonial Development Fund towards the cost of a detailed survey to be undertaken in connection with the Haifa-Bagdad railway. It is believed that the 80 engineers are about to start on this survey.

The Mosul pipe line, which will carry the oil from the Mosul fields in Iraq, is to have its Mediterranean terminus at Haifa. The proposed railway is expected to parallel the pipe line.

Egypt Lowers Tariff on Palestine Oranges, Bananas

Cairo, Nov. 18.—The Egyptian government today reduced its recently imposed high tariff on oranges and bananas from Palestine. The tariff resulted from the Palestine government's decision to raise the tariff on vegetables and dairy products from Egypt.

Pioneer Women to Dine Hannah Czizik Nov. 20

A reception for Hannah Czizik, leader of the settlements of "halutzoth," or women pioneers, of Palestine, will be given on Thursday evening, November 20th, by the Pioneer Women's Organization of this country, upon whose invitation Miss Czizik has come. The reception will take place in Beethoven Hall. A short concert program will be rendered at the meeting.

Polish Embassy Intervened in Immigration Suspension

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Nov. 18.—That the Polish embassy in London had intervened with the British foreign office regarding the suspension of immigration to Palestine was revealed here today. The Polish embassy had complained over the fact that 2,000 Polish Jews had liquidated their businesses with the intention of proceeding to Palestine and then had not had permission to go granted them.

The British foreign office replying to the protest today indicated that of the 1,500 immigration certificates recently released, Poland would probably receive over 1,000. At the same time the foreign office expressed surprise that so many Jews were able to liquidate their affairs in the two days that elapsed between the time the High Commissioner released the certificates last May and the time the Colonial Office suspended them.

May End Lemberg Kehillah for White Paper Protest

Lemberg, Nov. 18.—Because the Lemberg Jewish community submitted a protest against the British White Paper to the British consul in Lemberg the community may be dissolved, it was learned today. Administrative circles are of the opinion that the community stepped out of its competence which does not entitle it to direct contact with the foreign corps. The Lemberg community was the first to adopt a sharply-worded protest against the White Paper.

Vaad Leumi Expected to Turn Down White Paper and Refuse Cooperation with Government

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Nov. 18.—The Jewish National Council at its meeting tonight is expected to reject the White Paper and to decide not to cooperate with the British government in view of the failure of Premier MacDonald at last night's Parliamentary debate on Palestine to make any statement that could be interpreted as a modification or explanation of the White Paper.

In both official and unofficial Jewish circles here great disappointment is being voiced at the Prime Minister's statement. It had been expected that the Premier would say something that would result in a modification or at least an explaining away of some of the sore points in the White Paper.

The text of the Premier's declaration as well as the speeches of the other statesmen in the House of Commons appeared this morning in extra editions of all the Hebrew dailies and of the Palestine Bulletin.

While none of the Arab leaders or papers have yet commented on the Parliamentary debate, the Falastin, fearing that despite the Prime Minister's failure to say so in so many words that the British government is preparing to modify the White Paper under pressure of the Jewish protest, advocates a special meeting of the Arab Executive to notify the British government that the Arabs will not tolerate any modification of the White Paper.

Art Work of Boris Schatz on Exhibition in Newark

Newark, Nov. 18.—An exhibition of the creative genius of Prof. Boris Schatz, founder and director of the Arts & Crafts School Bezalel and the National Museum of Jerusalem, is now on view in the local Y.M.-Y.W.H.A. Building. The exhibition includes oil paintings, brass repousse and ivory carved miniatures and is drawing record audiences. Professor Schatz and his son Bezalel are personally conducting the exhibit which is sponsored by a committee headed by Louis V. Aronson.

London Press Divided Over Parliament Palestine Debate

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Nov. 18.—A marked division of opinion is manifested in today's London press as to whether yesterday's parliamentary debate on Palestine will do anything to pacify Jewish grievances resulting from the White Paper. "It still remains to be seen whether yesterday's explanation by Premier MacDonald and Dr. Shiels will compose the angry excitement existing among the Jews of many countries, especially in New York," writes the London Times. The paper emphasizes that "yesterday's debate should serve as another warning of the danger attending any carelessness in preparation of state papers."

Taking a contrary attitude the Daily Telegraph points out that "we don't suppose that the government's assurances yesterday will placate the resentment aroused in Zionist circles by the icy and disinherit tone of the White Paper. This assurance however shows that the government is very anxious to remove the bad impression caused by Dr. Weizmann's and the other resignations."

The Morning Post says that yesterday's debate was conducted chiefly with an eye on the forthcoming by-election in Whitechapel. The paper criticizes Lloyd George for his accusation of anti-Semitism saying that this accusation was not only disgraceful but fantastic and concludes that Premier MacDonald and Dr. Shiels deserve praise for having the courage to stand for the principle of a fair deal to both races.

Heschel Farbstein, noted Zionist leader and president of the Warsaw Jewish community, was defeated.

Others elected were Rabbis Levin, Agudist, and the following Zionists: Joshua Thon, in Crakow; Henry Rosmarin, in Stanislov; N. Somerstein, in Lemberg; S. Rosenblatt and Chaim Neiger, in Lodz, and Russ Alexander. The Jews elected on the government ticket were M. Minchberg, M. Wislicki, M. Kaufman, G. Minkovsky and Ignacy Jaeger.

Rabbi Brod, Deputy Farbstein and M. Wigodsky, candidates of the United Zionist bloc, were defeated. In Vilna and Bialystock, Jewish candidates lost by but a few hundred votes as a result of a split among the Jewish voters who were presented with the opportunity of voting for five Jewish tickets not only in this city but throughout the country.

In Warsaw alone 150,000 Jews went to the polls, of whom 80,000 cast their votes for the Jewish tickets, while the rest of the Jewish votes were divided among other parties, with a large majority to the pro-government bloc. The general impression here is that the failure of the Jewish electorate to concentrate on one, or at the most two, Jewish tickets was an important factor in the Pilsudski victory.

James de Rothschild, PICA Head, Denies Claim of Simpson That PICA Colonies Benefit Only Arabs

London, Nov. 18.—The assertion made by Sir John Simpson in his report on land settlement, development and immigration in Palestine, that the colonies of the Palestine Jewish Agricultural Association (PICA) have been more beneficial to the Arabs than the Zionist settlement, was refuted by James de Rothschild during the Palestine debate in the House of Commons yesterday.

Mr. de Rothschild is the son of Baron Edmond de Rothschild, venerated throughout the Jewish world as the man who has done more work for Palestine than anybody else. The Baron, as he is usually called, is reported to have spent more than 60,000,000 dollars on his land in Palestine which is administered by PICA of which James de Rothschild is chairman. The PICA is the largest land-holding agency in Palestine, owning 454,840 metric denims of land.

"By accident of birth," Mr. de Rothschild said jokingly, "I happen now to be chairman for the PICA which the White Paper and the Simpson Report mention. The PICA has created good relations with the Arabs. After fifty years the Arab villages of the PICA colonies are flourishing but the same will happen with the Jewish colonies. Jewish colonization must give more employment for the Jews because you cannot make a Jewish national home without land and without Jews.

"The Arab suspicions to which the White Paper refers are totally unfounded. Good terms between the two races are developing from cultural, economic and social cooperation to which the government has contributed little help. Without a Jewish national home there would be no British Mandate," Mr. de Rothschild concluded, appealing to the Prime Minister to approach the problem from the same angle of sympathy as expressed in the pamphlet "A Socialist in Palestine," by Ramsay MacDonald.

Mr. de Rothschild read to the House of Commons a letter that Dr. Chaim Weizmann addressed to Lord Passfield last September in which the Zionist leader suggested calling an Arab-Jewish conference. At the end of his address, Mr. de Rothschild quoted from the famous "Hebrew Melodies" by Byron and concluded with the following verse from Byron's poem "O, Weep for Those":

"Tribes of the wandering foot and weary breast,
How shall ye flee away and be at rest?
The wild dove hath her nest, the fox his cave,
Mankind their country — Israel, the grave."

along side of an Arab sheikh and Rabbi Meier Berlin, Mizrahi leader, sat next to a Moslem in full oriental garb.

Passfield Not Present

It was remarkable that while the benches of the Conservatives and the Liberals were crowded the benches of the Laborites were half empty. Missing were the Labor members who are dissatisfied with the White Paper. Missing too was Lord Passfield. The central figure on the Labor benches was the gray-headed Premier who in American fashion sat with his feet stretched out on the table at which each speaker appeared—unusual in Congress but considered a common thing in the House of Commons.

His speech meant nothing. He said he agreed fully with Dr. Shiels but what Dr. Shiels outlined was far from what the Jews would have expected since Dr. Shiels concluded his long oration with the assertion that the present government policy will remain as recommended by Sir John Simpson, otherwise religious riots similar to the Wailing Wall troubles may occur. "Touch one Moslem and the entire Orient will be set aflame," Shiels said, thus making it clear why the Labor government thinks it necessary to maintain its present Arab policy.

The debate was concluded at 11:30 p. m. with an address by Commander Kenworthy. The House usually concludes its business at 11 p. m. but Kenworthy asked for an additional half hour which was granted by the speaker.

Prize-Winning Jewish Novel to Be Announced in January

Publication of the Jewish prize novel offered jointly by the Stratford Company and the Jewish Tribune will be begun in the first issue of the new monthly magazine that has recently been announced. The \$2,000 prize is for serial right publication in the Jewish Tribune and for book publication by the Stratford Company.

It was recently announced that beginning January, 1931, the Jewish Tribune will publish two separate publications, a national monthly and a New York weekly. David N. Mosesohn is the editor and M. Mosesohn the publisher of the Jewish Tribune.

Rabbi Millgram Named to Philadelphia Pulpit

Philadelphia, Nov. 18.—Rabbi Abraham E. Millgram, formerly rabbi of the Beth Shalom Congregation of Wilmington, Delaware, was last night elected spiritual leader of the Congregation Beth Israel of this city. Rabbi Millgram is to fill the pulpit that was made vacant by the resignation of Rabbi Marvin Nathan, who occupied this position for twenty-five years.

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B'nai Brith Head Urges Britain to Reconsider White Paper and Simpson Report

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Cincinnati, Nov. 18.—Voicing an "earnest appeal and solemn protest against the recently issued White Paper" on Palestine in behalf of the B'nai Brith, Alfred M. Cohen, international president of that Jewish order, today wired Sir Ronald Lindsay, British ambassador at Washington, urging that Great Britain carefully reconsider the subject matter of that document and of the Simpson report.

Speaking in the name of an international fraternity of Jews with 80,000 members in 26 countries, Mr. Cohen wrote that the B'nai Brith "respectfully requests you to convey to His Majesty's Government its earnest and solemn protest against the recently issued White Paper which, by denying further immigration of Jews in considerable numbers and setting up insurmountable barriers to the acquisition of land by Jews, nullifies the provision in the Mandate of Great Britain over Palestine guaranteeing that His Majesty's Government will use its best endeavors to facilitate the establishment of a national home for the Jewish people.

"The B'nai Brith further, respectfully, but none the less firmly, protests against the implication, if indeed it be not the conclusion, of both the Simpson report and the White Paper that the enormous amount of constructive work done in Palestine by Jews at the expense and sacrifice of world Jewry has been detrimental to the interests of the Arab population. The evidence of hundreds of impartial observers of many nations is to the contrary.

"The B'nai Brith unites with others, who, in behalf of the Jewish people, are urging careful reconsideration of the subject matter of the White Paper and the Simpson report to the end that the inviolability of the pledge of His Majesty's Government to the Jewish people and to all the nations concerned in the Mandate of Palestine may be assured."

Jonah B. Wise to Be Honored Here Nov. 23
