Melchett Urges Whitechapel Jews Not to Vote for Government's Candidate

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Nov. 21.—A small-sized riot developed today in Whitechapel when George Lansbury, prominent Laborite, attempted to address an election meeting in behalf of James Hall, the Labor candidate in the by-election in Whitechapel, a strongly Jewish constituency. Throughout the district there is a growing tendency among the Jewish voters to support the Liberal candidate, who is a Zionist, as a protest against the government's Palestine policy. The booing and hissing of Lansbury is but one indication of the anti-government sentiment in the district.

With the election set for December 3 the candidates of all four parties are making the Palestine question the most important issue in view of the fact that almost half of the electorate is Jewish. The Jewish Socialists have practically decided to support the Labor candidate while many other Jews are inclined to vote for Barnett Janner, the Liberal candidate.

The Conservatives are mobilizing all their forces in an endeavor to win the seat from the Laborites. Lord Melchett, resigned chairman of the Council of the Jewish Agency, and a Conservative leader, has sent, through his son, Henry Mond, a letter urging the Jews of the district to support the Conservative nominee, T. L. B. Guinness.

Lord Melchett's letter emphasizes that the White Paper is a deliberate insult for world Jewry, particularly the Palestinian. It belittles "all our great work," Lord Melchett writes, "about which Premier MacDonald waxed so

Jewish Beggar Hangs Self in Haifa Synagogue

Haifa, Nov. 20.—The first case of a Jew committing suicide in a synagogue in Palestine occurred today when a Sephardic Jewish beggar was found hanging from a beam in the Prophiet Elijah synagogue. Police are endeavoring to establish the identity of the man.

Vandals Mar Memorial to Walter Rathenau

Berlin, Nov. 21.—Vandals, believed to be Fascists, today smeared soot over the fountain erected to the memory of the late Walter Rathenau in People's Park, in the Rehberg section of the city. The bas-relief of the murdered German diplomat and industrialist was also covered with anti-Semitic and Hitlerite emblems while a part of the bas-relief itself was broken off.

Resume Fight for Jewish Rights in Hungarian Diet

Budapest, Nov. 21.—The fight for Jewish rights in Hungary was resumed during today's parliamentary debate with the speakers using language even stronger than that employed in the discussion in the last two days over the exclusion of Jews from membership in the Hungarian Order of Heroes.

Deputy Fabian openly accused the government of practicing an unofficial numerus clausus in providing Jewish ex-servicemen with civilian employment. He supported this charge by citing figures to prove that only ten percent of the Jewish war veterans had received civilian jobs.

This charge aroused Julius Goemboes, minister of war, who had favored the barring of Jews from the Order of Heroes, to interrupt Deputy Fabian by shouting "mention specific cases." The debate then developed into a heated argument exceeding by far the stormy scene enacted during the discussion on the question of Jewish exclusion from the Order of Heroes.

This matter was again raised today by the Jewish deputies, one of them inquiring from his seat why one whose mother or wife is a Jewess may become a cabinet minister but is not permitted to belong to the Order of Heroes.

Nazis Try to Prevent Habimah Play in Wurzburg

Berlin, Nov. 21.—Police today dispersed a crowd of several hundred National Socialists in Wurzburg who sought to prevent the showing of a performance of the Habimah, world famous Hebrew dramatic troupe. The Habimah has been touring the German provinces.

The Nazis formed a circle around the entrance to the Wurzburg municipal theatre and prevented any one from entering. Those who sought to wend their way through the Nazis were pushed around and threatened. While a part of the Nazis held the would-be patrons at bay others distributed Hitlerite leaflets. The performance finally began almost two hours late when the police chased the Nazis away from the theatre.

Van Vriesland Named Honorary Palestine Consul of Holland

Jerusalem, Nov. 21.—S. A. Van Vriesland, a former member of the Zionist Executive and now an official of the Palestine Potash, Ltd., was today appointed honorary consul-general of Holland in Palestine. He succeeded Jacobus Kann, also a Zionist, as Dutch consul here.

Rutenberg Going to London to Aid in Parley with Government Prof. Frankfurter May Go Also

Jerusalem, Nov. 21.—The Executive of the Jewish National Council today decided to send the Council's chairman, Pinchas Rutenberg, to London to aid in the Jewish Agency's negotiations with the British government. Simultaneously the Executive appointed a committee of three consisting of Chaim Arlosoroff, Meyer Dizengoff and Berl Katzenelson, all of whom are now in London, to present the Council's political views. One of these will fill the place allotted to the Council on the Jewish Agency's political commission.

London, Nov. 21.—Up to last night it was not known here whether Pinchas Rutenberg, chairman of the Jewish National Council of Palestine and Prof. Felix Frankfurter of Harvard University would come to London to fill the two vacancies left for them on the Jewish Agency's political commission as the representatives of Palestine and the United States respectively.

The post for the United States is now vacant but Dr. Maurice Hexter is acting as the American observer. Another observer is Prof. Harold Laski, who although British, is nevertheless considered an American observer too because of his affiliations with Justice Louis D. Brandeis. Professor Laski ceased to be active in Zionist work when Justice Brandeis and his followers left in 1921 but now is substituting for Professor Frankfurter.

His participation in the present negotiations is considered a great gain for the Zionists in view of his excellent connections with the cabinet and his great experience in British politics. Professor Laski, who holds an important position as chairman of the government

Cabinet Not United on Palestine Question, Lady Passfield Says

London, Nov. 21.—No united front exists among the members of the British cabinet on the Palestine question, declared Lady Passfield, wife of Lord Passfield, British Colonial Secretary, in an address before the Fabian Society, the old London Socialist club of which Bernard Shaw, Sidney Webb (now Lord Passfield) and his wife were the founders.

Lady Passfield said that a strong difference of opinion prevails among the members of the cabinet. Reviewing the present political activities of the Labor cabinet she avoided dwelling much on the Palestine question, although she did say it was one of the most troublesome problems facing the government.

Jews Win Fight Against Anti-Semitic Lake Placid Club

The Lake Placid Club will relinquish all claims upon the property on which the state of New York is to erect a bod-sled run for the 1932 winter Olympic games, according to an announcement made on Thursday by Dr. Godfrey Dewey, chairman of the winter games committee and vice-president of the Lake Placid Club. Should the state fail to maintain the run after the completion of the Olympic games, the property will be turned over to the Lake Placid community, said Dr. Dewey.

This is regarded as a victory for the National Council of the Jewish Tribune, which had objected to improvements being made with state funds upon the property of the Lake Placid Club, which discriminates against Jews in membership admissions. Mark Eisner, attorney for the Council, earlier in the week had issued a challenge to the Lake Placid Club to lease its property, upon which the state of New York is to build a bod-sled run, to the state, or convey it in fee simple to the town of North Elba. From Dr. Dewey's latest statement it appears that the Lake Placid Club is now willing to do this.

"Our sole desire in this situation," said Mr. Eisner, "is to prevent the enrichment of a notorious anti-Semitic institution through the application of state funds derived in part through the taxation of our Jewish citizens."

The protest against the use of state funds to improve Lake Placid Club property was first made by the National Council of the Jewish Tribune a fortnight ago to Governor Roosevelt. On August 2 last the state Olympic Games Commission awarded a contract for a bod-sled run to be built on the property of the Lake Placid Club at a cost of \$60,000. The protest to Governor Roosevelt was embodied in a letter written by David N. Mosessohn, editor of the Jewish Tribune and chairman of its National Council.

Cyrus Adler Heads Provisional Committee Acting for American Members of Administrative Committee of Jewish Agency

A provisional committee of four which will act on behalf of the American members of the Jewish Agency for Palestine has been established, according to an announcement made by Dr. Cyrus Adler, joint chairman of the Council of the Jewish Agency, through the Jewish Telegraphic Agency. This provisional Committee has been created in consequence of the resignation of Felix M. Warburg as chairman of the Administrative Committee of the Jewish Agency in protest against the White Paper issued by the British government on October 31 restricting Jewish immigration and land purchase in Palestine.

Dr. Adler's statement follows:

"When the White Paper of October, 1930, representing the statement of policy of the British Government with respect to the Palestine Mandate, was made public, in common with Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, and Lord Melchett, chairman of the Council thereof, Mr. Felix M. Warburg felt that he must resign from office in the Jewish Agency. He announced that further relations with the British government, such as the chairmanship of the Administrative Committee entailed, were no longer possible in his case. At the same time, he requested that the necessary steps should be taken for the creation of an interim emergency committee to carry on the affairs of the Administrative Committee of the Jewish Agency. He made clear that his devotion to the Jewish cause and to Palestine remained unabated, and that he would continue to lend his best efforts to support our work in Palestine which challenges the deepest interest of all of us.

Recalls Warburg's Suggestion

"Immediately after the announcement of his resignation from the office of chairman of the Administrative Committee, Mr. Warburg caused to be called together the American members of the Administrative Committee of the Jewish Agency at a special meeting on Wednesday, October 22, 1930. At this fully attended meeting, Mr. Warburg confirmed the notice of his resignation, which he desired to take effect forthwith. He suggested that a committee of the American members should study the situation, and in his behalf, forward to the appropriate bodies and offices of the Jewish Agency, the notice of his formal resignation from the Chairmanship of the Administrative Committee.

"By resolution of the American members of the Administrative Committee, confirmed at a subsequent meeting especially called therefor on November 13th, 1930, it was the sense of the American members of the Administrative Committee that Mr. Warburg's resignation be handed to an emergency committee, to be, by that committee, transmitted to the proper authorities and that the aforesaid committees should take immediate steps to study the entire situation and take such action as it might deem itself legally

empowered to do and as seemed to it proper.

"Dr. Cyrus Adler, as Joint Chairman of the Council, presided over the meeting of the American members, and was directed by the resolution adopted, to appoint an emergency committee in the sense indicated in this statement. That emergency committee consisted of Dr. Cyrus Adler, Bernard Flexner and Robert Szold, the chairman of the Administration Committee of the Zionist Organization of America.

Adler Named Chairman

"Having considered the matter fully, the emergency committee has established the following provisional committee in behalf of the American members of the Administrative Committee: Dr. Cyrus Adler, chairman; Bernard Flexner, Morris Rothenberg, Robert Szold, Julius Simon as a member of the Executive of the Jewish Agency, will serve ex-officio with this committee, and Joseph C. Hyman will serve as the secretary of the Provisional Committee.

"It is intended that the Provisional Committee will from time to time call upon the American members of the Administrative Committee for counsel; it will serve as an interim committee to dispose of all emergent matters, to guide and counsel the secretary in the discharge of his daily duties, and to maintain formal contact between the American members of the Administrative Committee and the offices of the Jewish Agency in England.

"Dr. Adler, as chairman of the Provisional Committee, is happy to state that the Committee has been in constant, in fact, almost daily touch with Mr. Warburg, with Mr. Justice Louis D. Brandeis and with Prof. Felix Frankfurter, who have indicated that they are ready to cooperate with and advise the Committee on all matters of importance. The Provisional Committee has transmitted to the office of the Jewish Agency abroad Mr. Warburg's notice of resignation."

Montreal Workers Taxed for Jewish Philanthropy Drive

Montreal, Nov. 20.—The Montreal branch of the Amalgamated Clothing Workers' Union today announced that it had assessed its members two dollars annually per man and one dollar per woman as a contribution to the \$300,000 campaign of the Montreal Federation of Jewish Philanthropies which opens next week.

Palestine Drafting Law on Land Purchase to Aid Tenant

Jerusalem, Nov. 21.—The Palestine government has drafted land legislation which is designed principally to protect tenants, it is learned today. The proposed ordinance, which is to be promulgated shortly, disallows land sales subsequent to foreclosures on occupied lands.

MacDonald Personally Initiated Present Talks with Agency in Letter to Weizmann

London, Nov. 21.—The present negotiations between the British government and the Jewish Agency are the result of Premier MacDonald's personal intervention, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns today from an absolutely reliable source. This source points out that the Jewish Agency would never have entered into negotiations with the government so long as the White Paper was not withdrawn if Premier MacDonald, under his own signature, had not addressed an invitation to Dr. Chaim Weizmann saying, "let's put the White Paper aside for the moment and consider the situation as is."

Accepting this invitation the Agency's political commission nevertheless found it politically wise to devote the first session of the conference not to submitting demands but to reviewing the injustices contained in the White Paper's recommendations. This was to serve as a stepping stone by which the government would indirectly be advised of the character that the Jewish demands would have when submitted at further sessions.

The minutes of the first session were sent out today as a secret document to the parties concerned. In his two and a half hour speech Dr. Weizmann pointed out that the Jewish Agency would never accept the recommendations on immigration contained in the White Paper and that it would oppose the legislative council.

Touching on immigration he said that the number of Jewish immigrants must be fixed not by Arab unemployment nor even by Jewish unemployment but by the possibilities of employment offered to the new arrivals. Referring to the legislative council, Dr. Weizmann made it clear that while the Jews had agreed to participate in a legislative assembly in 1922 they would not do so now.

He pointed out that in 1922 the extreme section of the Arabs was unpopular with the Palestine government but since then because the extreme Arabs have gained a larger influence the Palestine government submitted constantly to their demands and even encouraged them in many ways. In addition to this, he stated, Palestine officials who will become members of the legislative council are no longer trusted by the Jewish people to carry out the obligations of the Mandate.

Montreal Jewry to Mark Rosenberg's 70th Birthday

Montreal, Nov. 21.—Orthodox Jews of Montreal are preparing to celebrate the jubilee of Rabbi Jehuda Rosenberg, spiritual leader of the Polish Jews in Montreal, who has attained his seventieth birthday. Rabbi Rosenberg is the author of many religious books in the Hebrew language. Born in Poland of an eminent rabbinical family, he came to Canada in 1912 and during recent years has headed the Federation of Orthodox Jewish Congregations in Montreal.

Irish Organization Aids Jewish Philanthropies

An Irish society in New York has donated one thousand dollars to the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies. Dudley D. Sicher, president of the federation, announced this contribution yesterday by the Friendly Sons of St. Patrick. James A. Foley, president of the Friendly Sons of St. Patrick, in a letter to Mr. Sicher, stated that the contribution was one of three voted at the annual meeting of the society, the others being \$1,500 to the Catholic Charities and \$1,000 to the Charity Organization Society.

Hexter Denies Report on No Agreement with Britain

London, Nov. 20.—Replying to an inquiry from the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, Dr. Maurice Hexter, American member of the Jewish Agency Executive, today denied the Daily Telegraph's report that the conference between the Jewish Agency and the British government would lead to no successful results because the American leaders of the Agency had cabled instructions to the representatives of the Agency here not to come to any conclusive agreement with the British government. The paper added that American Zionist leaders had counseled the Zionist Executive against an understanding unless the White Paper was annulled.

Dr. Hexter pointed out that it was only natural that Jewish Agency leaders in the United States should ratify any agreement reached with the British government before its terms were made public since it would be a document sanctioned by the Jewish side.

Meanwhile a division of opinion prevails among the Jewish leaders as to whether the conference with the government will bring the expected results. Most optimistic of all is Dr. Chaim Weizmann. The least hopeful are the leaders from Palestine.

The Palestinian leaders, Chaim Arlosoroff, Berl Katzenelson, Joseph Sprinza and Rabbi Meier Berlin have been detained in London by the Zionist Executive so that they may be on the spot while negotiations with the government are going on.

It is understood that the first statement regarding the negotiations may be made public Monday if the conference, which adjourned until Monday, meets again then. The statement is to be worked out by the British government and the Jewish Agency jointly.

Sterne Wins Art Prize at Washington Exhibit

Clark prizes in the twelfth biennial exhibition of paintings which will open here next Sunday. The exhibition will take place at the Corcoran Gallery of Art.

ment arbitration committees and who is considered a great authority on the British constitution, was, in fact, the intermediary between the government and Dr. Chaim Weizmann since the issuance of the White Paper. Disgusted by that document he broke relations with Lord Passfield, whose personal friend he was for a number of years, and decided to plunge into the work of having the White Paper withdrawn. He is the son of Nathan Laski, a prominent Manchester Zionist and member of the Board of British Deputies.

Rabbis Offer to Reduce Wine Quota for N. Y. Congregations

Washington, Nov. 21.—Offering to reduce the wine quotas of Jewish congregations in New York City below the allowances of the national prohibition act, a group of New York rabbis, representing the Assembly of Hebrew Orthodox Rabbis of the United States and Canada, protested yesterday to Dr. James M. Moran, commissioner of industrial alcohol, against "over zealousness" and "undue suspicions" of Federal prohibition officials in New York City in their watch on sacramental wine distribution there.

The offer was presented by Rabbis Kalman Kellner, J. J. Margolin and Bernard Birstein, officers of the Rabbinical Board of New York, to prove that Orthodox rabbis are not interested in the diversion of wine. The plan is to limit allowances of wine for sacramental purposes in the home to 1½ gallons per family, instead of the five gallons permitted under the Volstead law.

Complaints at the alleged dilatory tactics of prohibition officials in dealing with rabbinical applications for wine permits were also made by the rabbis, who said that in many cases no action would be taken on the applications. This, declared the rabbis, frequently worked hardships when rabbis were preparing their ceremonies in advance.

Would Close All Papers Till Printable News Is Defined

Jerusalem, Nov. 21.—A proposal that all newspaper owners in Palestine discontinue the publication of their papers until the government definitely clears up what is printable and what is not is made today by the Arab paper, Al Hayat, in connection with the suspension of the Hebrew daily, Doar Hayom and the Arab daily, Falastin.

The Jewish National Council is expected to protest the suspension of the Doar Hayom while Mouzza Kazim Pasha, president of the Arab Executive, today saw Mark Aitchison Young, the chief secretary, and protested against the suspension of the Falastin. Meanwhile another Arab paper, Seraat Al Mouskatim, which is under Moslem ownership, today opened its columns to the staff of the Falastin for the duration of the latter's suspension.

Refute Charges Immigration of Jews Aids Bolshevism

London, Nov. 21—Indignant denials of the charges by Lord Lloyd, former High Commissioner of Egypt, that Jewish immigration was turning Palestine into a "springboard for Bolshevism in the East," are made today in letters to the London Times by Chief Rabbi Hertz and Col. Richard Meinertzhagen, former chief political officer of Palestine.

Rabbi Hertz points out that the accusation of bad faith which is being hurled at Great Britain from every quarter of the globe "cannot be weakened by repeating cruel and baseless charges against Zionism or the Jews of Palestine." Rabbi Hertz, who has been a leader in the campaign against religious persecution in Russia, charges Lord Lloyd with being unaware of the fact that no class of the Russian population has been "persecuted with greater ferocity than the Zionists, the Bolsheviks openly boasting of their share in instigating the Arab massacres of 1929."

Declaring that "it is therefore inconceivable that the Zionist authorities should grant immigration certificates to Soviet propagandists," Rabbi Hertz concludes by saying that the Federation of Jewish Labor, representing the entire Jewish working class of Palestine, is strongly anti-Communist and no Communist is permitted to remain in its ranks.

Pointing out that the Jews of Russia have suffered most from Bolshevism and are therefore "least likely to spread the disease," Colonel Meinertzhagen quotes the late Lord Balfour as having told him in Paris on July 30, 1919, on the eve of Meinertzhagen's appointment to Palestine, that "all development, industrial schemes of all kinds and financial assistance must be based on the principle that the Jews are the most favored nation in Palestine and all preparatory work undertaken before the final destiny of Palestine is settled must be similarly based on this principle."

Asserting that the British policy in Palestine since 1920 has been whittled down to "exasperating limits by the very persons whose duty it has been to carry out the policy according to Lord Balfour's interpretation," Colonel Meinertzhagen says that obstruction to Zionism by the government or by persons "blinded to the immense moral and physical advantages of the Palestine policy by anti-Semitism and by unsympathetic officials in Palestine and in Downing Street proved greater enemies of Zionism than all the economic and political obstacles."

Wilmington's First Soup Kitchen Opens by Jews

Wilmington, Del., Nov. 21—Wilmington's first soup house conducted by two Jews will open here next Tuesday. The soup house committee is headed by Abe Greenstine, a grocer of this city, who with several others have banded together to take care of several hundred families who are in destitute circumstances. The soup house will be located on East Fourth Street, in a building that has been donated by Max Weiss.

eloquent in the debate in the House of Commons and tampers with the fundamental principles which guided the Jewish National Fund and the Jewish Federation of Labor in the past."

Saying that the government's attitude during the debate was entirely unsatisfactory and declaring that he was tired of hearing nothing but compliments, Lord Melchett stated that "we are entitled to insist not only on words but on deeds, on active assistance by the Mandatory in the establishment of the Jewish National Home instead of hostile neutrality which we have endured so long." Finally he appeals to the Jews not to vote for the government candidate.

Proposes Good Will Seminars at All Colleges, Universities

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Lewisburg, Pa., Nov. 21—Self-criticism by both Jews and Christians as a cure for misunderstandings between religious and racial groups was suggested yesterday by Rabbi Abram Simon of Washington, D. C., addressing the Good Will Seminar of Bucknell University. No group should be afraid to analyze its weaknesses, said the rabbi, for only in that way can it correct its own faults and thus gain greater strength and dignity in the eyes of other groups.

Rabbi Simon also suggested that Good Will Seminars should be a permanent feature at all colleges, to be held in conjunction with the sociological departments of universities. These seminars, he thought, should study how prejudices originate, how Jews function in various walks of American life, etc. They should also publish text books on the contribution of various religious and racial groups. Greater cooperation between Jews and Gentiles and a "Better Understanding Week" were also proposed by Rabbi Simon, who called attention to specific instances of discrimination against Jews in social areas, university circles and economic relationships.
