## Only One Jew Elected to Polish Senate; Failure of Agudath to Cooperate Blamed

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Nov. 24—Only one Jew, Dr. Schreiber, was elected to the Polish Senate in yesterday's elections. He represents the Lemberg district. This marks the first time that Warsaw has not had a Jewish senator. In the previous Senate there were 5 Jews among the 111 senators.

Great disappointment is being voiced in Jewish circles at the failure of not more than one Jew's having been elected. This is attributed to the government's policy of arresting Zionist candidates in many cities and the failure of the Agudath Israel to join in a united Jewish bloc. The defeat of all Jewish candidates in Warsaw is blamed on the Agudath's nomination of the banker, M. Shereshevsky against the Zionist, Senator Koerner.

The Agudath declined to yield to the Zionist suggestion of withdrawing Shereshevsky's candidacy in Warsaw in exchange for the Zionists' withdrawing their nominee in Lublin, thus uniting the Jewish vote and ensuring the election of at least one Jewish senator in each city. In Lodz, a German senator was elected with Zionist support.

The election was marked by the arrest of numerous Zionist candidates in various parts of the country. In Bialystok, M. Wachumowski and the secretary of the Zionist Organization, M. Gluckfeld, were arrested. In East Galicia, especially in Lemberg, many Jewish candidates were arrested. Hooligans broke into the office of M. Rothfeld, a Zionist candidate, doing much damage.

## Thousands of Warsaw, Lodz Jews Influenza Victims

Warsaw, Nov. 24—One hundred thousand Jews in Warsaw and more than half of the 180,000 Jews of Lodz, have been stricken with influenza in a epidemic sweeping through the Jewish districts of this cities. The total number of those attacked by the epidemic in Warsaw is estimated at 200,000, most of them in the densely populated Jewish quarters.

The epidemic, however, is not serious and no deaths have been reported. The hospitals nevertheless are filled to capacity and the disease is unchecked.

## Form Society to Help Zionists in Soviet Russia

Tel Aviv, Nov. 24—A society to aid the persecuted Zionists of Russia was organized here today. In an appeal setting aside a tag day for the Russian Zionists the Jews are urged to "remember the captives of Zion in this critical hour."

## Find Ancient Arch Under Synagogue Near Wailing Wall

Jerusalem, Nov. 24—An ancient arch under a synagogue close to the Wailing Wall was uncovered today on King David Street near the gate chain leading to the Temple area. King David Street is supported by underground arches which in ancient times spanned the Tyropean valley. The newly-found arch resembles the famous Sir Charles Wilson arch below which is the Burak pool named after Mohammed's legendary horse.

The find was made during repairs on an old drain. Simultaneously a pool about 16 metres below the street level was found. The government department of antiquities has ordered work on the drain suspended pending an investigation of the arch.

## Palestine Revisionists Vote to Secede from World Z. O.

Tel Aviv, Nov. 24—A resolution calling upon the World Executive of the Zionist Revisionists, the opposition to the Weizmann regime, to take immediate steps to secede from the Zionist Organization, to repudiate the Jewish Agency's negotiations with the British government, to reject the legislative assembly and to return the recently released 1,500 immigration certificates was adopted here early this morning at the conclusion of the annual conference of Palestinian Revisionists.

The measures were carried through the insistence of a fraction of the Palestine Revisionist party favoring immediate secession of the Revisionists from the Zionist Organization. The conference, which was attended by 36 delegates, elected a new central committee and a new executive.

The members of the new committee are Dr. Wolfgang von Weisl, chairman, Dr. Wunderlich, vice-chairman, Akhi Mayer, leader of the National Youth League, and Moïse Segal. The new executive consists of M. Rosov, chairman, M. Yevserov, G. Epstein and M. Weinstein.

The division among the Palestine Revisionists is the same as that in Europe, with the followers of Dr. Richard Lichtheim and Meer Grossman favoring carrying on Revisionist principles within the Zionist Organization, while the adherents of Vladimir Jabotinsky, head of the Revisionists, are evidently planning to secede at the 17th Zionist Congress after submitting their maximum program which the Congress is expected to reject.

## Borscha Trial Ends With Defendants' Acquittal; Danila Fined 5,000 Lei

Bucharest, Nov. 24—Tremendous disappointment was expressed today by the Jewish community and in democratic circles over the verdict of the court in the city of Satu Mare, completely vindicating all hooligans who participated in the anti-Jewish pogroms in Borscha and in burning the Jewish quarters of that city.

Among the vindicated are the two anti-Semitic leaders, Fathers Berindei and Dumitrescu, who were directly responsible for inciting the peasants against the Jews. Berindei and Dumitrescu were also charged with having assembled the peasants in the Pienna church in the neighborhood of Borscha and with refusing to release the agitators, "Prince" Danila and others, after they had barricaded themselves in the church, defying the authorities.

A fine of only five thousand lei was imposed upon Danila, which is considered farcical in view of the evidence against him. Seventeen Jews, who were among the accused on charges of having combated the anti-Semites, were also freed.

Before the verdict was issued the prosecutor demanded the strict application of the laws of Hungary to the Jewish defendants and the milder laws of Roumania against the anti-Semites, which was not granted.

## Urges Measures to Stop Migration of Turkish Jews

Istanbul, Nov. 24—Djinnhurriet, one of the leading newspapers of Turkey, today demands that the government take steps to prevent the exodus of Turkish Jewish citizens who are "distinguished by their creative intelligence and productive activity." Many Jews have been leaving Turkey because of oppressive economic restrictions and because of the failure to put into effect the minority laws.

Djinnhurriet points out that the government must turn its attentions to remedying the population deficiency because a population of 13,500,000 is spread over a territory one and a half times the size of France. Few public works and the unproductivity of the railroads are laid to sparsely inhabited tracts and hence the migration of the Jews should be stopped, the paper says.

The Turkish press and public leaders are now beginning to realize the need for economic development and also to consider opening the gates to immigration. Under the new Turco-Greek agreement, however, any advantages granted to Jews must necessarily also be given to Greeks.

## Lessing Rosenwald's Plan to Raise \$100,000 for Jobless (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Philadelphia, Nov. 24—The sum of \$100,000 will be provided for the relief of the unemployed of Philadelphia through a plan suggested today by Lessing J. Rosenwald, vice-president of Sears, Roebuck & Co., the son of Julius Rosenwald, Horatio Gates Lloyd, chairman of the committee for unemployment relief, announces that this sum had been promised by Mr. Rosenwald as a result of the astonishing initial success of a plan adopted at Mr. Rosenwald's suggestion.

Employees of Sears, Roebuck & Co. throughout the country are voluntarily contributing one day's pay every four weeks for the relief of the unemployed in the various communities where the plants are located. Ninety percent of the employees of certain departments of the company in this city contributed the first day the plan went into effect, Mr. Rosenwald reported and there was practically a 100 percent representation of the higher salaried officials and employees.

There are between 600 and 800 employees of the company in the Philadelphia area and the money contributed by the employees in this area will be matched dollar for dollar by the company and the entire sum turned over to the committee for unemployment relief every four weeks. "I am more than delighted at the response to my suggestion," Mr. Rosenwald said, adding that he "can only hope that it will serve to influence other firms to adopt the idea. Should they do it this problem of relieving distress arising through lack of employment will be solved at once."

## Austrian Minister Sues for Charge of Racial Anti-Semitism (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Nov. 24—Franz Hueber, Austrian Minister of Justice and Heimwehr leader, has begun a libel suit against the newspaper Wiener Allgemeine Zeitung for calling him a "race anti-Semite." The case will be heard on November 28.

## Z. O. A. Announces Determination to Continue Opposition to White Paper; Judge Mack Reports on Political Situation

The National Executive Committee of the Zionist Organization of America declared its determination to continue to oppose the White Paper at an executive meeting held all day Sunday at the Jewish Club. A resolution to that effect which was adopted at the meeting was drawn up by a committee consisting of Robert Szold, chairman; Louis Lipsky, Emanuel Neumann, S. J. Rosensohn, and Bernard A. Rosenblatt.

In reviewing the events that have transpired since the issuance of the Passfield White Paper, Mr. Szold, who is chairman of Administration of the Zionist Organization of America, declared that all Jews are united in their stand against the White Paper. He deprecated the attempts that have been made to distinguish "between what are called the 'extreme' Zionists and the 'moderate' Zionists" and said that it must be made clear that "such distinctions are only meant to distract public attention from the fundamental issues."

"The explanations in Parliament in defense of the Passfield White Paper as reported in the newspapers only serve to add fuel to the fire," said Mr. Szold. "Dr. Shiels, on behalf of the Colonial Office, is reported to have stated, 'the White Paper, as explained and simplified today, stands.' Apparently the government proposes to attempt to satisfy the Jews throughout the world with words and declarations of good intent while at the same time reiterating that the White Paper stands, the same White Paper which, as Mr. Lloyd George stated in the Parliament debate, was 'biased in its whole drift and hostile to the spirit of the Mandate' and 'breeds distrust of an even antagonism to Jewish activities.'"

"We note that in the announcement of the \$12,500,000 loan for the development of works in Palestine and to provide land for ten thousand families, it is stated that landless Arabs will have the first claim. Included among the landless Arabs, according to the plain purport of the Simpson report and the White Paper, are those Arab village workmen who have never even in the long period before the Balfour Declaration owned or occupied land. And yet the Jewish National Home is to be

halted because of Arabs whose condition has in no way been altered or affected by the Jews except for their betterment."

Judge Julian W. Mack delivered a report at the meeting of the political situation in London as well as one on his visit to Palestine.

The resolution adopted at the meeting reads as follows:

"Whereas the White Paper issued by the British Colonial Office constitutes a repudiation of the Balfour Declaration and of the Palestine Mandate, and

"Whereas leading British statesmen of all parties have pointed out that this White Paper constitutes a repudiation of the Balfour Declaration, and is a breach of the trust assumed by Great Britain under the Palestine Mandate, and

"Whereas the official statement made on behalf of the British Government in the House of Commons in effect has failed to remove the inherent injustices of the White Paper,

"Be it therefore resolved by the National Executive Committee of the Zionist Organization of America that we, taking our stand with our brethren in Palestine, reiterate our demand that the White Paper be eliminated and annulled;

"Be it further resolved that we send to the Jewish National Council of Palestine a message of our unshaken determination to rebuild, with them, the Jewish National Home."

## Prussian Educators to Confer on Ending Student Outbreaks (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Nov. 24—The Prussian Minister of Education, Grimme, has invited all rectors of universities and high schools to a conference in order to discuss the necessary measures against student excesses. It is understood that the minister will warn the rectors against yielding to the student followers of the Fascist leader, Adolph Hitler.

A demand on the Minister of Trade to enact a new law dealing with the damage caused during the recent riots was made by the Berlin Chamber of Commerce. The Chamber points out the damage which Hitlerites caused in Berlin during the excesses on the opening day of the Reichstag. The Chamber asks that all rioters and those inciting the riots should be held responsible for the material damage since the riots harmed business life.

## Plan Conference of Hebrew Arab Publishers in Jerusalem (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Nov. 24—Acting on the proposal of Dr. Wolfgang von Weisel on behalf of the suspended Hebrew newspaper, Doar Hayom, Issa Elissa, publisher of the Arab paper, Falastin, today agreed to a joint Arab-Jewish publishers conference regarding the government's press restrictions and especially the pending press law.

The Doar Hayom and the Falastin were both recently suspended for printing inciting news reports.

## Nazis to Be Disbanded Unless Berlin Excesses Discontinued (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Nov. 24—A warning, that unless the National Socialists discontinue their attacks on their political opponents the police will ban the Fascist organizations, was sent today to the Fascist leader in Berlin, Dr. Joseph Goebbels, by Arthur Grzesinski, Berlin police president.

Simultaneously with this warning, M. Grzesinski declared that he does not take seriously the orders from the National Socialists to their members to end their excesses. The police president termed these orders an obviously misleading manoeuvre.

## Charge Police Laxity in Nazis Attack on Habimah Players

Berlin, Nov. 24—From official and Jewish sources came charges today of police laxity in dispersing the National Socialist hooligans who last week sought to prevent the performance of the Habimah players at the municipal theatre in Wurzburg. M. Racky, a Socialist member of the municipal council of Wurzburg, today accused the police of unnecessary delay both in removing the rioters and in confiscating the Hitlerite literature distributed by the Nazis.

The Central Association of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith and the Jewish community of Wurzburg have called a meeting to protest against insufficient police protection and to demand greater protection for Jewish citizens. M. Wolz, spokesman of the National Socialists in the council, assured Racky that the Nazis condemn anti-Semitic excesses but that the Habimah performances damage German national interests.

The mayor of Wurzburg, M. Loeffler, said that he had witnessed the disturbance in front of the theatre and saw 30 young Germans beating a Jew. The police officials have promised to investigate the charges of police laxity.

## Warburg and Baker to Talk at Good-Will Seminar

Felix Warburg, former Secretary of War Newton D. Baker, Rev. John Haynes Holmes, Prof. Rheinhold Niebuhr and Justice Joseph M. Proskauer will be among the speakers at a Seminar of Protestants, Catholics and Jews which will be held on December 9th in the Hotel McAlpin, according to an announcement made yesterday by Everett R. Clinchy, director of the National Conference of Jews and Christians. The Seminar is sponsored by a committee of which Chancellor Elmer E. Brown of New York University is chairman.

Rabbi Philip Bookstaber of the Pennsylvania Commission on Employment will direct the discussion of vocational discrimination. Prof. William H. Kilpatrick of Columbia University will lead the opening and closing round tables. Three other round tables will be led by Prof. Harry Overstreet of the College of the City of New York, Prof. H. H. Horne of New York University and Prof. Raub of Columbia University.

## Czech Cities Grant 35,000 Kronen for Hebrew Schools

Prague, Nov. 24—The sum of 35,000 kronen was appropriated today by two Czechoslovakian municipalities for Hebrew schools. The city of Uzhorod, capital of Carpatho-Russia, assigned 20,000 kronen while the city of Macrischos-trau gave 15,000 kronen.

## Jewish Merchant Pledges \$500 Monthly for Jobless

Atlantic City, Nov. 24—A pledge to contribute \$500 a month during the next five months for the relief of unemployment in Atlantic City has been made by Mayor Bacharach by Samuel Stern of Ventnor. Mr. Stern is a member of the Mayor's committee on unemployment relief. The committee plans to raise \$4,000 monthly during the period of need.

## Jewish Communists Said to Be Involved in Anti-Stalin Plot

Moscow, Nov. 24—The left wingers in the ranks of the Jewish Communists today launched an attack on Diamenstein, Chemerisky and A. Merezhin, three of the best known Jewish Communist leaders. The Yiddish Communist organ of Charkov, the Shtern, accuses them of being nationalists, opportunists and of propagating "Soviet Zionism."

By "Soviet Zionism," the Shtern refers to the program of Chemerisky and Merezhin in 1927 to make Bira Bidjan a Jewish land. Diamenstein is attacked for showing sympathy to the various foreign Jewish organizations working to aid the declassified Jews and for saying that they merit attention.

The attack on Merezhin, one of the leaders of the Comzet, the government department for settling the Jews on the land, is particularly bitter. The Shtern charges him of having converted the Comzet into an all Jewish institution and adds that he is carrying on a purely nationalistic policy.

This attack follows the revelation that five other prominent Jewish Communists have been involved in a plot against Joseph Stalin, head of the Communist party. M. Shatzkin, head of the Communist Youth Organization, Ch. Nusinov, V. Kavraiskey, M. Halperin and M. Reznik are charged with being aides of Sergei Syrtov, former president of the Council of Peoples Commissars of the Russian Socialist Federated Soviet Republic, who planned to overthrow Stalin.

## Goldberg, Polish Immigrant Official, Is Dead

Warsaw, Nov. 24—Ben-Zion Goldberg, manager of the Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society office in the City of Brisk, is dead here. Goldberg was here on his way from Berlin, having accompanied a transport of immigrants there on behalf of the Society.

## Dr. Robert Heller, Friend of Prof. Einstein, Dead

Prague, Nov. 24—Dr. Robert Heller, noted mathematician and physicist who has just completed a new treatise on the theory of relativity, died today at Koenigshof. Dr. Heller was a friend and collaborator of Professor Albert Einstein.

## Maurice Minkovsky, Deaf and Dumb Painter, Dead at 49

Buenos Aires, November 24—Maurice Minkovsky, the Polish-Jewish deaf and dumb artist who arrived here several months ago to exhibit his paintings is dead here as a result of an auto accident. He was 49 years old.

Minkovsky was born in Warsaw in 1881. From his very youth he showed artistic inclinations. At the age of 11 he had already painted a portrait of the governor of Warsaw. He attended various art schools in Cracow and Paris and soon became a very prominent artist. Minkovsky attracted particular attention by his paintings of the Bialystok pogrom in 1905 giving impressions of Jewish life of that time. Among the latter the most famous are his "After the Pogrom," and "The Exiles." He also did many landscapes and religious paintings on Biblical themes which gained for him a prominent reputation. He received many medals during his various exhibitions and was greatly admired by connoisseurs of art among them the French Minister of Art, Anatole de Monzie, whose portrait he did and who named him Master of Portraits.

The funeral will take place under the auspices of the local Jewish community.

## Agudath Dissociates Self from Vaad Leumi's White Paper Stand

Jerusalem, Nov. 24—The first sign of a break in the united front of the Palestine Jewish community, which has existed since immigration was stopped last May, is seen in a statement made public today by the central committee of the Agudath Israel, orthodox organization, deprecating the use of the term "Jewish community" by the Jewish National Council in its resolution rejecting the White Paper.

The Agudath, which is not affiliated with the National Council, points out that the Council does not represent the Agudath unless the latter expressly associates itself with the Council's actions. The declarations of the National Council in connection with the White Paper contained expressions with which Orthodox Jewry, not belonging to the Council, is not associated, the Agudath says.

Its attitude to the White Paper was defined in a declaration to the executive of the World Agudath Israel and issued in complete harmony with the executive of the Palestine Agudath, the communiqué states.

## California Rabbis to Study Effects of Inter-marriage

San Francisco, Nov. 24—The Board of Jewish Ministers of Northern California has decided to undertake research into the scope and effect of inter-marriage on modern Jewish life. The board recently went on record with a pronouncement distinguishing between inter-marriage and "mixed marriage." It is planned to make the survey exhaustive and comprehensive in scope.

## Congregation Honors Jonah B. Wise on Fifth Anniversary

Marking the fifth anniversary of his leadership as rabbi of the Central Synagogue, about 600 members of the congregation paid tribute to Rabbi Jonah B. Wise at a dinner given for him on Sunday night at the Hotel Astor. Leaders in New York Jewry praised Rabbi Wise for his character and deep understanding of all that is Jewish.

Among the speakers were Max L. Schallek, President of the Board of trustees of the Central Synagogue, who called upon American Jews to return to "the true ideals of Judaism and forget an era in which materialism has been our god"; Dr. Julian Morgenstern, President of the Hebrew Union College; Felix M. Warburg, who said he wished that theological seminaries could "turn out Jonah Wises at the rate of twenty a year"; Mrs. William M. Flexner, president of the women's group in the synagogue; and Emanuel Goldstein, president of the men's organization.

Former Attorney General Albert Ottinger was toastmaster. Others who attended the dinner were Rabbi Nathan Krass of Temple Emanu-el; Adolph S. Ochs, publisher of the New York Times; David A. Brown; Ben Altheimer; Mr. and Mrs. Henry Morgenthau; Dr. Lee K. Frankel, and Mrs. Alexander Kohut. Mrs. Isaac M. Wise, mother of Rabbi Wise, was a guest of honor.

## Bill Ending All Immigration to Be Offered in Senate

Washington, Nov. 24—A bill to suspend all quota immigration to this country, except that of immediate relatives, until July 1, 1933, will be proposed in the Senate next month by Senator Reed of Pennsylvania in order to relieve unemployment, according to his announcement today. The bill has the support of William Green, president of the American Federation of Labor, and of Secretary of Labor James J. Davis, who will resign from the Cabinet to become a member of the Senate next week.

## Paterson Y Seeks \$50,000 to Ease Financial Ills

Paterson, N. J., Nov. 24—A campaign to raise \$50,000 to relieve the local Y. M.-Y. W. H. A. from its financial difficulties, will be launched here Monday, December 1st, to last for one week, according to a decision of the board of trustees, now made public. Nat Kent will be general chairman of the campaign and A. H. Slater heads the executive committee.

In making public the drive plans, Philip Dimond, president of the "Y" who also heads the New Jersey Federation of Y. M.-Y. W. H. A.'s, declared: "Conditions in the 'Y', caused by lack of funds, have placed the institution in a position where a campaign to raise the quota of \$50,000 is inevitable; otherwise the activities would have to be curtailed or the institution forced to close its doors."

## Arab Executive to Accept White Paper, Simpson's Conclusions; Not to Waive Protest Right

Jerusalem, Nov. 24—The Arab Executive's official stand on the new Palestine policy of the British government will accept the White Paper and Sir John Simpson's conclusions which are favorable to the Arabs but will not waive the right to protest what is objectionable to the Arabs. Although the Arab Executive's stand will not be made public until about December 1, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency is in a position to forecast its general lines.

One-third of the 25-page document to be issued will survey political developments in Palestine in the last decade and will charge that Arab rights have been consistently trampled on and that even the Mandate's provisions regarding self-government have been ignored. The statement is expected to steer clear of either accepting or rejecting the legislative council, the authors of the document deliberately choosing ambiguity in order not to commit the Arabs to either course.

Strong exception will be taken to the proposed land legislation giving the High Commissioner discretion over transferable lands. The Arabs will demand explicit regulations not subject to political considerations or to changes of policy in London. The statement will welcome Simpson's suggestion that the government keep the Huleh lands and will protest against the release of 1,500 certificates for Jewish immigrants. It will also argue against the lack of changes in immigration categories other than that of labor.

The official Arab view regarding co-operation with the Jews will take the view that this is impossible because the Zionists must strive to become a majority or else resign themselves to a position in Palestine similar to that in other countries. The statement will point out that the hope for a Jewish majority clashes with the Arabs' natural desire to predominate.

## San Francisco Jewry Planning Einstein Reception

San Francisco, Nov. 24—Backed by civic leaders, the San Francisco Jewish community today began plans to extend an ovation to Prof. Albert Einstein when he arrives here January 2 aboard the S. S. Belgeland. Mayor James Rolph, Jr., who is governor-elect of California, Mrs. M. C.
