International Conference to Discuss Problems of European Jewish Students

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Geneva, Dec. 5.—The second international conference for the study of the Jewish problem in the universities will be held in Locarno, January 4th to 9th it was announced here today by Dr. Walter Kotschig, general secretary of the International Student Service, a non-sectarian organization under whose auspices the conference will be held. The first conference was held at Bierville, France in 1928.

The International Student Service, which has undertaken a campaign to fight anti-Semitism in the universities of Europe, will sponsor a program of address treating the principles of university life with regard to the actual situation of the Jewish students, the history of the Jewish student in Europe, the Jewish student in the life of the country in which he lives and the problem of the emigre Jewish student.

Among the patrons of the International Student Service are Thomas Masaryk, president of Czecho-Slovakia, Viscount Cecil, Dr. Albert Einstein, and Paul Painlevé.

Galatz Officials Will Have to Pay for Jewish Losses

Bucharest, Dec. 5.—The officials responsible for the anti-Semitic student outbreaks this week in Galatz will be held personally liable and will be required to pay damages to the Jews who suffered from the disturbances, Victor Cadere, under-secretary of the state in the ministry of the interior in charge of the division of police and public safety, told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today.

Cadere also said that the government was taking the necessary precautions throughout Roumania to prevent any disturbances on December 10th, the anniversary of the establishment of the nationalist student movement in Roumania.

Referring to the Galatz disturbances, Cadere said that the government was taken unawares. All measures to preserve order while the students were on their way to the congress in Braila and in Braila itself were taken, he said, but no trouble was looked for in Galatz. While the disturbance there was not serious, he stated the officials will be held responsible.

The Galatz disturbances were also aired in Parliament today by the Jewish deputy, Michael Landau, who asked what the ministry of the interior had done to punish the officials and the students. He emphasized that it was a mistake for the government to grant free passage on the railroads to trouble-makers.

Slovakian Jews Threatened by Sunday Closing Law

Prague, Dec. 5.—The livelihood of hundreds of Jewish merchants is threatened as the result of a compulsory Sunday closing law promulgated in Slovakia today. A similar ordinance is in vogue in the Czech region of the country. The presence of minister of trade Matussek in Bratislava today was utilized by a delegation of Jewish merchants who waited on him.

They pointed out that aside from the economic hardships the law would work because of its effect on the general population it would also mean that the Jews would have to keep their places of business open on Saturday. Matussek promised to consider the request, particularly since the economic argument may make it necessary to reconsider the compulsory Sunday closing laws in other parts of Czecho-Slovakia.

New Austrian Cabinet Bans Extreme Anti-Semites

Vienna, Dec. 5.—Extreme anti-Semites have been eliminated from the Austrian cabinet as a result of the selection of a cabinet of moderates representing a coalition consisting of the Christian-Socialist party, the Peasant party and the Pan-Germans, the latter known as the Schober bloc. No members of the Heimwehr have portfolios. The chancellor is Dr. Otto Ender, a moderate Christian-Socialist while Dr. Johann Schober is vice-chancellor and foreign minister.

Doubts Denials of Reports of Passfield's Resignation

London, Dec. 5.—Although rumors that Lord Passfield, Colonial Secretary, was about to resign, have been officially denied. The London Jewish Chronicle says in its current issue that it has excellent reason for not attaching undue importance to this denial. In the same issue, the Jewish Chronicle says that Pincbas Rutenberg, chairman of the Palestine Jewish National Fund, is to make a bid for Zionist leadership, with American support, at the forthcoming Zionist Congress.

French Movie Audience Resents Pro-Jewish Film

Paris, Dec. 5.—Bottles of ink, eggs and foul-smelling bombs, and cushioned seats were thrown at the screen in a Montmartre moving picture house today by spectators who objected to a talking film called "L'Age d'or" because the film was pro-Jewish. Damages estimated at \$5,000 were incurred.

Weizmann Says Jews Will Do Everything Possible to Keep White Paper from Becoming Law

Oxford, England, Dec. 5.—The Jewish leaders will do everything in their power to prevent the White Paper from becoming a law, Dr. Chaim Weizmann, resigned president of the Jewish Agency and of the World Zionist Organization, said today during an address before the Liberal Club of Oxford University.

Outlining the present Zionist position toward the British government, Dr. Weizmann said, "we do not accept the White Paper and we shall never accept it. The British government has thrown its weight partly on the side of the Arabs by trying to limit us. It is an injustice that Jewish immigration should depend on Arab unemployment. There might be Arab unemployment without Jewish immigration. If Jewish immigrants are not absorbed into economic life we bear the responsibility and maintenance for them."

Concluding that hence any Jewish employed have nothing to do with the general economic life of Palestine, Dr. Weizmann said, "we admit that unless our work is not going to harm the Arabs it cannot be done. The Jewish National Home can only be built if the Arab position is not damaged."

Histadruth Election Platform Pledges Support to Agency

Jerusalem, Dec. 5.—The Histadruth platform for the Asefat Hanivcharim elections proclaims its unity with the Jewish Agency on all questions fundamentally affecting the realization of Zionism. The Revisionists' program concentrates on an attack against the leadership of Jewish groups which it holds responsible for "the political failure and bankrupting economic policy."

The election fight will center chiefly around the Revisionists who are trying to draw into their ranks all classes, including the Orthodox Jews and some dissatisfied members of the Histadruth.

First Anti-Semitic Poster Appears at Lithuanian University

Kovno, Dec. 5.—"Jewish students should not be elected administrative officers," says a proclamation posted today on the wall of the University of Lithuania here today in connection with the student association elections. "How can Jews manage our interests when one of their eyes looks toward Moscow and the other towards Palestine?" the proclamation asks.

This is the first anti-Semitic proclamation ever posted at the University of Lithuania.

Montreal Jewry Goes Over Top in \$300,000 Drive

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Montreal, Dec. 5.—Local Jewry went "over the top" in its response to the \$300,000 campaign on behalf of the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies. The total subscriptions reported at the final dinner of the workers amounted to \$303,676.06. Despite the hard times prevailing, the campaign was oversubscribed by \$3,500.

The money, which will enable the thirteen constituent societies which form the Federation to carry on their work among the poor, the orphans, the tubercular and other distressed citizens, was raised as follows. Special names, \$122,014.56; trades and zones, \$166,282.74; women's divisions, \$10,877.39; ladies garment workers union, \$1,500; and Amalgamated Union, \$3,000.

Yiddish Theatrical Employees Threaten General Strike

Employees of Yiddish theatres in New York threatened a general strike at a meeting on Thursday night in answer to the ultimatum presented during the week by nine theatrical managers that they would close all their houses next Sunday night unless their employees accepted a 40 per cent wage cut in all departments. The meeting, representing 700 Yiddish theatrical employees, decided to send a telegram to managers in which they were requested to rescind their ultimatum, otherwise their action would be regarded as a lockout.

The meeting, which lasted four hours, chose a committee of five which will confer with the managers with regard to the latter's ultimatum. Morris Feinstein, secretary of the United Hebrew Trades, stated at the meeting that the unions were ready to meet their employers half way in an effort to solve their common problems, but that they will refuse to do so under threats.

Signing of Contract Between Jewish and Protestant School Boards Ends Hope of Separate Montreal Jewish School System

Montreal, Dec. 5.—All hopes of Jewish nationalists in this city to establish a separate Jewish school system in accordance with the right given them by the school bill which was passed by the Quebec Legislature last year have now vanished as a result of the publication of the official text of the contract entered into between the Protestant and Jewish School Boards. According to this contract, Montreal Jewish children will, as in the past, continue to attend Protestant schools, though their liberty of conscience will be recognized and provision will be made for their observance of Jewish holidays.

The main points of the contract are as follows:

First, Jewish children are to enjoy the same rights and privileges as Protestant children in the Protestant schools; second, Jewish children may attend any Protestant school in their district and not be segregated from other children in classes; third, the Protestant School Board recognizes 13 Jewish holidays and Jewish children will not lose any marks for absence; fourth, Jewish children will not be forced to study the New Testament and will not lose any marks, if they will bring a letter from their parents voicing disapproval of this subject;

fifth, Protestants assure that they will not discriminate against employing Jewish teachers, but will make such appointments and promotions when deemed fit.

The complete control of the schools which Jewish children attend in Montreal will on the other hand remain exclusively in the hands of the Protestant Board. Regarding the financial side of the contract, \$75 per annum is to be paid for each Jewish child attending a Protestant school, such money to come from Jewish taxes and from the "neutral panel," which receives taxes from various corporations. The Protestant Board also grants the Jews the right to use two schools in the Jewish district after school hours for classes in Hebrew, Jewish history and religion.

Stating today that he is gratified with the solution of a difficult problem, Samuel W. Livingstone, chairman of the Jewish School Commission, added that whilst the agreement may not be acceptable to those members of the Jewish community who desire a separate school system for Jews, he feels that the majority of the Jews of Montreal are of the opinion that this solution is in the best interests of Canadian citizenship, since it is founded on the fact that Jewish children will attend school together with other Canadian children.

The contract will be in force for fifteen years, according to the joint statement issued today by the chairmen of the Protestant and Jewish commissions. Each party will have to give due notice two years before the expiration of the contract of any necessary change, otherwise the contract will be automatically renewed for a new 15-year period.

Rabbis Charge Bias to Jews in Wine Permit Distribution

Asking for a revision of the present system of wine distribution which would reduce the average distribution to about a gallon and a half a family annually, rabbis representing virtually all the Orthodox Jewish congregations in New York charged on Thursday that Jews are being discriminated against in the granting of permits for sacramental wine. At present a Jewish family is allowed five gallons of wine a year, but in many instances, the rabbis said, requisitions made by them were reduced by the government officials and sometimes denied.

"We feel that the rabbis under the present system are distrusted and subjected to espionage and persecution, which is a discrimination against the Jewish people," said Rabbi B. Birstein of Ezrath Israel Synagogue. "Every application for wine made by a rabbi must be authenticated by a federal official, but both Protestant and Catholic applications are granted as soon as they are approved by a bishop."

Kohler Sees Discrepancies in Text of Reed Bill

Washington, Dec. 5.—Discrepancies between the text of Senator David Reed's bill to bar immigration for two years as introduced in the Senate from that announced before the bill was offered are charged by Max J. Kohler, chairman of the immigration committee of the American Jewish Committee, in a telegram to Congressman Dickstein and Senator Copeland, both of New York.

Mr. Kohler points out that, while the bill as originally announced would have exempted from the provisions of the Reed bill near relatives of resident aliens lawfully admitted, the text of the bill exempts only husbands, wives, minor children and aged parents of citizens. This, Mr. Kohler claims, is "wholly inconsistent with the avowed purpose (of Senator Reed's bill) of merely reducing 'the number of newcomers into the United States who come here for the purpose of seeking employment,' for practically none of these near relatives would be seeking employment and scarcely any are of the bread-winning class."

Mr. Kohler also notes that in the annual report of the secretary labor, it was recommended that immigrants coming to join near relatives already in the country be exempt from any plan of control. President Hoover's order to consuls also that account be taken of prevailing unemployment conditions in the United States in issuing visas also exempted near relations of the residents of the United States, Mr. Kohler declares.

Congress Gets Many Bills to Restrict Immigration

Washington, Dec. 5.—A bill to bar all immigration to this country for a period of five years is now being considered by the House Immigration Committee. The bill has been introduced by Chairman Johnson and is similar to the one sponsored by Senator Reed of Pennsylvania, except that Reed would bar immigration for a period of two years only.

After discussing his bill with President Hoover, Senator Reed declared last night that the President is in favor of barring all immigration for a period of two years. Senator Reed believes that his bill and Representative Johnson's can be harmonized in conference.

Additional bills for the restriction of immigration have been introduced by Congressmen Bachmann of West Virginia and McClintic of Oklahoma. Bachmann's bill proposes in effect the debarring of all immigrants of Russian origin and is aimed against Communists. The bill would prohibit the admission of citizens of any foreign government with whom the United States has no diplomatic relations. Congressman McClintic's bill proposes the suspension of all quota immigration for a period of ten years.

Despite demands for further immigration restriction in Congress and by President Hoover, recommendations for liberalizing certain features of the present immigration law are made by Commissioner-General of Immigration Hull in his annual report to the Secretary of Labor made public here today.

Among these recommendations are the authorization to issue non-quota visas in favor of dependent parents over 60 of American citizens, wives and unmarried children under 21 of aliens resident in the United States who were lawfully admitted for permanent residence should be given priority over immigrants who are skilled in agriculture and the legalization of the status of aliens who entered illegally, so as to enable their naturalization, be extended to those who so entered prior to July 1, 1924, instead of only to June 30, 1921, as under the present law.

Carp Heads Bucharest Cheap City Dwelling Department

Bucharest, Dec. 5.—Horia Carp, a member of the Bucharest city council and a former senator, was appointed controller of the municipal department of cheap dwellings. This is the first time a Jew has been named to such a position in Roumania.

Manfred Noah, German Movie Producer, Dead

Berlin, Dec. 5.—Manfred Noah, prominent Berlin moving picture producer, died here today at the age of 37. He was a descendant of a well-known Orthodox Jewish family. His best known production was Nathan the Wise.

South American Now Best Place for Jewish Emigration, Says Kreinin, Emigrant Director

With Canada and South Africa this year added to the long list of "closed" countries, the "surplus" Jews of Europe have practically no region to go to but the unsettled, and sometimes even wild parts of South America, according to Dr. Myron Kreinin and Aaron Benjamin, Jewish emigration authorities, who arrived in New York this week to consult with other authorities on means of carrying on the work of finding places of refuge for the Jews of Eastern Europe.

Dr. Kreinin is president of the Emigrant; Mr. Benjamin is vice-president, and commissioner to Europe, of the HIAS (Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society of America). Both these organizations have joined with the ICA (the Jewish colonization agency) to form the HICEM, which will carry on the emigration work that all three organizations had undertaken before.

"Last year we sent 15,000 Jews to South America," said Dr. Kreinin. "They must emigrate from Russia, Poland, Lithuania, and other Eastern countries where their numbers are superfluous. In Poland, there is an annual emigration of 20,000 Polish Jews because there is not room enough in the country for their own people. So what is to become of the Jews there?"

"While the necessity, for emigration is greater than ever before, the means is smaller, and the field is smaller than ever before. One by one, the nations close their doors to newcomers—not only to Jews but to all peoples.

South America Best Place

"South America remains the best place at present. Even there, we are seeking new places. Brazil, Argentine and Uruguay are comparatively old Jewish settlements. There have been sporadic emigrations of Jews to such newer ports as Chile and Venezuela.

"Our work is not only to help them find fare to get to these places, but to help them get settled after they are on the spot. Until now, an expense of \$10 a head over the fare sometimes sufficed, for people had some means of their own. But now conditions are as never before.

"Of course we save on the transportation cost, by securing reduced rates for our people. Last year we saved \$107,000 in transport fares to emigrants.

"But our care must be not only to get these people to the new country. We must not let them become scattered. They must be settled in groups, so that their Jewish life is maintained, so that they are not lonely and discouraged in the new land, and so that gradually, in these new places, Jewish communities such as we have in America may grow up. In Argentine, for instance, there is already a community of 200,000 Jews."

In 1929, the emigration experts said, their societies had helped 25,000 Jews emigrate out of Poland. Of these, 5,600 went to Palestine, 15,000 went to South America. Jobs had to be found for the people, some setting up shops, needed credit. All had to be helped to learn the speech of their new homeland.

Ussishkin at City Hall Asks U.S. to Back Jewish Homeland

"Welcome to New York, a place that understands Zionism, and a city that has a profound love for Palestine," said Mayor Walker in extending his official welcome to Menachem Ussishkin, world president of the Jewish National Fund, who was received at the city hall Thursday afternoon.

While the band played The Star Spangled Banner and Hatikvah, Mr. Ussishkin, accompanied by Emanuel Neumann, American president of the Jewish National Fund, and the mayor's reception committee headed by commissioner Levy, walked through the hall crowded with cheering folk, to meet the mayor.

"There are more Jews in this city than in Palestine," said the mayor. "And there are also more Irish than in Dublin, and more Italians than in Rome. Let me say to you officially that this would not be the city that it is if not for the spirit and contributions of our great Jewish colony. As far as the mayor is concerned there could be twice as many, with twice the profit. You are our real guest. The respect, esteem, and admiration you'll find here for the people you represent is as strong as anywhere else in the world."

Pleased at Welcome

In his response, delivered in Hebrew, and translated into English by Elias Epstein, Mr. Ussishkin said, "I thank you, Mr. Mayor, for your fine welcome. It is a welcome extended not to myself as a private citizen from the mayor of this great city, but from the American people to the Jews of Palestine.

"Is there not something mystic in the fact that on one and the same day two far-reaching events in the history of Israel and humanity occurred simultaneously? About 438 years ago Ferdinand and Isabella of Spain signed the decree expelling the Jews from that country, that expulsion which precipitated the beginning of new Jewish settlement in the land of Israel. And on that same day Christopher Columbus set sail on his historic cruise which led to the discovery of America. On that one day the hatred of the Jews reached its peak, while on the other hand there was revealed the land which for 400 years has been the symbol of freedom, liberty, and tolerance for all peoples, all creeds, and all tongues.

Present Situation Dark

"Dark clouds again obscure our skies. After having devoted thirteen years, literally pouring out our blood, for the reconstruction of Palestine, after bringing the latest developments of science to the country, and investing over \$200,000,000 in it, we have been met with slander and misrepresentation on the part of the very forces that undertook to facilitate our task.

"I ask the powerful American Jewry for their maximum assistance to continue, to extend, to expand the upbuilding of the land of Israel, and from the great enlightened American nation I ask in the name of the Jews of Palestine

Catholic Biographer of Queen Isabella Defends Inquisition

A defense of the Catholic Inquisition in Spain is contained in a book called *Isabella of Spain*, written by William Thomas Walsh. The book has just been published by Robert M. McBride & Company.

In his defense of Queen Isabella and the Spanish Inquisition, Mr. Walsh declares that only 2,000 persons were burned by the Inquisition during Isabella's reign. Compared with later Protestant measures, says the author, the Spanish Inquisition saved lives in the long run.

Mr. Walsh admits that from the outset Queen Isabella was interested in the Inquisition for the money it would bring into the royal coffers, money which was spent for the most part in financing the wars with the Moors.

The Inquisitor-General Torquemada is described by Mr. Walsh as "a pleasant, kind, industrious, able and modest man, whose chief ambition in life was to imitate Jesus Christ by preventing the total wreckage of the Christian culture by its most determined enemies." In his book, Mr. Walsh attacks the Marranos, or secret Jews, who were persecuted by the Inquisition because, according to him, they were responsible for the laxity of morals of the true Christian population.

Mr. Walsh also tries to prove that Jews were guilty of the Blood Accusation. He says that the charge that Jews used to steal Christian boys and crucify them in ignominious mockery of the crucifixion "cannot be dismissed as a mere evidence of fanaticism or propaganda, for the fact is that from time to time Jews actually were convicted of such crimes."

for the benefit of their weighty moral and political influence.

"You, the successors of those Puritans who came to this country to seek rest and peace, and found it, will understand the Jews' search for that same rest for themselves and their children after them. May I quote the lines of the distinguished English poet, Byron?

'The wild dove hath its nest,
The fox his cave,
Mankind their country
Israel but the grave.'

"We desire not the grave, but life, firm ground under our feet, and fair skies over our heads in that land which to all humanity became the Holy Land through the medium of the Jews. To you, Mr. Mayor, I utter the great cry of millions of Jews. I ask you as I have had the honor to demand from the Peace Conference at Versailles in 1919, to assist in restoring our Homeland, from which we were deprived two thousand years ago."

Asks Public School Chanukah Fetes Where Jews Predominate

A suggestion that Chanukah be celebrated in the public schools of New York City is contained in an editorial in the December issue of the Jewish Forum, monthly Orthodox magazine. The editorial says:

If the authorities who foster the Christmas exercises are sincere about subduing the sectarian character of the celebration and stressing the spirit of 'good will to mankind,' let them, at least in those schools where there are Jewish children, not to speak of Jewish populations, celebrate Chanukah and make it the occasion of renewing the spirit of the Maccabees in their fight for idealism and recall the Maccabean efforts made by the fathers of our country in their stand against the greater numbers in the British armies in Revolutionary days,—or, let them not foist a Christmas celebration as part of their educational influences, on the minds of Jewish children.

'Jewish parents of children in a particular school should get together to devise ways and means of enrolling all the other Jewish parents whose self-respect may dictate a combined protest to the principals of their respective schools against the introduction of strange influences in the development of the religious life of their children, and there is no better time for such organization than before the Christmas celebrations now almost universally observed in the schools.

"We call upon Jews to organize against those who would destroy the Maccabean spirit in our youth. Let us not shame the Maccabean spirit during the period when we should celebrate it."

Simon Heads Maryland-Virginia-Washington Jewish Teachers

Washington, Dec. 5.—At the second annual convention of the Jewish Religious School Teachers' Association of Virginia, Maryland and the District of Columbia held here last week, Rabbi Edward N. Calisch of Richmond was elected honorary president and Rabbi Abram Simon of Washington, president. Other officers chosen were: Rabbi William Rosenau of Baltimore, vice-president; Rabbi Eugene Blachschlager of Richmond, secretary; and Rabbi A. Alan Steinbach of Norfolk, treasurer. Rabbi William Fineshruber of Philadelphia and Rabbi Henry Tavel of Wilmington, Del., addressed the convention at the Sabbath services. The general theme of the convention was the development of Jewish character.

Jewish Social Worker on Governor's Committee

Los Angeles, Calif., Dec. 5.—Governor Young has recently appointed a committee of thirty men and women to study the unemployment problem. Fifteen of this group are from Southern California and the only Jewish representative is I. Irving Lipsitch, executive director of the Federation of Jewish Welfare Organizations.

Wills \$50,000 to Charities in Baltimore and Palestine

Baltimore, Dec. 5.—One-sixth of the estate of Israel Fine, poet and writer who was prominent in Zionist activities, has been left to create a foundation for the benefit of charitable and religious institutions. Mr. Fine's will, including this provision, was filed in the Orphans' Court today. The personal estate was estimated at fifty thousand dollars.

Agencies of the Associated Jewish Charities of Baltimore and institutions in Palestine will be the principal beneficiaries. The proportion to go to the Palestine institutions is to be divided between the United Charity Institutions of Jerusalem and fourteen other organizations there. The Baltimore Jewish Parochial School and the Talmud Torah, as well as the Maryland Workshop for the Blind, are among the beneficiaries.

Mark 50th Year of Hebrew Technical School for Girls

The fiftieth anniversary of the Hebrew Technical School for Girls, which was established in 1880 by Mrs. Minnie D. Louis, was observed yesterday at the building of the institution which is located on Second Avenue and Fifteenth Street.
