Three Catholic Monks Say Kaddish in Vienna Synagogue For Converted Austrian Baron (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Nov. 29.—Three Catholic monks saying kaddish (the prayer for the dead) for a converted Jewish baron today startled a local synagogue congregation out of its customary Sabbath equanimity. The monks entered the synagogue in the middle of the service and stayed to the end to say the kaddish. Asked for an explanation by the elders of the congregation after the service, the monks told the following story. They explained they had come to say kaddish in accordance with the terms of the will of the late Baron Otto von Taussig. The baron, who was born a Jew, became a convert to Christianity and then military adjutant to the late Emperor. In this capacity he accompanied the Emperor to the city of Przemyśl where the Jews received them with the traditional bread and salt.

Among those Jews was a girl with whom the baron fell in love, but the parents of the Jewess refused to give their consent to marriage although the baron agreed to return secretly to Judaism. As a result of this the baron became melancholy and began to lead the life of a recluse. On his deathbed he willed his entire estate to an order of Catholic monks who maintained hospitals and welfare institutions for those unfortunates who had been rejected by society. One of the conditions of his willing the property to the monks was that every year on the anniversary of his death they should visit a synagogue and say kaddish for him.

Today was the anniversary of the baron's death and the monks came to the local synagogue to say the prayer for the dead.

New Austrian Cabinet Not Likely to Have Anti-Semites (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Nov. 29.—The next Austrian cabinet, when formed, will not include anti-Semitic ministers, it is predicted today in view of former chancellor Schober's declaration of an offer of the Christian Socialists to join in a coalition with the Heimwehr. This refusal removes for the present the danger of a continuation of the policy by means of which Heimwehr cabinet officers conducted anti-Semitic propaganda on the plea that, while as ministers they were not entitled to do so, as private citizens they were permitted.

Such explanations were recently given by Franz Hueber, minister of justice and Prince Starhemberg, minister of the interior. All efforts by the Christian Socialists to influence Schober to agree to the inclusion of at least one Heimwehrist in the coalition cabinet being formed have thus far been unsuccessful.

Mount Ararat Transferred to Turkey by Persia (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Nov. 29.—Mount Ararat, where Noah's ark came to rest after the deluge had ended, is changing hands, it is reported today. The Persian government is understood to have agreed to the inclusion of Mount Ararat in Turkish territory in exchange for a strip of Turkish land on the southern frontier. This step is a sequel to the recent Kurdish insurrection in that region where the rebels took refuge on Persian soil. Hence Turkey has requested the Persian government to consent to an exchange of territories.

Hitlerites Utilize Disunity of Berlin Jewry in Kehillah Elections for Propaganda (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Nov. 29.—Ten Jewish tickets are in the field for the election in the Prussian Jewish communities elections tomorrow. While the provincial Jewish communities in Prussia are united on one ticket in view of the serious situation facing the Jews because of the Hitlerite agitation, in Berlin the Jews have no such unity.

The chief split in Berlin Jewry is between the Liberal and national German Jews on the one hand and the Zionists on the other. "The Eastern Jews disgrace German Jewry," is what the German-born anti-Zionists claim in their campaign speeches.

Meanwhile the split in the Jewish ranks is being utilized by the Hitlerites who today manifested their interest in the Jewish elections by supplementing Jewish posters with their own. The national German Jews, who are anti-Zionists, posted throughout the city today streamers urging in heavy type "vote German." To these posters the Hitlerites immediately added their own poster with Swastika signs saying, "don't elect Jews at all."

The interest shown by the Hitlerites in the Jewish campaign is proving no obstacle in the heated campaign. The bitterness throughout the campaign between the various Jewish groups became especially noticeable at a Liberal meeting today when Dr. Bernard Weiss, vice-president of the Berlin police, declared, "I had favored the naturalized Eastern Jews, but because they have now formed their own ticket I have changed my mind regarding their naturalization."

Strickland's Report Rejects Government Agricultural Bank For Arabs of Palestine (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Nov. 29.—The proposal to create in Palestine a government agricultural bank to aid the Arab fellahen is emphatically rejected by Claude F. Strickland, British expert on rural economics, in his report on agricultural and cooperative conditions in Palestine made public here today.

Mr. Strickland, who last July visited Palestine on the invitation of the Palestine government to study the economic position of the fellahen in order to instruct the district office about objects and methods of cooperative credit, declares he was deeply and immovably convinced that an agricultural bank dealing on a small commercial basis with the small Arab farmers would be the greatest evil any government could introduce because proper supervision is impossible, repayment would be reluctant and the resultant sale of lands would be unpleasantly frequent.

Such a bank existed before, Mr. Strickland points out, but was closed by the former High Commissioner, Sir Herbert Samuel, thus becoming one of the main points in the anti-Zionist propaganda of the Arab leaders. They claim that the bank would be of relief to the Arab peasants. Strickland's report also outlines various schemes for aiding the fellahen with government credits and relief of their debt burdens.

During his visit to Palestine, Strickland expressed admiration for the Jewish cooperative societies. He said, however, that while the Jews are able to finance their cooperatives from their own means it would be necessary for the government to establish cooperative credit systems for the Arabs.

Jews Terrorized in New Disorders in Marmorosh (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Nov. 29.—Jews were terrorized and windows in Jewish houses smashed yesterday in Marmorosh, according to advices received here today by Deputy Ilie Lazar from the editor of the Ujkelet, Hungarian-Jewish paper in Bukovina. According to the reports the Jews asked the prefect and the local gendarmerie for protection.

Deputy Lazar today called on John Mihalache, minister of the interior, to ask that stern measures be taken to prevent any serious anti-Semitic outbreaks in Marmorosh which the Jews now fear. This fear is based on the fact that the renewed anti-Jewish agitation there is being fostered by the priest, Father Anderco, who exercises great influence.

Mihalache has already sent orders to Marmorosh to give the Jews protection.

Split in Vote May Result In New Election In Salonika Jewish Community

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Salonika, Nov. 29.—The failure of one party to obtain a majority in the Jewish community elections on October 12 is creating difficulties in the election of a community council. With half a dozen parties seeking representation on the council it appears likely that, whatever the complexion of the new council, it will be faced with such difficulties that it will have to call new community elections.

The general assembly elected by the community elections resulted in the victory of 28 Zionists, 24 nationalists (Mizrachists) and moderates, 11 Communists, and 7 professionals, pacifists and non-party representatives. Of these latter 7 three lean towards the Zionists, three towards the nationalists and one towards the Communists.

Efforts are being made to establish a concentration council, exclusive of the Communists, the fight being between the Zionists on the one hand and the greater part of the nationalists, moderates and non-party representatives on the other.

Dinner Will Welcome Judge Mack Back Home

A dinner will be tendered to Judge Julian W. Mack, of the United States Circuit Court, tonight, at the Temple Anshe Chesed Community Center, on the occasion of his recent return from Palestine, according to an announcement made by Professor Richard Gottheil of Columbia University, who is chairman of the committee arranging the function.

Judge Mack, who is honorary chairman of the Zionist Organization of America, will describe his recent visit to Palestine, and report on the developments in the political, cultural, industrial, agricultural, and commercial fields.

Trio of Palestine Labor Leaders Cheered at Convention of Palestine Workers; British Labor Party Pledges Aid; Ben-Gurion Describes Agricultural Achievements of Jews

Three of the most untiring of Palestinian workers came to the United States for the convention of the American National Labor committee for the Jewish workers in Palestine, and met at the opening of the convention in a hall crowded with more than eight hundred representatives of labor organizations. Shirt-sleeved youths hanging over the balcony, and grizzled gray-haired labor organizers greeted the veteran chalutzim with prolonged cheers. More than the cabled reassurances from the British Labor party itself, more than the message of commendation from the president of the American Federation of Labor, was the effect of the presence of those three workers who could tell their fellow-workers exactly what was happening in Palestine.

As one of the men, I. H. Goldberg, representing the Cap and Millinery Workers' Union said, "No amount of politics and of all the paper in the world can build Palestine. It takes labor."

Joseph Baratz, a "plain dirt farmer" from the colony of Digania, incidentally one of the founders of Digania, and secretary of the agricultural organization of Palestine, proved to be a gentle-looking, soft-voiced man with the angular movements of a farmer, and the gentle look in his eyes. "Comrades, the simple truth is that when the White Paper came out we over there didn't know what to do. Our hands and feet wouldn't move to work. Worse than the fever of malaria, worse than the exhaustion after terrible stretches of work under heat, is the feeling of loneliness, the feeling of being deserted. That was the feeling we had then."

Much Work to Be Done

"Let us remind you that even under present political conditions—which certainly must be bettered—there is much work to be done. We have in Jewish hands 150,000 dunams of land that lie waste because there is not enough capital and man-power among the Jews in Palestine to cultivate that land. We have thousands of good Jewish workers waiting to come to Palestine, and haven't the means to bring them. At this moment, the Arabs are in a panic to sell Jews land for which they themselves have no use."

David Ben-Gurion, general secretary of the Histadruth, impressive for his large head and shock of up-standing white hair, long revered in Palestine as a leader of labor, said, "There is much talk of men who gave up careers to come to work in Palestine. They gave up nothing. They chose the highest career—that of taking upon themselves the responsibility for the fate of their people." He then refuted many charges in the White Paper, chiefly those contending that Jews had dispossessed Arabs, or caused Arab unemployment.

Hannah Chizik Gets Ovation

An ovation greeted Hannah Chizik, woman worker from Palestine. Hannah Chizik is the organizer and leader

of one of the girl's farms in Palestine. She is a member of one of the most heroic and pioneer families. One brother was killed in the 1929 riots, dying as the hero of Chulda. A sister was killed in the Tel Hai riots. Another sister died of malaria. Brought here to talk for the Pioneer Woman's Organization, she said, "This year we have a new message for you Americans. We no longer ask you to collect money, to hold meetings, and discuss Palestine. Now we are making room in our settlements for you. We want you to come there and work with us."

The cable from the British Labor party to the convention said, "We are profoundly disturbed that our Jewish friends in Palestine and abroad should even for a moment doubt our sympathy with their ideal to establish a Jewish National Homeland in Palestine. It is precisely the purpose of the British Labor Government to provide for the orderly and consistent development of Palestine, including the close settlement of the land to its utmost capacity; to avoid unintentional injustice to the non-Jewish sections of the community, and at the same time to secure a broader and a more certain basis for the growth of the Jewish national home. We are delighted to have the assurance that the economic emancipation and social elevation of the Arab masses are coming from the efforts of our Jewish labor in Palestine."

Shiplacoff Presides

Abraham L. Shiplacoff, chairman of the National Labor Committee, presided at the opening of the convention, which was addressed by David Pinski, noted playwright, Julius Hochman of the International Ladies Garment Workers' Union, Berl Locker, general secretary of the Poale Zion, Dr. David Rebelsky of the Zeiri Zion, Isaac Hamlin, secretary of the National Labor Committee, and others.

A message from William Green, president of the American Federation of Labor, said, "We rejoice that you are incorporating the ideals of organized labor in your plans for the Jewish commonwealth."

Sessions of the convention were held all day Saturday, with a great meeting Saturday evening at Carnegie Hall. The Saturday sessions included discussions of the Arab Jewish problem, and reports on the actual progress of work in Palestine.

Jewish Butchers Exempt from British Sunday Closing Law

London, Nov. 29.—Jewish butchers are exempt from a bill introduced in the House of Commons compelling all retail butchers to close on Sundays. The Jewish butchers are excluded from the provisions of the bill provided they are licensed by a Jewish congregation or a shechita board and if they do not conduct business from sunset Friday to sunset Saturday.

Challenge of Modern Life to Synagogue to Be Probed by Hebrew Union Congregations

Philadelphia, Nov. 29.—The 32d Council of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, which will meet in this city on January 18 to 22, 1931, will consider "The Challenge of Modern Thought and Life to the Synagogue" in the symposium which forms an important part of its program. There are to be three sessions, the first of which is to be devoted to "Youth and Religion"; and the third to "Judaism as Expressed in Life."

In view of the approaching convention, the two local Reform congregations, Keneseth Israel and Rodeph Shalom, are preparing to act as hosts to some 1,500 delegates whom they expect from all parts of the country. Philadelphia has twice before served as host to the Union's biennial conference, once in 1877 and again in 1909. The local committee is under the leadership of Nathan Baum, chairman; Miss Jeanette Miriam Goldberg and Mrs. Moses Lieberman, vice-chairmen.

There are today 283 congregations affiliated with the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, comprising a membership of 61,545. The Union was founded in 1873 by Dr. Isaac Mayer Wise of Cincinnati for the purpose of strengthening reform Judaism in America. The Hebrew Union College, established in 1875 by Dr. Wise, was its first creation.

Other activities of the Union are carried on through the Department of Synagogue and School Extension, the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods and the National Federation of Temple Brotherhoods.

Editor Fined for Calling Minister Racial Anti-Semite

Vienna, Nov. 29.—A fine of 1,000 shillings or 14 days in prison was levied on the editor of the Vienna Allgemeine Zeitung in the local court today for calling Franz Hueber, minister of the interior, a "racial anti-Semite." M. Schreiber, counsel for the Allgemeine Zeitung, was fined 100 shillings and severely reprimanded for seeking to introduce into the record newspaper articles purporting to show that Hueber is an anti-Semite. Both the paper and Schreiber have appealed the verdict to a higher court.

Schreiber asked the government's press chief whether it was permissible for the minister of justice to agitate against the Jewish community which is recognized by the constitution. This is an elementary rule which Hueber should have known from his student days, Schreiber maintained. Thereupon Schreiber was reprimanded and the court declined to consider his proof of Hueber's anti-Semitism, claiming that it had no bearing on the charge against the Allgemeine Zeitung.

During the recent pre-election campaign, Hueber stumped the Austrian countryside to deliver anti-Semitic speeches.

Anti-Semites Rap Einstein On Eve of Visit to U. S.

Berlin, Nov. 28.—On the eve of Prof. Albert Einstein's departure for his second visit to the United States, the anti-Semitic press ridicules the intense interest Americans have manifested in his forthcoming visit. Prof. Johann Stark, Hitlerite theoretician, alleges the existence of an advertising firm that has manufactured dolls portraying Dr. Einstein in full dress, a fiddle and a sailing boat.

Professor Stark also terms Einstein's theory of relativity unproductive and complains against appraising Einstein above Newton and Kant.

Lloyd George, Herbert Samuel Back Whitechapel Zionist

London, Nov. 29.—Lloyd George and former High Commissioner of Palestine Sir Herbert Samuel, today urged the Jewish voters of Whitechapel to support Barnett Janner, the Zionist leader, who is the liberal candidate in the parliamentary by-election.

In an address in Whitechapel today, Lloyd George declared today "the world now knows how Lord Balfour's pledge has been ignored and jeopardized by the recent White Paper of the Labor government. I am upholding the principle of liberty to an oppressed people, a principle which has long been the special glory of our nation and which was exemplified in the pledge given to the Jewish race regarding Palestine when I was Premier."

Lloyd George also disclosed at the same meeting that it was due to his efforts that the pledge regarding the Jewish National Home was embodied in the Mandate for Palestine. This was done at a conference following the conclusion of the Peace Treaty. "I did it as my duty as Premier," Lloyd George explained.

Sir Herbert Samuel sent a letter which was read at the same meeting, saying he was unable to refer to the Palestine question in detail because he was a former High Commissioner of Palestine and the matter had already been an election issue. He added however that he was confident that if Janner was elected he would represent present Jewish feelings regarding Palestine.

Dr. Wise Recovering From Sudden Relapse at Resort

Atlantic City, Nov. 29.—Dr. Stephen S. Wise, noted rabbi and Jewish leader, is today recovering from a slight relapse he suffered yesterday at the Hotel Breakers where he has been recuperating from a recent illness. After the relapse yesterday he was ordered to bed but is now resting comfortably and will be permitted to get up tomorrow.

Dr. Wise, rabbi of the Free Synagogue in New York, is 58 years old.

Sees Jewish Way of Centering Life About Family as Best Solution for Sex Problem

The old Jewish way of centering all life about the idea of the family is set forward as the scientific ideal of the best social solution for the sex problem by Dr. Magnus Hirschfeld, founder of the Institute of Sexual Science of Berlin, who is in America to lecture before various medical societies.

"The Jewish idea of the family has been a tremendous influence for the good in modern life," said Dr. Hirschfeld. "It emphasizes the creation of normal relations. Father, mother, and child — that is the most important entity in the world. It brings human satisfaction, ethically, biologically, and physically."

The grizzled scientist, vastly sympathetic and serious in aspect, discussed some of the things he has found to be true through thousands of case studies in his institute. "The sex feeling is often stronger than any other. It is stronger than the feeling of race. This you see when you witness successful cases of inter-marriage. I believe inter-marriage, when it follows so strong an urge, is a good thing. Inter-marriage between Jews and Gentiles has increased since the war, with the general increase in personal liberty everywhere."

Dr. Hirschfeld spiked the popular idea that Jewish men and women are more passionate, as a rule, than people of other races. "Such generalities are generally unfounded," he said. "Though as a rule Jewish women have a deeper conception of love, and are deeper in love than most women." He attacked the anti-Semitic charges against Jewish morality. "Charges that the Jew is morally lax are utterly unfounded," he said. "I do not understand how the anti-Semites of Germany can make such charges. Many of the Jews who they say have no right to be in their country belong to families that have been there for a thousand years. They were there before the people who attack them were there. My family has been in Germany for many generations. My father is a doctor, my grandfather was a doctor, on so on back for a long time."

Dr. Hirschfeld receives many letters from orthodox Jews in relation to the question of birth-control. "This is a matter in which religion must make some compromise," he says.

Dr. Magnus is president, with Havelock Ellis and August Forel, of the World League for Sexual Reform on a Scientific Basis.

He has been invited to lecture before the Universities of Tokio and Shanghai, and is now on his way to the East.

German High Court Releases Two Anti-Semitic Leaders

Berlin, Nov. 29.—The highest German court today ordered the release of M. Wule, anti-Semitic leader, and Father Muenchmyer, who had declared that "a Jewish republic deserves a Jewish president." The reference was to President von Hindenburg.

South African Jews to Buy 15,000 Dunams in Palestine

Johannesburg, Nov. 29.—The purchase of 15,000 dunams of land in the Sharon Valley of Palestine in the name of South African Jewry became possible today when it was announced that the Jewish National Fund campaign here had raised an amount exceeding that raised in last year's drive. The success of the drive is laid to the tremendous enthusiasm of the various Jewish communities despite the financial depression and the effect of the White Paper.

Hear Hamburg Industrialists To Interview Adolph Hitler

Hamburg, Nov. 29.—The local press reports that Adolf Hitler, National Socialist leader, has been invited to attend Monday's meeting of the Hamburg National Club which is composed of leading industrialists and the captains of the shipping industry. The visit is believed to be an effort on the part of capitalist circles here to learn Hitler's sentiments towards them. Dr. W. Cuno, former German chancellor, is an ex-president of the Club.

Second Sholom Asch Work Offered by Schwartz

Uncle Moses, the second offering this season of the Maurice Schwartz Yiddish Art Theatre, was given its first performance on Friday night. Written by Sholom Asch, it is the third novel of his to be presented in dramatized form on the Yiddish stage this season, the other two being the Witch of Castile and The Chair.

Uncle Moses, which is in ten scenes, tells of a manufacturer who has brought over most of the people of his native town in Russia to work for him. For the sake of his career he neglects to marry until he hears the age of 30 when he marries a young girl. His wife leaves him when gangsters whom he has employed suppress a strike led by her old sweetheart and Uncle Moses is in the end crushed by fate.

Maurice Schwartz takes the leading role in Uncle Moses. Others who play important parts are Lazar Freed, Joseph Buloff, Anna Appel, Stella Adler, Shulamith Posner, Betty Farkauf and Wolf Goldfaden.

German Chancellor Receives National Socialist Leader

Berlin, Nov. 29.—Chancellor Brüning today for the first time received a National Socialist leader when he conferred with M. Goering, vice-president of the National Socialist fraction in the Reichstag. The purpose of the interview was to analyze the parliamentary situation. It was reported that the conference proved to be futile because the National Socialist spokesman could not assure the government of his fraction's support.

Roumanian Cabinet Officer Says Anti-Semites Will Be Free If They Make No Trouble

Bucharest, Nov. 29.—"Anti-Semites will remain free so long as they do not make trouble. We are always combating anti-Semitism but circumstances and conditions are now favorable for agitators." This was the reply given today by Virgil Madgearu, minister of agriculture, in parliament, to the criticism of the government's treatment of the Jews by the Jewish deputy, Theodore Fischer.

Emphasizing that his criticism was based on the constitution which grants equal rights to all citizens, Fischer declared that "there is no difference between the methods of the present government and others as regards the Jews and leniency towards anti-Semitism." He said that since 1922 anti-Semitism has had a free hand in Roumania "to play its barbarian game. No preventive measures were taken. Severe disorders occurred without punishment."

Recalling the Borscha fire, Fischer was interrupted by a number of deputies and by Madgearu who wanted to know why the Jews had made so much noise abroad about Borscha. "All the promises made by the government," Fischer continued, "were not fulfilled. I regret that he hopes we Jews put in the present government are vain." He concluded with a demand that the difficulties with regard to the Jewish school question and also over other injustices to the Jewish population should be adjusted.

Rabbi Fram Heads Ohio-

Detroit, Nov. 29.—Rabbi Leon Fram of Temple Beth-El, Detroit, was unanimously elected president of the newly organized Ohio-Michigan Jewish Education Association at the business meeting of the convention held at Temple Beth-El this afternoon. Rabbi Louis Witt of Dayton, Ohio, was elected vice-president. Miss Anna Oxenhandler of Detroit secretary, and David Weiss of Cincinnati treasurer.

Upon the invitation of Rabbi Witt, the city of Dayton was chosen as the scene of next year's convention. The Jewish teachers of Indiana are expected to join the organization at the Dayton convention, thus making it a tri-state association.

Among those who addressed the Friday session were Dr. Emanuel Gamoran of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations and Dr. A. H. Friedland of the Cleveland Board of Jewish Education, who spoke on the value of teaching Hebrew even in the one day a week school. Mrs. Harry A. Rosewater of Cleveland and Rabbi Witt spoke on training children of tender age in habits of worship and prayer.
