Palestine Question Chief Issue in Whitechapel Election; Labor Party Victory Seems Doubtful

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Nov. 25—The nomination of candidates today for the Whitechapel by-election on December 3rd began the last stage of the heated campaign to capture this seat, held by a Laborite since 1922. Although the Liberal candidate is a Zionist, the real fight will be between James Hall, the Laborite nominee and Loel Guinness, Conservative candidate, the chief issue is the Palestine question because forty per cent of the voters in the constituency are Jewish.

A few months ago a political fight in Whitechapel would have aroused little interest because it has been a Labor stronghold for the last eight years. But in view of the Jewish voters' resentment against the government because of the White Paper, the Labor party is extremely anxious over the outcome because the loss of this seat would further weaken the Labor government's tenuous hold on Parliament.

That its anxiety is justified is apparent from a study of some statistics. Of the 37,000 voters in the district, 14,000 are Jews. At the last general election the Labor candidate polled 13,701 votes, winning by a majority of 9,180.

The Labor candidate, James Hall, today began the circulation of a Yiddish pamphlet entitled "The Labor Party Stands for the Complete Embodiment of the Ideal of the Jewish National

Czech City Grants 250,000 Kronen for Jewish Schools

Prague, Nov. 25—A quarter of a million kronen were appropriated today by the municipality of Brunn, Czechoslovakia's second largest city, as the coming year's subsidy to the Jewish schools of the city. This grant needs no approval from higher government institutions. Yesterday the city of Uzhorod, capital of the province of Carpatho-Russia, assigned 20,000 kronen for Jewish schools and the town of Marish-Ostrau gave 15,000 kronen for manual training in the Yiddish schools.

Jewish Collectives Win Prizes for Grain Collections

Moscow, Nov. 25—The Jewish collective Larin was today awarded a tractor and a premium of 3,000 roubles as the best kolkhoz (government grain farm) at a regional convention of collective farm workers in Rostov. Eleven other Jewish collectives in Ukraina received premiums for delivering to the government more grain than the schedule demanded.

Governor Bans Subsidy to Brest-Litovsk Yiddish School

Warsaw, Nov. 25—The subsidy granted by the municipality of Brest-Litovsk to the local Yiddish school was countermanded today by the governor of the district despite the fact that the school has a government license. At first the governor even refused to approve of the subsidy for all Jewish schools in Brest-Litovsk which amounts to 30,000 zlotys. He finally consented, however, to permit the subsidy for the Orthodox Hebrew schools but under no circumstance would he approve of the grant to the Yiddish school.

The governor bases his action on the charge that the Yiddish school is opposed to the government. He also sought to obtain the return of a few hundred zlotys already granted the school. The Brest-Litovsk municipality is planning a protest to the central authorities in Warsaw.

The governor's action with regard to Brest-Litovsk has its counterpart in reports from other cities where the government is using pressure to suppress the Jewish schools in an endeavor to compel the Jewish children to attend the Polish schools, which is contrary to the Minorities treaties.

Agreement Restores Order in Viennese Commercial Colleges

Vienna, Nov. 25—Peace was officially reestablished today in the Viennese commercial colleges between the Jewish and nationalist students following the intervention of the college authorities. Trouble broke out a fortnight ago when the nationalist students expelled their Jewish classmates.

Both groups of students pledged themselves to maintain order while classes were in session. The agreement followed the appeal of a deputation of Jewish students to the minister of commerce asking for protection in the commercial colleges.

Tel Hai to Build Planes in Honor of Jabotinsky

Warsaw, Nov. 25—The Tel Hai Fund of Poland, a member of the international Jewish organization supporting Jewish schools of sport instruction, today decided to donate five aeroplanes in honor of the fiftieth birthday of Vladimir Jabotinsky, Zionist Revisionist leader, who is also one of the life executive members of the Tel Hai Fund.

The planes will be built in Palestine by members of the Jewish Aviation Club and the students of the Haifa Technical Institute and will be used by them.

Final Returns Show Not One Independent Jew Elected to Polish Senate; 6 in Sejm

Warsaw, Nov. 25—Final returns from Sunday elections show that Dr. Dov Shreiber, Zionist candidate for the Senate from Lemberg, was not elected. Early returns had indicated that he had won. His defeat means that for the first time since the reestablishment of Poland there will not be a single independent Jew in the Senate. The only Jewish senator will be Ascher Mendelsohn, Agudist, who was elected on the government bloc. For reasons of party discipline he will be unable to join the Jewish Parliamentary Club.

When the newly-elected Sejm convenes there will be only six independent Jews in parliament. Although seven Zionists were believed to have been elected to the Sejm, Benjamin Russ, Zionist candidate from Kalisz, lost his mandate at the last moment to a National Democrat. The six independent Jewish deputies in the new Sejm compare with 11 in the first Sejm, 46 in the second, and 19 in the third.

The failure of the Jews to elect more independent candidates in the Sejm and Senate elections has aroused bitter recriminations among the various Jewish parties who are blaming each other for the election results. The Jewish population as a whole is sadly disappointed and lays the results to the split in the Jewish vote which was divided among five parties.

Roumania Gives 10,000,000 Lei for Jews, 12,500,000 to Moslems

Bucharest, Nov. 25—The sum of 10,000,000 lei will be appropriated by the Roumanian government for Jewish religious purposes in the coming year, according to figures made public today. At the same time it was announced that for Moslem religious purposes the government will assign 12,500,000 lei. In view of the fact that the Jewish population of the country is ten times as great as the Moslem population these appropriations have elicited considerable surprise.

The Curierul Israelite, commenting on these figures, says the old proverb had it that the "Turk pays" but this should be changed now to the "Jew pays."

Lifts Suspension on Doar Hayom and Falastin

Jerusalem, Nov. 25—The government today lifted the suspension order on the Hebrew paper, Doar Hayom, and the Arab paper, Falastin, both of which were suspended last week for publishing inciting articles.

Jewish Agency-British**Government Parley Postponed**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Nov. 25.—The adjourned conference between representatives of the Jewish Agency and the British government which was supposed to resume its sessions today did not reconvene and has been postponed for a few days when the government will be ready with a full reply to presentations made by the Jewish Agency's spokesmen. It was expected that a joint statement would be issued today by the government and the Jewish Agency, but the Colonial Office informed the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that such a statement would not be forthcoming.

It is learned that while the government is interested in regaining immediately the confidence of the Jews, there nevertheless exists a sentiment that the Zionists, if they cannot forget the original White Paper, will be wise to accept it with "explanations and amplifications" to which Dr. Drummond Shiels, under-secretary for the Colonies, referred during the parliamentary debate on Palestine last week.

Synagogue Throws Open Temple Gymnasium to Aid Unemployed

San Francisco, Nov. 25.—Endorsing the suggestion of Rabbi Irving Reichert, the board of directors of Congregation Emanu-El voted at its last meeting to throw open the gymnasium of its Temple House as a dormitory for jobless and unemployed men if the emergency warrants during the winter months.

The plan, which will be put into effect should the situation warrant, calls for the installation of more than 100 cots in the big gymnasium and the serving of breakfast daily. A careful check will be made on the type of men picked for residence in the improvised dormitory. "This is my idea of religion in action," Rabbi Reichert said after his plan had been approved.

Samuel Mather Gets Charles**Eisenman Award in Cleveland**

Cleveland, Nov. 25.—The Charles Eisenman award given annually by the Jewish Welfare Federation to the person who "during the previous year, projected or achieved some piece of work of signal value or merit to the city's civic or philanthropic development" was given to Samuel Mather, Cleveland's first citizen.

The presentation was made at a luncheon rally of the Community Fund in the Public Hall by Newton D. Baker, a member of the award committee.

The award was presented to Mr. Mather by Mr. Baker read:

"The Charles Eisenman Award established in memory of the late Charles Eisenman, a citizen of Cleveland, a lover of his fellowmen, for nearly a score of years president of the Jewish Welfare Federation and throughout his life a leader in civic and social enterprises, is by the action of the Charles Eisenman Award Committee, awarded for the year 1930, to Samuel Mather in recognition of his leadership as honorary chairman of the Community Fund through which the community responsibility of Cleveland for the social welfare of its citizens is recognized and met, and through which the people of Cleveland are led into constructive thinking along social and civic lines and are being welded into a fellowship of service."

The award committee includes Sol Reintal, president of the Jewish Welfare Federation, chairman; Samuel Goldhammer, executive director of the Federation, secretary; Charles E. Adams, Edward M. Baker, Newton D. Baker and A. D. Baldwin.

J.D.C. Spent 30,000,000 Kronen in Czecho-Slovakia in 9 Years

Prague, Nov. 25.—Thirty million kronen were spent for Jewish work in Czecho-Slovakia by the American Joint Distribution Committee in the last nine years, according to figures made public here today. The sum includes appropriations for credit kassas, social relief, subsidies for orphanages for Jewish children who lost their parents during the pogroms in Ukraina and other countries.

Kosher Kitchen Opened in Detroit to Aid Unemployed

Detroit, Mich., Nov. 25.—A kosher kitchen was opened here at 1130 Westminster to aid the needy and unemployed. Sponsors of the kitchen state that donations from Jewish merchants guarantee that the kitchen will go on during the emergency situation without necessitating appeals for funds for its upkeep.

Rabbi Joshua L. Goldberg of the Astoria Center of Israel has been elected to the Executive Committee of the Emergency Relief Fund of the Borough of Queens to represent the Jews of the Borough.

Danila Faces Prison If**He Refuses to Pay Fine**

Bucharest, Nov. 25.—Counsel for Constantin Danila today lodged an appeal against the fine levied on him by the Satu-Mare court for his part in the Borscha anti-Semitic disturbances last summer. Simultaneously the public prosecutor has appealed against the smallness of the fine but he has taken no action against the acquittal of the other ringleaders, the priests, Fathers Berindei and Dumitrescu.

If Danila refuses to pay the fine, as he is reported to have threatened to do, he faces a three months prison sentence.

Seaboard Zionists Raised**\$1,232,500 in Nine Years**

Washington, Nov. 25.—During the past nine years the Seaboard Zionist Region has raised for various Zionist purposes the sum of \$1,232,500, of which amount Baltimore gave \$760,500. This was reported by Simon J. Levin, executive secretary of the Region, at its midyear conference held here Sunday at the Jewish Community Center. This sum, said Mr. Levin, is exclusive of all private investments made in Palestine by individuals in the Region.

Resolutions condemning the British White Paper and the Simpson Report, welcoming Mr. Ussishkin, president of the Jewish National Fund, on his forthcoming visit to this country and pledging the Seaboard Zionist-Region to raise \$30,000 for the Jewish National Fund within the coming year were adopted at the conference. Simon Land, Treasurer of the Region, gave a report on its financial status.

The conference was addressed by Jacob de Haas and Bernard Stone, the latter being executive field director of the Jewish National Fund. More than seventy-five representatives from practically all of the most important centers in the five states comprising the Seaboard Zionist Region attended the conference.

Jewish Communists of White Russia Officially Reprimanded

Moscow, Nov. 25.—The Jewish Communists of White Russia were sharply reprimanded today by the central executive committee of the White Russian Communist Party for their illegal treatment of Jews in a number of small towns. After specifying the illegal activities of the Jewish Communists the central executive committee invites the Jewish Communist leaders to prepare within two months a concrete plan for carrying on productive work among the Jews of White Russia.

The Jewish Communists are criticized for illegally municipalizing many Jewish houses, for unlawfully confiscating the property of Jewish artisans who are in need and who should be treated more mildly and for depriving a great many Jews of their election rights and thus putting them in the declassified category when they should have been given complete citizenship rights.

Hitler's Organ Launches Attack on Chicago Jews

Berlin, Nov. 25.—The Voelkische Beobachter, anti-Semitic organ of Adolf Hitler, today launched an editorial attack on Jews in Germany and Chicago. Chicago Jewry, the Voelkische Beobachter points out as an example of how Jews "control" American cities. In its attack on German Jews, the Hitlerite organ announces that Jews will never be admitted into the National Socialists' anti-Bolshevist camps, adding that the Hitlerites can have no united front with the Jews even in fighting Communism.

Under the headline, "Chicago, the City Without a Soul," the Beobachter asserts that all movie houses, theatres, hotels, restaurants and a majority of the business firms are in Jewish hands. "Eighty percent of the judges in Chicago are Jews and in the municipality and courts those children of the chosen people sit selling their service mostly to Chicago's criminal elements," the anti-Semitic paper alleges.

Reporting that while the other national minorities in Chicago are becoming assimilated the Jews there remain the only unassimilated group, the Beobachter goes on to say that their "number of synagogues and schools is always growing while similar institutions of other racial groups are dying out. Small wonder then that America today is a paradise for all Jews. The dollar is the actual governing force there. That is why everything is corrupt."

Chicago, and not New York is the symbol of the United States, Hitler's organ claims. To substantiate its assertions the paper prints a number of pictures of the Jewish districts and Jewish institutions in Chicago.

Turning its attention to the Jews of Germany, the Beobachter says that every German who wants to fight Bolshevism must "first throw the Jews out of Germany and then join the Hitlerites." In commenting on the recent ousting of a rabbi from an anti-Communist meeting he was addressing together with representatives of other religious groups, the paper asks "has Bolshevism fallen so low that there is no longer profit in it and Judas after ruining Russia is now turning anti-Bolshevik?"

Avukah to Give Dinner for Scottish Debating Team

A dinner to the debating team representing Scottish universities will be given at Columbia University, on Sunday evening, November 30th by Avukah. Tribute will be paid to Lord Balfour, late Chancellor of the University of Edinburgh and author of the famous Balfour Declaration.

Addresses on behalf of Jewish students will be made by James Waterman Wise, honorary secretary of Avukah, Dr. Mitchell Salem Fisher, chairman of the administrative committee, and George M. Hyman, formerly assistant registrar of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem and now executive secretary of Avukah.

French Jewry Will Honor Catholic Bishop Who Fought for Jewish Emancipation

Paris, Nov. 25.—French Jews, headed by a Chief Rabbi, are preparing to celebrate the centenary of the death of a Catholic Bishop. It was this Bishop, Henri Gregoire, who was more than anyone else responsible for the emancipation of French Jewry by the Revolutionary Assembly a hundred and forty years ago. He died on May 28, 1831, and so French Jews have already formed a Gregoire Celebration Committee to commemorate next year his role as a fighter for Jewish freedom. This committee is headed by Chief Rabbi Hagenauer of Nancy.

One of the most remarkable figures that the great French Revolution produced, Gregoire, who was a Jesuit priest, fought all his life for the rights of all men, regardless of creed and nationality. When he died his cortege was followed by a crowd of twenty thousand Parisians and the hearse was drawn up to the cemetery by students who had unyoked the horses.

"Fifty thousand Frenchmen arose this morning as slaves; it depends on you whether they shall go to bed as freemen," thundered Gregoire at the meeting of the Revolutionary Assembly when he put in his motion for the emancipation of the Jews. He also wrote a famous work on the "Regeneration, Physical, Moral and Political, of the Jews," which won the prize of the Royal Society of Arts and Sciences.

During the Terror, in spite of attacks in the Convention, in the press, and in placards on the street corners, Gregoire appeared everywhere in his episcopal dress and daily read Mass in his house. In the face of the Deputies he refused to abjure his religion or his office, and stood ready to face death. His record in the Revolution, however, saved him and he was allowed to have his way.

But when, on the other hand, Napoleon signed a treaty with the Vatican, Gregoire resigned his bishopric. To the last Gregoire remained a devout Catholic, but refused to budge from his revolutionary principles. It was on his motion too that Negroes in the French colonies were emancipated.

Sees Break Between Government and Jewish Agency Imminent

London, Nov. 24.—The negotiations between the British government and the Jewish Agency may break off at any moment, the Daily Telegraph says. The paper claims that the Zionist negotiators are getting impatient at the vague generalities of the government's spokesmen and they allege that the government's representatives will not make any concrete or definite offer.

The Telegraph also states that Prof. Felix Frankfurter of the Harvard Law School, who was reported to be coming here as the American member of the Jewish Agency's political commission, will take no part in the negotiations.

Charges Ozet Organizations in Ukraine, White Russia, Myths

Moscow, Nov. 25.—Seventy percent of the Ozet organizations in Moscow and a similar percentage in Ukraine are myths and exist only on paper, the labor control committee reports today. The Ozet is the society for settling the Jews on the land. The committee, which was appointed to check up on the Ozet's activities, toured a number of Ukrainian cities and found that the Ozet makes more noise about its work than the facts actually warrant.

The committee's report criticizes the Ozet for its exaggerated publicity and charges that most of the Ozet organizations in the provinces are non-existent. The Jewish Communist organ of Minsk, Oktiabr, makes a similar charge against the White Russian Ozet. The paper says that the Ozet is not only falsifying its reports but that in such large White Russian cities as Orsha, Vitebsk and Bobroisk the Ozet is non-existent.

Israel Fine, Poet, Zionist, Friend of Roosevelt, Dead

Baltimore, Nov. 25.—Israel Fine, widely known as a Hebrew poet, an intimate friend of President Roosevelt and also well-known for his Zionist activities, was buried yesterday afternoon in the Baltimore Hebrew Cemetery. Mr. Fine, who was 83 years old, died Sunday night at his home here of the infirmities of age.

A native of Russia, Mr. Fine came to the United States in 1891. Ten years later, on his election to the Zionist Congress in London, he went to Europe to take part in the Palestine movement.

Mr. Fine received wide notice for his writings. In 1922 he was informed by the Smithsonian Institute of Washington that his "Ode to America," written in Hebrew on the occasion of the centennial celebration of "The Star-Spangled Banner" in 1914, had been put on exhibition in the American history section of the national museum.

Through his association with President Roosevelt, Mr. Fine was the recipient of many favors. He carried the President's autograph in his spectacle case. This won him a spectator's seat in the Turkish Parliament after the meetings had been closed to foreigners.

Mr. Fine was well known for his philanthropy and his writings. On his seventy-ninth birthday he announced the donation of a home in Palestine as the first unit of an agricultural school for girls. He gave a large tract for the school after his return from the Holy Land. It was his practice to distribute checks to the needy on his birthday.

Mr. Fine was engaged in the clothing business in Baltimore until he retired a good many years ago. He had commendatory letters from President Roosevelt, Cardinal Gibbons and the former German Emperor.

Plan Reorganization of State Federation of Y's and Centers

Albany, Nov. 25.—Leaders from all parts of the state attended an all day conference in Albany on Sunday, at the call of Judge Irving Lehman, president of the Jewish Welfare Board, for the purpose of reorganizing the New York State Federation of Y. M. and Y. W. H. A.'s and Jewish centers. In addressing the conference, Judge Lehman stressed the importance of leadership as the first step in providing an adequate program in behalf of Jewish youth.

Other speakers outlined the status of the various communities, and the specific needs in New York state for character building agencies of the Jewish center type. Plans were adopted for strengthening the smaller communities and supplying the lack of Jewish influences and leadership through the provision of educational programs by the state federation.

At the recommendation of Harry L. Gluckman, executive director of the Jewish Welfare Board, a resolution was adopted calling upon all local organizations to cooperate fully in all communal efforts to relieve the present unemployment problem. He pointed out the greater need for recreational facilities in times of stress, and the important part that Jewish centers could play in maintaining the morale at this time.

Mr. Gluckman announced that Dr. Philip R. Goldstein, director of campaigns of the Jewish Welfare Board, would also act as field secretary for the New York state federation.

Spur Plans to Mark 275th Year of Jewish Settlement

Washington, Nov. 25.—Plans for the national celebration of the 275th anniversary of Jewish settlement in the United States, which is to take place in Boston, December 17, at Faneuil Hall, were advanced today as the result of a conference between Alexander Brin, publisher of the Jewish Advocate of Boston and chairman of the committee on arrangements and a number of government officials. Mr. Brin was assured that they were greatly interested in the celebration.

The speakers who will participate in the program, besides the governor of Massachusetts, include Paul C. Wolman of Baltimore, national commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Prof. Albert Bushnell Hart of Harvard University, Dr. S. Parkes Cadman of New York and Congressman Sol Bloom, director of the George Washington Bicentennial Commission.

Home." The pamphlet promises that the Labor government would see to it that the Jews got a fair deal in Palestine.

At the same time Loel Guinness, the Conservative candidate, has issued an appeal to the Jewish voters pointing out that the Conservative party has always dealt fairly with the Jews and is now the only party in the House of Commons with the will and the power to resist the Labor government's curtailment of Jewish rights. Meanwhile the Poale Zion, Socialist Zionist party, has announced its support of the Labor candidate but many Jewish workers are opposed to the Conservative party, saying that they will abstain from voting rather than vote for the Labor candidate.

With the exception of the Daily Herald, the government organ, the entire press is very doubtful about the Labor party's chances of retaining the Whitechapel seat which was left vacant by the death of Harry Gosling, former minister of transport.

Haym Salomon Picked By Jewish Book Club

Chicago, Nov. 25.—The November selection of the Jewish Book Club is Charles Edward Russell's biography of Haym Salomon it was announced here today by Ralph H. Goldman, editor-in-chief and president of the club, at the organization's quarters.

"This selection is regarded as particularly important by the literary world," Dr. Goldman said. "A selection of the Jewish Book Club has at once literary value and is authentic art and is a genuine contribution to knowledge."

Jewish Artist's Work on View at Central Synagogue

An art exhibition displaying paintings and drawings by Fred Taubes, and etchings and woodcuts by Isaac Friedlander, is now open under the sponsorship of the women's organization of Central Synagogue in the synagogue's Community House. Mr. Taubes, who has spent some time in Jerusalem, contributed several canvasses treating Palestinian subjects and scenes, while Mr. Friedlander's subjects, though not concentrated, show a wide range of Jewish interest.

Jews Must Refuse Assimilation Rabbi Tells Baltimore Seminar

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Baltimore, Nov. 25.—"Some people think the Jews constitute a separate race. We know today that Jews never formed a biological unit among the races of the earth. If we still speak of a Jewish race, we have reference to those psychic peculiarities which any group, whose fortunes have been molded by the same historical forces, is apt to develop."

These were some of the statements made by Prof. Israel Bettan of the Hebrew Union College at the Christian-Jewish Seminar held yesterday at John Hopkins University. Other speakers were Rabbi William Rosenau, Rabbi Nathan Krass, Rev. George Bull and Rev. Dr. Samuel McCrae Cavert, general secretary of the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America.

"Judaism is the Jews' birthright and badge of honor," said Prof. Bettan. "By clinging to his ancient but evergrowing faith, a faith that has produced prophets, sages and saints, the Jew can best serve the world. Let Israel therefore refuse assimilation. Israel is eternal. It is because of the heritage of responsibility which is mine that I find ample satisfaction for all of my spiritual deeds, that I am eager to preserve my Jewish identity despite the difficulties and hardships involved."

The afternoon session was attended by 425 people. Rabbi Edward Israel introduced the chairman, Prof. Horrell Hart, sociologist of Bryn Mawr College, who said among other things:

"The task which we have is to transfer the emotional energy from the collective struggle between Jews and Christians to a struggle in which Jews and Christians unite to bring the Kingdom of God on earth. The energy which many Christians ignorantly use in anti-Semitic feelings could be transferred to a struggle against poverty, against disease and for the cultivation of a better political order of society."

Rabbi Nathan Krass stated that "the problems of adjustment between Christians and Jews are colossal. The limitations of the Seminar are in the fact that speeches are not enough. The situation demands action."
